GOFFS ORBY SALE STARTS TODAY

Having dispensed with the Millions Sale concept last year, Goffs continues its 'focus on the horse' strategy with a strong catalog for this year's renewal of the Orby Yearling Sale, which starts at the sales company's Kill complex today. With the same number of yearlings

on offer as last year, subject to withdrawals, part one of the sale is set to take place today and tomorrow, with 430 yearlings catalogued. A further 236 are scheduled to go under the hammer Thursday. Among those on offer are 118 siblings to black-type winners, 60 of those at pattern-race level. The sale, or its previous incarnations, has enjoyed a banner year on the track, with 2008 graduate **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), a €330,000 purchase, garnering this season's G1 Irish Derby and G1 Irish Champion S.; and G1 Irish 1000 Guineas victress **Bethrah (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}), a €160,000 buy in 2008, leading the way. Reflecting on the Orby Sale's evolutionary process, Goffs' Chief Executive Henry Beeby commented, "We are thrilled with the excellent support from Irish breeders for this year's Orby Sale, including several new and returning vendors, which has resulted in such a strong catalogue of really good-looking athletic types. The overwhelming feedback from buyers last year was the high standard of individuals on offer. Goffs yearlings have demonstrated the success of our focus is the horse policy throughout the season, led by two Classic winners in Cape Blanco and Bethrah, backed up by some exciting two-year-olds. We believe buyers will find even more of the same quality at Goffs this September, as our vendors have worked with us to produce a catalogue of real strength, depth, quality and diversity that will appeal to a wide range of buyers."

Limerick nursery's team is Hip [426](#), an April-foaled Dr Fong half-brother to the recent G1 Phoenix S. hero **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}). Kilcarn Stud is a regular near the top of results sheets and offers eight yearlings this year. They include Hip [386](#), a daughter of hot sire Dubawi (Ire) and Spirit of Tara (Ire), who is a sister to the multiple Classic winner Salsabil (Ire) (Sadler's Wells. O'BRIEN DUO SET FOR GREEN LIGHT

Aidan O'Brien looks likely to saddle Derrick Smith's pair of **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. With Johnny Murtagh set to resume his partnership with the former, who has not been seen since winning the G2 Royal Whip at The Curragh Aug. 8, the ride on the Sept. 4 G1 Irish Champion S. hero Cape Blanco has yet to be finalised. "The plan is to go there with Fame and Glory and we're also looking at it with Cape Blanco," the O'Brien said on Sunday. "Obviously, there is a little bit of work to do and we'll see what this week will bring, but everything is so far, so good and we're happy."

DEWHURST LIKELY FOR FRANKEL

★ **"TDN Rising Star"** ★ Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) looks set to wrap up his two-year-old campaign with an outing in Newmarket's G1 Dewhurst S. Oct. 17. Following the Khalid Abdullah homebred's 10-length success in Saturday's G2 Royal Lodge S., Doncaster's G1 Racing Post Trophy was mentioned as an alternative, but Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe has suggested that Newmarket is the target. "That's the way [trainer] Henry [Cecil] wants to go and he is favouring the Dewhurst at the moment, but there is nothing set in stone yet," Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. Jockey Tom Queally was quick to pay a tribute to the juvenile. "He's so imposing and he dominates everything he does, even in a piece of work," Queally said. "He has so much going for him and has plenty of speed. At Ascot, they went slow and when I moved to go a length closer, he went from second to fifth gear. He's just smooth, has plenty of ability and a nice temperament. He's very exciting and let's just hope he stays sound."

ALL SYSTEMS GO FOR PATHFORK

Silverton Hill Partnership's **Pathfork** (Distorted Humor) remains on course for the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, trainer Jessica Harrington announced Sunday. "He's come out of the race really well and is back in full work now," Harrington said of the Aug. 21 G2 Futurity S. and Sept. 11 G1 National S. winner. "He has to produce the right form on the gallops between now and then, and there's a 50-50 chance of him going on dirt. I'm going to work him on Friday week, and we'll decide then when to work him again. He's going to travel out there Oct. 30 and he'll do 36 hours quarantine. The plan is then to give him a canter on the Tuesday, work on the Wednesday, jump out of the stalls Thursday, breeze him on Friday and hope for the best on Saturday."

FINAL JC GOLD CUP MOVE FOR BLAME

Blame (Arch) was sent to Keeneland's Polytrack Monday morning for his final drill prior to Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont. Sent to the track at approximately 7:45 a.m., the four-year-old breezed a half-mile in :48 with Casey Chavez aboard. The work was the fastest of five works at that distance. "He went :25 for the first quarter and :23 for the second quarter, and cooled out just right, which is the most important thing," said trainer Al Stall Jr. "This was more of just a blow-out type work. We weren't trying to gain anything by it fitness-wise. This was just kind of a sharpener. It's just very routine." The winner of the Aug. 7 GI Whitney S., **Blame**--who registered four works at Keeneland since returning to his home base Aug. 30--recorded his most recent Sept. 19, a six-furlong move in 1:12. "He had a bunch of stiff works and I wanted to get a two-mile gallop into him, that's why I [blew him out today]," Stall said. "That's needed here or there." According to Stall, **Blame** will walk this morning, jog Wednesday and then train lightly Thursday before boarding a plane for New York around 10 a.m. Also a winner of this season's GI Stephen Foster H., the Adele B. Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm color bearer will use the Gold Cup as a springboard to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. 6.

TATTERSALLS OCTOBER PREVIEW

Graduates from Book 1 of this year's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale will once again gain access to an exclusive group of eight races, worth £1.75 million, and that is expected to prove a big incentive to buyers when the sale kicks off at Park Paddocks Oct. 5. The

main two juvenile contests for graduates of the 2009 sale--a fillies' contest worth over £300,000 and a race for both sexes carrying a purse in excess of £500,000--are set for Oct. 2 at Newmarket. The first three races this season all went to

winner with five-figure price tags. Australian owner Nevan Botica picked up £200,000 Tattersalls Millions Auction Trophy heroine I Love Me (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) for 45,000gns; £100,000 Tattersalls Millions Auction S. victor Zebedee (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) cost owner Julie Wood 70,000gns; and Sheikh Mohamed Obaid Al Maktoum paid 40,000gns for £100,000 Tattersalls Millions Fillies' Auction S. winner Khor Sheed (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}).

"The whole point of having those first three contests as auction races was to give [buyers at] the middle-market October 1 chances of winning huge prize money, and that aim has been achieved already," said Tattersalls Marketing Director Jimmy George. "I'm confident those horses' owners will be back buying again this year. Since we moved away from the select Houghton format, the point of October Book 1 is that it attracts buyers from a whole cross-section, and the winners of these races demonstrate that. These races are designed to appeal to owners who spend anything from 5,000 to 1-million guineas on a yearling, and this series has really struck a chord with owners and trainers."



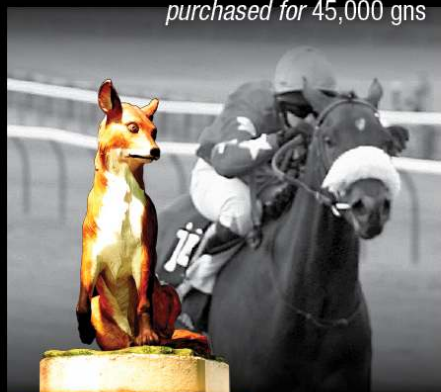

There are 689 lots catalogued in Book 1, compared to 676 in 2009, but numbers have shot up in the sale's second week. There are 1,030 in Book 2 (Oct. 11-14), compared to 820 in 2009 and 1,210 in Book 3 (Oct. 14-16), a huge rise on the 466 listed 12 months ago. "We working around the 650-figure mark for Book 1, and it's fair to say numbers in Books 2 and 3 are greater than anticipated when we went into yearling inspections this spring," added George. "But, again, it's a great vote of confidence in the sale." **Cont. p7**

With his marketing team, George travelled extensively through the year to promote this sale, and is confident that his efforts will bear fruit next week. "We really have been to all corners of the globe this year, and the response has been very positive since the October 1 catalogue came out," he said. "We're looking forward to welcoming an international cast of buyers with some new faces to add to the mix."

The Maktoum brothers bought 11 of the 31 lots to make 300,000gns or more in Book 1 last year, and in Book 2 they accounted for no less than 15 of the 23 six-figure yearlings. George acknowledges the family's importance. "We have been encouraged by the other Northern Hemisphere sales so far this year," he remarked.

"And the Maktoums have been great supporters of Tattersalls over the years and have bought many of their top horses here, and I am sure that they will continue to do so."

Tattersalls officials are examining the impact on next year's sale of the British Horseracing Authority's decision to move Champions' Day from Newmarket to Ascot next year. As part of the reshuffle, the middle weekend of the October Sale will feature racing at Newmarket next year at a time when buyers are usually busy inspecting yearlings. "There is a bit to digest with these race dates," George said. "There are seemingly no clashes with our sales dates, but we need to see if there will be any possible ramifications. At this stage, it seems they have put together an interesting new race programme, and I think the industry needs to get behind it so it can achieve its stated aims."

Henrietta Tavistock, the Dowager Duchess of Bedford, has spent the past five decades propelling Bloomsbury Stud to global success, but when [Lot 187](#) enters the sale ring at Tattersalls next Tuesday, it will mark the start of the final act for her celebrated breeding and racing operation.

Three years ago, the Duchess dispersed all but the most treasured of her New Zealand-based stock, and the remaining English yearlings--of which there are eight--will be sold at the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. A further 15 mares, three fillies and 10 foals from Bloomsbury will pass through the Park Paddocks ring at the Tattersalls December Sale, and then the curtain will fall.

The Duchess bought her first foal in 1965, resurrecting the famous Bedford silks that had lain unused by successive Dukes for a century. She set about passionately transforming her husband's family seat at Woburn Abbey, Bedfordshire, from a working agricultural farm into a thriving stud farm, built around the club-footed mare Mrs Moss

produced 11 winners from 15 foals. Among her five black-type scorers were G1 Japan Cup winner Jupiter Island (GB) (St Paddy {GB}) and the high-class two-year-olds Precocious (GB) (Mummy's Pet {GB}), Pushy (GB) (Sharpen Up {GB}) and Krayyan (GB) (Tower Walk {GB}).

Mrs Moss's influence is in strong evidence among the stud's offerings at Tattersalls October Yearling Sale. The mare appears as third dam to both of Bloomsbury's Book 1 yearlings, the first being a Nayef (Gulch) colt out of G2 Sun Chariot S. winner Danceabout (GB) (Shareef Dancer).

"He's a really lovely colt," said the Duchess. "Some of the Nayef's are quite leggy, but if you mix it with Mrs Moss, you have a much more compact horse. He looks like he is going to be a two-year-old rather than a late-developing horse."

"The Oasis Dream (GB) (Green Desert) colt [[lot 256](#)] out of First (Highest Honor {Fr}) is a full-brother to Perfect Stride (Oasis Dream {GB}), who is a black-type horse," she added. "I also have an Oasis Dream filly in Book 2 and, in the December Sale, I have a foal by Oasis Dream and a mare in foal to him. For once I've gone along with the right stallion."

Looking deeper into the sale, the Duchess remarked, "In Book 2, we have a Medicean (GB) (Machiavellian) filly out of Ego (GB) (Green Desert) [[lot 1014](#)], who was out of Myself (GB) (Nashwan) out of Pushy. Myself is now in New Zealand and has a very nice O'Reilly (NZ) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) filly this year. She gave Lammtarra (Nijinsky II) weight and was beaten a head in the Washington Singer as a two-year-old."

The Duchess still splits her time between New Zealand and England.

"I sold the stud in New Zealand and quite a lot of the stock, but what I didn't sell when we had the dispersal sale in New Zealand were the old mares and the fillies that I had in training--Myself was among those we kept. It's three years hence, and it's amazing how quickly they replicate."

"I'm a New Zealand resident, so I spend half and half in both places," she continued. "My three children live here in England, and the horses are in New Zealand."

It is impossible to escape Mrs Moss's legacy at Bloomsbury Stud. Her descendants continue to make an impact in Europe and Australasia.

"I never dreamt it would turn out like this and, had it not been for Mrs Moss, it probably wouldn't have," declared the Duchess. "She cost 2,100gns, and is now the ancestress of 161 individual winners, which is really quite a lot for one little mare. We have a very exciting one in the Southern Hemisphere called Precedence (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), who is a grandson of her High Line (GB) (High Hat {GB}) daughter. He is in training with Bart Cummings and is in the betting for this year's Melbourne Cup."

"Also from the same line is Tavistock (NZ) (Montjeu {Ire}), who has just been retired to Patrick Hogan's stud. He's by Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) out of a mare by Quest For Fame (GB) (Rainbow Quest), out of the same High Line daughter of Mrs Moss, and he won two Group 1s over seven furlongs and a mile, which is not what you expect from Montjeu. So Mrs Moss is making her impact now Down Under, which is lovely."

Come December, Bloomsbury Stud will cease as an operational entity, but what of Woburn's future, and the family's association with Thoroughbred breeding and racing?

"We have the stud farm at Woburn on the market to lease because, over the years, we have developed it into an excellent 280 acres, and it's really well-fenced and beautifully laid-out," said the Duchess. "It just seemed a shame, after putting as much effort into making it a really nice stud, to let it go back to being a farm again.

"Several people have looked at it and, hopefully, it will get leased. I have got such a good team running it that it would be very nice if it all continued."

But the Duchess is confident her connection to the stud has not ended.

"I would imagine the family would take it on again in the future," she said. "My oldest son [Andrew, Duke of Bedford and a Tattersalls director], who runs Woburn now has a tremendous amount on his hands and he has a very young family--they're only nine and five."

While the Duchess is philosophical about the upcoming dispersal, she admits there will be tough moments later this year.

"I have always sold yearlings, so that won't cause too much emotion, but in December the mares will be very difficult to sell," she said. "I have been breeding horses for 45 years, so it's going to be quite painful."--*David Morgan*

Another Golden Acord for Oakgrove?

Rudolf Valentino (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) gave the team at his Wales-based consignor Oakgrove Stud a pleasant surprise when topping last year's Tattersalls October Yearling Sale Book 1 at 700,000gns, and there are high hopes for the colt's Green Desert (Danzig) three-parts sister, who is catalogued as [Lot 400](#) next Wednesday.

Rudolf Valentino has since clinched a win and a Group 3 placing for Coolmore, further justifying Oakgrove Stud owner John

Deer's decision to pay 320,000gns for the colt's dam Maganda (Sadler's Wells) at the 2007 Tattersalls December Sale.

"I nearly had a heart attack when the boss bought Maganda, but she is a gorgeous mare," said Oakgrove Stud's Manager Tim Lane. "We thought her colt last year was a nice horse, but we didn't think he would make that amount. You think the sale-topper is going to be a horse with massive updates to the pedigree. He just seemed to tick all the right boxes, so it was a bit of a shock, but a real thrill.

"Her filly this year is probably not a typical Green Desert in that his progeny are often small, but she has size and scope as well as quality," Lane added. "She is a lot like a colt, with a great walk. We had Darley look at her twice in early spring, and someone came to see her the other day. It's not often that people come to look at them here, because we are in Wales--I don't think people like to pay to come over the Severn Bridge!"

Deer, who founded the high-tech tool business Renishaw, and was valued at £88 million in the 2010 *Sunday Times* Rich List, had a small broodmare team at Fawley Stud in Oxfordshire before buying Oakgrove Stud, near Chepstow in South Wales, a decade ago. Lane has been a key member of the team for the past six years. The stud has a further two yearlings catalogued in Book 1 and five in Book 2.

"We have a Shamardal (Giant's Causeway) colt in Book 1 who is out of Oystermouth (GB) (Averti {Ire}) [[lot 486](#)], a half-sister to Patavellian (Ire) (Machiavellian) and a full-sister to Avonbridge (GB) (Averti {Ire})," continued Lane. "He is the mare's first foal and he is a lovely horse. He is typically Shamardal in that he is a bit coarse to look at, but he is very athletic. He doesn't have the most attractive head, but there is an awful lot to like about him physically.

"The other in Book 1 is an Oasis Dream colt out of Royal Jade (GB) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) [[lot 557](#)] from a very good speed family. He has a bit of size about him and is a really nice horse--he looks speedy."

Deer has enjoyed no shortage of success as an owner-breeder via the likes of Averti and the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye-winning half-brothers Patavellian and Avonbridge, and he is now striving to establish a niche among the big-hitters at the yearling sales. To achieve those aims, Oakgrove has been upgrading its mares, a process that has seen Maganda joined by further purchases, via advisor Amanda Skiffington, such as the unraced three-year-old Flag Day (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), out of Darley's G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Blue Duster (Danzig) and from the family of triple Group 1 winner Special Duty (GB) (Hennessy). She traces back to U.S. champion filly Chris Evert (Swoon's Son).

"We took a view that the farm needed a bit of a shake-up to try and move on and compete in the top league at the sales," said Lane, adding, "Maganda has a lovely Green Desert weanling. I'm not sure where she will go next, but she is in foal to Oasis Dream again. She has given everything a bit of a wake-up call here--she's helping it all move forward.

"We bought Flag Day [for 115,000gns] at the Tattersalls July Sale, and she is from a great family. She is a nice-looking filly and we are not sure yet where we will go with her, but she is definitely something to look forward to.

“We picked up two mares at the Tattersalls December Sale last year. We bought a Lear Fan mare called Triple Edition [for 220,000gns] from the Special Duty family-- a very good Juddmonte family. We also bought an Orpen mare called Lady Grace (Ire) [for 170,000gns], who is a listed winner and Group 3-placed.”

Despite the little buying spree, Oakgrove will trim the broodmare band in the near future.

“Right now we have 26 mares on the farm, and we are looking to get it down to under 20 by the end of the year,” Lane explained. “I think the boss will buy one, possibly two, and we have a few to go to the sales, so if we can move them on we can invest in one more good mare at least.” --David Morgan

Redvers Busy on All Fronts

At Keeneland’s September Yearling Sale, one European agent conspicuously stood out on the buyers’ list. David Redvers--also owner of Tweenhills Stud in Gloucestershire--bought 11 lots for \$1,835,000, including a \$420,000 Tapit colt, for someone who could potentially become one of racing’s biggest players in coming years.

Sheikh Fahad Al Thani is a young member of Qatar’s ruling family and, racing as Pearl Bloodstock, has invested throughout this year, both at the sales and privately, in his British and Irish racing string before shooting to prominence when buying

G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois winner Makfi (GB) (Dubawi) as a stallion prospect in a multi-million pound deal.

Makfi will retire to Tweenhills Stud after running in the GI Breeders’ Cup Mile on November and Redvers, who is at Goffs this week, is building up to a busy fortnight at Tattersalls, where he will both a buyer and seller.

Tweenhills has not consigned yearlings in the recent past but, following a change in personnel, has five lots in Book 1, nine in Book 2 and one in Book 3.

“We’ve had a slight change on strategy at the stud farm with Ben Hyde coming in as stud groom and he has been responsible for selling one sale-topper at Newmarket already when he had the same role at Templeton Stud,” said Redvers. “He was keen, as part of his role for Tweenhills, to sell again. He has a huge amount of experience and knows all the big players in the marketplace, so that won’t encroach on my work as a bloodstock agent. It doesn’t stop Highclere Stud and [joint-owner] John Warren, being one of the most successful vendors and buyers, respectively.”

[Lot 212](#) is a full-brother to this season’s Group 3-placed juvenile Khawatim (GB) (Intikhab), while a duo in Book 2 have both had significant updates. [Lot 1262](#) is a Dubawi (Ire) half-sister to recent G3 Tower S. winner Dingle View (Ire) (Mujadil), while [Lot 857](#) is a full-brother to Coolmore’s Breeders’ Cup-bound facile Wokingham Handicap winner Laddies Poker Two (Ire) (Choisir {Aus}).

But it could be even more as a buyer that Redvers, who continues to work for existing clients such as trainer Ralph Beckett, is in the headlines in the coming weeks.

“Sheikh Fahad is wildly enthusiastic about racing, he absolutely loves the sport,” offered Redvers. “He’s only a young man and shares the ambition of anybody investing a lot of time and money into the sport. We want to be winning the big races on the big stage as much as possible. I’m optimistic we’ll be buying some nice horses at Tattersalls, but not expecting to be massively busier than we have been in previous years.”

Redvers revealed that all the Keeneland purchases will initially race in Europe as two-year-olds next year.

“The horses we bought in America will all be coming back to Europe,” he continued. “We took the view that having a two-year-old-in-training in the U.S. can be a vet’s benefit. We thought we’d bring them back, give them a nice European introduction and, those that are more traditionally dirt-bred and warrant it, will be sent back to America for their three-year-old careers.”

Redvers was happy with the market at Keeneland, but cautions that without serious Maktoum involvement in Newmarket, the 2,229-lot October Yearling Sale will struggle.

“If you compare to where we were four years ago, it was facile buying a nice horse in Kentucky, but if you compare to the last couple of years it was healthy, we were underbidder as often as we got one,” he said. “Tattersalls Book 1 is the strongest catalogue in terms of pedigrees I’ve ever seen at Newmarket and, if there’s no strength in depth there, then the knock-on effect to the cheaper horses will be huge. Their prices will make the yearlings that have already been sold look expensive. Everything revolves about how much Dubai involvement in the market there is. If there’s the same amount seen at the sales so far this year, then things are going to be dreadful at Newmarket and we’re in trouble. You only have to look at the percentage that have gone to Dubai-based ownership in the last three years. It’s huge. It’s certainly happened in Europe so far that people have stepped in, because the Maktoums have not been participating, but the domestic market will only go so far. Despite the new people, there still aren’t enough players to replace any vacuum left by the Maktoums.”

But there is no doubting the project that most excites Redvers at present is the builders’ work on Tweenhills ahead of Makfi’s arrival this fall.

“Makfi is the most exciting thing that has happened in my professional life, it’s hard to explain what an impact it makes on what we do,” Redvers, who turned 40 this

year, said. “Everything I’ve been working towards in the last 15 years has been heading towards this point. We’re doubling the size of the office and staff accommodation, redoing the covering yard to the highest spec, bringing in a new mare reception area and a new feed room. We are pushing the boat out to get all the jobs done that I’d been building towards. We’re having to reducing the number of mares we have and things like the cattle numbers we have here! Between ourselves and Sheikh Fahad, we’ll undoubtedly be

buying top-quality mares to go to Makfi over the next three months.”

Despite his defeat on Saturday, Makfi is still on target for the GI Breeders’ Cup Mile and his fee will not be set until after that race.

“I can guarantee the minimum fee he will stand at will be £25,000, but haven’t decided on the upper end,” Redvers added. “It depends what happens at the Breeders’ Cup and we won’t set it until Nov. 7. It’s highly unlikely we’ll syndicate the horse, but it’s likely that we’ll offer some restricted breeding rights for those breeders who will send him their very best mares.”

Redvers was outbid by Coolmore for Canford Cliffs (Ire) (Tagula {Ire}) as a prospective stallion, but has his sights on other targets.

“My aim is to have three stallions of a similar ilk over the next three years and there’s a strong chance we’ll get another for next year,” Redvers continued. “If there’s a horse out there that warrants the investments, then we’ll try and find him. There hasn’t been a horse like Makfi in private hands for 10 years that ticked every box. He has the best Shadwell pedigree, is by the best Darley sire and doesn’t belong to either of them. I’m just lucky to have clients able to invest in a resource in like that.”

We are likely to be hearing much more of Sheikh Fahad Al-Thani in years to come but, while his racing interests may be for fun, the stallion investment is done on a different level.

“Sheikh Fahad’s racing involvement is a different thing to Makfi,” explained Redvers. “The Makfi investment is a business decision done at a time of opportunity to make money. It’s a commercial thing driven by me and certainly not a rich man’s new toy.”

RECESSION ENDS FOR FIRST HALF OF SALE


The technocrats in the big wide world of economics decreed a while ago that a recession officially ends when the economy does not have two consecutive quarters of negative results--when things stop actually going lower. After Keeneland's September Sale, the world's largest and most important yearling supermarket, ended Sunday with single-figure gains in gross (three percent) and average (seven percent), it looks like we can declare the recession in Thoroughbred values over. It doesn't mean prices are suddenly climbing again --check back in 2013 and we'll see how that's been going--but it does mean prices do appear to have stopped falling. It's not just Keeneland, though it's of course the biggest and most important yearling sale; Ocala was up, Texas was up, Fairyhouse (Tattersalls Ireland) was up, Italy was up. None of these are up a lot, and heaven help those who research the percentage of profitable yearlings (14 percent is the worst I've ever seen, and this year wouldn't be far off it, due to the record 2008 stud fees). But at least the prices at these sales were marginally up from their 2009 lows.

The new Keeneland format presented a puzzle to observers as far as making comparisons while the sale was going on; as a few observers put it, we wouldn't really know until it finished what really happened. In going back over the session and Book totals, I think Keeneland Sales Director Geoff Russell came closest to the mark with his observation that exactly the same number of horses had sold in Books 1 and 2 this year as in the first five sessions last year: the 'first week' (four days) in 2009, plus the first day of last year's Book 3. Hopefully, all this intellectual surgery about days, books and sessions is a one-off; even though they are liable to tweak Book 1 next year, the 2011 sale should have roughly the same format as the one just completed, so comparisons should be easier.

Geoffrey made his observation at the end of this year's Book 2, which contained six sessions, although the first two night sessions of Book 1 would make more sense, comparatively, if they were treated as one day. Looking at it that way, in 2010 there was effectively one day of Book 1 plus four days of Book 2. Geoffrey's comparison was with last year's first five days: two days of Book 1, two days of Book 2, and the first day of Book 3, after the break. Even though it was really six days this year, in effect the comparison he made was five 'full' sessions this year versus five full sessions last year.

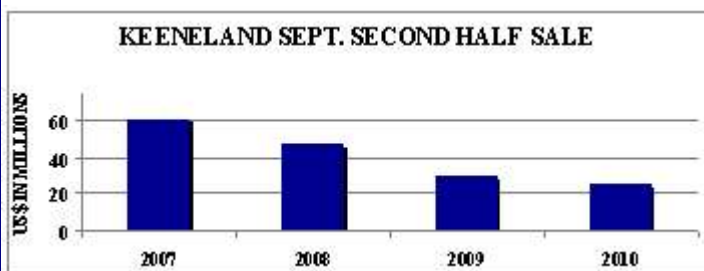

“The first half of the sale was plenty encouraging, as discussed in detail in the column. It’s a nightmare trying to find accurate comparisons with the format change, but these tables illustrate the grim reality of trying to sell in the second half of the sale: though, in this comparison, the number catalogued and sold were down from last year’s second half (by eight and nine percent respectively), the gross was down more (18 percent), and the average down by 10 percent. The 52 percent of yearlings catalogued in Books 4-6 accounted for only 12 percent of the gross, and averaged under \$16,000.” - Bill Oppenheim

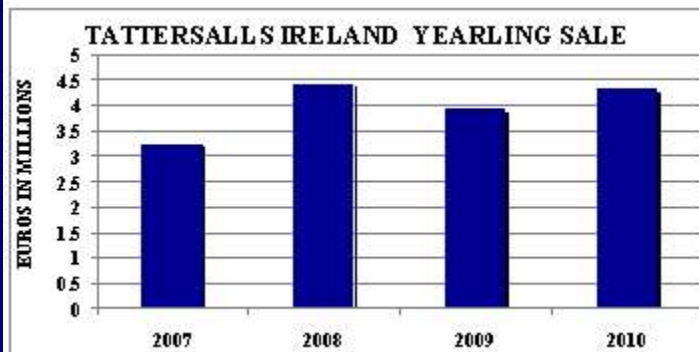

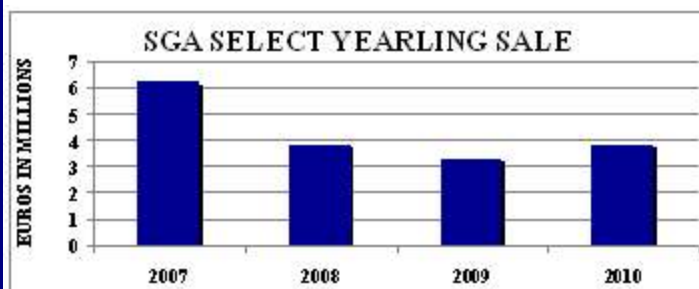

As the sale continued, I extended Geoffrey's principle to succeeding days, and I felt the comparison held up for two more days; in 2010, that was Book 3 (Sunday and Monday, the first two days after the break), but in 2009, it was the sixth and seventh sessions--the second day of 2009 Book 3 and the first day of 2009 Book 4. Those are the figures we ran last Tuesday (September 21, bottom of p. 8), and they showed that the first eight days this year (Books 1-3) did seem to compare with the first seven days last year (Books 1-3 plus Book 4, day one). Using that comparison, there were 102 fewer yearlings catalogued in 2010 (minus four percent), but 48 more yearlings sold (plus three percent). The gross for the eight sessions this year (effectively seven, if you combine the first two and call Book 1 this year effectively one session) was up seven percent, compared to the first seven sessions last year, and the average was up four percent. In 2010, in Books 1-3, a total of 2,349 yearlings were catalogued, of which 1,521 were listed as sold (65 percent of those catalogued). Books 1-3 in 2010 grossed \$173,754,200, and averaged \$114,237. In the comparable seven sessions last year, a total of 2,451 yearlings were catalogued, of which 1,473 were listed as sold--just 60 percent of those catalogued in last year's first seven sessions, which grossed \$162,033,000, and averaged \$110,002.

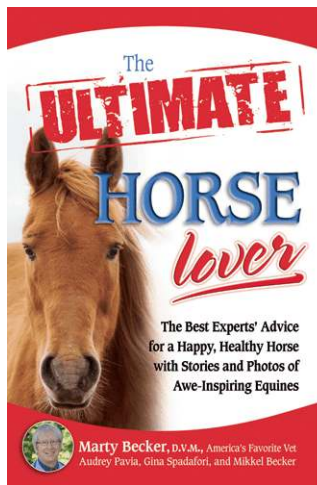
So it probably isn't as simple as saying 'first week,' 'second week,' as I was first inclined to do. It looks like the point of demarcation really was between Books 1-3 this year, and Books 4-6. Whereas last year the drop from day to day in the middle of the sale was gradual, this year it was quite dramatic: the average dropped from \$51,117 last Monday (second day of Book 3) to almost half that (\$26,921) on Tuesday, the first day of Book 4. Interestingly, this year's Books 1-3 catalogued 48 percent of the sale, so Books 4-6 catalogued 52 percent. Last year, the first seven sessions catalogued 47 percent of the sale, so the last seven sessions catalogued 53 percent; it's pretty close to half and half.

Which brings us to what happened in the second half of the sale, in other words, this year, the last six sessions, Books 4-6; and we compare those to the last seven sessions last year, the second day of Book 4 in 2009, plus Books 5, 6, and 7. It wasn't pretty last year, and the recession isn't over for that half of the catalogue. Last year (see Weekly Sales Ticker), in what we can probably accurately call "the second half of the sale," there were 2,737 yearlings catalogued, of which 1,686 sold, grossing \$29,826,200, and averaging \$17,691. This year, in the last six sessions, there were 2,508 catalogued, of which 1,538 were listed as sold, averaging \$15,932. This year, eight percent fewer yearlings were catalogued in the 'second half,' and nine percent fewer were sold. But the gross was down by 18 percent, and the average was down by 10 percent; in the first half of the sale, though four percent fewer were catalogued, three percent more were sold, for a seven percent gain in gross, and a four percent gain in average. In the first half of the sale this year, a total of 1,521 yearlings were sold for an average of \$114,237; in the second half, a total of 1,538 yearlings were sold, for an average of \$15,932. Reality doesn't get much starker than that.

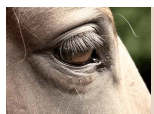

Sheikh Mohammed's purchase of the McNairs' Stonerside operation in the summer of 2008 has already begun to pay dividends. For example, the yearlings and weanlings included in the 2008 deal included Willing Foe, a potentially smart Dynaformer three-year-old, and White Moonstone, an unbeaten Dynaformer two-year-old. The latter heads the betting for next year's 1000 Guineas following her victory in the Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile.

In winning the Fillies' Mile, White Moonstone became no less than the 11th daughter of the Three Chimneys veteran to become a Group 1/Grade I winner. Even though Dynaformer has hit the classic target with his sons Barbaro and Lucarno, the female of the Dynaformer species is proving deadlier than the male, accounting for 11 of his 17 winners at the highest level on the flat.

White Moonstone ranks alongside the likes of Riskaverse, Gozip Girl, Film Maker, Collect the Cash, Sand Springs, Dynaforce, Starrer, Harmonious and Rainbow View, winner of the 2008 Fillies' Mile. White Moonstone is also the ninth of these fillies to have gained a Group 1/Grade I victory on turf, the sole exceptions being Critical Eye and Starrer.

White Moonstone has more in common with several of her fellow Grade I winners than just a liking for turf, as she is yet another example of Dynaformer's affinity for mares from the Mr. Prospector line.

In fact, the first two generations of the pedigree of her dam Desert Gold contain a combination of stallions which made Desert Gold a pretty safe bet to produce a gem to Dynaformer. Desert Gold's sire Seeking the Gold ranks as the broodmare sire of 27 foals of racing age by Dynaformer. Of the 18 which have started, 15 are winners and White Moonstone follows Riskaverse and the Grade III winner Vacation as the third to score at group or graded level. Another four members of this sample have finished second or third at graded level and this cross has an Average Earnings Index of 5.37.

It has been a similar story with Dynaformer's progeny out of Mr. Prospector mares. Here the figures stand at 24 starters from 32 foals and the 15 winners feature Film Maker, the smart Masseur and the 2010 Grade III winner Haka (plus the NSA-II hurdles winner Tax Ruling). This time the Average Earnings Index stands at 3.99.

You will hardly need me to remind you that Dynaformer has also excelled with mares by Mr. Prospector's sons Carson City and Kingmambo. Barbaro was his greatest achievement with Carson City mares, while his 11 foals out of Kingmambo mares include the Grade I winners Gozzip Girl and Wiener Walzer and the smart English filly Ocean Silk.

Desert Gold was bred and owned in partnership by Joanne H. Nor and Stonerside. This daughter of Seeking the Gold was a talented performer at around a mile and an eighth as a four-year-old in 2003, when she won the Mariah's Storm S. prior to finishing runner-up in the GIII Gardenia H. That said, Desert Gold wasn't quite as good as her sister-in-blood Sahara Gold. Bred by Nor from her GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Desert Stormer, Sahara Gold was acquired by the McNairs after she failed to find a buyer at \$1,450,000 as a yearling.

She must have given her new owners considerable pleasure, as her finest victory came in the Stonerside-sponsored Beaumont S., a Grade II event over seven furlongs. She also proved a goldmine as a broodmare, with yearling sons by A.P. Indy selling for \$3,000,000 and \$3,400,000. The latter, Sahara Heat, won the GIII Marine S. over 1 1/16 miles.

White Moonstone's dam Desert Gold is another bred to a very successful pattern. She is one of 53 foals sired by Seeking the Gold from daughters of Storm Cat and she ranks among this cross's eight black-type winners, alongside four graded winners.

Dynaformer has also done well with Storm Cat mares, siring four graded winners from 35 foals. Among them are this year's good fillies Harmonious, winner of the GI American Oaks, and It's Tea Time, a close second in the GI Ashland S. prior to taking the GIII Lake Placid S.

Rainbow View, Dynaformer's last winner of the Fillies Mile, was widely expected to become a dual Classic winner at three, but she was never asked to tackle a distance as long as a mile and a half following her defeat in the Oaks. A mile and a half is also likely to test White Moonstone, especially as her second dam is a sister to a GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner, but a mile and a quarter could well be within the scope of this admirable filly.

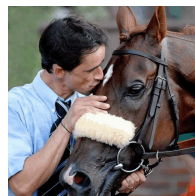
