RACHEL ALEXANDRA RETIRED

Reigning Horse of the Year **Rachel Alexandra** (Medaglia d'Oro--Lotta Kim, by Roar) has been retired, majority owner Jess Jackson announced Tuesday. The four-year-old, who is owned by Jackson's Stonestreet Stables and Harold McCormick, was coming off a disappointing second in the GI Personal Ensign S. She posted a bullet four-furlong drill at Saratoga Monday. "As you know, despite top training and a patient campaign, Rachel Alexandra did not return to her 2009 form," said Jackson in a statement. "I believe it's time to retire our champion and reward her with a less stressful life. We are delighted that she will retire healthy and happy to our beautiful farm in Kentucky."

Jackson said Rachel Alexandra will be bred to another Horse of the Year he co-owned, Lane's End's Curlin (Smart Strike). Winner of last year's GI Kentucky Oaks, GI Preakness S., GI Haskell Invitational, GI Woodward S. and GI Mother Goose S., Rachel Alexandra retires with a record of 19-13-5-0 and earnings of \$3,506,730. **Cont. p2**

KINGMAMBO PENSIONED

Lane's End Farm announced Tuesday that leading sire **Kingmambo** (Mr. Prospector--Miesque, by Nureyev) has been pensioned from stud duties. The 20-year-old stallion had stood at the Kentucky nursery since entering stud in 1994. "He's one of the great stallions of all time," said Lane's End's Will Farish. "He has sired Classic horses, sprinters, and milers." A winner of three Group 1 races for the Niarchos family, the bay

has been represented by 21 Grade/Group 1 winners to date, including champions Lemon Drop Kid and Russian Rhythm. In recent years, he had suffered from an arthritic condition in his neck. **Cont. p12**

GALILEO REIGNS AT GOFFS

Since accounting for four of the top five lots at Arqana's August Sale and the topper at Baden-Baden, Galileo (Ire)'s claim as one of Europe's most important patriarchs has been furthered by the exploits of his brilliant son Frankel (GB). It is commonplace at present that his progeny dominate the major auctions, and his influence was certainly felt during yesterday's opening session of Goffs Orby Sale. Coolmore's number one resident was responsible for two of the top four lots, including a daughter who co-topped the session at €300,000 (*US\$407,430*), while his son Teofilo (Ire) shared that top price with the day's prized colt. It was Demi O'Byrne who lit the blue touchpaper early on in the trading when securing Galileo's jewel of the Croom House Stud consignment. From one of the leading French families, [lot 12](#) is out of a winning 3/4-sister to the 2007 G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine and GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup third Coquerelle (Ire) (Zamindar), and is therefore a descendant of Luth de Saron (Fr), whose dynasty encompasses a host of top-class runners, including the sires Roi Normand and Luth Dancer. "She's a lovely, lovely filly and a fabulous mover, while the stallion speaks for himself," O'Byrne summed up.

First and Gold...

Bred by Dolphus C. Morrison, Rachel Alexandra was the first foal produced by Morrison's SW & GSP Lotta Kim (Roar), and hailed from the first crop of her sire,

Medaglia d'Oro. Morrison, a commercial breeder, entered Rachel Alexandra in the 2006 Keeneland November Sale as a weanling, but scratched her after x-rays revealed what he considered minor flaws that, nonetheless, might compromise her value in the ring. Morrison's decision to keep and race the filly got a boost by overwhelmingly positive reports from Jimmy Dodwell, the manager at Diamond D Ranch in Lone Oak, Texas--where

she was being broken.

Sent to trainer Hal Wiggins, Rachel Alexandra made an inauspicious debut at odds of 26-1 in May of her two-year-old year, finishing a well-beaten sixth going 4 1/2 furlongs at Churchill. She was a 12-1 shot when graduating in her next over five furlongs at Churchill, which preceded a runner-up finish to Garden District (Dixie Union) in the GIII Debutante S. at the end of June. "Rachel" returned to take her second win in a six-furlong dash over Keeneland's Polytrack in October, then was the beaten favorite when second to Sara Louise (Malibu Moon) in the GIII Pocohantas S. back at Churchill. Turning the tables on that rival in her season finale, she earned her first black-type win in the GII Golden Rod S. under the Twin Spires in late November.

At that point, Rachel Alexandra, a piece of whom had been sold to Michael Laufer, had yet to run two turns and hadn't started in a Grade I race. She could have been any of a half-dozen promising but unproven young fillies in a given year. But she began to show signs that she was indeed something very special early in her three-year-old season. Sent around two turns for the first time in the Martha Washington S. at Oaklawn, she dazzled by eight lengths in February of 2009, then added the GII Fair Grounds Oaks by an eased-down margin in March. In Oaklawn's GII Fantasy S. in April, Rachel aired by nearly nine lengths.

Those efforts ensured heavy favoritism in the GI Kentucky Oaks, and while the anointed often fail to show at their own coronations, Rachel put on a show at 1-5 odds. In a performance as easy as it was impressive, she unleashed a record-setting 20 1/4-length dismantling of the Oaks field that left writers grasping for superlatives.

"I've never been on a horse that good, to tell you the truth," her regular rider Calvin Borel flatly. Many wondered if Rachel Alexandra ran a day early at Churchill, but Morrison said he had no regrets of not running in the Derby, and added that she wouldn't race in the Preakness or Belmont, either. "No sir, the Triple Crown races are to showcase the future stallions of our industry, and fillies should run with fillies, and stallions with stallions," Morrison said at the time.



Move to Stonestreet...

While there had been plenty of buyers looking to purchase his charge privately in the weeks and months before the Oaks, Wiggins admitted to being somewhat surprised when he received a call from Morrison in the days just *after* the race, saying that an offer had been made that, frankly, couldn't be refused. The Stonestreet vetting team would be over to inspect her presently. And when Jess Jackson and partner Harold McCormick officially announced they had purchased Rachael for an undisclosed sum, they quickly reversed Morrison's line-- Rachel would be supplemented to the GI Preakness S. at a cost of \$100,000 and run against the boys.



'Rachel' before the Oaks...

Transferred to trainer Steve Asmussen and sent off the 8-5 choice in the second leg of the Triple Crown over Derby hero

Mine That Bird (Birdstone), Rachel raced wide in the early going while setting an honest tempo. She opened up by four lengths in the lane, and dug in as the Derby winner closed fast. The wire came in time and she won by a length, becoming the first female to capture the race since Nellie Morse in 1924. Borel, who opted to stay on Rachel despite winning the Run for the Roses aboard Mine That Bird, earned the rare distinction of taking the first two legs of the Triple Crown aboard different horses.



...and after the Preakness

The effort seemed to gain further luster when Borel opined that Rachel didn't handle the track well. "She struggled a lot," Borel said. "She's so used to that track at Churchill. She was struggling at the end. She'd never been hit before. The more I asked her, the more she struggled."

It was Jackson and Asmussen's second Preakness victory. They paired to win the race two years earlier with Curlin. Cont. p4

Earning Horse of the Year Honors...

Connections gave consideration to a tilt in the Belmont, but ultimately returned Rachel to her own sex in her next outing, an easy 19-length dismissal of subsequent Grade I winners Malibu Prayer (Malibu Moon) and Flashing (A.P. Indy) in the GI Mother Goose at Belmont in late June. But she was back against males before long. Favored once again, this time in the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth, she delivered arguably her greatest performance, defeating the GI Belmont S. hero--and later GI Travers S. and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup winner--Summer Bird (Birdstone) by six resounding lengths in the slop. She joined Serena's Song (Rahy) as just the second filly to win the Haskell.

"She's just a tremendous filly, and I'm glad she put on a good show," Steve Asmussen said. "She's very special. She's been able to separate herself from everyone else."

One horse she hadn't separated herself from, at least in the minds of some, was the older mare Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}). The possibility of a Breeders' Cup showdown at Santa Anita was taken off the table earlier in the year when Jackson stated he wouldn't run Rachel over synthetics, and so Eclipse voters wouldn't have the luxury of a head-to-head match-up when it came to judging Horse of the Year honors. As it turned out, Jackson effectively won the balloting when he sent Rachel out to victory in Saratoga's GI Woodward S. against older males. Starting as the 1-5 chalk, Rachel set crisp :46 2/5 and 1:10 2/5 splits and courageously staved off the challenge of Macho Again (Macho Uno) to win the nine-furlong race by a diminishing neck. She became the first female winner in the race's 56-year history. "It might have taken a couple of years off my life, but it was worth it," Asmussen smiled afterward.

Connections decided Rachel had done enough for the year: eight wins at seven different tracks, five in Grade I company, three against males, one against older males. And despite Zenyatta's own dazzling heroics in the GI Breeder's Cup Classic, Rachel was named Horse of the Year by a convincing margin. The vote tally was 130 to 99. She was also named champion 3yo filly.

Disappointing 2010 for the Champ...

After a three-year-old campaign unequaled by a female in racing history, Rachel had a lot to live up to in 2010. A rainy winter in New Orleans comprised her training at Fair Grounds, and when she reappeared after a six-month break, she failed to hold off Zardana (Brz)

(Crimson Tide {Ire}) in the New Orleans Ladies S. Mar. 13. A planned meeting with Zenyatta in Oaklawn's GI Apple Blossom S. was soon scuttled, and Rachel against runner-up in the GII La Troienne at Churchill Apr. 30, this time to Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled's Song). It seemed apparent she just wasn't the same

filly. Rachel subsequently notched easy wins in the GII Fleur de Lis S. at Churchill June 12 and in the Lady's Secret S. at Monmouth July 24, but a no-excuse second to the rallying Persistently (Smoke Glacken) in the GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga Aug. 29 would prove to be her career finale.

"Rachel Alexandra owes us nothing," Jess Jackson said yesterday. "As a three-year-old, she set standards and records that no filly before her ever achieved. And I suspect it will be quite a while before a three-year-old filly ever equals or surpasses her achievements. Although her fans were thrilled by a series of spectacular victories, I believe they, as we, were simply awed time and again by her sheer beauty, courage and athleticism."

Asmussen kept a similar perspective. "I have been blessed to have been part of history," he said. "We are all very fortunate that Rachel carried the banner following Curlin's amazing success story. The fans adored her, we all did. She had the most fluid and beautiful stride of any horse I have ever seen. It's been quite a ride."

Jackson concluded, "On behalf of my partner Hal McCormick, I want to thank Steve Asmussen, Scott Blasi and the entire Asmussen racing team for their immense contributions to Rachel's success story. And last but not far from least let me thank the great Calvin Borel.

"Now we are looking to the future. We are eager to introduce Rachel to Curlin. Imagine what possibilities those two super horses might produce."

Shortly after yesterday's announcement, Fair Grounds announced it had renamed the Tiffany Lass S. in honor of Rachel Alexandra. The Grade III event will be held next Feb. 19.

Setting the Table...

Three lots before securing the day's top-priced filly, Demi O'Byrne was forced to see off Blandford when paying €200,000 for a son of Danehill Dancer (Ire) ([lot 9](#)) from a distinguished Wertheimer family. Consigned by Clare Castle on behalf of Paget Bloodstock, the half-brother to listed-placed Cote Quest (Green Desert) is out of a half to the dual Group 3 winner and 2004 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club runner-up Prospect Park (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and his full-brother, the 2008 G2 Prix Greffulhe hero and G1 Grand Prix de Paris second Prospect Wells (Fr).

Omnipresent Ogden...

Fresh from celebrating his first top-level success on the flat with the G1 Irish St Leger hero Sans Frontieres (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), one-time jumps supremo Sir Robert Ogden was seeking to supplement his burgeoning team of class acts in this sphere. Ogden, highly active on the yearling circuit so far in 2010, was at the forefront again yesterday with a trio of choice colts, led by Teofilo's aforementioned joint-topper. Consigned by Paddy Twomey's Hawthorn Villa Stud as [lot 179](#), the February-foaled bay is a grandson of the top-class High Heeled Hope (Salt Lake), who is also the dam of 2008 GIII Endine H. winner and G1 Test S. runner-up Sweet Hope (Lemon Drop Kid) and stakes-placed Highgate Park (A.P. Indy). His page includes the highly regarded and talented Ballydoyle runner Jupiter Pluvius (Johannesburg), who failed to build on his two-year-old promise after winning the 2007 G3 Killavullan S. Not surprisingly, it was Teofilo's breeder, owner and trainer Jim Bolger who made his presence felt in the ring, but he had to surrender when the bidding reached €300,000. "We had bought one Teofilo already at Deauville, and this horse really showed himself well," said Ogden's Racing Manager Barry Simpson. "He did everything required of him, and looks to have an excellent temperament. He's an exciting type." Earlier, Ogden paid €240,000 for Barouche Stud's [lot 158](#), the sole representative of Medaglia d'Oro to sell this week. His second dam is the 1999 GII Adirondack S. heroine Regally Appealing (Valid Appeal) from the family of Rockport Harbor. "The stallion is very hot at the moment and this colt fit the profile of what we were looking for," Simpson added. "He really looked like a quality sort." The third of the Knighted entrepreneur's high-profile purchases was [lot 137](#), Noreland's Stud's son of Acclamation (GB) from a family cultivated by Baron Edouard de Rothschild. Out of a half to dual group-winning stayer Epitre (Fr) (Common Grounds {GB}), the February-foaled bay was secured for €160,000.

Just Like a Dream...

Since retiring to Banstead Manor Stud, Oasis Dream (GB) has established a reputation for producing a wide range of top-class performers, and the pick of his progeny have come to command large premiums. That was the case again yesterday as the extra, [lot 125](#), a grandson of the stellar Gainsborough flagbearer Hatoof (Irish River {Fr}), was sold for €250,000. The youngster hailed from Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud. Initially purchased for €160,000 at Arqana December, he was bought back at Deauville last month at €170,000, a move that was justified after Alex Cole's final bid on behalf of owners Jim and Fitri Hay. "He's a very nice colt by a top stallion and was a welcome addition to the catalogue," Cole explained.

Park Express...

David and Patricia Thompson's Cheveley Park Stud took home a pair of leading lights among the potential broodmare prospects. [Lot 156](#) was a stand-out on paper, being by Galileo out of the late Dr. Vincent O'Brien's top-class sprinter-miler Grecian Dancer (GB) (Dansili {GB}). Consigned by Seamus Burns's Lodge Park Stud, her dam was progressing quickly when she was in foal with this filly in 2008, and followed a first pattern success in the G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. with a third in the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot on her final start. Her predominantly fast family includes the 2002 G2 Flying Childers winner Wunders Dream (Ire) (Averti {Ire}) and the top-class Hong Kong performers Firebolt (Ire) (Flying Spur {Aus}) and Mensa (GB) (Rudimentary). "She's an especially good-looking filly out of a very good racemare, and her pedigree will enhance the broodmare band back home," Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson explained. [Lot 151](#) was offered by Ballylinch Stud, and her precocious and highly talented dam was one of the stars of the Richard Hannon stable in her day, which is where this March-foaled bay is also headed after being knocked down to Ross Doyle. Red Clubs (Ire) (Red Ransom), who was taken out of stud duties at Tally-Ho Stud earlier this year, also made an impact, with two of his first set of yearlings to sell for six figures. Heading that duo was [lot 47](#) from Eddie O'Leary's Lynn Lodge Stud. He will join Barry Hills, who trained the sire and also this colt's G3 Craven S.-winning half-brother Killybegs (Ire) (Orpen), after BBA Ireland secured him for €130,000. "He was an outstanding colt," that organisation's Adrian Nicoll commented. "I bought his sire and I bought his brother, and there was a lot to like about him."

Another Hills trainee represented by his first yearlings is the 2007 G1 Middle Park S. winner Dark Angel (Ire) (Acclamation {GB}), and he also had two to make it into the magic six-figure bracket. [Lot 88](#) from the draft of the O'Callaghans' Yeomonstown Stud fetched €115,000 from Bobby O'Ryan. She is a half-sister to the Desert Style (Ire) pair of group/graded performers Shermeen (Ire) and Mister Manannan (Ire). "She's a cracking filly and is a half-sister to two very smart horses already," O'Ryan said. "I've bought her for Dermot Weld."

Other first-crop gems were Hawthorn Villa Stud's [lot 18](#), another Teofilo who is a half-brother to the 2001 G2 Sun Chariot S. winner Independence (GB) (Selkirk), later the dam of the 2008 G1 Eclipse hero Mount Nelson (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) and last year's G2 Great Voltigeur scorer Monitor Closely (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}). He sold to Jim Bolger for €100,000.

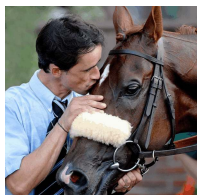

Lemaire Chooses Behkabad...

Jockey Christophe Lemaire's dilemma over which of His Highness The Aga Khan's two Arc hopefuls to partner, G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner **Behkabad (Fr)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) or G1 Prix de Diane victress **Sarafina (Fr)** (Refuse to Bend {Ire}), is at an end after the jockey opted for the former yesterday. Gerald Mosse will pick up the plum spare ride aboard ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆** Sarafina, who was third in the G1 Prix Vermeille over the Arc course and distance last time. "Christophe Lemaire has made up his mind and will ride Behkabad, and Gerald Mosse will be riding Sarafina," said The Aga Khan's racing manager Georges Rimaud. "I suppose Christophe feels Behkabad has a better chance, but I haven't spoken to him on that specific line. I think he feels the horse is right and is going to progress from his last race, even though he won it. Sarafina has come on since her last race and she worked Tuesday morning without any great sparkle, as she normally does, but the trainer was pleased with her work, and everything is on course with her as well." Rimaud added, "With a big field, let's hope there are no traffic problems. Behkabad needs a clear run through, and Sarafina has the acceleration that could get her out of trouble in an easier way, but that's racing and the Arc. It's a tough race. [Weather] conditions are not looking great; we have been getting some rain and we are to get some more this weekend, so we just have to deal with it. If we get some sunshine it might dry out a little, but it's a bit uncertain at the moment."

Lope De Vega to Be Supplemented...

With uncertain ground conditions causing concern for connections of some hopefuls, 26 remained engaged following yesterday's forfeit stage for Sunday's Arc, with the possibility of two further additions, dual Classic hero **Lope de Vega (Ire)** (Shamardal) and G2 Grand Prix de Deauville winner **Marinous (Fr)** (Numerous), at the €100,000 supplementary stage tomorrow. Trainer Andre Fabre, who initially indicated the Arc was not on Lope de Vega's agenda, will saddle the ☆ **"TDN Rising Star" ☆** in Sunday's €4-million contest after owner Dietrich von Boetticher of Gestut Ammerland decided the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 Prix du Jockey Club winner should take his chance. "Lope de Vega will be supplemented for the Arc," Fabre told *Racing Post*. "He's very well in himself, which is why we are taking our chance, but, of course, there is a big question mark about the distance. I'm more hopeful than confident he'll stay, but I'll leave talk about that to the 'experts.' It's not my money, but it's very sporting of the owner to decide to run. The horse looks on very good terms with himself mentally, which was the problem during the summer. Physically, he's in great shape."

Going Currently Soft...

Overcast conditions prevailed in Paris yesterday with continued grey skies and rain forecast until Saturday. "The going remains soft to very soft," Longchamp's clerk of the course Christian Delporte told *Racing Post*. "I have looked at various forecasts and they aren't all the same, but further rain is expected, although we don't know quite how much."



RACETRACK Round-Up

Canford Cliffs to Run Again this Year?

Though trainer Richard Hannon indicated last week that **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}) was unlikely to run again this term, he revealed yesterday that his star sophomore may not yet be done for the year after all. The G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, G1 St James's Palace S. and G1 Sussex S. hero was forced to miss Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot following an unsatisfactory scope last week, but a change of heart may see him embark on an end-of-season campaign. "The owners seem keen to have another run, though there is nothing left for him in Europe," said Hannon. "I suppose if he does go again, they will be looking at the [G1] Breeders' Cup Mile in Kentucky [Nov. 6], as well as Japan and Hong Kong. If they decide against travelling him this year, we'll pack him up until next season."

Dunlop Keen on a Day at the Opera

Trainer Ed Dunlop is set to run dual Oaks winner **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) in Sunday's G1 Prix de l'Opera, but has warned ground conditions must be in the distaffer's favor if she is to line up in the 10-furlong event at Longchamp. The G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Irish Oaks victress, a last-out fourth in the G1 St Leger S. at Doncaster Sept. 11, holds an alternative engagement in the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket Oct. 16, but France is the preferred option "I am pleased with Snow Fairy's condition, and the intention is to take our chance in the Prix de l'Opera, but we are very much ground dependant," Dunlop explained. "The going at Longchamp was good-to-soft on Saturday, but there is then the prospect of rain and it could be a significant amount, anything up to 16 millimeters, which would obviously be a big concern. We will need to reassess the weather situation Thursday and make a decision on whether to travel, but if we decide that the omens are not favourable, we will keep her back for the Champion S. at Newmarket."

4,695 Horses Cataloged for KEENOV...

A total of 4,695 horses have been catalogued for the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, to be held over 13 sessions from Nov. 8-20. The sale includes the dispersals of Robin Scully's Clovelly Farm, the North American holdings of Gonzalo Borges Torrealba's TNT Stud, and the stable of Irving Cowan, as well as a reduction of the Phipps Stable. Horses in training will be offered by accomplished stables such as Darley, Shadwell, Gary and Mary West and WinStar. The catalogue breaks down as such: 2,729 broodmares or broodmare prospects; 1,756 weanlings, 198 horses of racing age and 11 stallions. One stallion share will be offered. Catalogs for November will be available on Keeneland's website www.keeneland.com, beginning Tuesday, Oct. 5. Print catalogs will be mailed the week of Oct. 18.

Real Quiet Dies...

Real Quiet (Quiet American--Really Blue, by Believe It), who came within a flared nostril of becoming racing's 12th Triple Crown winner in 1998, suffered several fractured vertebrae and died in a "traumatic" accident in his paddock at Penn Ridge Farms Monday. He was 15 years old. "He was the reason I started the farm. Pennsylvania had never had a Kentucky Derby winner, so it was a big deal," said Penn Ridge's Michael Jester, who was also the syndicate manager. "He was a gentleman, had such class and was just a pleasure to be around. We loved him. He showed his greatness on the track and in the breeding shed and he will be greatly missed." Racing for Mike Pegram, the one-time \$17,000 yearling purchase closed out his freshman campaign with a victory in the GI Hollywood Futurity and was registering his first success at three when besting Victory Gallop (Cryptoclearance) in the Run for the Roses. He followed with a more decisive score in the GI Preakness S. before his narrow miss in the Belmont S. in which he carried a four-length advantage into the final furlong. During a consistent four-year-old season, the bay made five starts from coast to coast, becoming the first horse in a half-century to add the GI Pimlico Special H. to his Preakness win, and he overcame trouble to take the GI Hollywood Gold Cup in what would become his final appearance. He retired with a record of 20-6-5-6 and earnings of \$3,271,802, and entered stud at Vinery and then Taylor Made in Kentucky. Relocated to Pennsylvania, he stood at Regal Heir Farm and Pin Oak Lane Farm before moving to Penn Ridge. Real Quiet, who also shuttled to Australia and Uruguay, is the sire of 15 stakes winners, including two-time GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero Midnight Lute, who earned that division's Eclipse Award in 2007. He is also the sire of Grade I winners Pussycat Doll and Wonder Lady Anne L, and his progeny amassed earnings in excess of \$18 million.

When Stavros Niarchos's homebred Miesque was retired in 1989 following her historic second triumph in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, it didn't require much thought to book her to Claiborne stallion Mr. Prospector. Foaled in February 1990, Kingmambo established himself as a useful juvenile in winning one of six starts for trainer Francois Boutin. He finished second to champion Zafonic in the

G1 Prix de la Salamandre, and notched similar efforts in the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon and G3 Prix de Cabourg. After turning the tables on Zafonic in the Listed Prix Djebel in their 1993 opener, the Niarchos colorbearer doubled up victories in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains and G1 St. James's Palace S. He ran third in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, then captured the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp before finishing third in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot. The bay retired to Lane's End in 1994 with a career mark of 13-5-4-2 and earnings of \$733,139.

Classic Star...

Kingmambo stamped himself as a sire of international appeal when El Condor Pasa emerged from his first crop foaled in 1995. Carrying the colors of Takashi Watanabe, that bay colt reigned as Japan's champion

Drop Kid captured both the GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. on dirt. Kingmambo was later represented by Classic winners King's Best, the G1 2000 Guineas hero in 2000; Bluemamba, the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches victress the same spring; Russian Rhythm, winner of the 2003 G1 1000 Guineas and three other Group 1 events; Rule of Law, the 2004 G1 St. Leger S. victor; Divine Proportions, the 2005 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix de Diane heroine; Virginia Waters, who landed the G1 1000 Guineas in 2005; 2007 G1 Oaks S. winner Light Shift; Henrythenavigator, conqueror of the 2000 Guineas in England and Ireland in 2008, as well as the G1 St. James's Palace S. and G1 Sussex S. From 14 crops of racing age, Kingmambo has been represented by 76 black-type winners (9 percent of foals), and his offspring have amassed over \$87.2 million to date, according to *brisnet.com*. Ringside...

Kingmambo's offspring have been in demand ever since he established his international credentials as a sire. In 2006, Meydan City, a colt out of Crown of Crimson (Seattle Slew), became the first yearling to break the eight-figure barrier since Seattle Dancer in 1985 when he sold for \$11.7 million to John Ferguson at KEESEP in 2006. Other Kingmambos to bring over \$2 million include King's Consul, a son of Battle Creek Girl (His Majesty) who brought \$5.3 million in KEESEP in 2000; Russia, a \$3-million son of Seattle Way (Seattle Slew) at FTSAUG in 2001; Blue Glory, a colt out of Zuri (Danzig), made \$3.1 million at KEESEP in 2003, the same year that Ashaawes--a full to Meydan City--made \$2.85 million at the same venue; and Queenofalldiamonds, a filly out of Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}) who brought \$2.7 million at KEESP.

Wide Realm...

Though a consummate miler on the racecourse, Kingmambo's ability to get top-class runners at a variety of distances further added to his appeal. El Condor Pasa's success in both Japan and France at 12 furlongs furthered the appeal for Kingmambo progeny in the Far East, and King Kamehameha (Jpn) came along as Japan's champion three-year-old of 2004 with wins in the Tokyo Yushun (Japanese Derby) and NHK Mile Cup. He has become one of the leading young stallions in Japan with a pair of juvenile champions, Apapane (Jpn) and Rose Kingdom (Jpn) from his second crop in 2009 ([click here for Andrew Caulfield's column](#)).

Lemon Drop Kid, hero of the GI Futurity S. at two and a Classic winner at three, developed into an Eclipse Award winner at four in 2000. After a tepid start at stud, he has worked his way back into breeders' favors, and has millionaire Richard's Kid and GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Lemons Forever from his tally of five Grade I winners to date.

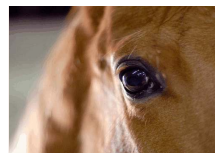
Top-class miler Henrythenavigator, out of Group 1 winner Sequoyah (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), ([click here for Andrew Caulfield's column](#)) capped his career with a brave second in the 10-furlong GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita in 2008. He entertained an impressive first book of mares at Ashford Stud the following season. Among his first crop, foaled in 2010, are half-siblings to stars Zenyatta and Big Brown, as well as a son of champion Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy).

The millennium G1 2000 Guineas hero King's Best, a 3/4-brother to Arc heroine Urban Sea (Miswaki), has sired six Group 1 winners since entering stud in 2001, including the highly impressive 2010 G1 Epsom Derby victor Workforce (GB).

Kingmambo's daughters are having an impact in the breeding shed, too, with no fewer than 22 graded/group winners to their credit. He is the broodmare sire of five-time Group 1 winner Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) and Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}), whose quintet of top-level trophies includes the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf.

Kingmambo has been represented by a sextet of top-level winners from Sadler's Wells mares, and that cross has also worked for King's Best, who has two Group 1 winners--including Workforce--from mares by the Coolmore giant, as well as Group 1 winner King's Apostle (Ire) from a Barathea (Ire) mare. Another Group 1-winning son of Kingmambo, Dubai Destination, sired G1 Racing Post Trophy S. winner Ibn Khaldun from Gossamer (GB) (Sadler's Wells).

In the Pipeline...

In recent years, Kingmambo battled an arthritic condition in his neck. According to the *Report of Mares Bred*, the stallion covered 19 mares in 2008, and is listed with 11 live foals for 2009. He had just one live foal for 2010 from three mares bred the previous spring, and the only mare bred to him in 2010 did not get in foal. However, his 2008 crop numbered 51, including Voodoo Prince (GB), the first foal from international star Ouija Board (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}); Light Blow, a full-sister to the aforementioned Light Shift; and Group 2-placed Ecliptic, a son of Grade I winner Indy Five Hundred (A.P. Indy). The power of the Kingmambo/Sadler's Wells cross will be tested, since the 2008 group includes 11 youngsters out of Sadler's Wells mares

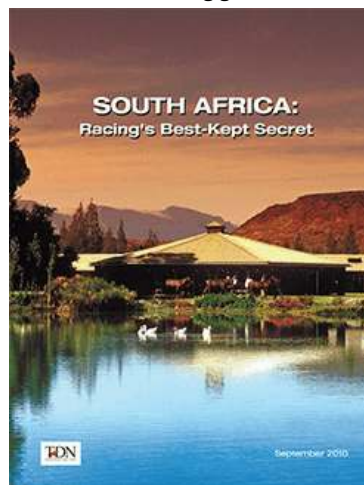

SOUTH AFRICA: RACING'S BEST-KEPT SECRET

By Bill Finley

In winning the Masters and the U.S. Open, Gary Player captured the biggest, most prestigious golf events in the world. Now, he wants to breed horses that win the biggest, most prestigious horse races in



the world. At age 74, that is what keeps him young, energetic, and passionate. He has the wealth to do so, but that's not why he never stops believing the next horse bred by his Gary Player Stud Farm will be The One; rather, it's his faith in his country, its land, its people and their determination. When it comes to horse racing, South Africa, he says, can do anything anybody can do.

"Look at South Africa. Look at what we've done," he says, his voice rising as he speaks, an evangelist preaching to the non-believers everywhere. "The proof is in the pudding. I am not someone who says these things when I cannot back them up with the bottom line. I am a bottom-line guy. We've had Colorado King (Grand Rapids II), Horse Chestnut (SAf) (Fort Wood), Ipi Tombe (Zim) (Manshood {GB}). Ipi Tombe was the best filly in the world. She went everywhere and she won. We are just a small country, but our horses go anywhere in the world and run extremely well."

It's easy to dismiss Player as just a proud South African, someone whose enthusiasm causes him, perhaps, to lose touch with reality. He knows what people must think. South Africa? Isn't that some tiny, irrelevant country on the bottom of the world still trying to escape from its racist past? It cannot possibly ever be a horse racing power, even on a modest scale. Can it?

"It's already happening," Player said. "This has been the best-kept secret in horse racing. We have some very wealthy people here, and they are buying the best, most beautiful ranches in the world. We have people coming here from all over to buy our horses and they can buy them much cheaper than they can in Europe or the U.S.--for way, way less. We've always been good, and we're getting better all the time." **Cont. p15**

Maybe he has a point.

It has only been within the last 10 years that the South African racehorse has begun to venture outside the country's borders, and the results have been impressive. Led largely by trainer Mike de Kock, South African-bred or raced horses have won dozens of races in Dubai, a number of stakes in the U.S. and England, and some of the world's richest races in places like Hong Kong and Singapore.

That, South Africans argue, is only one part of the equation, one reason among many that South Africa is about to emerge in the horseracing world as a small-scale global power. These horses, they say, have won around the world, yet remain great bargains. Top horses in training still sell for a few hundred thousand dollars, and the best-looking, very best-bred horses at the yearling sales will cost you no more than the equivalent of about \$350,000.

"The price is right here, and that's the main point," said bloodstock agent Jehan Malherbe, who represents Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum. "The costs are low. You can buy yearlings here and start them here. If they are good enough, you can ship them to the States or to Europe. The costs of failure are much less, and that's important."

Horses came to South Africa with the white settlers, and the first-known horse races were conducted by the British around the late 1700s. The South African Jockey Club was established in 1882, and the sport would grow into a plaything for the country's many wealthy whites.

Along the way, as was the case with most things South African, the racing industry was a complicated and insular business.

There was the occasional breakout horse. Colorado King, a foal of 1959, came out of South Africa to win the 1964 Hollywood Gold Cup. *Hawaii (Utrillo II), bought in South Africa as a yearling for the equivalent of just \$12,600 by New Jersey millionaire Charles Engelhard, came to the U.S. and won the Man o'War and United Nations Handicaps. He was the champion older turf horse in America in 1969. But such things as African horse sickness, apartheid and geography played a role in keeping the sport in South Africa small, isolated, largely ignored by the rest of the world, and suffering from an inferiority complex.

It didn't help that South Africa was a pariah in the rest of the world because of its racial policies.

"When we had apartheid, getting money out of the country was a long and lengthy process," Malherbe said. "There were a lot of little complications, and sending a horse outside the country became very difficult. The feeling was, why bother? You might as well just race here."

A bigger problem was African horse sickness. A highly infectious and deadly viral disease that has affected African horses, mules, donkeys and zebras, it can devastate a horse population. The South African horse industry has had to go to great lengths to guarantee that it does not spread the disease to other countries and South African horses have to go through long quarantine periods before being allowed to go elsewhere.

Even South Africans had all but given up on ever being anything more than small and insignificant when it came to racing and the global picture.

"Everyone was rather critical of South Africa and played us down," said Mike Sharkey, the stud manager at Highlands Farm, which was owned by the late Graham Beck. "People would say, 'Oh, it's only South Africa.' And we would listen to them. So we had this tradition of knocking ourselves and comparing ourselves to racing in England and the rest of the world. Instead, we should have realized what we had in the way of strengths and promoted ourselves right from the beginning. We lost a lot of time when it came to establishing ourselves, getting on and being seen as a country to be reckoned with."

What happened? There was no one watershed moment, but many point to Apr. 13, 1997 as a key turning point for South African racing.

Twirling Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}), who was impressive in a 3 1/4-length romp in the Sept. 5 GII Del Mar Derby, will get the services of jockey Mike Smith for his next assignment in Saturday's GI Goodwood S. at Hollywood's Oak Tree meet. Undefeated in four lifetime

starts, the Craig Family homebred was ridden by Joel Rosario in his two latest starts, but the sophomore's connections were forced to make the change after Rosario was named to ride Blind Luck (Polalrd's Vision) in the GII Cotillion S. at Parx on the same afternoon. Smith confirmed that he has been familiarizing himself with the colt and was aboard for a seven panel move in 1:25 at the Inglewood oval last Sunday. "I've watched him very closely," Smith said of the quirky colt. "I know what works

and what doesn't." Also this weekend, Smith picks up the mount on Jaycito (Victory Gallop), who is slated to contest the GI Norfolk S. The Zayat Stables representative, accompanied by Martin Garcia in both prior lifetime starts, was runner-up most recently in the GI Del Mar Futurity Sept. 8. In addition to those top rung horses, the day promises to be a banner day for the rider, who is also scheduled to ride last year's champion older mare **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}). The imposing six-year-old is scheduled to defend her title in the GI Ladies Secret S. The mare is slated to cap of the season with a start in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs. "She looks so good right now, I don't think she has ever looked better," asserted Smith. "I don't know how she can get better, but she has." On a national teleconference yesterday afternoon, Smith, who has been aboard for 15 of the mare's 18 lifetime starts, addressed the possibility of finding a chink in the amazon's armor. "She trained amazing over Churchill Downs' dirt track even though she didn't get a chance to run because of the weather [in Derby weekend's Distaff H.]," explained Smith when asked how the champion would handle the dirt at Churchill. "Her last win [in the Aug. 7 GI Clement L. Hirsch S. at Del Mar] was a good race for her. She has moved forward from it and has been training very aggressively in the mornings." Sounding fair warning for any lingering naysayers, Smith added, "When she gets the opportunity to run her race, she stands alone."

In 2010, Don't Forget Gil won the Wayward Lass S. and was third in the Saratoga Dew S. on Sept. 3. She retires with a record of 19-4-3-4 and earnings of \$370,737. "We are very happy to offer this broodmare prospect from Mr. Brodsky," said Denali's Craig Bandoroff, who will consign the Don't Forget Gil to the November Sale. "She ran 17 times in stakes races, she put her heart out there every time, and I think she will pass that on to her foals."

Benefits for Industry in Small Business Stimulus Bill:

Edited press release The American Horse Council reports that President Obama signed the Small Business Jobs and Credit Act of 2010 into law on Monday. The bill is intended to help small businesses and create new jobs. The bill continues the bigger write-off for horses and other property purchased and placed in service by a horse business that were originally included in earlier stimulus bills. The first incentive allows an owner who purchases a horse or other business property used in a horse business and places it in service in 2010 or 2011 to expense up to \$500,000 of the cost. This so-called "Section 179" expensing allowance applies to horses, farm equipment and most other depreciable property. Once total purchases of horses and other eligible property reach \$2 million, the expense allowance goes down one dollar for each dollar spent over \$2 million. Without the bill the expensing allowance would have been \$250,000 in 2010 and gone down to \$25,000 for later years. The second incentive re-institutes the 50 percent first-year bonus depreciation for horses and most other depreciable property purchased and placed in service during 2010. Bonus depreciation had expired at the end of 2009. This benefit applies to any property that has a depreciable life of 20 years or less. Also, the property must be new, meaning that the original use of the horse or other property must commence with the taxpayer. Bred by Hascombe and Valiant Studs, the 70,000gns TATOCT yearling enjoyed a busy juvenile campaign and won six of his seven starts, including the Listed Dragon S. at Sandown, the G3 Molecomb S. at Goodwood and the G2 Flying Childers S. at Doncaster last time Sept. 10. The grey colt's only defeat came in the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot in June, and he retires with a record of 7-6-0-0, and earnings of £162,819. "Zebedee proved an absolute star for us and it was a pleasure to have him in the yard," said trainer Richard Hannon. "He gave us some great days, winning the Flying Childers and the Molecomb, besides mopping up one of the big sales races at Newmarket and, at 70,000 guineas, he was one of the biggest bargains. You never like losing one of your best horses, but Zebedee was only small and a sprinter through-and-through, so it would have been tough for him next season against the older speed merchants. I can quite understand [owner] Julie [Wood] accepting an offer for him to stand at stud in Ireland."
