Vendors in Newmarket were heartened by the sight of several major players at Tattersalls' Park Paddocks ahead of Europe's most significant yearling sale, which gets underway this morning at 10:30 a.m.

Sheikh Mohammed was looking at yearlings over the weekend ahead of Book 1 of the October Sale, and those on the sales grounds yesterday included a sizeable Coolmore team, including John Magnier and trainer Aidan O'Brien. Dubai-based owner Jim Hay was on the sales grounds, along with representatives of Sir Robert Ogden and Andrew Tinkler,

who have made a splash at previous sales this year. There was also a good international representation on the premises, with half a dozen Japanese parties around, and buyers from the likes of Hong Kong, Turkey, India, South Africa, Abu Dhabi, Qatar, Russia, Kazakhstan and the U.S.

Agent Jeremy Brummitt was among those who was particularly impressed by the standard of animal on show.

"You'd say that if a Classic winner is sold anywhere this year, it is most likely to be at this sale because they are head and shoulders above the yearlings everywhere else," Brummitt said. "I think the market will be stable in regards to last year."

Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) may yet run again this season after it emerged yesterday that connections have not ruled out an attempt at the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Churchill Downs Nov. 6. "Workforce seems to have come out of the Arc very well," Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "We'll have to see how he is over the next couple of weeks, and then make a decision on whether to run him again this year--possibly in the Breeders' Cup." The question of whether or not Workforce will continue racing as a four-year-old is another connections have yet to answer. "We'll sit down at some stage and talk to Prince Khalid," said Grimthorpe. "There are several factors involved in whether [or not] he stays in training as a four-year-old, and we all need time to reflect."

Reflecting on Sunday's G1 Prix de la Foret success for **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa), trainer Freddy praised his star racemare and indicated she is bang on target to attempt a third win in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Downs Nov. 6. "Goldikova was brilliant on Sunday," said Head. "It was a brilliant race, and she got a great ride from [jockey] Olivier [Peslier], who rode a very clever race, and she won well. I was very happy with the way she quickened, but it was a tough race. They allowed her to lead, and when Regal Parade took over, Olivier didn't panic, and she just came back. She wasn't blowing after the race, she was cool when she came back and didn't have a hard race. She was very good this morning, she ate up and was fine. It's the Breeders' Cup next, and it could be her last race. Well, for the moment it will be her last race, but you never know, as the owners are sporting people. They love to see her run, and they will never get another one like her." **Cont. p5**

Tattersalls October Sale Starts Today (cont. from p1)

Agent Charlie Gordon-Watson, who bought the sale topper in Deauville in August, was also impressed with the quality on offer at Tattersalls, although he felt that the 689-lot Book 1 catalogue could be pruned.

“There are 200 horses that shouldn’t be here and anybody that has to cover the whole sale would agree with me,” said Gordon-Watson. “There are just too many horses and there is not enough time to see them. The sale should start on Wednesday, with Book 3 taking place after the Horses In Training Sale at the end of October. There is a shortage of top, top horses, but the best 100 are very nice and you’d be happy to buy any of them. I hope to be fairly busy, but it’s very hard to judge how the market will go, although all the usual suspects are here.”

Consignor Jamie Railton has 24 lots catalogued in his draft and feels that there will be opportunities for buyers.

“The quality is very good and I think there is going to be great value for buyers, because there are so many good horses about,” said Railton. “We’ve been steady, ticking away and you have to be pretty happy with the way the market has gone elsewhere this year. You’d have to be disappointed if it doesn’t follow through with the best yearlings in Europe here.”

Tattersalls officials are hoping that trade will keep up to last year’s level, which saw 472 lots sell for 53,764,000gns at an average price of 113,907gns and a median of 80,000gns.

“It’s a very good catalogue and everybody is saying we have some really nice horses and we’ve attracted many international faces,” said Tattersalls marketing director Jimmy George. “Last year’s October Sales outperformed the Northern Hemisphere yearling market and the sales we’ve seen so far this year have, by and large, maintained the levels of 2009, which is encouraging.”

Among those to have achieved sizeable prices on previous sale ring visits include [lot 329](#), an Oasis Dream (GB) (Green Desert) colt who was bought by Eugene McDermott of Kennycourt Stud for 240,000gns at Tattersalls last year. [Lot 678](#), a first-crop Teofilo (Ire) colt offered from Highclere Stud made 165,000gns last year, while [lot 619](#), a son of Danehill Dancer (Ire), realised 220,000gns when appearing at Tattersalls last year.

The sale runs today through Thursday, starting at 10:30 a.m. each morning, with Book 2 and Book 3 taking place next week.

Her second dam is the top-class Last Second (Ire) (Alzao), responsible for Aussie Rules (Danehill), as well as this March-foaled grey's group and graded stakes-placed and listed-winning dam.

Attraction may have had the most scrutinised legs in the business in her day, but had more than her fair share of brilliance to counter any conformational issues. We've met four times and have yet to beat

her. The draw is even more important over the mile in American racing, and maybe we will get the luck at Churchill Downs."

Hot Cha Cha Works for Weekend Stakes

Hot Cha Cha (Cactus Ridge), winner of last year's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup, worked a half-mile at Keeneland yesterday in :48 in preparation for a stakes engagement at the Lexington oval this weekend, but connections haven't decided which one. The four-year-old filly is nominated to Saturday's GI Abu Dhabi First Lady at a mile on the turf or Sunday's GI Juddmonte Spinster S. over 1 1/8 miles on the Polytrack. "I am not sure which one she will run in," said trainer Philip Sims. "I may enter in both. It will come down to pace and distance. I think she is better at a mile and an eighth than a mile." Hot Cha Cha is coming off a runner-up effort in the Aug. 21 Beverly D.

Borel Picks Up Arabian Mount

Two-time Kentucky Derby-winning rider Calvin Borel will ride undefeated Arabian TM Super Bird in Saturday's G1 The President of the United Arab Emirates Cup, the first Arabian race in Keeneland history. "As soon as [Borel] said he would do it, I got little knots in my stomach," said Elizabeth Brand, who trains TM Super Bird. "The pressure is on. I'm so excited." Brand trains at Arapahoe Park and at Retama, where her neighbor is Thoroughbred trainer Allen Dupuy. Dupuy is a longtime friend of Borel's and is responsible for making the connection.

Japan on Cliffs Agenda

Richard Hannon has revealed that he is favoring a tilt at the Nov. 21 G1 Kyoto Mile Championship with **Canford Cliffs (Ire)** (Tagula {Ire}). Scratched from last Saturday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. due to an unsatisfactory scope, the May 22 G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and June 15 G1 St James's Palace S. winner could be set

for one more run in 2010. "Because Canford Cliffs won the St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot, he qualifies for the Japanese Racing Association bonus," Hannon explained. "The Kyoto race is worth £769,000 to the winner, but those quali-

fied for the bonus have their earnings doubled if they finish in the first three, so if Canford Cliffs happened to win, he would net a tasty cheque of £1.538 million." Connections have not ruled out running in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Mile, with son and assistant Richard Hannon Jr. adding, "[Jockey] Richard Hughes feels that [Churchill Downs] is the best venue for Canford Cliffs—he takes the view that the ground would have been too fast for him in California, but we will get a European climate in Kentucky and the race should suit him well."

Native Khan Has Dewhurst Option

Vefa Ibrahim Araci's **Native Khan (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}), who defected from Sunday's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere because of the rain-softened turf, will point to next week's increasingly hot renewal of the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket instead of the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster the following week, trainer Ed Dunlop revealed yesterday. "I have no regrets about missing the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp last Sunday as conditions were very soft," said Dunlop. "Native Khan is such a good-actioned horse who floats over the ground. We realise that good ground is probably the best that we can hope for at Newmarket, but I very much suspect that the going will be a lot worse should we wait a week for the Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster, so we will take on the big guns in the Dewhurst and hope for the best." Looking ahead to next year, Dunlop added, "We are very much thinking of the [G1] Prix du Jockey Club [at Chantilly] rather than [the G1] Epsom [Derby]. Being French-bred, he qualifies for a handsome premium, and, in any event, on pedigree he is not totally guaranteed to stay the mile-and-a-half of the [Epsom] Derby, so the 10-and-a-half furlongs at Chantilly could prove his optimum distance."

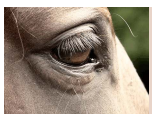

There must have been a raised eyebrow or two when Jim Bolger announced that the triple Group 1 winner Lush Lashes was to visit Sea the Stars in 2010, to create a foal inbred 2x3 to the phenomenal Urban Sea.

Sadly, Lush Lashes didn't hold onto her pregnancy, but Arc day provided compelling evidence that there is merit to the idea of trying to reinforce Urban Sea's influence. Not only did Lush Lashes' sire Galileo achieve a magnificent Group 1 double with his daughters Misty For Me and Lily of the Valley, but the family also struck in the Arc, with winner Workforce being a son of Urban Sea's half-brother King's Best.

Workforce's victory came 17 years after Urban Sea sprang a 37-1 surprise with her neck victory in the Arc, a race that also fell to her brilliant son Sea the Stars 12 months ago. Anabaa Blue, Black Sam Bellamy and Anzillero, three other Group 1 winners from the family, also contested the Arc, which underlines the family's rare prowess over middle distances.

Apparently, 24 winners of the Epsom Derby have attempted to win the Arc in the same season, but Workforce is only the sixth to complete this very difficult double, following Sea-Bird II, Mill Reef, Lammtarra, Sinnidar and Sea the Stars. I reviewed King's Best's stallion career in my *TDN* column of June 1 ([click here](#)), just a few days before Workforce smashed the track record at Epsom, to give King's Best his second Derby victory of the year.

Of course, Workforce's Longchamp victory ended Sir Michael Stoute's long wait for his first Arc success after numerous good attempts. The trainer's pleasure must be all the greater because he also trained King's Best and King's Best's dam Allegretta.

Delving into the far reaches of my garage, I unearthed an interview that Stoute gave

Timeform in the spring of 1981, which underlines the patience and attention to detail that has earned him 10 trainers' championships. He had this to say of Allegretta, who had won over eight and nine furlongs on her first two starts at two, before finishing second in the Zetland S. over a mile and a quarter:

"She's a filly that hasn't wintered too well, and we're going to give her plenty of time. Dead honest and she stays well, but I haven't planned anything for her yet because I'm not going to put her into work until she's really ready for it. She's another of those Schlenderhan animals, they're really hardy and honest. She's a filly that could win a nice race before the year is through."

Unfortunately, Allegretta didn't flourish after finishing second in the G3 Oaks Trial at Lingfield, and she was sold for 24,000gns at the end of the year. Allegretta's sale came a year before her brother Anno won the German St Leger. The decision to let her go possibly reflected the fact that her dam had a weanling filly by her sire, Germany's two-time Horse of the Year Lombard. That filly, Arionette, became the second top-rated two-year-old filly in Germany in 1983 and another sister, Alya, was runner-up in the German Oaks in 1987. **Cont. p9**

There is plenty of stamina in Allegretta's pedigree, but we were never to discover exactly how far King's Best stayed. Made favorite for the Derby in the ante-post betting, he eventually missed the race with a muscle problem in his quarters. Although he recovered in time to take his chance against the English and French Derby winners in the Irish version, he suffered a career-ending fracture of a cannon bone. As his sire Kingmambo is responsible for winners of the Belmont S., Oaks and St Leger, it's not impossible that King's Best would have stayed a mile and a half, but his hot temperament and tendency to sweat may well have prevented him from doing so. After all, he was branded a "head-case" after refusing to accept restraint in the 1999 Dewhurst S.

That King's Best was a miler rather than a mile-and-a-half horse is reinforced by the fact that his mature stock have an average winning distance no higher than 8.7 furlongs, compared, say, to Galileo's 11.2 furlongs and Sadler's Wells' 11.3 furlongs.

It mustn't be forgotten that King's Best was fairly spectacular on the day he won the 2000 Guineas over a mile, bursting 3 1/2 lengths clear of Giant's Causeway and 25 others. I tend to regard him as a miler, and that is part of his appeal as a mate for Juddmonte Farms' Sadler's Wells mares, along with his conformation. Juddmonte has eight animals aged three or over from this partnership and they include four stakes winners, including Workforce and the smart Runaway, who chased home Hurricane Run in the G2 Prix Niel. These King's Bests out of Sadler's Wells mares have so far outperformed Juddmonte's other King's Bests, but that could change if the two-year-old filly Tuscania, out of a Danzig mare, fulfills the promise of her impressive debut win.

From a pedigree viewpoint, King's Best is an obvious choice for Sadler's Wells mares. The main encouragement comes from the exceptional results that Kingmambo enjoyed with daughters of Sadler's Wells, one of their six Group 1 winners being the Japanese star El Condor Pasa, who failed by only half a length to take the 1999 Arc. These Kingmambo horses are inbred 4x3 to Northern Dancer and 4x4 to Special, because he is out of a Nureyev mare, whereas the inbreeding for Workforce is 5x3 to Northern Dancer and 5x4 to Special.

Workforce was one of two group winners last week from Juddmonte's Media Luna family, the other being the Sommerville Tattersall S. winner Rerouted. This tough Stormy Atlantic colt is out of the Miswaki mare Rouwaki, a half-sister to the Kentucky Oaks and Alabama S. winner Flute.

Soviet Moon, the dam of Workforce, never made it to the races, but was well-rated as a yearling. She has several full siblings, most notably Brian Boru, winner of the G1 Racing Post Trophy at two and the G1 St Leger at three, and the two-year-old listed winner Kitty O'Shea.

Kitty O'Shea has made a bright start as a broodmare, with two black-type performers by Danehill Dancer, including Kissable, a fine third to Misty For Me in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. on her latest appearance.

Workforce's family was introduced to the Juddmonte studbook with the purchase of his third dam Media Luna a few months after she had finished second in the Oaks. Media Luna had only four daughters, but all four produced black-type performers, the best known being her Blushing Groom filly Rougeur (dam of Flute and second dam of Rerouted) and Workforce's second dam Eva Luna.

A daughter of the dual Arc winner Alleged, Eva Luna gained her best victory in the G3 Park Hill S. over the St Leger course and distance at the age of four. Eva Luna became a natural to visit Sadler's Wells after he had sired three group winners from other daughters of Alleged, including Dream Well, winner of both the Prix du Jockey-Club and the Irish Derby. The total of group winners has since risen to five, thanks to Sadler's Flag and Brian Boru, and there is a total of eight stakes winners from 41 foals bred this way, which equates to an impressive 20 percent.

AQUEDUCT VLTs

Done Deal At Last!

ALBANY, N.Y. — More than 1,000 video slot machines could soon be whirring at the Aqueduct race track in New York City now that a long-delayed contract has gotten final approval from the state comptroller.

Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli said Monday he has approved a contract for Genting New York LLC to build and operate about 4,500 of the machines at the thoroughbred track in Queens.

That gives the company 10 days to pay the state \$380 million upfront. State officials say they expect to eventually get \$1 million a day in revenue.

The subsidiary of Genting Malaysia Berhad proposed



G1 Triumph for NY Bred Haynesfield in JCGC

New York's reigning Horse of the Year and Champion Three-Year-Old Haynesfield just keeps proving that, no matter how big the race, each and every challenger had better watch out. After making the point emphatically in the Grade 2 Suburban Handicap in July, Haynes-

field reiterated the message on Saturday with an extra exclamation point when he and jockey Ramon Dominguez ran away with the most prestigious race of Belmont Park's fall championship meet, the Grade 1 \$750,000 Jockey Club Gold Cup Invitational, increasing the colt's career earnings to \$1,116,981 and making him New York's newest million dollar-earner.

Although Haynesfield's sophomore campaign — and Derby aspirations — were cut short by nearly seven months on the bench after the Grade 3 Gotham, the four-year-old chestnut son of Speightstown finished 2009 in style for trainer Steve Asmussen, winning the \$250,000 Empire Classic in October and the Grade 3 Discovery Handicap in November by open lengths. This was only the prelude to even bigger things.

After a decisive victory in his first race of 2010, a \$100,000 conditioned allowance / optional claiming race for state-breds at Belmont on June 13th, Haynesfield headed

F-T EASTERN FALL YEARLINGS SALE STARTS

The Fasig-Tipton Eastern Fall Yearlings Sale begins today in Timonium, Maryland, with bidding getting underway at 10 a.m. A total of 645 yearlings have been catalogued for the two-day auction. "After Saratoga and Kentucky, this is probably the third-oldest continuous yearling auction in North America," said Fasig-Tipton's local Director of Sales Paget Bennett. "In its early years, it primarily served the Maryland Thoroughbred industry, but its scope is much wider now, with yearlings, consignors, buyers and trainers from many parts of the world. There are at least seven state-bred programs represented in the catalogue in 2010." During last year's Fall sale, 387 horses sold for \$5,616,450. The average was \$14,513 and the median \$5,500. Top price of \$300,000 was paid for a colt by Harlan's Holiday.

STRONACH BIDS TO TAKE MID PRIVATE

ST Acquisition Corp., a corporation controlled by the Stronach family, has made an offer of approximately \$607 million to purchase all shares of the racetrack holding company MI Developments not already owned by it or its affiliates. MI Developments took over the racing assets of the bankrupt Magna Entertainment Corp. in August. ST Acquisition offered to buy all 46.7 million outstanding shares for \$13 each in cash, a 22-percent premium on the stock's trading price Friday, which would essentially take the company private. Stronach already owns 50,000 Class A shares and 383,414 Class B Shares of MID, approximately 60 percent of the total voting power of MID's outstanding shares. According to a statement from ST Acquisition, "If the offer is successful, STAC expects that MID will continue to execute its business plan including growth and development of MID's racing and gaming business..." The board of directors of MID will establish a special committee of independent directors to review and evaluate the offer.

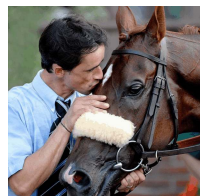
