FRANKEL AMONG DEWHURST DOZEN

★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) will face a maximum of 11 rivals in Saturday's G1 Dubai Dewhurst S. at Newmarket. Trainer Henry Cecil reported himself pleased with the progress of Khalid Abdullah's highly impressive G2 Royal Lodge S. winner on Friday. "Frankel seems in great order and is growing up all the time and I'm happy with him at this stage," said Cecil. "I wanted him to run again down here when the ground is likely to be good, and I can finish him up early near to home--there is no reason why he shouldn't have one more race, as he's done things very easily so far and is entitled to go there."

Among Frankel's potential opponents is Khalifa Dasmal's

Dream Ahead (Diktat), emphatic winner of the G1 Middle Park S.. That colt's participation depends on his work tomorrow morning and the state of the ground, which stood at good, good-to-soft in places yesterday, with a mainly dry build-up to Saturday. As expected, Godolphin paid the supplementary fee to add the unbeaten G2 Champagne S. scorer and ★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ Saamid (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}) to the mix, with Ed Dunlop keeping the similarly unbeaten G3 Solario S. winner Native Khan (Fr) (Azamour {Ire}) in the seven-furlong feature. *Cont. p2*

MORE THAN QUICK ENOUGH IN MORVICH

Quick Enough (High Brite) completed the transition from claimer to graded stakes victor with a 1 1/2-length victory in Monday's GIII Morvich H. at Oak Tree's Hollywood Park meeting. The six-year-old gelding was sidelined for over a year before resurfacing with a win at Del Mar July 25. Claimed for \$32,000 out of that race, he won again for the new connections in an Aug. 5 optional claimer and was haltered for \$40,000 by trainer Doug O'Neill on behalf of Michael Bello, Russ Sarno and Pablo Suarez. He missed by just a nose to California Flag (Avenue of Flags) when second in the Green Flash H. at Del Mar Aug. 18 and was making his graded stakes debut in the Morvich. Quick Enough stalked the pacesetter from second yesterday, moved to the lead with a furlong to run and pulled clear to the wire to earn a berth in the Nov. 6 GII Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. "Well, we're in [the Breeders' Cup]," O'Neill said. "Now all we need is for one of these guys to write a big check [to supplement]. He's such a cool horse. He's very game and brings it every time. Aidan O'Brien has a total of four remaining, headed by last Sunday's clear-cut Tipperary conditions event winner **Seville (Ger)** (Galileo {Ire}), while Jim Bolger has left in the G1 Phoenix S. runner-up **Glor Na Mara (Ire)** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) to complete the Irish challenge. One of the most significant withdrawals at yesterday's stage was John Connaughton's unbeaten G3 Anglesey S. scorer **Dunboyne Express (Ire)** (Shamardal), who heads to Doncaster's G1 Racing Post Trophy the following Saturday. "We have decided to run Dunboyne Express in the Racing Post Trophy, as it seems the most suitable race," trainer Kevin Prendergast told the *Racing Post*. The Clive Brittain-trained Listed Chesham S. winner **Zaidan** (Street Cry {Ire}), Brian Meehan-trained G3 Acomb S. scorer **Waiter's Dream (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Michael Jarvis-trained G2 Coventry S. runner-up **Elzaam (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) make up a potentially strong renewal.

PLEASANT TAP EUTHANIZED Pleasant Tap (Pleasant Colony--Never Knock, by Stage Door Johnny), the champion older horse of 1992, was euthanized Oct. 8 after developing laminitis. He was 23. The bay captured the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup and GI Suburban H. and ran second in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic for owner/breeder Thomas Mellon Evans during his Eclipse-winning campaign. He retired with nine wins from his 32 starts and earnings of \$2,721,169. Sent to stud at Evans' Buckland Farm in 1993, he joined the Lane's End stallion roster four years later, and went on to sire 53 stakes winners, including champion and MG1SW David Junior and GI Santa Anita Derby hero Tiago. His progeny have earned more than \$51 million. "We are saddened by the loss of Pleasant Tap," said Lane's End's Will Farish. "He was an outstanding racehorse, and an extremely successful sire."

MARE IN FOAL TO SEA THE STARS AT FASIG

The first mare in foal to champion Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) to be offered at public auction will sell Nov. 7 at Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky November Sale. Love to Dance (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), a group-placed five-year-old mare in foal to the 2009 G1 Arc de Triomphe winner, will go through the ring as [hip 96](#). She is consigned by Conor Doyle and Neal Clarke's Bedouin Bloodstock, as agent for S.F. Bloodstock, LLC. Love to Dance, a half-sister to champions Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill) and Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge), will be shipped to Kentucky from Ireland in late October.

COWAN DISPERSAL BEGINS AT F-T OCTOBER

Irving Cowan will begin dispersing his bloodstock holdings at the upcoming Fasig-Tipton October Fall Yearling Sale with the Taylor Made Sales Agency. Cowan, along with his late wife Marjorie, bred and campaigned Breeders' Cup champions Hollywood Wildcat (Kris S.) and War Chant (Danzig). During the first phase of the Cowan dispersal, three yearlings will sell at the Fasig sale from Oct. 25 through 27. Among the yearlings is [hip 458](#), a filly by Hard Spun out of champion Hollywood Wildcat. Eight broodmares will be sold at the Keeneland November sale, including multiple Grade I winner Society Selection (Coronado's Quest). In foal to Medaglia d'Oro, the nine-year-old mare sells as [hip 43](#). Also selling in November is Hollywood Wildcat's daughter Danzig Wildcat (Danzig), in foal to Smart Strike, who is catalogued as [hip 131](#). "The chance to buy into some of these families is unprecedented," said Mark Taylor of Taylor Made. "Take a look at the broodmare sires on these pages: A.P. Indy, Danzig, Saint Ballado, Gone West, Rahy--they are all ranked among the best in the world. To say the least, we are honored to be able to offer these horses." Cowan will retain the 20-year-old Hollywood Wildcat, who, in addition to War Chant, has produced English group winner Ivan Denisovich (Ire) (Danehill) and stakes winners Ministers Wild Cat (Dep-uty Minister) and Double Cat (Storm Cat).

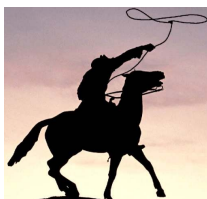

RACETRACK Round-Up

TWICE READY TO DEFEND CHAMPION TITLE

Khalid Abdullah's **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory) is set to bid for back-to-back renewals of the G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. Saturday at Newmarket, for which 15 remained at yesterday's forfeit stage. "He's run some great races and he is working very nicely," trainer Henry Cecil said of the five-year-old, who won the July 3 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown. "He's always had trouble with his feet, but since he had stick-on shoes put on, it has given him a new lease on life and he has improved from last year." After announcing last week that they would supplement **Poet's Voice (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), Godolphin duly paid the £20,000 fee yesterday to add the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. hero to a fascinating edition of the 10-furlong contest, which will be run for the last time at its current venue. Trainer Ed Dunlop is planning on running Cristina Patino's G1 English and Irish Oaks winner **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab), while a strong French challenge is set to include Jacques d'Etre and Eric Libaud's four-time Group 1 winner **Vision d'Etat (Fr)** (Chichicastenango {Fr}), Alec and Ghislaine Head's G1 Prix du Moulin hero and ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Fuisse (Fr)** (Green Tune) and His Highness The Aga Khan's **Shimraan (Fr)** (Rainbow Quest). "The going won't be an excuse for him, but he is a better horse on good ground because he has a huge action," said Fuisse's conditioner Criquelette Head-Maarek. Aidan O'Brien scratched all his entries apart from Michael Tabor's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ and nine-length G3 Kilternan S. scorer **Await the Dawn** (Giant's Causeway), while Team Valor could be represented by the 2009 GI Goodwood H. winner **Gitano Hernando (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}), who made a winning return in Dundalk's G3 Diamond S. at the start of the month.

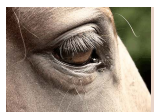

We have known for a long time now that easily the most prolific source of above-average performers by A.P. Indy has been his partnership with Mr. Prospector's daughters. For example, this year has seen this cross ably represented by **Lomaki**, winner of the GIII Endeavour S., and **Girolamo**, who showed unusual speed for a mature son of the two-time champion sire when he landed the GI Vosburgh S.

Their successes mean that there are now 15 graded winners, plus another five black-type winners, among the 121 foals of racing age from this ultra-popular nick. These 121 foals represent roughly 11 percent of A.P. Indy's total output, but their 15 graded winners equate to around 19 percent of his 80 winners at that level.

So is it any surprise that A.P. Indy's sons from this highly effective Mr. Prospector nick are proving the most effective as stallions? Although this select band accounts for less than 20 percent of A.P. Indy's graded winners, they have so far supplied two thirds of all the graded winners by A.P. Indy's sons, including a similar proportion of their Grade I winners.

These impressive figures have been compiled largely by **Pulpit**, **Malibu Moon** and **Mineshaft**, with help from **Flatter**, **Accelerator** and **Indy King**, and now the name of **Congrats** can be added to the list. His daughter **Wickedly Perfect** has collected the GIII Sorrento S. and GI Darley Alcibiades S., with the latter success marking the start of a profitable weekend for **Vinery's Florida-based** freshman stallion. **Congrats** also took third place in the Alcibiades, thanks to **Jordy Y**, and third place in the GI Champagne S., with his son **I'm Steppin' It Up**. This fine sequence means that **Congrats** now holds a lead of over \$300,000 on the first-crop sires' table, with earnings in excess of \$1 million. **Cont. p5**

With Wickedly Perfect now unfortunately sidelined with a knee chip, she won't be heading for the Breeders' Cup, so it remains to be seen whether Congrats can hang onto his lead until the end of the year. He could face a serious challenge from a much more famous son of A.P. Indy in Bernardini, who achieved a notable Group 1/Grade I double in Italy and the U.S. three days ago. The American win came via A Z Warrior, who heads for the richly endowed Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. It's possible, too, that Bernardini's Italian Group 1 winner, the English-based Biondetti, will also feature on Breeders' Cup weekend.

It is going to be interesting to see whether Congrats' connections leave him in Florida, or whether they will decide that he has done enough to take his chance in Kentucky, in much the same way that Malibu Moon's bright start earned him a transfer from Maryland.

The 10-year-old stallion started out at a fee of \$12,500 at Cloverleaf Farms II in Florida, after Cloverleaf bought him from the Hancock family.

His exploits for the Claiborne-Dilschneider partnership included a victory in the GII San Pasqual H. and a good second, dividing Rock Hard Ten and Borrego, in the GI Santa Anita H. These efforts earned Congrats a trip to Dubai for the 2005 World Cup, in which he finished fifth of 12 to Roses In May (Devil His Due).

Even so, there were a few important shortcomings on his resume. For a start, he hadn't become a stakes winner until he was four, or a graded winner until he was five, and he failed to achieve that all-important Grade I win. To compound these shortcomings, he had nothing better than a Grade III placing to show for his final year on the track, in 2006, which never helps launch a stallion career. **Cont. p6**

Having said that, I wouldn't disagree with the comments of Brent Fernung, Cloverleaf's general manager, when he said:

"I think the breeders will agree this is a fair price for a millionaire son of A.P. Indy; he is the type of horse that Florida has been waiting for."

When Cloverleaf relocated to Kentucky, Congrats moved to Vinery. He initially proved very popular, covering 172 mares for 113 live foals in his first year, and then covering 125 mares in his second season. The usual third-year decline saw his book fall to 56 mares in 2009, and his fee was subsequently chopped from \$10,000 to \$4,500.

Considering that Pulpit, another of A.P. Indy's sons out of a Mr. Prospector mare, has sired Grade I winners from daughters of Storm Cat, Hennessy and Tabasco Cat, it comes as little surprise that Congrats sired Wickedly Perfect from a granddaughter of Storm Cat, by the disappointing Tactical Cat.

Although he didn't become a stakes winner until he was four, Congrats was reasonably precocious for a horse who stands 16.2 hands, scoring over 6 1/2 furlongs at Saratoga from two starts. Perhaps Wickedly Perfect owes some of her two-year-old talent to Tactical Cat, who numbered victories in the GIII Tremont S. and GI Hollywood Futurity among his nine juvenile starts. It's also worth pointing out that Wickedly Perfect's third dam, Show Off, was a fast and precocious filly. She earned an Experimental Free H. weight of 114, with victories in the Fashion S., Astoria S. and a division of the Astarita S., and was also second in the Alcibiades S. (then over seven furlongs).

For anyone considering using one of these A.P. Indy stallions with a Mr. Prospector dam, I should point out that they have generally enjoyed success with mares from the Danzig line, including with daughters of Danzig himself, Danehill and Chief's Crown, and also with Deputy Minister and his sons French Deputy and Dehere. Topsider is another Northern Dancer line horse who has worked well.

Rahy mares have produced Grade I winners to Pulpit and Malibu Moon. There are also two Grade I winners out of Easy Goer mares, plus two graded winners out of daughters of Affirmed.

Some of these stallions have good winners inbred to Mr. Prospector, especially through Forty Niner. The Grade I winner Malibu Prayer is out of a Grand Slam mare, so is inbred 3x4, and so is Declan's Moon, out of a Norquestor mare. The same applies to the two graded winners out of Rubiano mares and the two out of Unbridled mares.

Mares by sons of Roberto, such as Red Ransom, Kris S. and Major Impact, feature prominently. Congrats is one of two of these stallions which have graded performers out of mares by Fly So Free. This list isn't meant to be comprehensive, but others that feature include Broad Brush, Lord At War, Wild Again, Pleasant Colony and his son Pleasant Tap.

Although I have pointed out how much A.P. Indy owes his reputation as a sire of sires to his sons out of Mr. Prospector mares, there is no reason why he shouldn't also make his mark through some of his younger stallion sons. Bernardini, after all, is out of a Mr. Prospector line mare, by Quiet American (who has 20 percent graded winners among his daughters' foals by A.P. Indy). A.P. Indy has 14 percent stakes winners among his foals out of mares by Seeking the Gold, including four graded winners, the best of which was the GI Hopeful S. winner Majestic Warrior. The first foals by this Ashford resident were born this year, and his weanlings should be worth close inspection at the breeding stock sales.

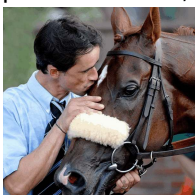

OVER THE MOONE

Sean and Anna Curtin saw something special in the Tapit filly they acquired at Keeneland January in 2009. They picked her up for a mere \$40,000, and hit one out

of the park when she brought \$330,000 as a pinhook for the Curtins' MoonStone Sales just eight months later at Keeneland September. The grey, now named Dancinginherdreams, made good on that promise when she attained ★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ status with an easy win in her debut for owner John Oxley at Keeneland Sunday.

"She was a standout," Sean Curtin recalled. "She looked like a racehorse to us. She was a flashy filly, maybe a little bit immature, but we never thought we'd get her for that price."

Curtin grew up on a farm in Ireland, and worked for Coolmore for a decade, on both sides of the pond. After managing a farm in New York for three years, he went out on his own in 2005.

He met his future wife ("at the sales, of course," she explained), and the two had just started buying horses together when Anna, then Gojanovich, signed the ticket on the short yearling by hot young sire Tapit that winter afternoon.

"She was by a super hot sire, and we really liked her as an individual," she said. "She was a little later in the sale, but we thought she'd bring more money. She was correct--the only fault we could find was that she was immature. It might have taken a little bit of imagination, but she really looked like a Tapit filly--the kind that runs."

The Curtins, who were married this past August, brought their new acquisition back to their 170-acre MooneStone Farm in Paris, Kentucky, where they board mares and foals and do sales prep.

"Moone is [Sean's] mother's maiden name--he's a good boy, naming the farm after his mother," Anna said with a laugh.

Dancinginherdreams thrived in her new environment, and the Curtins knew they had made the right buy.

"She matured quite a bit," Sean said.

Added Anna, "Sean does an amazing job, and he has them exactly where they need to be for the sales. She was really classy from Day 1, and by September, she had blossomed. She had grown up and come into her own.

"She was the filly we would go out to see on the farm every night," she continued. "She was always special--you were glad to have her standing in your paddock. We knew she was our big horse that year."

Still, the two had modest aspirations when they headed to Keeneland September.

"When I was taking her to the sale, I thought she'd bring \$80,000 to \$100,000," Sean remembered. "As people started taking an interest in her, I thought she'd bring more, maybe \$150,000 to \$200,000. She had a lot of really high-end people on her."

Anna was getting the same vibe.

"She vetted super clean, and she showed like a champ," she remarked. "She has tons and tons of class. We knew she was going to do well. We knew everybody liked her."

Dancinginherdreams was in the second half of Book 3 at Keeneland September 2009, and turned out to be the session-topping filly.

"I think part of the reason she did so well was that she's a clone of the good Tapit fillies," Sean said. "She's leggy and racy-looking, just like Careless Jewel and Stardom Bound."

Her former owners may have been just a bit surprised that she was so successful in her second trip through the sales ring, but the Curtins fully expected her to run a big race first time out.

Unfortunately, they had to be out of town for the momentous debut.

"We had to go to a wedding in Louisiana, and we couldn't get an earlier flight out," Sean explained.

But the couple was impressed by what they saw on TV.

"She's the type of filly that loves the crowds and loves the excitement," Sean said. "There were a lot of people at Keeneland Sunday, but it didn't faze her. She handled it all very well, and it didn't look like the race took anything out of her. It was fun to watch."

He added, "I was very happy [that she went to John Oxley and John Ward Jr.]. They will put the time into her--they won't push her."

The Curtins, who pinhook roughly a half-dozen horses each year, will be back at Keeneland November.

"I tend to buy yearlings with some sire power, and I try to buy in the range I bought her in," Sean said. "There is quite a strong contingent of pinhookers out there, and not so many foals, but we've been lucky to date. This is our fourth year pinhooking, and we've been relatively successful at it." **Cont. pg. 3**

The Curtins bought a second short yearling at Keeneland January in 2009, getting a colt by Sky Mesa (coincidentally bred by John Oxley) for \$25,000. He sold for \$70,000 to Chester Stables, agent, at Keeneland September and, now named Sky Maggy, the grey captured his turf bow in a maiden special weight test at Laurel Sept. 15 by five lengths.

There is a family history of success with Keeneland fall yearlings. Anna, who grew up in Canada riding show jumpers, came to the U.S. 10 years ago to work with Thoroughbreds on her uncle's farm.

That uncle was Carter Thornton, who passed away in April at age 92. Thornton operated Threave Main Farm near Paris, Kentucky, and sold a yearling by *Pretendre for \$1,200 at the Keeneland Fall sale in 1969. Two years later, that colt--Canonero II--came charging down the stretch at Churchill Downs to take the 1971 Kentucky Derby by 3 3/4 lengths.

IFFRAAJ COLTS TOP TATTS OCT BK 2 OPENER

John Ferguson led the proceedings as Book 2 of Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale got underway in Newmarket yesterday, buying a pair of highly prized sons of leading first-season sire Iffraaj (GB) (Zafonic). Heading the action was the first foal of the mare Camp Riverside (Forest Camp). Ferguson saw off trainer Ed Dunlop, agent Ed Sackville of Kern Lillingston, and finally agent Rachel Boffey, accompanied by Luca Cumani, to secure the colt for 160,000gns. The yearling ([hip 875](#)) yielded a great result for vendors Mick and Fiona Denniff's small Nottinghamshire breeding operation, which acquired Camp Riverside, a half-sister to G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains third River Proud (Proud Citizen), for €26,000 out of the 2008 Goffs February sale. Ferguson spent 150,000gns when seeing off Alastair Donald of Kern Lillingston for an Iffraaj (GB) colt ([hip 709](#)) out of Voyage of Dreams (Riverman), daughter of GI Frizette S. heroine Proud Lou (Proud Clarion). The Victor Stud-bred colt, who was consigned from Peter Player's Nottinghamshire-based Whatton Manor Stud, showed a handsome profit on his 22,000gns purchase price in the same ring as a foal in December. "Given that he wasn't just a two-year-old, but a horse that improved throughout his career, I think he has done remarkably well," Ferguson said of Iffraaj. "These were a pair of outstanding individuals and Sheikh Mohammed will decide whether they go to Godolphin."

John Magnier's son M.V. was busy bidding on behalf of the Coolmore team yesterday. Standing with Paul Shanahan, Magnier waited until the very last lot and prevailed in a duel with agent Rachel Boffey to get a 145,000gns High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) colt ([hip 980](#)) from the Special family sold from Mike Caddy's Heatherworld Stud. Coolmore also paid 125,000gns for a Pivotal (GB) half-brother to listed winner Tora Bora ([hip 859](#)) consigned from John and Lady Carolyn Warren's Highclere Stud.

John Warren was also in action in his capacity as an agent and paid 110,000gns for a High Chaparral (Ire) colt out of a half-sister to Group 2 winner Via Borghese ([hip 762](#)) sold from Donal Commins' Albany Stud. Warren's purchase is a possible to race for Highclere Thoroughbred Racing. "He was one of few here this week who could end up running in a Derby trial and, although I thought he made his money, if he lined up in one of those races then he wouldn't look expensive," said Warren.

Local agent Jill Lamb paid 125,000gns for a Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) colt ([hip 792](#)) consigned from the Irish-based Clare Castle Stud on behalf of owner Liam Sheridan, whose horses are split between trainers Henry Cecil, Paul Howling and William Haggas. "He was a lovely, big imposing horse by a sire I like," said Lamb. "It's a good fast family and he has a nice early foaling date." The sale continues today at 10 a.m.
