No BC for Cape Blanco, Fame and Glory

A day after it was revealed that Ballydoyle star Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was retired, trainer Aidan O'Brien announced that **Fame and Glory (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Cape Blanco (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) will miss the Breeders' Cup.

While both had been in the running for the \$3-million GI BC Turf, the decision has been made to call time on their 2010 campaign. "Both horses had hard races and tough passages in the Arc and it has been decided

that neither of them will be going for the Breeders' Cup Turf," the Ballydoyle conditioner told *Racing Post*. "But they'll be kept in training next year." O'Brien also revealed that last year's G1 Dewhurst S. hero **Beethoven (Ire)** (Oratorio {Ire}) would run in the GI BC Mile, the G2 Royal Lodge S. third **Treasure Beach (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) was being aimed at the GII BC Juvenile Turf, **Bright Horizon (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) will go for the GIII BC Marathon, and that **Together (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) was "under serious consideration" for the GII BC Juvenile Fillies Turf.

Espoir City Heads to Track

GI Breeders' Cup Classic hopeful **Espoir City (Jpn)** (Gold Allure {Jpn}) had his first taste of the Churchill Downs racetrack yesterday, galloping a mile and a quarter under the Twin Spires. The five-year-old arrived in Louisville Tuesday. "We just wanted to get him out for some light exercise because he was climbing the walls in the barn," said Mikki Tsuge, West Coast representative for the Japan Racing Association. "He will probably go out about the same time [9 a.m.] tomorrow when there is not as much traffic on the track."

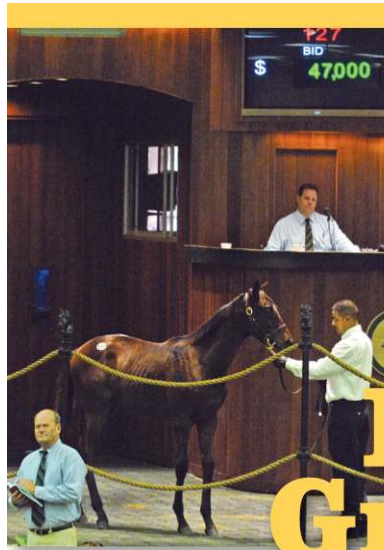
GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile candidate **Here Comes Ben** (Street Cry {Ire}) breezed six furlongs in 1:12.20 on Keeneland's Polytrack yesterday morning. Enrique Pacheco was aboard the GI Forego S. hero, who galloped out seven furlongs in 1:24. "Unbelievable," trainer Charles Lopresti offered. "He did it very easy. He's been begging to work all week."

Thunder Rolling In

J. B.'s Thunder (Thunder Gulch), winner of the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity on Keeneland's Polytrack Oct. 9, is expected to test the dirt in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 6. "He will work [Friday] morning at 8:15 at Keeneland," trainer Al Stall Jr. said. "He will go back to the track Sunday and Monday and, if everything is perfect, we will pull the trigger and pre-enter." Immediately following the colt's score in Lexington, Stall said that the Breeders' Cup was "50-50," and that the colt would likely point for the GIII Delta Jackpot S. Nov. 20. The Columbine Stable colorbearer will ship to Louisville next Wednesday along with stablemate **Blame (Arch)**, who will be among the favorites in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

Cash Refund Drills for Sprint

GI Breeders' Cup Sprint aspirant **Cash Refund** (Petionville) tuned up for the Nov. 6 test by travelling five-eighths from the gate in :58.80 at Keeneland Thursday morning. Jockey Brian Hernandez Jr. was in the irons. "I thought he went very good; he did it very easy," said trainer Steve Margolis. "Brian didn't even really ask him. He just kind of went on his own." The four-year-old captured his first two starts at Fair Grounds this winter before finishing third in each of his next efforts, the GIII Aristides H. at Churchill May 29 and in the Iowa Sprint H. to Majesticperfection (Harlan's Holiday) June 25. He hasn't faced the starter since that Prairie Meadows appearance. Jockey John Velazquez has the call in the Breeders' Cup.

The Usual Q.T. Mile-Bound

Grade I winner **The Usual Q.T.** (Unusual Heat) will be part of a strong contingent in the GI Mile. Hero of the 2009 GI Hollywood Derby and the GI Eddie Read H. at Del Mar July 24, the Cal-bred is coming off a runner-up effort in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 19. He breezed six furlongs in 1:12.80 at Hollywood Wednesday. "I told [co-owner Don Van], 'Don, the

horse is doing great," trainer Jim Cassidy told *Daily Racing Form*. "It was a really nice work. He's back to his old self." The four-year-old will ship to Kentucky on Halloween.


Banned Looking to Get in Juvenile Turf

Glen Hill Farm's **Banned** (Kitten's Joy), perfect in two grass starts, will be entered for the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf Nov. 6. "He should get in," said trainer Tom Proctor. The bay colt graduated by three lengths in his turf bow at Belmont Sept. 18, and added a five-length allowance score on the Keeneland weeds Oct. 17. The conditioner is also considering Barbara Hunter's **Keertana** (Johar) for the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. Sixteen years ago, Proctor saddled Glen Hill's One Dreamer (Relaunch) when she lit up the toteboard by upsetting champions Heavenly Prize, Hollywood Wildcat and Sky Beauty in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. "She never should have been 47-1," Proctor offered. "She won [the Louisville Budweiser BC H. at Churchill] that spring, and the year before in the fall she ran second to Miss Indy Anna [in the Churchill Downs Budweiser BC H.]. I had run her on turf all that summer before the Breeders' Cup."

Willcox Inn, Major Gain Go in Company

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf hopefuls **Major Gain** (More Than Ready) and **Willcox Inn** (Harlan's Holiday) breezed in tandem on the Keeneland lawn yesterday, covering five panels in 1:03.60.

Major Gain, trained by Wayne Catalano, won the GIII Arlington-Washington Futurity in September before finishing fifth in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at the Lexington oval Oct. 9. Michael Stidham trainee Willcox Inn broke his maiden at Arlington Sept. 18 before finishing third in the Breeders' Futurity. "Major Gain has never been on the turf and [Stidham's] horse has never been on the turf, so it's good to have a little company out there," Catalano said. "Make sure the babies aren't out there wandering all over the place."

Catalano confirmed that Major Gain would be cross-entered in the *Keeneland/Coady Photography* GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Stidham added, "We wanted to give [Willcox Inn] a little test run over the grass and they went the last quarter in :23 and change, so we were pleased with that and a good gallop-out," Stidham said. "I think we accomplished what we were looking for."



Pashito the Che Pointed Toward Sprint

Tuna Stable and Off the Hook's **Pashito the Che** (Flatter) will be pre-entered for the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, connections revealed yesterday. The four-year-old, first or second in 14 of 17 lifetime starts, was beaten just a nose by This Ones for Phil (Untutttable) in the Sunshine Millions Sprint earlier in the year. After missing some time with a quarter crack, he returned to be a close-up third in a Philly Park allowance Sept. 12, then ripped off two straight at Delaware, in an optional claimer Oct. 2 and then in the six-furlong Hard Spun S. 11 days later. The win convinced trainer Scott Lake and Co. to take a shot at the Sprint, which will be Pashito the Che's first

attempt in graded company. "We've been waiting a year [for the Sprint]," said Off the Hook's Joe Appelbaum. "We thought of going last year, but were unsure how he would run on the surface at Santa Anita. Beating Custom For Carlos by a nose [in the \$250,000 Gallant Bob at Philly last October] and losing to This One's For Phil by the same nose gave us confidence he could compete at a very high level. He's in the money 16 of 17 starts, with eight wins at five different tracks. What else is he supposed to do?" Pashito the Che was slated to run in the GI Carter H. in April. "[But] he cracked a quarter and was sidelined for six months," said Appelbaum. We've had an abbreviated schedule to get him ready, but he came out of last win in great shape."

Defending champion **So You Think** bypassed morning trackwork at Moonee Valley earlier this week, but firmed into 1-2 ante-post favoritism when he drew barrier five for Saturday's main event. "He's an on-speed horse, so I thought the draw was ideal," commented jockey Steven Arnold. "I can use him a bit from

that barrier and just work out how quick they're going to go through the first couple of furlongs. I'll be rolling down the first furlong. "If they're not going to go quick, he can take it up or if something wants to go around them, then it can lead. The only thing I

can do is ride him to his strengths and have him as comfortable and as relaxed through the first half of the race. If that means he's in front, or running second, third or fourth, that won't worry me." Second in early wagering is the filly **More Joyous**, who stretches out off wins in the G1 George Main S. Sept. 25 and in the G1 Toorak H. Oct. 9, both over the metric mile. "I think she can [pull off an upset]," jockey Nash Rawiller said. "I'm not saying she will, but I think she can. Depending on how we jump, I've got the opportunity of assessing the situation after we go 50 yards, but certainly I'll be positive myself."

West Virginia Hears The Roar...

The LION HEARTED daughters, bred by Nancy L. Terhune and Ernest Frohboese, owned by Terhune and trained by Gary Capuano, applied completely different tactics, as ASPENGLow battled on the lead with Down Town Allen from the start and pulled away to win by more than a length. SILVER HEART, winner of the Maryland Million Distaff Starter H. in her most recent start, rallied from last of 10 to get the show spot.

In getting her 10th victory from 15 lifetime starts, ASPENGLow increased her lifetime earnings to \$328,577.

Earlier in the day, LION HEARTED's daughter SERENADIA, second to SILVER HEART on Maryland Million day, rallied to finish third in Delaware Park's Tax Free Shopping Distaff S.

Bill Casner's 2009 G1 Dubai World Cup hero **Well Armed** (Tiznow) has arrived at the WinStar Farm Training Center in Versailles, Kentucky, in preparation for a return to action. After undergoing surgery to remove an ankle chip last fall, the gelding recuperated at Casner's Texas ranch. "Well Armed has been on a program of swimming combined with riding, and he has taken everything we have thrown at him," Casner said. "He looks great and is feeling big. He has always had tremendous grit and the ability to overcome adversity. We look forward to the next chapter of his racing career." In addition to his World Cup success, the seven-year-old won the GI Goodwood S., GII San Diego H. and GII San Antonio H. in 2008. Well Armed, who has bankrolled over \$5.1 million to date, is expected to target the Dubai World Cup next March. "The training facility at WinStar is second to none, and a great place to set in motion what we eventually hope will be another run at the Dubai World Cup," Casner added.

Blinkers On Racing's **Turbulent Descent** (Congrats) made a smooth landing into the winner's circle at first asking, scoring under wraps at Oak Tree's Hollywood meeting Oct. 3 ([video](#)).

Not much of a secret backed as the 8-5 chalk in an 11-horse field, the \$160,000 OBSAPR graduate ([video](#)) sat in a perfect spot in

fourth through an opening quarter of :22.20. With David Flores aboard, she gamely split horses at the top of the lane, took the lead shortly thereafter and turned back the challenge of Canadian Pride (Canadian Frontier) without ever being asked, scoring by 3/4 of a length. The two-year-old daughter of the unraced Forestry mare Roger's Sue--trained by Mike Puype--stopped the clock for six furlongs in 1:09.90, good for a Beyer Speed Figure of 90. Rigoletta (Concerto), who captured the GI Oak

Leaf S. going a mile and a sixteenth one race later, was awarded an 85.

"We were expecting big things," Blinker's On Founder Scott Sherwood commented. "Mike Puype isn't one to be overly confident, and doesn't do a lot of predicting, but he really thought that he had her geared up to win first time out. She went through that little hole, and as a two-year-old, they all don't want to do that, particularly fillies. She showed a brilliant turn of foot and he never took the stick out. Inside the sixteenth pole he's almost standing up on her like it's a gallop. It was visually very impressive."

Sherwood and the Blinkers On partners cheered on their charge from Hollywood Park's Turf Club.

"Five of the partners were able to attend and they brought friends," Sherwood said. "It was a great time. This is a smaller type partnership. We're all friends--people take trips together and everyone knows each other. It's become a little family. We celebrated with champagne."

Turbulent Descent is pointing toward a tilt in Hollywood's \$100,000 Moccasin S. going seven furlongs Nov. 21. If she passes that test, the bay's next goal would be the two-turn GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 11.

"She came out of the race great, everything's good," Sherwood said earlier this week. "We'd like to see if she can go farther. A lot of the Congratses are going a little bit longer with that A.P. Indy [influence] on top. She does have Forestry on the bottom and that says a little bit more sprint, but she's a real leggy filly, though. We think she can stretch out and that's what our plans are. The Moccasin is a good way to take that next step."

Sherwood launched Blinkers On Racing in 2006 after selling a West Coast-based chain of golf and tennis stores to national retailer Golfsmith. The 54-year-old was in the retail sporting goods business for more than 25 years. His late father Don Sherwood founded the company.

"I started claiming horses for a couple of years with Brian Koriner, then wanted to start playing at a higher level, so I started Blinkers On," said Sherwood, who was born in Washington and raised in California. "I made money in a different line of work; I'm trying to have a good time with this. I'm not in a position where I could personally spend \$400,000 or \$500,000 every year on horses. I started Blinkers On to bring people in and share in the experience and fun."

Blinkers On assembles its stable from the two-year-old-in-training sales. With recently retired trainer Greg Gilchrist serving as an advisor, the group typically purchases four or five juveniles per season, with an emphasis on the \$100,000-to-\$150,000 price range. Offerings are sold in five- and 10-percent shares. On a few occasions, there has been as many as 15 partners on a single horse.

"We looked at what the other partnerships were doing at the time--Little Red Feather, Bongo, West Point--and everyone is a little bit different," Sherwood explained. "I decided that instead of buying yearlings, pinhooking or claiming, to zero in on two-year-olds. When I was claiming horses with Koriner, he had a good eye for the two-year-olds. We went that route, and I stuck with it. When Brian moved down south, I went with Greg and he's really a two-year-old guy as well."

When asked why he prefers shopping at the two-year-old sales, Sherwood added, "From a price standpoint, there's some value in the yearling market, but, if you're looking at auction price in relationship to earnings on the racetrack, two-year-olds are a lot stronger because it's more of a proven commodity."

Blinkers On has quickly enjoyed success since its inception, campaigning Golden Gate stakes winner Heaven On Hold (Deputy Commander) as well as stakes-placed runners Caped For Flight (Cape Town), Shakenwithanolive (Suave Prospect) and This Side Up (Outofthebox). Shakenwithanolive has become a multiple stakes winner in Western Canada since being sold privately.

"Caped For Flight also ran fourth in the [GI] Del Mar Futurity," Sherwood noted. "Another good horse that won a lot of money for us was Searchforthetruth (Yes It's True). He was one that you like to have in the barn. Everytime he went out there it was a paycheck. He was a lunch pail kind of horse, but he did quite well for us. We've also done okay selling some of our horses privately."

The partnership took some money off the table following Turbulent Descent's impressive debut, selling a 25-percent interest in the Florida-bred.

"Two hours after the race, the offers started coming in," Sherwood revealed. "Without getting into dollar amounts, we brought in another partner. Blinkers On is still the managing/majority owner." -SS

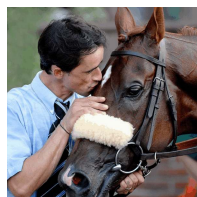

Jockey Club Releases 2010 Report of Mares Bred:
Edited Press Release

The Jockey Club today released Report of Mares Bred (RMB) statistics for the 2010 breeding season. Based on RMBs received through Oct. 13, the Jockey Club reports that 2,186 stallions covered 40,576 mares in North America during 2010. The annual statistics include the number of mares bred to each stallion and represent approximately 90 percent of the mares that eventually will be reported as bred in 2010. According to historical trends, The Jockey Club expects to receive RMBs representing an additional 4,000 to 4,500 mares bred from the 2010 breeding season. The number of stallions declined 9.3 percent from the 2,409 reported at this time in 2009, while the number of mares bred fell 10.5 percent from the 45,317 reported at this time last year. RMB statistics for all reported stallions in 2010 are available through the Publications & Resources section of The Jockey Club's website at jockeyclub.com. "The decline in breeding activity in 2010 falls in line with our forecasted 10-percent decline for next year's registered foal crop, from 30,000 foals in 2010 to 27,000 foals in 2011," said Matt Iuliano, The Jockey Club's executive vice president and executive director. Although the number of stallions covering 100 or more mares declined from 85 in 2009 to 82 in 2010, these stallions accounted for a greater percentage of the total mares reported bred this year--26.8 percent of mares bred in 2010 versus 24.6 percent of mares bred in 2009. Examining the origins of the 4,741 fewer mares bred in 2010 by stallion book size, 34.8 percent of the decline in mares bred occurred in stallion book sizes under 25; 16.7 percent occurred in stallion book sizes between 25 and 49; 34.7 percent occurred in stallion book sizes between 50 and 74; 8.3 percent occurred in stallion book sizes between 75 and 99; and 5.5 percent occurred in stallion book sizes of 100 or more. In 2010, Giant's Causeway led all stallions with 217 mares bred. Rounding out the top five were Dunkirk, 186; Kitten's Joy, 173; and Candy Ride (Arg) and Malibu Moon, each with 172. Thoroughbred breeding activity in Kentucky traditionally paces North America.

ARQANA OCT CLOSES ON A POSITIVE NOTE

Arqana's October Yearling Sale concluded yesterday and the French auction house celebrated aggregate returns breaking through the €11-million barrier for only the second time and the first since 2007. Two-thirds of the final day's offerings found new homes during an active half-day session, justifying its inclusion at the end of the usual three-day sale. "The results are very encouraging and show that the October yearling sale has much more to offer than the leftovers of the August session," commented Arqana's Olivier Delloye and Eric Hoyer in a joint-statement. "This is a market in its own right, which relies on the solid French demand as well as on the strong interest that the French racing system raises among neighbouring countries, and encourages them to look for French-bred horses. This was particularly evident regarding British and Irish professionals, who were very active despite having already attended a vast number of sales in their home countries."

Leading the day-four way was Haras d'Etream's Hip [530](#), who sold to locally-based trainer Markus Nigge for €40,000, after a protracted duel with fellow local conditioner Philippe van de Poele. From the first crop of Darley sire Manduro (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), the April-foaled bay is a half-brother to the dual GIII Tropical Turf H. victor Ballast (Ire) (Desert Prince {Ire}), and to this semester's Listed La Coupe de Marseille winner San Martin (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}). Earlier, Haras de Victot's Hip [502](#), a son of My Risk (Fr) already named Mount Athos (Fr), set the pace when selling to agent, and leading buyer at the sale, Paul Nataf for €30,000.

One further notable aspect was Shadwell France's first activity at the sale, buying six lots for a combined €680,000. Reflecting that this year's additional fourth session was indeed justified, Delloye and Hoyeau indicated it was a one-off and next year's sale will revert to the usual three-day format, adding, "We are delighted by the warm welcome that buyers have given to the new format. This change was initiated by the directors of Arqana, and the subject of an in-depth reflection in which vendors and buyers took part. All of them can now be pleased with the success of the sale. Looking forward, we think it is possible to improve the quality of the selection for this sale even further, which will allow us to maintain the momentum and fit the sale in three days [next year] as opposed to three and a half [days] this year."
