



SUPER SAVER RETIRED TO WINSTAR

WinStar announced that **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon--Supercharger, by A.P. Indy), its homebred GI Kentucky Derby hero, has been retired and will enter stud at the Versailles, Kentucky, farm in 2011. In addition to his epic victory for trainer Todd Pletcher under the Twin Spires, the bay colt captured the 2009 GII Kentucky Jockey Club S., and was a close second in the GI Arkansas Derby. "The final decision to retire Super Saver was a difficult one that may not be popular with fans, but should be very popular with our breeders," said Elliott Walden, WinStar's vice president and racing manager. "The bone bruising that was discovered by Dr. Larry Bramlage DVM, which limited his performance during the latter half of this year, should sub-

side with time. However, it created a risk that he would not return to the form he showed as a two-year-old and through the Kentucky Derby. He was a top two-year-old, and became WinStar's and Todd Pletcher's first Kentucky Derby winner. We felt like he had nothing more to prove." A stud fee has not yet been announced. **Cont. p2**

HERE COMES BEN SIZZLES IN BC WORK

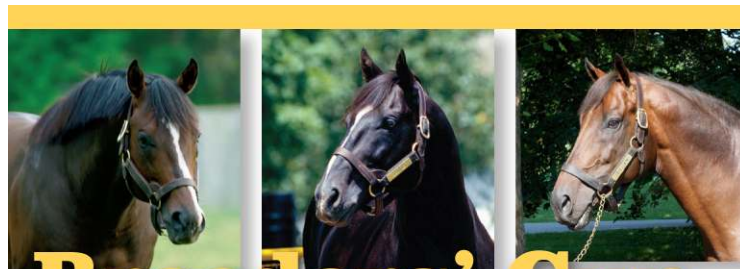
GI Forego S. winner **Here Comes Ben** (Street Cry {Ire}) turned the screws in advance of the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile with a sizzling :46.60 half-mile breeze yesterday at Keeneland. It was the fastest of 18 works at the distance. With Enrique Pacheco aboard, the four-year-old got the first quarter in :23.60, and galloped out five furlongs in :58.40 and six furlongs in 1:12.40. By way of comparison, the bullet for five-furlong workers was earned by a three-year-old gelding named Boynamedtomi (Tactical Cat), who went in 1:00.00. "We wanted to let him just go easy and let him finish up," said Charlie Lopresti, who trains Here Comes Ben for breeders Brandon and Marianne Chase. "Enrique said he...asked him down the lane, and I think the clockers got him the last three-eighths in :35. He came back and he wasn't even blowing."

Savings Plan...

Super Saver capped his juvenile campaign with a resounding success in the Kentucky Jockey Club, which stamped him a Classic contender. After kicking off his sophomore season with narrow defeats in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby and GI Arkansas Derby, the bay colt blossomed, and went postward as the 8-1 second choice in the Kentucky Derby. Under an inspired ride by Calvin Borel, Super Saver skipped over the slop and secured the roses for WinStar.

"It was the most amazing thing," Troutt offered. "At first, I was very calm, because when you've got multiple horses [WinStar also had American Lion (Tiznow) finish 11th], you're looking here and there, and I was trying to check and see where we were. And then, all of a sudden--I'll never forget this as long as I live--Elliott [Walden] yelled, 'He's going to the lead!' and then from the top of the stretch down, I yelled so loud I lost my voice. I was completely hoarse. Never in my life have I gotten so involved in a race. It was so exciting--my family was all there, and half of us were in tears. It was unbelievable, that day.

"I tell everybody, anybody, that's in horse racing, they've probably had a thousand dreams of winning the Derby," Troutt continued. "If you put all of those emotions together, it doesn't even come close to what that day was like. It's what everyone wants to win, and we were very blessed to be able to win that day."

Troutt's teenage sons Preston and Brant had previously made the walk over with the WinStar Derby horses, and his 10-year-old daughter Savannah wanted to do the same, in hopes of making it onto the live broadcast.

"It rained this year and the cameras missed her," Troutt recalled. "I asked if she was okay, and she said, 'Dad, I'm okay with it, it was fun anyway.' Then we get to the winner's circle, and she's right in front of my wife and myself, and the Governor of Kentucky introduces her on national television. Bob Costas asked her a question...that was such a thrill for me seeing her up there. I couldn't have scripted that day any better, to be honest." Super Saver retires with a record of 10-3-2-1 and earnings of \$1,889,766.

A homebred Kentucky Derby winner might be a slam-dunk addition to a farm's stallion roster, but, when asked if they would have entertained bids from other farms, Troutt said, "For the right offer, we would have considered it." However, he added with a laugh, "Now, it would have had to be the right offer--I never want to give up on what I said about this being a business. I think that with the way the economy is, it's a great time to bring him home."

A Winning Story...

Ak-Sar-Ben may no longer function as a racetrack, but the Omaha, Nebraska, oval was the scene where Kenny Troutt and Bill Casner first crossed paths.

"About 35 years ago, we did a shake for a horse and he beat me out," Troutt said ruefully. "We got to know each other and became good friends."

Troutt, a native of Illinois, began going to the races with his uncle while still in high school.

"He liked to bet and knew several of the trainers," said Troutt. "I got to meet them and talk to them, so I kind of got the bug then."

While attending Southern Illinois University, Troutt and a group of friends made the trip to Louisville to attend the Kentucky Derby, but the thought of actually winning the blanket of roses didn't seem likely at the time.

"I think it's so far out there that you can't even imagine it," he offered. "To be honest, when I first got into it, I just really enjoyed it--it enables me to get away from the regular business things. Some people golf, I don't golf. But if you get into it more seriously, then you start focusing on it." **Cont. p3**

After their fateful meeting in Omaha, Troutt and Casner pursued various business interests, but joined forces in 1988, when Troutt founded the Dallas-based Excel Communications. Casner joined him in that venture, which grew and expanded until it was sold for \$3.5 billion in 1998. That success enabled the purchase of the Preston brothers' Prestonwood Farm and bloodstock in early 2000. Among the stallions on the farm's roster at the time were the well-established Kris S. (Roberto), and a young son of Forty Niner named Distorted Humor, whose first foals were arriving that spring.

"When we got the farm, Bill and I said that the one thing we were going to do is run this like a business," said the entrepreneurial Troutt. "That's something that I really cherish and am very proud of."

Distorted Humor was represented by GI Spinaway S. heroine Awesome Humor as a freshman in 2002 and, the following spring, Funny Cide--bred by WinStar and foaled in New York--memorably secured the Kentucky Derby for Sackatoga Stable.

"We sold some horses that we probably shouldn't have sold," Troutt said with a laugh, "but that's the business."

He added, "We used to have a joke when we were walking around, Bill and I, in the fields looking at the mares and foals, saying, 'Somewhere on this farm we've got a Derby winner, I know that.' Then we changed it to, 'I know we've got a Derby winner, I just hope Doug and Elliot didn't sell it.'"

"[Winning the Derby with Super Saver] was a real blessing for us."

WinStar is active as a seller. Awesome Humor's first foal by Storm Cat fetched \$8.2 million as a yearling at Keeneland September in 2006, and Super Saver himself was, at one point, headed for the auction block. He was withdrawn from Keeneland April in 2009.

"We sell a lot of horses at all sales, yearling to horses in training," Doug Cauthen explained. "We have [about] 40 in the November sale, which is our annual training horse sale. We didn't think [Super Saver] was at his peak for the yearling sales, so we didn't enter him. We thought we'd take a shot with him for the two-year-old sales, but we just felt he wasn't going to bring \$300,000, which is what we would have liked to have gotten to make it a good sale [at the time]. We thought we'd take him to the next stage and race him...we got lucky, thank God for that!" **Cont. p4**

WinStar has become a major player since its inception in 2000, just as trainer Todd Pletcher quickly established himself as one of the nation's best. It's only fitting that two of the industry's biggest success stories of the last decade combined to land their first Kentucky Derby.

"They obviously have a very good team in place that understands the game very well from all aspects, whether it's breeding, racing or training horses," Pletcher offered. "They obviously have access to the top-level stallions, since they stand a lot of them. They

have done such a great job buying horses and selecting mares, just continually improving the program."

The conditioner always thought highly of Super Saver.

"I loved him last year as a two-year-old when we trained him at Saratoga," Pletcher said. "The race that put in our mind that he might be a Derby horse was when he won the [Kentucky Jockey Club] at Churchill, because he really liked the track and had the pedigree to go that far. We definitely went to Florida thinking he was one of our top prospects. We ended up having to play catch-up a little bit, but we got him on schedule, and we felt he was coming into the big race the right way."

Though Super Saver won't be returning to Pletcher's shedrow, the Eclipse Award-winning trainer thinks his former charge has a big future in the breeding shed.

"I think he's a tremendous stallion prospect," he reflected. "He's a great-looking horse, well-balanced, athletic, had great two-year-old form and has tons of pedigree. He's the complete package." **Cont. p6**

The Bottom Line...

Super Saver was purchased by WinStar in utero from the 2006 Keeneland November sale. It seems a bargain now, but a mare has to have a pretty special pedigree to sell for \$160,000 as an 11-year-old that has been barren four times in seven trips to the breeding shed. Supercharger (A.P. Indy) had no ordinary lineage. Having won three of eight starts for the Phipps family and trainer Shug McGaughey, the daughter of Get Lucky (Mr. Prospector) was bred to Maria's Mon in the spring of 2006. That was right around the time a son of her full-sister She's a Winner, Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat), ran second in WinStar's first appearance in the Kentucky Derby.

"Elliot and I were looking at her together," Doug Cauthen recalled. "We were drawn to her, obviously, because of the family, and we'd had good luck with She's a Winner, and A.P. Indy mares in general. We liked her a lot, and thought she was similar in size and quality to She's a Winner. She'd had a bit of bad reproduction luck, but we got lucky. It was a slight concern, but it was also an opportunity. We talked

to the farm, and they said that they thought she was fine and that they'd gotten her straightened out. That was very accurate, because she's gone on to have four foals."

She's a Winner, a year younger than Supercharger, was purchased privately at the beginning of the decade. Her first foal for WinStar was Lord of the Game (Saint Ballado), who debuted for a \$10,000 tag at Hawthorne, but romped by 22 3/4 lengths. He was claimed that day, but went on to become a multiple graded stakes winner.

"Obviously, Bluegrass Cat was the shining star, but she's thrown several really nice horses, like Lord of the Game," Cauthen pointed out. "She was throwing great physicals, and it's such a great, great family. It's a tough family to get into, and we figured it was worth a shot."

WinStar stallion Bluegrass Cat, winner of the GI Remsen S. at two and the GI Haskell Invitational S. at three, has made an excellent start this year with his first juveniles. The family will be represented at the Breeders' Cup by

Supercharger's full-brother Girolamo, who will be among the favorites in the GI BC Sprint.

After foaling Super Saver in 2007, Supercharger was bred to WinStar stallion Distorted Humor and produced Brethren, who made a winning debut for Pletcher at Belmont Oct. 16 ([video](#)).

She has a yearling Awesome Again filly and a weanling colt by Medaglia d'Oro, and is currently in foal to Tiznow.

Where will she head next?

"After the November sales, we will sit down and make up our minds," Troutt said about Supercharger's date for 2011.

Lopresti also trains Morton Fink's **Wise Dan** (Wiseman's Ferry), who is coming off a win in Keeneland's six-furlong GIII Phoenix Oct. 8. The gelding, who breezed a bullet five furlongs in :58 flat at Keeneland Tuesday, is being pointed toward the GI Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Sprint. "I wouldn't change places with anybody right now, if I can just keep them together until next week," said Lopresti. The horses will ship to Churchill next Wednesday. In the Breeders' Cup, Rafael Bejarano will ride Wise Dan, and Alex Solis will be aboard Here Comes Ben.

HAMAZING DESTINY WORKS FOR LUKAS BARN

Westrock Stables and Barry Butzow's **Hamazing Destiny** (Salt Lake) prepared for a tilt at the GI Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Sprint with a four-furlong work in :49.60 (9/35) yesterday at Churchill Downs. Working after the renovation break over a fast track, the four-year-old colt was caught through fractions of :13 and :25. He galloped out five furlongs in 1:04.40. "I thought it was an excellent work," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "I think we might be a little stronger than people think." A winner of four of 15 lifetime starts and without a stakes victory, Hamazing Destiny registered two sharp allowance wins in four starts at Churchill. He was beaten just a neck by subsequent Grade I winner Here Comes Ben (Street Cry {Ire}) in the Kelly's Landing S. in late June. He comes into the Sprint off a 4 1/2-length allowance win at Delaware Park Sept. 13, when he sped six panels in 1:08 4/5. Lukas has two other Breeders' Cup pre-entrants: **Mine That Bird** (Birdstone) for the GI Dirt Mile and **Tidal Pool** (Yankee Gentleman) for the GI Sentient Jet Filly & Mare Sprint. Last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner is scheduled to work Sunday morning. Westrock's Tidal Pool, third on the preference list for the F/M Sprint, will run in the \$85,000 Dream Supreme S. at Churchill Nov. 6 if she doesn't draw in," said Lukas.

GET STORMY WORKS ON THE WEEDS

Sullimar Stable's **Get Stormy** (Stormy Atlantic), on course for the GI TVG Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 6, worked five furlongs on the turf in 1:00.80 yesterday at Keeneland. It was the four-year-old's first work since running fourth to Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat) in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile Oct. 9. "That was well done, it really was," trainer Tom Bush said of the move. "He did what we needed him to do." With Anna Hollander in the irons, Get Stormy was timed through fractions of :25 and :49.20; he galloped out six furlongs in 1:14.20. Get Stormy won seven of eight heading into the Shadwell Turf Mile, including back-to-back victories in the GII Fourstardave H. at Saratoga Aug. 1 and the GII Bernard Baruch H. Aug. 27. "I followed a similar pattern to what we did earlier in the summer at Saratoga," Bush explained. "He ran in the Fourstardave off a six-week layoff, then I worked him back just once-around 17 or 18 days [later]."

Bush continued, "Today was 19 [days since the Shadwell]. I worked him a strong five-eighths, then he won the Bernard Baruch. It was a month between those two races, and the Shadwell was six or seven weeks [later]. So basically I followed the same pattern. I thought one work would be enough, especially since we'll ship him to Churchill now. That'll be enough to put him on his toes anyway." Get Stormy, who gets the services of Javier Castellano in the Breeders' Cup, ships to Churchill Sunday.

LEPAROUX COULD RIDE IN 12 BC RACES

The reigning top jockey in the U.S., Eclipse Award winner Julien Leparoux, will be a busy man next week-end with possible mounts in 12 of the 14 Breeders' Cup races. Leparoux booted home three winners on last year's card--Furthest Land (Smart Strike) in the GI Dirt Mile, She Be Wild (Offlee Wild) in the GI Juvenile Fillies and Informed Decision (Monarchos) in the GI Filly & Mare Sprint--and has five winners overall. He also won on Nownownow (Whywhywhy) in the Juvenile Turf at Monmouth in 2007 and on Forever Together (Belong to Me) in the GI Filly & Mare Turf in 2008. According to Leparoux's agent Steve Bass, the Frenchman will attempt the repeat on Informed Decision, and will also ride: **Harlan's Ruby** (Harlan's Holiday) (Juvenile Fillies), **Kathmanblu** (Bluegrass Cat) (Juvenile Fillies Turf), **It's Tea Time** (Dynaformer) (Ladies' Classic), **Typhoon Slew** (Stormy Atlantic) (Juvenile Turf), **Silver Timber** (Prime Timber) (Turf Sprint), **Rogue Romance** (Smarty Jones) (Juvenile), **Cool Coal Man** (Mineshaft) (Dirt Mile), **Society's Chairman** (Not Impossible {Ire}) (Mile), **Warrior's Reward** (Medaglia d'oro) (Sprint), **Al Khali** (Medaglia d'Oro) (Turf) and **Fly Down** (Mineshaft) (Classic).

DOZEN REMAIN FOR CRITERIUM CHALLENGE

Twelve remained in Sunday's G1 Criterium International after yesterday's forfeit stage, with **Roderic O'Connor (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) the most notable name in the list. One of three Ballydoyle possibles still engaged alongside the impressive maiden winners **Exodus (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **Recital (Fr)** (Montjeu {Ire}), Susan Magnier's G1 Dewhurst S. runner-up would be providing another barometer to the talent of his Newmarket conqueror Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). Godolphin France's unbeaten **French Navy (GB)** (Shamardal) is the sole Andre Fabre entry and he could be asked to renew rivalry with Gerard Augustin-Normand and Daniel-Yves Treves' **Havane Smoker (GB)** (Dubawi {Ire}), the Jean-Claude Rouget-trained colt he had 3/4 of a length back in second in Longchamp's G3 Prix des Chenes when last seen Sept. 18. In what could prove a fascinating encounter, Alain de Royer-Dupre has His Highness The Aga Khan's course-and-distance debut scorer **Ziyarid (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}) as a potential representative, while Ecurie Jarlan's Oct. 3 G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere dead-heating runner-up **Maiguri (Ire)** (Panis) and Khalid Abdullah's Sept. 30 G3 Somerville Tattersall S. scorer **Rerouted** (Stormy Atlantic) add proven Pattern-race form to the mix.



Paddy Mullins Dies...

Ireland's legendary figure Paddy Mullins died yesterday, aged 91. Renowned as the trainer of the brilliant national hunt mare Dawn Run (Ire) and father of current trainers Tom, Willie and Tony Mullins, the master of his Goresbridge stable for over 50 years had also tasted high-profile success on the flat. Two of those came courtesy of Hurry Harriet (GB) in Newmarket's 1973

Champion S. and Vintage Tipple (Ire) (Entrepreneur {GB}) in the 2003 G1 Irish Oaks, but it is with his jumpers that Mullins is best associated. Chief among them was Dawn Run, still the sole winner of Cheltenham's Champion Hurdle and Gold

Cup and an iconic figure in the history of the famed National Hunt Festival which takes place each March. Son Tony said yesterday, "Everyone knows he was a great trainer, but he was an even greater family man. He was certainly the greatest family man I ever knew and we all stayed around him and trained within five miles of home. The family has always been very unified and he kept it that way all his life. It's only seven years since he trained a Classic winner, but he always maintained his greatest achievement was training Hurry Harriet to win the 1973 Champion S. Vintage Tipple and Dawn Run were two great achievements, but I think Hurry Harriet gave him the biggest thrill of his life." Mullins is also survived by wife Maureen, daughter and fellow trainer Sandra McCarthy and son George, who owns a horse transport business.

Stephen Peskoff Passes Away...

Stephen D. Peskoff, who bred 1991 Horse of the Year Black Tie Affair (Ire) and raced 1983 champion older mare Ambassador of Luck in partnership with Richard Ransom, died at Johns Hopkins Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland, Wednesday during surgery to install a heart pump. Peskoff had suffered from cardiomyopathy in recent years. He was 68. A graduate of the University of Rhode Island, Peskoff earned his MBA in finance and marketing from the University of Toledo, and went on to work as an agent for Northwestern Mutual Life, the managing partner of Investment Capital Associates, vice president of Drexel Burnham Lambert and president of Underhill Investment Corporation. He became involved in racing in 1978, and five years later saw his Ambassador of Luck, who carried the colors of Envoy Stable, earn the Eclipse Award after a perfect six-for-six campaign that included victories in the GI Maskette S., GII Molly Pitcher S. and and GIII Ballerina S. The Pennsylvania-bred mare won 14 of 23 career starts and earned \$489,583. Peskoff had another mare in his racing string that season, Hat Tab Girl, who he had purchased for \$75,000 at OBSFEB in 1981. The gray, a stakes winner in 1982, was winless in three starts the following year, and retired with earnings of \$94,681. She proved even more successful in the breeding shed--her first foal was SW Start a Tab, and her second was Black Tie Affair. Sold for \$85,000 as a FTSAUG yearling, he went on to wire the field in the 1991 GI Breeders' Cup Classic for owner Jeffrey Sullivan, and bankrolled \$3,370,694. Peskoff also raced GI Selima S. and GI Demoiselle S. winner Snow Plow. His son, Jonathan, said of his father, "He came from nothing and started his own financial planning business, and was one of the top sales persons, if not the top, for Northwestern in the mid to late '70s. He was the brainchild for joining annuities with securities, which today is quite the common thing, but back then had not been done. Later in his career, he was a large commercial real estate developer, and was highly successful sitting on boards and providing advice for companies. He was a man who had a passion for the Thoroughbreds, and enjoyed working with people." Services will be held Sunday at 1 p.m. at Temple Shomer in Sylvia, Ohio.

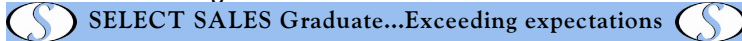

TATAUT WRAPS ON LOW KEY A low-key final session of the Tattersalls Autumn Horses In Training Sale was topped yesterday by four-year-old **Aaman (Ire)** (Dubai Destination), who was bought out of the David Simcock stable by Wales-based trainer Bernard Llewellyn for 42,000gns. "I bought him for my 16-year-old grandson Robert Williams, to ride in amateur flat races initially, but he will probably then go hurdling," said Llewellyn, who fought off trainer Alastair Lidderdale for the Darley-bred colt. The four-day sale turned over 17,577,300gns, up one percent on 2009. The 20,321gns average rose by five percent and the 9,000gns median was level versus last year. The clearance rate dropped from 83 percent to 69 percent. Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "Our October Yearling Sales achieved figures broadly in line with last year's returns, and the trade this week at the Autumn Horses in Training Sale has performed very similarly. The turnover of just over 17.5 million guineas is up a little on 2009, as is the average, while the median is the same as last year." He continued, "The slightly larger catalogue has resulted in a lower clearance rate than the exceptional 85 percent at the 2009 fixture, but has improved upon the clearance rates in both 2007 and 2008. Another positive was the 550,000gns top price [for Hearts Of Fire (GB)], which was the second highest price ever at the Autumn Horses in Training Sale, and the diversity amongst the leading buyers has been particularly encouraging. In many ways, it has been a typical Autumn Horses in Training Sale--huge numbers of overseas buyers at all levels of the market, combined with solid domestic demand from both Flat and National Hunt owners and trainers. 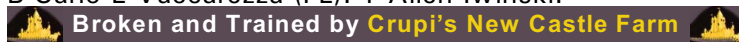
