Awesome Gem Re-Routed to Marathon...

West Point Thoroughbreds' **Awesome Gem** (Awesome Again) was cross-entered in two Breeders' Cup races, listing the Dirt Mile as preferred over the Marathon. But, given the veteran's penchant for finding trouble in running in many of his races, connections have called an audible and will send the 2007 GI Classic third-place finisher in the 14-furlong Marathon. The late-running seven-year-old, who will make his fourth consecutive start on Championship weekend, has three

wins over the last two years, including an 8-1 upset of Rail Trip (Jump Start) in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup July 10. Awesome Gem was sixth to Goldikova (Ire) in the 2008 Mile and an even seventh to Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in last year's Classic at Santa Anita.

Rogue Romance Headed to Juvenile...

Despite making each of his three trips to the post over the turf course, **Rogue Romance** (Smarty Jones), last-out winner of the grassy GIII Bourbon S. at Keeneland Oct. 10, is being pointed to a start in next Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile on the main track. Julien Leparoux will ride the chestnut colt for owner

Catesby W. Clay. "The team at [Clay's] Runnymede feels that the Juvenile is the right race for Rogue Romance, and we are delighted that Julien has accepted the ride," Clay commented. "Rogue Romance's breeding and his training during the summer over the main track at Saratoga indicate

he will perform well on the dirt," added Martin O'Dowd, general manager of the farm. "He's bred top and bottom for it, and everything about his conformation suggests the dirt. His talent is what has propelled him to his success on the turf."

Cash Refund Sizzles in Sprint Prep...

Richard, Bertram and Elaine Klein's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Cash Refund** (Petionville) put in his final work for next Saturday's GI Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup Sprint Friday morning at Churchill Downs, covering five furlongs in 1:00.20 over a fast surface. With jockey Brian Hernandez Jr. in the irons, the four-year-old went in splits of :11.40 for the opening panel, :22:60 for the quarter and four furlongs in :46.60. Working in company of stablemate Homerun Berti (Forestry), Cash Refund was down inside and a length in front after breaking off at the half-mile pole. The gelding completed his move at the seven-eighths pole. "He worked well and I was glad he had that other horse with him," trainer Steve Margolis said. "He's kind of funny in that when he works by himself, he will go in 1:03. I only wanted Homerun Berti to work a half, and Brian said Cash Refund lost a little focus at the wire and then picked it up again." Winner of a pair of black-type events at the Fair Grounds over the winter, Cash Refund exits a distant third in the June 25 Iowa Sprint H. **BC Bulletin cont. p2**

Murjan Clears Quarantine, Arrives at Churchill...

Silverton Hill Farm's **Murjan** (Officer) has arrived in Louisville a little more than a week after leaving Peru, where he won his three career starts by a combined 27 3/4 lengths. "You never know where a good horse will come from," said Darrin Miller, trainer for Tommy and Bonnie Hamilton's operation. "An agent in Lexington passed him on to the Hamiltons. We flew to Peru and watched him and liked him. He was very impressive." After working in Lima Oct. 21, Murjan departed for Miami and spent a week in quarantine there. He flew Thursday night from South Florida to Indianapolis and boarded a van, arriving at 3:30 a.m. at Churchill Downs Friday morning. "He has been in quarantine seven days, so we are going to play his schedule by ear," Miller said of Murjan, who will be ridden in the Breeders' Cup by Rafael Bejarano. "I just got a peek at him when he got in this morning and then now, but so far everything looks good."

BC Launches Zenyatta Fan Video Contest...

Fans can submit their own Zenyatta tribute videos through the Breeders' Cup Facebook page and become eligible for a trip to the 2011 Eclipse Awards. Videos can be uploaded through the "contests" tab on the Breeders' Cup Facebook page and videos must include footage of Zenyatta. Entries must be submitted by Nov. 17 and a winner will be announced Dec. 2.

Head to Join Moss on Preview Webcast...

Freddie Head, a two-time Breeders' Cup Mile-winning jockey who will look to saddle Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) to a third straight score in this year's Mile, will join ESPN's Randy Moss by telephone on a special NTRA Live! Webcast beginning at 12 noon (ET) Saturday. "Our goal all year with these Webcasts has been to deliver high-quality horse racing content via a new media platform," said Keith Chamblin, Senior Vice President of the NTRA. "Fans around the world have embraced the concept, tuning in to watch important Triple Crown and Breeders' Cup prep races, and now we're taking it a step further with exclusive analysis from one of horse racing's most respected voices, and an interview with a central Breeders' Cup figure located a continent away."

Slight Shifts in BC Race Order

The race order of next week's Breeders' Cup Championships at Churchill Downs changed when the pre-entries were revealed. "The anticipated field for the Breeders' Cup F/M Turf came up very strong with eight Grade/Group 1 winners from the UK, France, Japan, Canada and the U.S.," Ken Kirchner of FalKirk International, which directs the wagering product for Breeders' Cup Ltd, said yesterday. "It deserves top billing with the Ladies' Classic." Kirchner added, "The Dirt Mile is also a very deep, high-quality field with eight graded stakes winners. This change also makes a good grouping of the two sprints and the two juvenile races in the early \$1-million guaranteed Pick 4, and a grouping of the Classic, Turf, and two mile races in the \$1.5-million guaranteed late Pick 4."

Aidan O'Brien yesterday declared **Roderic O'Connor (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) for tomorrow's G1 Criterium International and scratched both Exodus (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Recital (Fr) (Montjeu {Ire}). Runner-up to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket Oct. 16, the Coolmore/Sangster-owned colt will face nine rivals in a competitive line-up, as Ballydoyle seek a third renewal following the exploits of Mount Nelson (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) in 2006 and Jan Vermeer (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) 12 months ago. "He had a nice break after winning his maiden, and we were very happy with his effort in the Dewhurst," O'Brien told *Racing Post*. Andre Fabre, who saddled both Carlotamix (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) to collect in 2005 and Thewayyouare (Kingmambo) to follow suit two years later, puts forward Godolphin France's unbeaten **French Navy (GB)** (Shamardal). The only other trainer with an entry to win this previously is Alain de Royer-Dupre, who saddled Dalakhani (Ire) to glory in the second renewal eight years ago. His Highness The Aga Khan's colors will be carried by the stable's course-and-distance debut winner **Ziyarid (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}), the least exposed in the list.

*Editor's Note: Earle Mack, the former U.S. ambassador to Finland, is in Melbourne, Australia, this week, where his four-year-old gelding **Manighar (Fr)** (Linamix {Fr}), who he races in partnership with Terry Henderson, takes aim on Tuesdays Melbourne Cup.*

On a stroll through Melbourne on Tuesday night, it was not a piece of clever advertising or a packed Melbourne Cricket Ground that told me I was at the sports capital of the world. Rather, it was a bar filled with sports fans glued to a replay of an American football game between the Dallas Cowboys and New York Giants, played on the other side of the world that same day. Welcome to Melbourne for the 150th celebration of the richest handicap race in the world, the A\$6 million Melbourne Cup.

The four days of the Flemington carnival will attract over 350,000 people through the famous Flemington gates. That is not bad when you consider the population of Melbourne is 3 million and Australia is 20 million. One hundred years ago, the crowd was 100,000 when the population was 300,000; that is one in three people going to the races.

Compare that to back home in America where the population is 310 million. If the same percentage of our population headed to the track, as Flemington in Cup week in 1910, the crowd would be about 103 million.

Stepping off my 15-hour flight, I felt as if I had flown to another part of America. Australia is one of the few nations in the world that truly loves America and you will be hard pressed finding a friendlier nation anywhere in the world.

Cup night is also the night of the American election so I might be up all night watching results. Bookmakers would have the Republicans a much shorter-priced favorite than Manighar to win Congress. Two years ago, I was the first American attempting to win the Cup when Mad Rush (Lemon Drop Kid) started favorite in the race. Back then, the Australian dollar was worth 66 cents to the American dollar; however, since that time, Australia has flourished economically, so much so that as I was flying over, the Aussie dollar touched par with the U.S. dollar.

Mad Rush was backed into favoritism after a fast-finishing fourth in the Caulfield Cup, historically, a great form reference for the Melbourne Cup. In the Melbourne Cup, he finished seventh, beaten by five lengths-- maybe the hard track did not suit him or maybe he was just off his game. Then and there, I vowed to search for a winner of the Melbourne Cup.

That year, my trainer Luca Cumani finished second in the race for the second straight year with Bauer (Ire) (Halling) being beaten by a pixel. Bauer has recovered from a serious injury to again be in contention for this year.

After the race, I spent time with OTI manager Terry Henderson, and two years later we would land on the same horse at the same time and as a result we will race Manighar together.

That win could easily have come last year, after I unsuccessfully attempted to purchase Shocking (Aus) (Street Cry {Ire}), nine months before his Melbourne Cup triumph.

Manighar is rated a 12-1 chance of winning the big race, or \$13 as the locals would say. I think this probably represents good value. Like Mad Rush, Manighar finished off very nicely in the Caulfield Cup, which has proven a great guide to the Melbourne Cup, as many winners have come through that race. Add to that the fact there will be cut in the ground, which will suit Manighar, the extra distance will be to his advantage, and, with the engagement of world-class jockey Damien Oliver, he ticks most boxes.

The gorgeous Francesca Cumani has been keeping a close eye over Manighar and the other Cumani hopefuls until her father arrives. Both will be treated like rock gods on Tuesday. She has done a magnificent job both with the training of the horses and dealing with the media. Interestingly, quarantine restrictions since the E1 outbreak of a few years back, are very stringent. Only trainers, riders and grooms may see the horses while in quarantine; owners are strictly prohibited.

Melbourne Cup day itself is a world-class event. Run on the first Tuesday in November, it is normally a glorious spring day. At Flemington Racecourse, the flowers have blossomed and are a spectacle to behold, with many of the sights not out of place in the world's nicest gardens, and where the crowd is expected to be over 150,000 people with the television audience exceeding 700 million across the world.

The lead-up to the Cup is just as remarkable, with the Cup Parade down Swanston Street on the Monday, bringing the town to a standstill, as roads are blocked and thousands of adoring fans line the street and cheer wildly as past winners--horses, jockeys and trainers--are paraded before them. As the owner of a horse, I ride with the jockey and trainer as we wave to the fans. I am looking forward to sitting with Damien Oliver again for the event like I did two years ago. To not only witness a parade like this, but to be a part of it is truly remarkable.

Many experts say that the Melbourne Cup is the toughest race to win in the world, and after seeing the race first-hand, I would concur with that theory.

On race day, it surprised me that there is such emphasis on the fashion. Most men wear morning suits. If you arrived at the races in America in a morning suit, you would be greeted by raised eyebrows, looks of bewilderment and laughter.

The ladies, though, steal the show in the fashion stakes--all appear to put as much time into their race-day appearance as trainers do attempting to win the Cup! There are fashion and hat contests where judges award prizes to the most outstanding. This is yet another truly unique aspect to the day.

If an American owner can't win the Cup, then don't be surprised if a horse named Americain (Dynaformer) can. I have followed this horse in France and trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre is very astute. His win in the G3 Geelong Cup would have bought him on nicely for the Cup, and the extra distance and cut in the ground will both be major advantages.

Last time I was in Australia, master trainer Bart Cummings won his 12th Melbourne Cup with Viewed (Aus) (Scenic {Ire}). Bart is an Australian racing icon and there is even a large statue of him up at Flemington. He has a chance to win his 13th Cup with a host of chances, including talk of the town So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}), who won the Cox Plate last week over a mile and a quarter.

It will be interesting to see how he handles the step up to two miles, coming off just a two-day rest after [today's] Mackinnon S. Personally for my horses, a bit more than two days rest would be preferred.

Reigning champion Shocking is again the favorite for this event. He came home nicely in the Caulfield Cup finishing an eye-catching fourth, but I am hoping our horse can turn the tables on him on Tuesday when he has to lump the top weight over extra ground.


My son Andrew has joined me, although the thrill of coming to Australia for him is more about spending time on Australia's world-famous golf courses. I wish he loved racing as much as he does golf, but when your handicap is as low as 8, it is easy to see why he enjoys it so much.

Hopefully, though, on Tuesday we can win the Melbourne Cup and he might inherit his father's passion for the sport, but irrespective of the weather, or where Manighar (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) finishes, the real winner will be the 150th Melbourne Cup.

AAEP Issues Veterinary Guidelines:

The American Association of Equine Practitioners has released a document entitled "Clinical Guidelines for Veterinarians Practicing in a Pari-Mutuel Environment," which promotes practices that the AAEP deems "place the appropriate emphasis on the health, safety and welfare of the racehorse." The thrust of the guidelines is the practice of administering treatment to a horse based on the entry date of its next race. All treatment should be based on a veterinary diagnosis, allowing enough time to ensure the horse has recovered prior to racing again. Entry date should not be the primary factor when evaluating a horse's need for medical care. "Our purpose is to reinforce sound medical principles within the unique environment of racing," said Dr. Nat White, AAEP president. "As horse racing continues its pursuit of increased safety, we understand the need for us, as veterinarians, to examine our role in medication usage and medical treatment. These guidelines affirm the already excellent medical care provided by many veterinarians." The clinical guidelines document was developed by the AAEP Racing Committee, a group comprised of private racetrack practitioners, regulatory veterinarians and veterinary specialists. Dr. Scott Palmer of Clarksburg, New Jersey, and Dr. Foster Northrop of Louisville, Kentucky, serve as chair and vice chair, respectively. "While the guidelines were written for veterinarians, we hope our recommendations will focus the attention of trainers and owners on the 'entry date' dilemma," explained Dr. Palmer. "The racehorse is going to have the most success and be its healthiest whenever the owner, trainer and veterinarian are communicating openly and making decisions as a team. Transparency and integrity within this relationship reinforces good medical practice."

Racing Secretaries Convene in Lexington:

Edited Press Release

Sixteen racing secretaries from tracks around the U. S. and Canada gathered in Lexington, Kentucky, Monday, Oct. 18, to identify issues that all racing offices face; exchange information about initiatives that have had a positive impact on their respective racing operations; and identify best practices that can be used at every racetrack for the betterment of the sport.

The meeting was facilitated and coordinated by InCompass Solutions Inc, a technology solutions company formed in 2001 as a subsidiary of The Jockey Club to centralize the software applications and systems that serve North American racetracks and simulcast outlets.

Among the topics discussed were the declining foal crop, horse inventory and the shortage of available racing stock, continued declines in starts per horse, the effect of state incentive initiatives on racing programs, purse structure, interaction with racing offices at other racetracks, the entry process, scratch times and the growing complexity of race conditions.

"The industry often receives input from regulators, vets, owners and trainers, and it is the hope of this group to use this opportunity to provide input to the industry from the united voice of the racing secretaries," said Rick Hammerle of Santa Anita.

The group is reviewing and prioritizing the various topics and issues discussed during the meeting to identify actionable items. Among the immediate actions to be undertaken are to:

- Determine the feasibility of formalizing the group and creating a structure that would enable racing secretaries to speak to the industry as a unified body
- Analyze current purse structures, field sizes and stakes schedules

Brad Kimbrell, the executive vice president of InCompass, said, "This was not meant to be a one-time occurrence and, to a person, the group has pledged to continue the dialogue, in person and on conference calls, to ensure that some of these ideas and practices are implemented."

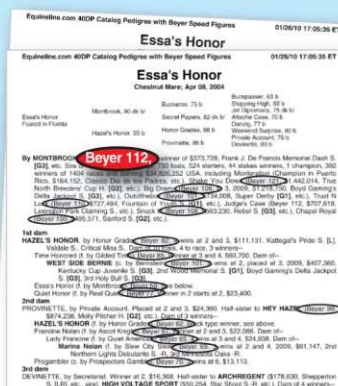

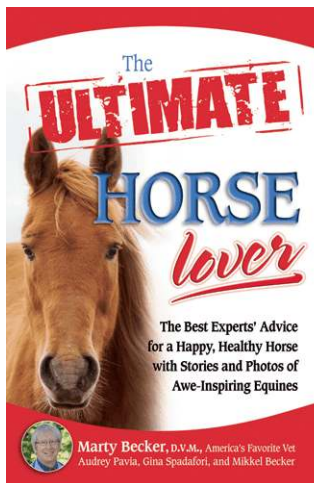
