STUD FEE SET FOR ESKENDEREYA

Grade 1 winner and leading three-year-old **Eskendereya** (Giant's Causeway--Aldebaran Light, by Seattle Slew) will stand his inaugural season at Taylor Made Stallions in Lexington, Kentucky, for a fee of \$30,000 live foal, stands and nurses. The chestnut was most impressive in 2010, winning the GI Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. and GI Wood Memorial S. in back-to-back performances. Owned by Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, Eskendereya was retired earlier this year. The

\$250,000 KEESEP yearling purchase was campaigned throughout his racing career by Zayat Stables. "There are very few horses that showed the type of quality that Eskendereya did on the racetrack," said Ben Taylor, Vice President of Taylor Made Stallions. "He was precocious at two and special at three, with a brilliant mix of speed and stamina. I don't recall a more exciting three-year-old that was built better for the classics than he was." Eskendereya's first three damsires are Seattle Slew, Alydar and Northern Dancer, and he is bred on several similar crosses to Shamardal, Europe's leading second-crop sire who is also by Giant's Causeway. He also won Belmont's off-the-turf Pilgrim S. at two. Jackson added, "Eskendereya represents the highest of quality, and we feel that he presents a fantastic opportunity at \$30,000. He was an elite racehorse--one who captured the imagination unlike any other three-year-old this year. Physically, he's as grand-looking as a Thoroughbred could be, and it all makes sense when you evaluate his tremendous pedigree. He embodies what is required of a top stallion prospect, and he'll get the full support of Stonestreet."

GIO PONTI TO MILE

Last year's champion older male and champion male turf horse **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat) will be entered for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, it was announced. The Castleton Lyons colorbearer was also pre-entered for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, which was listed as his first preference. A game runner-up behind Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in last year's Classic over Santa Anita's Pro-Ride, Gio Ponti heads to the Mile following a sharp win in Keeneland's GI Shadwell Turf Mile S. Oct. 9. "Having thought long and hard about our choices, we have decided to enter our dual champion in the Breeders' Cup Mile," Castleton Lyons President Shane Ryan commented. "As tempting as the Classic is, we were awed with his last trip over the mile course at Keeneland when winning the Shadwell Mile. It is due to this professional performance that we feel we must take on the best milers in the world, including a show down with Goldikova (Ire). I'm not sure which filly is more feared, Goldikova or Zenyatta, either way neither race is a picnic! We are very much looking forward to the challenge."

UNRIVALED BELLE POINTING FOR LADIES' CLASSIC

Trainer Bill Mott said Monday that **Unrivaled Belle** (Unbridled's Song), pre-entered in two Breeders' Cup races last week, will likely target the G1 BC Ladies' Classic rather than the G1 BC F/M Sprint. "We have an option, but I think the option we're going to take is the [Ladies'] Classic," Mott said. "I think she'd be very competitive in the Filly and Mare Sprint going seven-eighths, [but] she won going two turns here in the spring." Mott added, "I guess the [Ladies' Classic is] where the big reward is." Unrivaled Belle bested Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) when she took the GII La Troienne S. by a head at Churchill Downs Apr. 30. In three subsequent starts, she ran second in the June 12 G1 Ogden Phipps H., Aug. 1 G1 Ruffian S. And Oct. 2 G1 Beldame S. The four-year-old had her final prep Monday, going a half in :49 2/5 on the Churchill main. Kent Desormeaux was in the irons.

BLAME IN EASY PRE-CLASSIC WORK

Temperatures had dipped into the high 30s when Adele Dilschneider and Claiborne Farm's **Blame** (Arch) took to the track at Churchill Downs yesterday in the early morning darkness. The four-year-old contender for the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic stood with a lead pony at the eighth pole for a bit before getting to the task at hand, a four-furlong drill that would be his final serious piece of work in advance of Saturday's \$5-million feature. In what trainer Al Stall, Jr. termed a maintenance move, Blame went the distance in an easy :49 4/5 under Garrett Gomez.

"He started out comfortable, did his job, pulled up with a little buck and a squeal, and came on home," said Stall. "Garrett said he's becoming like a movie star; he loves all the cameras and attention out there." The G1 Whitney S. hero galloped out in 1:03 1/5. Gomez, who has been aboard Blame in each of his last four starts and who rides in the Classic, said the colt was eager to do more. "The last time I went to work him at Saratoga, before the Whitney, I had trouble getting him to the pole, he was pulling that hard," Gomez said. "This morning he started out like that, but I was able to kind of con him around there and play with him and get him into a nice little gallop and kind of trick him that he was just going to gallop around there. His work was just what we were looking for, just enough to open his lungs and get him a little more on edge."

BIONDETTI '90 PERCENT' FOR JUVENILE

Godolphin's undefeated European invader **Biondetti** (Bernardini), who captured the G1 Gran Criterium at San Siro Oct. 9, looks like he'll make his dirt debut in the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile, rather than start in the GII Juvenile Turf over familiar underfoot conditions. "It would be because of Bernardini and the breeding for dirt, and because he's a Group 1 winner on turf," explained his trainer, Mahmood Al Zarooni. "The Juvenile is a Grade I, and the Juvenile Turf is a Grade II. We haven't decided yet, but it's 90 percent that we will go for the dirt." Biondetti, who visited the track around 10 a.m. yesterday after clearing quarantine, would be attempting to give jockey Ahmed Ajtebi his second straight victory in the Juvenile. The rider won it aboard Vale of York (Ire) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) last season.

SIDNEY'S CANDY WORKS; SALE STILL POSSIBLE

The Craig Family Trust's **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) hit the turf course at Churchill yesterday and put forth only his second-ever work on the spinach. Jenny

Craig's homebred, a candidate for the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, covered five furlongs around the dogs in 1:01 flat. It was the co-fastest of four moves at the distance, along with GI Filly & Mare Turf hopeful Forever Together (Belong to Me). With exercise rider Jose Alferrez up, the striking chestnut was caught through splits of :12, :24 3/5, :37 3/5 and :49 2/5. He galloped out in 1:15 3/5.

"It was a good move for him," trainer John Sadler said. "He's a fast horse, and his speed will be in play here Saturday. Anyone who saw his race at Del Mar this summer knows that he's a special horse capable of special things." In his turf debut at Del Mar this summer, Sidney's Candy set a new course when winning the 1 1/16-mile GII La Jolla H. in 1:39 2/5. Sidney's Candy was slated to start in the GI Oak Tree Mile at Hollywood Oct. 9, but was scratched after it was announced that the three-year-old was due to be sold privately. The transaction has yet to go through, but Sadler said negotiations with Middle East interests were still ongoing. "Either way--in Jenny's colors or with the possible new owners--he'll run Saturday," said Sadler.

THORNS, PHONE DEFINITE FOR DIRT MILE

Crown of Thorns (Repent) and **Dakota Phone** (Zavata), both cross-entered for the GI Dirt Mile and GI Classic on Breeders' Cup Saturday, will both head to the former, connections confirmed yesterday. Crown of Thorns is trying to do one better than his runner-up effort in last year's GI Sprint, a race trainer Richard Mandella opted to bypass over the summer. "I decided not to go in the Sprint after the seven-eighths race at Del Mar [the GI Pat O'Brien S. Aug. 28, when he was a closing second]," said Mandella. "He acted like he wanted to go farther." Mandella stretched the five-year-old out to two turns in the GI Goodwood S. at Oak Tree Oct. 2, and the bay acquitted himself well, running Richard's Kid (Lemon Drop Kid) to a half-length in the 1 1/4-mile test. Despite the good showing at the Classic distance, Mandella decided to scale him back in trip. "I knew the Classic would have a lot of horses, and a lot of good horses," he said. "You better have some experience with those guys, so I'm sticking with the [Dirt] Mile. He's a very good horse. I know he will give it a good try."

JUVENILE A GO FOR J. B.'s THUNDER

Trainer Al Stall, Jr. gave the undefeated **J. B.'s Thunder** (Thunder Gulch) the green light for Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile after the colt worked four furlongs at Churchill yesterday. Owned by Columbine

Stable, the bay had to wait for a loose horse to be corralled after stepping onto the track shortly after the renovation break yesterday, but then got down to business, breezing the distance in :50 flat. He went in company with stablemate Heritage Hall (Unbridled's Song). "It was a perfect work," Stall said. "Shaun [Bridgmohan, rider] said he was

perfectly relaxed, dragged him up to that horse, and wanted to accelerate on his own when he turned for home. He had to slow him down a little bit, and when he got to the wire he dropped his hands a little bit, and 'J.B.' took off again with his ears forward. It was a great work." A first-out winner on the grass at Saratoga in August, he drew off by four lengths in a front-running victory in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland Oct. 9. Immediately after the race, Stall said he might wait for the lucrative \$1 million GIII Delta Jackpot later in the month, but changed his mind after watching his colt on the dirt in recent days. J. B.'s Thunder's last work, a bullet four furlongs in :47 flat, came at Keeneland Oct. 22. "He came over here from Keeneland and took to the dirt just like he'd been here his whole life, although he was here for 3 1/2 months from April to mid-July, so we weren't too concerned," said Stall. The conditioner said the prospect of an Eclipse Award factored heavily into the decision to go in the Juvenile. "I just don't want to deny him the chance of being two-year-old champion, which is what would happen if he wins this race," said Stall. "He just has to be perfect--he's got to look perfect, train perfect, his legs have to be perfect--and so far, he's been that way. We'll see what he looks like tomorrow, but we haven't had any problems with him, and the way he worked today, I have to say he's a definite go." Despite being on the lead in both of his wins, J. B.'s Thunder isn't a one-dimensional horse, said Stall. "We had no intention of ever being on the lead, he just kind of 'out-athleted' them out there," the trainer said. "He rates kindly, but he just breaks so sharp that he usually just spurts away from them. He took a big, deep breath in the middle of the turn at Keeneland, and just relaxed and kicked on home on his own, so that's always a good sign, too."

PROVISO WORK LEAVES MOTT CONTENT

Juddmonte Farm's **Proviso (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) is coming into the GI Breeders' Cup Mile on a four-race winning streak--all in Grade I company--and yesterday turned in an eye-catching work over the Churchill Downs sod. Going to the track shortly after 9:30 a.m. and working with the dogs well out, the five-year-old mare breezed four panels in :51 3/5 under Kent Desormeaux. Mike Smith, her regular rider, will be aboard Saturday. Trainer Bill Mott talked things over with Desormeaux after the work, then fielded questions from reporters. "She was very good," the Hall of Famer, wearing a New York Yankees ballcap, said of the move. "Kent did a great job with her. She warmed up nicely, [was] off a little easy, but she came through the stretch in :23 and change. He never let her off the bridle, and she galloped out very strong. I couldn't be happier." Proviso won the GI First Lady S. at Keeneland Oct. 9 in her most recent. She has never started at Churchill Downs.

JUVENILE FILLIES FOR JORDY Y

Trainer Wayne Catalano said yesterday that Darrell and Evelyn Yates's **Jordy Y** (Congrats) is "90 percent certain" to be sent to the GI BC Juvenile Fillies over the GII BC Juvenile Fillies Turf. The chestnut has made all four starts on all-weather, most recently finishing third in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland Oct. 8. "She's only run on PolyTrack so far, but she may be a dirt horse," Catalano said. "Her pedigree is more dirt than anything. From different camps around the track, I'm hearing that the turf race might be coming up a little tougher than the dirt. I could go either way, but Mr. Yates is leaning strongly toward the dirt."

'BOYS' BREEZES AT BIG A

GI Hopeful S. winner **Boys at Toscanova** (Officer), the likely second betting choice in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, breezed five panels in 1:01 flat (2/5) Monday morning. Regular rider Ramon Dominguez guided the dark bay through fractions of :25 1/5, :37 3/5 and :49 1/5 fractions; the gallop-out time for six furlongs was 1:13 3/5. "It was everything we wanted," said trainer Rick Dutrow, Jr. "Ramon was very happy with the horse, and I've got to go by what my riders tell me in the morning. We figure we're sitting on a stick of dynamite. We're very excited about this horse." Boys at Toscanova flies to Kentucky today.

“AWESOME” BREEZE FOR WARRIOR’S REWARD

Getting in a final workout before Saturday’s GI BC Sprint, **Warrior’s Reward** (Medaglia d’Oro) went a half in :49 flat and galloped out five-eighths in 1:02 on the Churchill main track.

Exercise rider Tracey Wilkes, wife of trainer Ian Wilkes, was in the irons. “He was awesome--he just didn’t follow instructions,” Wilkes said. “Ian said to go easy to the pole, and he pulled me on up there.” Added the conditioner, “He’s full of energy, pulling up wanting to do more, and that’s what I want to see. He looked good--everything was perfect this morning. The main thing was just getting in a main-

tenance work and getting some air in his lungs, letting him run down the lane a little and finish feeling good. We’re just tweaking him a little bit, and I expect to see him bounce out of this work ready for the race.” The winner of the GI Carter H. in April and a rallying second, beaten a half length by **Atta Boy Roy** (Tribunal), in the GII Churchill Downs H. in May, the four-year-old was sixth in the GI Met Mile H. May 31 and fourth in the GI Forego S. Sept. 4. He finished third in the Oct. 6 GIII Phoenix S. on the Keeneland Poly last time out. “He just didn’t like the PolyTrack, but he loves it here at Churchill and he’s been training fantastic,” Ian Wilkes said. “I’ve got no excuses coming into this race.”

COURT VISION WORKS FOR THE WEEKEND

IEAH Stables and Resolute Group Stables’ **Court Vision** (Gulch), a close-up fourth in last year’s GI Breeders’ Cup Mile, put in his last work yesterday before another crack at the \$2-million race. The Rick Dutrow, Jr.-trained colt went five panels in 1:02 flat over Aqueduct’s main track. Exercise rider Michelle Nevin was in the irons. “He’s not the greatest work horse in the world; he’s a bit lazy in the mornings,” said Nevin. “I was really happy with him this morning.” Court Vision is coming into the Mile off a strong, 12th-to-first win in the GI Woodbine Mile Sept. 19, but Dutrow knows his charge needs another huge effort up against his conqueror last year, two-time champ Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa). “He’s training great, but man, this race is coming up tough,” said Dutrow. “[But] his Woodbine win was unbelievable.” Court Vision, winner of the GIII Iroquois S. over Churchill’s main track as a juvenile, has started twice on the sod under the Twin Spires. He ran third to Einstein (Brz) (Spend a Buck) in the GI Turf Classic in 2009, then returned in that race this term to be second by a neck to General Quarters (Sky Mesa). Court Vision ships to Kentucky today.

BLOW OUT FOR DEFENDING CHAMP

Looking to put them back-to-back in the GII BC Turf Sprint, **California Flag** (Avenue of Flags) stretched his legs over the Churchill sod yesterday, going three panels in :36 2/5. "It was a good move," trainer Brian Koriner said. "I think he got a hold of this course well. I'm expecting that he'll show up [Saturday]." Koriner is hoping to see improvement off the gelding's 11th-place finish in the GIII Woodford S. on the turf at Keeneland Oct. 9. "It was unsettling not to see him really try last time," he remarked. "He just couldn't seem to get a hold of that course over there. But if he 'gets' this one, he'll be back in the game."

ETCHED TO VAN FROM SPA

Darley homebred **Etched** (Forestry), pointing toward Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic off an upset win in the GII Monmouth Cup Oct. 9, galloped 1 3/8 miles over the Poly at Darley's Greentree Training Center in Saratoga yesterday and is expected to board a Kentucky-bound van today. The five-year-old is expected to arrive early Wednesday. "He's stabled at Greentree at Saratoga, so it'd be a four-hour van ride down [to New York City], and then he'd have to be boarded onto a plane," trainer Kieran McLaughlin explained of the decision. "We figured it would be easier for him to put him in a box stall and van him down there." Etched gets the services of Alan Garcia for the Classic.

AL KHALI SHARP IN CHURCHILL WORK

Al Khali (Medaglia d'Oro) tuned up for the GI BC Turf Monday, going five furlongs in 1:01 2/5 around the dogs on the Churchill turf. Jockey Julien Leparoux, who replaces Alan Garcia aboard the four-year-old, was in the saddle. Trainer Bill Mott was pleased with the move. "It looked like he was on the bridle most of the way," he said, adding, "If you look at him, you'd know he's the type of horse who's going to get better as he gets older." A neck winner of the GII Bowling Green H. at Belmont Sept. 11, the bay was a troubled fourth in the GI Canadian International S. Oct. 16, finishing just 3/4 of a length behind winner Joshua Tree (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}).

Dancinginherdreams (Tapit), a dazzling heroine of Sunday's GII Pocahontas S. at Churchill Downs, will likely return to action in Gulfstream's seven-furlong GII Forward Gal S. Jan. 29. Ridden by Julien Leparoux on the Stars of Tomorrow card, the gray awaited racing room on the turn for home and gamely shot through an opening along the rail to win for fun. "She is good this morning," trainer John Ward said early Monday. "I was excited to see some daylight yesterday for her to get through. It was a little suspect at the quarter pole." Ward continued, "I didn't want to go two turns [in the GII Golden Rod S. at Churchill Nov. 27], then shorten up when we got to Gulfstream." Bred in Kentucky by Nancy Shuford, Dancinginherdreams was a \$330,000 KEESEP yearling graduate.

Stonestreet Stables's and George Bolton's **Astrology** (A.P. Indy), a 2 3/4-length winner of Churchill's GIII Iroquois S., may reappear beneath the Twin Spires in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 27. "I will discuss it with Mr. [Jess] Jackson, but it is a strong possibility," trainer Steve Asmussen revealed. Astrology, a two-length winner over the GIII Nashua S.-bound To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) at the Spa Sept. 4, headed to the Stars of Tomorrow program following a third-place finish in Monmouth's Garden State S. Sept. 25. "He ran a lot better than he did the last time," jockey Garrett Gomez said. "I thought he'd win for fun that day. They went a little faster early yesterday and I let him do a little more. He's got a lot of talent." Jackson's Stonestreet operation acquired the mare Quiet Eclipse (Quiet American) for \$1.6 million in 2007 while carrying Astrology in utero. He RNA'd for \$285,000 as a KEESEP yearling last year.

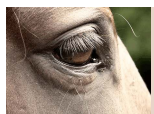

A breeder's route to success can be fraught with so many possible wrong turns that any signpost is more than welcome. So, when a stallion sires a top performer from the daughter of a particular sire, you can be sure that more daughters of that sire will gravitate towards him the following breeding season.

Sunday's results provided two reminders of this, with the GIII Iroquois S. falling to Astrology, an A.P. Indy colt with a Quiet American dam, and the G1 Criterium International to Roderic O'Connor, a colt sired by Galileo from a Danehill mare. Roderic O'Connor, of course, had earlier finished runner-up in the G1 Dewhurst S. behind the exciting Frankel, another representative of the Galileo/Danehill cross.

These youngsters were conceived in 2007, on the strength of compelling clues from some of 2006's top events. A.P. Indy's 2006 representatives out of Quiet American mares were Bernardini, who clinched the three-year-old championship with his Preakness-Travers-Jockey Club Gold Cup sequence of Grade I victories, and A.P. Warrior, who notched up a pair of Grade II successes.

These two, remarkably, were A.P. Indy's first two foals out of Quiet American mares but the total now stands at 10, including six youngsters conceived in 2007. These represent quite a slice of his 2008 crop, which numbers 58.

Moving on to Galileo and Danehill, this has always been a popular cross, partly because both these champion sires were Coolmore stallions, as was Galileo's extraordinary sire Sadler's Wells.

Danehill had drawn attention to the possibilities of this type of cross by siring some very talented performers from daughters of Sadler's Wells. Among the earliest examples were Irresistible Jewel (G2 Ribblesdale S. in 2002), Chevalier (a neck second to Dalakhani in the 2002 Criterium International), Roosevelt (third in the 2003 Irish Derby) and Five Dynasties (G2 King Edward VII S. in 2004). Although this cross produced 3x3 inbreeding to Northern Dancer, its early successes guaranteed that more and more foals were bred this way, and it enjoyed its finest moment in 2007, when Peeping Fawn won four consecutive Group 1s to establish herself as Europe's champion middle-distance filly.

It was therefore inevitable that breeders would send daughters of Danehill to Galileo from the moment he covered his first mares in 2002. Although the first two foals from this cross both won, it was Teofilo, one of the two second-crop foals out of Danehill mares, who became its first stakes winner. Undefeated in five juvenile starts in 2006, including in the G1 National S. and the G1 Dewhurst, he ended the year as champion European two-year-old.

The number of Danehill mares visiting Galileo had been steadily increasing, producing four named foals in 2005, five in 2006 and seven in 2007, but Teofilo's 2006 exploits opened the floodgates. There are 17 youngsters bred this way among Galileo's current two-year-olds and, in addition to Frankel and Roderic O'Connor, they include Golden Lilac, an unbeaten daughter of the Group 1 winner Grey Lilas.

The incentive for sending Danehill mares to Galileo has been further increased by such distinguished representatives as Cima de Triomphe (2007 Derby Italiano), Cuis Ghaire (second in the 2009 1000 Guineas) and Gile Na Greine (a close third in the 2010 1000 Guineas). As a consequence, there are 19 yearlings from this cross, including brothers to Frankel and Roderic O'Connor and fillies out of the Group 1 winners Aquarelliste, Banks Hill, Echelon, Luas Line and Simply Perfect.

At least another 24 were born this year, including a sister to Roderic O'Connor, and there's even a filly out of Peeping Fawn, which is inbred 2x3 to Sadler's Wells.

Incidentally, the figures given here relate solely to the Northern Hemisphere, adding up to 37 named foals of racing age, of which 10 have so far earned black type and four have become Group 1 winners. With nearly half of the 37 still being only two years old, these statistics can be expected to improve substantially.

You will often see Galileo credited with having 79 foals bred this way, but more than half of them come from the five seasons he spent in Australia. Those seasons yielded 572 foals, the youngest of which are three-year-olds of the 2010-11 Australian season. I find it scarcely credible that a stallion who has 17 Group 1 winners in his Irish crops; has only one to his credit among his numerous Southern Hemisphere progeny. This just goes to show how different bloodlines often suit different conditions.

His best Australian runner out of a Danehill mare has been Banc de Fortune, a filly who was second at Group 1 level, but he also has two South African stakes winners with Danehill dams.

Roderic O'Connor was bred by Swettenham Stud. It isn't hard to see why the colt's dam, Secret Garden, was considered a good match for Galileo. In addition to having a dam by Danehill, the broodmare sire of Teofilo, he has a second dam by the outstanding miler Kris. It was Kris's brother Diesis who sired the dam of Galileo's first-crop son Sixties Icon, winner of the 2006 St Leger.

Roderic O'Connor comes from a family that carried the late Robert Sangster's colors with distinction. His third dam is Durtal, a quick-maturing filly who helped put Lyphard on the map as a stallion by winning the 1976 Cheveley Park S. Durtal looked set for an excellent second season when she trotted up in the G3 Fred Darling S., but she then came up against the formidable Madelia in the French 1000 Guineas. Durtal's stamina was to be put to the test in the Oaks, but she was injured after she unseated Lester Piggott on the way to the start.

Durtal became the dam of Gildoran, twice a winner of the Ascot Gold Cup over two-and-a-half miles, but Roderic O'Connor's second dam, the Kris mare Chalamont, was a hard-puller who won twice over six furlongs at two.

Sent to Danehill, who sired the Group 1 winner Kissing Cousin from another Kris mare, Chalamont produced Roderic O'Connor's dam Secret Garden. If her name seems familiar, it is because she became a stakes winner over 1 1/16 miles on turf at Turf Paradise, having won a seven-furlong listed race at Ascot during her time in England.

With none of his first three dams having won over much further than a mile, Roderic O'Connor isn't guaranteed to stay a mile and a half. The same could be said of Frankel and it looks as though this is a quandary we are going to have to get used to over the next few years, as more and more good horses emerge from the Galileo-Danehill cross.
