



## ZENYATTA FAVORED AT 8-5 IN BC CLASSIC

Looking to become the second back-to-back winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and possibly the first to win three Championship events overall, **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) was installed as the 8-5 morning-line favorite in Saturday's running of the \$5-million race. The six-year-old, who drew post 8 in the 12-horse field, arrived at Churchill Downs yesterday after a flight from California and a van ride from Louisville International

Airport. The voyage included a police escort and was tracked by a local news helicopter. Owners Jerry and Ann Moss also flew into Kentucky yesterday. "We came in right behind her," Ann Moss said. "She looks great--she's all dappled out. She did really well." Quipped Jerry

Moss, "She shipped better than we did." He added, "The Breeders' Cup, every year, has always been our goal. It's where the big action is, and it's where we want to be." A large crowd was there to greet the great mare when she stepped out of the van, and the Mosses were impressed by the reception. "Everybody seems to have a great feeling for her," Jerry Moss said. "There were 45,000 people on a Friday at Oaklawn [for the GI Apple Blossom S.], and hundreds of people just watched her get off the plane and graze [on the Churchill backstretch]. She's got something, obviously, that people feel pretty good about, and it seems to transcend racing." A teary Ann Moss reflected, "It's hard to talk about, but every day with her has been a celebration. It's just amazing to be a part of it all--we are very blessed." As for her chances in her Classic title defense, Jerry Moss remarked, "It's a tough race, a great group of horses, and if she beats this group, it will really be something. We think she's up to the task, or we wouldn't be here." **Blame** (Arch), assigned post five, is the second choice in the Classic at 9-2, and **Quality Road** (Elusive Quality) is third at 5-1. The latter, who had to be withdrawn from the Classic last year after throwing a tantrum at the starting gate, drew post 1. "Obviously, that wasn't the post position we were hoping for," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "But it's less of a disadvantage in a 12-horse field. The horse is doing very well. It's as tough a field as you could possibly assemble, but we're looking forward to giving it a try." Can Quality Road end Zenyatta's winning streak at 19? "Thus far, it's been impossible to beat her," Pletcher offered. "But we're hoping the dirt track will help us a little bit and Quality Road, on his day, can run as good as anybody."

## AMERICAN FIRST IN MELBOURNE

**American** (Dynaformer), trained in France by Alain de Royer-Dupre, but owned by the Melbourne-based Gerry Ryan and Kevin Bamford, came calling in the final of the 16 furlongs which comprise the G1 Melbourne Cup and denied **So You Think (NZ)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) in his attempt for a repeat success in the "race that stops a nation." Demoted from the victory in the 2008 G3 Prix de Lutece, American scored by a length for his breeders in the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier over the Melbourne Cup distance the following May before being repatriated for a spell. Unplaced in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational, the GII Bowling Green H. and the GIII Sycamore S., the dark bay was third in a Gulfstream allowance this past January before returning to France. **cont. p10**

**BLIND DRAW**

Three-year-olds have been favored in 11 of the 27 runnings of the GI BC Ladies' Classic (nee Distaff), but only three have managed to come home on top. (That's assuming that Lady's Secret would've been favored in

1985, and not stablemate Life's Magic, who beat her). This year, **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) will be looking to elevate that stat for the sophomore set. The winner of the GI Kentucky Oaks over the track, she is the 9-5 morning-line choice facing 10 rivals. "Our filly likes the

racetrack, she likes the dirt and she always gives a very good effort," trainer Jerry Hollendorfer said. "I think she has a pretty good chance to win. I'm happy to walk over as the favorite." The chestnut drew post 10 in the nine-panel test. It's her widest draw since she came out of the nine hole and romped by 13 1/4 lengths in a \$40,000 maiden claimer in her debut at Calder in June of 2009. The filly has been no farther out than post five, her Oaks draw, in her 13 subsequent starts, but Hollendorfer is unconcerned. "I'd rather be out there than way inside," he said. "I'm not unhappy with the post." Blind Luck has hit no less than seven racetracks in six different states this campaign while winning five of her eight starts. Her trainer is not worried about the effects of the frequent flyer miles either. "She has done a lot of travel," Hollendorfer said. "The races I wanted to run in, the ones I wanted to concentrate on, were back on the East Coast, on the dirt. She seems to take the travel very well. It didn't seem to dampen her enthusiasm for training or take anything out of her. I'm not too concerned about that."

**Draw for Team Pletcher**

Todd Pletcher will saddle 10 horses over the two days of the Breeders' Cup, and his luck at the draw was mixed. Two drew the rail, two drew the far outside, and the other six were scattered between posts 3 and 11. The conditioner was philosophical about the situation. "You can get great trips from bad posts and bad trips from great posts," he said with a shrug. Pletcher was pleased with the draw of **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie), who will break from post 7 in the GI BC Juvenile. The GI Champagne S. winner was made the 7-5 chalk on the morning line. "It's the perfect spot," Pletcher remarked. "There is plenty of speed inside him. He should be able to find a way to the turn in good position, and take it from there." As for the plan of action for Classic hopeful Quality Road, he said, "We have to get position leaving the gate. We'll have to play that by ear. We have a lot of confidence in Johnny Velazquez, and that's one of the decisions he'll have to make."

Pletcher was enthusiastic about returning to Churchill Downs for the Breeders' Cup. "It's the perfect site," he opined. "It's neutral--there's no advantage for the East Coast guys, there's no advantage for the West Coast guys. It's a good neutral surface, and it's suitable for the Europeans. They don't have to travel into a hot climate." In a perfect world, according to Pletcher, the event would rotate between California, New York, Kentucky and a wild-card site every four years. "I'm a fan of having the Breeders' Cup at different locations," he said. "It's the fairest way to do it for everyone."

**History in the Making?**

All eyes will be on Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) when she looks to make a mark in the Breeders' Cup record books Saturday, but **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) has the chance to get there first. The five-year-old faces arguably the toughest field of the 14 Breeders' Cup races as she bids to become the first horse ever to win three Championship events in the GI BC Mile. She was 9-5 when she took the race in 2008, and went off at 7-5 in 2009. This year, she is 6-5 on the morning line after drawing post 10 in the 11-horse field. The bay had her first look at the Churchill strip yesterday morning, jogging the wrong way single file in company with GI BC F/M Turf hopeful **Plumania (GB)** (Anabaa) and GI BC Turf runner **Behkabad (Fr)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), then turning around for an easy gallop on her own.

**FROM THE POST POSITION DRAW...**

**Trainer Dale Romans**

"In a 12-horse field going a mile-and-a-quarter, I don't think there's a bad post. I just like to have a horse on each side of me; that worked out well. I think Paddy O'Prado out of the two-hole, he's going to drop back and try to make one run anyway. I think First Dude [post 4] is fast enough. He's going to break and the real speed will go to the lead. He'll be covered up by them and he'll sit as long as he can."

**Trainer Al Stall, Jr. on Blame's post five:**

How can you not be happy with that number? I'm not a big post position person unless you draw far to the outside, so it's one less thing to worry about. Post position number five is just fine."

**Trainer Bob Baffert on Lookin at Lucky's post 12**

"It's better than the one-hole. He went to the extreme opposite from his Kentucky Derby post position. It's not the end of the world. I guess you could say it's a good thing that all the speed is inside of us. That's a joke."

**First Time Plucky**

Last year, Dr. Chris Ruhnke had the chance to buy a small share in a Team Valor homebred that was being offered to newcomers to the business. A fan of the

sport since high school, Ruhnke decided to take the plunge on then-yearling **Pluck** (More Than Ready). You can call it beginner's luck if you like, but Pluck will be taking the first-time owner to the Breeders' Cup, competing in the GII BC Juvenile Turf.

Better still, the good doctor believes he could find himself in the winner's circle Saturday.

"Obviously, the European horses are going to be tough," Ruhnke said. "But, my take on it is that every race out, Pluck has improved. If he can improve a little more and get a perfect ride from Garrett Gomez, we have a chance. It's a hard race to win, and we're going to need a little racing luck to get there, but, realistically, I think we can get there."

Ruhnke, an orthopedic surgeon based in Cincinnati, has seemingly risen to a lofty spot in a very short span, but he is far from an overnight success.

"I've been following horses for a very long time," he remarked. "I grew up in New Jersey, so I grew up going to Monmouth Park. Then one of my good friends [fellow orthopedic surgeon Dr. Tony Infante]--he's my son's godfather--invested in horses with Team Valor, and I've been following him along. He put me on to Team Valor and, when the opportunity came up last year to buy into Pluck, I decided it was the right time for me and my family to get involved. I decided to pull the trigger and invest in my first horse."

Pluck is out of Secret Heart (SAf) (Fort Wood), a mare acquired by Team Valor from her native South Africa, where she was a listed winner and three times Group 1 placed. The dark bay started four times in the U.S., running second in allowance company twice, then headed to the breeding shed. Pluck is her first foal.

According to Team Valor International CEO and founder Barry Irwin, the decision was made to make the colt part of a program introduced last year that targeted owners new to racing. The first horse offered was the ill-fated Sailor's Cap (Distant View), who enjoyed solid success, winning the GIII Colonial Turf Cup in 2008 and the GIII Poker S. in 2009, and earning \$616,970.

Explained Irwin, "Both Sailor's Cap and Pluck are home-breds. They were both bred nicely enough, and were well conformed and athletic. We knew them from birth, knew they had no problems and felt they would do us proud. Team Valor owned a majority interest in each of these colts, so we had equity interests available to market.

"Our idea was to offer five-percent interests in the colts, and include as part of the deal a four-payment installment opportunity, in order to make participating as painless as possible," he concluded.

The deal suited Ruhnke, who had decided he would rather be involved in a partnership than try to buy a horse on his own. **Cont. p9**



"There were multiple factors for that," he stated. "Number one, Team Valor gave me the opportunity to invest in a better class of horse than I could afford on my own. As a novice, they also offer much more knowledge--about the horses that they buy, the breeding of these horses, and everything else that needs to be done in the horse racing business. There are probably about 50 corporations like Team Valor and, after doing some research, I found they had the best track record, and the longest, of doing it with success. I just thought it was the right opportunity for me."

Team Valor will offer yet another homebred colt in the newcomers' program this year.

"Our third is Thursby, a current yearling Mr. Greeley colt who is the second foal of the German group winner Dalicia (Ger) Acatenango {Ger}," Irwin said. "Her first foal, Animal Kingdom (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) broke his maiden impressively two weeks ago going long on Poly at Keeneland."

A busy schedule keeps Ruhnke from getting to every race, but he heads to the track to watch Pluck run as often as possible.

"Pluck's run four times, and I've seen him run twice--when he won his first race at Belmont [a maiden special weight on the turf July 11], and when he ran at Monmouth [in the Continental Mile S. Aug. 14, where he finished second, but was DQ'd and placed fourth]," he said. "Unfortunately I didn't have the chance to see him up at Woodbine [winning the GIII Summer S. last time out Sept. 18], but, obviously, I'll be there at the Breeders' Cup. You don't miss that one."

The Ruhnke family--wife Melissa and sons J.T., 10, and Kevin, 8, have been able to attend some of the races as well.

"They were with me when Pluck won his first race at Belmont," the doctor remarked. "That was a thrill for them. We were all in the winner's circle together, which was fun for them. They enjoyed that."

But it will be Dr. Infante, who has shared the love of horses since the two met in seventh grade, and owns a share in Pluck as well, who will share the Breeders' Cup experience.

"He and I are meeting up [in Louisville]," Ruhnke offered. "Thursday night, there is Pluck owners' get-together, and we will be out at the races Friday and Saturday."

Still, Ruhnke said he believes the kids will develop an interest in racing as deep as his own.

"With the amount of time that horse racing is on the TV at home, it would be hard for them not to," he laughed.

### American First in Melbourne (cont. from p1)

Having shown ability as a stayer, American caught the attention of bloodstock agents David Medbury and Robert Rouston, who offered a reported \$225,000 on behalf of Ryan--founder of the successful Jayco Caravans--and Bamford, and the entire was turned over to de Royer-Dupre. "We bought him to run in the Melbourne Cup, he had already qualified for the race," Bamford told *Australian Associated Press*. "Every race he won was a bonus."

Fifth on his first start for new connections, he rattled off five consecutive scores, including the Listed Prix du Carrousel at Deauville July 30 and a narrow defeat of Manighar (Fr) (Linamix {Fr}) in the G2 Prix Kergolay at that same venue Aug. 22. American was sent to Australia to have his final prep in the G3 Geelong Cup H., and he came through, carrying top weight of 128 pounds and Gerald Mosse to a head victory. He had his fair share of backers in the market and was sent off a 12-1 chance behind So You Think, at 2-1 the strongest favorite since 1971. Drawn in the lower half of the gate, American jumped smoothly and took up a position slightly better than midfield, as the filly **Once Were Wild (Aus)** (Johannesburg) took them along at an even gallop over rain-softened turf. So You Think, running on three days' rest following his score in Saturday's G1 Mackinnon S., was always forwardly placed, but proved a difficult ride for Steven Arnold, tossing his head and pulling through the opening mile.

By the time the field reached the side of the Flemington oval, Once Were Wild had expanded her advantage on the engine, while the market heavies were bidding their time a bit further back. Daylight came for So You Think with about a quarter-mile to race, and he looked like he might be on his way to history. But Mosse and American were winding up, came widest of all and outstayed his rivals to the wire. Maluckyday nosed So You Think out of second, while Zipping (Aus) (Danehill) filled the fourth spot for the third time in his career.

"The job is so easy when we have the best horse," Mosse told *Racing Post*. "I took my time and up the straight I could see the favourite going through, and he had been travelling a bit too keenly all the way, and I knew when I pressed he would answer. I knew I was going to catch him, so I took my time in getting to the winning post."

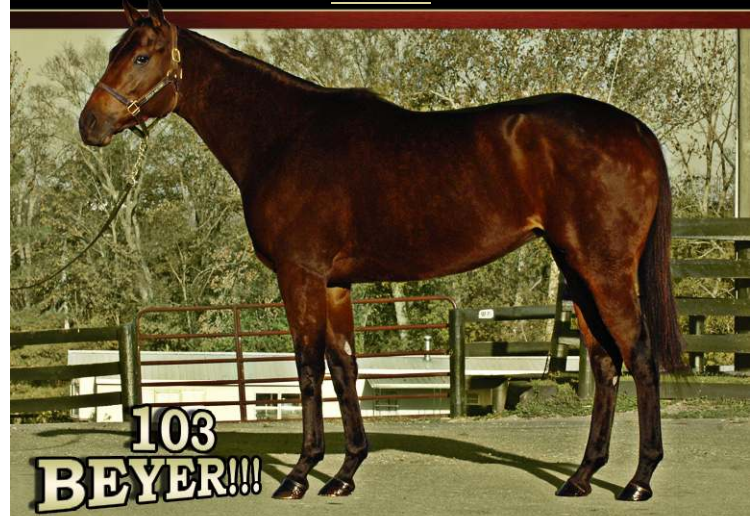
Trainer Bart Cummings, looking for a remarkable 14<sup>th</sup> Cup, was critical of the ride given to So You Think.

"I told the jockey to wait until the clocktower [about one furlong from the finish] but I think his clock stopped. I'm not saying So You Think didn't run the distance--the winner just stayed the distance better."

### DOUG CAUTHEN LEAVES WINSTAR

Doug Cauthen has resigned from his position as president and CEO of WinStar, the farm announced yesterday. Cauthen has been with WinStar since its inception in 2000. He will be replaced by Elliott Walden, who had been serving as vice president and racing manager for WinStar. The announcement comes weeks after it was announced that Kenny Troutt had bought out minority partner Bill Casner in the farm, which captured the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. this year. "Helping WinStar grow and succeed on all levels has been my number one mission for the past decade," Cauthen said. "WinStar gave me the experience of a lifetime, which only a limited number of horsemen will ever know. Kenny and Bill afforded me the opportunity to know what makes a great racehorse, what makes a great stallion, and what makes a great farm. From having the experience of recruiting and developing a world class stallion roster to being involved with winning two legs of the Triple Crown this year, I wouldn't trade the last 10 years for anything in the world. It has been an invaluable experience. But life always changes and it's time to look towards the future to find new opportunities. I can imagine that my future might include helping new clients navigate this great industry--it would be wonderful for the whole industry if more people found greater levels of success." During Cauthen's tenure, WinStar's stallion roster grew to include leading stallions Distorted Humor, Tiznow and Speightstown, as well as the farm's homebred Grade I winners Bluegrass Cat and Colonel John. Next year, the roster will also include WinStar's homebred Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver. Cauthen said the sale of the farm proved the right time for his departure. "Kenny and I have had several discussions regarding the consolidation of the farm and his vision of the future," he said. "At the end of the day, now seems like the appropriate time to offer my services to a wider group of people. I feel very fortunate to have been part of such a superb team, and I have learned a great deal by working for Kenny." Troutt added, "Doug has had a huge impact on WinStar and its development into a leading commercial and stallion farm. He has negotiated big deals for the purchase and sale of bloodstock, screened all the mares submitted to our stallions, constantly evaluated our bloodstock in the fields, handled a lot of responsibility at the sales, and on and on. He has a special mix of horsemanship and business acumen that have and always will serve him well. I wish all the best to Doug, who has been nothing short of stellar in every respect. He and his entire family are the epitome of class in this industry. He has agreed to continue on with the farm in a consulting role during the transition, and will most likely be an independent sounding board for WinStar for a long time in the future."

Astutely plucked out of the New York claiming ranks for \$50,000 last April, the six-year-old makes her next start in Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint at Churchill before heading into the ring at Fasig-Tipton's November Sale two days later. She has been consigned as a racing/broodmare prospect by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent IV, as [lot 82](#).

"We are hopeful that we can win a small stakes with a lot of the horses that we claim up north and bring down to Florida, but obviously a Grade I was far beyond what we could have ever hoped for," Myron Miller said of Jessica Is Back, who was formerly campaigned by Gumpster Stable and trainer Bruce Brown.

Jessica Is Back, bred in Florida by Larry Perkins, has done little wrong in 14 trips to post since joining the Marty Wolfson barn following a close second-place finish at the Big A. In addition to her impressive two-length win over a stacked group of female sprinters during the Summit of Speed program in July ([video](#)), the versatile mare has also annexed a pair of black-type events at Calder and Gulfstream going a mile or longer. Out of the multiple winning Jolie's Halo mare Jessica's Halo, the chestnut gave subsequent MGISW and GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic contender Life at Ten (Malibu Moon) all she could handle when second-best in the GIII Sixty Sails H. at Hawthorne in April, and completed the trifecta behind reigning Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) in Churchill's GII Fleur de Lis H. in June. Third behind Rightly So (Read the Footnotes) in Saratoga's GI Ballerina S. Aug. 28, Jessica Is Back was supplemented for \$90,000 to compete in the Breeders' Cup. **Cont. p13**

The Sunshine Millions Distaff runner-up will face off against a loaded bunch on day one of the World Championships, including the aforementioned Zayat representative, as well as defending champion female sprinter Informed Decision (Monarchos).

"She can do anything, that's what we like about her," the 34-year-old said of Jessica Is Back, who has placed first or second in 25 of 45 career starts, good for \$796,765 in earnings.

"She has a real good shot in the Breeders' Cup. I left it up to Marty [Wolfson] entirely [to supplement]. He's a fairly conservative trainer and said, 'Let's give them the money and let's go.'"

With a broodmare band of approximately 25 head, Miller said that he would rather add to Farnsworth's racing stable--which is similar in size--than hold

on to Jessica Is Back for breeding purposes.

"To be honest, we prefer racing," he explained. "So, by selling her, we can go buy more racehorses."

Two other shrewd \$50,000 claims courtesy of Farnsworth Stables and Wolfson--Gill Azalea S. third-place finisher and Charles Town Oaks runner-up **Bronx City Girl** (Yankee Gentleman), and Calder stakes winner **Jeux de Danse** (Grand Slam)--will be offered at the upcoming breeding stock sales in Lexington, Kentucky as well.

Bronx City Girl--haltered from owner Bill Hayes and trainer Tom Amoss out of a sharp 7 1/4-length tally beneath the Twin Spires May 27--immediately increased her value while carrying the Farnsworth dark blue colors for the first time by hitting the board behind Pica Slew (Pico Central {Brz}) in her graded stakes bow in the Azalea ([video](#)). Bred in Kentucky by Brereton C. Jones, the three-year-old daughter of GI Hollywood Oaks third-place finisher Carsona (Carson City) returned with another good effort in the \$400,000 Oaks in West Virginia Sept. 18. She lines up next against her elders in Churchill's GII Chilukki S. on the Nov. 6 Breeders' Cup undercard, then heads to the sales ring as a racing/broodmare prospect at Newtown Paddocks as [hip 25](#). The half-sister to MGSW Siphon City (Siphon {Brz}), is consigned by Casse Sales, Agent I.

“She ran good numbers, was a three-year-old, and the Azalea was coming up,” Miller said of the decision to fill out the slip on Bronx City Girl, who brought \$100,000 as a KEESEP yearling. “We thought that she’d fit in there nicely, and the Florida horses seem to do well in the stakes at Calder. We figured that we could train her over the track for a while and she’d be successful. She ran really well and also ran excellent at Charles Town. We’ll take a shot against older horses in the Chilukki; she really enjoys the Churchill track.”

Jeux De Danse, claimed on four different occasions throughout her 25-race career, made one start for Paul Pompa Jr. and Patrick Reynolds in September 2008 before catching the attention of the Millers’ operation at Belmont. Shipped to Calder following a close third-place finish, the dark bay got the job done in a \$50,000 optional tagger, then achieved her first taste of black-type with a win in the grassy Copano S. The daughter of the winning Pleasant Colony mare Caroline’s Dance was sent to the breeding shed following respectable efforts in the Gill My Charmer H. and the Marshua’s River S. and produced a Dixie Union filly in 2010. The seven-year-old is currently in foal to Juddmonte’s Empire Maker and will be presented by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent XXXIX, at Keeneland November as [lot 183](#).

The sales action doesn’t stop there for Farnsworth. **Champagne Eyes** (Flatter), a \$95,000 purchase at last year’s KEENOV sale, has been catalogued as a racing/broodmare prospect by Casse Sales, Agent I, as [hip 31](#) at Fasig-Tipton November. The five-year-old mare was last seen completing the exacta behind Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled’s Song) in the Gill Rampart S. at Gulfstream Mar. 20.

“We’re selling about 17 horses [at FTKNOV and KEENOV],” Miller revealed. “We have a couple of weanlings at the Fasig sale and we’re also selling seven or eight mares at Keeneland just to put some more money together to go buy some more racehorses.”

Miller added that stable star Gozzip Girl, off the board in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational at Belmont Oct. 2, would return for a five-year-old campaign. She is currently spending some time in the oxygen chamber at the Miller’s KESMARC-Florida, which is also located on the Farnsworth property in Ocala. -SS

The 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita, the first run on a synthetic surface, marked the final career start for three of the top four young stallions who retired in 2009, had their first foals born in 2010, earlier this year, and are among the 10 young sires with seven or more weanlings catalogued during the first week of the November sales: Fasig's one-day extravaganza on Sunday, November 7, followed by Keeneland's first three Books (first six days), the following Monday-Saturday. (See *Freshman Sire Table p20*)

It was arguably **Curlin** (Smart Strike)'s worst race; he finished fourth behind **Raven's Pass** (Elusive Quality) and **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo)--the only time in his 16-race career he was off the board (for the record, Tiago {Pleasant Tap} was third). Owner Jess Jackson blamed the 'plastic,' but most professionals were of the opinion that Curlin wasn't the same horse once he came back from winning the G1 Dubai World Cup the previous March, and the Beyer speed figures supported that point of view. Curlin, after all, retired as the winningest racehorse in American history, racking up just over \$10.5-million in earnings. He ran third to Street Sense and Hard Spun in the 2007 GI Kentucky Derby in only his fourth lifetime start, came back to beat the Derby top two in the GI Preakness, then was beaten a head by Rags to Riches in the GI Belmont S. Third to Any Given Saturday and Hard Spun in the GI Haskell H. in his comeback race, he skipped the GI Travers but defeated 'olders,' including Lawyer Ron (who was 3-5, coming off impressive wins in the GI Whitney and GI Woodward S.) in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup (Beyer 114). Curlin then won the GI Breeders' Cup Classic impressively in the Monmouth slop, running a Beyer 119 and earning champion three-year-old (in a good year) and Horse of the Year titles. He had a prep race at Nad al Sheba at the end of February 2008, then won the G1 Dubai World Cup by seven lengths at 2-5 at the end of March 2008. The race earned a Racing Post Rating (RPR) of 131, which equates to the Beyer 119 he ran in the Breeders' Cup Classic.

Though he was unbeaten in three subsequent starts on conventional dirt later in 2008, his three Beyers in those wins were 110-112-111; and he was beaten in his other two starts, in the GI Man O'War on the grass, and in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. Be that as it may, it really doesn't detract from his overall accomplishments. Curlin was a complete superstar, and he's by a horse everybody likes in Smart Strike, so it's a certainty there will be plenty of interest in the eight foals from his first crop catalogued to sell at Fasig (one) or Keeneland's first three books (two in Book 1, five in Book 2). *Cont. p18*

When Curlin ran fourth to Raven's Pass and Henrythenavigator, he was finishing fourth to Europe's two top three-year-old milers of 2008. The top American three-year-old of 2008, by a fairly wide margin, was **Big Brown** (Boundary), who has 15 weanlings from his first crop catalogued in the November sales' first week.

Winner of a Saratoga turf race by 11 lengths in his only start as a two-year-old, Big Brown proved himself the best American dirt three-year-old that year with a five-length win in the GI Florida Derby (Beyer 106), followed by a four-length win over the ill-fated Eight Belles in the GI Kentucky Derby (Beyer 109). He won the GI Preakness easily also, by five lengths, but his Beyer figure was only 100--not any better than the rest of his pretty average crop were running. He went off at 3-10 to become the first Triple Crown winner in 30 years in the GI Belmont S., but finished tailed off, a huge disappointment. He did come back to win the GI Haskell (at 1-5, Beyer 106), and a \$500,000 grass race at Monmouth in what was intended as a GI Breeders' Cup Classic prep, but he had to be retired before he could meet up with Curlin, Raven's Pass, and Henrythenavigator. Big Brown is not a horse who has the charisma of Curlin, but he was decisively the best three-year-old of his generation, and, with grass form and plenty of grass elements in his pedigree, he's one European foal buyers might be taking a look at, along with more familiar names.

Raven's Pass and Henrythenavigator met five times as three-year-olds. 'Henry,' the more precocious (he had won the G2 Coventry S., six furlongs at Royal Ascot in June, as a two-year-old), defeated Raven's Pass the first three times they met at three. He won the G1 English 2000 Guineas, with Raven's Pass fourth; the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot and the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood, Raven's Pass a good second in both those races. Henrythenavigator also won the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas, and in both the English and Irish 2000 Guineas, his immediate victim was New Approach (Galileo), so the form looks pretty stellar. However, by the end of the year, Raven's Pass was getting stronger. After winning the G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood, Raven's Pass then upended 'Henry' in their next two meetings: the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S., at a mile at Ascot; and then in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. At year's end, Timeform assigned Raven's Pass a rating of 133 (Racehorses of 2008), Henrythenavigator was rated 131. New Approach, who bounced back from his Guineas defeats to win the G1 Epsom Derby and later the G1 Champion S., was rated 132; his first foals will be appearing at the European sales this year. Raven's Pass stands at Kildangan, in Ireland (a Darley farm), but has seven foals catalogued in Kentucky the first week of the November sales; Henrythenavigator, who stands at Coolmore's Kentucky farm, Ashford, has 14 catalogued.

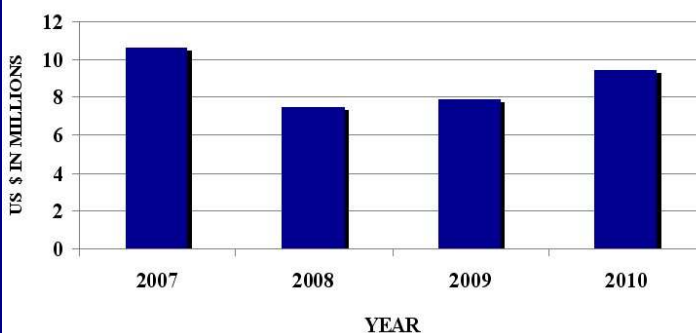
# Weekly Sales Ticker

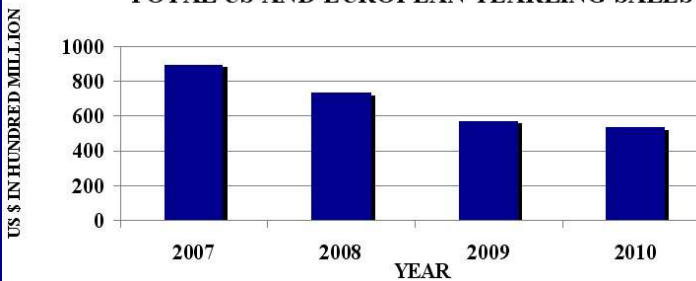

Curlin and Big Brown are entitled to appeal to Europeans as well as Americans; Raven's Pass and Henrythenavigator are sure to appeal to Europeans, and, oh, by the way, did run one-two in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic when it was contested on the all-weather, synthetic, plastic, or whatever you want to call it. One horse sure to appeal to Americans of all stripes is **Midnight Lute** (Real Quiet), who has 22 weanlings catalogued in the first three Books at Keeneland. Midnight Lute is the only horse to win the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint twice, the first time in the slop at Monmouth (Beyer 108), the second on the synthetic at Santa Anita (1:07:0 flat, Beyer 112). He also once ran a Beyer 124, when winning the Forego over seven furlongs at Saratoga on fast dirt.

The only F2010 stallion (first foals 2010) to have more catalogued in the first week of the November sales than Midnight Lute is **Street Boss**, who ran 13 times in his life, all on synthetics in California, including when third to Midnight Lute in his final career start, the 2008 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Racing for a partnership including trainer Bruce Headley and from the first crop by Street Cry, which also included 2007 GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense and a certain Zenyatta, Street Boss was never out of the first two in his first eight starts in 2008, his six wins including the GI Triple Bend H. and the GI Bing Crosby (Beyer 107; he also ran a Beyer 109 when second in the GI Ancient Title). Purchased by Darley to add to their collection of sons of Street Cry, he's proven very popular, and is represented by 27 weanlings in the sale's first week.

**War Pass**, by the successful Blushing Groom-line sire Cherokee Run out of a Mr. Prospector mare from a great Claiborne family (Bourtai, who was dam of Delta and Bayou, War Pass's fourth dam), was the undefeated champion two-year-old of 2007. Trained by Nick Zito for Bob LaPenta, he ran a Beyer 103 when winning the GI Champagne S., eased down, from Pyro; he repeated the dose, only more so, in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Monmouth, running an off-the-graph (for a two-year-old) Beyer 113, leading all the way and winning, again eased down, from Pyro and Kodiak Kowboy. He didn't make it past the GI Wood Memorial as a three-year-old, but he was a seriously good two-year-old, so his eight foals in the first week should generate plenty of interest.


The favorite in the GI Champagne had been **Majestic Warrior**, an A.P. Indy colt bred by the late George Steinbrenner's Kinsman Farm who had won the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga with a Beyer 95--good for a two-year-old at that time of year. Out of Dream Supreme, a dual seven-furlong Grade I winner at Saratoga (GI Test, GI Ballerina) by Seeking the Gold out of Spinning Round, herself a winner of the GI Ballerina, by Dixieland Band out of Take Heart, by Secretariat--it all means that Majestic Warrior is inbred 3x4 to Secretariat (also damsire of A.P. Indy) and 4x4 to Buckpasser--an extremely potent genetic combination, the Coolmore team is hoping.

They have to recoup it in the breeding shed because, unfortunately, after they bought into Majestic Warrior, he never won another race. In fact, he was unplaced in all five of his subsequent starts. However, he is certain to be a very good-looking horse; he has a very good pedigree, especially if all that inbreeding clicks; and he has a very powerful team behind him. There are 17 weanlings by Majestic Warrior catalogued in the first week, in Keeneland Books 2 and 3.

Also with seven or more foals catalogued in the first week of the November sales are: Millennium's Kingmambo horse **Student Council**, winner of the GI Pacific Classic as a five-year-old, and the GI Pimlico Special, at six; he has seven catalogued in Books 2-3. And with 10 catalogued is **Tiz Wonderful** (Tiznow), winner of the GI Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs as a two-year-old, and one of the three Spendthrift stallions represented by their first foals in 2010. **Into Mischief** (Harlan's Holiday) has four catalogued in the first week; and **Notional** (In Excess) has three.

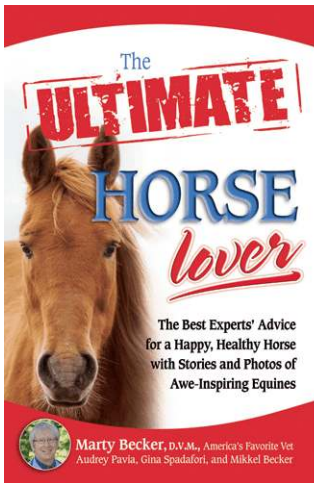
