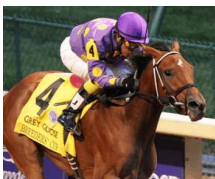
SHARED ACCOUNT SHOCKS MIDDAY IN F/M TURF

Defending GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf champion Midday (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) looked to have victory in her sights yesterday evening, but 46-1 Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect) snuck through on the inside to claim the \$1.8-million event for Sagamore Farm. "I tell you, coming across a horse like this that I know the books called a longshot, in our opinion, man, she's a winner," said owner Kevin Plank. "She was classy." Cont. p4-5

Jacks or Better Farm's Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course) hadn't gotten much press while compiling a five-for-five record at Calder, but wound up going postward in the GI Grey Goose Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies as a tepid 4-1 favorite. The Florida-bred put away a valiant R Heat Lightning (Trippi) to likely secure year-end honors. "I'm speechless," said winning trainer Stanely Gold. "I was confident that she was right and ready to run. Basically, I wanted to see if she could do this, and she didn't disappoint me. We hoped she could just keep climbing up the ladder, and she did." DUBAI MAJESTY RULES F/M SPRINT

Dubai Majesty (Essence of Dubai), sent off at 8-1 in the GI Sentient Jet Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint, put away a strong field and came home a comfortable winner over California invaders Switch (Quiet American) and Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet). "On the turn, she took a deep breath and grabbed me and took me to the lead," said winning rider Jamie Theriot. "When we made the quarter pole, I said, 'That's it. I ain't gonna get beat today.'" MOMENT OF ZEN

Ahead of her date with destiny in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic this evening, unbeaten Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) continued to thrive with a lively gallop under the Twin Spires. The six-year-old had a 12-furlong spin at 9:15 Friday morning. "She really felt great," said exercise rider Steve Willard. "I'm really glad that [trainer] John [Shirreffs] didn't ask me to go around three times. She would have made it, but my arms wouldn't have." The big mare will be coming from off the pace, as will second-choice Blame (Arch). That colt's trainer Al Stall Jr. mused about the prospective pace scenario with ESPN analysts Jerry Bailey and Randy Moss. "We were trying to guess what the six-furlong split would be in the Classic, and we put the under-over at 1:11," Stall said. "That would be good for us. We've seen enough 1:13s and 1:12s--we're ready for a little pace in there." Classic cont. p14-15

BELLE DU JOUR

Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled's Song) knows a little bit about playing second fiddle, but coming out on top. On her only other previous voyage to the River City, the homebred daughter of dual Grade II winner Queenie Belle (Bertrando), belied her off odds of 9-1 and took down none other than reigning Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra in the GI La Troienne S. Apr. 30. Five races later on that same program, the well-traveled **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) was sent off at 13-10 to give trainer Jerry Hollendorfer a third win in the GI Kentucky Oaks. It wasn't easy, as they went only a moderate pace up front, but the chestnut overcame that slow tempo, rallying wide to score by a nose. She would go favored at 3-2 to become just the second Oaks winner to follow up in the Breeders' Cup, but Unrivaled Belle would play spoiler yet again.

Unrivaled Consistency...

A debut second sprinting at Keeneland last April, Unrivaled Belle rattled off three consecutive wins, including a 6 3/4-length romp in the Real Prize S. Oct. 23, and closed a promising freshman campaign with a runner-up effort in the GI Gazelle S. Nov. 28. Given one crack to run against her own age group to begin her four-year-old season, the striking grey filly was only fourth in Santa Anita's GI La Canada S. Feb. 14, but bounced back to wire the field in the GI Rampart S. at Gulfstream Park Mar. 20. Allowed to lay close to a moderate pace in the La Troienne, she came to tackle Rachel Alexandra at the quarter pole and would not go away, earning a hard-fought head decision. Unrivaled Belle then ran into a road block otherwise known as the Todd Pletcher armada of distaffers. Runner-up to the front-running Life At Ten (Malibu Moon) in the GI Ogden Phipps H. at Belmont June 12, it was Malibu Prayer (Malibu Moon) who tagged-teamed the Bill Mott runner in the Aug. 1 GI Ruffian H., relegating her to the bottom of the exacta. In her final prep for the Ladies' Classic, Unrivaled Belle prompted the pace in the GI Beldame S. at Belmont Oct. 2, but couldn't quite match strides late with Life At Ten and was bridesmaid again. That would all change in the span of a little more than 110 seconds Friday evening.

Tactical Advantage...

The complexion of the Ladies' Classic changed in the preliminaries, when jockey John Velazquez, aboard the 7-2 second choice Life At Ten, reported to ESPN's Jerry Bailey that his mare was not warming up to his satisfaction. As soon as the gates flew back, it was clear

that his concerns were well-founded, as the five-year-old dropped herself out the back of the field and essentially called it a day. She would ultimately be eased under the line. Up front, it was her stable-mate, Malibu Prayer, as expected, who cut out the early running, chased by GI Alabama S. third **Acting Happy** (Empire Maker) and GI Spinster S. heroine **Acoma** (Empire Maker),

having her final career appearance. Possessed of solid tactical foot, Unrivaled Belle was about fifth, within four lengths of the front-runners, while Blind Luck found herself at the back of the field. After a four furlongs went up in a shade over :49 seconds, those who backed her into favoritism were feeling uneasy.

Malibu Prayer still had the call as the field put the half-mile pole in the rear-view mirror, but at that point, Kent Desormeaux decided to try to win the race right there and then, launching Unrivaled Belle in move reminiscent of Real Quiet in the 1998 Kentucky Derby. With a burst of energy, she moved four wide to overhaul the pacesetters and set out to make life difficult on the come-from-behinders. Blind Luck had begun her patented rally at about the three-eighths pole and weaved her way into the mix in upper stretch. She took aim on Unrivaled Belle in the final furlong, but the elder rival had just a bit too much in the tank and held sway to the wire. **Havre de Grace** ran admirably in third, a length behind Blind Luck, who wrapped up her division's Eclipse Award in spite of the defeat.

"She took me all the way to the three-sixteenths pole all by herself," said Desormeaux, winning the Ladies' Classic for the first time. "She was on the bridle all the way. I hadn't moved on her until then. I asked her, and she went. I saw Blind Luck on TV [infield screen] coming at the three-sixteenths, and then I saw her again at the sixteenth-pole and she hadn't gained any ground on me. I was home then."

For the runner-up, connections were offering few excuses.

"She did everything like she always does," commented jockey Joel Rosario. "She broke good and got good position. We moved when I wanted her to and she just ran like she wanted to win, but the winner was too good."

Life At Ten Performance a Puzzler...

Life At Ten, five-for-six in 2010 and heading into the Ladies' Classic as the leading candidate for championship honors, was "abnormally quiet" in the paddock, according to trainer Todd Pletcher. Though Velazquez was obviously concerned, he never asked the on-track veterinarian for an opinion, Dr. Larry Bramlage told *Daily Racing Form*. She was sound both immediately after the race and several minutes later at the barn.

"I told him [John Velazquez] when we left the paddock that I was concerned about the way she saddled," Pletcher explained. "I told him to make sure and warm her up well. Unfortunately, she's either had some sort of allergic reaction to her Lasix treatment, or she's had some severe cramps, or tied up before she ever went out there. Her week to 10 days here has been phenomenal. We felt really, really confident that she was coming into this race so well. That's why I think it's some kind of reaction to the Lasix."



SHARED ACCOUNT ECLIPSES MIDDAY

On Thursday morning, Shared Account gave her connections a scare when she dropped her rider just as she was about to enter the turf course to gallop. Her exercise rider, with arms raised and fear in her voice, did her best to block off the otherwise open backstretch, while the outriders, already positioned behind her, quickly moved in to apprehend the excited filly

([video of the incident at 1:00 mark](#)). It was an incident that could have been much worse, and could have even precluded the four-year-old's participation in the yesterday's Filly & Mare Turf. As it was, Shared Account not only started in the race, but at 46-1 fought off the heavily favored Middyay to spring the biggest upset

in the race's history. "I'm speechless," said winning trainer Graham Motion. "I'm very emotional. I love this filly. I'm not surprised she won. I'm really surprised she was overlooked [by the bettors]. She only had one bad race." Cont. p5

Sharing is Caring...

A good three-year-old who was perhaps a cut below the best of her generation, Shared Account won the GII Lake Placid S. at Saratoga and ran second in Belmont's GI Garden City S. and Keeneland's GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge S. She began her 2010 season with a close-up fourth to Rainbow View (Dynaformer) in the GIII Gallorette S. at Pimlico May 15, then rallied into slow fractions to win the GIII All Along S. at Colonial June 19. She was flying in the nine-furlong GI Diana S. at the Spa July 31, only to find Proviso (GB) (Dansili {GB}) a head too strong. That effort prompted bettors to give her a good 7-2 chance in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational Oct. 2, but, after a lackluster fifth-place effort in a bog, they dismissed her chances here.

As one of just two mounts for jockey Edgar Prado at the championships, Shared Account was a well-placed third tucked in along the hedge as the Euro invader Plumania (GB) (Anabaa) led through :25.64, :50.32 and 1:15.94 splits. Despite getting to the half in a tepid 1:40.95, she began to feel the heat as the field fanned wide in upper stretch. Prado smartly guided Shared Account to the outside of the tiring pacesetter, moved back to the hedge and joined with Midday at the eighth pole, and simply outfinished last year's winner with gutsy run to the line.

"I tried to get the filly nice and relaxed in the first part of the race," said Prado. "She broke so good, and I dove right into the rail and was able to cover her up. I was hoping the hole would stay open until I got there, and luckily the filly was running pretty good. Once she saw the clear, she kept grinding. I think she really wanted to win today."

It was a big win for Prado, who not long ago was considered one of the top two or three jockeys in the nation, but who has been on something of a cold streak. His last win in the Breeders' Cup came at Churchill four years ago, when he guided Round Pond (Awesome Again) to an upset in the GI Distaff.

"I tend to get more emotional with Edgar," said Motion. "He's been one of my favorite riders, if not my favorite. It went from the days when I couldn't get him when I started. It's very special."

It was Motion's second Breeders' Cup win. He previously lit up the toteboard with 27-1 longshot Better Talk Now (Talkin Man) in the GI Turf back in 2004. For three straight years, he hit the board in the F/M Turf with Film Maker (Dynaformer) (2nd '04, 3rd '05, 2nd '06).

BETTER THAN AWESOME

Jacks or Better Farm's **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course) had flown a bit under the radar while winning the first four races of her career at Calder, but began to get some attention when she stretched out to a route in the My Dear Girl S. Oct. 16, and dusted her rivals by 8 1/4 lengths. The defection of several leading contenders saw her go postward yesterday in the GI BC Juvenile Fillies as at tepid 4-1 favorite, and the bay filly came through for owner/breeders Fred and Jane Brei, who were seeing their purple-and-yellow colors carried at the championships for the

first time.

"We're a small breeder--we only have 14 to 16 foals a year," said Fred Brei. "We bred and own her sire, Awesome of Course [Awesome Again]. And we bought her dam as a yearling and raced her. So when you have a double homebred, that's as good as it gets."

The unbeaten juvenile, almost assured of year-end honors, is catalogued as [hip 10](#) Sunday at Fasig-Tipton

"She will stay in that sale," Brei confirmed. "Our reason for that is quite simple. I prefer to race in south Florida, and Stanley doesn't prefer to run all over the country, so we're better off to let somebody own her that will run her where she needs to run."

Awesome Feather, a 5 3/4-length winner at first asking at Calder May 1, overcame some trouble to land the Jj's Dream S. at that track July 10. She secured the first leg of the Florida Stallion Series, the Aug. 7 Desert Vixen S., by 4 3/4 lengths, and took the Aug. 28 Susan's Girl S. by four. Those races were all at one turn, and Awesome Feather concluded her sweep of the Florida Stallion Series with her eye-catching romp in the My Dear Girl ([video](#)).

After California-based Grade I winners Rigoletta (Concerto) and Wickedly Perfect (Congrats) dropped out of Breeders' Cup contention, Awesome Feather's My Dearl Girl effort began to stand out, and she wound up going off as the favorite yesterday, albeit at a tepid 4-1. She broke alertly under Jeffrey Sanchez and secured a good spot directly behind pacesetters **R Heat Lightning** and **Theyskens' Theory** (Bernardini), who put up splits of :23.90 and :48.14. Awesome Feather ranged up boldly on the far turn and looked like she'd win by daylight, but R Heat Lightning dug in valiantly, and the two exchanged bumps. Though Awesome Feather was reluctant to change leads, she finally got the better of her fellow Florida-bred, and edged away in the final strides.

"I wanted to make one move with her," Sanchez explained. "When I asked her, she went. Then, when we got in the stretch with that other filly, she bumped us, and my filly tried harder. She came away from that other filly. I love her. The first time I rode her, I told everyone that this was a champion filly, and now she is a champion." **Cont. p7**

Fred Brei, a native of Illinois, moved to the Ocala, Florida, area in the mid-1990s. The Jacks or Better operation may be streamlined, but it's done quite well, being honored with Florida's Needles Award in 2001 and 2004 as the Sunshine State's outstanding small breeder. The Breis bred and raced stakes winner Awesome of Course before supporting him at stud, and did the same with Hear No Evil (Carson City). The latter is the sire of Jackson Bend, a multiple stakes winner in 2009 for the Breis before they sold a majority interest in him to Robert LaPenta. Another Jacks or Better acquisition, Bayou Plans (Bayou Hebert), produced Grade I winner Midas Eyes (Touch Gold), whom the Breis sold privately to Edmund Gann. The couple also sold Bayou Plans's 2007 Medaglia d'Oro colt for \$1.6 million at FTFFEB in 2009, and the bottom line is what led to Awesome Feather's inclusion at Fasig-Tipton.

"The deal was, and Stan knew it well, was that if we win the race, she goes to the ring," Brei explained. "We run back in the pack, she goes home. That's the difference, you know, in all reality. I would assume an undefeated filly that won the Breeders' Cup will be the juvenile champion. And, at that point, she needs to race where all the Grade Is are, and that's why she's going to the sale."

"The reserve hasn't changed--it's high," Brei added. "It's always been high."

Precious Feather (Gone West), a granddaughter of top performer Quill (*Princequillo), was acquired privately by Jacks or Better. She bankrolled \$257,441 while winning four black-type races and placing in a pair of Grade III events. The 13-year-old mare produced a full-brother to the Breeders' Cup winner in January, and was bred back to Consolidator (Storm Cat).

Yesterday, the former claimer put on a tour de force performance under the Twin Spires to take the GI BC F/M Sprint by 2 1/4 lengths.

"We were excited about running here at Churchill Downs," trainer Bret Calhoun said. "One of the best races of her life came here in the Winning Colors. She has been consistent for us on all surfaces, but, obviously, she has a proven affinity for the Churchill surface."

Owners Bill Martin and Dan Morgan had to pony up the supplement to give their mare a shot at the Breeders' Cup, but they felt they would get their money back.

"We were \$90,000 worth of confident," Floridian Morgan said.

Added Martin, "This filly has improved really year after year since we've owned her. It just seemed she was thriving in the sprint races. We thought she was good."

MORE THAN READY FOR A THROWDOWN

Bobby Flay loves a challenge. The celebrity chef regularly takes on the best in the business as he travels the country for *Throwdown! with Bobby Flay*, one of seven cooking shows he has hosted. Yesterday, he threw down with the best in the world in the GI BC Juvenile Fillies Turf and came out a winner once again as **More Than Real** (More Than Ready) rolled to a two-length victory.

Flay had to sweat out an objection by Jose Lezcano aboard runner-up **Winter Memories** (El Prado {Ire}), but not for long. The stewards quickly determined that the winner had not hampered the even-money chalk, and it was time to celebrate.

“This is obviously the biggest win I’ve ever had in horse racing, by a magnitude of a thousand,” Flay said during the post-race press conference. “It was just an amazing feeling. In fact, I don’t remember the last sixteenth of a mile because I couldn’t see. I had my wife, [actress] Stephanie [March] with me, obviously, and my friends, and everybody was jumping all over each other. The last sixteenth of a mile was a blur to me.”

Flay also was initially unaware that the an objection had been lodged.

“I didn’t hear [the announcement],” Flay admitted. “Actually, I was just going on ESPN with Jeannine

Edwards, and [TDN Publisher] Barry Weisbord, who helped me acquire this horse, said, ‘Objection.’ I was like, ‘oh, what a bummer.’ I mean, talk about killjoy. I looked at [trainer Todd Pletcher], and he could see the worry in my eyes. He said, ‘I think we’re going to be all right.’ Todd is almost always right, so I was happy to hear it.”

A Real Deal...

Flay acquired More Than Real from owners TYB Stable after she posted a 1 1/4-length maiden score over a salty field on the Saratoga turf Aug. 14. She carried his colors for the first time in the Sept. 18 Gill Natalma S., but couldn't catch gate-to-wire winner **New Normal** (Forestry).

"I saw her win up at Saratoga, and [bloodstock agent] Mike Ryan [co-owned] the horse," Flay recalled. I had purchased a horse from Mike prior, another More Than Ready, Grace Power, who was Grade I placed. And Barry, a really good friend of mine and my most trusted Thoroughbred advisor, said, "I think Mike might want to sell that filly. This is right in your wheelhouse--you like to buy fillies that can run, especially on the grass." So we purchased her."

Let go at 13-1 on Breeders' Cup Day, More Than Real broke sharply under jockey Garrett Gomez and pulled her rider up to sit just off the leaders early. Floated a bit wide around the first bend, she edged closer on the backstretch. An aggressive Gomez really went to work as they approached the stretch, and he angled her toward the rail when they straightened for home. Winter Memories, caught behind horses, had to check at that point, and More Than Real wandered a bit at the top of the lane, but she was deemed innocent of the interference. She opened up at midstretch and needed just a couple of right-handed reminders to maintain a clear advantage to the wire.



Looking ahead, Pletcher said, "This will be her last run for the year, and we'll take her down to Florida and give her a little freshening and look to maybe start back in February, something like that. Knock on wood, she has been a very healthy filly...but she'll deserve a little bit of freshening off this and, obviously, there's no big opportunities left on the grass after this."

Little known trainer Diane Alvarado was thrust onto racing's biggest stage when Eldaafer posted a 10-1 upset in this contest, but the victory was overshadowed briefly when jockeys Calvin Borel and Javier Castellano got into a scrap on national television in the winner's circle just after the race. Seventh, beaten nearly 25 lengths, in the Breeders' Cup last year, Eldaafer ran a good third in the 1 1/2-mile GII Brooklyn H. at Belmont June 4. He was outclassed in the nine-furlong GII Suburban H. in New York July 3, running fifth to Haynesfield (Speightstown), then dropped into a grassy 1 1/16-mile Laurel allowance for a popular confidence builder Aug. 21. That win set him up for a sharp score when stretched back out to the longer distances in the 12-furlong GIII Turfway Park Championship Sept. 11, but the gelding was let go at 10-1 here. At the break, it was longshot Gabriel's Hill who went to the front and, after a relatively quick opening quarter in :24 4/5, he slowed things down through :51.42, 1:17.44 and 1:43.60 splits. Eldaafer, sitting a wide fourth, began to rally in earnest in upper stretch, fought past the game Gabriel's Hill, and outfinished Will I Am (Victory Gallop) for the win. "Oh my God, I'm so proud of him," said Alvarado. "He's done everything right all year. This means everything to me, I can't even think of what I'm feeling right now." The horse ran in the colors of IEAH Stables, which bought an interest in the gelding from Mansour Albaroudy's Alghuwayriyah Stable just two weeks ago. "Nick Sallusto, who does most of our bloodstock work, called and said there was an interesting Marathon horse that one of the owners was looking for a partner for the race," said Iavarone. "So I took a look at the horse. I take a lot of what Nick says [seriously]. We're very fortunate." Albaroudy confirmed that he brought in a partner to help pay the \$15,000 entry fee for the Breeders' Cup. "It's still a little bit of a shame that you win and you are in [the Championship was a Win and You're In Race], and you still have to pay your entry fee," he said. **Cont. p12**

Just as Eldaafer was having his picture taken in the winner's circle, ESPN cameras switched to the action occurring just behind him. As the jockeys weighed in, Calvin Borel, aboard third-place finisher A.U. Miner (Mineshaft), shoved his finger in the face of Javier Castellano, on runner-up Prince Will I Am. The confrontation quickly escalated when Castellano threw a punch at Borel, but the two jocks were separated in a flurry of action as an irate Borel made repeated attempts to get to Castellano ([click for footage](#)). Brother Cecil held the three-time Derby winning rider back, then was joined by Calvin's wife Lisa, and finally the trio retreated to the jocks' room. The fight was spurred by an incident on the far turn. Castellano, skimming the rail on the rallying Prince Will I Am, shifted out abruptly in search of room two furlongs out. He slammed into Romp (Arg) (Incurable Optimist), Martin Garcia up, who then sandwiched Borel's mount. Stewards reviewed the incident, and DQ'd Prince Will I Am from second to 10th. A flustered Castellano commented on the situation just after the race. "I had so much horse," he said. "I went for a hole, and they said I took his lane. I don't know--I don't know." Michelle Nihei, trainer of Prince Will I Am, took the DQ in stride. "Despite the decision, my horse ran a very, very terrific race," she said. Jockey Julien Leparoux, aboard Gabriel's Hill, added, "On the final turn, I looked around and I knew he was running a big race," he said. "They just came to me in the stretch, and they were going better than me. I never really felt like he got tired. The other ones just had a big kick." The final time for the race, 2:59.62, established a new track record, nicking Caslon Bold's mark by 2/100 of a second.

It was an eventful Friday morning for three-year-old **Lookin At Lucky** (Smart Strike), who was forced to avoid a loose horse as he galloped just after the break. The bay took the incident in stride.

"'Lucky' doesn't care," trainer Bob Baffert said. "He's been run over so many times, nothing affects him. He's the best horse I have that's been run over so many times. He can handle it all."


Can he handle Zenyatta? Baffert is a fan of the big mare, but he'll take his best shot at ending her unbeaten streak at 19.

"I don't think there'll be anybody rooting against her; I don't root against her," Baffert remarked. "But it's horse racing. That's what we're here for. We're supposed to try to beat her."

Will a victory come with mixed feelings?

"If I beat her, I don't know how I'm going to feel," he admitted. "[But], after what we went through in the Kentucky Derby [a disappointing sixth-place finish after a rough trip from the inside post]...we're just trying to get back here and see how good he is and get a chance to run, just make a run."

A Road Less Traveled

Quality Road (Elusive Quality) has been a mile and a quarter twice before, running third as the 6-5 chalk in the GI Travers S. and second at 5-2 in the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup last year. But trainer Todd Pletcher is confident he can win at the trip.

"He's been very successful at a mile and an eighth," Pletcher said. "It's not like he's been desperate when he got there. Take the [GI] Donn, for example [a 12 3/4-length romp in February], which to me was the most impressive race that any horse has run this year, arguably as impressive as any horse has ever run. I can't imagine that a mile and a quarter would have been an issue that day."

Track condition, and not the added distance, figured in his two 10-furlong losses, according to the trainer.

"He's had two tries at a mile and a quarter, and, unfortunately, both of them were on sloppy tracks," Pletcher said. "And while they weren't bad races, they weren't him at his best. John Velazquez has ridden him almost every start, and he says he's OK on [a wet track], but he's not the same as he is on a fast track."

If **Quality Road** can come home first in the Classic, his connections believe he will beat out his rivals for year-end honors as well.

"This is for Horse of the Year 2010," Pletcher said. "Any accomplishments you had in 2009 don't count. This is about 2010, and here it is all on the line. I have nothing but the highest praise for [Zenyatta]--I am amazed at how consistently she's been able to do what she does. Until someone beats her, she's got to be the horse to beat. If we can't win, like everyone else, I think it would be the greatest thing for horse racing if she does."

Rightly So a Vet Scratch from F/M Sprint

Zayat Stables' **Rightly So** (Read the Footnotes), the 3-1 morning-line favorite in Friday's GI BC F/M Sprint, was scratched after a morning examination by the Breeders' Cup Veterinary Panel. "The [veterinarians] came back to the barn and they looked at her again," said trainer Anthony Dutrow. "They were not happy with the way she was moving, and said they would not allow her to run [Friday]." The four-year-old had not raced since capturing the GI Ballerina S. at Saratoga. Dutrow added, "I am sure that whatever is wrong with **Rightly So**, we will get to the bottom of it and take care of it and then go on from there. It's disappointing, but this is all part of the game."

All Eyes on the Ground for Workforce

Juddmonte Farms' homebred **Workforce (GB)** (King's Best) cantered on the lawn yesterday at Churchill Downs as connections continue to mull a run in today's G1 Emirates Airlines Breeders' Cup Turf . "We are still concerned about the ground, and what the weather will do," his trainer, Sir Michael Stoute, explained. The conditioner is worried the course at Churchill will be too hard for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and G1 Epsom Derby hero. "Obviously there are concerns with a big heavy horse like him," said Stoute. "The added problem is moisture evaporation with this wind. We'll play for time, and make a decision in the morning, and obviously we'll talk to Ryan [Moore, jockey] after he rides on the course today." Stoute talked with Breeders' Cup turf consultant Dr. Mick Peterson about what grooming would be done to the course. "Right after training, we're going to give it a short [three minutes] shot of water, because of the wind, just to make sure that it's not drying out," Peterson told Stoute. Peterson also stated that there was a 40-percent chance of rain in the forecast, so they were not going to water ahead of that. Workforce stretched his legs Friday with Paul Grassick up.

Hannon Jr. Thinking Upset

Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) will line up against **Goldikova (Ire)** (Anabaa) for the fifth time in today's G1 TVG Breeders' Cup Mile, and while he has yet to find her measure, assistant trainer Richard Hannon Jr. is hopeful the five-year-old can turn the tables. "Why can't we beat her?" he asked. "She's drawn not very well this year [post 10], which is probably to our favor, and we've drawn quite well [post 6]." In August, Goldikova and Paco Boy finished second and third to Makfi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois. In their next meeting, Goldikova beat Paco Boy by a half-length in the Prix de la Foret at Longchamp Oct. 3. "Every time we've been beaten by her this year, we've had excuses," said Hannon Jr. "The first time in Deauville, the ground was very soft and he didn't get the trip. Then we went to Paris and we were just drawn terrible. We came from a different county that day and we just touched off. At Royal Ascot [second beaten a neck in the G1 Queen Anne S. in June], we may have given her a little bit too much air space. This time we're going to keep a close eye on her, and the form book says we'll probably be second. But my horse is a very tough horse, very hard to beat, and he deserves one."

Something to 'Peru-ve'

Two Breeders' Cup contenders started their careers in Peru. The first is **Al Khali** (Medaglia d'Oro), who had two wins and a second from three South American starts, and is one of the favorites for the GI BC Turf after U.S. wins in the GII Bowling Green H. and GIII Saranac S. The second is GI BC Juvenile hopeful **Murjan** (Officer). A 10 1/4-length winner in his career opener at Monterrico in May, he romped by 16 lengths in a conditions event Aug. 22, and made it a perfect three-for-three in the G1 Peruvian 2000 Guineas.

The dark bay, purchased privately by Tommy and Bonnie Hamilton's Silverton Hill just a couple of weeks ago, schooled at the gate after galloping yesterday morning, and hit the paddock in the afternoon. "He has taken everything in stride," said trainer Darrin Miller, who also serves as the colt's exercise rider. "He feels good. He's a light mover, and covers a lot of ground."

As for expectations as the two-year-old makes his U.S. bow, Miller added, "We're absolutely all grounded, and being very realistic about what to expect. First and foremost, we want a good performance, and that he comes out of the race well. We want him to set up in a good position, and run strongly at the end. The Hamiltons put so much into this, they are excited, and I am, too, for them."

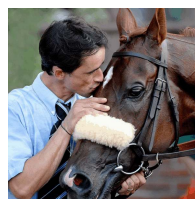

The Hall of Fame conditioner noticed a problem as the five-year-old cooled out following a gallop Thursday morning. "There was some heat in his [right front] knee and we checked it, and it turns out it was a flare-up of an old injury," Mandella said. "He's had an issue with that knee for the past few years, and it has come back. It's nothing real serious; not a fracture or anything like that. But coming up to a race like this, there's just no way you could think about running him given the circumstances. It's the kind of thing where I think we can do a procedure on him, give him a little time off and bring him back for next year. That's a possibility. It'll be up to Mr. Hughes [Spendthrift owner B. Wayne Hughes]. I spoke to him about it this morning, and he's disappointed, of course, and considering his options."

Cavey Hopes Mo Gives Playa Maya a Fasig Boost

When **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie) goes postward in today's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, it will mark the crowning achievement of his breeder Dr. D. Michael Cavey's long involvement with the colt's family. That involvement, which goes back five generations, will come to an end Sunday, when Cavey sends Uncle Mo's dam **Playa Maya** (Arch--Dixie Slippers, by Dixieland Band) through the Fasig-Tipton sales ring as [hip 122](#).

"I bred Playa Maya and her mother, Dixie Slippers," Cavey recalled last week. "I bred the dam of Dixie Slippers, who is Cyane Slippers and I purchased Hot Slippers off the racetrack. The family has been good to us."

Cyane Slippers (Cyane) is the dam of graded stakes winner Woods of Windsor, as well as stakes-placed Cyane's Thunder and Axial Rift. Cyane Slippers' daughter Dixie Slippers (Dixieland Band) produced only one foal.

"Dixie Slippers had a colic and died carrying her second foal, so that's why there is only one," Cavey explained. "Playa Maya was her only foal."

Racing for Cavey, Playa Maya was multiple stakes placed on the track. Uncle Mo, who Cavey sold for \$160,000 as a Keeneland November weanling, is her third foal and her third winner. She sells as part of the Denali Stud consignment in foal to Broken Vow.

Cavey admitted it was a difficult decision to sell the 10-year-old mare.

"It's one of those economic issues," the veterinarian said. "I would prefer not to sell her, but with Uncle Mo doing what he is doing, if he wins the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, his value would go up and her's may be great enough that we just can't afford to keep her."

Uncle Mo was an instant sensation when he debuted with a 🌟 **"TDN Rising Star"** 🌟 performance at Saratoga Aug. 28. He followed up with an easy victory in the GI Champagne S.

Cavey knew Playa Maya's colt was something special early on.

"Spectacular," Cavey said of his early impressions of Uncle Mo. "He's a plain brown wrapper. He's not one that stands out with great colors and so forth, but physically he was extremely correct and just the type you want as a racehorse. Very athletic--you could watch him in the field and tell that he was athletic. You couldn't tell that he was going to be what he is, but you could see his athleticism."

Cavey's Respite Farm currently has five horses in training, and Uncle Mo might have joined the stable. If he had been a filly.

"We don't keep colts, that's the only reason that he was sold," Cavey said. "If he was a filly, we'd still own him. We were very tempted to keep him. At the time, we just had too many horses. My wife and I have a small operation. We do race some, but you have to bite the bullet. If we say we're not going to keep colts, we don't keep colts."

In addition to Indian Charlie, Playa Maya has produced foals by Silver Deputy and Forest Wildcat. Cavey was inspired to send the mare to Broken Vow this spring in part due to the success of his homebred filly Proud Heiress, who captured the GIII Whimsical S.

at Woodbine in April.

"I like Broken Vow," Cavey said. "I've bred to him several times and I thought the pedigree worked well. The physical type, they are good type-to-type breeding. And Proud Heiress, who we just retired to the breeding shed, has a physical very similar to what we were looking for. She is probably the best-looking filly that I've ever bred. So I am hoping that Playa will produce something that looks like her."

Respite Farm was originally based in Maryland, where Cavey managed the Happy Retreat Farm of Adelaide Riggs. Cont. p25

"I owned Respite Farm shortly after I graduated from veterinary school," Cavey commented. "And then Mrs. Riggs asked me to help her with her breeding and racing operation. Through that, we became good friends and I purchased a part of her farm and we called it Respite Farm. That was about 1990, somewhere in that area."

Cavey stayed in Maryland for the rest of the decade, but eventually a move to the Bluegrass was in the cards.

"Mrs. Riggs passed away in 1999," Cavey said. "I had promised her that I would stay there, but when she passed away, we moved to Kentucky at the end of 1999. Kentucky is the place to have horses. We had a very bad experience with a van accident carrying some of our better mares, and we didn't like to move them back and forth as often as we had to to breed to Kentucky stallions, so we moved here where the stallions are."

Now based in Paris, Kentucky, Respite Farm is home to a broodmare band of 14. Cavey and his wife Nancy replenish the broodmare band with their homebred fillies, while selling colts.

"We pick the fillies that we like," Cavey confirmed. "If we like the pedigree and like the physical, we'll keep them. If it's a filly that we're not really excited about, we'll sell them. And some of the real nice ones we'll sell for money. It's a business."

Respite Farm had 31 broodmares just two years ago, but Cavey acknowledged he had culled the band with a specific destination in mind.

"We own a little a house on the beach in South Carolina that we never get to see," he explained. "So we thought if we had fewer horses, we'd have more time," he explained.

Asked if fewer broodmares had translated into more time by the sea, Cavey chuckled, "Not at all." Before explaining, "We're sort of anal. I deliver all of our foals. It's not that I don't trust other people, it's just that that's the fun of the business for me--watching the baby pop out. So it's always the time of the year when you want to be somewhere warm when the foals are arriving."

Maybe success at Churchill today and in the Fasig-Tipton sales ring tomorrow will earn the couple some extra vacation time. Keep your eye out for the post-card. -*Jessica Martini*

Top Sophomores from Pompa Heading to the Ring...

Fresh off the heels of dual Classic winner and champion Big Brown's dream run in 2008, owner Paul Pompa Jr. has continued to play the game at the highest level. Five-time graded stakes winner **D'Funnybone** (D'wildcat) and GI Prioress S. heroine **Franny Freud** (Freud)--two of the latest big guns to carry Pompa's red, white and green silks--have been catalogued to Sunday's Fasig-Tipton November Sale.

A debut seven-length maiden win over the boys at Belmont and a strong runner-up finish in Woodbine's My Dear S. prompted the native New Yorker to purchase a controlling interest in the latter. Trained throughout her career by John Terranova, Franny Freud became an instant success for her new majority owner, annexing the Ontario Debutante S. over subsequent GISW Negligee (Northern Afleet) as well as a pair of stakes against Empire-breds at Finger Lakes and Aqueduct. The bay came back even stronger at three, kicking off the season with a close second in Santa Anita's GII Santa Ynez S. That would be the last time Franny Freud tasted defeat. A gate-to-wire winner in Keeneland's GII Beaumont S. ([video](#)), she thrashed New York-breds in her next two stakes attempts, including a six-length win under wraps against males in the New York Stallion S. over the Belmont lawn ([video](#)). Favored at 3-5 in the prestigious Prioress ([video](#)), she put an exclamation point on her brilliant career with a 1 3/4-length tally over next out GI Test heroine and live GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint contender Champagne d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro). Franny Freud was retired with an ankle injury while training for Saratoga's premier race for sophomore female sprinters.

"She was great," Pompa recently reflected. "Franny Freud won on all three surfaces, and probably would've been the favorite in the Test if she hadn't gotten injured days before. The horses that ran one-two in the Test [Champagne d'Oro and Bonnie Blue Flag {Mineshaft}] ran two-three in the Prioress. We would've been in a good spot there."

Owned in partnership with Stephen Yarbrough and breeder Anthony Grey, the daughter of Frankly Fran (D'Accord) was no worse than second in 10 of 11 starts, and posted \$686,029 in earnings. Franny Freud heads to the ring under Hidden Brook's consignment as [hip 59](#).

"When you have a partnership, everybody has their opinion," said Pompa, who has approximately 25 horses in training. "So, I thought it was best to offer her. We'll see--obviously, if she doesn't bring the kind of money that we're looking for, we'll retain her and pick out a stallion for her to go to. But, she is in the sale and she's by Freud, who's a half to Giant's Causeway. She's a Grade I winner; we think she'll bring some attention."

Like Franny Freud, D'Funnybone was acquired privately by Pompa through bloodstock agent Nick Sallusto following a runaway debut maiden win and a second-place finish against stakes company. The well-built chestnut, previously based in Florida with co-owner/trainer Joseph Calascibetta and owner/breeder Harold Plumley,

took New York by storm under Rick Dutrow's tutelage, scoring by a dazzling 10 1/2 lengths in the GII Saratoga Special S. and 4 3/4 lengths in Belmont's GII Futurity S. ([video](#)). After spinning his wheels over Santa Anita's soon-to-be-removed Pro-Ride surface in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the son of two-time winner Elbow (Woodman) bounced back at three in Gulfstream's GII Hutcheson S. ([video](#)) and GII Swale S., and soundly defeated GI King's Bishop S. hero Discreetly Mine (Mineshaft) under a perfect Edgar Prado ride in the GII Woody Stephens S. on the GI Belmont S. undercard ([video](#)). A winner of six of 11 career starts and earnings of \$658,200, the Florida-bred heads to Newtown Padocks under the Hidden Brook banner as [hip 179](#). The half-brother to Meadowlands stakes winner and GII Demoiselle third-place finisher Dr. Kathy (Polish Numbers) will be offered as a racing/stallion prospect.

“He’s still sound--we just wanted to freshen him up and give him a little break,” Pompa said of D’Funnybone, who failed to land a blow last out in the King’s Bishop.

“We put him in the November sale because he has racing and stallion potential. If they offer me the right kind of money, then we’ll let him move on. Ricky Dutrow wants me to bring him back; he thinks that he’s got a lot more work to do on the racetrack.”

Pompa continued, “He’s a pleasure--a very kind horse to be around. He won five Grade 2’s at some of the best racetracks in the country--Saratoga, Belmont, Gulfstream. He’s got a lot left in him. He’s run against the best three-year-old sprinters in the country this year.”

Pompa will also be represented at the Keeneland November Sale. **Sweetbabe** (Formal Dinner–Believe in Sugar, by Garthorn), the dam of GIII Stage Door Betty H. and Sunshine Millions Distaff heroine Sweet Repent (Repent), will be offered in foal to Big Brown. The 13-year-old is consigned by Hidden Brook as [lot 951](#). Pompa’s GI Garden City Breeders’ Cup S. heroine Backseat Rhythm (El Corredor) and Elbow (dam of D’Funnybone) both visited the Three Chimneys resident this year as well. The 2008 GI Kentucky Derby hero is represented by first-crop weanlings.

Mary’s Follies (More Than Ready), a good second while making her seasonal bow in the GIII Athenia S. at Belmont Oct. 16, will be scratched from Fasig-Tipton

November and pointed toward the GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood Park Nov. 26, according to Pompa.

“We’re going to keep her in training,” he confirmed. “She ran great off an 11-month layoff. She just had some hind-end issues that we had to figure out. It was the first time she ever really ran on a boggy course. Kent [Desormeaux] told me that she didn’t like it and still ran on heart alone.”

Before playing the role as seller at the November Sales, Pompa has some

business to settle on the racetrack. **Rose Catherine** (Speightstown), a victress of four straight, including Philly Park’s \$200,000 Turf Amazon H. Sept. 25, is slated to take on the boys in today’s GII Breeders’ Cup Turf Sprint. The \$410,000 FTSAUG graduate just got tagged late to place a close second in last year’s Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Santa Anita.

“Todd [Pletcher] likes her a lot,” Pompa revealed. “She’s been training super. I think that her style is going to fit nicely in that race. She could be right on the pace or sit a little off. I think the five-eighths distance is big for her, and she also gets a nice weight allowance.” -SS
