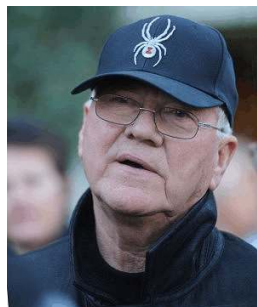

Just two days after wrapping up championship honors with her win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course--Precious

Feather, by Gone West) completed a big weekend for owner/breeder Fred Brei's Jacks or Better Farm, topping Fasig-Tipton November at \$2.3 million to the bid of Frank Stronach's Adena Springs. The underbidder was Michel Zerolo, bidding for Martin Schwartz. After signing the ticket on the unbeaten filly, Stronach admitted it was Awesome Feather's 2 1/4-length victory at Churchill Friday that convinced him to make the purchase. "We're

going to continue to race her," Stronach said. "I just hope she goes on." Stronach called Awesome Feather's Breeders' Cup effort "pretty impressive." Jacks or Better owner Fred Brei was in an understandably jovial mood after watching Awesome Feather stride out of the Fasig-Tipton sales ring. "She is a tremendous filly," Brei said of his Breeders' Cup winner. "Frank will get her where she needs to go." Of the decision to sell the juvenile, Brei added, "We don't race much out of Florida and, when it comes to going up north, where certainly she belongs, where the Grade 1s are coming up for three-year-olds, it was just best for the filly and best for us that she is in somebody else's hands." After her Breeders' Cup win, Brei said the reserve on Awesome Feather would be high. When the filly sold for \$2.3 million, he admitted with a laugh that it was, "Never enough," but added the price "was enough to make me smile. It was not much above the reserve. I probably wouldn't have let her go for below \$2 million." **Cont. p2**

KEENELAND NOVEMBER GETS UNDERWAY

Off the heels of last evening's lively trade at Fasig-Tipton's November Sale at Newtown Paddocks, Keeneland begins its 13-session November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington. A total of 4,695 horses were initially catalogued for November, then another 77 lots were added when it was announced that Lance Robinson and Jerry Bailey would conduct a complete dispersal of their Gulf Coast Farm. Last year's November Sale rang up total receipts of \$159,727,800, down 13.92 percent from the previous year's 15-day event. The average of \$57,477 was down 6.48 percent, which was generally taken as a more-than-satisfactory result considering the lingering instability of the financial markets, and the median of \$20,000 was unchanged. Last year's November sale was the boosted by the dispersal of the W.T. Young family's Overbrook Farm, which saw 148 horses bring \$31,760,000--an average of \$214,595. The dispersal, the second biggest in Keeneland history, yielded the sale's highest price: Honest Pursuit (Storm Cat), a four-year-old daughter of the brilliantly bred Honest Lady (Seattle Slew), who sold as a broodmare prospect for \$3.1 million to Wertheimer et Frere. Still, action at the top wasn't what it was in 2008. Five horses topped the \$1 million mark, compared to 19 the year prior.

young colt Jackson Bend (Hear No Evil) after he swept the Florida Stallion series. Racing for Robert LaPenta this term, Jackson Bend was second in the GII Holy Bull S., GI Fountain of Youth S. and GI Wood Memorial and third in the GI Preakness S. Awesome Feather swept the fillies' version of the Florida Stallion series this year. "I sell them when they get to this level, not before," Brei explained of his operation,

which produces 14 to 16 foals a year. "I sold Jackson Bend when he got to this level last year."

Brei still owns Awesome Feather's dam, Precious Feather. The 13-year-old mare is in foal to Consolidator, but Brei has a pretty good idea who she will be bred to next spring. "Next year, she'll probably be in foal to Awesome of Course, I would think," he smiled. -JM

Southern Equine Lands a Jewel at Fasig-Tipton...

Careless Jewel (Tapit--Sweet and Careless, by Hennessy), a brilliant 11-length victress of the prestigious GI Alabama S. last term, brought \$1.95 million from Mike Moreno's Southern Equine Stable at Sunday's Fasig-Tipton November Sale. Lincoln Collins, owner and president of Kern Thoroughbreds, was underbidder. The always entertaining trainer/Southern Equine bloodstock advisor Eric Guillot signed the ticket after doing his bidding from the balcony adjacent to the press box. The millionaire, consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency as a broodmare prospect as [hip 97](#), failed to make it back to the races after a disappointing run in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic at Santa Anita.

"She's white, Christmas is coming, snowflakes,"

Guillot joked of the roan's appeal as Hill 'n' Dale's Donato Lanni stopped by and popped the collar on his dark blue Champagne d'Oro jacket. "Mike and I are all about foundation mares, and this is one that fits the bill. Her body, hip, pedigree on the bottom side and her race record before she got hurt--that's what we're looking for. She's going to be a nice addition to Southern Equine. I was hoping to get her for \$1.3 or \$1.4 million, but wouldn't back out. I had to have her. They're not selling a lot of these kinds right now. Tapit's going really well as a sire. Mike and I are trying to land the big ones only."

Guillot doesn't have a stallion in mind yet for the four-year-old daughter of the unraced mare Sweet and Careless. Her dam, a half-sister to MGISW Subordination (Mt. Livermore), brought \$900,000 while carrying a full-sister to Careless Jewel at last year's KEENOV sale. Careless Jewel joins a loaded Southern Equine broodmare band, led by Broodmare of the Year Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister). The dam of champion Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy), GI Belmont S. hero Jazil (Seeking the Gold) and GII Peter Pan S. hero Casino Drive (Mineshaft) was acquired for a record \$14 million at this sale two years ago. The former Parrish Hill Farm near Lexington, purchased by Southern Equine a couple of years ago, will be open for business Nov. 15, according to Guillot.

"Better Than Honour is doing great," he said. "She's back in foal to Street Cry (Ire); she has a weanling by him. I think we'll breed her to Medaglia d'Oro next year, or maybe even Mineshaft. He's coming around; it would be the same cross as Rags to Riches, and we'd have a full to Casino Drive, who I loved and wanted to buy." -SS

Jewel of a Sale Inspires Mixed Emotions...

in the GI Alabama S., GII Delaware Oaks and GII Fitz Dixon Cotillion S. They returned the gray filly to the sales ring yesterday at Fasig-Tipton, where she attracted a final bid of \$1.95 million. But as the couple, standing with the filly's trainer Josie Carroll, received congratulations from a large group, they admitted the moment was bittersweet. "I really didn't want to

sell, but we did," Vern Dubinsky said. Donna Dubinsky echoed her husband's sentiments. "It's just a part of the game," she said. "For today, it was a good price." Carroll added, "It's tough to see her go." Careless Jewel was consigned by John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency. Sikura understood the Dubinsky's mixed emotions. "He's a guy that loves the horse, not the money," Sikura said of Vern Dubinsky. "That's unique, and it's great to be involved with someone that genuine." Of the price tag, Sikura added, "After a million, it can get light. I thought this mare could bring from between \$1 million and \$1.5 million. She had immense quality, and she's unique. Eric's trying to buy the best mares in the world, and he went and got her. She sold very well, and she's worth every dime. We're absolutely happy with the price."

Cool-Mo: Team Coolmore Lands Uncle Mo Dam...

Playa Maya (Arch--Dixie Slippers, by Dixieland Band), the dam of the undefeated pro-tem two-year-old champion Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie), was hammered down to Coolmore interests last night for \$1.65 million. M.V. Magnier, son of Coolmore principal John Magnier, signed the ticket for the 10-year-old, selling in foal to Broken Vow. A group of Japanese, stationed out back under the bid spotters' stand, were the immediate underbidders. Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud consigned the dark bay as [hip 122](#). Uncle Mo, a **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★**, took the GI Champagne S. at Belmont, then knocked one out of the park with a dominating win in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Uncle Mo is owned by Repole Stable and trained by Todd Pletcher.

"She's a very nice mare, and the horse [Uncle Mo] was very impressive over the weekend, and we really liked her," said Magnier, who stood along the inside rail of the rear walking along with Paul Shanahan and two other associates. Magnier said it was undecided whether the mare would stay in America at Ashford or head to Coolmore's operation in Ireland. "We'll talk about it," he said. "There are no immediate plans, but we'll think of something."

Playa Maya is by Arch, sire of Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Blame and recognized as a very good turf sire. Playa Maya herself won on the sod, and Magnier confirmed the versatility in her pedigree added to her appeal.

"There's a couple of options open there, so we'll have to go to the drawing board," he said about mating decisions.

As the interview wound down, Magnier was asked by a reporter, "If Uncle Mo didn't win Saturday, do you buy this mare?" Magnier considered the question for a second and then said with a smile, "She's a nice mare and he's a very good horse--and he *did* win."

Cavey Enjoys Playa Maya Sales Success...

Dr. Mike Cavey's walk from inside the sales pavilion towards the back walking ring was continually interrupted by well-wishers after Playa Maya (Arch) sold for \$1.65 million yesterday, but the veterinarian didn't seem to mind. The 10-year-old mare, dam of Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie), was consigned by Craig Bandoroff's Denali Stud. Asked if he was satisfied by the seven-figure price tag, Cavey said, "It's low," before breaking into a broad smile and adding, "No. I'm just kidding. I was very pleased. In this market, you really can't tell. You always hope for more, but what do they say? Pigs get fat and hogs get slaughtered. So we're happy with it." Cavey admitted that parting with Playa Maya "always will be bittersweet." It sounds like watching Uncle Mo dominate the Juvenile at Churchill Downs was a raucous affair for Cavey and Bandoroff. "I guess I was a little excited, wasn't I, Craig," Cavey dead panned as a hoarse Bandoroff croaked, "None of us can talk." Cavey concluded, "It was a very good day."-JM

Japanese Make Deep Impact...

Members of Japan's first family of racing, the Yoshidas, were busy during last night's action at Newtown Paddocks, purchasing three of the top six lots. Terry Yoshida's Shadai Farm saw off representatives of Coolmore to purchase the four-year-old **Serious Attitude (Ire)** (Mtoto {GB}--Zameyla {Ire}, by Cape Cross {Ire}), recent upsetter of the GI Nearctic S. against males at Woodbine, for \$1.85 million. Sweezy & Partners, agent, consigned Serious Attitude as [hip 146](#).

Shadai's Mitsuru Ikeda, standing with several associates out back, resolutely staved off a challenge from a collective just 10 yards away that included Coolmore's M.V. Magnier and Paul Shanahan, BBA Ireland's Adrian Nichol and Australian owner/breeder Bob Scarborough. Ikeda said the filly would be retired and sent to Japan.

"Her pasterns were a little bit long, but her walking was very, very nice," said Ikeda when asked about the mare's appeal. Serious Attitude was also the winner of the G1 Cheveley Park S. at two.

Shadai also made a play for--and landed--the night's fourth highest priced mare, MGISW **Gabby's Golden Gal** (Medaglia d'Oro--Gabriellina Giof {GB}, by Ashkalani {Ire}), who went for \$1.25 million.

"She's the perfect combination; very speedy and the breeding is good," Ikeda said of the former Bob Baffert charge, who was unplaced in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint coming off a lay-off. "She was bought to be bred. We're not sure who she will be bred to, maybe to a son of Sunday Silence. We also have [G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. winner] Harbinger now [at Shadai]. But it will be a very good stallion."

Don Robinson's Winter Quarter Farm sold Gabby's Golden Gal for her owner and breeder Arnold Zetcher as [hip 69](#). It was the second time Robinson's outfit had brought the filly to the market at Fasig. In 2007, Winter Quarter offered Gabby's Golden Gal as a yearling, but she went unsold at \$120,000. Zetcher was rewarded with wins in the GI Acorn S. at Belmont in 2009 and the GI Santa Monica S. earlier this term.

Terry Yoshida's brother, Northern Farm's Katsumi Yoshida, purchased Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint heroine **Dubai Majesty** (Essence of Dubai--Great Majesty, by Great Above) for \$1.1 million. Katsumi's son Shunseke Yoshida, positioned out back, saw off a number of challengers for the filly. Representatives of SS Bloodstock, who'd earlier purchased Don't Forget Gil (Kafwain) for \$200,000, were on the phone with Fasig-Tipton's Max Hodge, and were the direct underbidders.

"We'll retire her, and we're going to take her home," said Yoshida, a regular at the bloodstock sales who took advantage of Churchill's close proximity to attend the Breeders' Cup over the weekend. What he saw from Dubai Majesty, who aired by 2 1/4 lengths as an 8-1 chance, left him impressed. "We saw her winning at Churchill Downs, and we saw her this morning, and she's gorgeous," said Yoshida. "She's got a lot of speed. The race she won the other day was fantastic. I knew about her, but after seeing her win the other day, we decided we wanted to take her home."

Yoshida also purchased Grade I winner **Franny Freud** (Freud--Frankly Fran, by D'Accord) for \$560,000. Offered by Hidden Brook, agent, as [hip 59](#), the three-year-old New York-bred was one of the top sprinting fillies in the nation before being derailed by injury. Owned by breeder Anthony Grey along with Paul Pompa Jr. and Stephen Yarbrough, she won the GI Prioress S. at Belmont and the GI Beaumont S. at Keeneland. -LM

From 7,500gns to \$1.85 Million, a 'Serious' Score...

When conditioner Rae Guest, a trainer with limited name recognition in the U.S., laid eyes on Serious Attitude (Ire) as a yearling at the Tattersalls October Sale in 2007, she was an immature sort with some growing to do, and her sire, the reliable Mtoto (GB), wasn't particularly popular commercially. But Guest liked the filly, and went to a modest

7,500gns to buy her, later selling a three-quarter interest to Derek Willis. During the summer of the filly's two-year-old year, the men

began to get the impression they'd landed a bargain.

"She really just bloomed," said Guest, who was on hand to watch Serious Attitude sell last night. "As a yearling, she was very late-looking, which is why she didn't make any money in the ring. And Mtoto was not a popular horse at that time. He's a good old horse, but was a bit out of favor."

Serious Attitude won her debut at Windsor in August of 2008, took the Listed Dick Poole Fillies' S. second time out, then kept her record unbeaten in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket.

At three, she added the G3 Summer S. at York. This year, the recruiting team at Fasig-Tipton came calling and asked that they consider putting the mare in the November Sale. Willis and Guest agreed, and then had a thought: why not take a shot at the GI Nearctic S. at Woodbine, if we're shipping across the pond anyway?

"They courted us long before we considered any race in North America," Guest said.

As it turned out, Serious Attitude greatly enhanced her own value when she stormed home from second last to post the 23-1 upset in the Nearctic Oct. 16.

Asked about expectations coming into November, Guest said, "I thought that if she didn't make a million dollars, than everybody's lost the plot. She's a dual Grade I winner--what more do you want out of a horse? She's 100 percent clean and sound. There are no problems at all. So if she didn't make a million dollars, why have Grade I races? When you get here, everybody's worried about the economy and this and that. It's a nervous time before the sale. But in the end, it worked out great."

Wayne Sweezy, whose Sweezy and Partners consigned Serious Attitude as [hip 146](#), was happy for the filly's owners. "They've had a wonderful ride with this horse. All we did was close the last chapter for them. Rae Guest is a fabulous guy, and Derek Willis is another great man. I'm going back to have some champagne with them right now."

Before retreating to the bar, Sweezy, who struck out on his own after spending many years at Darby Dan, confirmed it was his operation's biggest success to date. "Hopefully, it won't be the last," he added. -LM

Kept in Training, Dubai Majesty Rewards...

One year ago, Taylor Made Sales Agency catalogued Dubai Majesty as hip 77 for her owners, Dan Morgan and Martin Racing Stable. But the racemare's trainer, Bret Calhoun, made a play to keep her in training.

"He thought that she could have a big year this year," said Taylor Made's Mark Taylor. "Bret has never had owners who could buy expensive horses before, so he decided to take his inexpensive ones and make them expensive."

That's a strategy that typically works only on the chalkboard, but Calhoun's confidence in Dubai Majesty, now five, was well-founded.

Initially slow to come around, Dubai Majesty won her first two races against claiming company. But she began to blossom

at the end of her three-year-old campaign and finished third in the GII Indiana Oaks and GII Raven Run S. At four, she added the GIII Winning Colors, but it was at five that

she would really blossom. In a career season, Dubai Majesty repeated in the Winning Colors, then finished third in the GI Princess Rooney S. at Calder in July. Her versatility was underscored in her final four starts. She won the Incredible Revenge S. on the grass at Monmouth, finished second by a head in the GIII Presque Isle Downs Masters S. on the Tapeta, then captured the GII Thoroughbred Club of America S. over Keeneland's PolyTrack in her penultimate start. She became the first of Calhoun's Breeders' Cup winners Friday; on Saturday, he took the GIII Turf Sprint with Chamberlain Bridge (War Chant).

Taylor Made once again was tasked with consigning duties, selling Dubai Majesty as [hip 47](#).

"I thought that was fair," Mark Taylor said of the price. "I think she's the prototype of what people are looking for in the modern racehorse. She won graded stakes on all three surfaces and was tough--she ran 34 times. She's what everyone wants. No matter what racing jurisdiction you go to, she takes her racetrack with her. And she was very good looking." -LM

Alpha Delta Broodmare Band Expands by Two

Bloodstock agent Reynolds Bell, acting on behalf of John Clay's Alpha Delta Stables, purchased a pair of mares at the Fasig-Tipton sale yesterday for matching \$1.05-million price tags. Bell first signed the ticket for **Love to Dance (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells).

The five-year-old holds the distinction of being the first mare in foal to European superstar Sea the Stars (Ire) (Cape Cross {Ire}) sold at public auction. Late in Sunday's sale, Bell paid the same amount for **Win McCool** (Giant's Causeway), in foal to Distorted Humor. While the two mares are distinctly different types, Bell was attracted to them for similar reasons.

"Look at the families," Bell said. "I mean, the first mare was by Sadler's Wells from a fantastic family. She was Group 2 placed and in foal to Sea the Stars, who is probably the best horse we've seen in Europe in three decades."

Love to Dance is a half-sister to European champions Dylan Thomas (Ire) (Danehill) and Queen's Logic (Ire) (Grand Lodge).

As for graded stakes winner Win McCool, Bell added, "Win McCool had a lot of ability on the racetrack. She's from a terrific family, and in foal to Distorted Humor."

Win McCool's first foal, a filly by Unbridled's Song, brought \$825,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. Bell admitted he thought he had gotten a bargain for both mares.

"I'll be honest with you, I was very pleased with the price on both of them," he said. "We're happy to have them."

Clay is putting together a broodmare band based at Lane's End Farm. "These mares are just what he's looking for," Bell said. "John is putting together a commercial broodmare band. He's been working on it for the last couple or three years."

Clay purchased Summer Raven (Summer Squall), in foal to Unbridled's Song, for \$1.7 million at last year's Keeneland November sale. At the same auction, he purchased Mary Delaney (Hennessy), in foal to Elusive Quality, for \$850,000.-JM

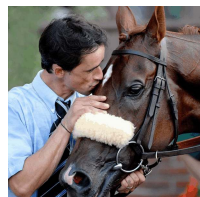

could say. We're collecting investors from different countries and buying high-quality horses and stallion prospects. We're looking for very specific quality. We're buying the best possible horses that we can."

Aaron and Marie Jones could have one of the dearest lots in today's opening session of the Keeneland November Sale when they offer the 12-year-old MGISW Golden Ballet (Moscow Ballet), dam of this year's

GI Belmont S. hero Drosselmeyer (Distorted Humor) as hip 161 (see hip happenings, p13) through Taylor Made Sales. But with Fasig-Tipton drawing to a close last night, Marie Jones played the role of buyer, securing the four-year-old GSW **Warbling** (Unbridled's Song--Impassion, by Shadede), for \$1.1

million. Taylor Made consigned the filly, selling as a broodmare prospect only, as [hip 174 \(ThoroStride video\)](#). Taylor Made was offering Warbling for owner Joe Sutton, who had purchased the striking gray--from Taylor Made, incidentally--as a yearling for \$260,000. Racing for Sutton and trainer Eddie Kenneally, Warbling won this year's GI Inside Information S. at Gulfstream and was twice placed in Grade I sprints. She was first or second in six of nine and earned \$352,293. Jones did her bidding from the last row of seats in the sales pavilion while sitting alongside Doug Cauthen and Frank Taylor, both advisors to the Joneses. "I think she fits our broodmare band very well," said Jones. "Frank looked at her, Doug looked at her, and we all agreed that she was the one we wanted." Cauthen, who recently announced he was leaving his position at WinStar Farm, said the mare simply had the goods. "She could be accepted to any stallion in the country," he said. "We'll get together and make a plan [as to what stallion she'll go to]."

That's a Wrap...

Nine horses reached seven figures at yesterday's Fasig-Tipton November Sale, led by GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course) at \$2.3 million. In total, 89 horses brought \$27,996,500 for an average of \$314,567 and a median of \$130,000. During last year's trade, 80 head grossed \$28,905,000, good for an average of \$361,313 and a median of \$170,000. Fasig-Tipton Chairman Walt Robertson, who announced his retirement in October, received a stirring standing ovation from the large crowd still on hand at Newton Paddocks as the final horse went under the hammer. "It felt pretty similar to me," Robertson said when asked to process the numbers. "It seemed like we were real active at nine million-plus mares. We had a lot of very nice horses. There was plenty of play once you got to the \$100,000 level. Prior to getting to that level, it was pretty sticky." Did having the Breeders' Cup held at Churchill Downs this past weekend help at all? "I think that it brought everybody to town, but for this sale, any buyer in the world is going to be here anyway. Everybody that needed to be here was here," Robertson continued, adding "I would've liked to sell more horses to Europe. I don't think it's fair to blame it on the Breeders' Cup, it's still a struggling economy we're in. It applies to everybody."

MARKET CORRECTION Compounding the financial market's crash in 2008 was the breeding industry's own problem with overproduction: too many mediocre mares were being bred, and the stud fees invested in them often weren't cheap. Over the last few breeding seasons, considerably fewer mares have been bred--

this year's figure of 40,576 mares bred represented a 31.7 percent slide from 2006. Breeders who took it on the chin have been trying to slim down their broodmare bands, and Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said that trend isn't about to reverse itself. "We are still in the midst of a correction, and there

are some people who have to sell, whether they want to or not," Russell said yesterday. "It's something we're working through still. Most commercial breeders are thinking or saying, 'If we can make it through 2010, we'll be okay.'"

Russell added that even though 2010 weanlings were produced from lower, post-meltdown stud fees--and, likewise, mares who are now in foal generally have much lower stud fees invested into them--breeders are still struggling. "Because the production costs for this year's yearlings were so high, it has affected the cash flow for many breeders," said Russell. "I think one of the things that's going to be missing from this year's sale is the breeder who had a good yearling sale and wants to buy another mare. People had a better-than-anticipated September Sale, but for the mid-size to smaller breeder, not enough to re-invest in another mare."

In addition to the Gulf Coast dispersal, November offers dispersals from Clovelly Farm, Stud TNT and Irving Cowan, and a reduction from the powerful Phipps Stable. Despite the firepower on offer, Russell doesn't expect them to measure up to the Overbrook dispersal. "I don't think, combined, they'll have the same impact as a major dispersal like Overbrook Farm, which had horses from the top and running all the way through the sale," said Russell. "It added something like \$30 million to our sale. The other thing the dispersal did was to put value on horses in general, because they sold without reserve. They brought what they brought, and I think that helped people appraise their horses." For the catalogue and complete outs, visit

Stewards Rule on Jockey Fight

The Churchill Downs Board of Stewards ruled Sunday to fine jockeys Calvin Borel and Javier Castellano for their altercation following Friday's GIII BC Marathon. Both riders waived the right to a hearing. Borel was handed a \$5,000 fine, the maximum allowed, while Castellano will have to pay up \$2,500 for engaging in 'conduct against the best interest of horse racing.' Castellano was also suspended for six racing days for causing interference in the race. Riding Prince Will I Am (Victory Gallop), Castellano tried to force his way off the rail as they came around the far turn and slammed into Romp (Arg) (Incurable Optimist), who in turn crowded Borel's mount, A.U. Miner (Mineshaft). He went on to finish second, but was disqualified and placed 10th, moving Gabriel's Hill (A.P. Indy) and A.U. Miner into third. According to Daily Racing Form, Castellano will appeal the suspension in order to honor a commitment to ride in Japan Nov. 14, but will not contest the fine.

Attendance, Handle Up at Breeders' Cup

(Edited Press Release) Attendance and handle for the 2010 Breeders' Cup World Championships at Churchill increased over the 2009 event at Santa Anita Park, Breeders' Cup officials announced after the conclusion of Saturday's races. After an 11-percent increase in attendance Friday, there were 72,739 on hand for Saturday's 11-race card, a 23.6-percent increase from the 2009 Saturday attendance of 58,845 at Santa Anita. Total attendance for the two days increased 18.5 percent, from 96,496 in 2009 to 114,353 in 2010. The two-day common pool total was \$163,619,784, an increase of 13 percent over the \$144,599,205 wagered in 2009. The common-pool handle for Saturday's 10-race card was \$110,609,159, an increase of 15 percent from the 2009 Saturday common-pool handle of \$96,159,747. The \$53,010,625 wagered on Friday's card was an increase of 9 percent over the \$48,439,458 bet on Friday's card in 2009. On-track handle increased both days compared to 2009. Saturday's on-track handle was \$14,476,867, an increase of 19 percent over the \$12,177,982, wagered on-track in 2009. "The Breeders' Cup extends its sincere thanks to all of the participants in our event, to the enthusiastic crowd, to our sponsors and to our partners at Churchill Downs," said Breeders' Cup President Greg Avioli.

Shirreffs Confirms Retirement

There had been speculation that **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) might be kept in training for another season, but trainer John Shirreffs said Sunday that was not the plan. The six-year-old will return to California, but only for a brief stay. "She'll be there for about a month," Shirreffs said, adding, "That's the thing about racing. As a trainer, you have to learn to let go. Heck, she's been a champion for three years, and she's going to a great place." But the conditioner is unlikely to be watching the replay of the mare's spectacular GI Breeders' Cup Classic effort any time soon. "It was her last race," he said. "It's all over. Why watch it again?"

Analyzing Zenyatta's effort in the Classic, Shirreffs commented, "It's unfortunate that she drops so far back. It left her too much to do." But, he continued, "You always have that hope that she'll get there when you see her lower her head and start stretching out."

The trainer had no criticism for Mike Smith after the race. "What could I say?" Shirreffs remarked. "I just patted him on the shoulder. He was devastated."

The rest of her connections were as well.

"It's been a fairy tale, and you want all fairy tales to come true," Shirreffs concluded.

Zenyatta was scheduled to fly west Sunday night. Breeding plans have not been finalized.

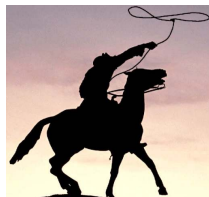

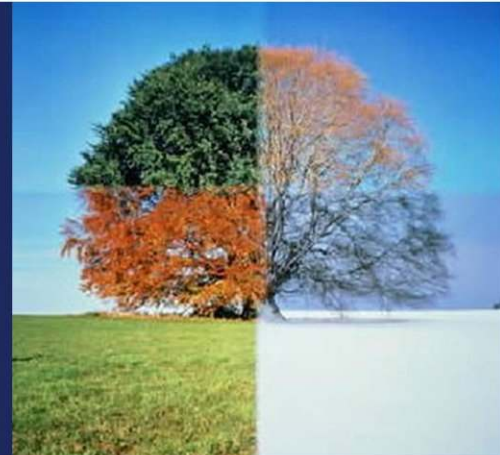
