



MYERSES STRIKES FOR LADY ALEXANDER

Lady Alexander (Exchange Rate--Lady Ironwood, by Housebuster) will be joining the racing string of Keith and Ginger Myers' Coteau Grove Farms after selling for \$410,000 during yesterday's third session of the Keeneland November sale. Keeneland bid spotter Spanky Assiter, speaking by phone with Keith Myers, handled the bidding. Coteau Grove is a breed-to-race operation, according to the Sunset, Louisiana-based

farm's racing manager and trainer Glenn Delahoussaye. Lady Alexander, a five-time stakes winner, will continue her racing career with Delahoussaye before joining the Coteau Grove broodmare band. The Myers were underbidders on four horses in book one before finally signing the ticket on Lady Alexander. Delahoussaye

left Kentucky before the filly went through the ring, but had pinpointed Lady Alexander as something special. "I was amazed at the quality of her vet work," the trainer reported via telephone. "Basically she's a sprinter and those sprints are hard on horses, but this filly's vet work is very good. She is a beautiful legged filly. She has a nice long walk on her. She is a beautiful physical specimen. I think she is the type of filly that would throw you a good foal. And in the meantime, we can get another year out of her and have some fun with her." Just two years old, Coteau Grove has a racing string of 21 and a broodmare band of eight. Already in the breeding program is Clear Sailing (Empire Maker), winner of this year's Pelleteri S., and stakes-placed Bella Medaglia (Medaglia d'Oro) and Harlie's Dreams (Pleasant Tap). "The mare we just purchased is a little more accomplished in her career, but her quality level, I would say, is on par with those other mares," Delahoussaye added. Of the mare's session-topping price tag, Delahoussaye said, "Racing fillies coming off the racetrack, you do have to pay a little more for them than a broodmare. We weren't able to acquire what we shot after on the first two days, so we probably went a little stronger on this mare because we didn't get what we wanted from the first two days. I thought the filly would have brought about \$300,000. I asked [Keith] not to do anything crazy and I don't think he did."

Keeneland November Marches On...

During yesterday's third session of the Keeneland November sale, 254 horses grossed \$21,249,100. The average of \$83,658 dropped 21.4 percent from a year ago, while the median fell 13.3 percent to \$65,000. Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell attributed the session's drop-off directly to last year's Overbrook dispersal. "The major difference is we don't have Overbrook," he said. "We are off almost exactly what Overbrook grossed last year at this session." Russell was satisfied by buyer participation at yesterday's first session of Book 2. "Today we had all the activity that we expected from both domestic and international buyers," Russell said. Through the first three sessions of the auction, 580 horses grossed \$91,594,100. The cumulative average is down 12.3 percent to \$157,921, while the median is down 9.1 percent to \$100,000. Of the overall health of the market, Russell observed, "Foals are selling very well. Over the first few days, the top end of the foal prices are higher than last year. I think people are not looking for quantity, they are looking for quality. And they are being very selective, whether they are buying mares or foals. They are looking at mares very hard, at their produce record, as well as who they are covered by and giving premiums to the younger mares who are well-covered and a little discount on the middle-aged mares." Wine and Dyne with Nancy Dillman...

Wine and Dyne (Dynaformer--Southern Swing, by Dixieland Band) will be heading to Nancy Dillman's Stonegate Farm near Anchorage, Kentucky, after selling for \$350,000 yesterday at Keeneland November.

Nicoma Bloodstock's Headley Bell handled the bidding for Dillman, who is the breeder of last Friday's GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic third-place finisher Havre de

Grace (Saint Liam). "She's been a long-time client and friend," Bell said of the New York native. "She has about four or five mares and is always looking to upgrade." Yesterday was not the first time that Wine and Dyne had caught Bell's eye. "We actually considered her

when she was a yearling and, in the end, I came off of her out back," Bell said of the six-year-old mare who sold yesterday in foal to Giant's Causeway. Wine and Dyne sold for \$450,000 to Bob Greenbaum as a Keeneland September yearling in 2004. On the race-track, she won twice and earned \$128,897. She is a half-sister to stakes winner Mr. Pee Vee (Eltish) and to Grade I-placed Erinsouthernman (Eltish). "We liked all the ingredients," Bell continued. "We liked her as a racemare. And we liked Dynaformer and Giant's Causeway--the whole package." Of the price tag, Bell said, "It was a little more than I wanted based on the day, but, at the same time, I thought she stood out on the day, and we accept that." Dillman sells the majority of her foals as yearlings, including Havre de Grace, who sold for \$380,000 at the 2008 Keeneland September sale. Of Havre de Grace's success this season, Bell said that Dillman "was over the moon. You know how difficult it is to get a good horse, especially when you're dealing with a limited number of mares. So it was a special, special moment. Even running third was special, because everybody ran their race. It was great." Wine and Dyne will now head to Anchorage, where Dillman's 50-acre farm is located. "She's what everyone wants to have in the horse business," Bell said of Dillman. "A really fine lady."

Robinson Reminisces; 'Z' Sis Heading to Shirreffs...

Asked if he made it up to Churchill Downs to see Zenyatta's ultimately unsuccessful date with destiny in Saturday's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Winter Quarter Farm's Don Robinson laughed incredulously, "Did I make it up there?!" It was, admittedly, a dumb question to put to the man that raised and sold the champ, whose granddam is, in fact, buried Winter Quarter.

"Even though she didn't win, it was an amazing race," Robinson said during a break in the action yesterday. "I've never seen a horse, in a race of that caliber, on a track it isn't familiar with, do something like that. It was probably as sensational a race as I've seen. She's just a stone racehorse."

It's a story that's been told before, but here's a brief recap: Robinson welcomed Zenyatta's granddam For the Flag (*Forli) onto his farm back in the 1980s, not long after he struck up a business relationship with the mare's owner Eric Kronfeld, who breeds under the banner Maverick Productions LLC.

“Eric was sending his mares down from Pennsylvania on a seasonal basis, and finally he said, ‘I want my mares to be down there all the time,’” said Robinson. “For the Flag was a mare that always got lovely foals. Eric really liked the Roberto line, and so went to Kris S. one year, and got Vertigineux [Zenyatta’s dam]. We couldn’t sell her as a yearling in September--we bought her back for \$150,000--but we liked her a lot. She was

really promising on the track, but was not sound. She was magnificent looking, though. That’s where all the size comes from.”

Asked if Vertigineux resembled Zenyatta, whom Winter Quarter sold for just \$60,000 as a KESEEP yearling in 2005, Robinson said, “It was the other way around. Zenyatta resembles *her*. Where’s Bailey, the first stakes winner [produced by Vertigineux, by Aljabr], was the same--big and strapping. Balance was more a little more compact--more like what the sale ring wants.”

Winter Quarter sold Balance (Thunder Gulch), Zenyatta’s

older half-sister, to John and Jerry Amerman’s Amerman Racing for \$260,000 in 2004. The filly became a MGISW on the track, and during the Keeneland September Sale, Mill Ridge Sales sold her first foal, a colt by A.P. Indy, for a sale-topping \$4.2 million. The colt was purchased by Besilu Stables and has now been named Mr. Besilu.

Despite not having a financial stake in the transaction, Robinson said it was special to watch. “Oh, it was everything,” he said. “I grew up with the Bells, so I was thrilled for Mill Ridge. And I know the Amermans really well. They kept asking if I’d seen the A.P. Indy colt. And I was embarrassed to keep saying I hadn’t. So I made it a point to go see him when he came to September.

“Now, the Amermans had mailed me a photograph of a painting of Balance with the colt at her side. It looked, to me, *highly* stylized--the colt looked *that* big and handsome. But when they brought that colt out of the stall, I realized they hadn’t embellished the colt at all. He was the most handsome yearling I think I’ve ever seen. I couldn’t believe it--it was amazing.”

Robinson hopes the next newsmaker from the family is currently being broken at Winter Quarter right now. Her name is Eblouissante (Bernardini), and she is none other than a half-sister to Zenyatta herself.

“She’s magnificent,” Robinson. “She’ll go to be broken in Camden, South Carolina, then will join John Shirreffs’s stable.”

Kronfeld sold Vertigineux privately as a broodmare last year, but retained Eblouissante, whose name translates to ‘blinding.’ Robinson said the filly, like her big sister, already shares an affinity for the spotlight.

“The last weekend of Keeneland, some people from ESPN called and said, ‘Don, can we come to Winter Quarter to shoot some footage,’” Robinson recalled. “I said of course. They came one Sunday afternoon. I had the Broodmare of the Year plaque hanging in the barn--the wrong barn, by the way, but it’s the one everyone goes to--and they asked about the sister. I asked if they wanted to see her, so we went over to another barn where the yearlings were. We came up to the paddock--it’s a 25-acre paddock--and this filly saw the commotion from way in the middle of the field. She brought her head up, looked around, and left the others and came right over and *put her face right in the camera!* Then when the other fillies began coming around, she started running them off. They folks from ESPN were crackin’ up.”

So how has the whole Zenyatta experience been? “Believe me, this is as rewarding as it ever gets,” said Robinson. -LM

Duignan Lands Street Sense Colt for \$330,000...

Juvenile pinhookers lined up yesterday to take a shot at landing [hip 645](#), a weanling colt from the second crop of GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}). The battle came down to familiar parties on opposite sides of the auction house: Gabriel Duignan, sitting alone to the left of the sales ring, and a collective of Bill and Brian Graves and John Moynihan, to the back of the pavilion. Duignan ultimately proved gamest, landing the colt for a session-topping \$330,000. "I was running out of steam--I didn't mean to go that far, but I just loved him," said Duignan. "It was a strong price, but the really good ones are expensive. It's spotty for the rest, though." The Mar. 16-foaled bay, bred by Hertrich/McCarthy Livestock, Fred W. Hertrich III and John D. Fielding, was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency. He is a son of Autumnal (Forestry), who hails from the family of MGISW Albert the Great (Go for Gin). Autumnal was purchased, in foal to Vindication, for \$260,000 at the 2007 Keeneland November Sale in her most recent trip through the sales ring.

Darley's Street Sense was well-received at this year's yearling sales. A total of 43 of 60 offered sold for an average of \$129,933, according to *TDN* Insta-Tistics, making him the leading North American freshman sire by that measure.

His \$125,000 median was also best among North American sires. Coming into yesterday, his weanlings (six offered, five sold) averaged \$146,000--again best in his crop. "I love them," Duignan said about Street Sense's offspring. "And I love everything about him. He's a Classic-winning racehorse, having won the Derby, and he's got the pedigree. Let's hope he hits."

Buyers were once again willing to pay a premium for weanlings who jumped through the proverbial hoops yesterday, and Duignan said he wasn't surprised the colt attracted so much attention. "The market's gotten so selective that you either have the good one, or you're in trouble," he commented. "Everyone's landing on the same one." Duignan said he bought the colt for himself and a partner and confirmed he will re-offer him as a yearling. -LM

Cash is Greener for Polo Green...

At Keeneland September, Woods Edge Farm's Peter O'Callaghan registered a nice score when he sold a pinhooked Candy Ride (Arg) colt for \$475,000 to Amerman Stables. O'Callaghan plucked the colt out of the Craig Family reduction at Barretts January just nine months ago for \$37,000. Also making the trip to California for the reduction was Polo Green Stable's Nobu Araki. He, too, made a purchase in that range, going to \$32,000 for Seeking Results (Seeking the Gold), a half-sister to MGISW River Keen (Ire) (Keen {GB}) who was in foal to Candy Ride (Arg). After watching O'Callaghan's good luck at September, Araki's partners in the mare--all friends--chided him that he'd made the wrong buy in California. But yesterday, the men enjoyed their own big score, selling the mare's resulting foal, a colt by the Lane's End sire, for \$250,000. John Moynihan signed the ticket as Pacific Racing. Taylor Made Sales Agency consigned the Apr. 4-foaled bay as [hip 520](#). The colt was bred by Polo Green, Red Diamond Bloodstock, Keitaro Tsukamoto and Yui Torigoe. Since the catalogue, the colt enjoyed a nice update, as his two-year-old brother Clubhouse Ride won the Barretts Juvenile S. at Fairplex Sept. 19. Clubhouse Ride also finished third in the Jack Goodman S. at Oak Tree Oct. 23. Araki, however, said the colt stood out on his own merits. "He just did everything a horse needs to do," said the affable horseman, who runs Polo Green with his wife Brenda. "He's pretty typical of the Candy Rides. He has a great hip to him, and he has a good mind. He loves people. When he was weaned, he lost a little bit of weight, but then he bulked back up." Asked if he was expecting that much, Araki laughed, "No! I wasn't expecting *half* that." The reason Araki ventured to the Golden State in January was because he was stymied at both the Keeneland November and Keeneland January sales. That had something to do with his pretty limited criteria. "There were two things: I wanted a Seeking the Gold mare, because I had a season to Offlee Wild, and She Be Wild [the sire's 2009 champion juvenile filly] is out of a Seeking the Gold mare," Araki explained. "And the Candy Rides were doing really well, and I was hoping to get a mare in foal to Candy Ride." If that wasn't all, Araki had a budget of just \$30,000. "The last \$2,000 was overbudget, but it was just \$2,000, so it worked out," said Araki of the Barretts January purchase. "It was right there--it was perfect." All didn't go perfectly this spring when Seeking Results failed to get in foal, though that led to this colt's inclusion at Keeneland November. "We decided to put him in as a weanling to generate some cash flow," said Araki, who said Seeking Results could return to Candy Ride in 2011, given yesterday's result. "Hopefully, this horse will go on to be a star," he said. Based on 64 acres in Versailles, Polo Green bred last year's good three-year-old West Side Bernie (Bernstein), who won the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile and ran second in the GIII Delta Jackpot S. at two and was runner-up in the GI Wood Memorial. -LM

Curlin's First-Crop Weanlings Enter the Ring...

Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings LLC went to \$72,000 to acquire a weanling filly by his two-time Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike) at Keeneland November's Wednesday's session. The bay, born on Feb. 24, is out of the unraced Skip Away mare Skip to Baghdad, who also produced MSW & GSP Stormin Baghdad (Stormin Fever). The Kentucky-bred was consigned by Select Sales as [hip 537](#), agent for the weanling's breeder, MAP Mare Partnership #2. "We have some outstanding [Curlin foals] at the

farm," Jackson's bloodstock advisor John Moynihan said out back on an unseasonably warm afternoon in Lexington yesterday. "That's really the only one that I've seen that I wanted to take a shot with so far. There hasn't been that many [offered at auction]. I think I've only seen two or three so far--I think most people are hanging on to them." The mighty Curlin collected seven top-shelf wins during his brilliant career, including the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, GI Preakness S. and G1 Dubai World Cup.

He bankrolled more than \$10 million in earnings. Jackson has strongly supported the chestnut since his retirement in 2008, sending many of his top mares to the Lane's End stallion, including GI Prioress S. heroine Friendly Michele (Artax), the unraced Pleasant Dixie (Dixieland Band)--the dam of MGISW Southern Image (Halo's Image)--and MGSP Class on Class (Jolie's Halo). Friendly Michele was acquired by Stonestreet for \$1.15 million at this venue four years ago, while Pleasant Dixie was a \$1.25-million KEENOV purchase in 2007. Class on Class, the dam of MGSW Don't Get Mad (Stephen Got Even), was purchased by Jackson for \$950,000 at the 2006 KEENOV sale. All three Stonestreet broodmares foaled Curlin colts this year. "We bred some of our *best* mares to him," Moynihan continued. "It's a good sign when some of these mares that you have experience with--seeing what kind of foals they have produced--and some of the best foals they've had is this first crop of Curlins. We're really excited about it." -SS

Dynaformer Mares Lining Up for Summer Bird...

Pauls Mill owner Ben Walden Jr. and Drs. K. K. and Devi Jayaraman teamed up at Keeneland November's Wednesday session to purchase a pair of Dynaformer mares for champion three-year-old **Summer Bird** (Birdstone)'s inaugural season at stud in 2011.

"He is a *very* talented racehorse--a high level of talent," Walden said of Summer Bird after checking out the results sheets out back. "We're just trying to find some broodmares that were high-level racemares from

good families. There's no real remarkable recipe that we're looking for. We'll probably give a little bit of an edge to two-year-old form, since he didn't have any. Dynaformer is such an important broodmare sire influence. He's great for just about anybody."

The 13-year-old MGISW **Critical Eye** (Dynaformer--Critical Crew, by Dr. Blum), in foal to Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) on an Apr. 17 cover, brought \$200,000 from the tandem. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent LXV as [hip 704](#), the millionaire recorded wins for owner/breeder Carol and Herbert Schwartz in the 2000 GI Gazelle H. and the 2001 GI Hempstead H., both at Belmont Park. Critical Eye's unraced two-year-old colt by Medaglia d'Oro brought \$330,000 from John Ferguson at last year's Keeneland September sale; her yearling colt by Pulpit was locked up by Shadwell for \$300,000 a couple of months ago at the September sale.

Earlier in the session Walden and Jayaraman went to \$85,000 to land [hip 561](#), the nine-year-old mare **Stupendous Miss** (Dynaformer--Subeen {GB}, by Caerleon). The GIII All Along Breeders' Cup S. heroine was presented in foal to Smart Strike by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency. The dark bay went through the ring in foal to Distorted Humor at this sale four years ago, bringing \$1.3 million from Winsong Farm. The resulting foal, Do It All (Distorted Humor), was snatched up by John Ferguson for \$900,000 at the 2008 FTSAUG sale.

"Both of these mares are big-boned, big-structured mares who could *really* run," Walden continued. "We were really excited to get both of them. Critical Eye being a multiple Grade I winner in New York really made a lot of sense for [Summer Bird]."

Racing in the blue and red colors of the Jayaramans, Summer Bird placed himself in exclusive company during his three-year-old campaign, becoming the first horse since the great Easy Goer to win the GI Belmont S., GI Travers S., and GI Jockey Club Gold Cup in the same season.

INJUNCTION ALLOWS CASTELLANO TO RIDE

A judge in Franklin County Circuit Court in Frankfort, Kentucky, has granted jockey Javier Castellano a temporary injunction and stay to prevent the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) from enforcing its six-day suspension handed down for an incident in last Friday's GIII Breeders' Cup Marathon. The KHRC announced the suspension Nov. 7, two days after Castellano, aboard Prince Will I Am (Victory Gallop) in the 14-furlong Marathon, ducked out abruptly approaching the stretch, nearly unseating fellow rider Martin Garcia from his mount Romp (Arg), who caused interference to A. U. Miner, the mount of Calvin Borel. Castellano and Borel came to blows in the winner's circle after dismounting, and each was issued a fine, though Borel was not suspended. "In essence, the judge ruled that if the Commission is permitted to enforce its suspension without the opportunity to exhaust administrative remedies, Javier will be irreparably harmed and denied the statutory due process available to him pursuant to Kentucky law," said Castellano's attorney, Joel B. Turner. "Judge Shepherd immediately understood the arguments we made for Javier and was extremely sensitive to the urgent need for a ruling. We are very pleased to have obtained this result for our client. As far as we know, the KHRC has never denied a jockey a stay pending due process right to an appeal. In effect, the KHRC is making Javier serve his penalty before the matter is adjudicated. Only once in the past four years has a suspension of more than three days been handed out to a jockey in Kentucky."

Eugene Melnyk has moved a group of five horses, including **Bridgetown** (Speightstown) from Ken McPeck to Todd Pletcher, *Daily Racing Form* reports. The most prominent of the quintet is clearly Bridgetown, runner-up in the 2009 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf and most recently a solid fourth at 13-1 in the GII Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint last Saturday. "When the horse came to us last year, I don't think he was particularly well regarded, so I'm proud of what we did with him," McPeck told *DRF*. "I'm fine with the decision by Mr. Melnyk. I'm in the service business, and these things happen. We'll keep grinding."

Group Led by Ben Kessinger Take Down BC Pick Six...

At the conclusion of last Saturday's Breeders' Cup card at Churchill Downs, a group led by Ben Kessinger held the winning Ultra Pick Six ticket of \$800,160.40. Also involved in the six-man partnership was Kessinger's stepfather, Kip Cornett (of Cornett Advertising) in addition to four of Kessinger's friends.

"There were six people involved, basically the people we went to the races with," said Kessinger, who has worked at Hinkle Farms for six years and currently serves Sales/Marketing director. "Only my stepdad Kip is involved in horseracing. Everybody else is not directly involved in the business, they are fans."

Kessinger, who has been involved in horseracing since he was a youngster, is the son of the highly regarded trainer Burk Kessinger.

"I knew Saturday morning that there was a carryover from the day before, so I figured I would draft up a ticket a see what happens," said Kessinger. "When we got to the track, we hit the first two trifectas [headed by 6-1 shot Pluck in the BC Juvenile Turf and 5-1 BC Sprint winner Big Drama Sprint], so we had a little extra money to play with. I had already drawn up the pick six, and knew the pool would be between \$4-5 million. The ticket cost us \$576, so we decided to split it, \$100 a man. The rest is history."

Further explaining the methodology used in constructing the winning ticket, Kessinger added,

"We singled Goldikova, that was our only one of the day. We went four deep in the Turf Sprint and six deep in the Dirt Mile. In the Classic, we had Zenyatta, Blame and Lookin At Lucky."

Turning for home in the Classic, with Blame out front and Zenyatta closing from behind, who was Kessinger cheering for?

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

CONGRESS LOOKS TO FILL TOP COMMITTEE POSITIONS

Post-election jockeying for committee positions is in full swing and will continue for several weeks until the new Congress is seated in January. The House **Ways and Means Committee** is of particular interest to the horse racing industry, due to the committee's jurisdiction over tax matters. **Sander Levin** (D-MI) is serving as Acting Chairman while former Chairman **Charles Rangel** (D-NY) undergoes an ethics panel investigation. Meanwhile, **Richard Neal** (D-MA) is challenging Levin for the ranking Democratic position. **Dave Camp** (R-MI) likely will be the choice to take over as Chairman.

Chairmanship of the House **Energy and Commerce Committee** pits term-limited, Ranking Member **Joe Barton** (R-TX) against **Fred Upton** (R-MI) and **Cliff Stearns** (R-FL). **John Shimkus** (R-IL) announced that he may run if Barton does not get a waiver to continue beyond his term limit. Energy and Commerce has jurisdiction over the **Interstate Horseracing Act (IHA)**. Among Democrats, current Chairman **Henry Waxman** (D-CA) is expected to retain the top spot and become Energy and Commerce's Ranking Member.

"For the fan's sake and everybody that was there, I was cheering for Zenyatta," he admitted. "But, my stepdad, Kip, has been friends with [Claiborne Farm's] Seth Hancock for a very long time, and [Blame's trainer] Al Stall Jr. also used to train a few for my stepdad and myself, so I was really cheering for both horses. I really didn't care which one, because we knew we were going to win money regardless. At that point, I knew we had won, I was already running inside to celebrate."

Added Kip Cornett, "All week long, I'd been saying I hope it's a head-bob finish between Blame and Zenyatta, and it was. I've always been a big fan of Claiborne and got a great reward. Zenyatta fans also got to see a great finish."

When all was said and done, had the Amazon mare crossed the wire first, the payout would have been \$166,000. However, with Blame taking the big event, the winning ticket was \$800,160.40.

"We hung around Churchill for a long while after the race, because it took some time to become official," said. "Afterwards, we went to Malones and had a big dinner."

And what is Kessinger's plan for his share of the winnings?

"I think I'm just going to put it away," he said, adding, "Although I'm sure she will have the first say as to where it goes."-CB

BLAME IS THE NAME

Before we talk about the sales, which at least for the first three days were very strong for the right stuff, first a word about last weekend's Breeders' Cup. On the minus side, it was cold on Friday and there were a lot of complaints that the food was...typical racetrack fare. On the plus side, the racing was sensational and, from the Breeders' Cup point of view, the event was a big success: attendance was up, handle was up, and TV ratings were way up. It was a shame that Zenyatta couldn't go 20-and-out, but she went down fighting and came back to a winner's reception--though, had she really won, the roof of the place would've come off, like it did at Santa Anita last year. Goldikova was an imperious winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile to become the one and only three-time Breeders' Cup winner, and the announcement that she is to stay in training to try and win the Mile for a fourth time is great news for European racing fans, and bad news for the connections of Europe's other aspiring top-class milers of 2011.

And the only horse ever to beat Zenyatta, the horse that fought off her attempt to retire undefeated, having beaten the boys twice in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic? This is Blame, bred and raced by Claiborne Farm and partner Adele Dilschneider, and developed expertly by Al Stall, Jr., to become the top racehorse in America in 2010 (though does that make him Horse of the Year? Most would say yes, though it's certainly between the one-two in the Classic). Blame is by Arch (by Kris S., by Roberto) out of Liable, by Seeking the Gold out of Bound, a three-quarter sister, by Nijinsky II, to Nureyev; and a half-sister to the dam of Sadler's Wells, from probably the most important sire family of modern times.

As a racehorse, Blame's career closely parallels that of his sire, Arch, except, whereas Arch was retired after his three-year-old year, Blame raced on with, obviously, great success at four--the Classic was his third Grade I win of the year, after the GI Stephen Foster H. and the GI Whitney H. (both at nine furlongs), in the latter of which he defeated Quality Road by a head, running a Beyer 111, a number he repeated in his Classic win. As Zenyatta had run a Beyer 112 when winning the Classic last year, it tends to validate the form all around. These may not have been the fastest racehorses of all time (Medaglia d'Oro and Ghostzapper ran Beyers of 120+), but they were all three good enough to be justifiably called champions.

Blame's sire Arch had been bred by Helen Alexander and her mother, Helen Groves, and sold to Seth Hancock and Adele Dilschneider for \$710,000 at the 1996 Keeneland July sale. As you can tell from the price, he was a beautifully bred: by Kris S. out of Aurora, a black-type winner by Danzig out of the champion Althea, by Alydar out of Courtly Dee--a great family itself, which also incidentally includes Green Desert (Danzig). Trained by Frankie Brothers, Arch broke his maiden over seven furlongs at Keeneland in his only start at two; Blame broke his maiden over seven furlongs at Keeneland in his second start at two. At three, Arch went into the 1998 GI Breeders' Cup Classic a winner of four of his five starts that year, the last two coming in the then-GI Super Derby and the then-GIII Fayette H. Arch was down the field in one of the strongest editions of the GI Breeders' Cup Classics ever run, won by Awesome Again from Silver Charm and Swain, and was retired to Claiborne.

Blame, as mentioned, won the second of his two starts at two. He was four-for-six at three in 2009, dropping a seven-furlong allowance race at Churchill in his first start of the year and running second to Regal Ransom in the now-GII Super Derby. He followed that by beating older horses in the now-GII Fayette H. at Keeneland (on Polytrack) and the GII Clark H. at Churchill (on dirt) to close out his three-year-old campaign. It's not that dissimilar to Arch's career at that point, only Blame came back to win three Grade Is at four and go down in history as the only horse to beat Zenyatta. But what makes him a really mouth-watering sire prospect is that race record plus the pedigree. Arch has done well in Europe (though he never ran on the grass, he's Roberto-line), so Blame, with Arch plus the sire family of Nureyev and Sadler's Wells, should be a no-brainer for Europeans still with mares in America, or for anybody breeding for Europe. They showed him off at Keeneland during the sale before he ships out to the farm, and the prevalent comment from the horsemen I saw him with was "very well-balanced." He's probably 16.1 hands, but doesn't look a big horse. Some pretty tough judges gave him the thumbs-up on conformation, so that, plus good name recognition at home and being a no-brainer play for Europe, adds up to Blame not just being the horse that beat Zenyatta: it makes him a pretty hot sire prospect for 2011 from anybody's point of view.

One other horse who should be singled out for honorable mention at the Breeders' Cup is Gio Ponti, the five-year-old by Tale of the Cat who was the best grass horse in the country last year, and now has the distinction of having finished second to Zenyatta in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Classic (on synthetic) and second to Goldikova in the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Mile. He was fourth in a falsely run G1 Dubai World Cup last year, and there seemed a possibility his retirement might be delayed for another crack at that \$10-million race. Whenever he does go to stud, Gio Ponti is another who takes with him impeccable credentials as a potential sire of racehorses. **Cont. p17**

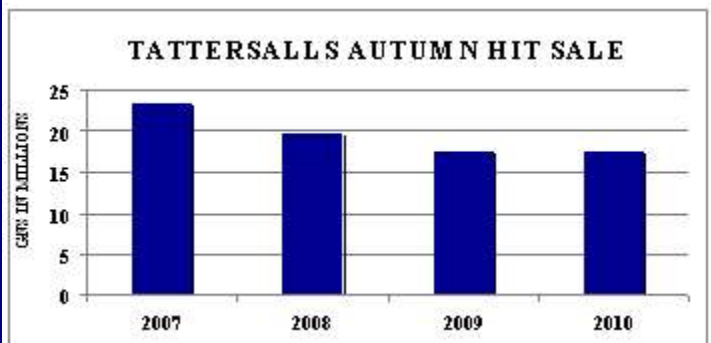

"As Keeneland Sales Director Geoffrey Russell points out, and as anybody who studies the horse market knows, it is really impossible to compare mixed sales from year to year, because the composition of the catalogues can change so much; last year, the Overbrook Dispersal accounted for \$21-million of the gross on Tuesday, for example. Nonetheless, the fact that the combined gross for Fasig's Sunday sale plus Keeneland Book 1, Monday and Tuesday, was within \$2-million of the same days last year, with more horses sold, seems a big plus to me. The market is very strong, though always only for the right stuff."

Meanwhile, At the Sales...

Whereas the auction market for yearlings can be compared as like-for-like from year to year, as mentioned in the Sales Ticker comment, this is not the case for mixed sales. The catalogues can vary dramatically from year to year, as, indeed, is the case this year, when we have to compare results with those which include the \$21 million the Overbrook dispersal generated on the second day of Book 1 at Keeneland in 2009. Without trying to quantify a comparison with this year's catalogues, as you can see from the Sales Ticker, the combined gross for Fasig's sale on Sunday, plus Keeneland Book 1 on Monday and Tuesday, was down only \$2 million from 2009, with more horses sold (therefore the average and median dropped).

Down in the trenches, two things are abundantly clear: that prices are still high on what is perceived to be the good stuff, but there is very limited demand below whatever 'the good stuff' is. Even with seemingly no participation from the Darley contingents, plenty of fillies and mares are being valued at a half-million plus--Japanese interests, especially from the Yoshida family, and Australian buyers have been very prominent again-- and plenty of foals are selling for good money, too. First-crop (foals of 2010) sire **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo) had a golden five minutes on Tuesday when two colts that happened to come up as successive hip numbers (309, out of User Cat; and 310, out of Versailles Treaty) brought prices of \$310,000 and \$450,000, respectively. He's the leader among his group so far, with four (of four offered) averaging \$252,500, with his archrival **Raven's Pass** (Elusive Quality) in second spot among first-crop sires, with six (of six offered) averaging \$196,666 (through Tuesday); a long way to go in that category, though, it must be said. The first two mares offered in foal to superstar Sea the Stars (Cape Cross) in Kentucky averaged \$975,000. The 'good stuff' might be few and far between from here on out, though, so it remains to be seen how things will pan out, but, as far as the sales series' three big days went--Fasig plus Keeneland Book 1--there were reasons to say the glass is starting to look half full instead of half empty.

AFLEET EXPRESS TO GAINESWAY

Afleet Express (Afleet Alex--Expense, by Distant View), winner of the GI Travers S. at Saratoga, has been retired from racing and will stand the 2011 season at Gainesway Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. A stud fee has not yet been announced for the three-year-old, who will stand alongside his sire at the Beck family's operation. "Afleet Express exemplifies the very best qualities

in the Thoroughbred race horse, and of the Afleet Alex progeny in particular," said Gainesway President and CEO Antony Beck. "The Travers victory, at the American Classic distance of 1 1/4 miles, when Afleet Express just would not be denied, showed his class and courage under fire. But he also won his two-year-old debut in New York going away, at six fur-

longs. And, equally important, around the barn he has a tremendously calm temperament and demeanor, which is representative of his sire's progeny. We are very excited to be standing this outstanding stud prospect." Bred in Kentucky by McMillin Brothers and James Devaney, the bay colt captured the GIII Pegasus S. at Monmouth June 19, then finished third in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga July 31 for trainer Jimmy Jerkens. He dug in gamely to deny Fly Down (Mineshaft) in a scintillating renewal of the Travers Aug. 28, but was sidelined the following month with a suspensory injury. Afleet Express, a half-brother to multiple stakes winner and GII Illinois Derby runner-up Reporting for Duty (Deputy Commander), heads to stud with a record of 7-4-1-1 and earnings of \$835,140.

NJ SENATE COMMITTEE APPROVES GAMING

BILLS The New Jersey Senate State Government, Wagering, Tourism and Historic Preservation Committee Monday approved a package of bills that would allow an exchange wagering system to be established in the Garden State. The four bills now must be passed by the state's legislative bodies. The first bill, S-829, was sponsored by Sen. Richard J. Codey (D-Essex), and would allow the New Jersey Racing Commission to issue a license to the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority (NJSEA) enabling it to establish an exchange wagering system. Earlier this year, California became the first state in the nation to pass exchange wagering legislation, though existing federal laws are unclear on the matter. Codey also sponsored another bill, S-2229, which would allow "single-pool wagering." If passed, it would allow racetracks to combine all wagers into a single pari-mutuel pool. Legislation was also approved that would pave the way for more OTBs in the state. The fourth bill would decrease the number of standard-bred dates at the Meadowlands. "[Monday's] action in the State Government Committee was only the first part of a comprehensive plan to make New Jersey's casinos and racetracks more economically productive," said Senator Jim Whelan, chair of the committee. "The fact remains that gaming and wagering represent a substantial part of our State's economy, and employ thousands of State residents from every corner of New Jersey. We have a responsibility to give our State's casinos and racetracks the tools they need to be economically competitive with facilities in neighboring states, but also to ensure that the industry can remain sustainable for the future."

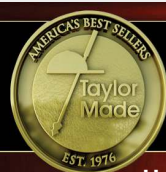
