Conchita (Cozzene--Desert Gold, by Seeking the Gold) will join the commercial broodmare band of Atlanta real estate developer Peter Blum after topping Thursday's session at Keeneland November at \$370,000 . The gray

mare, in foal to More Than Ready, is a half-sister to unbeaten Group 1 winner White Moonstone (Dynaformer). Mark Maronde, talking to Blum via telephone, handled the bidding from the back of the sales pavilion. "[Blum] has a top broodmare band, he's a commercial breeder who is always looking for something that can appreciate," Maronde said. "He liked the pedigree,

took a swing and got it done." Maronde admitted White Moonstone, who is four-for-four after her victory in the G1 Meon Valley Fillies Mile S. in September, was pivotal in the decision to bid on Conchita. "White Moonstone was the key," he said. "She's a good two-year-old that Peter is hoping trains on and becomes a top three-year-old, and then the pedigree improves. A young mare in the right hands, with the first dam being young, the pedigree could explode." The final price was over what Blum had expected to pay for the five-year-old mare. "He went a little bit beyond what we talked about originally, but Peter is game and he was happy to get her," Maronde said. "For what we went over, he said, 'If we're right, we're right and if we're wrong, we're wrong. It's not going to be the end of the world for what we valued her at and what we went over to get her.'" **Cont. p2**

SUPER SAVER TO STAND FOR \$20,000

G1 Kentucky Derby hero **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon--Supercharger, by A.P. Indy) will stand for \$20,000 when he goes to stud at WinStar Farm in Versailles for 2011.

"We've had overwhelming response since announcing Super Saver's retirement, and we felt at \$20,000 he would be placed in the market to have a strong first book of mares, while also providing good value to breeders," said WinStar President and CEO Elliott Walden. "When you take into account that he was a record-setting two-year-old, the Derby winner, and hails from the hottest active family in the stud book, there isn't another horse entering stud around that price that can match his credentials."

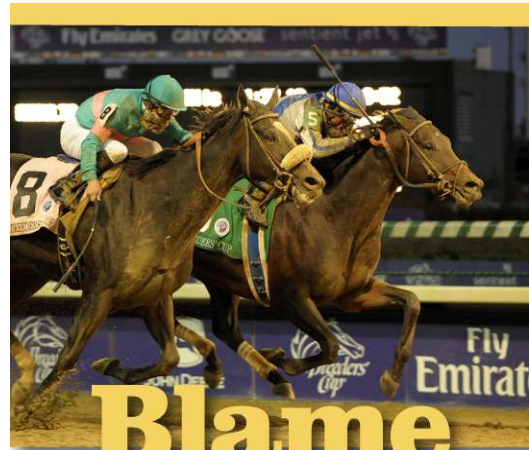

Thursday's \$370,000 session topper was a major score for Jody and Michelle Huckabay's Elm Tree Farm. Huckabay and partners purchased the mare, in foal to Congaree, for \$40,000 out of the 2008 Keeneland November sale. "We bought her for the bottom side," Huckabay said. "We've been a big fan of Desert Stormer for years. [Conchita's breeder] Stonerside has great horses and we were just lucky to get her bought." Conchita is out of graded stakes placed Desert Gold (Seeking the Gold), and her second dam is Desert Stormette (Storm Cat), a full-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Desert Stormer. Conchita has produced two foals, her yearling Congaree filly and a weanling filly by Exchange Rate. "We've kept both the fillies she's had," Huckabay said. "We'll keep them for a while and see what happens." Huckabay added that the weanling may be sent through the sales ring in 2011. In addition to the exploits of White Moonstone, the page enjoyed a boost when stallion More Than Ready was represented by two Breeders' Cup winners. "We bred her to More Than Ready, and what a weekend he had," Huckabay said. "Everything just came together. -J Martini

Weanlings Heading West...

Gary and Mary West, who have campaigned top-class runners such as GI Wood Memorial hero Buddha (Unbridled's Song) and GI Forego S. hero and promising

young sire Mass Media (Touch Gold), have been active participants in the lively weanling trade through the first four days of the Keeneland November Sale. The West's racing manager and bloodstock advisor Ben Glass has signed for a quartet of

youngsters for a sum of \$1,040,000, led by [hip 80](#), a \$310,000 Pulpit colt out of MGSW and GISP Winter Garden (Roy). The Feb. 12 foal was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent LV. The couple also purchased three weanlings by Tapit from Gainesway's draft--[hip 426](#), a colt out of the unraced Lady Solvig (Giant's Causeway) for \$260,000; [hip 892](#), a colt out of the Mr. Greeley mare Rhumb Line for \$260,000; and [hip 925](#), a filly from the winning Grand Slam mare Slammingpartygirl for \$210,000.

"We buy to race, we don't buy to pinhook," Glass said while taking a break from the action out back. "We usually get four to five weanlings every November. I'd buy more, but they're tough to get--you get outbid, you can't get them past the vet, etc. We like to find racey-looking individuals. They're tough to find and everyone else wants them too, obviously."

Any standouts among the future group to carry the West's pink and black silks?

"I bought three colts and one filly, and the filly is the raciest-looking one in the bunch," Glass replied. "Mr. West doesn't usually buy fillies, but we couldn't find any other colts [that we liked]. We really liked her, so he said 'yeah, go ahead and buy her.'"

The Wests ranked third amongst the leading buyers at this year's Keeneland September sale, purchasing 18 horses for \$3,722,000, good for an average of \$206,778.

"We have about 30-35 horses on the track right now, about 20 others coming off the farm--two-year-olds going back in training--and 41 yearlings being broken in Ocala," Glass continued before adding with a laugh, "We have enough." -SS

Hernon Toes the "Line"...

Keeneland faithful are familiar with Michael Hernon as Gainesway's director of sales, but the Irishman enjoyed success as a breeder at the November sale yesterday when a gray colt by Tapit sold for \$260,000. [Hip 892](#) is out of Rhumb Line (Mr. Greeley), a 10-year-old mare Hernon owns in partnership with Dr. Bill Andrade. He originally purchased Rhumb Line in partnership with Michael Narlinger for \$20,000 out of the 2005 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky February sale.

"I was at Fasig-Tipton when I first saw her," Hernon recalled yesterday. "And I was immediately captured by her. She's just a beautiful mare. She's got size and scope and she's correct." Cont. p3

After her purchase in 2005, Rhumb Line was bred to Officer and the resulting foal was Art Princess. Art Princess, a \$60,000 Fasig-Tipton November weanling, went on to finish second in the 2008 G2 Cherry Hinton S. Hernon was so impressed with the family, he reacquired Art Princess when she went through the sales ring at Keeneland last November.

"I bought her for \$50,000 last year and I own her with [Gainesway president] Antony Beck," Hernon said. "She is currently pregnant to Tapit."

Rhumb Line was bred to Tapit in 2006 and, at the request of Narlinger, she was put through the ring at the

2007 Keeneland January sale.

"I bought her back for \$65,000," Hernon said. "I always believed in the mare and didn't want to sell her. So I went back after her and bought her. I thought she had all the potential in the world, and was a mare who would get very good-looking stock."

That faith was rewarded when the mare's 2008 filly by Tapit sold for \$100,000 as a Fasig-Tipton November weanling, and again for \$285,000 at last year's September auction.

Now named Zazu and racing for Jerry and Ann Moss, the two-year-old was an impressive winner in her second start at Hollywood Park in October, and is being pointed towards the Moccasin S. Rhumb Line's 2009 colt by Corinthian brought \$130,000 at this year's September sale.

Hernon admitted he was "delighted" by yesterday's final bid of \$260,000, made by bloodstock agent Ben Glass.

"The colt has lots of potential to him, and his sister might be the real deal," he added.

Hernon said that he currently owns three mares in partnership, but that number could increase in the near future.

"I'll be hoping later in the week to try and find a nice young mare to add to the band," he confirmed. "I'm looking to establish myself as a serious breeder in the industry. It's always been my goal. I believe you can make a mare if you go about it the right way. I study it hard and I'm working in that direction."

Rhumb Line is currently in foal to Birdstone. -J Martini

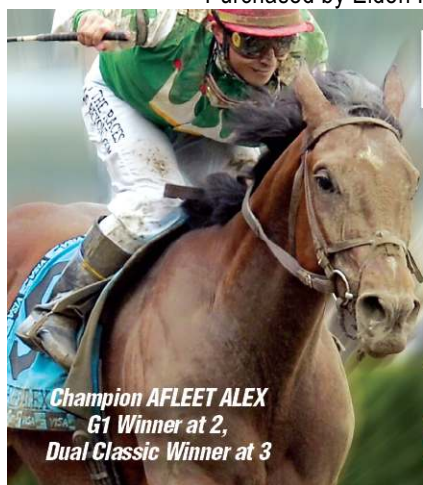

\$260K Times Two: Candy for a Baby...

Jim Wells and Everett Dobson's Candy Meadows Farm saw off all challengers Thursday to land a weanling colt by MGISW Corinthian (Pulpit) for

\$260,000.

The colt, from his sire's second crop, is a son of MSW Mykindasaint (Saint Ballado), and sold from the consignment of Gainesway as [hip 1255](#).

"We might race him, but we'll consider reselling him," Wells said from the rear walking ring shortly after signing the ticket. "He was a really nice colt--just a tremendous individual. I really couldn't fault him."

Wells liked the colt so much, in fact, that he bought his dam, Mykindasaint, who preceded him into the ring as [hip 1254](#). The seven-year-old mare, selling in foal on a Feb. 19 cover to Corinthian, was also consigned by Gainesway. And like her second foal, she realized \$260,000.

Both Dobson and Wells are from Oklahoma. Wells said he and his wife made the move to Lexington four years ago, when Candy Meadows was established, and said the farm is primarily a commercial operation.

"I've been around horses all my life--I love the business," said Wells.

Wells and Dobson, who race and sometimes breed under the banner Cheyenne Stables, bred Brother in Arms (Yes It's True), a two-year-old colt who was second in this year's Tyro S. at Monmouth while a maiden. He later graduated in a Belmont maiden special weight. They also bred the promising juvenile colt Peter Martins (Johannesburg), who broke his maiden at first asking at Newmarket in July for trainer Jeremy Nosedo in his only start. On his own, Wells bred Fairway Road (Cu-vee), winner of the Bustles and Bows S. as a two-year-old last year.

Yesterday's double-barreled transaction was, ultimately, the result of a partnership between Gainesway --where Corinthian stands--and Centennial Farm, which campaigned the chestnut. Gainesway and Centennial teamed to buy five mares to send to Corinthian, including Mykindasaint, who was acquired for \$290,000 at the 2008 Keeneland November Sale while in foal to Bluegrass Cat.

"It was part of a plan we had to support Corinthian," said Gainesway's Michael Heron. "We hoped [Mykindasaint] could produce the goods, and she did. He's a January foal, and is a well-grown, mature foal with good bone and substance underneath him.

"Certainly the sire stamped him," Heron added. "He was popular in the barn--he was vetted out eight times, so we knew there was solid interest. He was brought here and led into the ring with a \$59,000 reserve. Our style of bringing horses in is very conservative; people know they're not chasing a reserve bidding on Gainesway horses and that gives them comfort, knowing they're not being pushed. Today, two bidders emerged who were very aggressive about the horse, and he certainly did exceed our expectations."

Heron added that one of the mares purchased with Corinthian in mind wound up producing a session-topping Smart Strike colt at the most recent Keeneland September sale, making \$550,000.

Asked about expectations for Mykindof saint heading into yesterday's fourth session, Heron responded, "Well, she's a stakes-winning mare by Saint Ballado, who himself is an emerging broodmare sire. She's carrying a colt, based on fetal sex determination, and she's a very attractive mare in her own right. She's a superior physical."

Gainesway, which has enjoyed great success with another son of Pulpit in Tapit, has high expectations for Corinthian, said Heron.

"He had 31 individual yearlings sell for \$75,000 or more, and he's certainly my number one pick as the top freshman sire next year," he said. -LM



Rock Hard Ten Colt Brings \$300K...

November's fourth session was off to a quick start yesterday when [hip 890](#), a weanling colt by Rock Hard Ten--Regard (Fusaichi Pegasus), elicited a bid of \$300,000 from Westrock Stables LLC. It was the second-highest price paid for a weanling yesterday. Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud consigned the New York-bred colt on behalf of his breeder, Doug Koch's Berkshire Stud.

"He was just a big, pretty, classy horse," said Craig Bandoroff. "Doug said he was a nice horse, and the minute he came in, we said, 'Yeah, these are the kind you need.' He was vetted, 10, 12, 15 times. They all lined up. It doesn't happen often, but when it does, it's nice. We had a reserve that was immaterial."

The colt was produced by the unraced seven-year-old mare Regard, a daughter of SW Notice Me (Distinctive), and a half to three stakes horses. This is Regard's third foal. Her first, the two-year-old colt Highest Regards (Anabaa), looked good on

debut, airing by 3 1/4 lengths in a five-furlong maiden special for Empire-breds in June. He hasn't raced since. Todd Pletcher trains Highest Regards for Donna McLaughlin. Regard's second foal is a yearling colt by Tale of the Cat. Offered by Denali at this summer's Fasig-Tipton New York-bred Preferred Sale, the colt top the event on Repole Stable's \$140,000 offer.

"Doug's a very good breeder--he breeds a lot of good horses," Bandoroff said of Koch. "He has a beautiful farm in New York. It's as nice as any place in Kentucky. He was a prominent racetrack veterinarian at Belmont, and now probably has 10 or 15 mares. He raises a good horse."

Westrock Stables, the nom de course of former Alltel CEO Scott Ford, campaigns GI Kentucky Oaks third Tidal Pool (Yankee Gentleman), and co-owns Hamazing Destiny (Salt Lake), runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Saturday at 23-1 odds. -LM

'Trick' Keeps Treating Jones...

The Mazel Trick mare Don't Trick Her never made it to the races for owner/breeder Brereton C. Jones, but continues to reward the Airdrie principal with her offspring. Her third foal, GISW Check the Label (Stormin Fever), carried Jones's colors to graded stakes victories earlier this season in the GIII Appalachian S. at Keeneland in April, the GII Sands Point S. at Belmont Memorial Day weekend and Colonial's GIII Virginia Oaks in July, before selling privately to Roy and Gretchen Jackson's Lael Stables. The sophomore, a half-sister to the stakes winner On The Menu (Canadian Frontier), proved an instant hit for her new connections, securing a career-high win in the prestigious GI Garden City Breeders' Cup S. in September. Selling at Keeneland yesterday as [hip 1109](#), Don't Trick Her's weanling by Divine Park (Chester House) was the next to fatten Jones's pockets, bringing \$180,000 from Whitechurch. The 2008 GI Metropolitan H. winner stood his first season at stud at Airdrie for \$17,500 last year; he commanded a \$10,000 fee in 2010.

"I bred the second dam, Lucy Sims (Northjet {Ire}), too," Jones revealed of the May 2 foal's extended family, which also includes the Jones-bred GISW Sweet Talker (Stormin Fever).

found that horses with brilliance have more of a chance of passing it on. We're quite excited."

Jones hasn't decided yet who Don't Trick Her will be bred to next year. Her yearling colt by Include realized \$340,000 from Silverton Hill a couple of months ago at Keeneland September. In 2009, her yearling filly by Include sold to Jay Em Ess Stable for \$150,000 at FTKJUL.

Jones has been encourage by the trade through the first two books at the marathon breeding stock sale. "I think the market is doing very well," he said. "If you have a good individual and its got a reasonable pedigree, you seem to have the ability to get several people interested." -SS

Waratah Shopping Spree Continues...

Australian Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds-- which snatched up broodmare Elusive Sparkle (Elusive Sparkle) for \$1.2 million Tuesday--was at it again during Thursday's session, securing a weanling filly by Candy Ride (Arg) for \$320,000. Bred in Ontario by Windways Farm, the dark bay is a full-sister to GI Pat O'Brien Breeders' Cup S. hero El Brujo; and a half to the stakes-winning Galadriel (Ascot Knight), the multiple stakes-placed Volio (Beau Genius) and stakes-placed Manitoba Miss (D'wildcat). Consigned by Mr. and Mrs. Jody Huckabay's Elm Tree Farm LLC as [hip 1122](#), she was produced by the Devil's Bag mare Enchanted Spell. Glenmalure Farm's Peter Kirwan handled the bidding from a back-row seat inside the pavilion.

"She's a nice foal," Kirwan, who boards some of Waratah's horses at his Lexington-based establishment, said after receiving a quick thank you from the Huckabays. "We like Candy Ride--we think he's an up-and-coming sire. They're looking for different lines to either race here or take back to Australia. They had their homework done. We'll let the dust settle and see what happens. It's a great time for them to be buying because of the dollar, and with the market being a little low here, it's a double-edged bonus for them."

Including the aforementioned Elusive Sparkle, a half-sister to GI Kentucky Derby winner hero and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile champion Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}), Waratah has acquired a total of seven horses for \$2,920,000 thus far, good for second on the cumulative buyer's list at Keeneland November. Fudge, one of Australia's top 40 richest men, according to *Forbes*, sold a coal seam gas exploration permit to an Australian energy company for a reported \$466 million. -SS

Cauthen Swoops Late for Gulf Coast Horses...

By six o'clock Thursday evening, former WinStar Farm president Doug Cauthen had signed for only one horse at Keeneland November--[hip 1131](#), a daughter of Sharp Cat named Extra Sharp (Cherokee Run), who went for \$280,000. But Cauthen poured it on late, securing no fewer than eight horses from the Gulf Coast Farms dispersal that followed the day's scheduled selling. Cauthen said he was making the purchases on behalf of three different clients, including Bill Casner. Casner, who was on hand, co-owned WinStar Farm along with Kenny Troutt, but recently was bought out by his partner. In early November, Cauthen announced he was leaving the farm to establish his own independent consulting service.

Cauthen's eight buys ranged in price from \$18,000 to \$62,000. The latter was the price tag attached to [hip 5073](#), the 10-year-old MSW and MGSP Marwood (Marlin), who sold in foal to Bluegrass Cat. Taylor Made Sales Agency is handling the Gulf Coast dispersal.

"It's just a golden opportunity," Cauthen said after the sale. "I used to work for [Gulf Coast principal] Jerry Bailey for several years, and they had a great program. A lot of those mares have great pedigrees, great physicals, and a lot of race record. For some reason, the market wasn't there. It's been there all week, but wasn't for those mares in the dispersal."

He added, "I did the homework on all the mares in the dispersal. I mean, a mare in foal to Mr. Greeley for \$18,000 [[hip 5050](#), 11-year-old SW Balmy, by Salt Lake]? From a mare that gets good physicals? It was a great opportunity. Some of those mares were \$100,000 mares going for \$20,000, \$30,000. I got a really nice young half-sister to Cowtown Cat (Distorted Humor) for \$60,000 [[hip 5063](#), Cowtown Kitty, by El Corredor]."

Cauthen said he hadn't planned on buying so many of the Gulf Coast horses, but thought some of the horses that went through Monday's dispersal were undervalued. "I was surprised on some of the early hips--there were some really good buys in there," he said. "And I was hoping there would be value today. But I didn't expect that."

Vin Cox Purchases Staying Put...for Now...

Australian interests have made a big splash at the Keeneland November Sale through the first four days of trade. Paul Fudge's Waratah Thoroughbreds, currently the second leading buyer with \$2.92 million in purchases, extended to \$1.2 million to acquire Street Sense's half-sister Elusive Sparkle (Elusive Quality) during Book 1. Aussie agent James Bester has also played at the top of the market, bringing home MGSW and MG1SP Carribean Sunset (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) on behalf of Kia Ora Stud for \$1 million earlier this week.

Prominent Australian bloodstock agent Vin Cox has also made his presence felt, securing three racing/broodmare prospects for \$615,000.

"The market's been very strong," Cox said in front of the main entrance to the sale's pavilion on a sun-splashed afternoon. "I have a number of clients here that thought they'd buy a lot of horses. There's one guy in particular that bid a lot of money on a lot of horses, and he's going home empty. It's no secret that the Australian dollar is at an all-time high and the U.S. market is lower than it's been in some time. We can now be competitive on horses that we've only dreamt of owning five or six years ago."

What kind of horses is Cox shopping for?

"We like a good sort," he replied. "You don't want a camel when you have to spend \$30,000 to get them home; you don't want to take home something that you're going to be unhappy with at the end of the day."

Moon De French (Malibu Moon–French Silk, by French Deputy), third behind the mighty Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in the GI Lady's Secret S. at Oak Tree Oct. 2, led the way among Cox's purchases, going for \$300,000 during Wednesday's session. Racing in the colors of Zayat Stables, the five-year-old previously recorded a smart wire-to-wire tally in Del Mar's Adoration S. The Florida-bred was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency as [hip 837](#) during Wednesday's session.

"She's a stakes winner and a Grade I placegetter; she's just a pretty Malibu Moon mare," Cox commented. "She's going to stay in training and go back to Bob Baffert. We'll see how it goes from here; it should be exciting. She's for Widden Stud and a partner of their's from Australia."

Four-year-old filly **Noisy Feet** (Tapit–Victory Road, by Ikari), last seen recording a win for owner Sea Gulf Associates in Monmouth's College of New Jersey S. Oct. 16, brought \$200,000, also during Wednesday's session. Consigned by Three Chimneys Sales as [hip 847](#), she is a half-sister to GSW Touching Beauty (Tapit).

Gulf Coast Farms homebred **Cadazzle** (Malibu Moon–Key to the Cat, by Tale of the Cat), a two-year-old maiden with three starts in New York, brought Cox to \$115,000. Out of the stakes winner Key to the Cat, she is a half-sister to stakes winner Miss Catalyst (Mr. Greeley). She was presented by Taylor Made Sales Agency as part of the Gulf Coast Dispersal as [hip 5012](#).

“All of those three are staying here to race on,” Cox explained. “Our breeding season is not until September. Cadazzle and Noisy Feet are going to Tom Proctor, a trainer we’ve had a bit of luck with over the years. Cadazzle is owned by a long-standing friend of mine from Sydney, who is a real estate agent. This is his first foray into owning racehorses in America. Hopefully, it can work out the right way.”

He continued, “Noisy Feet is owned by Rosemount Racing Syndicate from Victoria in Australia. They race a filly with Proctor called Wild Mia (Wildcat Heir), who won a Keeneland allowance at the end of the meet. This is their second horse over here.” -SS

Kaenel Takes Career Transition in Stride...

Former jockey Kyle Kaenel was forced into retirement by injury, but the 22-year-old is forging a new career as a bloodstock agent. Kaenel, who has been involved with the sale of racehorses at the track, has signed the ticket for three lots so far at Keeneland November.

“This is the first time I’ve bought through a sale,” Kaenel said yesterday while sitting outside the back walking ring at Keeneland. “Most of the bloodstock work I’ve done has been with race-track horses. I move a lot of them. When I got hurt, that was where everything just fell into place. Last year, with all the racehorses, we got very lucky and got on a couple of nice horses.”

One of the racehorse’s that Kaenel was involved with buying was **Go Forth North** (North Light {Ire}), who was third in the GII Palomar H. before winning the GIII Harold Ramser H. in her most recent

start. Kaenel, whose five-year riding career was ended when he suffered a broken collarbone and shoulder blade and pinched a nerve in his back in a spill at Fairplex last September, first got involved with auctions at the two-year-old sales this past spring.

“People hired me to get a rider’s perspective on what the rider on top of the horse is doing,” he explained. “Some people will just cross off a horse because, ‘It’s the May sale, if this horse doesn’t know how to switch leads already, we’re going to cross him off.’

But I can look and say, ‘This rider is hurting the horse. The horse still put up a good time, but the rider is hurting him because he’s hitting him right-handed, so the horse stays on his left lead.’

“I can watch the rider and see what they’re doing with their hands, and I can pick the rider apart and whether he’s helping the horse or hurting the horse.”

From the juvenile sales, Kaenel moved onto the yearling sales, working with the Hill ‘n’ Dale sales team.

“Donato Lanni and John Sikura at Hill ‘n’ Dale have taught me so much, and really opened up a lot of doors for me,” he said. “They let me work for them and their consignment and the help they’ve given me is priceless.”

The three horses Kaenel has purchased at the November sale are on behalf of the California-based Restin Farm, buying the four-year-old mare **Here We Be** (A.P. Indy) for \$47,000, and a pair of weanlings by Discreet Cat for \$30,000 and \$25,000. He acknowledged that there is a learning curve to the bloodstock business.

“It’s step by step,” he said. “It’s definitely a process with bloodstock, and you build on it. You build relationships with people and hope they give you a shot to buy horses for them. I got really lucky with the people I’ve gotten in with, who are so sharp in the business. I love going barn to barn and just listening over their shoulders and looking at what they are seeing--just learning. It’s a blast. I love it.” -*J Martini*



For Small Breeder, Some Downs, but Big Up...

It's hard out there for the small breeder. He or she can be especially vulnerable to market whims, and the difference between a profit or loss on the year can often be the success--or failure--of a single auction

prospect. So it was nice to see Hedberg Hall's Lena Hedberg get **Contessa Halo** (Southern Halo--Queen of the Savoy, by Conquistador Cielo) sold privately after the 12-year-old broodmare RNA'd for \$285,000 during Tuesday's second session.

Hedberg reported yesterday that she completed the deal for \$260,000 to an Irish client. Contessa Halo was offered by Indian Creek as [hip 366](#). The mare is the dam of this year's standout juvenile Kantharos (Lion Heart), as

well as GSW Ikigai (Whywhywhy) and SW & GSP Bonifacio (Even the Score).

Lena Hedberg's run with Contessa Halo illustrates the luck--good and bad--that goes into the breeding business. She paid exactly zero dollars for the daughter of Southern Halo, who was a useful but unspectacular runner early in the decade. Contessa Halo broke her maiden in \$50,000 maiden claiming company at Churchill in 2000, won a Turfway allowance the same year, and took her only other win facing \$30,000 claimers under the Twin Spires in 2001.

Sent to the breeding shed, Contessa Halo ran into problems her first two years in the breeding shed. She twice got in foal, but resorbed the fetus both times. After two years of bills and no babies, her owners at the time had had enough.

"They didn't have their own farm and were paying board, and didn't want to continue with her," Hedberg explained. "So they called me up and said I could have her--I just had to pick her up that day. Which I did."

Hedberg was taking a chance taking on a mare with that track record, but reasoned it was worth the risk.

"I figure a mare has so many miscarriages and problems in them, and she'd just had two, so I felt pretty good about her," she explained. "I wasn't that worried."

Hedberg also had experience with mares with reproductive problems, and felt her small, quiet farm, located about an hour from Lexington in Mount Sterling, Kentucky, would be ideal.

"The thing with problem mares and with old mares is that you really have to keep them stressless," said Hedberg. "You have to keep things quiet and keep things the same. I have a small farm--it's just me and another fellow that works there--and so she was happy and stress free." Cont. p11

Farms and other sellers may also sell unspecified product, i.e., \$25,000 worth of stud fees for \$12,500. They may also link two or more stallions in the deal, where one of their popular stallions is coupled with another.

The TDN Daily Deal will be heavily promoted in the TDN, ensuring high visibility for each stallion on his day.

Whether the law of averages or the new environs, Contessa Halo turned into quite the producer for Hedberg Hall. A no-guarantee season to Whywhywhy yielded her first foal, Ikigai, who won the GIII Mr. Prospector S. in 2009. Contessa Halo's second foal, Bonifacio (Even the Score), won the Daisycutter H. at Del Mar in August and placed third in the GIII Sen. Ken Maddy H. since the catalogue. And **"TDN Rising Star"** Kantharos, her fourth foal, proved a juvenile sensation over the summer, winning the GIII Bashford Manor S. and GII Saratoga Special S. for Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stable and trainer Steve Asmussen. The colt looked poised for bigger and better things before suffering a career-ending injury while training at Saratoga.

That's quite a produce record for a mare that cost nothing. But it wasn't all good luck for Hedberg. She sold Ikigai for just \$40,000 as a short yearling at the 2006 Keeneland January Sale, nine months before he re-sold to Dapple Bloodstock for \$400,000 at September (Ikigai later went for \$470,000 as a juvenile). Bonifacio sold for \$40,000 as a KEESEP yearling, and Kantharos was an \$80,000 KEESEP yearling who would sell to Stonestreet for \$250,000 as a juvenile in training. Good results for Hedberg, but the sort that simply allow you to

keep your head above water. Additionally, Kantharos's premature injury prevented him from proving himself at the Grade I level, which could have added considerably to the mare's value.

Even this spring, things didn't go without a hitch for Hedberg and Contessa Halo. The mare was accepted to Any Given Saturday (Distorted Humor), but twice was unable to get to the stallion when ovulating. Eventually, she caught to Flower Alley (Distorted Humor) on a May 27 cover. In Hedberg's opinion, the later cover date was part of the reason she was led out of the ring unsold Tuesday.

"I was disappointed [with the price]," Hedberg freely admits. "I thought she'd be one of those one-time, set-me-free kind of mares. It costs so much money to run the farm.

"But she was free, and you can't turn \$260,000 down. I can't, at least. She had a March foal, and sold on a late May cover--and I think that hurt me the most."

Still, Hedberg knows the transaction was nothing to scoff at, and said Kantharos's run this summer was particularly exciting. "I'm so humbled by the experience," she said. "This summer was such a ride. I had fan mail from California, writing about Kantharos the Great! Also, I'm so pleased Mr. Jackson left the name. He was named after an Etruscan wine vessel. My mother's an Etruscan archeologist. They say that Dionysus, the wine god, drank out of a kantharos and it never emptied."

Lena Hedberg was back at it yesterday, shopping for her next bargain mare that might hit big. Stymied on one mare late in the morning, she was soon scouring the catalogue once again, aiming to fill a client's order. In the meantime, she talked about the importance of small breeders.

"It's the smaller people that make the business, and that's important," she said from the rear walking ring. "We have to make difficult decisions all the time. Do I feed the horse, do I pay the bank? I hope the industry keeps us in mind."

On Monday, Hedberg continues selling at November when [hip 2811](#), a weanling colt by Silver Train, goes under the hammer. Another from Indian Creek's draft, the colt is a half-brother to SW & GSP Potomac Bend (Polish Numbers) and hails from the family of Hookedonthefeelin (Citidancer) and her daughter Pussy-cat Doll (Real Quiet).

"He's a nice colt--he's out of a multiple stakes producing mare," said Hedberg. "He's very muscular. He's more like a Quarter Horse than a Thoroughbred, and the pedigree screams speed."

If Hedberg's recent success is anything to go by, shoppers would do well to stop by and take a look. After all, said Hedberg, "We sell dreams here, don't we?" -LM

Foals Carry the Day at Keeneland Thursday...

Keeneland's fourth session yesterday was highlighted by the strong sale of weanlings, with six of the top 10 prices coming for foals.

"The foals sold exceptionally well today," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "We're in that part of the sale where those well-conformed, good-looking foals are really outshining themselves."

As the sale progresses, buyers are more stringent in their requirements for mares, according to Russell. "Once you get through Books 1 and 2, people are very selective on their mares at the moment," he said. "The stallions that the mares are covered by start to drop off, so they're going to need a major update to really help those along. With foals, there is always the hope that some will pop up, and they are athletic enough that the buyers are quite happy to take a shot at them."

For Thursday's session, 263 horses grossed \$16,808,900. The average declined 23.55 percent to \$63,912, while the median fell 25 percent to \$45,000. Cumulatively, Keeneland has sold 843 horses for a total of \$108,403,000. The average, \$128,592, is off 14.44 percent from 2009 and the median is down 18.95 percent to \$77,000. The buy-back rate, which has been noticeably low all week, inched higher during yesterday's session, ending up at 25.50 percent. The four-day buy-back rate is 22.52 percent.

"The buy-back rate was a little higher, but it was still at a manageable level," Russell commented. Session figures continued to be skewed by last year's Overbrook dispersal, which was responsible for \$3.278 million and 32 horses during 2009's fourth session. "Overbrook still had an effect on the figures, and would have also had an effect on the RNA rate," he added.

The Keeneland November sale continues today at 10 a.m. -JM

TREAT GENTLY PREPS FOR HOLLY TURF CUP

She took on the boys in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic at the Hollywood Turf Cup trip of 1 1/2 miles Oct. 2 and finished fourth, beaten 2 3/4 lengths by Winchester (Theatrical {Ire}). "She likes the longer distances," Willaford said, adding, "We'd like to get her covered up, or she can be a little bit keen."

Pat Valenzuela has the mount Saturday.

Two other Turf Cup candidates were on the work tab Thursday, with both GII Del Mar H. runner-up **Buenos Dias (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre), trained by Ron McAnally, and Del Mar H. third **Worth Repeating** (Giant's Causeway), from the Richard Mandella barn, going three-eighths in :38.40 on the Hollywood main track.

MOTION TO TRAIN ALL TEAM VALOR TEAM; IRWIN'S STRING TO FAIR HILL Effective immediately, Graham Motion will train all of Team Valor International's horses based in North America. Barry Irwin's far-flung stable will be housed under one roof in a 40-stall barn that Team Valor is buying at Fair Hill Training Center near Elkton, Maryland. Team Valor and Motion came to a mutual agreement last week prior to the Breeders' Cup, in which Motion saddled the winner of the GI BC Filly & Mare Turf in Shared Account (Pleasantly Perfect). Team Valor also owns GI BC Juvenile Turf winner Pluck (More Than Ready). Motion will continue to operate his public stable out of his current barn at Fair Hill, but he will be the only trainer Team Valor will employ. "It's a good opportunity for us," said Motion. "Team Valor has some very nice horses." Pluck arrives at Fair Hill later in the week and is under serious consideration for the Irish 2000 Guineas next spring. "I remember when Fourstars Allstar was trained on the East Coast and was sent over to win the Irish 2000 Guineas," said Irwin. "I always had in mind to try to duplicate that feat if we ever came up with a proper candidate. I think Pluck could be that horse. I mentioned this to Graham, and he shares my enthusiasm for the project." A longtime advocate of European training methods, Irwin said that the main reasons for making the move from various racetracks to one training center are that the opportunity to have one set of eyes on all of his horses on a daily basis appealed to him, and the chance to have Motion train the string was exhilarating. This season Motion has trained South African import Gypsy's Warning to win the GIII Eatontown S. at Monmouth and place in the GI Yellow Ribbon S. and GI Beverly D. S., as well as German import Daveron, who took the Scoot S. at Belmont Park. "I will miss our current trainers," Irwin said. "I have the highest admiration for them, and they have done a super job for the stable. But at this stage of our stable's development, we think we can have a more cohesive business and training environment with all of our horses in one place."

Change to FTBOA Breeders' Awards Program:

(Edited Press Release) The Board of Directors of the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association announced Tuesday a change in the manner in which Breeders' Awards will be paid in 2011. Subject to the terms of the FTBOA's annual awards plan, which must be filed with and approved by the state, the FTBOA board voted unanimously to pay a Breeders' Award to the breeder of a Florida-bred lawfully registered with the FTBOA that finishes in first, second or third place in a race at a Florida Thoroughbred track as follows:

- First place: Ten percent of the announced gross purse, less any Florida Owners' Awards included therein, with each such Breeders' Award limited to no more than \$10,000.
- Second place: Three percent of the announced gross purse, less any Florida Owners' Awards included therein, with each such Breeders' Award limited to no more than \$3,000.
- Third place: Two percent of the announced gross purse, less any Florida Owners' Awards included therein, with each such Breeders' Award limited to no more than \$1,500.

The FTBOA's annual awards plan for 2011 will be submitted to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation's pari-mutuel division in the coming week. "This is another component of our economic stimulus plan being implemented," said FTBOA President Fred Brei. "We appreciate all the input we received from Florida's breeders on this important decision for our industry." In addition to paying three places for Florida races, FTBOA officials anticipate being able to pay out-of-state Breeders' Awards for Florida-breds that win Sunshine Millions races in California for 2010 and 2011.

Virginia Bettor Wins BC Betting Challenge:

Robert Hansan of Reston, Virginia, defeated a field of 95 of the nation's best handicappers and collected a total of \$181,863 in winning the Breeders' Cup Betting Challenge held over the two championship days last Friday and Saturday at Churchill Downs. Hansan won the first prize money of \$137,000 and added \$44,863 in winnings. Players were required to buy-in for \$10,000, of which \$7,500 was the bankroll for the two days. Hansan entered the Breeders' Cup Classic with a remaining bankroll of \$7,263 and went "all-in" on Blame, netting him \$44,863 in winnings, good enough for the title. "It was quite thrilling to be part of this and I'm ecstatic about winning the event, which has become the most prestigious live money tournament in the country," said Hansan. "It's wonderful to be able to take in the atmosphere surrounding the Breeders' Cup and witness the Championships in person."
