Earlier in the day, BBA Ireland paid €200,000 paid by BBA Ireland for hip 551, a daughter of Galileo whose dam was also a high-class performer. From Owenstown Stud, the February foal is the initial produce of the dual Group 3 hero Cheyenne Star (Ire) (Mujahid). "The sire is capable of anything and given that she's by Galileo out of a very good mare, I thought that she was quite good value," said buyer Adrian Nicoll. "She's been bought for a long-established client. She could be kept to race, or she could also be reoffered." Finishing off the Galileo trio of high-profile purchases was Springfort Park Stud's hip 641, a half-sister to the top-class sprinter Kingsgate Native (Ire) (Mujadil) knocked down to M.V. Magnier for €180,000.

Shadwell Duo Make Waves...

Two of Shadwell's residents, Nayef and his son Tamayuz (GB), also made headlines. The former was responsible for a notably bred colt from the draft of Jockey Hall Stud offered on behalf of Tullpark Ltd, who sold to John Ferguson for €240,000. Hip 666 is a half-brother to the operation's Bethrah (Ire) (Marju {Ire}), who captured this year's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and whose dam is a full-sibling of the accomplished

Highest Honor (Fr) duo of Numide (Fr) and Reve d'Oscar (Fr). The colt received another significant update last month when the latter's son Reve d'Essor (Jpn) (Agnes Tachyon {Jpn}) annexed the G2 Daily Hai Nisai S. Tamayuz was at the fore Wednesday, and another member of his first crop kept the ball rolling when Airlie Stud's daughter of the 2004 G1 Moyglare Stud S. heroine Chelsea Rose (Ire) (Desert King {Ire}) sold to Shadwell for €220,000. "She is by a dual Group 1 winner out of a Group 1 winner," explained Stephen Collins. "You can't ask for any more, and she was a standout."

They were Abbeville & Meadow Court Studs' hip [501](#), the half-brother to this term's G2 Norfolk S. and G2 Gimcrack S. hero Approve (Ire)

(Oasis Dream {GB}), who takes up stud duties at Morristown Lattin Stud in 2011. Having paid €190,000 for that May foal, Ferguson was on hand to secure Rockfield Farm's full-brother to this season's Listed Rose Bowl S.

Clodagh McStay paid €160,000 for Newtown Stud's [hip 619](#), an Invincible Spirit colt from the extended family of Lahib, while BBA Ireland purchased [hip 584](#) for €120,000. She is a daughter of the 2000 G3 Prix d'Aumale scorer Green Minstrel (Fr) (Green Tune) from the draft of Rings View Stud.

Bring In the Newbloods...

Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) and Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) have their first foals at auction at present, and Timmy Hyde's Camas Park Stud paid €215,000 for a son of the former consigned by Al-Eile Stud as hip 540. His dam is 2004 G2 Park Hill S. third-place finisher Bowstring (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) from the family of the 1984 Irish Oaks heroine Princess Pati (Ire). "He's a very good-looking colt by a great racehorse," Hyde said. "He'll be back for sale next year." Owner Norman Steel won the bidding war at €90,000 for [hip 631](#), a son of Raven's Pass and MGSW Miss Sally (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}) offered by Cloneymore Farm. Authorized (Ire), whose oldest are yearlings, was responsible for a half-brother to one of the most exciting Classic prospects for 2011 in the unbeaten colt Dubai Prince (Ire) (Shamardal), who switches to Godolphin after an impressive win for the Dermot Weld yard in the G3 Killavullan S. From the Castlebridge Consignment, [hip 564](#) that includes another Maktoum flagbearer in Storming Home (GB), and he was another to be added to Ferguson's roster after the agent met no further resistance when the bidding hit the €150,000 mark. Ferguson said, "Dubai Prince is a very exciting horse to look forward to, and we're delighted with how Authorized's first crop are shaping up."

That colt, now known as Approve (GB), had a remarkable freshman campaign in 2010, with wins in the G2 Norfolk S. and G2 Gimcrack S. and was third in the G1 Middle Park S. Those exploits made this half-sibling that much more desirable.

William Kennedy's Tullpark Ltd. paid 135,000gns for the well-related Reve d'Iman (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}), in foal to Marju (Ire), at Tattersalls December in 2006. The first foal produced for Tullmark was a filly that failed to meet its reserve and was bought in for 34,000gns at Tattersalls in 2008. Led back through this ring nine months later, she realized €160,000, and, campaigned by Shadwell as Bethrah (Ire), took down this year's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas. It won't be Sheikh Hamdan, but rather Sheikh Mohammed to campaign this half-brother, who helped add to the Tullpark bottom line.

LASER TARGET ON JACKPOT

WinStar homebred **Blue Laser** (Bluegrass Cat) was tabbed for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile after capturing Woodbine's Gill Grey S. Oct. 10, but his connections opted to skip the Churchill event in favor of this \$1-million contest. "There were a few reasons," trainer Mark Casse explained to *Daily Racing Form*. "I would say one, we thought he would enjoy a little more time. You have to remember he's only run on Polytrack. He's stayed at Churchill, and it's given us a chance to have three or four breezes over the dirt track. We would have been going into the Breeders' Cup

with only one dirt work. Now, we have three or four." Casse added, "We also looked at the race, both [racing manager] Elliott Walden and I, and we have a lot of respect for Uncle Mo." The chestnut colt is the 3-1 favorite on the morning line for the Jackpot. Shaun Bridgmohan will be in the irons. WinStar won last year's Jackpot with Rule (Roman Ruler).



Kyoto, and was subsequently crowned champion three-year-old filly at the prestigious Cartier Awards. "Snow Fairy only lost three kilos during the race, but she lost a bit more weight on the trip from Kyoto to Tokyo," explained Dunlop. "Although it

was nothing dramatic, it makes sense to give the Japan Cup a miss and wait for Sha Tin, when she will go for either the [2400-meter G1 Hong Kong] Vase or the [2000-meter G1 Hong Kong] Cup. We will assess the likely opposition and decide which race she runs in closer to the time, but she will leave for Hong Kong next week. The Japanese were very hospitable, and maybe we could have a look at the Japan Cup next year, but Snow Fairy is a star and has now proved herself on the international stage."

Easy Winter for 'Memories'...

Winter Memories (El Prado {Ire}), runner-up as the favorite in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf, will take it easy for the next few months. "She's a little body sore, but she's here and doing fine," said trainer Jimmy Toner. "We are going to give her a little break, and then take her down to Florida to enjoy the sunshine and get her ready for Keeneland in the spring." A homebred for the Phillips Racing Partnership, the grey daughter of MGISW Memories of Silver (Silver Hawk) went into the Breeders' Cup off an impressive win in the GIII Miss Grillo S. at Belmont Oct. 3.

Freshman sire Bernardini is off to a fine start at stud. The champion son of A.P. Indy can boast of A Z Warrior and Biondetti, who collected Grade/Group 1s on their respective sides of the Atlantic Oct. 9, as well as the group/graded winners To Honor And Serve and Theyskens' Theory. It wouldn't be a surprise if Buffum soon joined his list of black-type winners. The second-highest-priced yearling from Bernardini's first crop on the strength of John Ferguson's \$1.2-million offer, Buffum debuted at 8-1 odds in a one-mile Belmont maiden special weight Oct. 30. The treats came a day early for his connections and backers, as the Darley colorbearer chased just behind the front rank early, moved three wide heading into the turn, struck the front under a hand ride in upper stretch and gamely held safe the on-rushing Cool Blue Red Hot (Harlan's Holiday) to win by a nose ([video](#)). It was 7 3/4 lengths back to third. Trainer Tom Albertrani, who also conditioned Bernardini for Darley, said he wasn't surprised by the big first-out effort. **Cont. p10**

"He always showed us a lot of talent in mornings, so we expected a big race from him," said Albertrani. "The horse that ran second was well-regarded--I know Angel Penna Jr. thinks a lot of him. I don't know the competition was, but on his numbers [he earned a 96 Beyer], he looked very good. He was green at points, and I think that race will really move him up." Buffum will likely need to, as Albertrani said the bay is now on course for the GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct Nov. 27, where he's expected to meet another son of Bernardini, the Bill Mott-trained GII Nashua S. hero To Honor And Serve. Albertrani said he's not scared to take a shot at that horse. "At this point in the year, there aren't too many allowance races at this level, and this will give us a good reading on him. He'll have to move up from his initial outing. Mott's horse is obviously the main danger, especially with three races under his belt. It's a big step up for [Buffum], but it will tell us what the future brings. Maybe we'll give him some time off. But if he hits the frame, we'll know he's a good horse." Asked to compare Buffum and his sire, Albertrani explained, "Size-wise, Buffum is smaller--he's probably a hand smaller," said the trainer. "He's not as leggy, but he's well balanced and well put together. Like Bernardini, he's very athletic. It looks like he's got a bright future--we'll just have to see how he steps up." Buffum's pedigree is steeped in championship form. His dam, the stakes-winning Storm Beauty, is a half-sister to the champion Gold Beauty (Mr. Prospector), who in turn is the dam of sprint champ Dayjur (Danzig) and granddam of Sky Beauty (Blushing Groom {Fr}). Buffum is a half-brother to SW & MGSP Stormy West (Gone West) and a three-parts sibling to GSP Renaissance Lady (A.P. Indy). Lifetime Record: 1-1-0-0, \$37,200. The horse that fell a nose short to Buffum in his debut was the Angel Penna, Jr.-trained Cool Blue Red Hot, who was himself making his first start. Shift a decimal point to the left of Buffum's price and you have Cool Blue Red Hot's. Knocked down to Tim Kegel at the Fasig-Tipton July, Cool Blue Red Hot is a half-sibling to the good performer Decelerator (Dehere), winner of last year's GIII Debutante S. at Churchill Downs and recently second in this season's GII Raven Run S. at Keeneland as a three-year-old. Cool Blue Red Hot was working well in advance of his unveiling, firing three straight bullets at Belmont, but was an overlooked 11-1 shot at the windows. “Angel was playing it very close to vest,” Bakke said yesterday. “He said he was a nice horse, and he had some great morning works. You could tell he was enthused. But that was about it. So it was a little bit of a surprise when he ran that big, even though he didn’t win. I think he got an 8 3/4 Ragozin figure. He’s not a very big horse-- Angel described his as lightly built--but he can run.” While Penna didn’t want to talk up the horse, Frances Robinson, who broke Cool Blue Red Hot and gave him his early lessons on her farm in Florida, was always full of praise. “Ever since she got him, she loved the horse,” said Bakke. “She told me this spring that he was a special horse. Sometimes you have to take stuff like that with a grain of salt, but she was spot on.” Cool Blue Red Hot is currently in Florida with Penna’s string at Palm Meadows, and Bakke said a return to maiden special weight company at either Calder or Gulfstream was in the cards. Bakke (pronounced Bach-ee) is the president and CEO of Sub-Zero and Wolf. The former makes high-end refrigeration appliances (Cool Blue), while the latter, a corporate companion, makes ranges, cooktops and grills (Red Hot). Bakke’s father Westye F. Bakke founded Sub-Zero in 1945. Last year, Jim Bakke was inducted into the Kitchen and Bath Industry Hall of Fame ([video](#)). Bakke has owned horses for about 15 years. His best runner to date is the tough millionaire Champali (Glitterman), whom he co-owned. Champali won Churchill’s GIII Iroquois S. at two and added three more graded stakes victories in his career. Gerry Isbister, a longtime friend, is a Sub-Zero distributor in Western Canada. The men made it an annual tradition to attend the Kentucky Derby, and about seven or eight years ago, decided to go in on some horses together. “We usually buy three or four a year,” said Bakke. “Gerry is actually a horseman--he has horses at his place and knows more about them than I do--I just brought him into racing.” Isbister’s son, Brad Isbister, is a former player in the National Hockey League who now coaches. Not surprisingly, Bakke and Isbister have received some lucrative offers for Cool Blue Red Hot, but Bakke says the horse isn’t for sale. “We’re definitely keeping him,” Bakke said. “This is what you get into the sport for. We’ll just see where he takes us and have fun.” Lifetime Record: 1-0-1-0, \$12,400.

"Justenuffhumor won two graded stakes at Saratoga, earning triple-digit Beyers in both races, and was third in the Breeders' Cup Mile to Goldikova, also earning a triple-digit Beyer," added Vinery New York's Jamie LaMonica. "He has a tremendous family and showed tremendous talent on the racetrack, and will provide New York breeders with a much sought-after sire line. He is an outstanding physical specimen, and we look forward to breeders coming to see him."
