'SPECIAL' RACE FOR JUDDMONTE TEAM

Bobby Frankel, who passed away just over a year ago, saddled a remarkable five GI Matriarch S. winners for Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte operation. That doesn't include last season's heroine Ventura (Chester House), the Juddmonte homebred who ran for longtime Frankel assistant Humberto Ascanio after previously winning three Grade 1s for the Hall of Famer. Juddmonte's back looking for a seventh victory in today's renewal, and while three-year-old **Special Duty (GB)** (Hennessy) was never under Frankel's direction, it would undoubtedly be sentimental for the Juddmonte team to take a race so synonymous with their shared success. Special Duty brings strong credentials care of the Criquelette Head-Maarek barn. The chestnut crossed the line second in both the May 2 G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket and May 16 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp, but benefitted from stewards' reversal to collect both of those mile Classics. The wheels came off in the G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket July, when she trailed home seventh by over 20 lengths, but she ran a fine race when sixth in the G1 Prix de la Foret over Arc weekend Oct. 3. Sixth might not sound overly impressive, until you realize the likes of Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa), Paco Boy (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) and Dick Turpin (Ire) (Arakan) led the way. **Cont. p4**

CLARK COULD BE A SPRINGBOARD

There aren't many household names in today's GI Clark H. at Churchill Downs, but Blame (Arch) was barely on the radar last year when he got a neck in front of Misremembered (Candy Ride {Arg}) at 9-2

odds. The obvious parallel here is **Apert** (Flatter), a homebred for Adele Dilschneider, who also co-owns Blame. Al Stall Jr. has called the shots for both horses, and as he did with this year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero, took his time with the progressive Apert. The three-year-old didn't make his first black-type

appearance until the Prelude S. at Louisiana Aug. 28, which he won by 1 1/2 lengths. Stepped up in the GII Super Derby--a race in which Blame finished second the year before--Apert got up for a comfortable victory, then added a second graded win with a grinding win over **Demarcation** (Gulch) in the GIII Ack Ack H. Nov. 5. "It'd be kind of silly to think you could have the whole plan come together again the way we did with Blame," Stall admitted to *Daily Racing Form*. "But this horse has earned his shot." **Cont. 4**

DUNDALK DUST DASHES TO FALLS CITY SCORE

Dundalk Dust (Military), the lone sophomore in Churchill's GII Falls City H., went from last to first in the Thanksgiving Day slop to secure her first graded stakes success. "I was a little concerned with her in the first turn, because she dropped back and I thought she wasn't handling the track, but you could see in the far turn she gathered momentum, and I felt really good from that point on," explained winning trainer Chris Block. "I felt like this filly would run real good until the rain came through, but she handles every surface we've given her." The Illinois-bred looked a bit uncomfortable while cabooing the field in the early stages, while **High Quail** (Tiznow) splashed along merrily on the front end through splits of :25.17, :49.38 and 1:13.89. Dundalk Dust began to rev her engine on the far turn, and rallied determinedly through the lane to notch her fifth win in seven starts. High Quail stayed on for second. Favored **Distinctive Dixie** (Fusaichi Pegasus) was up close early, but faded late and wound up last in the six-horse field. **Cont. p2**

Dundalk Dust scored at first asking when unveiled in an open maiden on the Arlington sod in August 2009, but didn't face the starter again for another 10 months. After capturing an Illinois-bred allowance that was rained off the turf at Arlington June 6, the dark bay was a distant third on the main track in the Gill Arlington Oaks July 3, but was later placed second. She annexed another state-bred heat on the turf at Arlington 19 days later, only to run fourth in the

Gill Pucker Up S. over the same course Sept. 6. In her first attempt on conventional dirt, Dundalk Dust overcame trouble to secure the Illini Princess H. at Hawthorne Oct. 30, and overcame these sloppy conditions to make it a holiday to remember for her connections. "She's a neat filly to ride," said winning jockey Shaun Bridgmohan. "She's got a big stride to her, and at about the half-mile pole she switched leads and jumped in the bridle a little bit. All I had to do was pick her a spot and, once I did, she accelerated nicely."

Endless Circle, claimed by his current connections for just \$14,000 in April, earned the first graded stakes victory of his career here. The race was marred by the fall of Go Go Shoot (Songandaprayer) in upper stretch, though the horse and his rider, John Velazquez, appeared uninjured. Haltered by trainer Rudy Rodriguez from conditioner David Jacobson and owner Western Resources Racing out of a winning effort, Endless Circle was bumped up in class and won a state-bred optional claimer in June, then made it two straight in an open optional claimer at Belmont in mid-June. He finished second by 3/4 of a length in a similar test up at Saratoga July 26, then wheeled back to win the restricted John Morrissey S. in the slop Aug. 5. He made it two straight black-type wins off the two-month respite in the Easy N' Dirty S. for Empire-breds at Belmont Oct. 6, but failed as the chalk in the restricted Hudson S. Oct. 23, running sixth. Jockey Edgar Prado kept him well off this hot early pace as Wildcat Frankie tore through :21.80 and :44.80 splits. The pair tipped widest coming into the stretch and it was four across the track when Go Go Shoot took a bad step, stumbled and went down, throwing Velazquez to the track. Endless Circle kept on coming on the outside and won easily. "He came out of the Hudson with a little infection," said Rudy Rodriguez, who was saddling his first graded winner. "We got that cleared up, and today he showed up. He's a horse who's been very good to us."

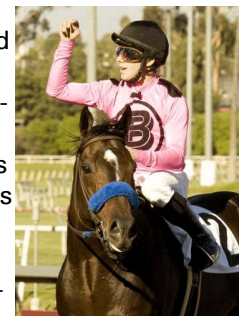

Cost of Freedom, hero of the 2008 GI Ancient Title S. and third by a head in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, was unplaced in his first three appearances in 2010, but shook off the rust in his latest, romping by 6 1/4 lengths in the Cal Cup Sprint Oct. 30 over this track and trip. Despite being last out of the gate here, the classy seven-year-old cruised up to hold the advantage through a :21.95 first quarter, and began to open daylight after a half in :44.19. Gato Go Win cut into his sizeable lead in the lane, but Cost of Freedom kept striding along to record his 10th victory in 20 starts. "He's always run well here," said winning trainer John Sadler. "What's nice is that we've had him long enough that he feels like family, so it's a good time to win on Thanksgiving." Jockey Joe Talamo added, "He always kind of breaks a step slow, but he's so classy he gathers himself right back up, and you just have to steer him in the right direction."

Another up-and-comer who could figure in next year's handicap division is **Successful Dan**. Owned and bred by Mort Fink and trained by Charles Lopresti, the half-brother to GSW Wise Dan (Wiseman's Ferry) enters the race a winner of five seven starts. He dominated a Keeneland optional claimer by seven lengths Oct. 9, then returned three weeks later to win the nine-furlong GII Fayette S. at Keeneland Oct. 30 in a sharp 1:47 flat. **Redding Colliery** has quietly turned into a very good handicapper. He established a new course record winning Laurel's nine-furlong John B. Campbell H. in February, aired by nearly seven lengths in the GIII Lone Star Park H. in May and comes into this off a gate-to-wire score in the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. Oct. 2, for which he was awarded a big 111 BRIS figure.

One filly or mare in this field will record her first North American Grade I victory, but that isn't a slight on the talent assembled. Along with dual European Classic heroine **Special Duty**, **Gypsy's Warning** brings solid international form. The five-year-old granddaughter of Storm Cat won the G1 South African Fillies' Classic last year in her native country, then opened her U.S. account with a nose victory in the GIII Eatontown S. at Monmouth in late May. She came close in Arlington Park's GI Beverly D. S. two starts later Aug. 21, rallying for third beaten 1 3/4 lengths, then was a good third once again in the 1 1/4-mile GI Yellow Ribbon S. at Hollywood Oct. 2. The big question here is the whether the mile distance will be too short. **Wasted Tears** took her seventh straight race in the GII John C. Mabee S. at Del Mar Aug. 15, but saw her skein snapped when swallowed up late in the GI First Lady S. at Keeneland Oct. 9, finishing fifth by 1 1/4 lengths. **Cont. p5**

In addition to Ventura's career finale tally in the 2009 Matriarach, Juddmonte's other Matriarch wins camewith Wandesta (GB) (Nashwan) ('96), Ryafan (Lear Fan) ('97), Heat Haze (GB) (Green Desert) ('03), Intercontinental (GB) (Danehill ('04) and Price Tag (GB) (Dansili {GB}) ('06). Frankel won a record eight Matriarchs altogether. His other trophies in the race came courtesy of Precious Kitten (Catienus) in 2007, Starine (Fr) (Mendocino) in 2001, and Happyanunoi (NZ) (Yachtie {Aus}) in 1999.

Sara Louise aims to repeat here in just her third start of the season. The Godolphin colorbearer, winner of the GIII Pocohantas S. over Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) as a juvenile, came back to win the GIII Victory Ride S. at Saratoga in her three-year-old bow in August of 2009. She was beaten just a head by Indian Blessing (Indian Charlie) in the GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont, then ran a solid fourth to Informed Decision (Monarchos) in the GI BC F/M Sprint at Santa Anita. She returned to New York to annex the Top Flight, but went missing for 10 months before making it back to the races. She finished third to upsetter My Jen (Fusaichi Pegasus) in her Gallant Bloom defense Sept. 25, then, after a flat-footed start, put in a mild rally in the F/M Sprint to be sixth. "She walked out of the gate in the Breeders' Cup, and that certainly didn't help," said Rick Mettee, who overseas Godolphin's New York string for trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "She made a good mid-race move and, not surprisingly, got pretty tired. All in all, it was pretty disappointing, but it was a 13-horse field, and she broke five lengths behind everybody. We're just going to draw a line through it. This is a smaller field, so by default she should get a better trip." Another daughter of Malibu Moon, **Funny Moon**, rates a chance. The winner of last year's GI CCA Oaks and this term's GII Shuvee H. at Belmont just missed by a nose to **Our Khrysty** in the GIII Turnback the Alarm H. at Belmont Oct. 30.

Snow may have fallen in Newmarket yesterday, but trade heated up last night as the better youngsters appeared at the Tattersalls December Foal Sale, with

three offerings making six figures. Shropshire-based Mill House Stud was responsible for the 140,000gns topper, hip 787, a Pivotal (GB) filly out of a half-sister to G1 Irish 1000 Guineas runner-up Penkenna Princess (Ire) (Pivotal). Chris Richardson, managing director of Cheveley Park Stud, signalled the successful bid, with pinhooker Willie

Browne coming off second best.

"She's obviously to race, and she was a foal share in which we bought out our partner," Richardson explained. "She was a very nice filly, and we're pleased to support Pivotal. We also have this filly's yearling half-sister in training with William Haggas, and she has just been broken."

Agent Gill Richardson, on behalf of owners Jon and Julia Aisbitt, denied John Ferguson with successful 120,000gns bid for hip 784, a Cape Cross (Ire) colt. Consigned by Trickle-down Stud for breeders Ashley House Stud, the youngster is a half-brother to G2 Royal Lodge Stakes third Treasure Beach (GB) (Galileo {Ire}).

"He'll be going to Lavington Stud in Sussex and then eventually into training with Mick Channon," said Jon Aisbitt. "We started buying foals to race because of the numbers of times we'd failed to buy specific yearlings we'd targeted with Mick and Gill." Richardson added, "He was just a horse that really had it. He was really racy and was a lovely-moving colt."

The Maktoum family's buying was led by hip 794, a filly from the first crop of Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef). She is a sibling to a quartet of black-type performers bred and sold by John Fagan's Deerpark Stud. Shadwell's Angus Gold fought off David Redvers, accompanied by Pearl Bloodstock's Sheikh Fahad Al-Thani, for the March-born miss.

Hip 767, a Halling half-sister to the dam of dual Californian Grade II winner Whatsthescript (Ire) (Royal Applause {GB}) was another in demand, selling for 90,000gns as a long-term racing and breeding prospect. BBA Ireland's Eamonn Reilly fought off agent Steve Hillen and then Richard Frisby to get the filly, bred by Tinnakill Bloodstock and Alan Byrne, and offered by the Castlebridge Consignment. **Cont. p7**

"She has been bought for Colin and Melba Bryce of Laundry Cottage Stud, who bred top two-year-old Wootton Bassett (GB) (Ifraaj {GB}), and I loved the individual and pedigree," said Reilly.

Earlier in the day, David Redvers shelled out 90,000gns for hip 582, a Pivotal (GB) filly out of SW Cartimandua (GB) (Medicean {GB}). She was offered by Throckmorton Court Stud for joint-breeder Fiona Williams.

"She's been bought for a pinhooking syndicate run by our Tweenhills Stud and Rathmore Stud, and was a very good example of the sire," Redvers offered. "Hopefully, she's an exciting filly for next year. I thought the market had been very strong for moderately bred horses, and I'd rather have her for 90,000gns than some of the horses without pedigree making 40,000gns or so."

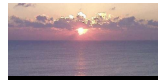
