speed right to the winner's circle--while Grade I winner **Evening Jewel** (Northern Afleet) tossed in a rare poor effort. "She ended up having a great trip," said winning trainer Marty Jones.

"She got a nice, easy lead like

she likes and did her thing. She's a special horse. She did break a little bit slow. She's not real, real quick the first eighth of a mile, but once she gets out of there and she gets going, she's something special. Hopefully, she'll come out of the race good. We'll play [her next start] by ear." Evening Jewel, off at 3-1, never got going and came home an even fifth.

CHANGING SKIES FROM THE CLOUDS

Swettenham Stud homebred **Changing Skies (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) was wisely reserved off sharp early fractions in Sunday's GIII La Prevoyante H. at Calder before unleashing a big stretch kick to win the 1 1/2-mile grass test by a commanding 3 3/4-length margin. The six-year-old mare, the crowd's 6-5 pick, sat eighth of 10 under Kent

Desormeaux as the 8-1 third choice **Speak Easy Gal** (West Acre) laid down fractions of :23 2/5, :47 4/5 and 1:12 4/5, relatively quick splits for the distance and over ground labeled 'good.' The closers began to bunch up nearing the quarter pole as the 8-5 second choice **Casablanca Smile (Brz)**

(Ocean Terrace) rallied to a narrow lead, but Changing Skies, circling the field with a powerful move, was going best of all and leveled out nicely in the lane to win her second Grade III event in style. Casablanca Smile proved second best. "I let my mare settle back and she responded exactly the way I needed her to," said Desormeaux. "She put us in the race when I asked her, and then I just took a clear outside path, and she showed them who was the best in the stretch." Cont. p3

Lots of Zip...

Unzip Me began a five-race winning skein in December of 2009 that culminated with wins in the GIII Las Cinegas S. on Santa Anita's downhill course in April and the Great Lady M. S. at Hollywood in May. She saw the streak snapped when facing males in the Robert K. Kerlan Memorial H. at Hollywood in June, where she was a close-up third. She shipped to Woodbine and got back on track in the GIII Royal North S. Aug. 2, winning by two lengths, and took the GIII Senator Ken Maddy H. at the Oak Tree meeting Sept. 30. Rightly given another shot against males in the GII Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint Nov. 6, she found herself off the pace for a change, but came on nicely and filled the show spot behind Chamberlain Bridge (War Chant).

Despite the presence of Evening Jewel, herself coming off a third-place effort in a Breeders' Cup race--the GI Filly & Mare Sprint--the public had it nailed yesterday as they sent off Unzip Me as the red-hot 3-5 choice in the Monrovia. They had to be encouraged when the chestnut was allowed sensible :22 1/5 and :44 4/5 splits.

After crossing over the main track, Unzip Me was flanked by Broken Dreams and Reba Is Tops, both of whom loomed prominently, but she left that pair to fight it out for place honors as she strode home a comfortable winner. Broken Dreams filled the exacta. It was Unzip Me's fourth win in five starts over Santa Anita's downhill turf course, and marked the second consecutive win for jockey Rafael Bejarano in the race. He won aboard the ill-fated Tuscan Evening (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) last year. Bejarano said race tactics weren't set in stone until he saw the day's scratches. "After I saw the other speed horse [Candace Gold] scratch," he explained, "I decided to be on the lead. This is the first time she has run after the Breeders' Cup, so I just tried to get her to relax and stay comfortable. When I saw everybody getting close to me, I was just waiting for the top of the stretch to close the door. As soon as I got to the dirt, I let her go. She kept running and finished strong."

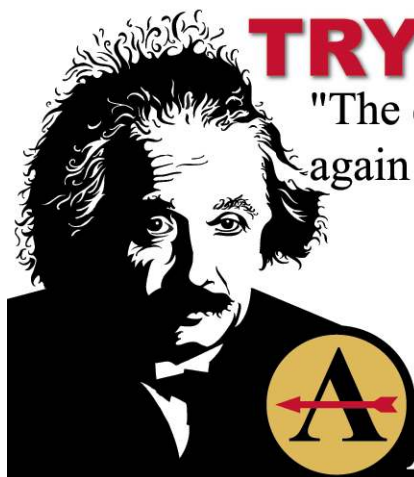

Changing Skies kicked off her 2010 season with a victory in the GIII Very One S. at Gulfstream--her first stakes win--followed up with seconds in the GIII Bewitch S. at Keeneland in April and the GII New York S. in June, then added a second black-type win in the restricted Waya S. at Saratoga Aug. 9. The impeccably bred filly just missed by a head in what would have been an important score when second to Ave (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational at Belmont Oct. 2, then failed at 3-5 odds in the GIII Long Island H. at the Big A Nov. 13. After yesterday's win, trainer Bill Mott's assistant Ken McCarthy said, "I think her last race left Bill kind of scratching his head and couldn't give her an excuse, but they got her down to Payson Park after that, and obviously ran like she can today." Changing Skies is a full-sister to English champion Playful Act (Ire), who set a new record for a broodmare at auction when she sold to Sheikh Mohammed for \$10.5 million at the 2007 KEENOV Sale.

INVESTIGATIVE SURGERY FOR SHAMARDAL

Darley's leading sire **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway--Helsinki {GB}, by Machiavellian) is reported to be recovering well after surgery at the operation's Kelvinside Stud. Having suffered a fall in Australia, the nine-year-old sire of Lope de Vega (Ire) and Casamento (Ire) was taken to

Newmarket's Equine Hospital for further evaluation. Darley's Director of Stallions Sam Bullard told the *Racing Post*, "Shamardal slipped and fell in Australia, and when he returned, we decided to carry out some investigative surgery. All the breeders who have booked to him

have been made aware, but we are anticipating that he will have recovered well enough by the start of the season to be able to cover." The champion juvenile in Europe in 2004, Shamardal won the G1 Dewhurst S., G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, G1 Prix Jockey-Club and G1 St James's Palace S. He is due to stand the 2011 season at Kildangan Stud in Ireland at a fee of €50,000.

ILLINOIS STEWARDS RESTORE UPPERLINE'S GRADE III

Illinois stewards have restored **Upperline** (Maria's Mon) as the winner of the GIII Arlington Oaks at Arlington Park July 3 and rescinded a \$1,000 fine to trainer Michael Stidham after revisiting a medication violation issued against the filly's connections in August. Owned by Stone Farm, John Adger and Oakcrest Farm, Upperline finished 4 3/4 lengths to the good of Snow Top Mountain (Najran) in the Arlington Oaks, but was later disqualified and placed last when a post-race test revealed trace amounts of the non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug etodolac. Etodolac holds properties similar to ibuprofen. Stidham was one of three trainers cited for an etodolac violation at Arlington Park, which had begun targeting the drug. Nick Canani and Ingrid Mason were the other trainers cited. All three appealed. According to *Daily Racing Form*, Stidham's lawyer, the Louisville, Kentucky-based Joel Turner, discovered the rule that was applied to Upperline's case referenced an older Association of Racing Commissioners' International (ARCI) model that listed etodolac as a Class 4 medication, not the Class 3 designation stewards based their ruling on. On Friday, stewards revised their decision based on the Class 4 designation. The Illinois Racing Board has since made etodolac a Class 3 drug. Stewards also reduced Stidham's penalty to the 10-day suspension he served in December, down from the original suspension of 15 days.



TEMPLE CITY BRINGS PLENTY OF UPSIDE In a very difficult and testing atmosphere for the Thoroughbred industry, B. Wayne Hughes is looking out for the breeder. The owner of Spendthrift Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, will offer his ground-breaking "Share the Upside" program for the farm's newest addition, the homebred **Temple City** (Dynaformer--Curriculum, by Danzig). Produced by a half-sister to the wildly successful Spendthrift stallion Malibu Moon

(A.P. Indy), Temple City was victorious at distances ranging from 6 1/2 furlongs--in his career debut--up to 1 1/2 miles. The attractive dark bay had a breakout season in 2010, with a head defeat in the GII American H. on turf prior to a track record-setting performance in landing Del Mar's GIII Cougar II H. going 12 panels on the Polytrack. A Grade I victory narrowly eluded him in what would become the final start of his career when he was just touched off in the final jump of the Hollywood Turf Cup. "He has the good looks and conformation that breeders are really going to respond to," Spendthrift's Ken Wilkins commented. "He stands 16.3 and is a very handsome son of Dynaformer." The only son of his sire to hold a track record on the main track, Temple City will be offered at an introductory fee of \$5,000.

Get With the Program...

Hughes pioneered the "Share the Upside" program in the last few years, offering breeders an opportunity to earn a lifetime breeding right in selected stallions. Heretofore, in order to qualify for the lifetime breeding right, breeders would need to breed to the stallion two times on stands-and-nurses terms. Things will work a bit differently with Temple City. "He's coming in relatively late, so to give him a shot at this level, we will ask that the breeder breed one mare on stands-and-nurses terms, have the foal, pay the stud fee and then the lifetime breeding right is theirs," Wilkins explained. "When people stop in and see him, I think they'll respond and give him a chance. A number of people have already signed up sight-unseen."

ENGLEHART SADDLES 7TH STRAIGHT WINNER AT BIG A *Edited press release* Trainer Chris J. Englehart went two-for-two at Aqueduct Sunday afternoon, extending his winning streak to seven straight races and coming to within one of what is believed to be the modern-day record for consecutive wins by a trainer in New York. Englehart's streak began on Dec. 30, when he sent out Who's the Cowboy (Intensity) to win the first race, Smokin Artie's Gal (Smokin Mel) to take the second, and, after Cherokee Trick (Yonaguska) was scratched from the fifth race, completed the hat trick when Budge Man (Fusaichi Pegasus) won the seventh race at the Big A. On New Year's Eve, Englehart won Aqueduct's fourth race with his only starter, Iberian Gate (Chapel Royal), and kicked off 2011 by winning the fifth race with Run Warrior Run (Desert Warrior) on Saturday. Sunday, Englehart's hot streak continued when he won the fifth race with Isn't She Grand (Grand Reward) and the sixth with Furhlang (Langfuhr) for his seventh straight winner. With Aqueduct closed for live racing on Monday and Tuesday, the trainer will try to make it a record-tying eight-for-eight on Wednesday when he sends out Who's the Cowboy in race five. According to recent records, four modern-day trainers have saddled eight consecutive winners at New York Racing Association (NYRA) tracks: John Parisella in 1973; Angel Penna, Sr., who sent out eight straight at Belmont Park in 1982; Oscar Barrera, who went eight-for-eight from Apr. 15-21, 1983 at Belmont Park, and Edward I. Kelly, who accomplished the feat in October, 1983. More recently, trainer John Kimmel went seven-for-seven at Saratoga in 2008. Since the Aqueduct inner track meet began on Dec. 2, Englehart's horses are 9-0-2 from 11 starts, with earnings of \$144,600.

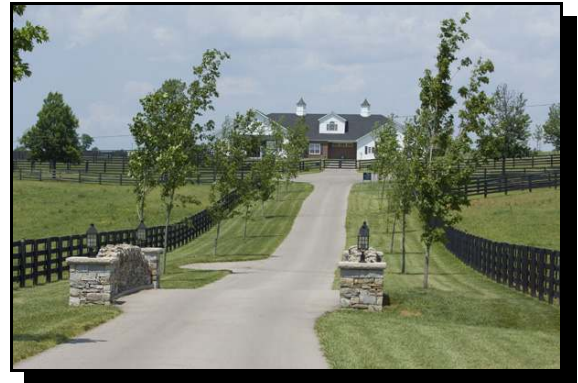

TWO-YEAR-OLD REVIEW

by Christa Riebel

Of the four group races for two-year-olds in Germany, Cologne's G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten over a mile carries the longest tradition, and this year's winner was Margot Herbert's colt **Silvaner (Ger)** (Lomitas {GB}). He is the first foal bred from the Monsun (Ger) mare Suisun (Ger), who is herself a close relative of the four-time Group 1-scoring Stacelita (Fr) (Monsun {Ger}).

While Silvaner was bred by Gestut Fahrhof, the G3 Preis der Winterkonigin victrix **Djumama (Ire)** (Aussie Rules) was bred in Ireland by Colin Kennedy. Owned by Stall Phillip, she is a first-crop daughter of Coolmore's top miler, out of an own sister to the 2000 G3 Greenham S. scorer and G1 2000 Guineas third Barathea Guest (GB) (Barathea {Ire}).

Christian Zschache is the owner and trainer of the impressive G3 Ratibor-Rennen scorer **Gereon (Ger)**, whose style of running very much resembles that of his sire Next Desert (Ire), the runaway winner of the G1 Deutsches Derby in 2002. Bred by Gestut Ebbesloh, Gereon is a son of the Surumu (Ger) mare Golden Time (Ger), whose previous progeny is headed by the 2008 G2 Oaks d'Italia winner Goose Bay (Ger) (Groom Dancer).

Salona (Ger) (Lord of England {Ger}) was the promoted winner of the G3 Maurice Lacroix Trophy, formerly known as the Zukunfts-Rennen at Baden-Baden, which helped her sire to become the leading first-season sire in Germany. She was bred by her owner Klaus Hoffman and is a daughter of the listed-placed Lomitas mare Selana (Ger), who traces back to the stakes-producing Mr. Busher mare Cold Morning as a granddaughter of the influential broodmare Miss Dogwood.

Lord of England is also the sire of the runaway Listed Oppenheim-Rennen winner **Acadius (Ger)**--who represents the same family as Urban Sea and her top-class sons Galileo (Ire) and Sea the Stars (Ire)--and the smart Hoppegarten maiden scorer **Theo Danon (Ger)**, who went on to be fifth in the Winterfavoriten.

Shirocco (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) has made an encouraging start to his stallion career, with his first stakes winner being the Listed Preis des Union-Gestut heroine **Jardina (Ger)**, a daughter of the listed-winning Platini (Ger) mare Juvena (Ger).

Baden-Baden's Listed Kronimus-Rennen is customarily a serious two-year-old event, and this year's winner was **Terra di Tuffi (GB)** (Pastoral Pursuits {GB}), out of the dual group-winning sprinter Daring Destiny (GB) (Daring March {GB}). The Azamour (Ire) colt **Lindenthaler (Ger)** looked something special when taking the Listed Junioren-Preis at Dusseldorf.

One who should not go unmentioned is the grey colt **Nice Danon (GB)** (Sakhee), who is a half-brother to the treble group-scoring Worldly (GB) (Selkirk) and 2008 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf hero Donativum (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}). He was demoted to the runner's-up spot behind Salona in the Maurice Lacroix Trophy and was second again in the Preis des Winterfavoriten.

Also worthy of note is the Preis der Winterkonigin runner-up **Aigrette Garzette (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre), who is a granddaughter of the 1992 G3 Prix de la Grotte winner Absurde (Fr) (Green Desert) and has Classic potential, along with the colt **Quinindo (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) out of the champion Quebrada (Ire) (Devil's Bag).
