

MOODY AT IT AGAIN AT MAGIC MILLIONS

Leading Melbourne conditioner Peter Moody raised the top price he set two days earlier when he went to A\$1.15m (US\$1.137m) to snag [lot 564](#) at Magic Millions Gold Coast Yearling Sale Friday. The Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) colt, offered by breeder Strawberry Hill Stud, is out of G1SW Sunday Joy (Aus) (Sunday Silence), making him a half to MG1SW More

"I've been able to buy the two nicest colts of the sale--so I'm very happy," said Moody, who took down a full-brother to successful sire Stratum (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) for A\$850,00 Wednesday. "I probably spent a fraction more than I wanted for them--but that's what you have to do to buy the nicest horses," he added.

Moody said that a group of stable owners would be involved in the ownership of the well-bred youngster. "He's a really lovely colt this bloke--he's got a top pedigree and I was impressed when I first saw him," Moody added. "He is a big, strong, running sort of horse and I would be surprised if he didn't run as a two-year-old."

A quartet of yearlings from A\$325,000 to A\$365,000 made up the second flight behind day three's main attraction.

Strong Day Three Brings Up Clearance Rate...

A solid day of selling Friday brought this renewal of the Gold Coast Yearling Sale's clearance rate to 80 percent so far. It was at 77.2 percent through Thursday and 78 percent last year.

"The strong selling continued in good style again today," said Magic Millions Managing Director Stephen Silk. "One of the most pleasing things is to see the overall clearance rate pass 80 percent--this is most pleasing for our vendors and also our buyers."

The sale gross has surpassed A\$52.5 million (US\$51.2m) with 420 yearlings selling for an average price of A\$125,000 (US\$123,800).

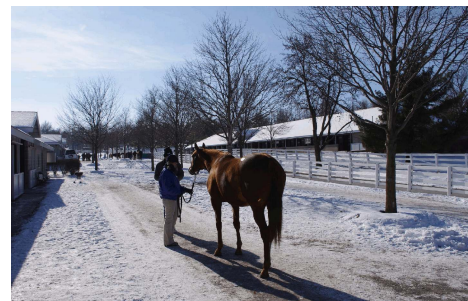

KEENELAND JANUARY CONCLUDES

The Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale concluded its five-day stand yesterday in Lexington. By most accounts, market conditions maintained well from a year ago, and perhaps improved a little. The sale's final average of \$24,731 enjoyed a sliver of an increase, up 1.6 percent, while the median of \$7,500 was down 6.3 percent. Keeneland rang up \$25,250,350 in gross receipts, compared to \$23,895,100 in 2010.



"The market continues to show positive signs of recovery from the one-two punch of the recent global financial crisis and the industry correction," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "As we've noted before, the market is resilient. People are still very discerning but they want to buy horses. That fact is supported by the prices paid for quality individuals, particularly young, stakes-winning mares and yearlings with good physicals. Trade was good throughout, owing to the diverse group of American and foreign buyers who attended the sale despite the wintery weather and tough travel conditions." **Keeneland January cont. p3**

Russell added that root causes of the market's dramatic slide, including overproduction, are currently being addressed. "Breeders have done a very good job of identifying the problem, and reducing the number of mares bred and stallion fees," he said. "We are just now beginning to see the effect of that adjustment, but it has helped buoy the market. The next stage of recovery will be dependent on the larger economic upturn and improvement in the racing product. While we know there continue to be challenges, we are optimistic in our outlook."

Topping the January Sale was the Three Chimneys Sales-consigned **Ave (GB)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), who elicited a bid of \$1.4 million from Shadai Farm. Ave was one of three Grade I-winning racing or broodmare prospects to sell at January. The other two brought

the next-highest prices at January.

The newly turned three-year-old **Wickedly Perfect** (Congrats) sold to Northern Farm's Katsumi Yoshida for \$800,000 from the Three Chimneys draft, while John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency sold **Negligee** (Northern Afleet) to Hunter Valley Farm, agent, for \$625,000.

Gainesway stallion Tapit enjoyed a successful sale, accounting for four of the top six short yearlings. They were led by a colt by out of Unbridled Appeal (Unbridled) who sold to Buckeye Road Stable for \$250,000. That price was good only for runner-up honors, though. Lane's End's Candy Ride (Arg) had the sale's highest-priced yearling. A colt out of Gentlemen's Crown (Gentlemen {Arg}) made \$300,000 to the bid of B G Stables. Kitty Taylor's Warrendale Sales consigned both horses.

On Friday, a mare by the Claiborne Farm stallion Pulpit was the session topper for the second straight day. [Hip 1598](#), the three-year-old racing or broodmare prospect **Poetfromthepulpit**, sold to Carlos S.E. Moore, agent, for \$40,000. Bred by Vinery's Grapestock, Poetfromthepulpit made three starts as a juvenile last year; her best effort was a runner-up finish in a seven-furlong maiden special weight at Woodbine in August. She is a daughter of the stakes-placed Kivi (King of Kings {Ire}), a daughter of G1 Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp runner-up Vilikaia (Nureyev). Poetfromthepulpit received a timely update when her half-brother Regally Ready (More Than Ready) finished third in the GIII Daytona S. at Santa Anita on New Year's Day for Vinery. Dr. Tom Simon's operation consigned Poetfromthepulpit to the January Sale.

Taylor Takes Stock...

Taylor Made Sales concluded Keeneland January as the second-leading consigner, with \$2,261,100 in gross sales, including the \$340,000 **Cowgirls Don't Cry** (Pure Prize). Because of the size of Taylor Made's draft--the 119 horses it sold was twice that runner-up Four Star Sales--the Taylor brothers are especially qualified to comment on the varying segments of the marketplace. Frank Taylor, vice president of boarding operations, saw some bright spots at Keeneland, but also saw a market continuing to go though a sometimes painful readjustment.

"Personally, I think the really good horses sold pretty well, but there were very few good horses," he

said. "There just wasn't a great selection here. I think it's still a clearing-out at the bottom end. We're still in the reduction period, and hopefully very soon, supply will start matching demand."

"But it is strong out there for good horses."

Asked if the industry is getting close to where it should be numbers wise, Taylor said, "I think so, but I don't know that for sure. We are a whole lot closer than we were before. Talking to people from around town, the number of horses has dwindled drastically. I think we got into a situation where things were going so good for so long, we bred a lot of horses that we shouldn't have bred. Then the market corrected, and the numbers were way up there. It's no fun seeing people loose a lot of money and see people get hurt, but a lot of people got overextended, using credit to buy horses to get into the business. It's not something I've ever advised; it just doesn't seem like the healthiest thing to do. But there's definitely a solid group of people who love the business and will stay in it and keep things going, and I think they'll be paid well when the market solidifies and gets going again."

Taylor also urged Kentucky state leaders to be more proactive in protecting the Bluegrass's signature industry. "We need some help from the state, or the other states who are getting help are going to get all the horses," said Taylor. "I don't know if slots are the answer or what is, but if they don't do something, you're going to see a lot more vacant farms around."

Taylor said the confluence of market conditions and state inaction can be seen in the number of mares being booked to local stallions. "It's either feast for famine," said Taylor. "There are probably 15 or 20 horses in Kentucky that just everybody has to breed to, and they're just slammed, and the others are booking slowly, or not getting booked. There are a number of stallions who have already left Kentucky, and I think you'll see another big wave leaving soon. That's going to hurt Kentucky, and the state needs to look at this like they looked at Toyota, when they were trying to lure it into the state. When you've got something, you usually don't appreciate it 'til it's gone."

TDN Q & A

The first sale of 2011, the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale, is now in the books, and yesterday the TDN's Lucas Marquardt sat down with Keeneland's Associate Director of Sales Tom Thornbury to get his thoughts about the state of the breeding industry, the transfer of talented horseflesh overseas, and his upcoming travel plans.

What changes in the market, either from November or last year's January Sale, have you seen?

Well, I think first and foremost you have to realize that this is the January Sale, which can go up and down like a basketball because the quality can vary so greatly. Last year, our Monday was comparable to our Tuesday this year, and our Tuesday this year was better than our Monday last year. It just depends on the quality of our stock.

I think we had some glimmers of hope from November. The market was strong on the upper end, and there were a lot of international buyers who fought it out over the top-end stock. That fostered some encouragement for this sale, and carried over to this sale.

Overall, the numbers are up a little bit, and there's some feeling that maybe we've hit the bottom of the trough, and we're elevating just a little bit. That's the hope, and I think it's generally the hope throughout the American economy. Preliminary indications are just that. **Q & A cont. p8**

You hear from breeders that the margin for profitability keeps getting narrower. What's your take on the current state of the breeding industry?

It has to be profitable, whether we're talking here at Keeneland or the Big Board on Wall Street. For years, we saw sustained high costs prior to the drop in the market, which created a real desperate situation for a number of breeders, who were really on the short end of the stick. They've suffered through almost three years, and sometimes were forced to sell their premier [breeding] stock just to maintain operating costs. But production costs now have come down, and I think we're seeing that expressed in the market. And I think we'll see that at September and in subsequent years. Stud fees have now come down to the level where there's a serious prospect for profitability.

At the same time, we're diverting a lot of stock to other countries, and a lot of that is our better stock. But the larger number is our lesser stock. So we're reducing the size of our herd. We're doing a good job of tightening things up. Racing is contracting in this country, and racing around the world is contracting. Those prospects bode well for the average breeder, who is positioned now to cover his operating costs and make a little profit.

Do you have any idea how many commercial breeders were forced out of the business by the market crash?

Candidly, no. I still see many of the same faces around, but I know there are a large number of farms on the market, and a large number of farms that have exchanged hands. It's a good opportunity for someone coming into the business to get a good start and have good prospects for the future. But if you're selling out right now, you're selling out on the low end. It isn't necessarily a fire sale, but it sure isn't ideal.

It seems the Japanese in particular have been very active at the top of market in the last year or two, purchasing highly sought-after prospects. Is the American breeding industry being weakened by this transfer?

I think the majority of what we're seeing is the sale of proven racing stock. And a lot of it is lesser-bred stock, whose value is based on performance, not pedigree. The American breeder is still breeding good-performing horses, and it's obvious that a Grade I filly off the racetrack still brings premium dollar. That's true anywhere in the world. In my opinion, the depletion of quality breeding stock has been ongoing for years. With the advent of foreign investment in this country--Sheikh Mohammed and his brother Sheikh Hamdan, Prince Khalid Abudulla, etc.--they bought their select mares from this market, and now those mares are almost in trophy rooms, of sorts. Those mares are collector's items. That's been ongoing for years. Now the shift has been for fillies coming off the racetrack. Pedigrees enhance the value, but those top racemares are highly prized, and we're still producing them every year. And the American horse, still to this day, wherever it goes in the world, is still sought after.

In the past year, you've traveled to South America to assist in yearling selection for the Copa Bullrich Sale, and to South Africa for the inaugural Cape Premier Sale, which will be held in Cape Town, Jan. 27-28. Will you keep on racking up the frequent flier miles in 2011?

In February, I'll be in Argentina for a few weeks, looking at yearlings for the Copa Bullrich sale. Last year was the first time I ever did that. There are a lot more breeders who are interested [in participating in the sale], and so now there are a lot more horses to look at. I'll be in Argentina for two weeks this year, rather than a week like last year. And then I'll be in Brazil for a week. It's something that really works out well for everyone. I use my vacation time here at Keeneland, and have their blessing, and the sales companies just pay my airfare and hotel. The breeders there wind up feeling more comfortable coming here and buying breeding stock, because I've met them and spent time with them and now they have a friend here. It's been a great experience.

A Grade III winner at two, he landed the valuable Smarty Jones S. last September and was runner-up to likely repeat champion Lookin At Lucky (Smart Strike) in the GII Indiana Derby Oct. 2 prior to a well-bet seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile Nov. 7. **Tweebster** carries a three-race winning streak into this graded-stakes debut, but his last is best taken with a grain of salt despite its lofty rating. The grey was allowed to get away with six furlongs in 1:15 in that off-turf test Dec. 18 and outsprinted his rivals to score by 3 3/4 lengths. OAKS PURSE RAISED TO \$1 MILLION For the first time since 1996 when it was hiked to its current level of \$500,000, the purse for the GI Kentucky Oaks will be raised to \$1 million for the 2011 renewal to be contested Friday, May 6 beneath the Twin Spires at Churchill Downs. "There is no weekend in American racing like Kentucky Oaks and Derby Weekend, and it is exciting to raise the purse for the Oaks to a level that reflects its status and importance as a sports and entertainment event," said Kevin Flanery, president of Churchill Downs Racetrack. The race has produced the last three Eclipse Award-winning three-year-old fillies in Rags To Riches (A.P. Indy, 2007), Proud Spell (Proud Citizen, 2008) and Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro, 2009). Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) is favored to run that streak to four when this year's champions are revealed Monday night in Miami. "The Oaks has enjoyed spectacular growth in recent years and the 2010 running won by Blind Luck was one of its greatest renewals. CHURCHILL STAKES WORTH OVER \$7M In addition to the GI Kentucky Oaks, now worth \$1 million, and the \$2-million, the Churchill Downs spring/summer stakes schedule will feature an additional 23 added-money events. The stakes schedule is worth \$7.325 million altogether. There have, however, been some alterations. The track's other Grade I event, the Stephen Foster H., will see its purse cut to \$500,000 from last year's \$600,000, while another Derby weekend event, the GII La Troienne S., has lost its Breeders' Cup supplement and will be worth \$300,000-added. The race was won in 2010 by subsequent GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic winner Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled's Song), who defeated Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro). Purses have been increased for the GII Churchill Downs S., which will get a \$50,000 bump up to \$300,000; the GIII Alysheba S., presented by Besilu Stables, from \$150,000 to \$300,000; and the GII American Turf to \$200,000 from its previous level of \$175,000. Four races were put on hiatus for 2011—the GII Fleur de Lis H., the GIII Kentucky Juvenile S., the GIII Locust Grove H. and the race previously known as the Matt Winn S. The GIII Eight Belles S. will be shortened from 7 1/2 furlongs to seven furlongs and is being moved to the Kentucky Oaks undercard. The GIII Turf Sprint, in past years conducted on Kentucky Oaks day, has been moved to Derby Day and has been renamed the Twin Spires Turf Sprint.

INDIANA CASINO SUBSIDY ON THE BLOCK?

Under a proposed budget by Indiana Governor Mitch Daniels, subsidies for the Thoroughbred industry in the state could drop from a projected \$26.1 million to \$18.1 million, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Like many other states, Indiana faces serious budget deficits. We were expecting something like this in this session for the last week," commented Eddie Martin, a legislative consultant to and former president of the Indiana Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association. Martin suggests that there is a fundamental lack of understanding in the executive mansion. "We paid for a study that showed that the Thoroughbred industry is responsible for \$1 billion in economic development," he said. "To have something that would cut our purse money in half says we haven't done a good job selling it to the state of Indiana." Despite the negative news, Martin admits that the news isn't a total surprise. "This is a budget year, and we knew this would be one of the most contentious in years," Martin continued. "Our governor prides himself on being fiscally conservative, but we don't like to see it taken out on us. We'll work collectively." The budget debate will press on over the next handful of months, and the ITOBA is in it for the long haul, Martin says. "This is going to be a long 90 days and there will be a series of ups and downs," he noted. "Hopefully we'll come out of this unscathed, but that doesn't seem very likely."
