Classic, but the big mare was able to deny her rival in the Horse of Year balloting. She carried 128 votes, while Blame received 102, and Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) garnered five nods. "I first want to say what a great honor it has been to have been associated with the other two finalists," said an emotional Jerry Moss, who also shared a Special Eclipse Award with his wife. "Blame ran incredible races, and is a

wonderful racehorse. I can only congratulate Seth Hancock for the 100 years of service of his family farm. I only hope for him and Mrs. Dilschneider to have the most success with Blame as a wonderful sire in the future. Also for the amazing Goldikova, what can we say? I'll be happy to see her on the racetrack next year." When asked by somebody in the crowd if Zenyatta might return to the track in 2011, Moss laughed and said, "I think she is quite happy at Lane's End farm right now, thank you." Zenyatta is the fifth distaffer to take the top honor at the Eclipse Awards, following All Along (Fr) in 1982, Lady's Secret in 1986, Azeri in 2002 and, of course, Rachel Alexandra 12 months ago. **Cont. p2**

## BOURBON BAY TAKES SAN MARCOS

**Bourbon Bay** (Sligo Bay {Ire}) picked up his fourth graded-stakes victory at Santa Anita with a decisive effort in Monday's GI San Marcos S. The five-year-old won a trio of graded events over this course last spring, sweeping the GI San Luis Obispo, GI San Luis Rey and GI San Juan Capistrano, before ending his year with a third-place effort behind

The bay gelding sat just off the early pace yesterday as longshot **Marlang** (Langfuhr) took the field through fractions of :23.91, :47.81 and 1:11.84. Favored Champ Pegasus moved with authority to take the lead into the homestretch, but Bourbon Bay powered past that rival in the final furlong to win going away. "I was pretty comfortable the whole way, and I was in a great position," said winning rider Rafael Bejarano. "When I saw the favorite was let go from the three-eighths, I thought that [Joel Rosario] didn't have as much horse as I had. As soon as I got the opportunity, I tried to get the first jump in the stretch and just let my horse go. My horse ran a really good race." **San Marcos chart, p7**

**What's in a Name...**

Her connections knew Zenyatta was something special from the start. “[Bloodstock agent] David [Ingordo] told us to get a very good name for her, because you either have a very good horse or a lot of slow ones,” Jerry Moss said with a grin. “That was because she took two strides for their one. We had to get a really good name for her, and we did.”

The popular mare became the first horse to capture two different Breeders' Cup events with her wins in the 2008 GI BC Ladies' Classic and 2009 GI BC Classic; she was also the first female runner to triumph in the Classic. Having been featured on “60 Minutes,” as well as *Oprah Magazine's* O Power List, Zenyatta has nearly 60,000 fans on Facebook.

Moss took one more opportunity to acknowledge the legions of Zenyatta supporters. “We can't thank everybody enough, especially our fans. This is dedicated to her fans--to the 45,000 fans who showed up on a Friday at Oaklawn Park, to the biggest Vanity crowd at Hollywood Park in the past 10 years. It's for what she did for the television ratings, and all the letters, post-cards, photos and emblems that she gets every day, from people all over the country and all over the world. We have to thank her fans. She touched these people in a very special way, and they all just love her.”

He also gave a nod to trainer John Shirreffs. “John has been just incredible. He trained this horse for a year and a half before she stepped foot on the racetrack late in her three-year-old year. I just can't say enough about John Shirreffs. We thank God we gave Zenyatta to him.”

**Zenyatta Gets Her Special Eclipse...**

Team Zenyatta not only went home with the highly sought after Eclipse Award reserved for the Horse of the Year winner, they also were honored with a Special Eclipse Award. A group comprised of owners Jerry and Ann Moss, jockey Mike Smith and trainer John Shirreffs--who was accompanied by his wife Dottie Ingordo Shirreffs--took to the stage for the special presentation.

“I want to thank everyone for giving us this very special award,” expressed Jerry Moss. “Obviously, it's been such an honor to be with Zenyatta. She did it all. Well, almost all, but she did it.”

Moss added, “We are thrilled to have everybody involved along on this journey. The great John Shirreffs who made this all happen, as far as we're concerned, and his wife, Dottie Ingordo Shirreffs, who has been our racing manager for 25 years. She liked John so much as a trainer, she married him. And Mike Smith. He's been on board Zenyatta for all her amazing races, and we can't thank him enough. Mike, is a very special member of our family, along with everyone else on Team Zenyatta.”

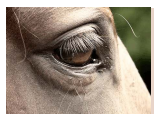

Reading between the lines, it looks as though Ron Winchell and his mother Joan were well aware of the potential of one of their 2007 juveniles, Pyro, before this homebred son of Pulpit made a winning debut in July 2007. A few weeks earlier, the Winchells had sent another mare from the same family to be mated to Pulpit's son Tapit, the result being a colt born May 6, 2008.

The Tapit colt's birth came just three days after Winchell Thoroughbreds had suffered a sizeable disappointment with Pyro. He had started third favorite behind Big Brown and Colonel John in the Kentucky Derby on the strength of clear-cut victories in the GIII Risen Star S. and GII Louisiana Derby. Unfortunately, he failed to reproduce the same high level of form--just as he had in the GI Blue Grass S.--in finishing a never-dangerous eighth.

Perhaps the 10th furlong was a little beyond Pyro, even though he went on to finish third in the GI Travers S. After passing into the ownership of Godolphin, Pyro reverted to shorter distances and repaid the move with a Grade I victory in the 2009 Forego S. He is now part of Darley's stallion team in Japan.

Of course, Winchell Thoroughbreds also campaigned Tapit, whose career featured the Kentucky Derby as well. With his Classic credentials including an impressive victory in the GIII Laurel Futurity and a win in the GI Wood Memorial S., Tapit started third choice behind Smarty Jones and Lion Heart for the 2004 Derby, but never threatened in finishing ninth.

I discussed Tapit with his trainer Michael Dickinson when we met at the December Sales, and he feels that rushing Tapit back from illness to contest the Wood Memorial effectively "bot-

tommed" the son of Pulpit. This prompted me to re-read the coverage of Tapit's win in the Wood.

"When we came home from Florida, we did an ultrasound and it showed a very significant lung infection," Dickinson told *The Blood-Horse*. "We did another ultrasound two weeks later and one lung was 100 percent and the other was 80 percent. We gave him a little five-furlong breeze, and he could blow a house down. I was going to wheel him back and work him a mile, but I told [owner Ron Winchell and manager David Fiske], 'I've got to give him as long as I dare to get him healthy and give the lungs a chance to heal.' It takes 28 days for the lung to get a new lining."

With Tapit needing more graded-stakes earnings to ensure his place in the Kentucky Derby field, his connections took the gamble of sending a less-than-fully-fit colt to the Wood Memorial.

"What Dickinson feared going into the Wood," *The Blood-Horse* reported, "was that Tapit, being such a generous and competitive horse, would try too hard and give more than what was expected of him."

Dickinson's expectation was that Tapit would come "late and easy" to take the \$75,000 third prize, but Tapit hadn't read the script. Although he landed the \$450,000 first prize, he disappointed in both his subsequent starts before retiring to Gainesway.

Although Tapit's racing career petered out, he has continued to reward the Winchells in his role as a stallion. Pyro's dam Wild Vision visited Tapit in 2005 to produce War Echo, winner of the GIII Silverbulletday S. for the Winchells, who also bred and raced the talented Retap and the stakes-winning Remit. They also raced the Grade III winner Hightap in partnership with Gainesway, with this partnership also breeding the GIII Comely S. winner Touching Beauty.

However, it is the easy-moving Tapizar, winner of the GIII Sham S. with his ears pricked, who is potentially the best of Winchell Thoroughbreds' homebred Tapits. His stylish Santa Anita triumph, together with his wide-margin victory at Churchill Downs in November, raise the possibility that--if he continues to progress--he could even erase the painful memories of the disappointing Kentucky Derby efforts of Tapit and Pyro.

Tapit has made such an eye-catching start that his fee now stands at \$80,000 in his seventh year at stud. The first two years were spent at \$15,000, with the next two at \$12,500. The lower fee was no doubt designed to offset the lessening in demand that affects so many young stallions, but this strategy wasn't necessary with Tapit. Having covered 142 mares in his first season and 104 in his second, Tapit was much in demand in his third year, thanks to the excellent reception his first weanlings had received at the 2006 breeding stock sales. He achieved an average of over \$108,000 with 13 weanlings and, consequently, covered 174 mares in 2007, including the dam of Tapizar. His current three-year-old crop also includes Grade I winner Tell A Kelly, Grade II winner Dancinginherdreams, Grade I-placed Joyful Victory and Grade II-placed fillies Tap For Luck and Zazy, plus the stakes winners Bandbox, Golden Set and Never Right Joey.

There's every reason to expect Tapit to keep up the good work, as he covered 117 mares in his fourth season, 170 to Northern Hemisphere time in his fifth (when his fee rose to \$35,000) and 169 in his sixth (at a fee of \$50,000).

Tapizar is easily the best of the first six foals out of Deputy Minister's daughter Winning Call, although his predecessors include his winning sister Tamboz. It's encouraging, from a stamina viewpoint, that other Deputy Minister mares are responsible for such as Rags to Riches, Jazil, Curlin, Sarava, Telling, Magistretti, Request For Parole and Persistently--all Grade I winners over a mile and a quarter or more. The GI Belmont S. winner Sarava was by Wild Again, which is interesting as Wild Again also sired Tapizar's second dam, the GI Del Mar Debutante S. winner Call Now. The first winner of the Breeders' Cup Classic was also responsible for Pyro's dam, Wild Vision, who is a three-parts-sister to Call Now.

Wild Vision's brother Wild Wonder raced 20 times between the ages of two and five, showing his best form at four, when his three graded wins included the GII Mervyn LeRoy H. over a mile and a sixteenth. Wild Wonder was fast enough to set a track record over a mile at four, and his only stakes success at five came over six furlongs.

Tapizar's second dam Call Now was also a half-sister to Olympio, who took the Minnesota, Arkansas and Hollywood Derbys over nine furlongs and the American Derby over a mile and a quarter, as well as being fast enough to win the Malibu S. over seven furlongs. His third dam Carols Christmas figures as the second dam of no fewer than five graded winners in addition to Wild Wonder, the others being the Futurity S. winner Cuvee, sprinters Early Flyer and Will He Shine, and million dollar earner Bien Nicole.

There is plenty of speed in this family, but Tapizar's four great-grandfathers include A.P. Indy, Unbridled and Wild Again, all major winners over a mile and a quarter or more, so there's reason to hope that lack of stamina won't prove his Achilles heel on the Classic trail.

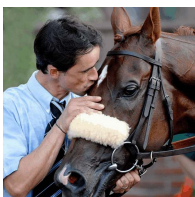

**LLOYD BENSEN PASSES AWAY** Owner Lloyd Bensen, who, with his wife Edna, ran under the nom du course Heatherwood Farm, passed away Wednesday, Jan. 12, from complications from pneumonia. He was 85. Jerry and Ann Moss had been disappointed when **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) came up second-best in Horse of the Year balloting the last two years, but the third time proved to be the charm. Despite losing her perfect career record when edged in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic by Blame (Arch), racing's most popular horse took home the heavy-duty hardware at Monday's ceremony at the Fontainebleau Hotel in Miami Beach. She follows Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro) as the second straight distaffer to win the Horse of the Year, and the third since since Azeri (Jade Hunter) in 2002. Like Azeri, Zenyatta also took the Eclipse as top older mare three straight years. "We believed in her," owner Jerry Moss said, adding, "We can't wait to tell her."

Zenyatta added a fitting final chapter to her racing legacy after being named the 2010 Horse of the Year. Briefly retired following her epic win over the boys in the 2009 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita, the big mare picked up right where she left off for her six-year-old campaign, fighting her way through traffic to win the GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. ([video](#)). While the GI Apple Blossom Invitational S. ([video](#)) failed to produce the anticipated showdown with Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro), Queen Z put on a show while facing four overmatched rivals, inhaling the leaders on the turn en route to a runaway win. Given plenty of time off, the daughter of Broodmare of the Year Vertigineux (Kris S.) returned to the Golden State with a pair of heart-stoppers to three-peat in the GI Vanity H. at Hollywood ([video](#)) and the GI Clement L. Hirsch S. at Del Mar ([video](#)). The Moss colorbearer had her backers holding their collective breath once again while making it 19-for-19 under a perfectly timed late rally in the GI Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup S. ([video](#)), a race she also won in 2008 and 2009. The fairytale story finally came to an end in the Classic, but it certainly didn't lack drama. Seemingly in Lexington beneath regular pilot Mike Smith while cabooing the field of 12 during the early stages of the \$5-million centerpiece, Zenyatta came with those famous giant strides as the Churchill crowd roared, but just couldn't reel in the classy Blame (Arch), who got his head down on the line first in one for the ages. Unless she pulls off another Brett Favre act, Zenyatta heads to the breeding shed with a record of 20-19-1-0 and \$7,304,580 in earnings.

Blame showed his quality during his three-year-old season, collecting a pair of graded stakes victories, including the GII Clark H., but certainly raised the bar in 2010. He was the unanimous choice for champion older horse.

“Thank you so much for this award, and one more time, we can blame it on Blame,” co-owner/breeder Adele Dilschneider said.

Of the colt, trainer Al Stall Jr. had earlier remarked, “He’s a beautiful horse to deal with and is so friendly and laid back. Nothing ever bothers him. But when he goes to the racetrack, he has a killer instinct. I think that is the definition of what a horse should be. He deserves everything that comes his way.”

A comfortable winner in his seasonal bow in Pimlico’s GIII William Donald Schaefer S. May 15, the homebred bagged his first Grade I score when coming from off the pace to hand favored Battle Plan (Empire Maker) a 3/4-length defeat in the nine-furlong GI Stephen Foster H. June 12. Having to settle for second choice again--this time behind the heavily backed Quality Road (Evasive Quality)--in the Spa’s GI Whitney H. Aug. 7, Blame battled that rival late and won the war by a hard-fought head while posting an impressive 108 Bris figure in the process ([video](#)).

Blame was sent off the 4-5 choice when asked to negotiate the Classic distance of 1 1/4 miles for the first time in Belmont’s GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 2, but was victimized by pedestrian early splits of :48 3/5, 1:13 1/5 and 1:37 carved out by the free-running speedster Haynesfield (Speightstown) and could only close to within four lengths of the winner, hitting the wire in second.

In what was anticipated to be the crowning moment for racing’s beloved star Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in the GI Breeders’ Cup Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. 6,

Blame was sent off at 5-1 odds for his career finale. Once again asked to rate off the early pace by jockey Garrett Gomez, the four-year-old was granted much faster fractions to run into than in his previous start. Given the go ahead by Gomez approaching the stretch,

Blame had the jump on the amazon six-year-old at the top of the lane and maintained enough in reserve as the giant mare closed resolutely on the outside ([video](#)). In what would prove to be an historic thriller, the well-bred colt was a head in front on the wire, but it wasn’t enough to clinch the first Horse of the Year title for Claiborne Farm since the juvenile filly Moccasin accomplished the feat for the storied nursery in 1965.

After the dust settled and Zenyatta had been crowned the year’s ultimate champion, Stall was asked if he and Blame’s owners would be going home disappointed.

“We’re not going home at all right now,” he replied with a smile. “We’re going across [to the after party]. It’s no disappointment to finish second in the voting to Zenyatta--it’s not a surprise. The Mosses did a tremendous job bringing her back [for her six-year-old campaign], and they were rewarded.”

Stall added, “[Claiborne and Adele Dilschneider] will keep breeding top horses and, hopefully, I’ll keep training for them.”

There was little mystery regarding Lookin At Lucky's class heading into his three-year-old season. After garnering championship honors at two, the bay had a lot to live up to in 2010. He did just that. A narrow winner despite encountering trouble in his seasonal bow in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Mar. 13, the \$475,000 KEEAPR purchase went off the 4-5 choice in the Apr. 3 GI Santa Anita Derby. Under regular rider Garrett Gomez, the colt ran into traffic and was forced to steady in the stretch, then had to settle for third behind Sidney's Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}) ([video](#)).

The Bob Baffert protegee was sent off the lukewarm 6-1 choice in a contentious renewal of the GI Kentucky Derby May 1, but once again found trouble--this time in the early going--before finishing a respectable sixth behind winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon). Baffert called an audible following that effort and opted to replace Gomez with up-and-comer Martin Garcia--a change that would hopefully turn things around for the seemingly jinxed sophomore. Not favored for the first time in his career when sent postward for Pimlico's GI Preakness S. May 15, the colt employed his customary come-from-behind move to hand First Dude (Stephen Got Even) a 3/4-length defeat in the second jewel of the American Triple Crown ([video](#)).

Given a bit of a breather following that grueling effort, Lookin At Lucky resumed with an authoritative score over in the Aug. 1 GI Haskel Invitational S. Stricken by illness soon after that winning effort, 'Lucky' was forced to miss almost a month of training, but Baffert had the colt back on track for the Oct. 2 GII Indiana Derby at Hoosier Park. Allowed to linger farther behind the early pace than was his custom, Lookin At Lucky was swung wide by Garcia turning for home and proved best to collect his eighth career score at the graded level.

He was asked to stretch out to 10 furlongs for his career closer in Churchill's GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 6 and made a gallant move to put himself into contention turning for home, but his truncated fall training schedule appeared to take its toll as he weakened to be fourth behind the classy trio of Blame (Arch), Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) and Fly Down (Mineshaft) ([video](#)).

Lookin At Lucky becomes the first two-year-old champion to repeat at three since Spectacular Bid in 1979. He retired to Coolmore America with a record of 13-9-1-1 and earnings of \$3,307,278.

A few years ago, Rags to Riches took down honors as champion three-year-old filly. In 2010, the 'Iron Filly' Blind Luck completed a rags-to-riches story of her own, and last night was awarded the Eclipse Award by a wide margin over her arch-rival Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) and Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet).

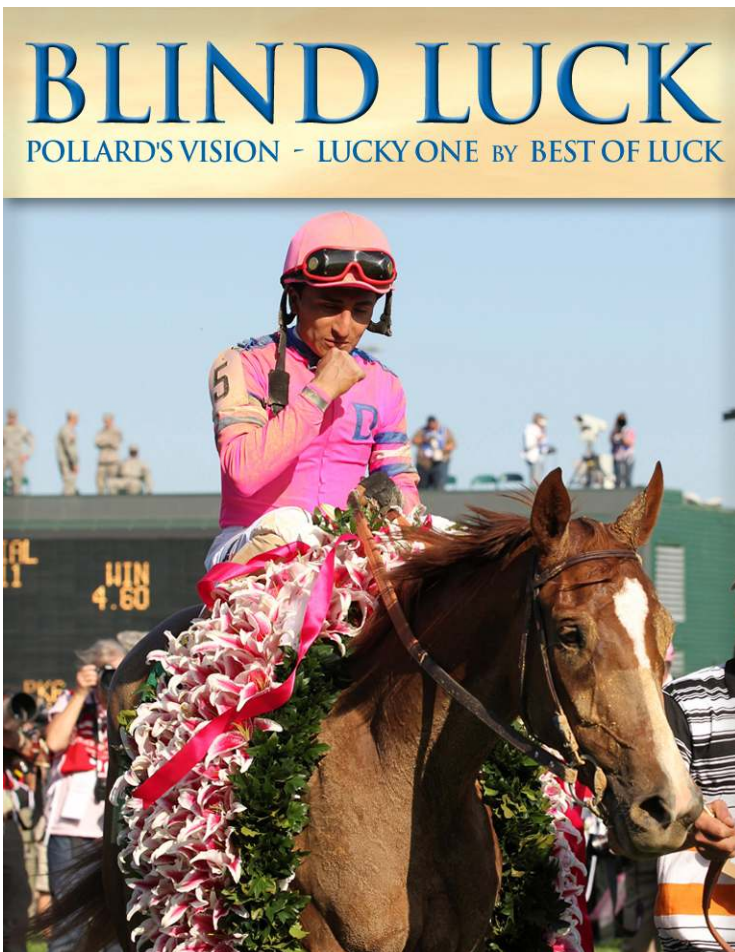
Denied a championship a year ago by She Be Wild (Offlee Wild), the definitive 'cardiac kid' of her generation just got the better of Evening Jewel by a nose in the GI Las Virgenes S. in February ([video](#)), but could not overcome a slow pace in the Mar. 6 GI Santa Anita Oaks and settled for third, a half-length behind Switch (Quiet American). She made the first of five trips out of California for the GII Fantasy S. Apr. 2 ([video](#)), and the 2 1/2-length margin of victory that afternoon was her most comfortable of the year. That result would propel her into favoritism for the GI Kentucky Oaks.

With main rival Devil May Care (Malibu Moon) opting for the GI Kentucky Derby the next day, the task for Blind Luck appeared that much easier. But an expected lively pace failed to develop, and Blind Luck found herself last for the opening five furlongs. She began to pick off rivals on the turn, switched wide for the drive and looked on her way to validating favoritism. Evening Jewel had something left to say--the GI Ashland S. winner dug in tenaciously, only to be victimized for a second time by Blind Luck's snout ([video](#)).

Returned to the Golden State, the champ was runner-up in a paceless renewal of the GII Hollywood Oaks, but atoned with another narrow success, this time over the upstart Havre de Grace in the GII Delaware Oaks in July ([video](#)). The budding rivalry was renewed in the GI Alabama S., where Blind Luck squared off for the first--and only--occasion with Devil May Care. The Todd Pletcher trainee, odds-on to assume divisional supremacy that day, got first run, but the California raider ran past Havre de Grace for a neck score, with Devil May Care soundly defeated in fourth ([video](#)).

That race would mark the end of the season for Devil May Care, but not for Blind Luck and Havre de Grace, who met again in the GII Fitz Dixon Cotillion S. Oct. 2. Havre de Grace, in receipt of 10 pounds, outlasted her foe, but Blind Luck lost nothing in defeat, closing with her trademark relentlessness to miss by a neck.

Her body of work earned Blind Luck a quote of 3-2 for the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic, but, as is her custom, she dropped well off a sluggish pace and came late to be second, 1 3/4 lengths behind Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled's Song), but a length ahead of Havre de Grace, putting her final stamp on the championship.

Uncle Mo's debut on Travers Day at Saratoga, Aug. 28, was so stirring and impressive that he almost stole the day's spotlight from a riveting photo finish in the "Midsummer Derby." The \$160,000 KEENOV weanling turned \$220,000 KEESEP yearling absolutely destroyed nine foes, dashing from gate to wire 14 1/4 lengths in front of his next-best rival and earning a 102 Beyer Speed Figure for the effort ([video](#)). He was a no-brainer recipient of the ☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆ tag.

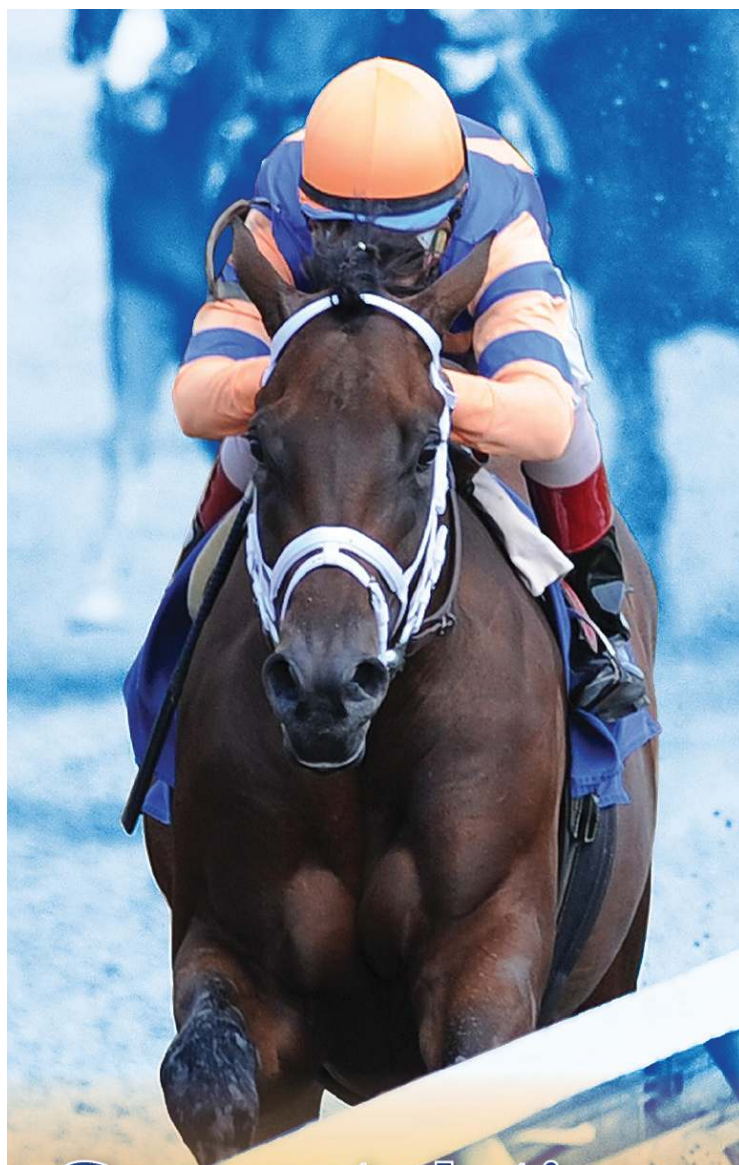
Mike Repole, who enjoyed an excellent Spa meet as leading owner, told the *TDN* in an interview after Uncle Mo's debut, "I've been in the game for six years as an owner and almost 30 years as a racing fan. I've been going to Aqueduct since I was a 13-year-old kid and hoping for a horse like this." A dream fulfilled would only get better.

After more than a month of rest, the justifiably hyped colt returned in the Oct. 9 GI Champagne S. at Belmont, proving emphatically that his unveiling was no fluke and a route of ground was no obstacle as the overwhelming 2-5 choice. The bay dueled on the front end and disposed of all comers with devastating ease, displaying his long, fluid stride en route to a 4 3/4-length success and certain Breeders' Cup favoritism ([video](#)).

The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile was billed as a showdown between Uncle Mo and GI Hopeful S. winner Boys At Tosconova (Officer), but the former, once again, turned it into a one man (against boys) show. The Repole colorbearer rated ominously just off the leader early, but was already four lengths in front by the time they hit the top of the stretch. Boys At Tosconova ran very well to be second--and in many other crops would have become a Breeders' Cup and Eclipse champion--but he came up 4 1/2 lengths short of the top gun. It was another six lengths back to third ([video](#)).

Like almost every juvenile champ at the beginning of his sophomore campaign, Uncle Mo is the favorite for the GI Kentucky Derby until further notice. He is expected to return in the Mar. 12 GI Tampa Bay Derby.

"Wow--for people who know me, I'm not speechless or overwhelmed too many times in my life," Repole said after accepting the trophy. "The good news is that I'm not speechless, but I am overwhelmed. I'm overwhelmed by being in the room with racing legends; I'm overwhelmed by holding an award that the great Secretariat won, that the great Seattle Slew won, that the great Affirmed won. And now my horse--I like the way that sounds--my horse is in that incredible company."

Awesome Feather scored by 5 3/4 lengths first out at Calder May 1 ([video](#)), and she was just getting started. The bay returned July 10 in the JJ's Dream at her home track and found the winner's circle again ([video](#)) before sweeping the Florida Stallion Stakes Series for juvenile fillies.

The homebred was never threatened in those three races--she took the Aug. 7 Desert Vixen S. ([video](#)), Aug. 28 Susan's Girl S. ([video](#)) and the Oct. 16 My Dear Girl S. ([video](#)) by a combined 17 lengths. After those dominant efforts she was ready to step into the big leagues.

Awesome Feather was the tepid 4-1 favorite in a wide open 12-horse renewal of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, but her price seemed like an overlay 1:45 after they sprung the latch.

Fred Brei, the owner of Jacks Or Better Farm in Florida, no longer owns Awesome Feather, but he accepted the Eclipse Award last night.

"This is just unbelievable for a small breeder," said Brei. "It doesn't get any better than this; well, maybe for winning the Kentucky Derby...we'll have to see."

Awesome Feather stole the spotlight again just two days after the Breeders' Cup. Up for sale at the F-T November sale, Awesome Feather went to Frank Stronach for a lofty \$2.3 million. She was transferred to conditioner Chad Brown at Palm Meadows, but it was announced last week that tendon problems may threaten the champ's future career on the track.

It figured to be a close vote, but, at the wire, it was his performance on racing's Championship Day that earned Harold Queen homebred **Big Drama** the Eclipse Award as the year's top sprinter. The Florida-bred was first or second in all five starts last year, a campaign that included three Grade I's and a Grade II. He made his seasonal debut in the Ponche H. at Calder in June, winning by a decisive 3 3/4 lengths ([video](#)), and made it two in a row in the GII Smile Sprint H. in July ([video](#)).

Compromised by a rough start and giving up four pounds in his only meeting with Eclipse finalist **Majesticperfection** (Harlan's Holiday), he ran second by 2 3/4 lengths in the Aug. 8 GI Alfred G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga ([video](#)), and he stumbled at the break in the Sept. 4 GI Forego S. before finishing a 3/4-length runner-up ([video](#)). But there was nary a straw in his path in the Nov. 6 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, and Big Drama sailed along in front from gate to wire to win the event in 1:09 flat ([video](#)).

Trainer David Fawkes, accepting the award, said, "Unfortunately, Mr. Queen couldn't be here with us today. I want to thank his staff for doing a great job in breeding and raising Big Drama, and my staff for staying out of his way and letting him do his job. This one's for him."

Now five, Big Drama is set for another season. He kicked off the year with a track-record-setting victory in Saturday's GIII Mr. Prospector S. at Gulfstream Park.

How much does an Eclipse Award cost? The answer for Bill and Stephanie Martin and Dan Morgan: \$90,000. That's the amount they had to pay to supplement Dubai Majesty to last fall's GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint, and with an upset win over deep and contentious field under the Twin Spires on Breeders' Cup Friday, Dubai Majesty secured not only a \$540,000 payday, but effectively an Eclipse Award, too. It was the third time since the award's inception four years ago that the F/M Sprint winner was named champion, following Maryfield in '07 and Informed Decision last season. Dubai Majesty was trained by Bret Calhoun.

Last night's award put the finishing touches on Dubai Majesty's unlikely story, which saw the Florida-bred go from winning a \$25,000 claimer at Calder in May of 2008 to wearing a blanket of purple and yellow chrysanthemums in November. The Martins, who race under Martin Racing Stable LLC, and Morgan purchased Dubai Majesty privately after the then three-year-old finished a well-beaten second in the GIII Azalea S. at Calder in July of 2008. And while an Eclipse Award may have been the last thing on their minds, the partnership was rewarded almost immediately by their new acquisition. Dubai Majesty ran second in that year's GII Indiana Oaks and GII Raven Run S. at Keeneland, finished runner-up in the Sunshine Millions Sprint in January of 2009 and third to Informed Decision (Monarchos) in the GI Humana Distaff in May, and soon after collected her first stakes win in the GIII Winning Colors S. at Churchill.

Dubai Majesty added another black-type event before closing our her four-year-old year and could well have been retired to the breeding shed. But her owners decided to see what she could do at five. Once again, they were rewarded. The mare took a second renewal of the Winning Colors ([video](#)), placed in the GI Vinery Madison S. ([video](#)) and GI Princess Rooney S. ([video](#)), and was beaten just a head by Informed Decision in the lucrative Presque Isle Downs Masters S. in September ([video](#)). Heading into the GII Thoroughbred Club Of America S. at Keeneland in October, Dubai Majesty seemed doubtful to make a Breeders' Cup appearance. But a sharp 3/4-length win ([video](#))--old rival Informed Decision was back in third--prompted her connections to pony up the nine-percent fee in a bid to become the 20th individual supplemented winner of a Breeders' Cup race. Betting for the F/M Sprint spoke to how wide open the race was. The favorite, Champagne d'Oro (Medaglia d'Oro), sat at 4-1 odds, while Dubai Majesty, the seventh wagering choice, was an 8.60-1 shot. As was her custom, Dubai Majesty rewarded her connections' faith, sitting just off the pace under Jamie Theriot before streaking home clear by 2 1/4 lengths over Switch (Quiet American) ([video](#)).

Two days later, Dubai Majesty was put through the Fasig-Tipton November Sale, and for a final time gave her owners cause for celebration, selling to Katsumi Yoshida for \$1.1 million. She has been retired and will begin her broodmare career in Japan.

Goldikova earned her first Eclipse Award after capturing her second consecutive GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita in 2009. Sportingly kept in training by her owner/breeders in 2010 for a historic attempt at a three-peat, the popular bay put together perhaps her finest campaign yet.

She began the season with wins in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp in May ([video](#)) and G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot ([video](#)), then scored a treble in the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville ([video](#)). Though she settled for second to G1 2000 Guineas hero Makfi (GB) (Dubawi {Ire}) in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois next out at the Normandy course ([video](#)), Goldikova headed back to the States after a stylish score in the G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp Oct. 3 ([video](#)).

There was a boatload of top performers in the starting gate for the 2010 renewal of the BC Mile at Churchill Downs, including seven Grade/Group 1 winners, but Goldikova mowed them all down with her usual elan to once more secure championship honors ([video](#)). Her effort under the Twin Spires took her career record to 21-15-3-2 and gave her a bankroll of \$6,153,284.

"It's quite unreal," trainer Freddie Head said after the Breeders' Cup. "She's amazing, she can do anything. I'm very emotional. I was the first jockey to win this race twice with a mare [Miesque], and now I'm the trainer of a mare winning [this race] three times. It's unreal. We don't know how good this filly is--she's extraordinary. I don't have the words."

The Wertheimers later announced that Goldikova would be back in action at age six, and she was honored as the Cartier Horse of the Year for her European exploits.

Goldikova is a great-granddaughter of 1981 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe heroine Gold River (Fr) (Riverman), who was bred and raced by the Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's father, Jacques. Her half-sister Galikova (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) was tabbed as a ☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆ following a successful debut in the fall, and the Wertheimers also have her yearling full-brother, a colt named Anodin (Ire).

His 2010 campaign lacked perhaps some of the brilliance of his championship season in 2009, but Castleton Lyons's Gio Ponti parlayed his consistency and a pair of Grade I scores to become just the third horse in the modern era to claim back-to-back Eclipse Awards as the nation's champion turf male. He joins John Henry (1980-81 and 1983-84) and High Chaparral (Ire) (2002-3) to complete the feat. In securing his second straight statuette, the newly turned six-year-old outpointed stable companion Winchester (Theatrical {Ire}) and GI Breeders' Cup Turf upsetter Dangerous Midge (Lion Heart).

Kept in training with an eye on the G1 Dubai World Cup, Gio Ponti missed by a nose in the Tampa Bay Breeders' Cup in February, then closed nicely off no pace whatsoever in the World Cup to pick up a check for \$500,000 in fourth. Given plenty of time to recover from the journey, the homebred resurfaced to defend his title in the GI Manhattan H., and looked to have had the race won, only to be tagged late by Winchester.

The bay overcame traffic to go back-to-back in Belmont's GI Man O'War S. July 10 ([video](#)), but couldn't repeat the dose in the GI Arlington Million Aug. 21, falling prey to a late rail run from Debussy (Ire) (Diesis {GB}) and going down by a half-length.

Gio Ponti would prep for the 2010 Breeders' Cup in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland, and he exuded class, coming through the eye of a needle in the stretch for the victory ([video](#)), and he was subsequently pointed for a battle with Goldikova (Ire) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. He posted his best BRIS figure of the year, and while it wasn't quite good enough to top the irrepressible Goldikova, it proved the final master stroke of another championship season.

Slip Away (2003, g, Skip Away--Aurura Slew, by Slew's Royalty) started the year with a nine-length score in the GIII Temple Gwathmey H. and ended it with a 25 3/4-length laugh in the GI Colonial Cup, efforts that were more than enough to earn him the Eclipse as the year's top steeplechaser. The grey was also runner-up in the GI Iroquois S., GI Helen Haskell Sampson Hurdle S. and GI Grand National, and third when beaten a mere 3/4 of a length for all the money in the GII A.P. Smithwick Memorial S.

A \$16,000 KEESEP purchase by Ken and Sarah Ramsey, Slip Away never raced on the flat, and overcame a tendon injury at the start of his jumping career, but proved more than worth the wait in his championship campaign.

## CHAMPION OWNER WINSTAR FARM LLC

For Kenny Troutt and Bill Casner's WinStar Farm, 2010 was all about its remarkable sophomore class. Most operations would be content to be represented by a single starter in the GI Kentucky Derby. For a time, it looked like WinStar could have as many as *five*, with **Super Saver** (Maria's Mon), **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor), **Rule** (Roman Ruler), **Endorsement** (Distorted Humor) and **American Lion** (Tiznow) all on the Derby trail in the spring. In the end, Drosselmeyer failed to make the earnings cut, Rule was deemed to be off form and sent to the farm, and Endorsement suffered an ill-timed injury in his final pre-Derby drill. That left WinStar with two in the gate on the first Saturday in May, but one was all they needed. Super Saver, under a confident Calvin Borel, skipped home a clear-cut winner in the mud, giving WinStar its first Classic winner. The frosting on the cake was that the blue-blooded colt was a homebred, born from Supercharger (A.P. Indy), a mare WinStar had acquired--with Super Saver in utero--for \$160,000 at the 2006 Keeneland November Sale. Super Saver disappointed in the GI Preakness S. two weeks later and bypassed the GI Belmont S., but WinStar had a capable back-up in Drosselmeyer. Not a homebred but a yearling purchase, the \$600,000 KESEF youngster came with a sustained run to win the third leg of the Triple Crown by 3/4 lengths. WinStar became the first operation to win two legs of the Triple Crown with different horses since Overbrook did so with Grindstone and Editor's Note, and they did it with two different trainers--Todd Pletcher trained Super Saver, Bill Mott conditioned Drosselmeyer.

In addition to that Classic-winning pair, Rule won the GIII Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa, American Lion won the GIII Illinois Derby and Endorsement won the GIII Sunland Derby. Another WinStar three-year-old, **Doubles Partner** (Rock Hard Ten), won the GII American Turf S., while the juvenile **Blue Laser** (Bluegrass Cat) won the GII Grey Breeders' Cup S. at Woodbine.

In all, WinStar horses won 46 of 248 starts and earned \$5,183,37946, which led all owners in 2010.

There was also major changes at WinStar. In October, Casner announced that Troutt, his longtime friend and business partner, was taking over as the sole owner of WinStar. It was an amicable split, said all parties, and Casner remains a major client of WinStar. And WinStar CEO Doug Cauthen announced that he was stepping down in November. Elliott Walden, vice president and racing manager, took over Cauthen's roles. Regardless of the personnel moves, 2010 was a dynamic year for one of the sport's top operations.

Troutt, standing on stage with his wife Lisa, as well as Bill and Susan Casner and Elliott and Rebecca Walden, accepted the award last night, thanking first God and then his trainers, Bill Mott and Todd Pletcher. He also singled out Walden for thanks. "Elliott was in charge of all the racing horses; he bought them, he put them with the trainers, he communicated with them and just kept us going in the right direction. Also, I want to thank Bill and Susan Casner, friends of mine for over 35 years. We met at the racetrack, and we've been together ever since. And it was their vision and their passion that got me back into this business about 10 years ago, and I just want to thank them from the bottom of my heart. I want to thank my wife, Lisa, and our kids who are back home watching this on TV."

Adena Springs saw its record streak of five straight wins as Outstanding Breeder snapped last year by Juddmonte Farms, but Frank Stronach's operation is back on top, thanks to Eclipse voters. Stronach also garnered the award in 2000. A total of 533 Adena-bred horses faced the starter in 2010. They made 3,661 starts, won 506 races, and earned \$13,369,852. That put Adena on top in each of those categories. By way of comparison, the runner-up breeder by earnings, Eclipse finalist Brereton C. Jones, had 269 starters who made 1,565 starts, won 236 times and earned \$6,545,265.

If you include horses Adena bred in partnership, those numbers grow even bigger, though not but much. Alone or in partnership, Adena bred 551 starters in 2010, who made 3,739 starts, won 519 races, and earned \$13,638,355. It was the eighth consecutive year Adena topped the "Individuals" and the "Individuals and Partnerships" leading breeder lists.

Adena bred 15 black-type winners in 2010, including GI Blue Grass S. hero **Stately Victor**, by Adena's young sire Ghostzapper. Adena also bred three-time Grade II winner **Bourbon Bay** (Sligo Bay {Ire}); GIII Ohio Derby and GI Florida Derby runner-up **Pleasant Prince** (Indy King); GIII Lone Star Derby winner **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again); Prince of Wales S. winner **Golden Moka** (Golden Missile); GII Autumn S. winner **Stunning Stag** (Running Stag); American 1000 Guineas heroine **Bay to Bay** (Sligo Bay {Ire}); MG1SP **Riveting Reason** (Fusaichi Pegasus); MGSP **Fatal Bullet** (Red Bullet); and GISP **Princess Jess** (Stormy Atlantic).

Stronach also has four Eclipse trophies as Outstanding Owner. He won three straight years, from 1998 to 2000, and again in 2008.

A native of Caracas, Venezuela, Ramon Dominguez arrived in the U.S. in 1995, and earned his first win in North America at Hialeah in March of 1996. He developed into the leading rider on the Maryland-Delaware circuit before moving his tack to New York in 2009, and established himself as the leading reinsman in the Empire State.

Dominguez garnered national attention as the regular rider for Better Talk Now, who captured the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Turf. He also piloted Gio Ponti during his dual Eclipse Award-winning campaign in 2009, and guided that bay to another championship season last year, with wins in the GI Man o' War S. at Belmont and GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland, as well as finishing second to Goldikova (Ire) in the GI BC Mile at Churchill Downs.

The 34-year-old rider rode five winners at Aqueduct Feb. 17, and brought home four winners on a card no fewer than 12 times in 2010. His other big triumphs last year were Boys At Tosconova in the GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S., Check the

Omar Moreno took home a Sovereign Award as Canada's top apprentice jockey in 2009, and carried the momentum forward to 2010, becoming the winningest apprentice in North America with 146 wins and over \$5.4 million in earnings. Last night, he was recognized with an Eclipse Award.

Moreno has overcome much to stand where he is today. From El Salvador, he lost his mother in the Salvadoran Civil War before immigrating to Edmonton, Alberta, where he lived in foster homes. As a teenager in Canada, Moreno envisioned glory not in horse racing, but boxing, where he hoped to represent his adopted country in the Olympics. But a shoulder injured derailed the three-time junior national champion's aspirations.

His diminutive size--he stands roughly five feet and weighs 106 pounds--led those around him to suggest the racetrack. Moreno painted houses in Edmonton while he learned to ride at nearby Northlands Park, and in 2009, he enjoyed a break-out season, winning 48 of 480 starts.

The Sovereign Award he earned availed him of more opportunities in 2010, when he compiled a record of 146 wins in 1,041 starts. But Moreno's competitive spirit keeps him striving to improve.

"When I look back, I always tend to think about what I could have done to make it better, how I could have won more races," he said last week. "But I was thrilled with how things went. You need to remind yourself that you are going to lose more races than you are going to win. I tried to handle losing better. Overall, though, we had a good year, and I was able to stay healthy. And now, I'm a finalist for an Eclipse Award. You can't ask for more than that."

The last time Todd Pletcher earned a divisional title was in 2007, the season his star pupil, Rags to Riches (A.P. Indy), gave her silver-haired conditioner his first Classic victory in the GI Belmont S. Fast-forward to 2010 and Pletcher would guide Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) to an Eclipse as top juvenile, and ride another Classic triumph--this time with WinStar's Super Saver (Maria's Mon) in the GI Kentucky Derby--to help him pave the way to yet another training title. In total, Pletcher's latest Eclipse gives him his fifth divisional crown, including three consecutive titles, beginning in 2004. He ties the record set by Bobby Frankel, who was top trainer in 1993, and again from 2000 to 2003.

Ribbing Uncle Mo's owner, Mike Repole, Pletcher said, "Mike said something during his 30-minute acceptance speech earlier, thanking the fans as the backbone of our industry. That's true, but, as a trainer, the life-blood of what we do is the owners. We've been blessed with tremendous backing--without the owners, there's no Uncle Mo, there's no Quality Road, there's no Super Saver, there are no opportunities like that."

He added, "We lost someone really important to all of us in Edwards Evans, and he will certainly be missed by all of us."

Pletcher closed out the 2010 season after hitting paydirt at an impressive 25-percent clip. His seasonal earnings of \$23,157,098 eclipsed that of 2009 Eclipse champion Steve Asmussen, who rounded out the year with \$16,308,920 in purses, and Bob Baffert, who concluded the year with \$11,103,463 in the coffers.

In 2010, the Dallas native's powerhouse string included GI Wood Memorial S. hero Eskendereya (Giant's Causeway); Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie), victorious in the GI Champagne S. and GI BC Juvenile S.; GI Mother Goose S. and GI CCA Oaks victress Devil May Care (Malibu Moon) and Derby champion Super Saver (Maria's Mon). In addition to those stable stars, Pletcher also trained fellow Grade I winners Life at Ten (Malibu Moon); Quality Road (Elusive Quality); R Heat Lightning (Trippi); Discreetly Mine (Mineshaft) and Malibu Prayer (Malibu Moon).

Pletcher, who collected the leading training title in New York in 2003, added a similar honor during the 2010 racing season. He earned that distinction by leading the ranks at Belmont's spring meet, Aqueduct's winter session and Saratoga's summer meeting, where he set a new record for number of victories. Additionally, the East Coast-based trainer was the leading conditioner at Gulfstream and was also pronounced the co-leading trainer at Monmouth's inaugural 'Elite Meet.'
