ZENYATTA HONORED WITH FIRST-EVER SECRETARIAT VOX POPULI AWARD

Penny Chenery, owner of superhorse Secretariat, yesterday announced that 2010 Horse of the Year **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}) has been named the first-ever recipient of the Secretariat *Vox Populi* Award.

According to a press release, the annual award will "recognize a horse whose popularity and racing excellence best resounded with the American public and gained recognition for the sport during the past year." Chenery will present owners Jerry and Ann Moss with a custom-

made trophy during a ceremony at Santa Anita Feb. 5. "Horse racing already has established avenues to award outstanding accomplishments, and we certainly should honor superior performance," Chenery said in a statement. "But achievement can be measured in many ways, and fans occasionally feel a disconnect when the horses who most impacted the public are not recognized through the traditional equine awards. The industry is long overdue in annually acknowledging the star horse who brings the most excitement and attention to the sport. It is my hope that the Secretariat *Vox Populi* Award will achieve that purpose." Chenery herself selected Zenyatta as the inaugural Secretariat *Vox*

Populi Award winner, but will put together a committee of racing personalities and industry representatives, as well as utilizing a national on-line vote, to choose future winners. "I think racing fans will be just as excited about this award as I am, and we welcome everyone

to come and share in the presentation festivities on Feb. 5," Chenery added. "The award is sure to be an honor that reflects the heart and soul of this sport and will help build upon the devotion the public has for a horse they love."

SOVEREIGN AWARD FINALISTS ANNOUNCED

The Jockey Club of Canada revealed the finalists for the 36th Annual Sovereign Awards Ceremony, which will take place Apr. 1 at Woodbine. Live Thoroughbred racing begins in Canada Apr. 2 Voting for the finalists began Jan. 1 in an effort to allow for statistics for the entire year to be considered.

Biofuel (Stormin Fever), a co-champion in Canada during her juvenile campaign in 2009, is back among the finalists for sophomore fillies, and is considered a leading candidate for Horse of the Year. The finalists for three-year-old male are **Big Red Mike** (Tenpins) and **Hotep** (A.P. Indy), the one-two finishers in the Queen's Plate; and GIII Canadian Derby winner **No Hesitation** (Siberian Summer). 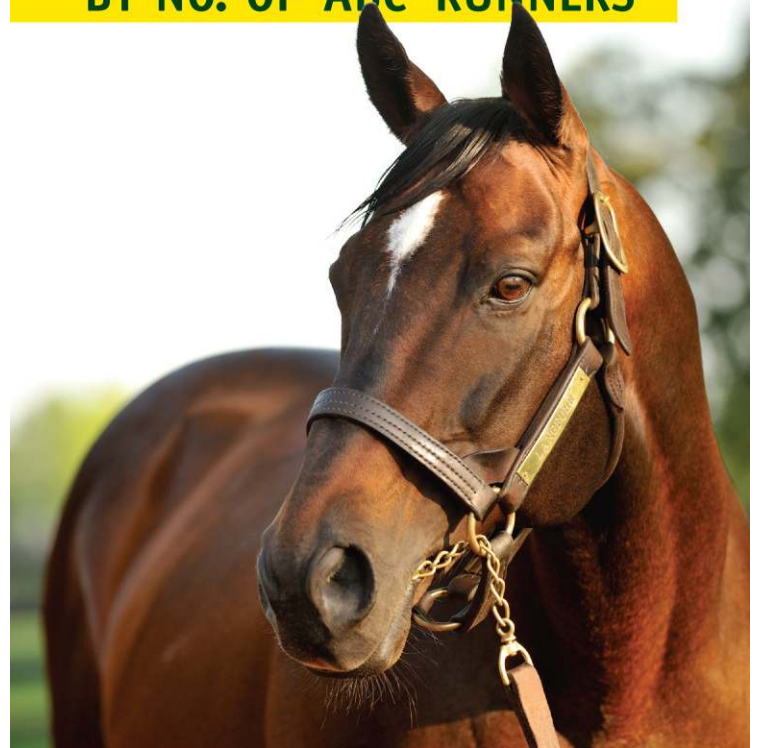

SIDNEY'S CANDY BACK IN TRAINING

Grade I winner Sidney's Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}), scratched on the eve of the GII San Fernando S. last weekend, is back on track after undergoing a nuclear scan Monday, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The examination showed no injury to his right hind foot. "The good news is that he's okay," trainer John Sadler told *DRF*. "He went back to the track [Wednesday]." Winner of the GI Santa Anita Derby last April, the chestnut captured Del Mar's GII La Jolla H. in his turf debut this summer, when he established a new course record of 1:39.52 for 8 1/2 furlongs. The Craig homebred most recently captured the off-the-turf GIII Sir Beaufort S. by 7 1/4 lengths on Santa Anita's opening day, and will now point for the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile on the Arcadia sod Mar. 5. "I like the timing," Sadler added. "I want to save him for the big races later this year."

Brethren Bound for Tampa...

WinStar's unbeaten **Brethren** (Distorted Humor), the half-brother to GI Kentucky Derby hero Super Saver (Maria's Mon), could make his stakes bow in the GIII Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Bay Feb. 12, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "His first start will most likely come in the Sam Davis at Tampa," trainer Todd Pletcher told *DRF*. "We're looking for some graded earnings, have had luck there in the past, and I like the one-mile and sixteenth distance--it's just more attractive than bringing him back at a mile and an eighth." Brethren closed out 2010 with an allowance score under the Twin Spires Nov. 27, and Pletcher did compare the sophomore to his elder brother. "Obviously the pedigree is there and he has the affinity for Churchill Downs--we saw that in his allowance win there," Pletcher added. "We're very high on him."

Deem, winner of the 2009 installment of this race when it was last conducted at Nad Al Sheba, recorded a victory over the local strip in the G3 Balanchine S. at Meydan in 2010. "She is in good form and seems to thrive in Dubai," said French jockey Olivier Peslier, who will ride the six-year-old Jerry Barton trainee. "We have to be hopeful of a good run, and hopefully, there will be a decent pace in the race to utilise her stamina." Runner-up behind Deem in the aforementioned Balanchine was Godolphin's Aspectoflove, who was also runner-up in last year's Cape Verdi. Aspectoflove, a dual listed winner in England last fall, will try her luck again over her home base. "She ran well in both her Meydan races last year and we are very happy with her," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "She is better racing prominently, and we expect her to go close."

FIFTH THIRD BANK FILES SUIT AGAINST

GULF COAST FARMS According to published reports, Fifth Third Bank has filed suit against Gulf Coast Farms, alleging that Gulf Coast defaulted on loans totalling more than \$15 million in 2009 and 2010. The papers were filed in Fayette Circuit Court in Lexington Jan. 5. Fifth Third is petitioning to have Keeneland turn over Gulf Coast's net profits from the dispersal of stock at the November Sale to the court. Richard Getty, the attorney for Gulf Coast, told *Daily Racing Form* that a countersuit would be filed, and that Fifth Third Bank did not hold the primary lien on all of the horses sold at Keeneland November. "Celtic Bank has the first, prior, and superior lien [on six of the mares sold], but, despite Fifth Third acknowledging Celtic Bank has a first lien, they've continued to try and hold up dispersal to Celtic Bank, which would substantially pay off Gulf Coast's loan to that entity, insisting that funds be paid to them," Getty told *DRF*. "I assume there is going to be significant dispute over the priorities involving a number of the horses that Fifth Third claiming the proceeds of, including a number of horses that were owned by lessees." He added, "I assume all these issues are going to be resolved by the court as expeditiously as possible."

Indy), brought a bid of \$47,000 from Michael Sucher to top Wednesday's second and final session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's January Mixed Sale. Consigned by Summerfield, the unraced four-year-old ([hip 299](#)) is a daughter of SW Trisha Runs (Sharkey). The highest-priced short yearling Wednesday was [hip 230](#), a son of MGSW Master Command (A.P. Indy) who sold to Blackwood Stable for \$28,000. The bay colt, a son of SW Quelle Surprise (Slew Gin Fizz), was consigned by Bridlewood Farm. Following the trend of Tuesday's consignor preferred session, figures were up at this year's open session, with 191 head grossing \$916,600 and averaging \$4,799. The Jockey Club to Continue Checkoff Program:

(Edited press release) The Jockey Club has renewed the retirement checkoff program that enables owners and breeders to support Thoroughbred aftercare programs at the time they register their foals in 2011, and will once again donate \$100,000 to each of the program's two beneficiaries. The Jockey Club donations and the checkoff proceeds benefit the retirement, re-training and adoption efforts of Thoroughbred Charities of America (TCA) and the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation (TRF). The retirement checkoff program is administered by The Jockey Club. Thoroughbred breeders have the option of selecting one of four graduated amounts (\$25, \$50, \$75 or \$100), to be designated for these Thoroughbred aftercare programs, or they can fill in the amount of their choice on the Application for Foal Registration form.

Other returning GOP members include Sam Johnson (TX), Charles Boustany, Jr. (LA), Geoff Davis (KY) and Devin Nunes (CA).

In the wake of last November's elections and subsequent loss of control in the House, Democrats continue to adjust membership. Richard Neal (MA), Mike Thompson (CA) and Joe Crowley (NY) will serve on Ways and Means under Ranking Member Sander Levin (MI).

Ways and Means impacts the horse racing industry due to its jurisdiction over tax matters such as those that affect owners and breeders and horseplayers.
