LOVE CONQUERS ALL IN CAPE VERDI

Aspectoflove (Ire) (Danetime {Ire}), a narrow runner-up in the 2010 renewal of this event, exacted her revenge to land her first score of the season in Thursday's G2 Cape Verdi S. at Meydan. Second behind Soneva (Cherokee Run) when the Cape Verdi was a Group 3 last winter, she returned to fall just a nose short of 2009 Cape Verdi winner Deem (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) 20 days later in the Feb. 25

G3 Balanchine S. The bay closed her campaign last term in Great Britain, highlighted by narrow scores in the Sep. 25 Deloitte Rosemary S. at Ascot and, most recently, the Oct. 28 Fleur de Lys Fillies' S. at Lingfield. She stalked the early pace from third, took over 300 meters from the wire and gamely denied **Thai Haku (Ire)**. **River Jetez (SAf)** was an unlucky third after a gamble to take the inside route by pilot Christophe Soumillon did not pay off when Thai Haku took to the rail and closed the gap. "We were hopeful as she had been working very well and is an improved filly this year after a good campaign in Europe," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor. JOEL HEADS UPGRADES

Newmarket's Joel S. has been awarded Group 2 status and is the chief beneficiary of a trio of upgrades by the European Pattern Committee. Previously run as a Group 3, the mile contest will be staged Sept. 23 and forms part of the inaugural British Champions' Series in 2011. Royal Ascot's Hampton Court S. has been enhanced to Group 3 from listed level and will be renamed the Tercentenary S. for this year's edition as the racecourse executive celebrates the 300th anniversary of the showcase meeting. *Cont. p4*

KEENELAND ANNOUNCES SPRING STAKES

Keeneland unveiled a \$3.425-million stakes schedule for its 2011 spring meeting, which will run Apr. 8-29. A total of 16 stakes races will be conducted during the 15-day meet, headlined by the \$750,000 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 16 and \$400,000 GI Central Bank Ashland S. Apr. 9. "The racing world converges on Keeneland in the spring because they know this is where the best jockeys, trainers and horses will be, and they want to compete at the highest level," said Director of Racing W.B. Rogers Beasley. The Lexington oval will host two other top-level events, both worth \$300,000, the GI Vinery Madison S. Apr. 14 and GI Maker's Mark Mile Apr. 15. DATES SET FOR '11 KY DERBY & OAKS POOLS

Edited Press Release

Churchill Downs has established dates for a trio of three-day betting pools in its 2011 Kentucky Derby Future Wager ("KDFW") and a single pool for this year's Kentucky Oaks Future Wager ("KOFW"). Dates established for the Kentucky Derby Future Wager, which is being conducted for the 13th consecutive year, are:

- POOL 1 - Feb. 18-20
- POOL 2 - March 11-13
- POOL 3 - April 1-3

Wagering on each of the Kentucky Derby 'Future Wager' pools will open at noon on Friday and close on Sunday at 6 p.m. The 'KDFW' Pools will include both win and exacta wagering. The 137th running of the GI Kentucky Oaks, which will carry a record purse of \$1 million in 2011, is scheduled for May 6 and the \$2 million GI Kentucky Derby Presented by Yum! Brands will be run May 7.

The dates for the single pool for the Kentucky Oaks Future Wager will again run concurrently with Pool 2 of the Derby Future. The 2011 Oaks Future Pool is set for March 11-13.

Betting on that pool will open at noon Mar. 11 and close Mar. 13 at 6:30p.m., 30 minutes after the conclusion of wagering on the second Derby Future Pool.

There is a significant change in the Kentucky Oaks Future Wager as exacta betting will be offered as part of that wager for the first time. The Kentucky Oaks pool, which is being offered for the ninth consecutive year, had previously offered win betting only. Exacta wagering has been offered on the past five Derby Future pools over the past two years.

Winning payouts in all three pools of the 2010 Kentucky Derby Future Wager on WinStar Farm's victorious Super Saver were significantly larger than the \$18 mutuel returned for a winning ticket on the Todd Pletcher trainee on Derby Day. A \$2 KDFW bet on Super Saver returned \$43.20 in Pool 1, \$51.20 in Pool 2 and \$73 in Pool 3. The Derby Future bet's \$2 exacta in Pool 3 for 1-2 Derby finishers Super Saver and Ice Box returned \$1,077.40--a record payout in the brief history of the Derby Future exacta. The exacta that combined those two horses on Derby Day returned \$152.40. Wagering interests for each of the Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks Future Wager will be announced on the Wednesday prior to the Friday start of each pool. RACETRACK Round-Up

Leave of Absence Possible for Holy Bull

Klaravich Stables and William H. Lawrence's **Leave of Absence** (Harlan's Holiday) worked a sharp half-mile in :48 flat Thursday morning at Palm Meadows. According to trainer trainer Rick Violette Jr., the Jan. 8 Spectacular Bid S. runner-up is being considered for Gulfstream's GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 30. "He worked very well and ran a good race in the Spectacular Bid," said Violette after the workout. "He just confirmed what we thought of him, and it's possible, we'll run him." Also possible for the Holy Bull is the same team's **Rescind the Trade** (Put It Back), who took an 'a other than' allowance race going one mile and 70 yards around two turns on the 'inner' track at Aqueduct Dec. 19. A final decision will be made following today's scheduled work. "He's already been two turns, so I'm a little reluctant to turn him back to a one-turn race [Holy Bull]," said Violette. "The other option would be to wait and run him in the [1 1/16mile, GIII] Sam Davis S. [Feb. 12] at Tampa Bay Downs."

Also working Thursday morning in advance of the Holy Bull was Our Sugar Bear Stable's **Gourmet Dinner** (Trippi), who earned the 'bullet' for five furlongs at Gulfstream. He negotiated the distance in :58 2/5 for trainer Steve Standridge.

Also up in grade is Doncaster's Sceptre S., which is a Group 3 for the first time. Ruth Quinn, director of racing at the British Horseracing Authority, commented, "All three races are fully deserving of the respective upgrades and are credible enhancements to Britain's Pattern programme. The Joel S. is a race that consistently provides great strength in depth. As a Group 2 event on a revised date, it has been positioned to provide an opportunity for quality milers on the weekend where the QEII was previously sited. It will have an important role to play in the programme and I am sure it will live up to expectations. The Hampton Court, to be retitled the Tercentenary S., has clearly been a strong addition to the Royal Ascot meeting since its inception in 2000. The European Pattern Committee has done much in recent years to enhance the programme for fillies and mares to encourage them to stay in training and compete beyond the age of three. Rewarding the fillies being placed in the Sceptre with Group 3 status can only assist this evolving process."

TDN's The Hot List

And the Gold Goes To...

Before we get back on track with The Hot List, we want to take a second to review last year's third-crop leaders, who we say to goodbye to in 2011 as they move on to be, well, fourth-crop sires. Mind, these are based on cumulative earnings in the Northern Hemisphere, excluding Japan (whose massive purses tend to throw our sires lists out of whack). Black-type is as designated in the International Cataloguing Standards in association with the International Federation of Horse-racing Authorities. There's just something exciting about watching young sires emerge as legitimate stars, and, as we talked about the last time we reviewed this bunch, the 2010 third-crop stallions are proving a vintage group, with the likes of **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}), **Tapit** (Pulpit), **Candy Ride (Arg)**, **Speightstown** (Gone West), **Birdstone** (Grindstone) and the now-exported **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat).

Since their first runners hit the track in 2008, they've taken turns beating each other on the year-end standings. Tapit won the battle for freshman honors care of his champion daughter Stardom Bound. Medaglia d'Oro won the sophomore championship in '09 care of *his* champion daughter Rachel Alexandra. And Lion Heart took the 2010 third-crop title, thanks to his GI Breeders' Cup Turf-winning son Dangerous Midge. At the end of three contentious years, though, it was Medaglia d'Oro who came out on top by way of cumulative earnings. According to the *TDN* Sire Lists, his runners earned a total of \$15,423,760 during three seasons. They included 20 black-type winners, 35 black-type horses, nine graded winners, 15 graded horses and five Grade I winners. The result is a \$100,000 stud fee at Darley this spring and mantle as one of Darley America's two premier stallions--the other being Street Cry (Ire).

Tapit was runner-up with \$14,461,321 in earnings. The Gainesway stallion is coming off a huge week: his son Tapizar, put himself on the Derby trail with an easy win in the GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita. On the same card, his four-year-old colt Tweebster missed by the narrowest of margins in the GII San Fernando S., and sophomore daughter Zazu ran third in the GII Santa Ynez S. Also armed with the likes of his Grade I-winning filly Tell a Kelly, Tapit could be on the verge of a blockbuster 2011.

On the Hot Seat

The TDN recently talked to Darley's global COO Olly Tait about **Medaglia d'Oro**. Here's what he had to say.



What type of mares have worked best with him? From a pedigree perspective, it seems he is well-suited to a wide range of bloodlines. Early on in his career he seemed to be nicking very well with Mr. Prospector-line stallions, but as the numbers of his progeny of racing age increase, it is clear that he is producing stakes winners from mares from a variety of sire lines. This versatility is also apparent when looking at the physical characteristics of mares that suit him best. He produces such consistent, well-balanced, good-looking stock that it is hard to pinpoint a particular physical trait in females that suits him. This in turn helps on the track. He has had Grade I winners on turf, dirt and synthetic, and we expect this to continue.

How is his 2011 book is shaping up? He is hugely popular and is fully booked this year. He had a great year on the track, again siring three individual Grade I winners, and is consistently getting stakes winners. He receives the support that you would expect for one of America's most exciting stallions.

What sorts of common traits do Medaglia d'Oro's best offspring have, particularly from a conformational standpoint? He produces great physicals, which has always been borne out by his sales performance. His stock have a lot of quality but are big and strong. They are correct and very athletic.

How many mares will Sheikh Mohammed send to Medaglia d'Oro in 2011? Sheikh Mohammed will support Medaglia d'Oro heavily this year, as he did last year and as he has done in the sale ring.

Can you tell us any of the mares in particular Sheikh Mohammed is sending to Medaglia d'Oro in 2011? Mares such as multiple Grade I winners Cocoa Beach (Chi) [Doneraile Court] and Flashing [A.P. Indy] will visit him, as will Fleet Lady, the dam of champion two-year-old and Darley stallion Midshipman [Unbridled's Song].

Eclipse Award Action...

Now, back to the current third-crop sires, the intended focus of this week's column. The Eclipse Awards were held Monday night in Miami, with Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) walking away as the big winner, taking home Horse of the Year honors by a relatively solid margin--128 votes to Blame (Arch)'s 102--and her third straight Eclipse for champion older female.

Established sires dominated affairs.

Of all the winners, only Blind Luck's sire **Pollard's Vision** (Carson City) had runners aged four years or younger in 2010 (his oldest were actually three). (Note: The little-known Awesome of Course, by Awesome Again and the sire of champion two-year-old filly Awesome Feather, had five-year-olds in 2010, though calling him an 'established' sire might be a stretch.)

Blind Luck has now flown the flag for her sire Pollard's Vision pretty convincingly over the past two seasons. The hard-knocking miss could well have been named champion juvenile filly in 2009 after winning the GI Oak Leaf S. and GI Hollywood Starlet, and placing in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and GI Darley Debutante. But Eclipse voters understandably went for the GI Juvenile Fillies heroine She Be Wild (Offlee Wild), who also won the GIII Arlington-Washington Lassie S. and ran second in the GI Darley Alcibiades S.

If she didn't quite convince the crowd in 2009, Blind Luck left no doubt who was the best sophomore miss 2010. During a nine-race campaign, the Jerry Hollendorfer-trained chestnut won five starts, including the GI Kentucky Oaks, GI Betfair TVG Alabama S., and GI Las Virgenes S. She also ran 1 3/4 lengths off Unrivaled Belle (Unbridled's Song) when second in the GI Breeders' Cup Ladies' Classic while beating divisional rival Havre de Grace (Saint Liam). When the votes were counted for champion three-year-old female, all but one of the 238 went for Blind Luck. (No Such Word, by Canadian Frontier, got the lone holdout.)

"It was a thrill," said John J. Greely IV, co-owner and syndicate manager at Wintergreen Stallion Station, which stands Pollard's Vision. "We were kind of expecting it, but it's nice when it actually happens. We were hoping she'd get it at two, but the Breeders' Cup race sealed it for [She Be Wild]."

Blind Luck recently came back and was a disappointing second at 3-5 odds in the GII El Encino S. at Santa Anita, but a speed-favoring track sure didn't help her chances. Only once all day--in the card's finale, a \$20,000 maiden claimer--did a horse win after being more than 1 1/2 lengths back at the first call.

"But it looks like she came out of the race good the other day, and we're hoping they point her to the GI Apple Blossom H., then maybe go to Kentucky and back up to Saratoga," said Greely.

Blind Luck's success has, without a doubt, made it easier to sell seasons for Pollard's Vision for Greely and his crew. After seeing his book dip to 36 mares in 2009--he covered 133, 102, and 55 mares his first three years--Pollard's Vision covered 165 mares in 2010 at an advertised fee of \$10,000. What's more, he shuttled to La Mission near Buenos Aires, Argentina for the first time last year, and bred an additional 130 mares in the Southern Hemisphere.

"The response has been great," said Greely. "But with us asking him to do the Southern Hemisphere, I don't know that we'll breed as many mares to him this year, but we're looking for a good, solid book of 120 to 130 mares." Pollard's Vision's fee has been raised a bit to \$12,500 this term.

Hot Lists Cont.

Part of Pollard's Vision's popularity with breeders is that fact that, while Blind Luck has been by far and away his best runner, he's shown the ability to sire quality elsewhere, too. According to the *TDN* Third-Crop Cumulative Earnings List, where he sits in sixth at \$4,736,327, Pollard's Vision has 146 named foals, of which seven have won a black-type race. Among Kentucky sires, his percentage of BTW/Foals--4.27 percent--sits just behind Afleet Alex's 5.04 percent and the deceased Saint Liam's 4.44 percent.

True, none of those have won a graded race other than Blind Luck, but his now four-year-old colt Air Crew has been hard-trying type overseas, winning a third of his 24 races and accounting for four stakes races. In fact, most of Pollard's Vision's stock appears to be plenty sound. His daughter Vertical Vision made seven starts at two, winning a pair of Prairie Meadows stakes, then made nine starts in 2010, just like Blind Luck. She didn't win as a three-year-old, but did hit the board five times in black-type events, including a near-miss second to the good Decelerator (Dehere) in the one-mile Instant Racing S. at Oaklawn in April. Another daughter, Fuzzy Britches, made 12 starts last year. Second in the 2009 GII Demoiselle S. as a juvenile, she went on to capture the 2010 Dearly Precious S. at Aqueduct and finish third in the GIII Dogwood S. at Churchill.

That's 72 combined starts for those four horses--Blind Luck, Air Crew, Vertical Vision, and Fuzzy Britches--over two seasons of racing. Looking at a list of his other leading-money earners, he has horses that have made 14, 17 (2x), 18, 20, and 24 starts through their three-year-old years. Not bad, even if they're not all Grade I horses.

"One thing they all have is heart," said Greely. "No matter what level they're running at, they're all trying."

Greely points out, too, that Pollard's Vision has made the most of limited opportunities. "Those horses didn't come out of Grade I-producing mares," he laughed. "Everybody's looking for a stallion who's going to improve his mares, and he's been doing that as good if not better than any stallion in the country."

Asked about what he's looked for in potential mates for Pollard's Vision, Greely said, "One of the lines that's worked very well has been inbreeding to Blushing Groom (Fr), through Mt. Livermore or Rahy or any of those stallions. A lot of time those Blushing Groom mares aren't the biggest mares, but he's had quite a bit of success with them. We've also noticed with both him and Five Star Day [another son of Carson City] that breeding to Storm Cat-line mares has worked."

Blind Luck herself is out of Lucky One, by Broad Brush's son Best of Luck. Lucky One garnered headlines in November when she sold, in foal to Pollard's Vision, for \$1.85 million to Shadai Farm.

Many remember Pollard's Vision as the one-eyed battler from Todd Pletcher's barn who carried the silks of David Moore's Edgewood Farm. Fewer probably remember that he in fact was born at raised at Wintergreen.

"I had Pollard's Vision, Borrego, and a horse that won the Japanese Derby all in the same paddock together when Pollard's Vision went blind," said Greely. Pollard's Vision lost his right eye in May of his yearling year, the result of his dam being affected mildly by Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome.

Greely sees similarities between Pollard's Vision as a youngster and his foals. "They're a lot like he was as a baby," he chuckled. "They're all very forward. "We are very excited to have Neko Bay for his first season this year," said Greely. "Last year, he won a Grade II and was second in the GI Santa Anita H. Besides being a very nice race horse, he is by sire of sires Giant's Causeway, out of a Grade II-winning 3/4 sister to Lemon Drop Kid and from the immediate family of A.P. Indy. He has been very well received so far this year."

NYRA Vets to Administer Lasix on Race Day:

Edited Press Release

Beginning Wednesday, Jan. 26, veterinarians for The New York Racing Association, Inc. will administer Lasix to horses on race day. "This important integrity measure will eliminate the need for private veterinarians to enter horses' stalls on race days," NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward said. "Combined with the expanded in-house drug testing program that was instituted last summer, we are very pleased with the progress made to protect the integrity of NYRA racing." Starting with last year's meet at Saratoga Race Course, NYRA enhanced its in-house drug testing program to detect illegal performance-enhancing substances in thoroughbred race horses utilizing state-of-the-art science, technology, and procedural processes. The program includes random out-of-competition testing designed to effectively deter the use of blood-doping agents such as Erythropoietin (EPO), bronchial dilators, and other emerging threats. At that time, NYRA also ceased operations of the security barn, initiating an "in-today" process that identifies all horses, in their stalls, running in a NYRA race within 24 hours. NYRA tests illegal levels of total carbon dioxide (TCO2, known as "milkshaking") through an assembly barn where all horses entering a race are required to report just prior to moving to the paddock for saddling. NYRA is the only racing circuit where private veterinarians do not administer Lasix.

Union Moves to Reopen NY OTB:

Representatives of the New York Off-Track Betting union workers moved to block the dismissal of NYC OTB's bankruptcy case Thursday, according to *Harness Tracks of America*. The group argued that funds previously paid out to tracks should be recovered to pay health and welfare benefits to the approximately 1000 terminated employees and 600 retirees. In response, OTB representatives indicated that the money left is enough to pay uncashed employee checks. According to reports, lawyers for NYRA, Yonkers and Monticello were on hand to oppose the move, indicating that the union employees should seek compensation in state court. A court ruling can come as early as next week.
