pacesetting **Pants On Fire** (Jump Start) for a head success in the first race of the series which culminates with the \$1-million GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 26.

After rallying from eighth to be beaten a head when runner-up in a seven-furlong

Keeneland maiden Oct. 21, the homebred couldn't overcome a wide alley and stayed on for second in an off-turf event at Churchill Nov. 14. The dark bay colt validated 2-1 favoritism in graduating by a length over this course and distance Dec. 10, he was five-wide in a five-horse field early on in a Jan. 1 allowance prep for the Lecomte, was still deep on the final turn and had to settle for third behind **Justin Phillip** (First Samurai). With Robby Albarado sidelined by injury, Garrett Gomez picked up the mount and saved ground from the inside post as East Coast raider **Pants On Fire** doled out a moderate pace of :24.82 for the opening two furlongs and :48.94 to the half. Gomez asked his mount for a middle move with about four furlongs to race and drew to within a length of the front-runner as the quarter pole loomed. **Pants On Fire** still held the call well into the final furlong, but **Wilkinson** gradually took ground from that one and was along in the waning strides. Justin Phillip, the even-money favorite off his allowance win, seemed unwilling to settle beneath Shaun Bridgmohan and had nothing to offer when the real running started, trailing in last.

Six-for-six to start his career, Euroears was kept out of the win column in 2010, beginning the year with a sixth in the Gaudin Memorial S. in New Orleans Jan. 23 and a third in the Duncan F. Kenner S. Mar. 27. A neck second in the GIII Texas Mile in his first try at that distance Apr. 24, he was a distant third in the GIII Lone Star Park H. going another sixteenth of a mile May 31 and was last seen finishing 13th of 14 in the GII Firecracker H. on the Churchill turf July 4. He trained sensationally over the new dirt surface at Santa Anita and ran to those morning trials. Quickly in front under Mike Smith, the fleet chestnut got his opening half-mile in :43.47, was by the five-eighths in :54.95 and remained clear to the wire. Smiling Tiger was fractious pre-start, didn't break alertly and never looked happy inside, though did just enough to keep the bridgejumpers on terra firma. He responded strongly and kept Dubious Miss at bay to add another graded win to his trophy case. "He's really adaptable," said trainer Mike Stidham immediately after the race. "I told Rosie [winning jockey Anna Napravnik] to let him sit where he's comfortable. He can be up close or he can come from the back. He continues to amaze me. He's amazed me in his last four or five races, like he's almost changed his style as an eight-year-old."

Calibrachoa decimated a second-level allowance field by six lengths at Hoosier Park Sept. 1 before missing by a half-length when runner-up in a \$50,000 claimer at Belmont Park Oct. 14. Dropped a peg on the claiming ladder into \$40,000 company at Aqueduct Nov. 18, the dark bay was haltered from his breeders by these Eclipse Award-winning connections out of a 4 1/4-length success. Calibrachoa tried the inner track for the first time in his most recent trip to the post, and he earned back the lion's share of his owner's investment, coming away to score an easy 1 1/2-length victory in the Dec. 18 Gravesend S. With entrymate Driven By Success (Precise End) ticketed for two turns in the Mr. International S. this coming Wednesday, it was left to Calibrachoa to fly the Repole flag and he did so successfully. A stalking third early on as an erratic Fastus Cactus (Cactus Ridge) cut out the running, the odds-on gamble loomed menacingly at the quarter pole. Independence War split rivals one off the fence inside the final furlong and looked like he might register the upset, but Calibrachoa dug in and found the wire first. Jockey Cornelio Velasquez went for an inside run on Endless Circle, but was forced to steady. He shifted back to the outside and finished strongly for third.

Of the 53 sons and daughters from the first crop of dual Grade I-winning sprinter Pomeroy (Boundary) to go under the hammer in 2009, Flashpoint achieved the third-highest price, selling for an even \$100,000 to John Fort's Peachtree Stable. Fort is an experienced horseman who cut his teeth with the likes of Hall of Famers Max Hirsch and Woody Stephens and worked for Calumet Farm during the Alydar and Davona Dale era, and has been no stranger to success since founding Peachtree in 1981. In the last 10 years, Peachtree has campaigned the likes of GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Invisible Ink (Thunder Gulch), Chimichurri (Elusive Quality), a Grade III winner who Fort later sold for \$2.1 million at Keeneland November; and India (Hennessy), who broke her maiden by 12 lengths at second asking before being sold for a reported price in excess of \$2 million. Flashpoint, who sparkled in winning his Jan. 15 debut by 6 1/4 front-running lengths ([video](#)), remains under Peachtree ownership--for now, that is.

"Every Peachtree horse is for sale," Fort confirmed from his South Carolina offices. "We haven't had the right offer yet, but hopefully that will come along."

It's all a bit of a guessing game, Fort would admit, selecting young prospects at public auction, and it was a son of the dual stakes winner Two Punch Lil (Two Punch), who had produced a pair of black-type horses from five foals to race. Fort says the colt who would come to be called Flashpoint did not resemble then what he does now.

"He's a big strong colt, but he was unfinished, a bit rough to handle," Fort recollected. "But he had that big shoulder and big hind end, very correct and a very strong horse. He had a big belly on him, which you had to look through because you knew it would disappear, although it took quite a bit of training."

The colt was sent to Barry and Shari Eisaman for his early breaking and training, and was turned over to trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. early in 2010. He turned in a bullet work at Aqueduct in July, but was sidelined three months before returning to the worktab. He made steady progress once back in the barn, but Fort wasn't counting his chickens before they were hatched.

"Saturday, a week ago," was the first time he knew he had something of considerable talent. "This horse had trained really well at the farm and he trained well for Rick, but honestly, I didn't know he was going to come out and run a race like that. He had the race won in two strides. As soon as he popped out of the gate with that big, huge push, you could see nobody was catching him. I didn't know whether I was going to see a typical maiden race where he showed some speed and got run down, but he was just bounding along under no pressure."

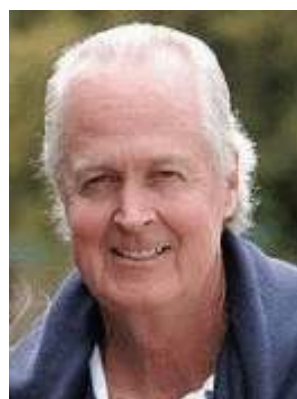

"I was extremely fond of [Rick Dutrow's] dad, who was an old-fashioned racehorse trainer who had a lot of success," Fort said of the reason he decided to employ the junior conditioner. "I probably know a little bit more about a Rick Dutrow than a lot of people do. He comes off as--well, you fill in the blank--but he grew up at the racetrack, and you can't help but develop an instinct and a feel for racing when you have that kind of background."

Though Fort customarily focuses his attention on horses with more scope and the ability to stretch out, he didn't have any problem reaching out for a horse he fully expected to be a short-track animal.

"I'm not necessarily out there looking for horses whose sires were sprinters, but the whole business of analyzing pedigrees is tricky," he explained. "It's indicative of how long a horse wants to go, but it isn't always right. I've seen just as many horses that look like they'll go long stop after six furlongs and horse that are bound to be sprinters that run on."

He continued, "If you were to ask me if this horse is built more like a stayer or a sprinter, I'd say he's a big, strong horse with a nice hind leg on him, but maybe more like a sprinter. If big and strong and broad through the chest makes you a sprinter, well, I guess he's that."

And that's just fine with Fort. "I think it was [Seattle Slew's co-owner] Jim Hill that said that when he looks for a horse, what he wants is a sprinter that forgets to stop," he commented. "I think I'd rather, if I had a card right now going forward into the spring, I think I'd rather have a horse with genuine speed instead of a horse that has no speed. At least this horse has speed; how far he's going to go, I don't really know."

The game plan heading into his maiden was that if he were to run well, Flashpoint would be on one of the first vans headed for Dutrow's Gulfstream Park string. That is soon to happen, Fort says, and he is likely to be pointed for the GII Hutcheson S. over seven furlongs Feb. 26.

"We'll see what happens," Fort stated. "Right now I'd anticipate that the correct race to run in would be a race like the Hutcheson. If he runs through the wire and gallops out an extra eighth of a mile like a freight train, maybe we'll adjust our thinking." To that end and just in case, Fort has sent in his \$600 to nominate Flashpoint to the Triple Crown series.

But whether Flashpoint gets on that train or remains around one turn, Fort thinks the colt is going to show him a good time.

"Let's say you bought a nice grass horse and won the Arlington Million and the Sword Dancer, for example. Would they be happy? You bet they would," he offered. "The same thing applies to sprinters. Let's say we win the Hutcheson, the Swale, the Woody Stephens, the King's Bishop and the Breeders' Cup Sprint. Have we done alright?"--Alan Carasso

### KATHMANBLU (Bluegrass Cat)

Know when to hold 'em, advised Kenny Rogers, but as anyone in the Thoroughbred business can attest, that takes a gift of foresight few can claim to possess. Kathmanblu's owner Five-D Thoroughbreds, however, has effectively made an art of knowing when to sell, and when to sit chilly.

Some three years ago, the *TDN* spoke with Five-D patriarch William Dobozi at the 2007 Keeneland November Sale. A retired orthopedic surgeon, the Lexington-based Dobozi headed a Five-D team that included wife Sandra, sons Todd and Brian, and Brian's wife Shay. The Dobozi had just sold a homebred daughter of Mt. Livermore named Countess Gold for a session-topping \$850,000. The sale was notable because, 11 months earlier, they had RNA'd Countess Gold for \$32,000 at the Keeneland January Sale.

"Her reserve was \$40,000," said Dobozi.

What happened in the interim to cause an \$818,000 appreciation in value? Countess Gold's son Strike The Deal (Van Nistelrooy) happened; bred by Five-D, the colt won the G2 Richmond S. and was considered one of Europe's more promising juveniles that summer. The sale was also notable because it followed a tough spring for Five-D, which lost two foals to Salmonella poisoning.

"This is great," said Dobozi. "We've gone from being miserable a wanting to get out of the business to this."

Interestingly, the Dobozi had another mare on offer at the 2007 November Sale. Their only other mare, in fact, and the dam of one of the stricken foals. She was the stakes-placed **Abba Gold** (Devil's Bag), and was selling on the same day through Denali Stud's consignment. But because of Countess Gold's big price tag, and the good cheer it generated, the Dobozi reasoned they didn't necessarily need to part ways with Abba Gold, and bought her back for \$240,000.

"She's in foal to Bluegrass Cat, so we are more than happy to bring her home," William Dobozi said.

It would prove a fortuitous decision that has paid off as recently as yesterday afternoon, as the resulting foal was Kathmanblu.

The Dobozi initially intended to sell Kathmanblu, and sent her to the Keeneland sales ring at the 2009 September Sale. But once again, they were faced with the decision to hold or fold when a lack of interest in the filly left few suitors. The Dobozi held, buying back Kathmanblu for \$57,000.

"She was a nice-looking filly, I just think the Bluegrass Cats went a bit cold," William Dobozi said yesterday. "I had her in the sale, and I think only 17 people came to look at her. I said, 'Well, we'll race her,' and that Thanksgiving I told my kids that I was giving the filly to Kenny McPeek, because he's the only person that can get us to the Breeders' Cup in the two-year-old fillies race. And sure enough, he got us there."

McPeek not only got Kathmanblu (note: the 'h' is silent) and the Dobozi to the Breeders' Cup last year, where the filly ran a good third in the GII Juvenile Filly Turf, but also has the filly positioned as one of the early favorites for the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill May 6.

"We've been lucky, we've been really blessed," said Dobozi after his filly romped in the Sweetest Chant.

He added, laughing, "It just doesn't happen like this. I mean, I tried to sell the mare, and tried to sell this baby, and nobody wanted them. I didn't really want to race anymore, but I got forced back into. Now, I really like it. I like this racing thing. And I still just have the one mare."

Dobozi went on to explain that Kathmanblu was originally scheduled to start in yesterday's Silverbulletday S. at Fair Grounds, but travel issues kept her local.

"We would have shipped four hours up to Ocala and got a FedEx plane to New Orleans, and then come back, and Kenny didn't want to do that," said Dobozi.

He also said that a dearth of two-turn races on the main track at Gulfstream prompted a return to the grass, a race after Kathmanblu dazzled in the GII Golden Rod S. at Churchill in her first try on dirt.

"We just didn't have a race for her," he said. "Kenny didn't want to go back to one turn, and actually, if this race had come off the turf, we would have scratched. But he wanted to get a race into her, too. He said she's been bucking and tearing down the barn. He said that we didn't need to win this race--we just need to race."

Despite not making the trip to the Fair Grounds this time around, Dobozi said the Big Easy is still in the cards. "We're going back to New Orleans for sure, to run on Feb. 19 in the GIII Rachel Alexandra S. Then we'll probably go to Keeneland for the GI Ashland S. in April. So she'll run on the turf, the dirt, the Poly, and then go to Churchill to run in the [Oaks]. How many fillies can do that?"

Interestingly, although he considers her a main-track horse--"She's definitely a dirt horse; that's where she belongs"--Dobozi said Kathmanblu will likely spend her summer and fall on the sod.

"After the Oaks, she'll go back on the turf for the rest of the year," he said. "Most horses that stay on the dirt, they don't last, though she probably could. But I want to have her around for next year, and the turf's generally a lot more forgiving. But I don't know--McPeek runs the show. I try to leave all the decisions up to him."

Kathmanblu's dam Abba Gold did not produce a foal in 2010, but is set to drop a City Zip foal in the next month or so. After that, she'll be bred back to Bluegrass Cat.

Dobozi concluded by saying that, when it came to Abba Gold and her offspring, his selling days are done--he's holding. And that includes Kathmanblu. "This is a once-in-a-lifetime thing," he said. "She's worth a lot of money as a broodmare, so you don't need to sell her and let someone else have the fun of racing her. I don't want to miss out on that." -LM

Our Dark Knight hit the board in all but one of his nine outings last year, but that lone unplaced effort was a seventh in the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Aug. 1. Second to runaway winner Trickmeister (Proud Citizen) in Saratoga's Pleasant Colony S. Aug. 27, the dark bay finished third in the Star of Cozzene S. at Belmont Oct. 2, and closed out his sophomore campaign with a second to Admiral Alex (Afleet Alex) in the Arts and Letters S. at the Elmont oval Oct. 24. Abrahams was quietly confident heading into Hout Bay's career debut that something good was going to happen.

"Yeah, we were hopeful," he stated. "Every work she's had has been good—even the slower ones were good."

Abrahams was full of praise for the work of Joel Rosario, who rode the filly quietly despite the slow break and let her finish up.

"He just doesn't panic," he explained. "He's one of those riders that doesn't panic and if he gets there he gets there, but he let's them settle and doesn't ride them off their feet. He's a tremendous talent."

As for Hout Bay, named after a picturesque body of water near Cape Town in South Africa, the jury is out on whether she'll be strictly a sprinter or whether she'll stretch out. But one thing is for sure.

"As a homebreeder, I typically don't sell my horses," he said. "I like to race. It's my passion."

Abrahams has five horses in training with John Sadler, including Get Funky (Straight Man), the 2006 GII Del Mar Derby hero and runner-up in the 2007 GI Shoemaker Mile. He has a small broodmare band of three in Kentucky at Columbiana Farm. Hout Bay is the first foal produced by Western Rush (West By West), a half-sister to GSW Onthedeanslist (Honor Grades). She is the dam of a two-year-old filly of this year by Kafwain and a yearling colt by Tiz Wonderful. Western Rush is currently in foal to Cowboy Cal.--*Alan Carasso*

**Stute Dispersing, But Not Going Away:**

Trainer Mel Stute will watch as the nine horses that currently comprise his racing stable go under the hammer Monday night at Barretts, but the conditioner is quick to add while he is downsizing, he is not going to be doing a disappering act. "We've got nine in the sale on Tuesday with (consignor) Mary Knight," explained Stute, who saddled his first winner at Portland Meadows in 1947, and who ranks eighth all-time at Santa Anita with 540 winners explained. "These are horses of racing age and most of them are in [wife] Annabelle's name. I'm keeping my two-year-olds and I've got a couple of them turned out right now. I've got five two-year-olds coming in here to Santa Anita Feb. 1. I don't know how long I'll keep them. I might run them through the Barretts Sale in May, so we'll have to wait and see. I want to do what I can to help (son) Gary also, so we'll be evaluating everything in the next few months." Stute's career highlights include wins in the Grade I Santa Anita Derby and Preakness S. in 1986 with Snow Chief; the 1986 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies with Brave Raj, and the 1987 Breeders' Cup Sprint with the filly Very Subtle.
