## JADE HUNTER DIES

Jade Hunter (Mr. Prospector--Jadana {Ire}, Pharly {Fr}), sire of Horse of the Year Azeri, was euthanized Sunday at Hagyard Equine Medical Institute after suffering complications from colic. The 27-year-old stallion had been pensioned at Old Friends since 2009. While racing for Bruce McNall and Allen Paulson, Jade Hunter won the 1988 GI Gulfstream Park H. and GI Donn H. and was second in the 1987 GI Widener H. The best of his progeny was 11-time Grade I winner Azeri. The Paulson colorbearer was

named champion older mare in 2002, 2003 and 2004 and was Horse of the Year in 2002. She retired in 2004 with earners over \$4 million. Jade Hunter is also the sire of Grade I winners Yagli, Stuka, Diazo and Global Hunter (Arg). He was also represented by graded stakes winners Halory Hunter, Jade Flush, So Keen (NZ), Midway Road, Foufa's Warrior, Pratella, Jadada, Best Friend Stro, Mythical Gem and Procrastinate (Aus). In all, he sired 42 black-type winners and the earners of over \$39 million. Jade Hunter concluded his stud career at Dutchess Views Farm in New York. He was donated to Old Friends by the Paulson Trust. "Jade Hunter was a very proud and confident stallion with an intelligence that matched his beauty," said Old Friends President and founder Michael Blowen. "It's very hard on all his caretakers to lose him and Polish Navy [who died Jan. 6] so close together."

## BULLET WORK FOR DIALED IN

Robert LaPenta's **Dialed In** (Mineshaft) turned in a bullet drill at Palm Meadows yesterday and remains possible for Sunday's GIII Holy Bull S. The Nick Zito-trained runner went four furlongs in :47.40, fastest of 24 at the distance Monday. "He looked absolutely terrific," Zito reported yesterday afternoon. "I couldn't be happier. He's amazing. I'm just knocking wood." Dialed In has made just one start to date, overcoming a sluggish start to win his 6 1/2-furlong debut at Churchill by half-length ([video](#)) last November. The \$475,000 FTSAUG yearling had been expected to start in an allowance last Friday at Gulfstream, but was scratched when the track came up sloppy. **Cont. p2**

Zito admitted yesterday the Holy Bull would be a lot to ask of his charge. “[The Holy Bull] is a possibility,” Zito said. “I’d still like to get a different type of race because it is a big step, but he sure acts like a good horse. It could happen, let’s put it this way.” Yesterday’s bullet drill could sway Zito. “[The work] was very good and it encourages us, but obviously, like I tell Bob you still want to do what you think is right,” the trainer continued. “The Derby is still the first Saturday of May, but on the other hand sometimes you’re dealt with certain cards and either you play or you throw them in, one or the other.”

Dial In has drawn a lot of attention. “He’s absolutely a beautiful horse,” Zito said. “I remember Steve Asmussen and his assistant Scott Blasi saw him in the paddock and both of them said, ‘Boy, what a spectacular-looking horse.’ He gets compliments all the time.”

Zito blamed the colt’s single start on routine issues. “It was just baby stuff--they get that stuff,” he said. “Shins or this or that, a cough, or whatever. With our program, we tend to wait a lot because we think that’s the right thing to do. We make sure they mature. And also, with his breeding, it made the most sense.” By Horse of the Year Mineshaft (A.P. Indy), Dialed In is out of Miss Doolittle (Storm Cat), a daughter of champion juvenile filly Eliza (Mt. Livermore).

# RACETRACK Round-Up

**TAPIZAR WORKS FOR ROBERT LEWIS**

Winchell Thoroughbred’s **Tapizar** (Tapit), last-out winner of the Jan. 15 GIII Sham S., worked four furlongs at Santa Anita yesterday in :50.40. The bay colt remains on target for the Feb. 12 GII Robert B. Lewis S., according to owner Ron Winchell.

“Tapizar came out of the Sham in good order, which was evidenced by a work that went exactly to plan,”

Winchell said. “He is now progressing toward running in the Lewis.” Also working towards the Robert Lewis yesterday at Santa Anita, Gem, Inc.’s **J P’s Gusto** (Successful Appeal) went seven furlongs in 1:25.40. It was the fastest of two works at the distance Monday. Winner of last year’s GI Del Mar Futurity, J P’s Gusto is coming off a runner-up effort in the Dec. 18 GI CashCall Futurity.

**Gran Estreno to Point to Muniz...**

Eight-year-old **Gran Estreno (Arg)** (Lucky Roberto), who successfully defended his title in the GIII Washington Park H. at Arlington in September and captured Saturday’s GIII Col. E. R. Bradley H. at Fair Grounds in his 2011 bow, will bid for his fourth U.S. graded score in the Mar. 26 GII Mervin Muniz Memorial H. in the Big Easy. “Our main goal for Gran Estreno is the Muniz,” trainer Mike Stidham confirmed. “I don’t know if we will go in the next race [GIII Fair Grounds H. Feb. 19] or not. That hasn’t been decided yet.” A Group 1 winner in his native Argentina in 2006, the chestnut has won 12 of 26 starts since moving north of the border, with North American earnings of \$507,306.

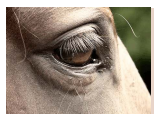

In the days following the death of that magnificent mare Miesque, it was appropriate that the GIII Lecomte S. should fall to Wilkinson, a grandson of Miesque's most famous son, Kingmambo. The victory by the Lemon Drop Kid colt acts as a reminder of Kingmambo's growing influence as a sire of sires.

Several of last year's top Japanese events illustrated Kingmambo's prowess in this department. His 2004 Japanese Derby winner King Kamehameha was responsible for the triple Group 1 winner Apapane, who numbered the equivalents of the 1000 Guineas and the Oaks among her victories, and also for Rose Kingdom.

After finishing second in the Japanese Derby and St Leger, this tough colt was awarded victory in the Japan Cup. It was only by a neck that Rose Kingdom lost the Derby to Eishin Flash, another grandson of Kingmambo, this time by King's Best. King's Best, of course, was also responsible for Workforce, the record-breaking winner of the Epsom Derby who went on to win the Arc.

These Classic successes were a reminder of Kingmambo's own considerable influence over the years on the European Classics. In addition to his 2,000 Guineas triumphs with Henrythenavigator and King's Best, he has landed the 1000 Guineas with Russian Rhythm and Virginia Waters, plus the French 1,000 with Bluemamba and Divine Proportions, the latter also winner of the French Oaks. This outstanding record in the Guineas races is highly appropriate for a stallion who won the French 2000 Guineas, and whose dam won the 1000 Guineas in Britain and France.

However, Kingmambo's Classic success certainly hasn't been limited to a mile. He has also sired three Classic winners over a mile and a half, with Lemon Drop Kid taking the Belmont S., King Kamehameha the Japanese Derby and Light Shift the English Oaks. He even sired a St Leger winner in Rule of Law.

Sons of Kingmambo now have 17 Group 1 winners to their credit in the major Northern Hemisphere countries, with others in Australia and South Africa. King's Best leads the way with six individual Group 1 winners, but Lemon Drop Kid is breathing down his neck with five.

Those five comprise Citronnade, Lemons Forever, Christmas Kid, Santa Teresita and Richard's Kid. The first two were conceived when Lemon Drop Kid's fee stood at \$75,000 in 2002, with the other three being the result of \$50,000 seasons in 2003 or 2004. However, Lemon Drop Kid was something of a slow burner as a stallion and he didn't enjoy his first success in an American graded stake until 2006 (after two in Canada in 2005). Consequently, he stood the 2006

season at a reduced fee of \$30,000, with his fee being further reduced to \$20,000 in 2007. The first reduction didn't help restore his popularity, but the 2006 Kentucky Oaks success by Lemons Forever was followed early in 2007 by graded victories by Citronnade and Christmas Kid. A book of 150 mares resulted, and Lemon Drop Kid has a crop of 111 three-year-olds ready to compete for him in 2011, with Wilkinson being the first to become a stakes winner.

Lemon Drop Kid's fee has rebounded since 2007, and he has covered more than 125 mares in each of the three subsequent years. His enduring appeal reflects his ability to sire a high proportion of stakes winners. His third crop, foaled in 2004, featured 18 stakes winners--an exceptional 19 percent--and his 2003 and 2005 crops also performed strongly, each achieving 12 percent stakes winners. As these crops were sired at fees of \$75,000 or \$50,000, we have to wonder whether his large three-year-old crop--sired at \$20,000--will prove capable of matching these impressive figures.

It is far too early to be judging any stallion's three-year-olds, and Lemon Drop Kid merits extra patience, judging by his record so far. Although he has sired a handful of two-year-old graded winners, such as Charitable Man, Break Water Edison and Bear's Kid, they are comfortably outnumbered by the Lemon Drop

Kids that didn't become graded winners until they were four or five. This group includes three of his Grade I winners (Santa Teresita, Richard's Kid and Citronnade), plus such as Bronze Cannon, Cosmonaut and Kiss The Kid.

For Wilkinson to become a graded winner early in his second season, I would

expect to find some precocious influences in the bottom half of his pedigree. Sure enough, he is out of Tasha's Delight, a graded-placed winner at two whose sister Miss Pickums numbered the GII Golden Rod S. among her juvenile stakes successes. Tasha's Delight's 2009 Smart Strike sold to John Ferguson for \$150,000 last September.

The run of success by Kingmambo's stallion sons is bound to center attention on his unproven sons, such as Henrythenavigator and Student Council in Kentucky, Archipenko in Britain, Thewayyouare in Ireland and Alexandros in France.

Henrythenavigator's fee is down to \$35,000 in his third season. As a dual Classic winner, he must be considered the best qualified of these. He also has the attraction of having been highly versatile. A winner of the G2 Coventry S. over six furlongs on only his second start, he rounded off his 11-race career with a fine second in the Breeders' Cup Classic over a mile and a quarter. He also represents the powerful Kingmambo/Sadler's Wells cross, his dam being the two-year-old Group 1 winner Sequoyah. It's hardly surprising, then, that his first weanlings sold for up to \$450,000.

**Alaazo to Swifty Farms:**

Zayat Stables' **Alaazo** (A.P. Indy--Atelier, by Deputy Minister) has been retired from racing and will stand the 2011 breeding season at Swifty Farms in Indiana. The six-year-old was second in the 2009 GIII Turfway Park Fall Championship S. On the board in five of 13 starts, Alaazo retired with three wins and earnings of \$220,100. "I am looking forward to giving Alaazo a chance at stud," said Ahmed Zayat. "He showed great stamina and talent early in his career, and gave us a big thrill in the GI Haskell, our summer Derby (finishing fourth behind Big Brown in 2008). We really believe in the Indiana program, and will offer great incentives for breeders to support our two Indiana stallions, Alaazo and multiple Group II winner Eaton's Gift (Johannesburg)." Alaazo will stand for \$1,500.

The dark bay, who RNA'd at KEESEP as a yearling for \$2,500, was the 4-5 choice to start a winning streak. Stalking in third behind a half in :46.31, Great Mills came with an outside run to take over a furlong out and extended his advantage to two lengths at the line. Goodtimehadbyall (Quiet American) was runner-up. Lifetime Record: 3-2-0-0, \$46,800.

**Great Mills (War Front)**

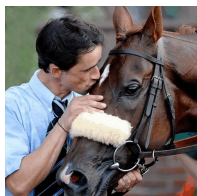
Great Mills, a Millennium Farms homebred, became the latest progeny of sophomore sire War Front (Danzig) to impress. Ro Parra's operation purchased him in utero when it landed the Glitterman mare Oriental Glitter for \$40,000 at the 2007 Keeneland November Sale.

"We were interested in breeding to War Front, but we'd sent two mares to mares to him that weren't accepted," said Millennium's farm manager Bobby Miller. "So one of the things that made her interesting to us was that she was in foal to him. We thought he had potential as a stallion, being a good son of Danzig."

At the time, Millennium was shopping for mares for its own stallions, and Miller liked what he saw in Oriental Glitter.

"She's a pretty good-sized mare, about 16.1 hands," he said. "She's racy looking, but not real compact. She's got some size. She's an attractive mare."

**'In Sharper Focus' - Great Mills cont.**

After foaling Great Mills, Oriental Glitter was sent to GSW Will He Shine (Silver Deputy) and produced a colt by the half-brother to GISW Cuvee. A year later, in 2010, Oriental Glitter produced a filly by MGISW Student Council (Kingmambo). Will He Shine currently stands at Millennium's Kentucky farm for a fee of \$2,500; Student Council stands for \$7,500.

Millennium consigned Great Mills to the 2009 Keeneland September Sale, but the colt, catalogued as [hip 2845](#), didn't generate much interest. Millennium bought him back for \$2,500. Miller said he was surprised the colt went unnoticed.

"He wasn't a big colt, but he was a pretty nice individual," he said. "He was correct and everything, but for some reason, people just didn't like him. It really didn't matter to us, because we break some yearlings and put them in training, and he went with the rest of them."

Great Mills has now won his last two starts by daylight, and Miller is confident Millennium and trainer Steve Asmussen have a solid runner on their hands.

"Steve likes him, and I think he'll be a useful horse for us," said Miller. "I think he'll make some money for us."

Another son of War Front, Soldat, recently took a Gulfstream allowance on the dirt in eye-catching fashion, but Miller said he was unaware of any plans to try Great Mills on the main track.

"That would be up to Ro and Steve," he commented. Interestingly, Soldat and Great Mills two sold roughly two hours apart at the September Sale. -LM

**2nd-FGX, \$39,000, Msw, 4&5yo, a7 1/2fT, 1:34, gd. GROVE PARK (c, 4, [Rock Hard Ten](#)--Tapstress {SW, \$152,210}, by Desert Wine), a \$225,000 KEENOV weanling who turned into a \$700,000 FTSAUG yearling, hit the board just once in five starts on three different surfaces for Bob Baffert to begin his career, but turned things around a bit when moved to the Werner barn. The half to Discreet Hero (Honour And Glory), GSW, \$681,591 fell just a head short of graduation over the Churchill Downs lawn Nov. 3, and was well-backed as the 6-5 choice to break through. 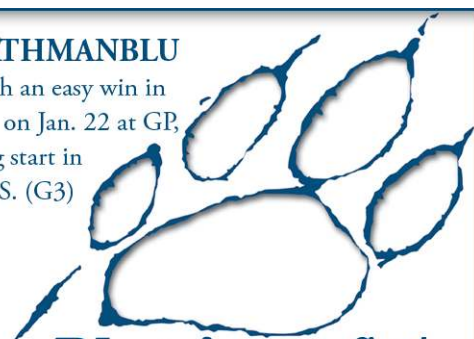

**From \$1,200 to Miss Arkansas, Good Run for Martins...**

Sunday was a good day for brothers Bill and Joe Martin. First, the Arkansas natives registered their first-ever stakes win at their local track,

Oaklawn Park, care of their bargain-basement \$1,200 yearling purchase **Stephanie Got Even** (Stephen Got Even). Then, they got to stand beside Alyse Eady, Miss Arkansas 2010, who presented the winner's trophy.

**'In Sharper Focus' - Stephanie Got Even cont.**

"It's just so much fun I can hardly stand it," enthused trainer-of-record Joe Martin. "It's very special to win a stakes here. It's our hometown, we know everybody around here, and I never saw so many of our friends. This town's our home, and there's no better place to win a race than Oaklawn."

Stephanie Got Even was winning her fifth straight start and is still unbeaten on conventional dirt. Joe and Bill, both trainers, operate a 97-stall training center near Hot Springs. They own a number of horses together, and also have outside clients. In the summers, the men split their strings. Bill, 46, heads to Mountaineer, while Joe, 44, goes to Presque Isle.

"That way, if one of the horses likes the Tapeta and doesn't like the horses, or vice versa, we can ship them back and forth," explained Joe Martin. "We usually meet at a truck stop halfway between the tracks. We don't unload 'em or anything--we just switch trailers and take off again!"

The Martins have another brother, Tim, who races at Prairie Meadows when he isn't at Oaklawn.

The Martin brothers found Stephanie Got Even at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Yearlings sale in 2008. They noticed her in the rear walking ring as she was preparing to sell for breeder and consignor Mineola Farm.

"Usually, I'll go back and look at the horses and at the vet reports so I know what I'm bidding on, but she went through there, and she was just a good-lookin' little girl," said Joe Martin. "So we took a shot at her. The price was right, and her breeding was good. After, we went back and checked with the vet, and she had a clean bill of health."

Stephanie Got Even didn't need to do much to prove her \$1,200 price tag a bargain, but it still took her a few starts to come around. She began her career with Joe at Presque Isle, and ran a well-beaten fifth sprinting five panels on the Tapeta last June. Three weeks later, she was dropped down for a \$25,000 tag, and came home third.

"I thought she'd win first out, because she'd worked so well on the Tapeta there," said Joe Martin. "She had outworked everything I put her against."

Joe called his brother Bill and said that he wanted to try her at Mountaineer, where Bill is stabled during the summer. The filly responded to the move to conventional dirt by winning her next four straight in Chester, West Virginia. First, she came away with a 2 3/4-length victory facing maiden special weight foes in July. Then, stepped up into allowance company, she won by nearly nine lengths in a NW2L in August. She was stretched out to a mile in a NW3L in September and won that by 3/4 lengths, then reverted back to sprints and completed her allowance conditions in a six-furlong NW3X Nov. 13.

Still, Mountaineer isn't Oaklawn, and so Stephanie Got Even was a 23-1 outsider when she stepped into the gate for Sunday's American Beauty S. Shuffled back to fifth racing along the rail heading into the far turn, she came charging in the stretch and, after being angled out by jockey Ernesto Oro, was up in plenty of time ([video](#)). The jock on favored Decelerator (Dehere) lodged an objection for contact initiated by Stephanie Got Even in the lane, but stewards made no change.

"Man, I was scared to death!" Martin said of having wait out the stewards' decision. "It was the [D. Wayne] Lukas horse claiming foul, and I told my brother, 'Oh man, they just may take this one from us.' But our jockey had to take his chance. He said afterward that he had so much horse."

Stephanie Got Even paid \$48.40 for the win, and keyed a \$1,247.40 exacta over fellow longshot Cosmo Girl (City Zip) that would have covered her own purchase price.

"The competition at the two tracks is so different, I wasn't surprised by the price," said Martin. "And I liked our filly, but she was facing a pretty good field. One thing I can say, though, is that one of the fillies she beat at Mountaineer [Winsockie, by Trippi] had finished third in a \$100,000 stakes, and the two other fillies where nice horses who where coming up from Kentucky. So I knew she beat some nice horses."

Martin said future plans hadn't been decided on, but said he thinks his filly will excel going long. "I think that's what she really wants to do," he said. "If you saw her [Sunday], she was just pulling away from them in the end."

He admits he may not be the one making that call, though. The Martins received several offers for the progressive filly, and by Monday morning, a nationally recognized trainer was at his barn inspecting her.

"If you get a chance to make a good sale in this business, you've got to do it," said Joe. "Don't get me wrong, though, I'd love to keep training her."

Stephanie Got Even's win Sunday put Joe and Bill Martin on the front page of the Arkansas *Sentinel-Record*. The local paper featured a photo of the horse's connections, standing with Alyse Eade. Asked which was more exciting, winning the stakes or standing next to Miss Arkansas, Joe Martin laughed, "Oh, the stakes race. Standing by her was fine, but that stakes race goes a long way! If you've never owned a racehorse--there's just something about winning. Even though it's only a \$50,000 race...to beat those horses and the fact that we only gave \$1,200 for her--it was so much fun. But Miss Arkansas was fabulous."
