NEW ZEALAND BLOODSTOCK PREMIER YEARLINGS

JAN. 31-FEB. 1

KARAKA SALE KICKS OFF

New Zealand Bloodstock will conduct the Premier Yearling Sale at Karaka Monday and Tuesday. A total of 503 youngsters have been catalogued for the two-day sale, including **lot 37**, a Zabeel (NZ) colt who is the first foal from multiple Group 1 winner Seachange (NZ) (Cape Cross {Ire}) consigned by The Oaks Stud; and Pencarrow Stud's **lot 346**, a son of Pins (Aus) out of Group 1 winner Grand Echezeaux (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}). The latter is a half-brother to champion Darci Brahma (NZ) (Danehill), as well as a Redoute's Choice (Aus) colt that sold for NZ\$1.3 million at this venue a year ago. Recent graduates of the sale include dual G1 Cox Plate hero So You Think (NZ) (High Chaparral {Ire}), a NZ\$110,000 acquisition in 2008. In 2010, 357 yearlings sold for NZ\$65,373,500. The average was NZ\$183,119 and the median was NZ\$135,000. Three colts achieved seven-figure prices, highlighted by Cambridge Stud's Zabeel--Diamond Like (NZ) colt that James Bester purchased for NZ\$2 million. **Cont. p5**

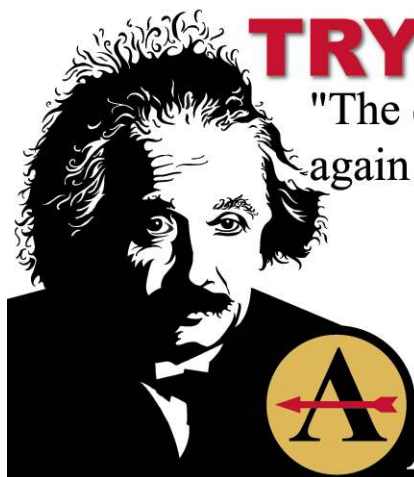

In second behind Third Chance (Kafwain) through sharp but not suicidal early fractions of :22.34 and :44.69, Pomeroy's Pistol had the jump on the late-closing filly Dancinginherdreams, who was making her first start since her graded score at Churchill Downs last October. With Pomeroy's Pistol on top after three quarters in 1:09.30, the undefeated grey's partner--Julien Leparoux--found himself with a lot to do with his customary come-from-behind filly. While Pomeroy's Pistol cut the corner turning for home, John Oxley's runner was fanned very wide, and despite cutting into the leader's advantage with every stride, fell just short of keeping her perfect record in tact. Evil Queen, who trailed in the early going, closed well to be third over R Heat Lightning. "There was not much response from her in the end, she just flattened," said Johnny Velazquez, who was aboard the second choice. "It's a little disappointing." *Cont. p4*

Sluggish at the start, Dialed In trailed early as Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) and Black N Beauty (Devil His Due) exchanged blows through the opening half. Sweet Ducky poked his head in front after three quarters in 1:10.33, as Dialed In improved his position to fifth. While the early leaders wilted, Sweet Ducky appeared to pose the biggest threat as he battled to maintain his superiority. However, Dialed In finally got into the groove, and proved himself much-the-best while collecting his first graded stakes victory. A \$475,000 FTSAUG yearling purchase, the dark bay broke a step slow but rallied late to graduate at first asking in a Churchill Downs maiden Nov. 12. "He's very special," said Zito. "I've never had a horse do this--go from a maiden special race to jump up and win a race like the Holy Bull. I wasn't that surprised that he was so far back early [15 lengths]. I had a good feeling and confidence in Julien [Leparoux] to let him be in the right place and then get into the mix. I just wanted him to get out clear and settle. I'm not sure what will be next. The idea is just to get him [to the Kentucky Derby]."

"I have to give all the credit to the horse," said winning rider Chris Landeros. "He is an amazing animal. We looked at the

form and knew there wasn't much pace in here. Our thought was if we were going to take it, let's take it nice and comfortable. Luckily, there were a couple horses that wanted to go up front and press the pace; I got a ground-saving trip and just waited for that move and he spurted when I asked him." "Karaka 2010 saw pre-sale expectations totally surpassed with one of the strongest sales on record," said Petrea Vela, NZB's co-managing director. "Since then, the trend across our sales throughout the year has been for solid demand, particularly at the top of the market, albeit selective purchasing making less appealing stock much harder to sell, and generally average prices showing some decline, but the clearance rates holding up well. If we had to predict, I'd anticipate a similar trend at Karaka 2011. The top of the market will take care of itself, but it is likely to swing in favour of the buyers at the second and third sessions [Select and Festival Sales]. That said, we are very proud of the selection on offer and, if there is good demand, we are well-placed to capture it." Vela continued, "Last year, we noticed a palpable shift in buyers' appetites towards more middle distance and staying horses. With New Zealand demonstrating that that is still where its particular strength lies, I think that played a big part in the increased success of last year's sales series. We'd hope that that trend wouldn't be a one-off. If trainers last year were plotting a strategy to compete in the cups and classic races with New Zealand horses--which is a long-term plan when buying yearlings with that aim--then we'd hope to see them back at Karaka to consolidate. In all likelihood, we won't see quite the firepower of last year, but still we're hoping to see a good turnout again. "Also going in our favour is the strong Australian currency. It is presenting international buyers with the most favourable exchange rate in over a decade which is bound to be a factor in purchasing decisions. "We're very pleased with the selection we have assembled this year. It features a good balance of sire power from New Zealand and around the world, including Australia, Ireland, England, Canada, Argentina, Chile and the United States. Buyers like to see sires and families that are familiar to them, so as well as presenting the best of the local product, it's important to have an international flavour." Giant Oak, Eldaafer & Rule Drill for Donn

A trio of probable runners drilled Sunday morning for an upcoming start in Saturday's GI Donn H. at Gulfstream. Heading the triumvirate was GISW **Giant Oak** (Giant's Causeway), who covered five furlongs in :59 3/5, the second fastest of 32 moves at the distance yesterday. Also working at the Hallandale oval was **Eldaafer** (A.P. Indy), winner of last fall's Gill Breeders' Cup Marathon, who negotiated a half-mile in :48 3/5. The drill was the 18th fastest of 46 works at the distance. Rounding out the threesome was dual Grade III winner **Rule** (Roman Ruler), who earned a bullet for five-eighths at Palm Meadows with a 1:00 4/5 final time. Also expected for the Donn are **Fly Down** (Mineshaft), **Morning Line** (Tiznow), **I Want Revenge** (Stephen Got Even) and **Square Eddie** (Smart Strike), who was scheduled to arrive from California yesterday afternoon.

ELLIOTT BURCH DEAD AT 86

Hall of Fame trainer J. Elliott Burch, who conditioned six champions, including Horses of the Year Arts and Letters and Sword Dancer and Co-Horse of the Year Fort Marcy, died Saturday at Newport Hospital in Rhode Island of complications from pneumonia. He was 86.

Burch was born into training royalty. Both his father Preston Burch and grandfather William Burch were Hall of Fame trainers. In 1957, he took over for his father as head trainer for Isabel Dodge Sloane's Brookmeade Stable. For Brookmeade, he sent out Sword Dancer to second-place finishes in the 1959 Kentucky Derby and Preakness before the colt finally broke through with a victory in the Belmont S. Sword Dancer also won that season's Metropolitan H., Travers S., Woodward S. and Jockey Club Gold Cup on his way to Horse of the Year honors.

In 1964, Burch made the move to Paul Mellon's powerful Rokeby Stables, and they enjoyed immediate success with Quadrangle, who followed in Sword Dancer's steps to win the Belmont for Burch. In the process, he dashed the Triple Crown aspirations of a small Canadian invader named Northern Dancer. Quadrangle also won the Wood Memorial and the Travers S. in New York.

The third and final of Burch's Belmont winners came in the form of Rokeby's Arts and Letters, who himself spoiled the Triple Crown quest of Majestic Prince in 1969 ([video](#)) after running second to that horse in both the Derby and Preakness. By season's end, Arts and Letters's resume would include the Met Mile, Travers, Woodward and Jockey Club Gold Cup. He was recognized as champion three-

year-old colt and Horse of the Year.

A year later, Fort Marcy was named Co-Horse of the Year after wins in the United Nations H., Man O' War S. and Bowling Green H. Fort Marcy was also champion turf horse in '67 and '70, co-champion turf horse in '68 and champion older horse in '70.

Burch also trained Bowl of Flowers, the top two-year-old and three-year-old filly of '60 and '61; Key to the Mint, who won the 1972 Travers, Woodward, and Brooklyn H. on the way to becoming that year's three-year-old champion; and Run the Gantlet, champion male turf horse in 1971. Burch retired from training in 1985 with 30 stakes winners to his credit.

"Elliott Burch was inducted into the Hall of Fame the same year that I became a racing fan," New York Racing Association President and CEO Charles Hayward commented yesterday. "I had the good fortune to meet Mr. Burch, as I was friends with all of his children. We all know that he was a brilliant trainer and a great horseman. He was also a devoted father who cared deeply for his family. He was an avid reader, and I enjoyed hearing him speak about his favorite books. Elliott Burch will be missed, and we should all thank him for the many contributions that he made to Thoroughbred racing."

Born on Mar. 3, 1924, in Washington, D.C., Burch served in the Army Signal Corps during World War II before going to work for *Daily Racing Form* as a writer. He was an assistant under his father beginning in 1955. Burch was inducted into Racing's Hall of Fame in 1980.

Predeceased by his wife, Phyllis Hammond Burch, Burch was the father of one daughter, Jehanne Burch, of Middletown, RI, and three sons: Daniel and his wife Patricia of Manhasset, NY, Richard and his wife Margaret of Charlotte, NC, and the late William E. Burch.

Looking to confirm his 9-1 upset of the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Mile in December, the Tony Cruz-trained Beauty Flash gamely held off a host of challengers to take the first leg of the Hong Kong Triple Crown. Away alertly under Gerald Mosse, he kept close tabs on the pacesetter Packing Winner (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) as they made the right-hand turn into the stretch, forged to lead in midstretch and kept finding more as favored Sunny King ran him to a neck. "What I asked him to do, he did," Mosse said. "Tony said to me 'Give him a chance to breathe and he will turn the engine on himself.' And he was right. At the 200 meters, there were

horses going faster than me, and I didn't want to use the whip because he doesn't like that. But he has such a big heart he kept quickening and fought them off." Cruz attributed the five-year-old's improvement this year to the fact that his lungs are cleaner now than they were last season. "Last year," said the trainer "he had blood in the trachea almost every time he raced or trialed. This year, he's scoping much cleaner, and I put that down to his being stronger now than he was as a four-year-old." Cruz said Beauty Flash will now be targeted to the 1800-meter G1 Dubai Duty Free at Meydan in March, but did not rule out a crack at the 2000-meter second leg of the Triple Crown, the Citibank Hong Kong Gold Cup Feb. 27. The old veteran Good Ba Ba (Lear Fan) shadowed the leaders--"[He] hasn't been this close in years," the track announcer said of the typically late-running gelding--but didn't have the needed punch and faded to sixth. "It's a wonderful result for our owners; he's a horse that continues to improve and shows more and more ability, so he will be an exciting prospect. We saw the horse at the Premier Sale last year, and he looked like he was the type that would run early, so we bought him with the Karaka Million in mind, so to actually go out and win the race is a great result. We will have to sit down and decide where to send him next, the Sires Produce is a race we would like to see him run in, so we will see how he goes in the coming weeks."
