GLADDING WIRES SAN ANTONIO

Gladding (Sarava), making his stakes debut, went wire-to-wire to record a one-length victory over **Spurrier** (Dixieland Band) in Sunday's GII San Antonio S. at Santa Anita. The four-year-old gelding broke from the

inside post in the six-horse field and promptly assumed control while setting pedestrian splits. Spurrier made a big move from last to first on the turn and eyeballed the pacesetter into the lane, but Gladding remained undaunted in a deter-

mined victory. Favored **Aggie Engineer** (E Dubai) never offered a serious threat and finished third. "I thought [Joe Talamo] was going to send [Aggie Engineer], but when I saw him take a hold, it let me go to the lead really easy," explained winning rider Rafael Bejarano. "I decided to stay there and stay close to everybody. I was really comfortable with the pace and I was waiting for the stretch. When I felt [Spurrier] come running from the outside, I made sure to try and keep my horse on the lead down the stretch and let him explode. He showed me a big kick." *Cont. p2*

"I thought he worked excellent," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "Last week, he just had an easy three-eighths, and I was actually surprised how much he moved forward off of just that one easy work. His work this morning was pretty much a textbook half-mile. He went nice and easy and galloped out really strong. He came back not tired at all. He'll likely go another half-mile next week." Pletcher unveiled another

promising sophomore yesterday at Gulfstream, with **Cal Nation** (Distorted Humor), who earned **"TDN Rising Star"** honors with his 7 3/4-length debut victory in Saturday's eighth race. "Cal Nation came out of his race well," Pletcher said. "It's a little late [for him to make the Kentucky Derby]. We'd have to make up a lot of time. I think we'll just take the conservative route with him."

Kathryn Schultz and trainer Harold Schultz. He made one final start in Florida for Schultz, finishing fourth over the Calder lawn Nov. 11. The gelding was purchased privately after that effort and resurfaced in the John Sadler barn. In his first start for Lee and Susan Searing's CRK Stable, Gladding captured a one-mile optional claimer at

Santa Anita Dec. 29. He had been training strongly for his first foray into stakes company, including a pair of bullet works at Santa Anita in January.

Asked if Gladding would join stablemate Twirling Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}) in the Mar. 5 GI Santa Anita H., trainer John Sadler quipped, "I told Lee, 'I've got to come here and say, he'll kick the crap out of Twirling Candy. But seriously, he's another option for the Big 'Cap, and if he's doing well, and he's ready, he'll probably go in there with Twirling Candy.'"

Even-money choice **Aggie Engineer** (E Dubai), coming off wins in the GIII Native Diver H. and GII San Pasqual H., chased the pace early but lacked a late kick. "I don't think he had any excuse," reported trainer Paddy Gallagher.

"Today she finally woke up from her win in the El Encino. But I released my jockey [Rafael Bejarano, who was aboard in the El Encino, but rides **Blind Luck** in the La Canada], so I'm looking for a rider."

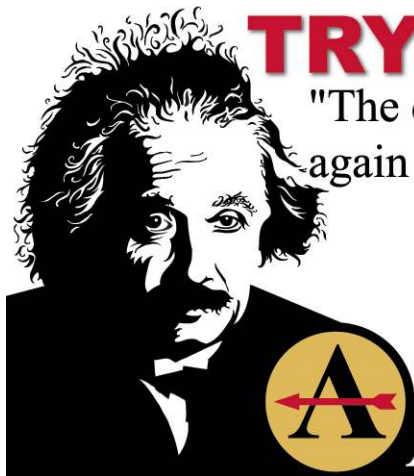

UAE Derby Likely Target for Xin Xu Lin...

G1 Carlos Pellegrini winner **Xin Xu Lin (Brz)** (Wondertross), recently purchased by Sheikh Mohamed's Godolphin team and now under the care of trainer Mahmood Al Zarooni in Dubai, is likely to target the Mar. 26 G2 UAE Derby at Meydan on Dubai World Cup night. "He will probably go straight to World Cup night and, most likely, the UAE Derby," confirmed Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. Xin Xu Lin is a four-time Group 1 winner in South America. In addition to the Pellegrini, the colt captured the G1 2000 Guineas and G1 Derby Paulista at Cidade Jardim. His former owner Jose Renato Tucci remarked, "I am extremely happy with the sale of Xin Xu Lin, and I am going to continue to be very supportive hoping that his new owner can win many more important races with him, wherever he wishes to race him. Now my hopes are with Xin Xu Lin's unraced full two-year-old brother Zunido (Brz), a real clone of Xin Xu Lin, including his behavior and his way of galloping."

Super Espresso recorded her third straight victory, while collecting her first black-type, to remain undefeated in 2011. In the money in one of four starts for trainer Steve Klesaris last spring, the attractive dark bay finished a credible third--despite getting bumped soon after the start--in her debut for trainer Todd Pletcher in a nine-furlong allowance at the Spa Aug. 25. A neck back in second going 8 1/2 panels in an off-the-turf affair at Belmont Oct. 6, Super Espresso got the monkey off her back with a score in a mile test at the Elmont oval Oct. 27. Most recently, the four-year-old came from off the pace to record her second straight win over this track Jan. 5. Sent off the warm favorite this time, she settled off a modest early pace set by Electric Gold, was asked for more leaving the three-eighths pole, swung out for the stretch drive and wore down Diva's Gold late to collect her first black-type victory. SUPER ESPRESSO (Medaglia d'Oro)

By his own admission, Bobby Flay was smitten with Super Espresso from the start. However, it took an unusual set of circumstances to bring the daughter of Amizette (Forty Niner) into the hands of the celebrity chef. The filly was originally knocked down for \$1.1 million at Keeneland September in 2008, but the sale was nullified when it was determined the buyer lacked the appropriate credit. Flay subsequently purchased the filly privately.

"She was the one filly in the whole sale that I really wanted, because her pedigree is huge and she is absolutely gorgeous," said Flay. "Medaglia d'Oro was just getting really hot and she was something that we really zeroed in on."

Flay, who has the majority of his racing string with Eclipse Award-winning trainer Todd Pletcher, opted to send the filly to Steve Klesaris.

"I had a filly named [SW & GISP] Grace and Power [by More Than Ready] with Steve, and he did a really good job with that filly, so I decided to let him have Super Espresso," explained Flay.

A credible third in her second career start last April, Super Espresso finished off the board in her final two tries for Klesaris, including a seventh-place finish over the Delaware turf June 1.

"From a training standpoint, I don't think Steve really had the opportunity to get the best out of her, because I just don't think she was physically ready to show that," observed Flay. "And that's exactly what you see in the lines. She always ran evenly, in the middle of the pack, but didn't win."

"Also, Steve's in Maryland [Fair Hill], and I was never able to see her, because it's hard for me to get down there," Flay continued. "I love this filly. She is just so beautiful and I paid a lot of money for her, so I really wanted to be able to go out and see her, which is why I decided to send her to Todd in New York."

In her first start for her new tutor, the dark bay was a close-up third going nine furlongs at the Spa in August before coming up a neck short of graduating at Belmont Oct. 6. In her 2010 finale, Super Espresso finally put it all together and broke through with a victory while trying a flat mile at Belmont Oct. 27, and kicked off the new season in the same fashion, this time against Aqueduct allowance foes Jan. 5.

"Todd has done a great job," said Flay. "He made some changes and adjustments, which seems to have helped. The first few races Todd had her, she was sort of competitive, but she hung late. She just ran with the other horses, but wouldn't actually win. I think now she is learning that she actually likes to win."

The filly--who was collecting her first black-type victory at a mile yesterday--appears to be coming into her own at four, and looks likely to try longer distances in the future. **Cont. p3**



"If she's up near the pace, she will grind them down, especially the longer they go," said Flay. "In my opinion, the mile is definitely the shortest distance for her. In fact, probably a little short for her. The ideal distance for her might even be a mile and a quarter. If you watch her race, she is a stayer. She doesn't have a big move, she just kind of grinds it out. To me, the longer she goes, the better she's going to be."

In regards to her late development, Flay added, "When I bought her, it was really obvious, just by looking at her physically and her pedigree, that she wasn't going to be a [winning] two-year-old and probably wasn't going to be a good three-year-old, and in fact, she wasn't. She is just now growing into her frame and sort of finding her stride."

Out of the 19-year-old mare Amizette, Super Espresso is a half-sister to King of Rome (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), a dual group winner in Ireland and Group 1 placed in Germany. She is also a granddaughter of the blue hen mare Courtly Dee, who is responsible for champion Althea (Alydar); Grade I/Group 1 winners Ali Oop (Al Hattab), Ketoh (Exclusive Native) and Azzaam (Chief's Crown). The Broodmare of the Year is also the dam of Foreign Courier (Sir Ivor), the dam of Group 1 hero Green Desert and Aurora (Danzig), dam of GI Super Derby winner Arch (Kris S.), UAE Horse of the Year Festival of Light (A.P. Indy) and Grade I victress Acoma (Empire Maker).

Flay, who currently has about a half dozen mares, confirmed that the filly will join his broodmare band at the conclusion of her racing career.

"She's going to be with me forever," he said.

Flay, who was in Las Vegas on Super Bowl Sunday and was unable to watch his filly run in person, added, "I have such a busy schedule that it's hard to get to see my horses run sometimes. If I'm in New York when one of my horses is running, I will definitely go. I make every effort to watch my horses run. I really love going to the races. That's what it comes down to." --C Bossinakis
