## ZITO PAIR FINE AFTER DONN

Trainer Nick Zito indicated Sunday that **Morning Line** (Tiznow) and **Fly Down** (Mineshaft) exited Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup in March. Winner of last season's GII Pennsylvania Derby and runner-up in the G1 BC Dirt

Mile, Morning Line dueled on the lead with West Coast shipper Square Eddie (Smart Strike), before finishing second--beaten two lengths--by Giant Oak (Giant's Causeway) in the nine-furlong test. Fly Down came from well off the pace to finish fifth as the 5-2 choice. "Morning Line ran great," said Zito. "It's sad [Square

Eddie's connections] had to come 2,000 mile to basically act as a rabbit. It's hard, because the race would have been different all the way around [had the pair not engaged in a speed duel]. My horse laid it down and ran his guts out." Square Eddie faded to finish ninth. Fly Down, winner of last year's GII Dwyer S. and runner-up in the G1 Belmont S. and G1 Travers S., closed out 2010 with a third-place finish behind Blame (Arch) and Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic at Churchill Downs Nov. 6. "Fly Down just got started too late," explained Zito. "He only started to run the last eighth of a mile." said Zito of Fly Down's 2011 debut. "He hadn't run since the Breeders' Cup, and that was a tough race."

## AWESOME FEATHER MAKING PROGRESS

Juvenile filly champion **Awesome Feather** (Awesome of Course) may resume training by the end of the month, trainer Chad Brown told *Daily Racing Form*. The filly won five consecutive races before capping off her 2010 season with an authoritative victory in the G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs Nov. 5. Purchased by Frank Stronach's Adena Springs for \$2.3 million at Fasig-Tipton's November sale, the Florida-bred was found to have a tendon injury not long after her arrival at Palm Meadows Training Center in Florida.

Adena's business manager Mike Rogers indicated last month that the champion had a "profile in her tendon," which had the potential to become career ending. However, her connections have opted to make an attempt at a comeback. "She's been tack-walking for about a week," Brown told *DRF*. "So far so good, and hopefully, she'll be able to go back to the track soon. Right now, we're taking little baby steps with her. If all goes well, she could start jogging in about two weeks. Then we'll just see what happens from there."

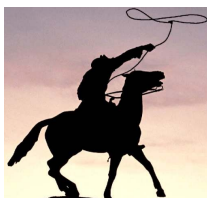

## Howard Outlines Plans for GSW Wilkinson...

Trainer Neil Howard indicated Monday that **Wilkinson** (Lemon Drop Kid), winner of the Jan. 22 GIII Lecomte S., could make his next start in the Feb. 19 GII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds. "Right now, I would say it is

60-40 that he'll run," said Howard, "with 60 percent being that he will run." While leaning toward running Gaillardia Racing's representative in the tightener for the Mar. 26 GII Louisiana Derby, Howard added that it still remains possible that will train the dark bay straight up to the nine-furlong prep for the Triple Crown. According to Howard, ☆ "TDN Rising Star" ☆ Machen (Distorted Humor) is also on track for the Risen Star. The Courtlandt Farms runner aired in both prior starts, including his most recent going a mile and 70 yards over the local strip Jan. 30. Originally considered for the Risen Star, fellow Courtlandt sophomore **Prime Cut** (Bernstein) is no longer likely to contest the race. 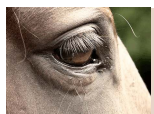

After Giant Oak's decisive victory in the Donn H. three days ago, I thought this was a perfect opportunity to highlight the achievements of his broodmare sire **Crafty Prospector**--one of the unsung heroes of the American breeding industry.

It was while I was trying to unearth **Crafty Prospector's** fee in his first year at stud in 1984 that I came across an old issue of the invaluable *Racing Update*, listing stallion fees for 1984 and 1985.

I had almost forgotten how out of control the industry had become before the crash of the late 1980s. The 1985 fees showed **Northern Dancer** leading the way at \$950,000, followed by **Seattle Slew** (\$750,000), **Alydar** (\$450,000), **Nijinsky** (\$400,000), and **Blushing Groom**, **Danzig**, **Lyphard** and **Mr. Prospector** (all \$275,000). Then came **Spectacular Bid** (\$250,000), **Roberto** and **Slew o'Gold** (both \$225,000), **Devil's Bag**, **El Gran Senor** and **Nureyev** (all \$200,000), **The Minstrel** (\$185,000), **Conquistador Cielo** and **Vaguely Noble** (both \$150,000), and **Caro**, **Damascus**, **Riverman** and **Storm Bird** (all \$125,000). Another six stallions commanded six-figure fees, making a total of 27.

Twenty-six years later, there are only a handful of six-figure stallions, with a top price of \$150,000, but it could be argued that the current situation will prove healthier, and less fragile, than the crazy days of 1985. Incidentally, note the number of top stallions in 1985 that had made their names racing on turf in Europe. Unfortunately for America, these international stars have largely disappeared from Kentucky's stallion roster, a notable exception being **Giant Oak's** sire **Giant's Causeway**, who has made a bright start to his bid to become champion sire for a third consecutive year.

**Crafty Prospector** appeared on the 1985 list at a fee of \$15,000, the same as in his first year at **Happy Valley Farm** in Ocala, Florida. This probably equates to less than \$7,500 in today's industry.

His fee reflected the fact that his racing career lacked one essential—a stakes victory. Although he had an impressive-sounding record of seven wins, two seconds and a third from 10 starts, only two of those starts had been at stakes level. At three, he had finished third to Distinctive Pro in the Marigold S., a sprint restricted to Florida-breds. More importantly, the four-year-old Crafty Prospector had failed by just a neck to hold the late challenge of the champion filly Christmas Past in a less-than-vintage edition of the GI Gulfstream Park H.

They have 20 graded winners to their credit, with Giant Oak being one of four Grade I winners among them. Significantly three of the four--Giant Oak, Harmony Lodge and Downthedustyroad--were sired by sons of Storm Cat, namely Giant's Causeway, Hennessy and Storm And A Half. His daughters also

have Grade II winners by Pure Prize and Hennessy.

Crafty Prospector mares have a particularly good record with Giant's Causeway. Their seven foals feature Giant Oak, the Grade III winner Win McCool and Giant Oak's stakes-winning sister Apple Martini. Another of Giant's Causeway's graded winners, First Passage, has a second dam by Crafty Prospector.

Of course, Crafty Prospector is by no means the only son of Mr. Prospector to figure among the broodmare sires of Giant's Causeway's graded winners. Thanks to daughters of Seeking the Gold, Kingmambo, Gone West, Machiavellian, Miswaki, Fappiano, Forty Niner and Crafty Prospector, there are 14 graded winners bred this way, including no fewer than nine Grade I winners (the colts Shamardal, Frost Giant, Red Giant and Giant Oak and the fillies Internallyflawless, Maids Causeway, Swift Temper, My Typhoon and Carriage Trail). Giant's Causeway has also sired the Grade I winners Aragorn and Ghanaati from daughters of Mr. Prospector.

One of the other trends in Giant's Causeway's stock is the number of late bloomers among them, such as Aragorn, Heatseeker, Swift Temper, Carriage Trail and Fairbanks. Giant Oak is the latest example, perhaps unsurprisingly, as his dam Crafty Oak didn't become a stakes winner until she was four or a graded winner until she was five.
