WELL ARMED RETIRED

WinStar Farm's homebred **Well Armed** (Tiznow--Well Dressed, by Notebook), a devastating 14-length winner of the 2009 G1 Dubai World Cup, has been retired.

"Well Armed certainly occupies a special place in my heart," said Bill Casner, who campaigned the eight-year-old gelding. "He was a horse that had true grit. He chipped a knee and fractured a hip as a three-

year-old, yet he came back to win the richest race in the world by an unimaginable margin. He had the desire and will to overcome adversity." Well Armed also collected wins in the GI Goodwood Breeders' Cup S., GI San Diego H. and GI San Antonio H. The GI Pacific Classic runner-up was attempting a comeback after missing the entire 2010 season, but developed filling in a tendon after breezing an easy half Jan. 20. The injury was deemed minor after a subsequent ultrasound revealed no tears, but the decision was made to retire him. "Well Armed has been training like a three-year-old," trainer Eoin Harty commented. "He is the epitome of a racehorse and dearly loves his task. He is a barn favorite and he will be dearly missed." Out of the stakes-winning mare Well Dressed, the bay is a half-brother to GSW Witty (Distorted Humor) and GI Travers S. third-place finisher Helsinki (Distorted Humor). Well Armed heads to retirement at Casner's Texas ranch with a record of 24-7-4-1 and earnings of \$5,179,805.

GIANT OAK TO PASS WORLD CUP

The Virginia Tarra Trust's **Giant Oak** (Giant's Causeway), who earned his second consecutive Grade I victory in last Saturday's Donn H., has been removed from consideration for the G1 Dubai World Cup and will instead focus on a domestic campaign geared towards a year-end run in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. "Over the last few days, his fans have been wondering what the next step was going to be," said Rudy Tarra, co-owner of Giant Oak. "They were hoping it was going to be Dubai, but it's not going to be. [Trainer] Chris [Block] and I talked about it last night, and there's no real upside to us going. We're a small stable, and I think that staying here in the States is the right thing to do." He added, "If you look at the long pull, I think the handicap division this year is very competitive. There's no real standout and everybody's going to have their chance to pick their spots, and maybe we can even win another Grade I or two this year. Sometimes it pans out and sometimes it doesn't." After conferring with Block, Tarra indicated that Giant Oak would more than likely make his next start in the GI Oaklawn H. at the Arkansas oval Apr. 9. The homebred five-year-old could also take in races such as the GI Stephen Foster H. in June and the GI Whitney H. en route to a return to Churchill for November's championship day.

AMENDMENT PASSES SENATE TO REPEAL 1099 PROVISION

The U.S. Senate recently approved an [amendment](#) to the FAA Air Transportation Modernization and Safety Improvement Act ([S. 223](#)) that would repeal a pending controversial recordkeeping requirement for small businesses. Senator [Debbie Stabenow](#) (D-MI) offered the amendment that passed 81-17 in a bipartisan vote.

At issue is an IRS regulation that would require businesses, like those in the horse racing industry, to file 1099 forms for each vendor from whom the business purchases a total of \$600 or more worth of goods or services in any given year. This provision was in last year's Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (commonly referred to as the health care bill) and would enforce the change starting in 2012. Current law requires 1099s only for independent contractors that receive \$600 or more from a business; the new regulation would apply to independent contractors and any other individual or corporation that meets the requirement.

The proposed change has been criticized for the recordkeeping burden it would place on small businesses. Groups such as the [U.S. Chamber of Commerce](#) and the [American Farm Bureau](#) support repeal.

Eventual stakes winners sold by Legacy include Champion Stardom Bound (Tapit) and multiple Grade I winner Life at Ten (Malibu Moon). "It was a fun ride from the start, and Tommy and I were fortunate to sell some tremendous horses," said Toothaker. "Over the last two years, we've averaged 40 stakes horses a year in our consignments. So our partnership has formed a very firm foundation for the Legacy brand." Eastham added, "I have enjoyed my partnership with Mark, and the decision to leave Legacy has been a difficult one for me. Sales and marketing is what I'm best at and that will continue to be my focus. Mark and I will continue to serve our current clients, and we will always support each other's endeavors."

STREET SENSE FILLY TOPS PERTH OPENER A filly by GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense out of G1 Melbourne Cup winner Jezabeel (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) topped yesterday's opening session of the Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale at Belmont with a final bid of A\$200,000 (US\$202,444). The bay yearling ([hip 4](#)), consigned by the Serpentine-based Distinct Racing and Breeding, was purchased by bloodstock agent Justin Bahen. "She's off to [trainer] Mark Kavanagh," Bahen said. "I thought she was the filly of the sale--a lovely individual who looks a great prospect as a three-year-old. I have seen most of the yearlings from Jezabeel and this filly is the pick of them in my book." The top-priced colt during yesterday's session is a son of Exceed and Excel (Aus) out of multiple group winner No Questions (Aus) (Xaar {GB}). [Hip 91](#) was also offered from Distinct Racing and Breeding and was purchased for A\$150,000 by Donna Riordan. A total of 77 yearlings sold yesterday for A\$3,580,500. The average fell 2.1 percent from a year ago to A\$46,500, while the median remained constant at A\$40,000. The buy-back rate was 25 percent. "As was the case on the Gold Coast in January, quality yearlings attracted strong interest from buyers," said Magic Millions acting managing director David Chester. "It was pleasing to see the average, gross and clearance rates hold up to last year's first session." The sale's second session gets underway today at 3 p.m. (WA time).

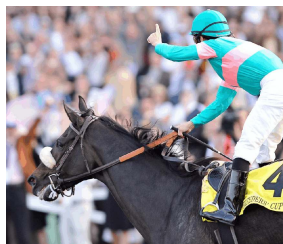
