DER TAPIZAR'S IN TOWN

Winchell Thoroughbreds' **Tapizar** (Tapit) will be favored in the GII Robert B. Lewis S. this afternoon at Santa Anita on the strength of his local debut, a 4 1/4-length success in the GIII Sham S. Jan. 15 ([video](#)). He we'll be going an additional sixteenth here, but that wouldn't seem to be an issue for the bay colt. "He's doing good and we're excited about running him," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "We're thrilled the way he won the Sham. We've been very fortunate. The weather's stayed good, and we like the rhythm we've established with the horse." Admittedly, Tapizar was

only able to break his maiden in his fourth start, but did so with aplomb, airing by 10 1/2 lengths at Churchill Nov. 27. One start prior to that, he finished fourth behind **Anthony's Cross** (Indian Charlie) in a Nov. 4 contest under the Twin Spires. That colt came back to finish a non-threatening third to Tapizar in the Sham, and reopposes him once more here. Anthony's Cross was also entered in today's GIII El Camino Real Derby, but trainer Eoin Harty opted to stay in the Los Angeles area. "It might be an easier spot," Harty offered.

HE AIN'T HEAVY, HE'S HIS BROTHER

Trainer Todd Pletcher still has champion Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) on deck, but he has plenty of other bullets in the barn, and will be looking for his fourth GIII Sam F. Davis trophy since 2006 this afternoon. WinStar homebred **Brethren** (Distorted Humor) had lots to live up to before even placing a hoof on the racetrack, being a half-brother to 2010 GI Kentucky Derby winner Super Saver (Maria's Mon). The regally bred bay prevailed in a contentious Belmont maiden when unveiled Oct. 16 ([video](#)), and added a smooth success in a one-mile allowance at Churchill Nov. 27 ([video](#)). Brethren is drawn on the outside here for his two-turn bow. "He's training well and is ready to get started," Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "Now it's time to see where we are. I was very pleased with his first two races; he's done exactly what we're asked so far, and now he's got to stretch out and try his first stakes." Pletcher certainly has his eye on the first Saturday in May. "In a perfect world he'll only run twice before the Derby," the conditioner added. "But we also have to keep an eye on graded stakes earnings while trying to sort out and try to separate some of the other top three-year-olds we have in the barn." Cont. p2-3

The Sagamore Farm homebred shipped down to Florida afterwards. **Adulare** (Flatter) traded spots with Tapizar (Tapit) in a pair of Churchill maidens last fall--he was third to that colt's fourth in a Nov. 4 affair before finishing a distant third in Tapizar's Nov. 27 romp--then earned his diploma at Calder Jan. 2 ([video](#)). He received an 89 Beyer Speed Figure for that effort. **Washington's Rules** (Roman Ruler) was benched after a solid second to Stay Thirsty (Bernardini) in a Spa maiden last August, but came back with a rallying score in a Gulfstream off-the-turfer Jan. 22 ([video](#)). Soaring Empire could prove tough to collar coming off a victory in the GIII Hal's Hope S. here Jan. 8 over Rule (Roman Ruler) and Morning Line (Tiznow), as well as next-out winners **Tackleberry** and **Caixa Electronica**. The 106 Beyer Speed Figure the four-year-old earned for that effort is five points higher than the field's next-highest number. **Gauche**, a \$425,000 KEESEP yearling, could be primed for a big effort, but will need to improve to contend for the top spot. The Peachtree colorbearer, who enjoyed a three-race win streak at Calder last summer, has been on the bench since finishing a distant second in an optional claimer Dec. 26. Conditioner Marty Wolfson displayed some confidence in his charge's form when he scratched **Gauche** out of another optional claimer Jan. 22 only to return in this tougher spot. **Tackleberry** upset the \$500,000 Sunshine Millions Classic at 27-1 here Jan. 29 when he got loose on an easy lead, but must prove he can handle an elongated sprint against this caliber of runner. To his credit, three of the dark bay's six wins from 10 tries have come at sprint distances.

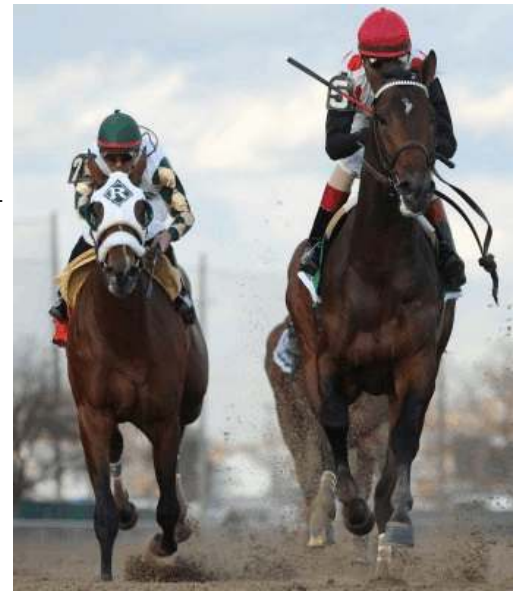

Trainer Kathy Ritvo will likely send **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno) to Fair Grounds for the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 19. Second behind To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) in both the GIII Nashua S. and GII Remsen S. last fall at Aqueduct, the bay finished fourth as the favorite in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 30. Ritvo was debating whether to keep her charge at home for the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 26. "The thinking is the Risen Star might come up an easier spot," Ritvo said. "We'd love to stay and run at Gulfstream, but we're looking for graded stakes earnings. Also, it will be good for him to learn how to ship. We haven't officially decided anything, though." Ritvo added, "We're really looking forward to getting him back to two turns. In his last race, he just got going a little too fast. I guess he was a little sharp for the race. I didn't think so beforehand, but you never know until they get on the track. Going two turns, he can't get going that fast early on because there's a turn coming up, and I think that will help him to relax."

Young Stallion Wildcat Heir On Top...

In his column in Wednesday's *TDN*, Bill Oppenheim lauded the accomplishments of the Florida sire **Wildcat Heir** (Forest Wildcat--Penniless Heiress, by Pentelicus).



Said Oppenheim, "[The] 2010 sophomore sire phenomenon Wildcat Heir...had an amazing 30 three-year-old ABC Runners in his first crop, nine more than Giant's Causeway and Distorted Humor. Nobody else was even

close. It's one thing to be a leading freshman sire, but to sire 30 horses in a crop that each earn \$50,000 or more in a season, that takes some doing. Very impressive."

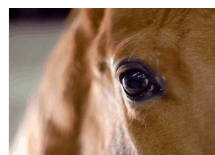

Wildcat Heir's prominence on Oppenheim's APEX rankings is mirrored on *TDN's* Third-Crop Cumulative Earnings Sire List, where the 11-year-old sits third, behind the Europeans **Shamardal** (Giant's Causeway) and **Dubawi (Ire)** (Dubai Millennium), and ahead of the rest of his North American competition. Wildcat Heir had cumulative progeny earnings of \$6,077,836 as of yesterday morning, about \$385,000 in front of fourth-placed **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet). **Roman Ruler** (Fusaichi Pegasus) rounded out the top five.

Wildcat Heir's 106 individual winners (from 206 named foals) is just off Dubawi's leading figure of 108 winners (from 210 named foals). He ranks fourth by black-type winners (10) and fifth by black-type horses (17).

The only knock against the up-and-comer is that his numbers are a bit soft when it comes to graded races. Only one of his 10 black-type winners has won a graded stakes, last year's Gill Old Hat S. heroine Richiegirlgonewild, and none of his four graded horses has placed in a Grade I.

Then again, we are talking about a sire who began his career for a modest \$8,000 fee and currently stands for \$10,000, so how critical can one be about the lack of graded horses, particularly when he's getting such consistent quality, borne out by his APEX figs. **Cont. p8**

Heir-Raising Adventure for Fernung...

Wildcat Heir is proving to be another successful young sire with ties to Brent Fernung, who owns and operates Journeyman Stud in Ocala with his wife Crystal. Journeyman has been on a remarkable streak lately. Its 2011 roster includes **Hear No Evil** (Carson City), the sire of last year's good three-year-old Jackson Bend; **Awesome of Course** (Awesome Again), whose daughter Awesome Feather won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies; **Bwana Charlie** (Indian Charlie), sire of GI CashCall hero Comma to the Top; and **Mass Media** (Touch Gold), sire of the promising three-year-old Manicero. They may not be household names, but they are sires who are making the most of their opportunities.

One horse who is becoming a household name is **Congrats** (A.P. Indy), whom Fernung purchased as a stallion prospect for his previous employer, Cloverleaf Farms II. After beginning his stud career at Cloverleaf, last year's leading freshman sire moved to Vinery Florida, and now stands at Vinery's Kentucky operation. Fernung also purchased the more established Repent (Louis Quatorze) as a stallion prospect for himself and Cloverleaf. That one now stands at Vinery New York.

Wildcat Heir was originally a Cloverleaf stallion, too. When he was retired to the farm in November of 2005, Wildcat Heir had the reputation of a horse who perhaps had never showed his best in the afternoon, which isn't something you can't say about a lot of horses with a Grade I win to their credit.

Plagued by injuries through his career, Wildcat Heir debuted at two in June of 2002 for Eb Novak's New Farm, which bred the colt, and earned a huge 107 BRIS figure winning at Monmouth. The Ben Perkins, Jr.-trained colt went favored in the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga in his next start, but couldn't keep pace with Whywhywhy (Mr. Greeley) and finished second.

It would be another 15 months before he saw action again and, after running second to Alke (Grand Slam) in a Belmont allowance in October of 2003, he went missing again for another seven months. Perkins got the horse right at four, however, and was rewarded when Wildcat Heir capped off a four-for-seven season with a victory over Midas Eyes (Touch Gold) in the 2004 GI Frank de Francis Memorial S. at Laurel.

Off for another extended break, Wildcat Heir earned the biggest figure of his career when he posted a 114 BRIS winning the Teddy Drone S. at Monmouth in 2005, an effort that so impressed handicappers that he was the only horse under 10-1 against the seemingly invincible Lost in the Fog (Lost Soldier) in the 2005 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. Neither horse raced very well. Lost in the Fog, put down less than a year later from cancerous tumors, finished seventh; Wildcat Heir finished 10th, and emerged from the race with a fractured knee. Shortly thereafter, it was announced that Wildcat Heir would begin stud duties at Cloverleaf for a partnership of WinStar Farm, Taylor Made and New Farm.

"Byron Rodgers was working for Taylor Made at the time, and Byron said, 'Hey, would you like to do some business with us?'" explained Fernung. "I asked what he had in mind. When he said Wildcat Heir, I said, 'Yeah, that's the kind of horse I can be interested in.'"

Florida breeders agreed; Wildcat Heir was hugely popular in his first year. Only nine stallions in the country covered more than the 173 mares he served in his first year at stud. The next year, in 2007, he bred 177 mares, co-third-highest in the country. He dipped to a still-respectable 97 mares in his third year, but was back up to 130 mares in 2009, the year his first runners hit the track. Wildcat Heir bred 150 mares last term. Fernung said being a big cat in a small forest helped Wildcat Heir maintain those books. Cont. p9

"They probably would have done just as well with him the first year in Kentucky," said Fernung. "But it's a little more difficult in Kentucky in the second, third and fourth years, because they have that onslaught of good horses ever year coming off the track. I think that helped the horse a lot--his smallest book during his first four years was [97] mares."

Wildcat Heir's runners made an immediate impact. In May of 2009, the late Jack Werk wrote on his blog, "The two-year-old filly Wildcat Aly [recently] won a \$62,600 maiden special at Woodbine to become her first-crop sire's fifth winner of the young season! At WTC Inc., we spend a lot of time tracking young stallions, and to have five individual winners by mid-May is an obvious indication that a stallion is siring precocious stock and needs to be followed closely." Werk was right; Wildcat Heir ended the season as the nation's leading sire by winners (39) and ranked fourth by earnings.

"The funny thing I heard more than once was, 'Well, he wasn't a very precocious horse; he didn't win stakes as a two-year-old,'" Fernung smiled. "He made up for that with 39 two-year-old winners, and now people don't say that anymore."

When Cloverleaf dissolved and Fernung launched Journeyman in 2007, Wildcat Heir made the trip across town with him. At the time, Rodgers was quoted as saying that the ownership group considered moving the horse to Kentucky based on the attractiveness of his foals. There may have been a bit of marketing going on there, but there's little doubt that Wildcat Heir could stand in the Bluegrass if his owners chose to relocate.

"It's an ongoing process," said Fernung. "I think the majority owners in the horse, including Mr. Novak from New Farm, looked at moving the horse to Kentucky, but I think I convinced him that whatever they can do in Kentucky, I can do here this year. Probably, as time goes on, there might be a point where they'll want to move him to Kentucky. But as long as I can match what they could do here, then it's a pretty good reason to leave him here. There's something to be said for having the best horse in Florida, as opposed to the 35th best horse in Kentucky. If he gets a Breeders' Cup horse, or a Classic contender, something that makes him really stick, out, then I think he'd earn his way to Kentucky."

While it's too early to cast a mold, Wildcat Heir has done especially well with fillies thus far. In fact, all 10 of his stakes winners are of the fairer sex. (Strangely, the remainder of his stakes horses, seven in all, are all colts or geldings.)

In addition to Richiegirgonewild, Wildcat Heir is the sire of the black-type winners Derwin's Star, Karmageddon, Wild Mia, Wildcat Heiress, Wild About Marie, Dances With Ashley, She'll Heir, and Fiscal Policy. His best runner right now appears to be the three-year-old Breathoffreshheir, a New Farm homebred who improved to three-for-four when she won the Jan. 2 Ruthless S. at Aqueduct.

Fernung said Wildcat Heir's success means he could breed the stallion to as many mares as he'd like to in 2011.

"But I'll cut his book back some," Fernung noted. "I hoping to limit him to about 125 or 130 mares. I don't want to crank him up over 150 again. But you don't realize how many friends you have until you have a hot horse people are trying to get mares to."

Asked if the cutback was in order to alleviate wear and tear on the stallion, Fernung laughed, "I don't know if it takes its toll on him, but it's stressful as hell for me! But yeah, I think, at some point, it does take its toll on a stallion. And at some point your numbers will start to go down the more mares you breed. It's mostly a matter of managing the horse in a reasonable manner. But, as far as the horse goes, he's never complained about his job."

Wildcat Heir is a grandson of Storm Cat and shares the great sire's propensity for siring early developing stock, but physically, he takes his cues from his female family, said Fernung.

"He reminds me of a correct Pentelicus," said Fernung. "Pentelicus was a big, pretty horse. He didn't give you a real good set of knees, and didn't have a real good knees himself. But this horse, to me, took the best of the Storm Cat line and the Forest Wildcat line--who was a pretty nice Storm Cat sire in that he got correct horses--and the best of the Pentelicus line." -LM

Donald Dizney's **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even), second or third in five Grade I races last season as a sophomore, has been transferred to trainer Bob Baffert in California, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Previously under the care of Dale Romans, the big colt was most recently fourth after a questionable ride as the odds-on choice in the Sunshine Millions Classic Jan. 29. "We're just getting to know him," Baffert told *DRF*. "He looks good, though." First Dude, who has amassed \$895,160 in his 13 races thus far, remains eligible for a non-winners of one.

Jockeys, Horses OK After Spill:

Edited press release

Four jockeys escaped serious injury after being unseated from their mounts in a chain-reaction spill during the stretch run of Friday's fifth race at Gulfstream Park. Although reluctant, veteran jockey Eduardo Nunez was taken to Hollywood Memorial Hospital after complaining of facial and neck pain. Pedro Monterrey Jr. and Allen Maragh took off their remaining mounts as a precaution, while Sebastian Madrid continued to ride. All four horses escaped serious injury and were walked back to the stable area. The incident occurred when Wild Apache fell after clipping the rear heels of Air Union nearing the finish, tossing Maragh to the track. Nunez, aboard In the Sweets, Monterrey, on Universal Soul, and Madrid, aboard A.P. Sierra were subsequently unseated in efforts to avoid the Nunez and his mount. Air Union, who finished second under jockey Elvis Trujillo behind race winner Fly On the Wall, was disqualified and placed last for drifting out into the path of Wild Apache. Earlier on the card, apprentice jockey Jose Alvarez was taken to Hollywood Memorial Hospital after being unseated from his mount in the first race. Alvarez, who fell to the racetrack when Nuevo Seville appeared to hit the inside rail leaving the backstretch in the six-furlong race, complained of neck and back pain. Agent Jose Sanchez reported that Alvarez expected to be released from the hospital later Friday after precautionary x-rays were taken.

Darren McAuliffe's Impressive Racing extended to A\$240,000 to land the yearling from Ron Sayers' Yarradale Stud draft. "He's a lovely colt," McAuliffe said of [lot 318](#). "I looked after his mum when I was working as a strapper with Lou Luciani. Of all her progeny so far this guy is probably the closest to her. He's a good, tough-looking colt. He's not that big, but mum wasn't and she was tough and she won a Karrakatta Plate." A Show a Heart (Aus) half-brother to Aussie leading juvenile filly Karuta Queen (Aus) (Not a Single Doubt {Aus}) also proved popular yesterday, bringing A\$230,000 from Melbourne-based bloodstock agent Damon Gabbedy. He was offered by Durham Lodge as [lot 331](#). "He's a really flashy individual who has a lot going for him," Gabbedy said. "He's a loose, great walking horse with plenty of length and scope--he looks a real natural runner. There's plenty of presence about him. He will almost certainly be trained in the Eastern States." The sale's three-day gross passed A\$12 million; the average of A\$44,669 was up eight percent on last year's auction. Magic Millions Acting Managing Director David Chester offered, "As has happened at all auctions around Australasia this year the quality lots proved popular and sold accordingly. The lower end of the market was tough and we obviously would have liked the clearance rate of 67 percent to be higher. The economy hasn't helped--particularly the high Australian dollar. We had lower levels of visitors and trade from abroad--although we still had buyers from Malaysia, Singapore and South Africa. Buyers, as we expected, were very selective and this has become the norm around the region over recent years."
