## DIALED IN TO SKIP FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH

The connections of GIII Holy Bull S. winner **Dialed In** (Mineshaft) have opted to skip Saturday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park, *Daily Racing Form* reports. The Robert LaPenta colorbearer, impressive in a maiden victory at Churchill Downs Nov. 12, came back to make it two-for-two with an eye-catching late run in the one-mile Holy Bull Jan. 30. "I conferred with both Bob and his son Rob, and we all were in agreement that it would not be right to ask Dialed In to come back in four weeks after the Superman-type effort he turned in to win the Holy Bull," trainer Nick Zito told *DRF*. "They said let's skip the Fountain of Youth and look for a two-turn race before the Florida Derby." The colt is scheduled to work Friday or Saturday. It has not yet been decided where Dialed In will go next, but Zito indicated that he would not take on champion Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) in the \$100,000 Timely Writer S. at Gulfstream Mar. 12, as it is a one-turn mile. He added, "Fortunately, he has enough graded earnings from the Holy Bull that it looks like he'll get into the [Kentucky] Derby, so our main focus at the moment is the Florida Derby and how to get him there."

No Advantage, winner of the GIII W.D. Schaefer S. in May of 2009 for Suarez Racing, Joseph Besecker and Kirk Wycoff, went through the ring at Keeneland November later that year, with Pablo Suarez's Suarez Racing retaining ownership. Fourth in this event at the start of 2010, he failed to find the winner's circle in nine subsequent starts, but was second in the Schaefer in May and in the HPA Governor's Cup at Charles Town in October. He broke the losing streak with a rallying score in the Auld Lang Syne S. at Parx Racing on New Year's Eve, and entered this off a second in the Native Dancer S. going a mile at Laurel Jan. 17.

Overlooked by the crowd, No Advantage settled off the pace as the leaders battled through a half in :46.61. He closed ground on the far turn, drove to the front at midstretch and held off the late charge of Laysh Laysh Laysh to prevail. "This horse normally breaks a little bit slow, so I just let him find his stride going down the backside," said jockey Manuel Chaves. "He just gets comfortable and gets into the race and responds whenever I ask him.

Cozi Rosie had some success on the all-weather, graduating when stretched to two turns for her third start at Santa Anita last January, and adding an optional-claiming score the following month. The Moss homebred was switched to the turf after running fifth in the GI Santa Anita Oaks in March, but ran into trouble in the stretch and could do no better than seventh in the GII Providencia S. Apr. 3. Brought back for the GIII Senorita S. at Hollywood May 2, she rallied to win by a length, and she was beaten just a head by Evening Jewel (Northern Afleet) when second in the GII Honey-moon H. May 31. The filly had not been out since, but her task was made easier when connections decided to scratched Evening Jewel due to the slight give in the grass and the outside post she had drawn. Rated off moderate early splits, Cozi Rosie closed some ground on the far turn and was put to the test when she turned for home, catching pacesetter Briecat in the final yards before edging clear. "There was certainly a sense of relief when I saw Evening Jewel scratch out of the race," jockey Mike Smith admitted. "She's very talented and she has tactical speed. She would have been making the first run and I would have had to try and run her down. My horse is sharp and she got away well. I opted to get her clear real quick down the backside just because she's a big filly and I needed to give her some room. I didn't care about going wide because I already saved ground on the first turn, and she ran dynamite. She has so much room to improve. I don't know how many gears she has, but she only used a couple today." It was the eighth graded win of the meet for trainer John Sadler. Cambina kicked off her career carrying the colors of Mrs. John Magnier for trainer Tommy Stack in Ireland, breaking her maiden at Killarney in her second outing in July and taking a conditions event over that course in her fourth attempt in August. The chestnut filly ran second as a 14-1 shot in the Flame of Tara S. at The Curragh Sept. 12; the winner that afternoon, undefeated Chrysanthemum (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), followed up with a victory in the G3 Park S. two weeks later. Cambina was purchased

privately after that race by a partnership headed by Californians Anthony Bilich, a mortgage broker from San Ramon, Jason Cline of Danville and George Schmitt, a New York native who retired in 2000 after establishing the first-ever mobile phone service in Germany.

She ran into traffic trouble in her U.S. debut in the Jan. 22 Sweet Life S. at Santa Anita, but enjoyed clear sailing from far off the pace this time. Eased back to last out of the gate, she trailed the field through a half in :44.17. The Irish-bred still had the majority of the field in front of her as they came across the dirt, and swung widest of all at the top of the stretch. She seemed to have an impossible task as she hit the gas on the far outside, but came flying in the final sixteenth to get up in the very last jump. "She's small, but she's got a lot of heart and she's got a heckuva turn of foot," jockey Garrett Gomez said. 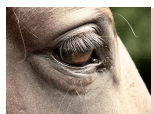

When I saw the result of Australia's Lightning S. at the weekend, I jumped to the conclusion that the connections of the stunning winner, Black Caviar, would be busily arranging for their excellent mare to tackle the major English sprints in June and July.

After all, Australian sprinters have tended to dominate Royal Ascot's feature sprints in recent years, with Choisir (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), Takeover Target (Celtic Swing {GB}), Miss Andretti (Ihtiram {Ire}) and Scenic Blast (Scenic {Ire}) all taking the King's Stand S. Choisir followed up in the Golden Jubilee, a race that also fell to another Aussie raider, Starspangledbanner (Choisir {Aus}), last year. Starspangledbanner went on to take the July Cup, with the Australian mare Alverta (Flying Spur {Aus}) a good third; Choisir had put up a bold show against Oasis Dream (Green Desert) in the Newmarket Group 1 seven years earlier.

The merit of these globetrotting sprinters has been recognised in the World Thoroughbred Rankings. With a rating of 123, Black Caviar was the highest-rated sprinter in the older horses section of the 2010 rankings, four pounds above the best of America's specialist sprinters, Big Drama (Montbrook), Kinsale King (Yankee Victor) and Majesticperfection (Harlan's Holiday). Starspangledbanner was included in the three-year-old section and he too was rated four pounds higher than the best American specialist, Smiling Tiger (Hold That Tiger).

It had been a similar story in 2009, when the top three sprinters in the older horse section all carried the (Aus) suffix after their name (one was based in Hong Kong and another in Singapore).

The Hong Kong-based Aussie, Sacred Kingdom (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), had been considered the equal of Midnight Lute (Real Quiet) in 2008, when these two were followed in the older sprinter rankings by two more Australians in Weekend Hussler (Hussonet) and Apache Cat (Lion Cavern). I could go on, but I'm assuming that you already get the picture--that horses bred in Australia are proving a match for any in the world over sprint distances.

Unfortunately for those of us in Europe, it sounds as though Black Caviar's trainer Peter Moody is reluctant to test the daughter of Bel Esprit against the top Europeans in their own backyard, at least this year. This is a pity, as Black Caviar looks ideally qualified to boost the reputation of Australasian bloodstock in much the same way that Starcraft (Soviet Star), Haradasun (Fusaichi Pegasus) and the previously mentioned sprinters did during the noughties. We also have the fascinating prospect of the New Zealand-bred, Australian-raced So You Think (High Chaparral {Ire}) competing in Europe's top middle-distance events this year.

As with most horses bred in the Southern Hemisphere, Black Caviar possesses a cosmopolitan pedigree. Although both her parents, Bel Esprit and the unraced Helsing, were bred in Australia, Bel Esprit was sired during one of Royal Academy's flying visits from Ashford Stud, and Helsing is by Desert Sun, a British-bred import.

To add to the mix, Black Caviar has the distinction of having a fourth dam, Love Song, who was foaled in Denmark. Love Song competed in Britain, Sweden and Denmark, notably winning the 1979 Dansk Oaks.

**Pedigree Insights cont.**

After being sold for 4,600 guineas, Love Song was sent to Australia, where she produced two colts and three fillies. Two of the fillies produced group winners, with Song of Kingston producing Muirfield Village, a colt good enough to finish second in the G1 Victoria Derby and G1 Spring Champion S.

However, the daughter that concerns us here is Love Song's Vain filly, Song of Norway. This mare's name and heritage provided scope for some chilly-sounding names, and she enjoyed stakes success with Frosty The Snowman, Midnight Sun and Russian Tea Room, as well as with Black Caviar's second dam Scandinavia.

Scandinavia was a daughter of Snippets, a leading two-year-old and sprinter who once finished second in the Lightning S. (the race won by Black Caviar three days ago). Scandinavia became one of the 50-plus stakes winners by Snippets, winning the G3 Blue Diamond Preview over five furlongs at two and the six-panel QTC Cup at three. Her speed also brought her third place in the 1999 Lightning S.

I'm guessing here, but I wonder whether Scandinavia's owners were tennis fans. Her 2002 Flying Spur colt was named Magnus, perhaps after Magnus Norman, a Swede who was a semi-finalist at the 2000 Australian Open. There can be no doubt that Wilander, her 2005 son by Exceed and Excel, was

named in honor of the Swedish champion who won the Australian Open three times.

Both sons did very well. Magnus won the G1 AJC The Galaxy over 5 1/2 furlongs in 2007 and finished second to Miss Andretti in the Lightning S. before being sent by Peter Moody to England, where he finished a good third in the King's Stand S. Wilander also showed plenty of speed, with one of his group victories coming in the G2 Schillaci S., a race won by Black Caviar in 2010.

Both of Scandinavia's fast sons were by sons of Danehill, and Black Caviar's dam Helsing was also by a Danzig-line stallion in Desert Sun. This handsome son of Green Desert never quite managed to fulfil the high hopes he sometimes raised on the racetrack, but he made amends by siring that extraordinary mare Sunline, who clocked up 13 Group 1 victories in New Zealand, Australia and Hong Kong.

Black Caviar is Helsing's first foal, her latest being a 2010 Redoute's Choice filly which is inbred 3x4 to Danzig.

Black Caviar was one of three runners by Bel Esprit in the Lightning S. field. The son of Royal Academy is clearly passing on plenty of the speed which brought him six group victories at less than seven furlongs, including Group 1 wins in the Blue Diamond S. at two and the Doomben Ten Thousand at three.

Mating Helsing to Bel Esprit produces 3x4 inbreeding to Vain, a champion at two and three in Australia before becoming a champion sire and champion broodmare sire. From an American viewpoint it is arguably more interesting that Black Caviar is inbred 5x5 to Silly Season. This winner of the Dewhurst S. and Champion S. for Paul Mellon was a son of Tom Fool. Tom Fool in turn was one of the best sons of Menow, the influential stallion who appears twice in the fourth generation of Royal Academy's pedigree.

Incidentally, Royal Academy covered his last mares at the age of 22 in Australia in 2009, siring nine live foals from 14 mares. This winner of the July Cup and Breeders' Cup Mile was represented by Group 1 winners in the U.S., Britain, Ireland, France, Australia, Hong Kong, Japan, Brazil and South Africa, so it is going to be interesting to see where he makes the longest-lasting impact. It could well be Australia, as Bel Esprit is his second Australian son to sire a major sprinter, the first being Ihtiram, sire of Miss Andretti. One of Royal Academy's daughters is the dam of Fastnet Rock, a Lightning S. winner who is now covering his second book of mares at Coolmore in Ireland, having become a six-figure stallion in Australia.

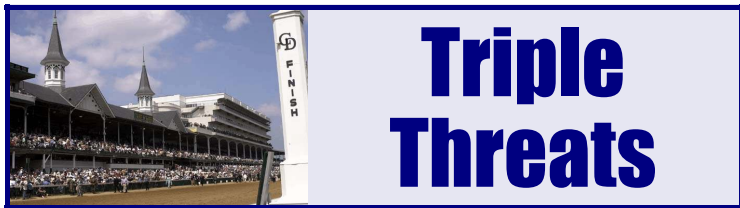

GIII Sham S., has suffered a hair-line fracture to his right front ankle and will be forced to skip the Triple Crown, *Daily Racing Form* reports. "It's miniscule and he will recover," trainer Craig Lewis told DRF. "That's the good news. The disappointment is I believe he is a true mile-and-a-quarter horse."

Lewis added, "Fortunately, the horse should fully recover. He can come back in a couple months and be a very good horse." The winner of the Barretts Juvenile S. at Fairplex last September, Clubhouse Ride was also third in the GIII Delta Jackpot S. and GI CashCall Futurity last year. A \$22,000 BESJAN juvenile purchase, he has compiled a record of 11-2-2-4 and earnings of \$317,550.



**BUEN VERSO AN INTERNATIONAL HIT**

**Buen Verso (Arg)** (Distorted Humor--Indy Verse, by A.P. Indy) got his racing career off to a rousing start with a powerful five-length victory over 1400 meters at Palermo Saturday ([video](#)). The win was an international affair for the two-year-old, who is co-owned by WinStar Farm and a racing partnership put together by bloodstock agent John Fulton.

WinStar Farm bred the colt's unraced dam Indy Verse to Distorted Humor on Southern Hemisphere time and sent her to Argentina. She produced Buen Verso at Antonio Bullrich's Haras el Mallin in September of 2008, and the youngster immediately impressed his handlers.

“The foal was raised on Antonio’s farm,” recalled Fulton. “Antonio is my partner and close friend and I have horses there, so I watched this horse grow from day one, and we always liked him.”

“[WinStar’s] idea was to sell him in the Copa Bullrich sale, so I ended up buying him,” he added. “I put together these racing packages every year, and I bought him to go into the package. Then WinStar de-

ecided that they would stay in--they wanted to participate with us. So they own half of him and then the other half is owned by my racing package.”

The syndicate, a group of nine owners and eight horses, includes some well-known names in North American racing. Roy and Gretchen Jackson, Arthur and Stacy Hancock and Gary Biszantz are all part of the partnership, as well as some racing newcomers.

The syndicate was attracted by the economic advantages of racing in Argentina.

“We got this horse for P510,000, which at that time was about \$130,000,” said Fulton. “That’s for a Distorted Humor colt out of an A.P. Indy mare. They were able to price him reasonably. The numbers are still working quite well. We train horses, pay everything--the vet, the blacksmith, the trainer and everybody--for about \$1,100 a month. And when you have success with a horse like this, there is quite a good resale market for him for export.”

The country itself has become a selling point for racing enthusiasts as well.

“Some of these people have come down here, they see Buenos Aires and they want to come back,” Fulton continued. “They see that the racing is good, healthy and passionate, and so more and more people are getting involved with us.”

Expectations for Buen Verso were high even before his first start. The colt is bred on the same cross as fellow promising WinStar runners **Brethren** (Distorted Humor--Supercharger, by A.P. Indy), winner of the Gill Sam F. Davis S., and impressive first-out victor **Cal Nation** (Distorted Humor--She’s a Winner, by A.P. Indy).

Despite the optimism of his connections, Buen Verso faced a tough task Saturday.

“We thought he would run good,” Fulton said. “But then everybody started talking about how they had their hot shots in there. The track was off, and I wasn’t sure how he’d handle that. That had me a little bit concerned, but when I looked up at the board and he was 25-1, I thought, ‘I better have a bet on this horse.’ To give you an idea of the quality of this field, with his pedigree and with good works, he went off at 13-1.”

The colt handled it all with aplomb.

“He was on the outside, so the rider sort of kept him way out on the track,” Fulton said. “He lost a lot of ground and he just waited with him. When he asked him, he never had to hit him, he just asked him to run and he kicked away and was drawing away with every stride. It came up a very strong maiden race, but he just destroyed them. It was a very, very impressive effort, and he came out of it great.”

While most of Buen Verso's owners missed his first start, there was one very excited syndicate member on hand for the victory.

"Latane Ware was there," Fulton confirmed. "It was very exciting for him and his family. They are from Virginia. Latane and his wife and their two kids are living down here for three years. They came down to expose their young girls to a different culture and language. We met just by chance through a mutual friend. He ended up getting involved with us and this was his first winner. We've had two starters out of our package. The first one ran on Feb. 6 and was a very nice third in his first start, and this was our second starter out of that package."

It could get even more exciting for Ware and his fellow owners as Buen Verso next targets the May 1 G1 Gran Premio Montevideo.

"There is not much once you break your maiden early as a two-year-old," Fulton explained. "So we'll just point him for the Montevideo. He trains well and we won't have any trouble getting him up to the race fit."

Fulton believes the extra time will be good for the colt.

"He doesn't have the appearance of a really precocious two-year-old colt," Fulton explained. "He is a good-sized, lengthy colt. He's not a big muscular horse. He's an attractive horse, but more of the bodied type of horse to run on. We're going to take our time and go for that race, and more than likely, the goal would be to go to the Estrellas [in June], which is Argentina's Breeders' Cup."

After her South American sojourn, Indy Verse was repatriated and was covered by Candy Ride (Arg) this year. But the infusion of North American mares like Indy Verse has allowed Fulton to put together a racing package with international appeal. And there are other horses to keep the syndicate members occupied while awaiting Buen Verso's May 1 date with Group 1 company.

"Also in this group, I've got one that we're waiting on for a little bit because we think he's for a little bit later on," Fulton said. "He's by Tiznow and out of a Seeking the Gold mare. It was the same deal; the mare was bred in the Northern Hemisphere and was brought down here and foaled. And he is spectacular. We're really excited about him. They just ran the first seven-eighths [race for two-year-olds], and he is a horse, like his daddy, that is going to want to run a mile or more. We probably won't run him until April, but he's training really well. We've also got a King's Best colt who is a brother to the dam of I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even). He's in the package and he is also for later on with that pedigree. We're very pleased with him. We've got a Southern Halo filly from Invasor (Arg)'s family. We've got the kind of pedigrees and individuals that we have a chance to do some good with."

Bill Would Put Private Vendor in Charge of NYC OTB: State Senators Martin J. Golden and Andrew J. Lanza introduced a bill last week that would pave the way for New York City Off-Track Betting to be run by a private vendor. The legislation calls for a request for proposal, which would be used to select the vendor. The State Racing and Wagering Board would also have to sign off on the selection. New management would be required to give former NYC OTB employees first chance at job openings, and the RFP is to include a plan for providing health benefits to NYC OTB retirees. There will be a minimum of three facilities opened in each of the five boroughs. In a statement, Sen. Golden said, "The closing of operations of the New York City Off-Track Betting Corporation was preventable, and this legislation presents a plan to bring it back in a superior form. This bill addresses the problems that closing OTB caused, including job and benefits loss, and that is why I urge my colleagues to support this bill and ask for swift legislative action in the Senate and the Assembly." Added Sen. Golden, "This is our chance to bring back OTB to New York City to make it profitable long-term, generate revenue, and create hundreds of jobs. We cannot simply abandon the workers and the role that OTB has played in our city since 1972."

Arlington Park and the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association announced Monday that purses for overnight races at the 2011 meet will be based on field size. In order to qualify for the purse listed in the condition book, a race will have to field at least seven betting interests. If fewer than seven are saddled for the race, the purse will be cut 15 percent, and that money will be returned to the purse account. "This banking program will allow us to maintain a sustainable purse structure at the most competitive time of the year," said Arlington General Manager Tony Petrillo.
