## F-T FOY HAS MAJOR DERBY IMPLICATIONS

today's GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream. The impressive Nov. 6 GII Nashua S. and Nov. 27 GII Remsen S. winner has been carefully handled by Hall of Fame conditioner Bill Mott, having skipped the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last term and with only two preps--this and, most likely, the GI Florida Derby here Apr. 3-- on his plate before a tilt in the GI Kentucky Derby May 7. "He's going into this race with only six works, which is not an overabundance, but this is by no means supposed to be his best race," Mott told *Daily Racing Form*.

"But we've got to get started and I'm hoping and expecting to see a good effort on Saturday." To Honor and Serve's two-year-old form was flattered a week ago when Nashua and Remsen runner-up Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) annexed the GII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds by 1 1/2 lengths. The expected Fountain of Youth favorite was the third individual betting choice at 10-1 in Pool 1 of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager. **Soldat** (War Front) will make his first dry dirt route attempt following a 10 3/4-length allowance romp over track and trip in the slop Jan. 21. After a pair of runner-up efforts sprinting on the main track to kick off his career at two, the Kiaran McLaughlin trainee broke his maiden in the turf GIII With Anticipation S. at Saratoga and was runner-up in the GIII Pilgrim S. at Belmont and the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf S. under the Twin Spires Nov. 6. **Gourmet Dinner** (Trippi), winner of the \$1,000,000 GIII Delta Downs Jackpot Nov. 20, is coming off a fourth-place finish in the GIII Holy Bull S. here Jan. 30. Eclipse Award-winning pilot Ramon Dominguez climbs aboard for the first time. **Full Field p2**

## ATONEMENT DAY IN DAVONA DALE

John Oxley's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Dancinginherdreams** (Tapit) tasted defeat for the first time in her career at the hands of Hardacre Farm's **Pomeroys Pistol** (Pomeroy) in the seven-furlong GII Forward Gal S. Jan. 30, but is expected to reverse form with that rival when they rematch in this afternoon's GII Davona Dale S. over Gulfstream's one-turn mile. The \$330,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase took her first two starts--including the GII Pocahontas S.--by over 10 lengths combined, but couldn't quite get to the pace-pressing Pomeroys Pistol in the Forward Gal, missing by a diminishing 3/4 of a length. **Cont. p3**


## 'TRAVELIN' LOOKS TO REPEAT DEBUT IN HUTCH

E. Paul Robsham Stables LLC's **Travelin Man** (Trippi) will try to run back to his devastating 7 1/4-length debut romp at Gulfstream Jan. 6 today in the track's GII Hutcheson S. for sophomores at seven furlongs. The homebred earned a 106 Beyer Speed Figure for his impressive unveiling, the highest earned by a three-year-old so far this term. "From one race, from a figure standpoint, he's the possible favorite and one to beat," trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "From an experience standpoint, he might have benefitted from an allowance race. But I think he's talented enough to compete." **Cont. p3**

Ever the realist, trainer John Ward is making lemonade out of the Forward Gal lemons. "The filly showed me a new dimension and some grit this last time," trainer John Ward told *Daily Racing Form*. "She was chasing horses down and running to catch the leader instead of just blowing to the lead and galloping like she did in her first two starts." Dancinginherdreams will have to be aware of the field's newest face, Lally Stable's **Oh Carole**. The bay, produced by a half-sister to champion Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}), debuted victoriously over the Keeneland Polytrack Oct. 15. She proved she was something other than a synthetic freak in her sophomore debut, coming from off the pace to land a first-level allowance over 6 1/2 furlongs of this main track Jan. 30. Though the distance of the two races was different, Oh Carole earned a Beyer four points superior to the one earned by Pomeroy's Pistol for the Forward Gal.

**R Heat Lightning** is in search of her first victory since taking the GI Spinaway S. last September. Runner-up in the GI Frizette S. and in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, she was bumped at the start of the Forward Gal, but appeared to have no alibi thereafter, finishing 4 1/2 lengths back in fourth.

Travelin Man might also have to overcome a significant pace disadvantage. Most members of this field, like him, appear to have their eyes on the early lead. Darley's **Crossbow** found himself in a furious speed duel when finishing third on debut at Aqueduct Nov. 27. He and a foe, last Saturday's impressive graduate Escort (First Samurai), got their first quarter in :21.40 that day. The son of MGSW Forest Heiress (Forest Wildcat) has bounced back nicely from that meltdown with a maiden-breaker at Aqueduct Jan. 2 and a track-and-trip allowance tally Jan. 29. Peachtree Stable's **Flashpoint** also caught the eye with a speedy first go at Aqueduct Jan. 15, dashing home by 6 1/4 lengths over a next-out winner. One of the few definite closers in this event is Klaravich Stables and William H. Lawrence's **Leave of Absence**. The bay broke his maiden second out in New York Nov. 7 with a 94 Beyer Speed Figure and returned in 2011 to take the place slot in the Spectacular Bid S. here Jan. 8. Leave of Absence was given little chance after experiencing early traffic trouble in the GIII Holy Bull S. here last out Jan. 30, finishing sixth. He adds the hood, cuts back a furlong and comes into this locked-and-loaded with a bullet four-panel drill at Palm Meadows Feb. 22.

**F-T UNVEILS NEW VENUE FOR JUVENILE SALE**

Fasig-Tipton Company, which has partnered with Calder Racecourse for over 25 years to host its annual Two-Year-old in Training sale, has opted for a change of venue for its 2011 edition, heading north to Palm Meadows Training Center in Boyton Beach.

“We thought it was just a great opportunity to improve the sale this year,” said Boyd Browning Jr., Fasig-Tipton president. “There is virtually no argument that Palm Meadows is the finest training center, in my opinion, in the U.S.,” said Browning. “It has a beautiful barn set up and racetrack. It is a great environment for both horses and humans. So, from that perspective, it’s always been at the back of our minds to conduct a sale there.”

In contrast to the breeding stock and mixed auctions scheduled throughout the sales’ season, the two-year-olds in training sales bring to center stage a generally different type of buyer, whom Fasig-Tipton decided would be more accessible at Palm Meadows.

“Palm Meadows has a strong a group of buyers, with plenty of buying power, who are actually situated there,” explained Browning. “Buyers can physically watch the horses train every day and literally walk 300 yards to inspect the horses. When you look at the training roster that is stabled at Palm Meadows, it’s dramatic buying power of the people stabled there.”

While some buyers agree that Calder’s backstretch and track wasn’t always considered ideal in the preparation of juveniles for sale, Browning was nothing but glowing in his praise for the Miami-area oval.

“Calder was a great home for us for over 25 years,” he offered. “We had a great relationship with the staff and the team at Calder while we were there, and we have maintained a great relationship with them.”

Explaining a few of the advantages to the change, Browning said, "It was an opportunity to have a little more upscale environment with a slightly different racetrack and a slightly different barn layout that's newer. Everything is configured slightly different, with the sales horses in one area, so it makes the logistics easier for both buyers and sellers alike. It works very efficiently for us at Palm Meadows."

While fitted with a generally appreciated racing and training surface, as well as housing facilities for backstretch workers, Palm Meadows had not been equipped with the amenities to host a Thoroughbred sale, that is until this year.

"We have put in temporary facilities, including a large tent that is going to act as the sales pavilion," said Browning, explaining some of the modifications. "It will



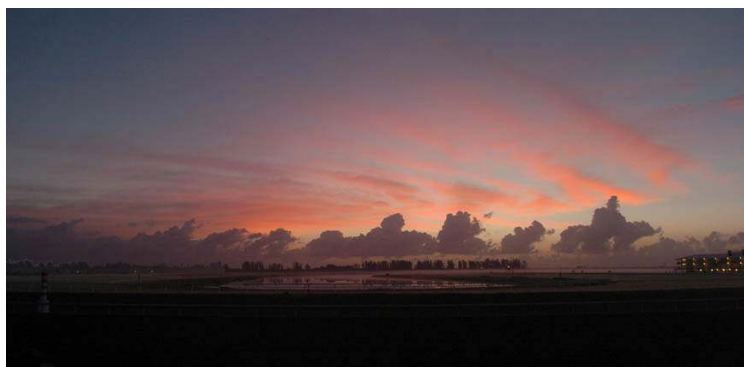

include ancillary services, such as videos, sales office and food services. We will also have temporary stands in place for the breeze show. Previously, we had converted the paddock at Calder for years, and that worked really well, so I think this will work well too."

When asked how buyers might regard this year's changes, Browning added, "We always try to take great care of the horses and do everything we can to present them in the most favorable light. We also make a genuine effort to treat the buyers well, and in the end, they want the opportunity to buy quality horses in a quality environment."

Listed among buyers who have frequented Fasig-Tipton's juvenile sale over the last three decades is bloodstock agent Buzz Chace.

"Palm Meadows is the greatest place I've ever seen to train horses," said Chace, echoing Browning's sentiments. "You don't really hear anybody knock that place, as far as soundness goes. The track itself, the cushion that's on it and the people that take care of it is first rate. The surface is very consistent and so it should work out well down there."

Among equine luminaries to have emerged from the sale are dual Eclipse Champion Gio Ponti (Tale of the Cat); GISWs A Shin Forward (Forest Wildcat), Devil May Care (Malibu Moon) and Court Vision (Gulch); in addition to Grade II scorers Munnings (Speightstown) and More Than Real (More Than Ready). And Fasig-Tipton officials are upbeat that the new venue will serve to further highlight Fasig-Tipton's future racing stars.

"We're excited about this year's catalog," said Brown ing. "We have another strong catalog for 2011, and our consignors have delivered a very high-quality product. I've already had a lot of feedback from people who are watching these horses in the morning and have looked at some horses in the barn area. They are very enthusiastic and think we have a stellar group this year."

As in prior years, Fasig-Tipton scouts sought out, and according to Browning, successfully secured a solid group of athletes for this year's catalog.

"Our approach is always pretty simple, we try to find the best horses we possibly can," said Browning. "We look for the combination of good pedigrees, but we do tend to lean toward athleticism. We were very impressed when we had visited Ocala, because that's where most of our product comes from for our two-year-old sales. During those inspections, this past fall and early winter, we were very impressed with the quality horses we saw there and continue to be so."

Previously, Fasig-Tipton presented its breeze show on Friday before hosting the sale the following Tuesday.

"The breeze show on Friday conflicts with racing, so we really only had a choice to have a breeze show against live racing [Friday] or a sale against live racing [Thursday]. With the only dark days being on Monday's and Tuesdays, it obviously impossible to have them on consecutive days."

Highlighting today's racing action at Gulfstream is the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S., which has drawn divisional standout To Honor and Serve (Bernardini).

"Since the Fountain of Youth is an important activity in its own right, we didn't want it squeezed in there as well," said Browning, explaining another factor in deciding against the Friday Breeze/Thursday sale option.

"So what we tried to do is have folks focus on this great racing weekend, including the Fountain of Youth, which will set the tone for the sales activities next week."

According to Browning, the final schedule was designed in an attempt to accommodate the often hectic selling schedules of buyers and sellers.

"By breezing on Monday and selling on Thursday, we also eliminate one day between the breeze and the

sale," he explained. "There used to be five days between the days, and now we have cut that to four. In the world that we live in, time is a precious commodity and it effectively shortened the window by 20%. It cuts down on travel time and the time it will require people for people to attend the sale."

Departing from what is generally considered the norm in sales' scheduling, Fasig-Tipton will host its juvenile sale in direct competition with live racing, which will be conducted down the A1A at Gulfstream in Hallandale.

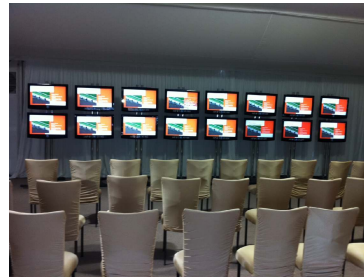
“We talked to the folks at Gulfstream in advance,” confirmed Browning. “We recognized that there would either be a conflict with the breeze show or the sale. We believed the Monday/Thursday format would work very well and the feedback that we have received thus far has been positive. Most weeks, the competition builds as the week goes on, so the competition on a Thursday racecard is slightly lighter versus a Friday, which tends to be a little bit better.”

Browning, who admitted that Fasig-Tipton considered it a top priority to have potential buyers in attendance at the all-important breeze show, didn't feel the racing action down the interstate would affect buyer's attendance of the sale.

“In the past, people might miss the breeze show to attend the races, but in the world we live in now, folks have strong assistance and depths to their racing teams and personnel, so it's not a huge hardship if they have to miss a day of live racing and have their assistants saddle their horses on Thursday,” said Browning.

And voicing his opinion from the buying bench, Chace was unfazed by Fasig-Tipton's decision to sell on a racing day.

“It's ok that it is on a racing day; it's not like it is on a Saturday or a Sunday with a stakes race,” he said. “That doesn't bother me in the least.”

**MI DEVELOPMENTS-CDI DISPUTE REMAINS UNRESOLVED** MI Developments CEO Frank Stronach and Churchill Downs Inc. CEO Bill Carstanjen met Friday in Kentucky to discuss a dispute over race dates between MID's Gulfstream Park and Churchill's Calder Race Course, but failed to reach a compromise. With the deadline for race date applications for the next fiscal year (July 1, 2011-June 30, 2012) due to the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering Monday at midnight, it appears likely that the two South Florida tracks could find themselves in direct competition. Calder, which re-opens Apr. 25, is expected to run a four-day a week schedule through 2011, while Gulfstream plans to run twice a week from July 1 until their regular meet begins Nov. 26. "Frank said to move forward with the construction of the new barns and everything else necessary to reopen here in July," Gulfstream vice president Tim Ritvo told *Daily Racing Form*. "[He] said he's glad there is the opportunity for free enterprise in south Florida racing, and he's happy that horsemen will now have another choice at where to stable and where to run here year-round," added Ritvo. Gulfstream informed Calder horsemen of their plans in a letter Friday, adding that any horse shipping from Gulfstream Park to race elsewhere would be allowed to return. Calder officials informed horsemen earlier this week that any horse shipped to Gulfstream to compete in anything besides a graded stakes race would be barred from returning to his or her stall.

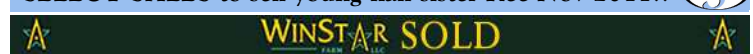

**Suffolk OTB Could File for Bankruptcy:**

Officials at New York's Suffolk Regional Off-Track Betting Corporation announced Friday that they are considering filing for bankruptcy protection. "Suffolk OTB's Board of Directors voted on Thursday, Feb. 24 to authorize the President and Vice-President to proceed with a reorganization plan (Chapter 9) when, and if, they deem it necessary," a statement on the OTB's website read. "It is anticipated that this decision will be reached sometime next week," the message explained. The OTB system, which operates 12 OTB parlors on Eastern Long Island as well as 16 self-betting terminals, remains open for business, and there are plans for it to stay that way should the organization file for bankruptcy. "With something like a reorganization, it would give us the breathing room we need as far as renegotiating some leases and considering whether to close some less-profitable parlors," Suffolk OTB spokeswoman Debbie Pfeiffer told *Daily Racing Form*. "We would remain open." New York State Racing and Wagering Board president John Sabini met with Suffolk OTB President Jeff Casale and vice president Anthony Pancella Friday. "We have asked them for additional financial information that we have not been provided with yet," said Sabini after the meeting Friday. "They have assured us that they will get that information to us--information that we need to further assess their financial position. And that's where we are at this point."

The NYSRWB has the authority to revoke Suffolk OTB's operating license, but it is unlikely that such an action will be taken unless direct violations of the licensing agreement are discovered. This would be the second off-track-betting corporation in the state to file for bankruptcy in recent memory, following New York City OTB's declaration of bankruptcy in 2009 and subsequent closure in late 2010.

**University of KY Reporting Increase in Placentitis:**

*Edited Press Release*

The University of Kentucky Maxwell H. Gluck Equine Research Center and Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory has reported an increase in the number of cases of fetuses and placentas submitted to the laboratory and diagnosed with nocardioform placentitis.

This is a unique form of bacterial placentitis affecting late gestation mares, causing abortion, stillbirth or foals born alive but compromised. This form of placentitis was first diagnosed in central Kentucky in the 1980s and has also been reported in other areas of the United States and abroad.

The number of nocardioform placentitis cases fluctuates from year to year. How mares become affected has not been determined. Nocardioform placentitis is typically a sporadic occurrence on the farm, however, and there is no evidence that affected mares pose a risk to other mares in their herd.

Mares experiencing nocardioform placentitis breed back normally and are not at an increased risk for reoccurrence in subsequent pregnancies. While the number of cases has increased this year, incidence within the overall population of mares is very low, with less than 1% abortions reported.

According to researchers at UK, based on past observations, it is likely that the number of cases will return to average levels in future years.

The Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory's epidemiology section constantly surveys the occurrence of animal diseases, and trends are immediately noted and monitored. A detailed epidemiological study is currently underway to identify risk factors associated with nocardioform placentitis.

"The VDL has constant surveillance for trends and emerging problems that allowed for early identification of the increase in placentitis cases. We will continue to monitor for the occurrence of this and other problems through epidemiology and diagnostic testing," said Neil Williams, professor and the laboratory's associate director. "The increased capabilities for surveillance we have built in the past several years allow us to catch syndromes early."

A survey will be sent to farm managers in the near future, and results will be used to complete a first-line analysis for risk factors. UK will then distribute a report of the findings.

According to Mats Troedsson, director of the Gluck Center and chair of the department of veterinary science at UK, the Gluck Center, Veterinary Diagnostic Laboratory and area veterinarians are currently engaged in collaborative research to better understand, diagnose and treat this type of placentitis, as well as placentitis in general.

Farms are encouraged to submit to the lab any fetus (including placenta) that is aborted, as well as placentas from any live foalings where the placenta is judged to be abnormal or the foal is compromised. This is to understand the scope of the situation better and to provide research data.

**TOC Announces 2010 Awards:**

*Edited Press Release*

For the third consecutive year, Jerry and Ann Moss were named Owners of the Year and their mare Zenyatta Horse of the Year by the Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC). They also will receive the award for "Most California Purse Money Won." The awards for "Most California Stakes Races Won" and "Most California Wins" went to the Craig Family Trust and La Canada Stables, respectively. New California owners Anthony Ramsden and William Warren were chosen in a tie as Rookies of the Year. "Story of the Year" went to Zenyatta's 2010 California Campaign.

The Mosses led all owners in California by purse money won with \$1,497,593. They campaigned Zenyatta, who won her 19th consecutive race in California, as well as stakes winners Neko Bay and Cozi Rosie. Jenny Craig, who races as the Craig Family Trust, won eight stakes races with her two stand-outs Sydney's Candy and Twirling Candy. La Canada Stables won a remarkable 59 races in California in 2010. Among their winners was Royal F J, who ran third in the G2 Del Mar Derby.

Ramsden won two races and over \$80,500 in earnings, and his Locksley Hall ran second in the Harry Henson Stakes at Hollywood Park. Mr. Warren also won two races with his horses finishing on the board in 75% of their starts and with earnings of \$80,000. The selection process included a media selection committee comprised of representatives from northern and southern California track publicity, print media, television, and local handicappers. The winners were chosen by a combined vote of the media committee and members of the TOC board of directors.

Selected to receive this year's Ed Friendly Industry Service Award were Jerry and Ann Moss. The award is presented annually to recognize outstanding contributions and service in the Thoroughbred racing industry. The Mosses became Thoroughbred owners in 1970, had their first stakes win in 1981 and won the Kentucky Derby in 2005 with longshot Giacomo. Jerry Moss has served on the California Horse Racing Board since 2004 and generously donated a portion of Zenyatta's 2010 earnings to racing charities.

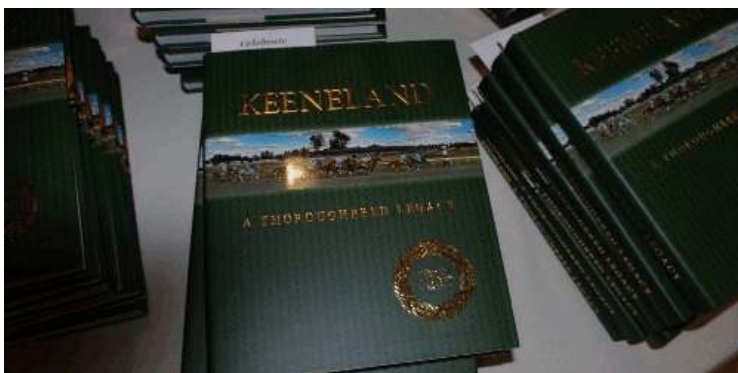
