EXCLAMATION POINT!

John Fort's Peachtree Stable's **Flashpoint** (Pomeroy), a dazzling 6 1/4-length debut wire-to-wire winner over the Big A inner dirt Jan. 15 ([TDN Taking Flight](#)), made it look easy with another brilliant performance in yesterday's GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream Park. Hounding 3-5 favorite **Travelin Man** (Trippi) from the outside through fractions of :22.16 and :44.53, Flashpoint blew past that rival following a sizzling six furlongs in 1:08.84, and opened daylight in the stretch to score by an eye-catching 7 1/4 lengths. "You have to be excited after a horse does that," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. commented. "He was sensational the first time and sensational today. I thought he'd be in front, but broke a step slow and sat off [Travelin Man], so I'm happy to know that he can do that." As for what's next, Dutrow continued, "We'll discuss the options, including the Florida Derby. Personally, I like the seven-eighths to a mile-and-an-eighth angle, but we'll see. I would say his next start will be here. You never know if they can go long until they do it, but naturally with the [Kentucky] Derby coming up everybody thinks about it."

Saratoga last summer before completing the exacta in the GIII Pilgrim S. at Belmont Oct. 3 and the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Churchill Downs Nov. 6. He previously hit the board in a pair of maiden special weight events over wet tracks. "When he drew the one post we decided he had to go to the lead," McLaughlin continued. "That doesn't mean we might not have another strategy in the future. He's always done everything right and today we got the fast track we wanted." Winning jockey Alan Garcia added, "I just went to the lead and tried to slow it down as much as possible. My horse just kept on going today. I don't think anyone was going to get by us today the way he ran. He was really good today." Eclipse finalist To Honor and Serve, an impressive victor of Aqueduct's GII Nashua S. and GII Remsen S. at two, ran out of gas in the stretch to place a well-beaten third in his sophomore debut. "[Jockey John Velazquez] said he did everything he asked until he got to the quarter pole and then he said he got a little flat," trainer Bill Mott offered. "I can imagine he might have needed the race. If he got beat I thought he might carry [Velazquez] a little more into the stretch. It looks like he needed the race." Velazquez, who has ridden the Live Oak colorbearer in four out of his five career starts, was pleased with the effort. "I thought he ran very well," Velazquez said. "He settled really well going down the backside. He ranged up to the leader on the far turn and finished well; [he] just didn't have the closing kick he usually does. I think, off the layoff, that is to be expected. Overall, though, I thought he ran terrific."




R Heat Lightning, heroine of last term's GI Spinaway S. and runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, quickly erased the memory of her fourth-place finish behind Pomeroy's Pistol and Dancinginherdreams in her seasonal debut in the Jan. 30 GII Forward Gal S. with a tour de force here. Placed within striking distance in a close fourth through a half mile :46.53, the Robsham Stables homebred was guided through an inviting opening along the rail heading for home and turned in a devastating turn of foot in the stretch, drawing off to win for fun. "She had a much smoother trip today," trainer Todd Pletcher offered. "Last time she got bumped pretty hard at the start and never settled down in the backstretch. Today she had a clean trip, relaxed, and then went on with it. We'll naturally consider the [GII] Gulfstream Oaks here [Apr. 2]. The main goal is the GI Kentucky Oaks." Regular pilot John Velazquez was in the irons. "She settled really well today," he said. "Maybe she learned something from her last race when she was a little rank. We were between horses today, she relaxed, and when I asked her at the quarter pole she responded. Cornelio Velasquez retained the mount from New York after guiding Flashpoint home in his unveiling. "The only other horse I was concerned about was [Travelin Man]," Velasquez said. "We broke good, and had a good trip. I didn't want to move too soon because this horse likes company. In the stretch, I didn't really hit him. He was very good today." Travelin Man, a 7 1/4-length debut winner at Gulfstream Jan. 6, stayed on to complete the exacta. Going into Saturday's action, he had posted a division-leading Beyer Speed Figure of 106. 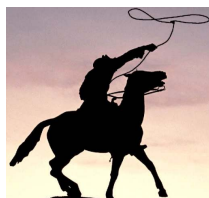

Baffert Playing It Cool with The Factor...

Hall of Fame trainer Bob Baffert is in no hurry to commit the sharp GII San Vicente S. hero **The Factor** (War Front) to the GI Kentucky Derby just yet. The ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ is pointing for his first two-turn test in the GIII Sunland Derby Mar. 27 or the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Mar. 19.

"Any horse I might be considering for the Derby has to prove himself to me that he fits," Baffert commented. "That's the whole key. It depends how he's training. The whole thing about [making] the Derby is about hav-

ing hiccups. If he doesn't have hiccups and it looks like he's training on, then you can move forward." Baffert is pleased with how the George Bolton and Fog City Stable colorbearer has bounced back since his latest win. "The Factor came out of the San Vicente better than he came out of his [track-record setting] maiden win [Dec. 26]. He got a lot out of it. He showed he can carry his speed seven eighths full bore. That's pretty impressive right there. It's very rare you can get a horse to go that fast and keep going." Baffert added, "The beauty of it is, George Bolton, who [co-] owns him understands the game and knows we have a really good horse, and the horse will tell me when he's ready to take the next step."

As a health insurance executive, Philip Leberherz knows that success can often hinge on controlling costs and getting the most out of limited resources. So during his 15 years as a Thoroughbred owner, he has established a set of ground rules for himself based on pragmatic business principles: do your due diligence, don't overpay, and don't



take things for granted. It's a philosophy that's worked well for the California-based Leberherz, who, together with a number of ownership partners and trainer Jeff Bonde, has achieved a string of notable success with horses purchased for modest prices. The roster currently includes (arguably) California's best sprinter, **Smiling Tiger** (Hold That Tiger), a \$40,000 acquisition who won the GI Bing Crosby S. and GI Ancient Title Breeders' Cup last season and also took the GII San Carlos H. just last Saturday. But while dual Grade I winners take a back seat to no one, thank you very much, the horse who has Leberherz most excited right now ran a day later... and is

still eligible for a first-level allowance. The horse is **Sway Away** (Afleet Alex), a \$75,000 Barretts March juvenile who stamped himself as a legitimate Triple Crown horse with a strong, late-running second to **★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ The Factor** (War Front) in the seven-furlong GII San Vicente S. at Santa Anita. Leberherz owns 50% of the 3-year-old colt, whose owners also include Batman Stable, Cindy Olsen, Janet Sharp, and Glen Wallace. Bonde, along with bloodstock agent Mersad Metanovic, bought Sway Away from consignor Jerry Bailey last year at Barretts. Notably, Bailey sold The Factor, too, at Barretts May.

Sway Away's San Vicente effort was eye-catching for a number of reasons, not least of which is that he finished within 3/4 lengths of an awfully talented horse in The Factor. Sway Away was also making just his third career start and his first since August, when he exited a runner-up try to J P's Gusto (Successful Appeal) in the GII Best Pal S. with an injury that required time off.

Perhaps most impressive was the way Sway Away closed from some 10 lengths back over a Santa Anita track that's been unkind to closers. Trailing the six-horse field as The Factor carved out admittedly wicked fractions of :22 1/5 and :43 2/5, Sway Away kicked into gear three furlongs out and closed resolutely down the center of the course under Garrett Gomez.

"You would have thought we won," Leberherz said. "We came running down to the track... Garrett Gomez was beaming... we were so excited. The thing was, we really didn't want to come back in that race, but we need to get some [graded stakes] money for the Derby, and we were really looking at the race as a schooling race for him. He's only raced three times, and coming down the stretch, he was still a little green--he was looking around and had his head up--but then he got down in that little crouch that he does and started gobbling the track up. Not to take anything away from The Factor--he's a great horse--but we were excited about our style of running and the heart he showed."

Sway Away debuted going five furlongs at Pleasanton last June and belied a route-oriented pedigree by steaming home clear by 3 1/4 lengths in a crisp :56 2/5 (102 BRIS). It isn't often horses jump from maiden wins on the fair circuit to favoritism in graded stakes, but bettors confidently backed Sway Away as the 3-2 choice in his next, the Best Pal Aug. 8, and were nearly rewarded when he rallied from last of five to finish a half-length adrift of J P's Gusto.

"That's when I knew we had a good one," said Leberherz. "He looked so good in his maiden, but you can't tell, because it's just a maiden. Sometimes when you buy a new horse, you know he's quick and powerful, but you don't know about the heart. In the Best Pal, we found he had that. And, incidentally, he ran 111 feet farther than J P's Gusto that day--that have Trakus out there--and J P's Gusto's a good horse."

Leberherz, who owns almost all of his horses in partnership, first got into the racing business after a few trips to the track left him intrigued. "I liked going, and there were all these people about--trainers, jockeys, owners--and I was just wondering how it worked," he explained. "I was referred to Jeff Bonde, and Jeff explained everything to me. We bought a horse named Just Plain Fancy, won a few races with her, and sold her for \$40,000 out of a claiming race at Del Mar."



Sway Away may well turn out to be the best, but he isn't Leberherz's first horse with Classic aspirations. Just a year after he and Bonde teamed up with a successful run with Just Plain Fancy, they purchased Epic Honor (Honor Grades) for \$62,000 at the 1996 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Juvenile Sale. As a three-year-old, Epic Honor won the GIII Golden Gate Derby, ran third to Stephen Got Even in the GIII Gallery Furniture S. at Turfway, then finished fourth to eventual Derby hero Charismatic in the GII Lexington S. at Keeneland. The colt had the earnings to make the Derby cut, but his connections opted to bypass the race.

"We didn't enter him, and that was one of the dumbest decisions of all time," said Leberherz. "We were planning on running him in the Belmont [instead], but he got hurt in between the races."

The sting was assuaged by other successes, such as the filly Erica's Smile (Williamstown). A \$58,000 purchase in 2000, Erica's Smile banked over \$230,000 after winning a pair of stakes and taking third in Got Koko's GI La Brea S. in 2002. She later sold in foal to Unbridled's Song for \$675,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November sale. **Cont. p12**

Lebherz added, "We also bought one horse for \$80,000 that, two months later, we sold to someone in Kentucky for \$350,000. We were on a gigantic roll. Then for a couple of years we didn't do as well, but we hung in there, and that's when I started coming up with the philosophy of how we should buy our horses. Ever since I did that, we've had good years and bad years, but more good."

Derby fever struck again in 2008, when Sierra Sunset (Bertrando), a \$40,000 purchase, ran second to Denis of Cork (Harlan's Holiday) in the GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn, then returned to win the track's GII Rebel S. But he, like Epic Honor, was kept from a Classic appearance by injury.

"I've had my heart broken," laughed Lebherz. "I'm on cloud nine right now, but if something happens, I'm prepared. I've been through this."

Disappointments aside, Lebherz clearly has a plan that's paying dividends, and he's quick to steer credit to Bonde. "The guy's a world-class trainer," said Lebherz. "I wish they had a ratio for the amount of money that you spend on your horses, compared to how much money those horses win in stakes races. I'd bet you anything Bonde would be number one in the country. Some of these guys get \$20 million to spend on two-year-olds each year. We spend maybe \$400,000. We're value purchasers. We really don't go after the terrific pedigrees, mainly because we don't have the capital to do that. We're looking for athletes and well-conformed horses who can run. We attend the two-year-old auctions at Barretts and at Keeneland, and also buy at yearling sales. Jeff has such a good eye for young horses. Sway Away, actually, didn't fit our plan. We didn't think we'd be able to get that pedigree--an Afleet Alex out of a Seattle Slew mare--for \$75,000--but he's a bit sway-backed, and so I guess people thought he wouldn't be able to run. But Jeff watched him work, and said, 'Oh my God.' And he called me and said, 'This is the horse.'"

Sway Away exited the San Vicente in good order, and his connections are currently mulling their options. Nothing's set in stone, but right now they're favoring a tilt at Oaklawn's two remaining major Derby preps, the GII Rebel S. Mar. 19 and GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 16. "There are two main reasons why we'd go there," said Lebherz. "First, the track [at Santa Anita] is so fast, and there's a bias toward speed. And we're a power closer. Second, with the track the way it is, we don't feel like he'd be learning anything on a track that isn't like Churchill Downs. Plus we've had success at Arkansas--we won the Rebel with Sierra Sunset--so we like Oaklawn."

Lebherz hopes the third time's the charm when it comes to making the Derby, but make it or not, he understands that many owners with bigger budgets would be envious of his stable's current run. "I've been so lucky lately," he said. "I know that we have a style and a pretty disciplined structure on how we buy horses that seems to be working, but I also know that it takes a lot of luck, too. We're having a lot of fun." -Lucas Marquardt

GOVERNOR WANTS TO LEASE MONMOUTH

Requests for proposals to lease Monmouth Park for the 2011 season will be issued next week by the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, New Jersey Governor Chris Christie announced. "We were successful in the Meadowlands, and we can do the same for Monmouth Park to the benefit of New Jersey taxpayers," Christie said in a press release. "I want to see a vibrant but self-sustaining horse racing industry in New Jersey, but that can be accomplished without tens of millions of dollars in taxpayer subsidies every year." The New Jersey racing commission has already given the green light for 141 Thoroughbred racing dates in the Garden State in 2011.

CALDER EASES SHIPPING POLICY Just days after announcing that horses who shipped out to race at Gulfstream Park would not be allowed to return, Calder Race Course reversed policy and yesterday said that it would allow those horses back on its grounds. That includes horses that were shipped Gulfstream to compete in yesterday's Fountain of Youth card. "We know this has been a confusing time for the horsemen who participate in the racing programs at both Calder and Gulfstream Park, and we are returning to our normal stable-area ship-in policies so we can avoid impacting their operational routines," said John Marshall, Calder's vice president and general manager. "Calder wants what's best for South Florida racing. We continue to look at our racing schedule for the coming year, and as in prior years, we will do what's right for the South Florida racing community, including Calder, its horsemen and racing fans."

The announcement came late Saturday morning, after five Calder-based horses were already scratched from Gulfstream's program. There's been a growing rift between Calder and Gulfstream as Frank Stronach's MI Developments, which owns Gulfstream, has sought dates on the South Florida calendar typically held by Calder, a Churchill Downs Inc. track. Stronach and Churchill Downs CEO Bill Carstanjen met Friday to discuss the dates dispute, but were unable to come to any resolutions. The deadline to make amendments for date requests for the fiscal year running from July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012, expires this Monday at midnight.

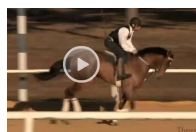

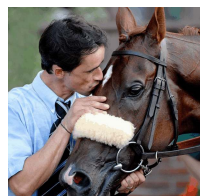
