LITTLE MIKE WIRES CANADIAN TURF

Little Mike (Spanish Steps) gave a grown-up performance to take the GIII Canadian Turf S. in wire-to-wire fashion Sunday at Gulfstream Park. Turning back to a mile yesterday, the Florida-bred was hustled out of the gate to take the early lead, cutting out quick fractions of :22.70, :45.42 and 1:08.65.

Society's Chairman (Not Impossible {Ire}) loomed a threat after seven furlongs in 1:20.28, but Little Mike kicked away for a confident score, completing the mile in 1:32.37. "I thought they we're going awfully fast

early, but the field was bunched, so they were all going pretty fast," said Romans. "Then, when he opened up at the top of the stretch, I knew he would go on." The consistent gelding, bred by Florida restaurateur and real estate investor Carlo Vaccarezza and owned by his wife Priscilla, has now won six of 12 starts. Cont. p2

IT'S A BREEZE AT PALM MEADOWS

There has been picture perfect weather in the Sunshine State in recent weeks, and more is expected today, when the under-tack show for the Fasig-Tipton Florida Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale will be held at the Palm Meadows Training Center in Boynton Beach. The show starts at 10 a.m. It's both a new venue and date on the sales calendar for the boutique auction, which was typically held at Calder Race Course a few weeks after the OBS February Sale. But, with that Ocala-based company opting to consolidate its February

and March sales, Fasig-Tipton will show the way in 2011. The move up Interstate 95 was a welcome one.

"I think it was a great decision," said bloodstock agent Mike Ryan. "It's a great facility to show horses, and I think it's refreshing to buyers, as well as consignors. The surface is very light and has a good bounce to it. The 2-year-old sales are very stressful at the best of times, and the horses are not as stressed here. It could get quite hot at Calder, and the track was very tiring. They are coming out of their works well."

Little Mike Wires Canadian Turf (cont. from p1)

While in the barn of trainer Allen Iwinski, Little Mike won three straight over the Monmouth lawn last summer. After a runner-up effort in the Monarch's Maze S. at Aqueduct, the gelding started another win streak with a Calder allowance victory followed by a wire-to-wire win in the 1 1/16-mile GIII Ft. Lauderdale S. Jan. 9. In his first start for Dale Romans, Little Mike set the pace before tiring to sixth in the Feb. 5 GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. over nine furlongs. Asked what is next for the now two-time graded stakes winner, Romans said, "We'll discuss options, maybe Keeneland. There are a lot of good races at a mile, but I think he'll go farther if we ask him." Little Mike's dam Hay Jude (Wavering Monarch) produced multiple stakes winner **Little Nick** (Tiger Ridge) and has a two-year-old colt by Hook and Ladder and a yearling filly by Bustin Stones. SOLDAT ON TO FLORIDA DERBY

A day after **Soldat** (War Front)'s two-length victory in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S., trainer Kiaran McLaughlin confirmed the colt will now be aimed at the Apr. 3 GI Florida Derby. McLaughlin said his charge came out of Saturday's win "happy and in great shape." The Fountain of Youth was Soldat's first win over a fast dirt track. "Going into the race, I wasn't concerned about that at all," McLaughlin said. "He's always trained extremely well over a fast track, but it is nice to finally get it in print that he likes it fast." McLaughlin added that plans were up in the air for Darley Stable's **Crossbow** (Bernardini). The colt was scratched from Saturday's GII Hutcheson S. After drawing the rail. "We were originally thinking of running him in the [Mar. 5 GIII] Gotham at Aqueduct," McLaughlin said. "But now it looks like we'll look at all options."

Fountain of Youth runner-up **Gourmet Dinner** (Trippi) exited the race "very well," according to trainer Steve Standridge. The colt could make his next start in either the Florida Derby or the Apr. 9 GI Santa Anita Derby. "We're going to play it by ear as far as his next start," Standridge said. "We're looking at the Florida Derby and Santa Anita Derby, but we're leaning a little toward Santa Anita. I know it will be easier in California than it is here, and it gives us another week."

Uncle Mo Leads Pletcher Workers

Juvenile champion **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie) worked five furlongs in company with GI Three Chimneys Hopeful S. runner-up **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini) in a bullet 1:00 3/5 at Palm Meadows yesterday. Uncle Mo is expected to make his first start since winning last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in Gulfstream's Timely Writer overnight stakes Mar. 12. Stay Thirsty, fifth in the Juvenile, is expected to make his sophomore debut in the Mar. 5 GIII Gotham S. at Aqueduct. Also working at Palm Meadows Sunday was WinStar Farm's **Brethren** (Distorted Humor). The colt, last-out winner of the GIII Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Bay Downs, went four furlongs in :49 2/5 and is expected to start next in the Mar. 12 GIII Tampa Bay Derby. Pletcher also sent out WinStar's impressive debut winner and **"TDN Rising Star"** **Cal Nation** (Distorted Humor) to work five furlongs yesterday at Palm Meadows in 1:02.40.

McPeek Duo Expected Back in the Big Easy

Trainer Ken McPeek reported both **Kathmanblu** (Bluegrass Cat), winner of the Feb. 19 GIII Rachel Alexandra S., and **Rogue Romance** (Smarty Jones), third in the GII Risen Star S. the same day, will return to Fair Grounds for the Mar. 26 GII Fair Grounds Oaks and GII Louisiana Derby, respectively. "Everything is fine with both of them," McPeek said. "We're planning on coming back with both of them." Risen Star victor **Mucho Macho**

Man (Macho Uno) remains on the fence. "Mucho Macho Man is doing great," trainer Kathy Ritvo said yesterday. "But we just need a couple of more days to decide what's next. We'll probably have something decided by Wednesday." Also considered possible for the Louisiana Derby is Risen Star fifth-place finisher **Decisive Moment** (With Distinction), who has recovered from a slight soft tissue injury in his left hind. "We X-rayed him and did an ultrasound on him and he came out clean," said trainer Juan Arias. "He's back in training now and we're looking for another race for him at the end of March."

TWIRLING CANDY WORKS FOR BIG 'CAP

Twirling Candy (Candy Ride {Arg}), last-out winner of the Feb. 5 GII Strub S., tuned up for Saturday's GI Santa Anita H. with a seven-furlong work in 1:25. Jockey Joel Rosario was aboard for the workout. "It was a very nice work," reported trainer John Sadler. "He's ready to go. He's a wonderful horse. You've always got to run the race, but I wouldn't trade horses with anybody else." Twirling Candy has won six of seven starts, including victories in last year's GII Del Mar Derby and GI Malibu S. Stablemate **Gladding** (Sarava), coming off a one-length victory in the Feb. 6 GII San Antonio S., also worked seven furlongs yesterday. The four-year-old gelding covered the distance in 1:24.80. Trainer Richard Mandella sent Big 'Cap hopeful **Setsuko** (Pleasantly Perfect) out for a seven-furlong work Sunday at Santa Anita in 1:25.60 under Victor Espinoza. "He worked great," Mandella commented. "He finished [a mile] in :34 and change. He went off slow and finished strong. He's looking as good as he ever did." San Antonio runner-up **Spurrier** (Dixieland Band), one of four Big 'Cap possibles from Bob Baffert, worked a bullet six furlongs at Hollywood Park yesterday in 1:11.20. Also possible for the race are: **Aggie Engineer** (E Dubai), **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even), **Game on Dude** (Awesome Again), **Pode Ir (Brz)** (Crimson Tide {Ire}), **Quindici Man** (Came Home), **Soul Candy** (Birdonthewire) and **Tweebster** (Tapit).

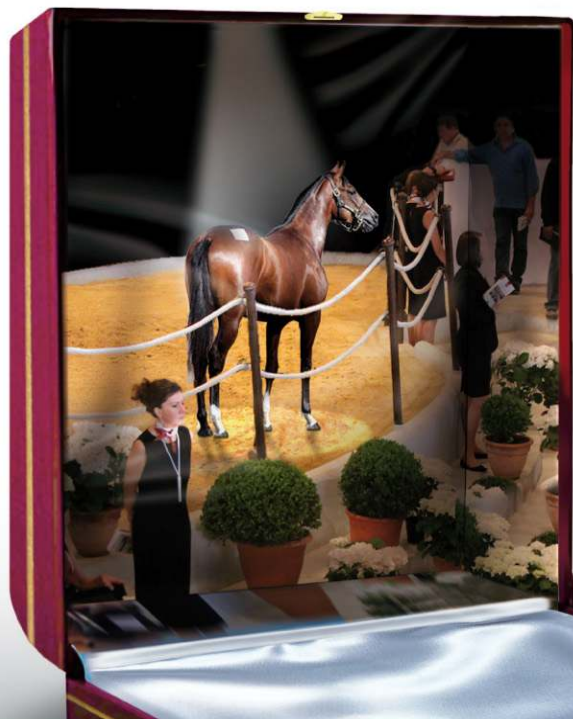

 Making his stakes debut in Hong Kong and trying 2000 meters for the first time locally, the U.S.-bred, European import California Memory belied his 30-1 odds with a stylish last-to-first victory in the second leg of Hong Kong's Triple Crown. California Memory had been plying his trade in handicaps prior to the breakout victory. He won by a half-length in a 1600-meter event on New Year's Day, then was a fast-closing third in an 1400-meter test Feb. 5.

Adding substantial ground, the gray broke well from stall 11, but soon settled at the back of the 12-horse field under Matthew Chadwick. California Memory had improved his position by just one as they turned into the straight, still second last and in close arrears of fellow closer and heavy favorite Irian (Ger) (Tertullian). Patiently shifted wide for running room by Chadwick, California Memory found his lane and turned on the afterburners, surging widest past an in-line group of six or seven on his way to a daylight victory. While many at Sha Tin were surprised by the result, winning trainer Tony Cruz wasn't one of them. "It was always in our plans," said Cruz. "We believed in this horse and believed this was the distance for him, as he'd run well in a 2000-meter race in France before coming here. Now, after this performance, I think this is a serious horse, and one to be looked on as the next big horse in Hong Kong. We'll definitely go to the QE II [the G1 Audemars Piguet Queen Elizabeth II Cup, May 1] with him and the Champions & Chater Cup, and some international races, too." The winner's 20-year-old pilot was elated. "It's a great feeling," said Chadwick. "And, hopefully, there'll be more to come. The bad draw didn't help, but he was always traveling. I was expecting him to close off well, but really he just came home like a bullet!" California Memory covered the final 400 meters in a blistering :21.63. CALIFORNIA MEMORY (Highest Honour {Fr})

A California with International Ties...

Five-thirty a.m. phone calls are rarely welcome. But Marie Yoshida didn't mind yesterday when, in the early morning hours at her home at Winchester Farm in Kentucky, she was awoken by the news that California Memory had captured one of Hong Kong's most prestigious races, the Gold Cup. "I got an excited phone call from the Liang family in Hong Kong!" said a still enthused Yoshida on Sunday afternoon.

"Over there, the race is very important, like the Preakness, Belmont or Haskell here. For the Hong Kong owner, the Gold Cup is the second-most prestigious race, after the Hong Kong Derby."

That California Memory made it "over there," and why Yoshida was the recipient of a phone call in the first place, is because she bought the gelding privately in France on behalf of Hong Kong's Liang family, which owns the 5-year-old. Yoshida, who along with her husband Dr. Naoya Yoshida operates and owns Winchester, also owns and runs Asian Bloodstock. She often buys for Far East interests, and her purchases include the likes of Fairy King Prawn (Aus) (Danehill), who became the first Hong Kong-based horse to win the Yasuda Kinen in Japan.



California Memory HKJC

The American-bred California Memory was named Portus Blendium when Yoshida and associate Francoise Dupuis came across him racing in France. Bred in Kentucky by Fred Seitz and sold by the Seitz family's Brookdale Sales at the 2007 Keeneland September Sale, Portus Blendium was hammered down to Chantilly/Newmarket for \$65,000. He began his career with Carlos Laffon-Parias and won three of his first six career starts, all in allowance company, before finishing third to Calvaryman (GB) in the Prix Matchem S. in June of 2009. The effort caught Dupuis and Yoshida's attention.

"Every spring in France, we check all the results for the young three-year-old races," Yoshida explained. "Most of the horses aren't for sale, because if they're French-bred, you can't touch them, or everybody's thinking about the French Derby or the Guineas. So it's a really small market. But this horse, even though he's by Highest Honour, was born in America. So we thought that he might be a good prospect." *Cont. p7*

In addition to class, the horse also met another crucial requirement. "Horses going to Hong Kong are subject to full veterinary inspection, and he could pass it very well," said Yoshida.

In what may be a surprise to some western horsemen, all horses in Hong Kong go through a stringent veterinary process before being admitted by the Hong Kong Jockey Club, a private organization. Before horses even arrive in the country, X-rays are taken, tendons are scanned and scopes are performed.

"The X-rays, especially the knees, have to be very clean," said Yoshida. "They are scoped before and after exercise...just everything you could imagine. You have to do this even before you buy the horse. You have a first vet examine the files, then a second vet who has been approved by the Hong Kong Jockey Club. Then the vet department at the Jockey Club takes a third look at the file, and says yes or no. Sometimes, good horses--group horses--get rejected. So it's not just about finding a good horse, it's about finding the right horse for Hong Kong."

Limited space and good prize money allow the Hong Kong Jockey Club to be selective. "They

race on very hard turf, and so they know well what they are looking for so they can have horses you can race for several years," Yoshida explained.

Having passed the inspections with flying colors, Portus Blendium raced once more in France for his new connections, running third in the Prix De Tourgeville, then joined the Hong Kong-based stable of Dr. Thomas T. S. Liang.

Sadly, Dr. Liang passed away a few months later, in September of 2009, and the horse was renamed California Memory. The Liang horses now run under his son's name, Howard Liang.

It has taken a while for California Memory to flourish in Hong Kong. He made his first eight starts in the handicap ranks, winning three of those starts. But his connections, including trainer Tony Cruz, thought he was much better than merely a handicapper, and now the late-developing gelding seems to be proving them right.

Because he was one of the last horses purchased by Dr. Liang, California Memory holds a special place in the Liang family, and yesterday's win was sentimental for Yoshida, too. Yoshida had been assisting Asian horsemen coming to race in France in the 1990s, but moved to Hong Kong in 1996 to launch her current business, Asian Bloodstock. She remembers the Liangs throwing her a birthday party in her first year there, and has a deep respect for both Dr. Liang and the family's devotion to racing.

"Dr. Liang knew the pedigrees by heart, and the whole family is very knowledgeable," said Yoshida. "They aren't the type of owners who don't do anything. They know exactly what they want, and they are very professional. They are dream owners because of their knowledge and passion for the sport."

"I have memories of being with him and his son Howard, and I was heavily pregnant with my son, so that was April 2006. He came to Sydney to inspect all the yearlings before he decided to buy three or four. That was just three years before his death, and he was in his late 80s and was frail, but he was on a mission. He knew all the pedigrees and the type of horse he wanted. It was so, so impressive. It's such an honor with people who have a long-term vision, and the family deserved this win, that's for sure. It's a wonderful tribute to the memory of their father."-Lucas Marquardt

FIRST THINGS FIRST

Though the progeny of young sires have historically been popular in auction rings, the bloodstock market's 2009 downturn put proven stallions back in the spotlight. However, with a pair of sons of A.P. Indy--Congrats and Bernardini--each coming up with a brace of Grade/Group 1 winners in their first crops last season, the attention is back on the incoming class.

This year's group of freshman sires is one of the strongest in recent memory, led by representatives of popular sirelines who grabbed the headlines during their racing days. There is, of course, the star quartet that retired to Darley's Kentucky base for 2008--champion **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}), as well as Grade I winners **Any Given Saturday** (Distorted Humor), **Discreet Cat** (Forestry) and **Hard Spun** (Danzig). Horse of the Year **Invasor** (Arg) (Candy Stripes) began holding court at his owner Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Farm that year, as did GI Belmont S. winner **Jazil** (Seeking the Gold). Turf champion **English Channel** (Smart Strike) joined his sire at Lane's End, and the ill-fated champion **Lawyer Ron** (Langfuhr) had one season at Stonewall Farm. **Stevie Wonderboy** (Stephen Got Even), the champion juvenile of 2005, got started at Airdrie Stud in 2008, while **Scat Daddy** (Johannesburg), a Grade I winner at two and three, took his sire's spot at Ashford Stud. **Corinthian** (Pulpit) retired to Gainesway after capturing the GI Met Mile and Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in 2007. Other Grade I winners entering stud in 2008 were **After Market** (Storm Cat), at Lane's End; **Flashy Bull** (Holy Bull), Airdrie; **Latent Heat** (Maria's Mon), Woods Edge; **Political Force** (Unbridled's Song), Claiborne; **Purim** (Dynaformer), Richland Hills; and **Shakespeare** (Theatrical {Ire}), at Hill 'n' Dale, but now at Signature Stallions.

Fab Four...

The 3-year-olds of 2007 were widely acclaimed as one of the best groups in recent memory. **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}), who followed his championship juvenile campaign with a win in the GI Kentucky Derby in 2007, became the first son of his sire to enter stud, and held court at Darley for a \$75,000 fee. He covered 157 mares. **Hard Spun** (Danzig), the GI King's Bishop S. hero who was runner-up in the "Run for the Roses" as well as the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, stood for \$50,000 in his first season, and was one of 2008's most popular stallions with 181 mares bred. The services of GI Haskell Invitational victor **Any Given Saturday**

(Distorted Humor), who stood for \$40,000, were also in demand, with 144 mares in the book. That trio was joined at Darley by **Discreet Cat** (Forestry), the brilliant 2006 GI Cigar Mile winner. Standing for \$30,000 in his initial year at stud, the bay had a book of 149 mares.

The four young stallions essentially sold themselves to breeders, according to Charlie Boden, Darley's head of sales.

"If there was a challenge, it was in the pricing of this group, and I think we hit the nail on the head, as all were extremely popular and bred full books that year," Boden offered. "They are represented well in the Florida Sale, with three Any Given Saturdays, two Discreet Cats, eight Hard Spuns and eight Street Sense 2-year-olds. They have all been getting plenty of chatter out of central Florida, and they are a very fancy bunch on the whole."

Boden also pointed out that Street Sense and Hard Spun, the one-two finishers in the 2007 Kentucky Derby, maintained their rivalry at stud.

“While Street Sense was the higher-rated horse upon retirement, Hard Spun got a slightly better mare, as evidenced by his superior CI [Comparative Index] and CPI [Comparative Productive Index] from the mares bred that year,” Boden commented. “Street Sense got his revenge in the sales ring, where he finished the year ahead of Hard Spun on the leading freshman sire of yearlings by average at \$129,000, versus Hard Spun’s \$107,000.

“There are three Hard Spun 2-year-olds selling that are half-brothers to graded stakes winners, and one of the best yearlings I saw last year is a Street Sense yearling that is back in this sale,” Boden continued. “We are very excited about the prospects of all four of these boys, as their progeny make their way through the sales ring and into the starting gates.”

A Mile a Minute...

The axiom “milers make the best sires” has been around for a long time, and Gainesway’s **Corinthian** (Pulpit) has an opportunity to live up to that saying. Disqualified to third after passing the post first in the 2006 GII Fountain of Youth S., the chestnut resurfaced at four to capture the GI Met Mile and the inaugural Breeders’ Cup Dirt Mile in 2007, and was a natural fit for Gainesway.

“We spotted him early on as a 3-year-old, when he won in great style at Gulfstream,” said Michael Heron, the farm’s director of sales. “We followed him from there, and Gainesway had an association with Centennial, having stood Colonial Affair, so he was always on our radar. He had all the attributes you’d want, certainly in terms of pedigree, and he himself is very appealing looking--he’s a great horse to look at on the hoof. He defeated a strong field in the Met Mile, and he had a devastating performance in the Breeders’ Cup--the 119 Beyer Speed Figure was the icing on the cake.”

Another son of Pulpit, Tapit, was developed by Gainesway as the leading freshman sire of 2008, and Heron is optimistic that Corinthian can follow in that grey’s hoofprints.

“Like Tapit, he’s got great depth of female family,” Heron noted. “It’s the same family as Sadler’s Wells and Nureyev. Top breeders sent mares to him, and top agents and trainers have purchased his offspring. We’re very pleased with the quality of product he’s putting out.”

Corinthian, who was priced at \$40,000 in his first season, has had full books thus far, and his popularity continued this year.

“He’s going to have about 150 mares in 2011, which is remarkable for a stallion in his fourth year, especially in this economy,” Heron pointed out. “So it’s a great endorsement that he’s had big books of quality mares.

“The commentary we’ve received about his 2-year-olds is very positive, and they are perhaps coming along earlier than might have been expected,” Hernon continued. “He has 17 catalogued at the select 2-year-old sales. Gainesway has four in training with Ron Stevens in Aiken, and they’re progressing very well.”

Though high on Corinthian, the Irishman acknowledged that the stallion is up against a tough field.

“He’s in deep water, competition-wise, but we’re confident that he’ll give a good account of himself,” Hernon offered. “There is no question that it’s an excellent group of young stallions. It will be very exciting when their progeny get to the track. But he was our number one pick, and we were delighted to get him. We’re confident that, by the end of the year, he’ll be climbing the ladder for leading juvenile sire.”

Eye on the Prize...

Agent Mike Ryan looks at hundreds of young horses every year, and thinks there are several new stallions on the scene that will have an impact.

“Everyone is landing on the same few sires,” he admitted. “I’ve been extremely impressed with the Hard Spuns and Street Senses, and I like what I’ve seen with the Scat Daddys as well,” said Ryan. “With the Hard Spuns, no two look alike--not even the same color, or anything--but they are all very impressive on the track. They are very forward in their minds, and they all have a lot of energy. They seem to train themselves. Hard Spun himself was very versatile, winning from six furlongs on and able to get a distance, and I see him getting a lot of 2-year-old winners.”

Though Street Sense earned his Eclipse Award as a juvenile, Ryan thinks the son of Street Cry will have more of a presence in 2012.

“They’re bigger and look to be later-developing,” he pointed out. “They seem to be more laid-back in personality, and I think they’ll start to come around this fall, and you’ll see the best of them next year.”

The horseman added that Flashy Bull (Holy Bull) and Latent Heat (Maria’s Mon) could be the sleepers of this year’s new stallions.

Scat Daddy (Johannesburg), winner of the GI Champagne S. and GI Sanford S. at two, followed up with victories in the GI Florida Derby and GI Fountain of Youth S. in 2007. He has four youngsters catalogued for Thursday’s sale.

“We bought two, and I’ve seen several on the farms,” Ryan noted. “They look to be good-moving horses.”

George Bolton knows a little something about diversifying his investments. The 47-year-old is the chief investment officer and portfolio manager for the successful San Francisco-based WestEnd Capital Management, an independent asset management company, and has tasted a fair amount of success in the Thoroughbred business since purchasing his first horse in the late 1980s in partnership with Bill Farish, with whom he attended college at the University of Virginia.

In 2007, Bolton teamed with Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables and Satish Sanan's Padua Stables to acquire a controlling interest in Curlin (Smart Strike) following his smashing debut maiden victory. Following the chestnut's victory in that year's GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Bolton and Stonestreet bought out Padua's interest in Curlin, giving the two partners 80-percent ownership, and about a month later, Bolton sold his share to Jackson. All in all, not a bad 10 months. As wild and successful a ride as it was with Curlin, Bolton is bursting with enthusiasm these days, and understandably so, owing to the exploits of The Factor (War Front), a colt he owns in partnership with David Shimmion's Fog City Stable. And a little bit of

information ended up going a long way.

The Factor was sent to Jerry Bailey after being purchased by Kim Valerio as a yearling on behalf of Las Vegas-based Mike Shustek, and it just so happened that Bailey's farm was also the winter home of some horses owned or co-owned by Bolton that carried high hopes, including subsequent GSW Astrology (A. P. Indy), Dominus (Smart Strike) and Abide (Tiznow). Bolton purchased just a handful of horses during the 2009 yearling sales season, and he wasn't necessarily going to add a two-year-old to the portfolio, that is until opportunity came-a-knocking.

"Jerry [Bailey] called me and said that I've got this War Front down here that can really run with all these nice horses you got," Bolton recollected. "I said, 'Jerry, I think I'm all set, I think I've got my list for this year.' He said, 'Watch him when he comes out there. You obviously live in California and can get down there easily.'"

Bolton's "hesitance" to buy a juvenile began to wane, quickly, once he saw hip 48 under tack. He would go on to breeze his eighth of a mile in :10, the joint second-fastest of the show ([video](#)).

"And he galloped out very strongly, *extremely* well, and when that happened, I thought, 'I don't know how far he's going to go, but he's obviously a special horse,'" Bolton explained. "So I bought him [\$250,000 sales-topper] and gave him to Bob Baffert to train. About a month later, Baffert texts me and says, 'The Factor is a freak.' And that's when I knew things were going our way."

Bolton, who does a lot of homework and is a very hands-on buyer, sees plenty of advantages to shopping the juvenile market.

"I sit on the rail [for the breeze-ups]," he explained. "This Monday I'll be on the rail at Palm Meadows, and I'll be able to see if they can breathe. [Bloodstock advisor] John [Moynihan] stays in the stands and covers it from that angle and I cover it from the ability to hear them. Then we deal with how they look the next day. We do get much more intelligence on how they move, how they withstand training, and a lot of good horses come out of the two-year-old sales on a percentage basis."

Not a whole lot has gone wrong since Bolton purchased The Factor. Although he was a disappointing fourth in his Nov. 28 debut on the Hollywood Cushion Track, The Factor has proved a monster on conventional dirt. The gun-metal gray colt set a track record in graduating by 8 1/4 lengths Dec. 26, covering the six furlongs in 1:06.98 ([video](#)). He was hampered by some foot issues and was able to breeze just three times ahead of the GII San Vicente S. Feb. 20, but he was classy enough to get the job done and held off Sway Away (Afleet Alex), never allowing that one to pass on the gallop out ([video](#)).

To say Bolton is smitten with his colt would be an understatement of monumental proportions.

"This horse seems to thrive on training and he moves very beautifully," the Maryland native stated. "The way he switches leads--you could put a wine glass on his back when he switches leads and it wouldn't move. He's got all the action, and he was one that was lucky enough that was able to go on. War Front at the time was a bit of a risky bet, but he's turned into a sire of two-turn horses, dirt, turf, Polytrack."

Bolton will make the trans-continental journey for this week's sale, and, despite spending in excess of \$2 million on yearlings last year, is a good bet to make the sales sheets.

"What I do now is talk to Jerry and ask if I have any holes and if he says yes, then we'll start looking at the two-year-old market to try to fill those in," Bolton offered. "Another thing that can happen in the two-year-old market is that I can just fall in love with something and break criteria and add one. The yearlings we buy are typically better-bred than the typical two-year-old we see. Most of the yearlings you get a better pedigree, but you take much more risk on ability to train, ability to have ability, all the things you don't know when you're walking them across the gravel."

The Factor is likely to get a shot at a route of ground in the near future, and Bolton is cautiously optimistic he can harness his speed and stay the trip.

"This family is kind of a miler family, so I think Bob Baffert and I are cautious about dumping this horse into two-turn races," he said. "I think we're going to give him a shot and see what he does if he can go out in :23 and :46. Bob's hoping he can do a little more. I have no pressure on Bob and neither does David to get this horse to the Kentucky Derby. I want this horse to be sound and healthy. We'll give him one prep around two turns, and if he can stretch it out, great. If he can't, there are Met Miles and King's Bishops and plenty of other fun things for him. But he's amazingly talented. I'd say The Factor is one of the more exciting three-year-olds of a pretty good three-year-old crop."--Alan Carasso

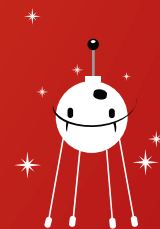


