GULFSTREAM/CALDER OVERLAP AVOIDED

A potential overlap of race dates in 2011-12 between Gulfstream Park and Calder Race Course was avoided Monday when the tracks submitted their race date requests to the Florida Department of Pari-Mutuel Wagering. Both South Florida ovals had originally said that they would seek nearly year-round racing, and efforts to negotiate between Gulfstream's parent company MI Developments and CDI, Calder's owner, fell through last Friday. Calder's final dates submission requests racing from July 1, 2011 through Dec. 2, 2011 and Apr. 9, 2012 through Jun. 30, 2012, while Gulfstream hopes to run from Dec. 3, 2011 through Apr. 8, 2012. This will be the first time for Gulfstream to run in December. "We're excited to add December to Gulfstream's existing schedule," said Gulfstream Vice President of Racing Tim Ritvo. "We know this will enhance our stakes schedule and the overall quality of our product. Gulfstream has a history of developing champion 3-year-olds who excel in the Triple Crown. Racing in December will only add to the excitement of racing at Gulfstream Park. We also know it is in the best interest of South Florida racing. We want to thank the horsemen for their continued support of our racing product." Calder's Vice President and General Manager John Marshall said, "We are planning a racing schedule for the upcoming season that will position Calder to continue leading South Florida and the nation in the training and development of juvenile racehorses as they begin their careers while providing year-round stabling and training facilities for horsemen and horsewomen who call Florida home." He added, "Many have asked us about our views regarding both Calder and Gulfstream Park running year-round schedules. We are of the opinion that such an outcome at this time would mean the end of the South Florida racing circuit and deny local horsemen the chance to make a living as they currently do."

BREEZY DAY AT PALM MEADOWS

Graced with plenty of sunshine and temperatures in the low 80s, Fasig-Tipton launched the new juvenile sales calendar with the first breeze show of the season at Palm Meadows yesterday. The single-session preview was presented ahead of Thursday's Florida Sale, which will be staged for the first time at the Boynton Beach training center. Heading the proceedings was [hip 49](#), a filly by More Than Ready who posted the fastest eighth of a mile with a final time of :9 3/5. The daughter of Spring Unbridled (Unbridled's Song) is a member of the W.D. North Thoroughbreds/SGV consignment. A pair of juveniles tied for the fastest quarter mile yesterday--[hip 73](#), a filly by Stevie Wonderboy and [hip 112](#), a colt by Empire Maker. Both negotiated the distance in :21 3/5. The former is consigned by Kelynack Farm/Casse Sales and the latter is a member of the Hoby and Layna Kight draft. **Cont. p2**

Without a traditional grandstand, it was a different experience viewing the works at Palm Meadows. "It's not a racetrack, it's a training center, so you don't have quite the height you would have at a race-track," explained Terence Collier. Collier held the announcing duties at yesterday's breeze show. "It offers a slightly different perspective, so we have made a couple of adjustments in the way we are monitoring the horses [for the videos] around the track."

Although the venue might be new to the sale, many of the faces on the scene were not. It took little time for the temporary grandstand erected near the finish line to fill to near capacity, including the likes of Todd Pletcher, Steve Asmussen, Steve Young, John Moynihan and Sasha Sanan. A strong contingent of serious players opted to observe the proceedings trackside. Among horsemen perched along the rail near the finish line were bloodstock agent Buzz Chace and WinStar's Elliott Walden, who put on an entertaining two-man show for a small group that included West Point's Terry Finley.

Always a positive sign in advance of any sale was the presence of Darley's Jimmy Bell and David Loder, who were stationed near the sixteenth pole, while Team Coolmore's main man Demi O'Byrne--flanked by a small group including Patrick Biancone--assumed their customary Florida sale spot at the eighth pole.

"It's a huge turnout--it looks like all of the big buyers are here," said owner George Bolton. "It's a newer facility, and I think it's just as convenient, since you've got the airports right here. The track seems to be playing pretty fair--there's a pretty serious wind, but it's a crosswind, so it's not really affecting the horses. The times all seem to be in the :9 4/5 to :11 1/5, which is what you'd expect."

Also appreciative of the new venue was Terry Finley. "The surroundings are fresh and everybody seems to be rejuvenated, so I think the change was a positive one," offered Finley. "I'm sure next year they might make a few minor adjustments, but I don't see anything major right now. I think it's really a great change."

High marks were also given to the collection of juveniles for this year's sale.

"It is a very nice group of horses," confirmed Bolton. "I think the pinhookers have had a chance to buy at a higher level, with better pedigrees, since 2007."

While a strong wind and high temperatures appeared to dry out and slow the surface slightly as the show progressed, the general consensus among Fasig-Tipton officials was that the event was a success.

"It's a beautiful day and the attendance has been spectacular, so we couldn't be happier," concluded Collier.

A few minutes later, with [hip 103](#) on deck, a white bag blew onto the track near the finish line. The quick-thinking Ocala horseman George Seabo jumped out to retrieve it, prompting announcer Terence Collier to quip, "That man could field for the Yankees!" The quick-thinking and fast-moving rider returned to his post amidst applause. --CB & MK

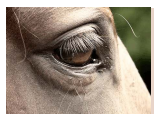

During its glorious history, Claiborne Farm has often stood several successive generations of the same male line, arguably the most successful being the father-and-son team of Nasrullah and Bold Ruler, which spawned Secretariat. Mr. Prospector also did sterling work, providing the Paris stallion station with Forty Niner, Seeking The Gold and Conquistador Cielo, plus Our Emblem, who was based at Claiborne when he sired War Emblem.

Not all of the Hancocks' superstar stallions have managed to found a Claiborne dynasty, though. Nijinsky II blotted his copybook with Ferdinand, and for a long time it looked as though Danzig wasn't going to make a lasting impact on the Claiborne stallion roster.

Polish Navy, a triple Grade I winner who became the first son to stand alongside Danzig at Claiborne, was sent to Japan in 1992 after a slow start. Hardly had he been sold than his first crop was represented by Ghazi, winner of the GI Secretariat S., and his second produced Sea Hero, the 1993 GI Champagne S. winner who went on to take the GI Kentucky Derby and Travers S.

Claiborne then seemed to secure the Danzig succession with the arrival of two more sons in 1995. Easily the more accomplished of the two was Lure, who seemed to combine just about every quality one looks for in a potential stallion, including two Breeders' Cup victories, a Grade I-winning dam by Alydar and tremendous good looks. Unfortunately, he lacked one of the basic requirements--fertility. Cont. p4

Whereas Lure started out at \$50,000, breeders needed only \$7,500 to use Boundary, Claiborne's other new Danzig stallion. Although Boundary had managed only two starts before his four-year-old campaign, he made up for lost time with four more victories over six furlongs, including two at Grade III level. Boundary had to be pensioned at the age of 15 in 2005 because of declining fertility, but not before he had sired three Grade I-winning sons. The first, Minardi, became a champion two-year-old in Europe; the second, Pomeroy, won a pair of Grade Is before starting his stallion career in Florida; and the third, Big Brown, was the dominant three-year-old of 2008.

The last son of Danzig to join the Claiborne team was War Front, runner-up to Pomeroy in the GI Forego S. in

2006. His record bore some parallels to Boundary's. War Front had also had to wait until he was four to score his first (and only) graded victory and he too developed into a sprint specialist, after winning a stakes race over 1 1/16 miles early in his career.

Even though I was impressed with War Front's achievement of recording eight triple-digit Beyer figures, this had to be set against his record of only four wins in 13 starts and his failure to achieve the required standard of 115 for an American horse to be included in the World Thoroughbred Racehorse Rankings. To that could be added the fact that his broodmare sire, the top sprinter Rubiano, had only one Grade I winner among his 500-odd foals.

So what was War Front's appeal to a stallion station with a history as distinguished as Claiborne's? Much of his appeal surely stemmed from the fact that Danzig had been pensioned in 2004, leaving War Front--conceived when Danzig was 24--as one of the last of the line. Then there was the bottom half of his pedigree. This read almost like a "Who's Who" of Claiborne stallions, containing Mr. Prospector, Nijinsky II, Forli and Round Table (who also sired the second dam of Boundary). **Cont. p4**

But I didn't appreciate War Front's most obvious attraction until I saw him in the flesh: he bears a powerful resemblance to his famous sire. It is beginning to look as though the resemblance isn't only physical. Danzig's first crop yielded Stephan's Odyssey and Chief's Crown, who filled second and third places in the Kentucky Derby. War Front also has a couple of high-profile three-year-old colts from his first crop, thanks to the efforts of GII San Vicente S. winner The Factor and Soldat. Coincidentally, Soldat's fine victory in the GII Fountain of Youth S. came on the same card that Danzig's grandson Pomeroy added to his eye-catching start with the victory of Flashpoint in the GII Hutcheson S. With Big Brown still to come, it looks as though the legacy of Claiborne's Danzig stallions is going to be much more profound than once seemed likely.

Soldat's transition from turf to dirt has gone very smoothly so far, but can this son of a sprinter stretch his stamina another furlong at Churchill Downs, where the early gallop is likely to be much stronger than at Gulfstream? As Mr. Prospector, Our Emblem, Distorted Humor, Elusive Quality and Boundary have all demonstrated in the last 12 years, today's sprinters are well capable of siring winners of the Kentucky Derby. They usually need some help from the mare and, in Soldat's case, War Front may well have received the necessary assistance from the colt's broodmare sire, Coronado's Quest.

Runner-up in the 1998 Fountain of Youth, Coronado's Quest went on to win the Wood Memorial and Haskell Invitational over a mile and an eighth and the Travers S. over a mile and a quarter. Coronado's Quest's sire Forty Niner won the Fountain of Youth and the Travers, as well as finishing second in the Kentucky Derby.

Even though Coronado's Quest proved disappointing overall as a stallion, the quality of the mares he initially attracted at Claiborne virtually guaranteed he would fare better as a broodmare sire. His daughters have already hit the Grade I target with Boys At Tosconova, Kodiak Kowboy and Mani Bhavan and they are also responsible in 2011 for the Dubai Group 3 winner Mendip.

It is to be hoped that Soldat has inherited a large measure of Coronado's Quest's stamina, as Soldat's next two dams are by speed influences. His second dam, Malbay, is by Apalachee, a stallion categorised in the Brilliant section of the chef-de-race sires. The next dam, Sawmill Lady, was by the sprinter Marshua's Dancer. Also, Soldat is inbred 5x4 to Mr. Prospector, but this may be balanced by his 5x4 inbreeding to Round Table.

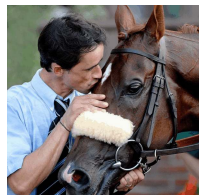

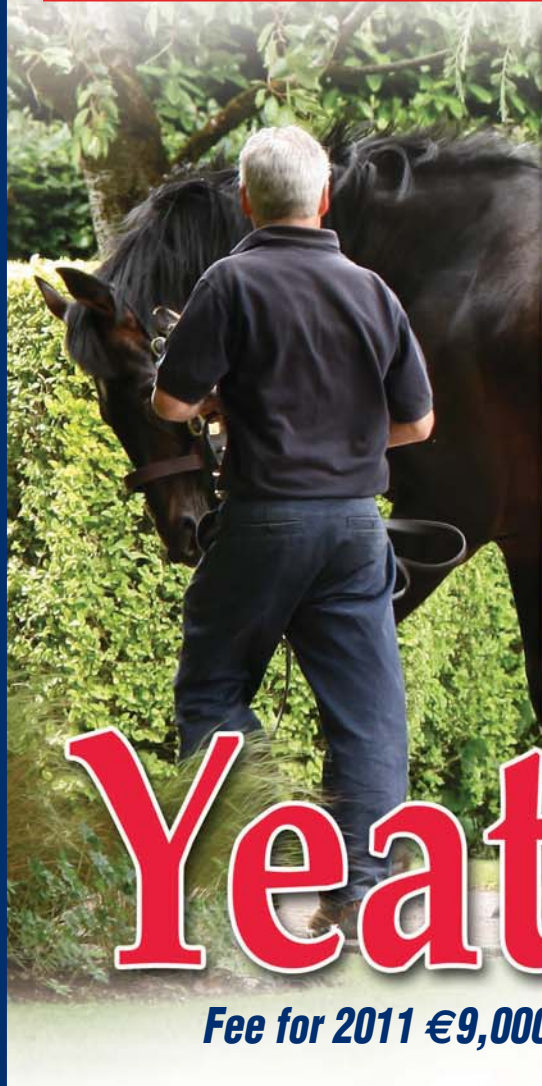
No World Cup For Drosselmeyer...

WinStar Farm's GI Belmont S. hero **Drosselmeyer** (Distorted Humor), who was under consideration for the Mar. 26 G1 Dubai World Cup, will not participate in the \$10-million event. The \$600,000 KEESEP yearling worked four furlongs in :50.00 at Payson Park Monday, but had missed a week of conditioning in February because of a fever. "He worked this morning and I'm very happy with it, but we're not going to the World Cup," conditioner Bill Mott told *Daily Racing Form*. "He just got pushed too far back in his training to make that race." Drosselmeyer could instead make his long-awaited first start since the Belmont last June in the 1 1/16-mile Challenger S. at Tampa Bay on Saturday. "We just need to get started, and if all goes well we'll look down the road to races like the [Apr. 9 GII] Oaklawn H. or [Mar. 26 GII] New Orleans Handicap," Mott relayed to *DRF*.

TRIPPI AVAILABLE ON NH TIME Trippi (End Sweep--Jealous Appeal, by Valid Appeal) will be covering mares on Northern Hemisphere time at Drakenstein Stud in South Africa for the 2011 breeding season, following a memorable weekend at Gulfstream Park. **R Heat Lightning** rekindled her juvenile sparkle, with an impressive score in the GII Davona Dale S.,

while **Gourmet Dinner** and **Travelin Man** added to their budding reputations with runner-up finishes in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. and GII Hutcheson S., respectively. Trippi has been well supported since arriving in South Africa three years ago, covering over 100 mares each season. His progeny were in high

demand at the recent Premier Yearling Sale in Cape Town, with 21 hips averaging R566,667 (\$81,308). Drakenstein's owner Gaynor Rupert is extremely enthusiastic about the decision, and will be sending some of her prized mares to the stallion. "I have been thinking that as Trippi is still known in America and doing very well, I am going to send a couple of my U.S.-bred mares to him on Northern Hemisphere time and then send them to America," explained Rupert. "I have invited other breeders to do the same at a reduced cost from his R100,000 (\$15,000) stud fee. I would love to have some of his progeny continue racing in America," added Rupert. Southern Hemisphere mares that foaled late, or failed to get into foal, are being encouraged to breed at the discounted fee. Young Arrowfield stallion Not A Single Doubt (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) enjoyed a strong session. Jason Petch Racing went to A\$260,000 to secure his colt from the Strategic (Aus) mare On The Loose (Aus), from the Supreme Thoroughbreds draft. The Hong Kong Jockey Club, meanwhile, landed another colt by Not A Single Doubt, this one from the Montjeu (Ire) mare Numero Douze (Aus) for A\$200,000. Limerick Lane Thoroughbreds consigned the chestnut.

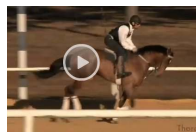
