BAFFERT ROLLING FOUR DEEP

Bob Baffert intends to start four horses against the imposing **Twirling Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) in Saturday's GI Santa Anita H., *Daily Racing Form* reports. The Hall of Fame trainer will likely be represented by multiple Classic-placed **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even), 2010 GIII Lone Star Derby hero **Game On Dude** (Awesome Again), GII San Antonio S. runner-up **Spurrier** (Dixieland Band), and GII Strub S. second-place finisher **Tweebster** (Tapit).

"Right now, it looks like all four unless something changes between now and then," Baffert told *DRF*. "Twirling Candy is a good horse, but it's the Big 'Cap and you've got to give them a chance." First Dude, Game On Dude and Tweebster worked five furlongs at Santa Anita Tuesday. The first, owned and bred by Donald Dizney, covered the distance in :58.80. He joined the Baffert barn following a troubled fourth-place finish in the Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream Jan. 29. Game On Dude, a sharp allowance optional claiming victor at Santa Anita Jan. 27, and Tweebster, covered the distance in 1:00.40. Spurrier worked six furlongs in 1:11.20 at Hollywood Sunday. "Game On Dude worked really nice," Baffert continued. "Everybody worked smoothly. [First Dude] worked a little quicker than the other ones, but he's sort of deceiving."

It's No Wonder...

A pair of youngsters shared Monday's fastest time for a quarter-mile breeze, including **hip 73**, a filly from the first crop of Stevie Wonderboy (Stephen Got Even). The chestnut stopped the clock in **:21 3/5**. Consignor Justin Casse wasn't too surprised by the filly's effort.

"We shipped in Feb. 15, and she was a bit nervous and kept checking everything out, like most of them do," Casse explained. "There are about 1,500 horses here. Since then, she's relaxed and enjoyed her time here, and has really blossomed. We asked a little bit more from her last week, and she just took off. I knew then that she's got it figured out and had become comfortable in her surroundings."

Along with [hip 39](#), a Lion Heart colt, the Stevie Wonderboy filly is consigned by Casse Sales on behalf of Kelynack Farm, a pinhooking venture backed by Ontario businessman Glenn Harvey and Steve Duffield. Harvey has had some success at Woodbine with his Kelynack Racing Stable.

“He got into racing about seven or eight years ago, mostly with lower-level horses and claimers,” Casse noted. “Over the past year and a half, he’s been working with my brother [Mark Casse]’s ex-assistant Ricky Griffith, who has gone out on his own, and decided to try pinhooking. We had a good year last year; we treaded water and made a little bit of money.”

Kelynack was the name on the ticket for a \$40,000 daughter of Northern Afleet at Keeneland September in 2009. Sold under the Casse banner last year at OBS March, she was purchased by Elisabeth Alexander for \$165,000. That encouraged the venture to continue.

“We doubled up for this year and went in a bit stronger,” Casse noted. “So far, so good. We don’t pay a lot of money for our horses--we try to keep it at \$70,000-80,000 or less.”

Hip 73 was picked up by Kelynack for \$40,000 last year at Keeneland from the consignment of her breeder, Airdrie Stud’s Brereton Jones. She is out of California stakes winner Tina Fleet (Afleet), a mare acquired by Airdrie for \$13,000 at Keeneland January in 2007.

“She was a very well put-together filly last year when we sold her, and nothing would make us happier than to see those guys hit a home run with her,” said Airdrie’s Bret Jones.

Airdrie launched the stud careers of Indian Charlie and Harlan’s Holiday, and Bret Jones is hopeful that Stevie Wonderboy can follow in their hoofprints. After securing Eclipse Award honors with his win in the 2005 GI Breeders’ Cup Juvenile ([video](#)), the big chestnut missed most of his sophomore season, and didn’t enter the breeding shed until 2008.

“Stevie really was a special horse on the track,” Jones offered. “That was a truly great crop he ran against, and for him to be named champion from that group is probably the best endorsement for his ability. Then, when you think about the fact that he ran a zero Ragozin number as a 2-year-old, that has to be considered brilliant by anyone’s definition. We were drawn to him immediately as a stallion prospect, and we will always be grateful to Merv Griffin for giving us the chance to stand him.”

Jones acknowledged the difficulty of having so much time lapse between the stallion’s racetrack achievements and his entering the breeding shed.

“It’s always a bit of a challenge to remind people just how good a horse was when he’s been out of their consciousness for a while, but certainly being an Eclipse champion helped jog people’s memory when we did announce him as a stallion,” Jones acknowledged.

Jones continued, "We were very happy with his first book of mares and are obviously thrilled with what we're seeing and hearing from this first crop."

Tina Fleet produced a chestnut colt by Bellamy Road last April and was bred back to Airdrie stallion Brother Derek. --MK

W.D. North & SGV Up the Ante...

W.D. North and SGV Thoroughbreds' Steve Venosa, who first linked up when selling a pair of juveniles in 2010, decided to crank it up a notch for the 2011

season, and bring a small but select cast of seven to this year's installment of the Fasig-Tipton Florida Sale.

"We brought a very diverse group here," offered North. "We have horses with Kentucky Derby pedigrees, and we have a few with more precocious, early-developing pedigrees. We

have horses to suit all buyers."

North, who over the last few years has purchased and sold horses in partnership with a variety of consignors, including Niall Brennan, Tony Bowling and Bobby Dodd and Halcyon Hammock, offers his largest consignment yet at public auction.

"This is the first time I've brought this many horses down to Florida while in partnership with somebody else," North commented. "In fact, this is the biggest consignment that I, personally, have ever had."

A Florida native, North was groomed to be a trainer. His stepfather, Darrel Innis, trained Quarter Horses in the 70s, and North nurtured his love of horses over the years by working for Florida horsemen Hoby Kight and Ricky Leppala. Among notable horses sold by North in earlier partnerships were dual Grade I-winning sprinter Delaware Township (Notebook) and MGSW & MGISP Diabolical (Artax). After selling horses alone and in partnership over the last 12 years, North opted to join forces with Venosa.

"Steve brings a lot to the table," said North. "He's an excellent horseman and he is a very smart guy. We work really well together as a team, because we are both so passionate. Also, it sometimes gets to the point where you have too many horses and you don't have time to focus on the individual. So by Steve and I partnering up, we have two people focusing on 25 head of sales horses."

For this year's sale, North has seven offered through Venosa's SGV Thoroughbreds, including a single juvenile that is owned in partnership with Paul Sharp.

"We brought a real select group of horses down here," said North. "We started the year with over 20 sales horse, and we wanted to pick and choose the ones that were the most precocious. We wanted the horses that made it to the sale to be very sound. We narrowed our team down to seven and we are proud of the ones we brought here."

Among the standouts in this year's consignment is [hip 49](#), a bay filly by More Than Ready, who rocketed to a [:09 3/5](#) one-furlong work during the breeze show at Palm Meadows Monday.

"She is very precocious and I think she can be a graded stakes winner as a two-year-old," stated North. "She's more than ready, like her sire's name suggests. Also, she has the greatest mind of any filly. We expected her to have a great workout, but we didn't necessarily expect her to equal the world record [for an eighth]. We felt she would be the fastest filly coming into the sale."

Also high on the SGV/North team's list is [hip 78](#), a bay colt by Malibu Moon who breezed an eighth in [:10 flat](#); and [hip 137](#), a filly by second crop sire Congrats. Owned in partnership with Sharp, the dark bay filly out of Chelsea Rose (West by West) worked an eighth of a mile in [:10 3/5](#) during Monday's show.

"She is a great filly and is just beautiful," North said of the Congrats filly. "She looks magnificent on the racetrack and I think she'll run two turns. Congrats has enjoyed a great start to stud. He's had two Grade I winners with fillies in his first crop. That's very good for us." **cont. p5**

North also offered high marks for Fasig-Tipton's decision to move the Florida sale to Palm Meadows.

"We absolutely love this place and love the track," said North. "This environment just puts everyone in a better mood. The horses like it here too. They seem so relaxed. We don't have any complaints."

As for the track itself, North added, "The racetrack is the best thing about this place. I think it's a very fair track that stayed pretty even and I think it can be one of the best surfaces in the world. I also like the set up of it better because we can go off through a different gap than we came in, which cuts down on traffic. I think it might have helped the breeze show to go off a bit faster."

Crossbow Sidelined...

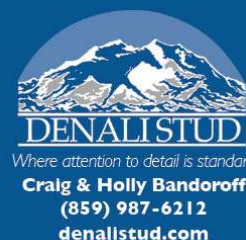

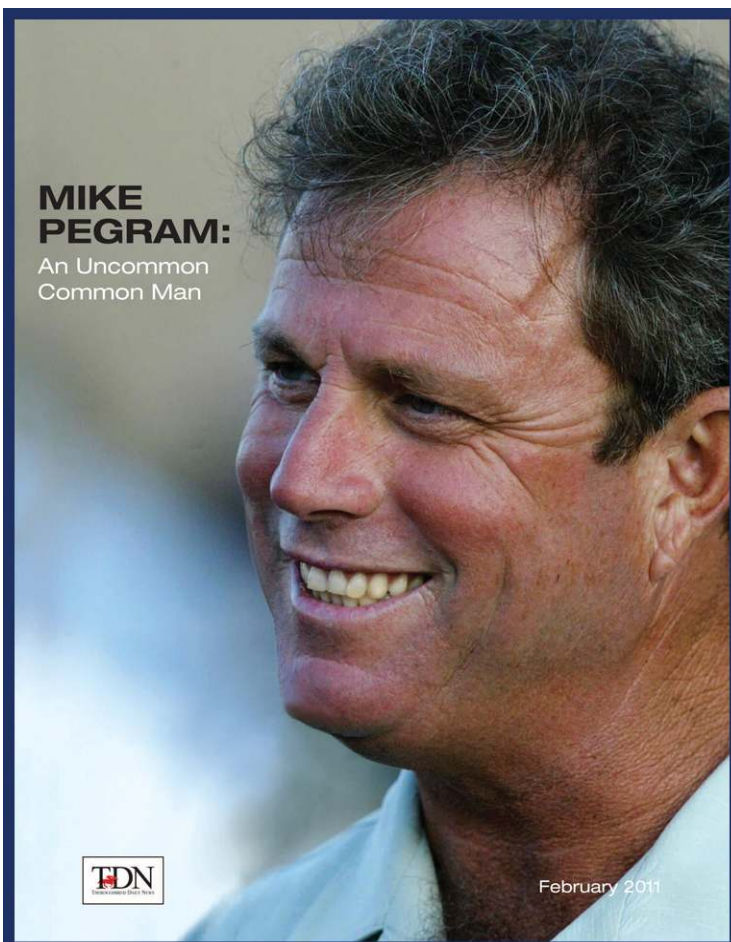
