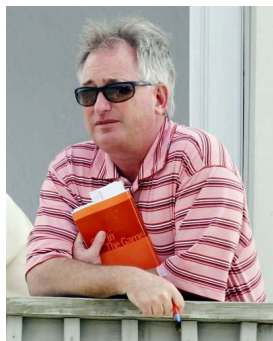

FUN IN THE SUN

The juvenile sales season kicks off this morning with Fasig-Tipton's Florida Sale, which will be held at its new venue, the Palm Meadows Training Center in Boynton Beach. Buyers and consignors have been most enthusiastic about the track's surface and barn area, and the auction house is hopeful that the sale will meet expectations.

"We had a great breeze show, and there's been great activity after that," Boyd Browning Jr., Fasig-Tipton's president, commented yesterday morning. "All of the indications are that it will be a very well-attended and well-shopped horse sale. I think we've got a lot of nice horses here. It will be a very good indication of the market, and I feel encouraged about the economy, too. It was very busy at the barns [Tuesday], and people are making their shortlists and going back for second looks."

Many of the East Coast's top trainers are based at Palm Meadows over the winter, and have had plenty of opportunity to watch the youngsters since their arrival on the training center's grounds two weeks ago.

"We did want to make it easier to find buyers for the horses," Browning pointed out. "It is a new location for the sale, and we'd like for it to get it off to a good start." He added with a smile, "Of course, we'd love to see a Triple Crown winner come out of this sale."

Last year's sale, which had a trimmer catalogue than in 2009, saw a 9.3% increase in average to \$257,473, while the median spiked up 33.3% to \$200,000 from the \$150,000 achieved 12 months earlier. Browning believes things are headed in the right direction.

"I'd like to see the marketplace start off this year in a positive manner, because all of the sales are related," he explained. "If the first 2-year-old sale goes well, then that's a positive sign for the rest of the 2-year-old sales, which has got to help the yearling sales. That in turn helps the mixed sales in November, so it's really, really critical that we get this started the right way, and I'm confident that we can do it."

WORLD CUP PREVIEW AT MEYDAN

Today's Super Thursday card at Meydan begins the countdown to the Mar. 26 Dubai World Cup program with five group races, highlighted by the G2 Al Maktoum Challenge, Round 3. The Al Maktoum Challenge has attracted a field of 14 hoping to solidify their chances in the \$10-million G1 Dubai World Cup. Zabeel Racing's **Richard's Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid), previously trained by Bob Baffert, makes his first start for Satish Seemar. The six-year-old won back-to-back renewals of the G1 Pacific Classic, and is making his first start since winning the G1 Goodwood S. last October.

Juddmonte homebred **Twice Over** (GB) (Observatory) makes his first start since winning a second renewal of the G1 Champion S. in October. Trainer Henry Cecil admitted the 13 post was a concern, but today's 2000-meter event was a necessary first step as his charge looks to improve on a 10th-place effort in last year's World Cup. "The draw is poor, but we feel he is in better shape than he was last year when we did not give him a prep race," Cecil reported. "Given that the first three home in the World Cup had been in Dubai all year, we have decided to come earlier this time. He should improve for the run but the race will give us a better idea."

Murmurs went through the grandstand when this grey filly zipped through her drill in **:9 4/5**, which was the co-second-fastest time of the day. She's barely stayed in her stall since. "It's not about going fast any more--you have to look good doing it," said Vision Racing's John Stephens. The March foal is a full-sister to Tempted to Tapit, who was second and third, respectively, in the GII Risen Star S. and GIII Sunland Derby last spring. Vision acquired her for \$67,000 at Keeneland September.

Among the horses that caused some buzz during Monday's breeze show was this son of MSP Princess Patricia (Aptitude), who is a half-sister to champion grass mare and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf heroine Forever Together (Belong to Me). The grey, who negotiated an eighth of a mile in :9 4/5, was one of only four juveniles to break the 10 second barrier Monday. "He's a horse we've been very excited about all winter," offered Dunne. "We wanted to buy a Hard Spun last year, since he was such a phenomenal racehorse. To our minds, this is the best one we had seen all year. He's been up at the farm since he was a yearling and he's been good all winter long." Dunne also gave high marks on the physical attributes of his colt. "He's long and lean and he looks like he will go two turns," he said. "And that's what it's all about."

The sharp final time of :10 2/5 recorded by the daughter of hot sire Indian Charlie during Monday's breeze would usually be sure to please almost any consignor heading into a juvenile sale. Any consignor except the filly's trainer Ciaran Dunne, that is. "Honestly, we were a little disappointed in her breeze," admitted Dunne. "It's a terrible thing to say when a horse goes :10 2/5 and you're disappointed. She trained so well at home and had been great all week here. She had just been so breathtaking in how she went about everything. When she got out there to breeze, as soon as she broke off, the grandstand caught her eye and she swapped onto her left lead and was kind of trying to get away from the stands the whole way. The rider said he could never get her to drop her head and let her run, because he was trying to hold her off. So when I say that we were disappointed, I mean that we really thought she had a shot to be as fast as anything that was here."

Another member of the Nick de Meric consignment to post an eye-pleasing :10 2/5 work Monday was a dark bay son of SW and GSP Crypto's Best. "He's just a beautiful colt," said de Meric. "This horse had a very good work and the sire is on fire right now, so we couldn't be happier with the way we're coming into the sale with him." The Virginia-bred is from the family of GIII Gotham S. winner Mayakovsky, who was second in the GI Hopeful S. According to de Meric, the son of Airdrie's resident stallion Indian Charlie, who is already responsible for champions Indian Blessing, Fleet Indian and Uncle Mo, is typical of his sire. "He's a little plain in the head, but physically he has a body to die for," the Englishman stated. "He's an outstanding mover and just a very attractive physical."

"She's been very popular," said Brennan. "She's a big, rangy filly, but she's deceptively quick on the racetrack. She's got great stretch to her."

During Monday's show, the filly zipped an eighth of a mile in [:10 flat](#). "She certainly has a presence to her," said Smith. "She has a star quality."

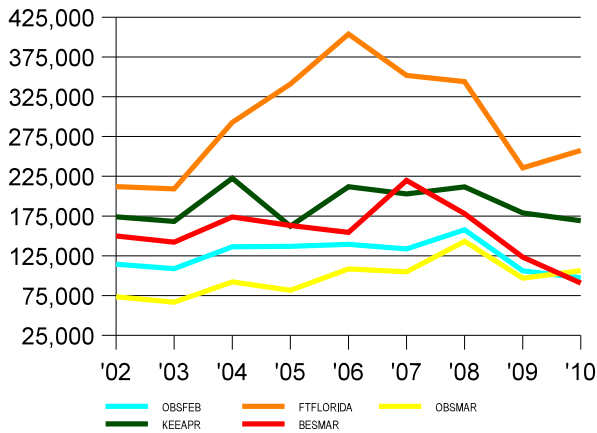

He's not a made horse, and I think anybody buying at this sale can see that. He's not finished by a long shot. I think he's going to keep improving, and I think he can do well at this sale."

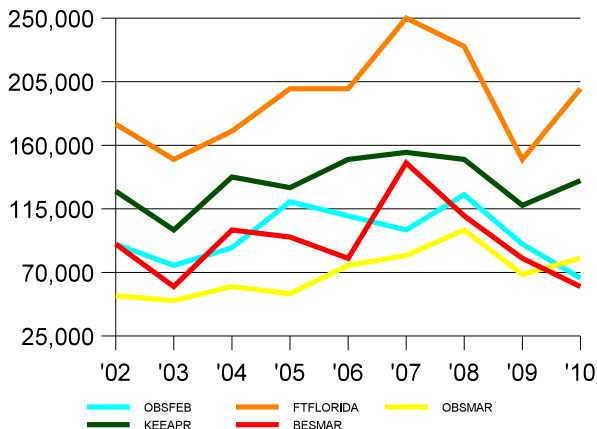

TWIRLING CANDY SWEETENS BIG 'CAP FIELD

Jenny Craig's **Twirling Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}) will look to take his game to the next level as the heavy 4-5 morning-line favorite in Saturday's GI Santa Anita H. The four-year-old captured the seven-furlong GI Malibu S. in track-record time of 1:19 3/5 in his sophomore finale. He returned with a 4 1/2-length romp in the Feb. 5 GII Strub S. last time out. Trainer John Sadler, who has already won eight graded stakes at the Santa Anita meeting, will saddle the dark bay colt. "My job is just to be a good steward and take good care of him because he's a natural runner," Sadler explained after the Strub. "My only concern is that I do a good job because I really feel this is the best horse in the country." Twirling Candy worked seven furlongs at Santa Anita Sunday in 1:25. Sadler also sends out GII San Antonio S. winner **Gladding** (Sarava) in Saturday's 1 1/4-mile event. The four-year-old gelding is 6-1 on the morning line. Bob Baffert will saddle four runners Saturday. Heading the Baffert brigade is **First Dude** (Stephen Got Even) at 5-1 on the morning line.

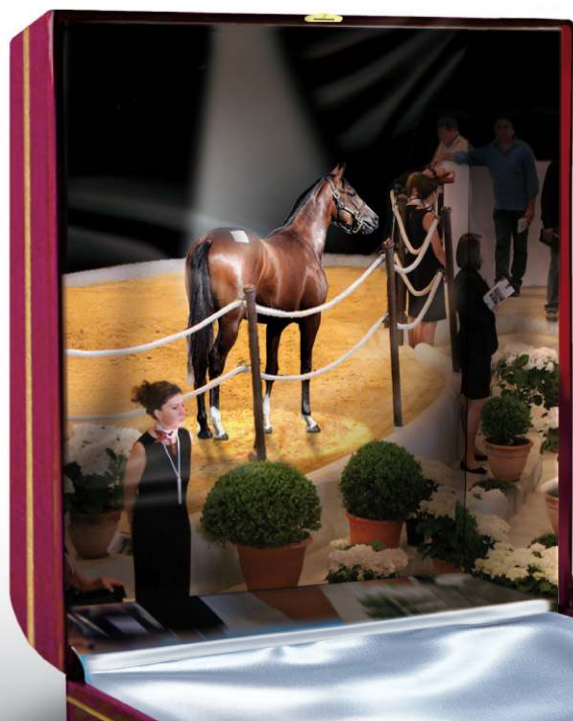

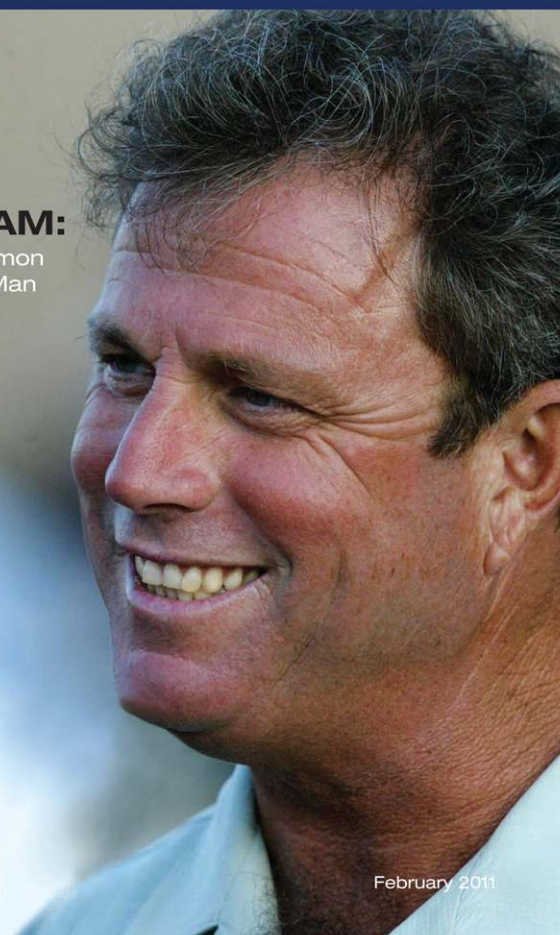

PUBLIC COMMENT INVITED ON 2011 ALLIANCE CODE OF STANDARDS

The public comment period for the 2011 NTRA Safety & Integrity Alliance Code of Standards is under way.

The Alliance enables every industry stakeholder to participate in a consensus-driven, national program to create, implement and enforce a Code of Standards for Thoroughbred racing. All stakeholder groups, including racetracks, horsemen, breeders, owners, trainers, jockeys, veterinarians, regulators and racing fans, have input into the Code.

The Code mandates minimum standards in six areas: injury reporting and prevention; safety equipment and a safer racing environment; medication and testing; health and safety of jockeys; aftercare of equine athletes; and wagering security.

The Code incorporates new or more stringent standards every year, continuously raising the bar. In 2010, for example, the Code was expanded to encompass wagering security. Tracks accredited for two years in 2009 will now have to meet these new standards, which were not covered in the original Code.

NEHBPA Vote Yes on Purse Contract:

After making one revision, the New England Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association voted unanimously Thursday to accept the 2011 purse contract offered by Suffolk Downs. The contract calls for 80 live racing days this year, a provision predicated on the approval of an amendment to current state legislation that requires the track hold 100 days of racing annually. The NEHBPA, however, refused to sign off on a clause that would have prevented its horsemen from opposing the dates reduction. The purse fund will total \$8.25 million, and revenue from simulcasting will be split 50-50 between the track and purses. The revised contract now needs to be approved by Suffolk Downs.

Researcher Back on Flat, Eying Charles Town Classic:

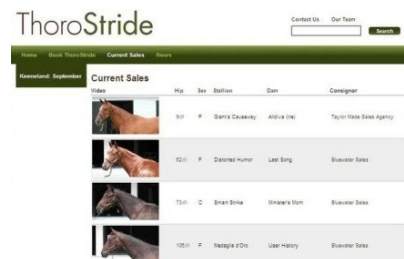
