READY TO ROCK

The juvenile auction season kicks into full swing in Ocala, Florida, as the OBS March Sale begins its two-day run at 11 a.m. today. With the deletion of the February sale from OBS's calendar this season, a beefed-up catalogue of 490 juveniles has been entered, up from 340 in 2010. Sunny skies and pleasant temperatures prevailed for the pushed-back breeze shows, following heavy rain and wind Thursday.



"We thought we'd benefit by combining the two sales--rather than having two separate sales--as the numbers [catalogued] were declining," OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura offered.

"Last year, we had 160 horses in the February sale and 340 in March. At least for the short term, the overall numbers of the foal crops are decreasing, so we thought that, by putting the two sales together, we could provide a solid group of horses in one setting rather than in two. We didn't lose anything, and by combining the two sales we have a strong group of horses to present. The February sale has traditionally been an excellent sale for us, and very productive. We didn't eliminate the February sale, we just moved those horses to March. Just a few years ago, we had over 500 horses in the March sale and over 200 in February, but we're in a different world today." *Cont. p2*

She was third in the Nov. 5 GI Breeders' Cup Ladies Classic. "Tony had clued me in that she needed to work with other horses, and her important work last week was like that, but this one she was by herself and she did it right," Jones added. "She's ready now. This should set us up perfectly."

Horsemen and consignors have been supportive of the scheduling change at OBS March.

"I think it's best for everybody," said Ocala Stud's J. Mike O'Farrell Jr., who also serves as OBS's Chairman of the Board. "Times have changed. The very first 2-year-old sale used to be at Hialeah in January. But that's back when they ran 2-year-old races a lot earlier. The economic climate played a part in it too. The pinhookers have less money to buy prospects with, and there just weren't going to be enough quality horses to go around to keep all the sales. We decided to take the best we could and make one very nice sale in March. I think the consignors

like it, and I think the buyers will like it."

Last year's OBSMAR sale produced 2010 GI Darley Debutante S. heroine **Tell A Kelly** (Tapit) (*RNA \$95,000 2yo '10 OBSMAR*) and unbeaten MGSW **Kantharos** (Lion Heart) (*\$250,000 2yo '10 OBSMAR*). In 2010, 167 head realized \$17,766,000 for an average of \$106,383. In 2009, 206 juveniles brought \$19,971,000, good for an average of \$96,947.

"We're expecting a good sale," Ventura confirmed. "I think the horses are here. We've had quite a bit of interest from the buying end. All of the indications--the credit requests, the hotel reservations--have been very positive. We'll just see if that turns into money at the end of the day."

Hip 16, c, Indian Charlie--Eva's Melody, by Storm Creek

Consigned by McKathan Bros., Agent IV

This colt, from the family of the graded winners Straight Man (Saint Ballado) and Pure Precision (Montbrook), is a robust bay who showed plenty of gas in his breeze, zipping an eighth in :10 flat ([video](#)) despite being on the wrong lead part of the way. "He worked great, and he went out in :33 1/5, which I'm told was the fastest gallop-out on the first day," said consignor Kevin McKathan. "He's a big, strong colt and a nice-looking horse. He's got enough stretch that I think he'd be able to go around two turns."

Hip 30, c, Macho Uno--Fearless Wildcat, by Forest Wildcat

Consigned by Leprechaun Racing, agent

This Texas-bred colt breezed an eighth in :10 1/5 ([video](#)) and counts the good juvenile Lou Brissie (Limehouse), winner of the GIII Kentucky Juvenile S. at Churchill, as his half-brother. He's also a half to another juvenile stakes winner in Fearless Cowboy (El Corredor). "He went in :10 1/5 and out in :23 2/5, so he was a tick off the fastest gallop-out of the day," said Leprechaun's Mike Mulligan. "The mare's had three to race and two nice stakes winners. [Lou Brissie] worked the other day, so he's back. This colt is a May 23 horse, so he's going to improve, and he's a really nice horse." **Hip Happenings cont. p3**

Hip 41, f, Tapit--Freccia, by Cryptoclearance *Consigned by Niall Brennan Stables, Agent III*

Bred in Maryland, this filly's second dam is a half to the good performer Topicount. But it's her sire that ensured her plenty of looks. Tapit came up with another good filly last Saturday in the form of Gill Honeybee S. heroine Joyful Victory. "She worked very well and has been very popular, being a daughter of Tapit," said consignor Niall Brennan. "Physically, she's actually a little different from the other Tapits. She's got a lot of substance--she's a powerful, strong filly. For a Tapit, she's very powerful. But she's a typical Tapit in her attitude--she's got an aggressive, I-want-to-do-it attitude." The filly breezed in :10 2/5 ([video](#)).

Hip 56, f, Latent Heat--Great Deep Bay, by Mr. Greeley *Consigned by Wavertree Stables (Ciaran Dunne), agent IV*

From the first crop of the Juddmonte-raced Woods Edge stallion Latent Heat (Maria's Mon), winner of the GI Malibu S. at three, this filly showed some of her sire's zip when she breezed a quarter in :21 1/5 ([video](#)), co-fastest at Friday's breeze show. "We actually sold the dam, Great Deep Bay, as a two-year-old," said consignor Ciaran Dunne. "She won huge at Calder in her first start for Frank Alexander, but unfortunately, things didn't quite work out for her. Even though the pedigree didn't reflect it, the mare was very talented, and when we saw her daughter at the yearling sales, we bought her. She's a big, leggy filly, and she looked go on the racetrack."

Hip 137, c, Scat Daddy--Madagascats, by Tale of the Cat *Consigned by Old South Farm, agent*

This colt posted the fastest one-eighth work at last Friday's breeze show, stopping the clock in :9 4/5 ([video](#)). Boasting a pedigree that includes the likes of Storm Bird, the March foal was produced by a half-sister to three stakes winners, including GSW Lindsay Jean (Saint Ballado).

Hip 151, c, Street Sense--Meadow Silk, by Meadowlake *Consigned by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, agent*

Bred by Gulf Coast, this colt boasts one of the stronger pedigrees of the sale. From the family of Speightstown (Gone West), he is a half-brother to Grade II winner Star Dabber (Saint Ballado), SW Run Production (Saint Ballado) and SP Bay Head King (Saint Ballado). "He's also a half to the sales topper here last year, a More Than Ready filly," said consignor Jerry Bailey. The filly, named Avid, was hammered down to Steve Young for \$525,000. She made a winning debut at Del Mar last August and was tabbed a 🌟 "TDN Rising Star" 🌟. This colt, from his sire's first crop, breezed an eighth in :10 3/5 at the first under-tack show ([video](#)). "He's a very smooth-built horse," added Bailey. "He's from a Meadowlake mare, and maybe gets a little more substance than the sire. I would say that most of them aren't as wide and strong as this horse."

Hip 176, f, Indian Charlie--Nesselrode, by Lemon Drop Kid

Consigned by de Meric Sales, Agent VI

Sent out to breeze an eighth at Friday's show, this filly stopped the clock in :10 2/5 ([video](#)). "She's a blocky, powerful filly with a big hindquarter, and a very smooth way of going," said consignor Nick de Meric. "She had a huge gallop-out the other day. She's just a straightforward, uncomplicated filly, and she's obviously by the right sire. It's a good family, too." The filly's second dam is a full-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Desert Stormer (Storm Cat).

Hip 196, f, Malibu Moon--Perdition, by Dixieland Band

Consigned by Eisaman Equine, agent

Malibu Moon fillies enjoyed a huge 2010, with the likes of Life at Ten, Devil May Care and Malibu Prayer representing the Spendthrift stallion. This filly breezed an eighth in :10 1/5 ([video](#)). "She's an early acting, fluid-moving filly," said consignor Shari Eisaman. "She's a very smart filly, too."

Hip 223, c, Empire Maker--Readhead Riot, by Top Account
Consigned by Eddie Woods, Agent LXXIX

This colt, named Julius Caesar, is by an exported sire who's enjoying a nice spring at the sales and on the track. Now in Japan, Empire Maker has had four juveniles to sell thus far this year for an average of \$668,750--tops among all sires. His median of \$537,500 is also tops. Leading the way, of course, was Murray Smith's \$1.35 million sale topper at Fasig-Tipton Florida, purchased by John Ferguson. Consignor Eddie Woods talked about this colt, who unofficially celebrates his second birthday on St. Patrick's Day. "He's a very Classic-looking horse," said Woods. "He's very well balanced and is a beautiful mover. He worked really well and is just a nice horse." The colt worked in :10 1/5 ([video](#)).

Hip 226, c, Street Sense--Regally Appealing, by Valid Appeal

Consigned by Classic Bloodstock (D Brendemuehl), Agent II

This nicely bred colt, from the first crop of GI Kentucky Derby hero Street Sense, was produced by GII Adirondack S. heroine Regally Appealing, a half-sister to the dam of the promising young sire Rockport Harbor (Unbridled's Song). This colt proved he inherited a bit of his dam's precocity when he gassed an eighth in :10 flat on Friday ([video](#)).

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING ...AT THE SALES

Off the Hook's Joe Appelbaum, when asked about action on the backstretch:

"It's been good, but after [Fasig-Tipton Florida], when we had amazing action and no bidding, I'm not even going to draw conclusions. It looks like they sold only one third of the horses [catalogued], and that's a very difficult environment. It seemed like there was a lot of interest, a decent amount of vetting, but when we got up to the ring there was very little bidding. I didn't fully understand it, to be honest with you."

Halcyon Hammock's Hal Hatch:

"I brought some tall, leggy horses here. They weren't over-prepped, and they're nice and sound. I'm hoping we get rewarded for that. I've always come to this sale with my better horses, and I've been very lucky. I've found it to be a really nice average, a really nice range of buyers."

Consignor Eddie Woods:

"The action's been very good. If we have the same action in the ring, we'll be fine. It was very much the same as in past years, but this time, they threw us a blinder. We did more showing than we ever did before, and we got a little carried away with the action we had, and when in actual fact, all we had was the same sale. I think it was that we were in a new facility and a lot of people drove down to see what was going on. We had a lot of very proactive trainers on the grounds, and they were coming to look at horses. Unlike the Calder guys, who maybe aren't as active at that level, the trainers at Palm Meadows are. We had a lot of vet work in a lot of spots, but a lot of the buyers just wanted to play in certain spots."



Consignor Niall Brennan:

"There's good activity, for sure. At a sale like this, they're not all landing on the same horse. There are people with different budgets, and the guys who have a \$100,000 budget aren't going to go look at a horse they think is going to bring \$300,000. People can come and work the sale hard and think, 'I'm going to find one you don't find.' At a boutique sale, it's harder. People shop better here--there are more people and more horses, and that's what makes a sale. The more buyers there are, the more momentum there is. That's what's happened in March before, and it happened last year. People tend to get in to a rhythm, and they realize they have to spend some money to get their horse. When it's just a few horses here and there, it's just flat. With more buyers, there's more kick and energy."



Consignor Nick de Meric:

"It's gotten to the point where the serious two-year-old buyer almost has to come to this sale. The track record is there, the horses are here. It's a blue-collar select sale. It's not too boutique-y, there are a lot of different horses here. There are a lot of good horses that have sold for very reasonable prices." Asked about the decision to end OBS February: "I have to be honest, I'm on the OBS board, and I was the first proponent of eliminating that first sale. I loved it; that sale's been very good to me, and we sold a lot of good horses there, but it got to a point where we were sort of inventing horses for it. Let's face it: it's a minority of two-year-olds who are ready to dance that early in the calendar. In the old days, when it was the Florida-bred Sale, those horses would thrive on in--they were tough, precocious horses and they would handle it well. But since the emphasis has changed to Kentucky-breds and outside horses, the horses don't have the resilience and precocity you have to have for that sale. So we were trying to invent horses for it; we all knew it, and we were all trying to keep the catalogue alive. But I said, 'Let's make the decision now, before it's made for us.'"

McKathan Bros.' Kevin McKathan:

"I think Friday, with the headwind, was a totally different breeze show from Saturday. Horses seemed to get over the track a lot easier Saturday. Just watching it, it took a horse that was really running to go in :10 flat at the first show. Saturday, they seemed to be clipping them off a lot easier. Whether the headwind was the only factor, I don't know. Maybe the track needed to dry out a little bit. But the headwind can be tricky with babies. When the turn for home and the wind hits them in the face, it can be startling for them. Other than just the resistance, it can also startle them."

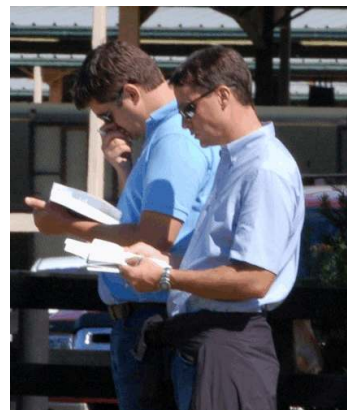

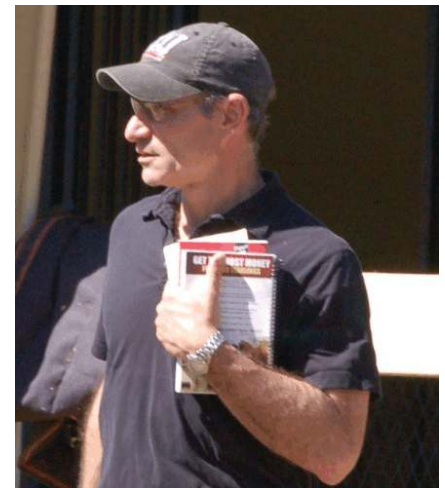

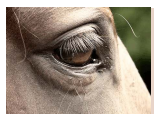

When I studied the result of Saturday's San Felipe S., I almost felt as if I had hitched a ride with Marty McFly in "Back To The Future's" DeLorean and been transported back a couple of decades. After all, it's not often these days that you see a Grade II winner with a second dam by The Axe, a horse born in 1958, and a third dam by Ambiorix, a stallion who was born as long ago as 1946 and who was North American champion sire in 1961.

The explanation for this unusual aspect to Premier Pegasus' pedigree is that several members of his female line were born when their dams were fairly elderly. His fifth dam Source Sucree--who found everlasting fame as the dam of Turn-to, co-champion American 2-year-old of 1953--was born in France in 1940. Source Sucree was 17 when she produced fourth dam Giff-Gaff (who was three when mated to Ambiorix in 1960 to produce third dam Glass of Fashion).

Glass of Fashion was 18 when she produced second dam Glimmer Glass to the 21-year-old The Axe. Glimmer Glass in turn was 17 when she produced Premier Pegasus' talented dam Squall Linda, whose finest moment came when she was runner-up in the GIII Monrovia H. down the hill at Santa Anita.

Glass of Fashion was fairly ordinary as a racemare. A veteran of 25 starts in two seasons in the early 1960s, she earned less than \$3,000 with two wins and a handful of seconds and thirds. There was nothing ordinary, though, about the pedigree of this Guggenheim-bred mare, who had the distinction of being inbred 2x3 to the influential broodmare Lavendula. Best known as the dam of Ambiorix, champion French 2-year-old of 1948, Lavendula also had some very accomplished broodmare daughters, led by Source Sucree (also dam of the very smart Cagire) and Perfume (dam of the 2000 Guineas winner My Babu and the good sire Sayani).

This close inbreeding stood Glass of Fashion in good stead as a broodmare, as you will see from Premier Pegasus' catalogue-style pedigree available on the TDN website (*Click [here](#) for the SWP*). The edited highlights are that Glass of Fashion produced a Grade I-winning stayer in Trojan Bronze (San Luis Rey S.) and a highly successful Australian broodmare in Clystalla, her daughter by Pia Star. Clystalla produced Group 1 winners in Australia and South Africa, most notably the champion Australian filly November Rain.

Glass of Fashion also produced a stakes winner to The Axe, namely Premier Pegasus' second dam Glimmer Glass. Mention of The Axe also acts as a reminder of another era, as he was conceived when his sire, the 1936 Derby winner Mahmoud, was 25. The Axe was perplexingly inconsistent during his two years in training with Cecil Boyd-Rochfort in England, but there were no such problems after his repatriation. His 13 victories from 29 North American starts included the San Luis Trey S., Man o'War S. and Canadian Championship. Stamina was clearly no problem for The Axe, who went on to sire the likes of Al Hattab, Executioner, Foggy Note, Hatchet Man, Poleax and Twist the Axe.

Premier Pegasus received a weight of 112 on the Experimental Free Handicap, so still has a little way to go before he matches his half-brother Street Hero, who was given 122 on the 2008 Handicap. This son of Street Cry had the unusual record of having broken his maiden in the GI Norfolk S., defeating Midshipman (Unbridled's Song), and he confirmed his class with third place in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Unfortunately for owner-breeder Myung Kwon Cho, Street Hero didn't last long enough to be able to tackle the Triple Crown: he required surgery for a knee fracture after the Juvenile and was immediately retired to Vinery, where he covered 78 mares as a 3-year-old.

Hopefully Premier Pegasus will prove more durable. He has already emulated his sire Fusaichi Pegasus in winning the San Felipe, and the Santa Anita Derby should tell us more about his chances of further emulating his sire at Churchill Downs.

Fusaichi Pegasus' fee stands at only \$15,000 for a second successive year, but was still as high as \$75,000 in 2007, when Premier Pegasus was conceived. It was as high as \$150,000 in 2005, when his other 2011 graded winner, Champ Pegasus, was conceived. Premier Pegasus' crop also includes such as Riveting Reason, Fusa Code and Powhatan County. It is going to be fascinating to see whether the Ashford resident will prove capable of siring performers of similar calibre at his reduced fee.

Premier Pegasus and Powhatan County are both out of mares from the Storm Bird line. Fusaichi Pegasus' potential with this type of mare was established early in his career, thanks to Storm Bird's fine broodmare daughter Marozia, who visited him in his first two seasons. Their first foal, Andromeda's Hero, became a Grade III winner and showed plenty of talent at Grade I level, notably finishing second in the Belmont S. Their second foal, Superfly, also became a stakes winner with a Grade I placing.



Pedigree Insights cont.

Inevitably, the Kentucky Derby-winning son of Mr Prospector became a popular option for mares by Storm Bird's son Storm Cat. Among this cross's 34 representatives are a couple of stakes winners and four graded-stakes performers, including the Group 1-placed English filly Pursuit of Glory. There are also graded-stakes performers out of mares by three sons of Storm Cat.

Premier Pegasus' broodmare sire Summer Squall was bred to the same cross as Storm Cat, both being out of Secretariat mares. Fusaichi Pegasus has only three foals out of Summer Squall mares but Premier Pegasus--as a Grade III and Grade II winner with only one defeat in five starts--hopefully has the potential to develop into his sire's best representative from a Storm Bird line mare.

Summer Squall's fertility problems mean that he has only 139 broodmare daughters, which have produced

576 foals aged three or over. Premier Pegasus and his half-brother Street Hero are two of only seven Graded winners among these 576 foals, but the others include those top performers Stevie Wonderboy and Summer Bird. Others are Winslow Homer, the 2010 2-year-old Group 3 winner Theysken's Theory and the Arlington Classic winner Mr. Mellon. There was also a smart Japanese dirt performer, Seeking the Best, out of a Summer Squall mare and there could well be more graded

winners to come from a sizeable crop of 2011 2-year-olds out of daughters of the 1990 Preakness winner.

As Fusaichi Pegasus won the Kentucky Derby and Summer Squall finished second to Unbridled, prior to siring the 1999 winner Charismatic, stamina should be no problem at all for Premier Pegasus--especially if he continues to rate as well as he did in the San Felipe. Indeed, it is perhaps more noteworthy that he was fast enough to win stakes races over six and seven furlongs at two.

I loved David (Powell)'s interpretation of both the racing industry, and avenues for fixing it. My father and I are small-time breeders. We love the horses and hope that, through our due diligence, we will mate our mares with stallions that give us a reasonable chance at succeeding on the racetrack. We aren't breeding to sell at auction. Our hope is to both breed and race horses that are free of medication, as we want to participate in this business as naturally as possible. I fear that we will always be behind the 8-ball as we attempt to breed and race in what we view as the "correct way." I don't know if the industry is breeding an unsound horse. However, it sure does appear as though specific names pop up consistently in the pedigrees of horses that are either retired early or break down. Rather than perpetrate what we believe to be a desire for speed at the expense of soundness in the breed, we will attempt to breed the unsoundness and bleeding out of our horses. We may be idealistic in this desire, but we feel it is the correct path to take for our animals. If we can't afford to give them time off when they need it, we shouldn't be in the business to begin with.

JOCKEY CLUB COMMISSIONS INDUSTRY

STUDY The Jockey Club has commissioned a comprehensive study to examine the current state and prospective future of Thoroughbred breeding and racing in North America. The study, provisionally entitled "Driving Sustainable Growth for Thoroughbred Breeding and Racing," will be conducted by the consulting firm McKinsey & Company in conjunction with The Jockey Club, with input from a cross-section of industry representatives. The McKinsey team has been provided a list of industry stakeholders, and will be contacting them and others during its research phase of the project in order to gain insight into the issues and opportunities in racing. The last major study of this type, commissioned by The Jockey Club in 1975, was conducted by Pugh-Roberts Associates. The 2011 study will be an in-depth look at Thoroughbred breeding and racing from an economic and consumer standpoint. It will include three main areas of focus:

- An examination of the current course of the sport and where it would be over the next 10 years without change
- An evaluation of a range of alternatives that could be undertaken to improve the short- and long-term health of the sport
- A broad strategy for implementing the most promising courses of action

The study will delve into issues such as: the effect of takeout and exchange wagering, international opportunities for expansion, ways to increase the popularity of the sport and the importance of improving the health and safety of the sport's athletes. The major findings and recommendations emanating from the study will be presented at The Jockey Club's 58th annual Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing in Saratoga Springs, N.Y. Sunday, Aug. 14, 2011. "The Jockey Club's Board of Stewards firmly believes this study will illuminate the best opportunities for bringing sustainable, positive change to our sport and create a credible frame of reference for building consensus among breeders, owners, racetracks and other constituencies to move this sport forward," said Jim Gagliano, The Jockey Club's president and chief operating officer.

"We look forward to an even stronger performance in 2011 as we record the full year results from the combined TwinSpires.com-Youbet.com account-wagering platform, from Harlow's, and from the Calder Casino, which has been subject to a lower gaming tax rate since July 2010. Additionally, we incurred higher expenses last year related to our acquisitions, many of which are costs that should not impact our results going forward. Overall, we are very pleased to see the positive impact these strategic investments have had on CDI's profitability." Evans added, "We still face a number of challenges as we work to improve the results of our racing operations, including nationwide declines in handle and intense competition for racehorses with tracks that are able to subsidize their purses with alternative gaming revenues. 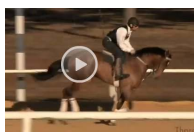
