

SMALL BUT SELECT, BARRETT'S TONIGHT

The 2011 Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training will be held tonight at the Hinds Pavilion at Fairplex Park in Pomona, California.

An already slender catalogue of 106 horses has been whittled to 82 after outs, but what the sale may lack in size, Barretts officials hope it makes up for in quality. Friday's under-tack show, where a total of 13 horses shared the bullet at :10 flat, certainly gave the indication there were some runners on the sales grounds.

"The horses trained well in the two weeks leading up to the breeze show, and they didn't disappoint," said Barretts Vice President of Sales Kim Lloyd. "They came through big. We had a lot of traffic right after the preview, and you know when they come right back to the barn after the preview, the horses did well. So I'm excited about the sale. I think we've got a pretty strong catalogue with a lot of athletes, and I think we'll get them sold. That's the goal--to get them sold."

Last year, Barretts catalogued 135 horses for March, and sold 69 of those juveniles for \$6,255,000. The sale average was \$90,652, down 26.4% from the year prior, while the median was \$60,000, down 25%. Topping the 2010 sale was Uphill Tigger, a colt by Unbridled's Song--King Shooting Star who sold to Narvick International for \$475,000. Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables consigned the horse, who joined Katsumi Yoshida's Northern Farm string in Japan.

Several groups from Japan have been perusing the wares on the sales grounds over the past few mornings, and officials and consignors alike are especially grateful for their presence, given the crisis facing their home country in the wake of last week's earthquake and tsunami.

"Considering what happened in Japan, we're really appreciative to see them back here," said Lloyd. "It's very gratifying. They are very comfortable here and they've had great luck. We really admire them; they're great people and great horsemen. We have a special place for them." **Cont. p8**

Juniper Pass, a narrowly beaten third behind Haimish Hy (Ecton Park) in the GI Hollywood Derby last November, was coming off a fifth-place effort in the Feb. 19 GII San Luis Obispo.

Making his first start on dirt when this marathon event came off the turf and taking blinkers off, the bay chased pacesetter Dahoud through moderate splits. The colt moved to challenge the longtime leader after a mile in 1:43.44, but Dahoud kicked clear again on the turn. Juniper Pass refused to go away, however, and pestered that rival the length of the stretch before inching clear in the final strides. "My horse ran really well for his first time on the dirt," said winning rider Rafael Bejarano. "He surprised everybody. I knew the number eight [Dahoud] was going to go to the lead and try and slow the pace. My only chance was to put my horse right behind the speed the whole way around. I'm glad it worked out. My horse showed me a big kick in the stretch. The other horse [Dahoud] came running, but my horse was very strong." Winning trainer Ray Bell had nothing but praise for Bejarano. "I left it up to the jock and thank God I did," Bell said. "He knew what kind of pace they were going. I told the jock to just play it by ear. We knew that [Dahoud would be on the lead]. That was the only thing we knew. I kind of left it up to Rafael. I told him he could be laying second. He's got a little bit of speed. It all worked out well, so we're happy." 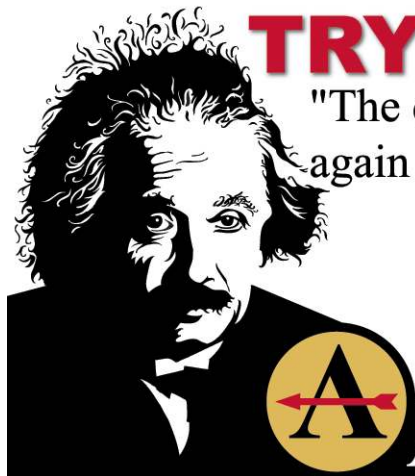

The lightly raced La Luna de Miel debuted a winner last April at Hannover and was sent stateside after an eighth-place effort in a listed event at Cologne in June. The bay filly took a 1 7/16-mile allowance over the Gulfstream lawn in her U.S. unveiling Feb. 18. Looking to go two-for-two in her first foray into graded stakes company, La Luna de Miel was taken in hand and settled into a stalking fourth. She took closer order along the rail on the turn, angled to the outside for the drive and forged to the lead late to win going away. "She's bred for the distance with that sire," said winning trainer Graham Motion. "She came to us at Palm Meadows in November. David [Rock], my assistant deserves credit for how she's done here. He's had her here all winter. One reason she was sent over is that there are so many more black-type opportunities for fillies and mares over here. We were hoping there would be some speed in the race and that's the way it developed. John [Velazquez] is riding so well and was able to get her covered up and then come on. The [Apr. 28 GIII] Bewitch at Keeneland would be a logical spot for her next." Things went to form for Velazquez. "It couldn't have worked out any more perfectly," the jockey confirmed. "Early on, I was between horses a little bit, but was able to get her out of there without any problem. Around the half-mile pole, I was saving all the ground and was looking for Leparoux's horse [Endless Expanse], figuring she was the horse to beat. Then I thought Bravo's horse [Giants Play] had gotten away from me, but when I asked my horse, she got there quicker than I expected to. It was all her today. She ran a great race." Lolly For Dolly backed a debut win at Cork last April with victory in the G3 Athasi S. here the following month, but slipped to eighth in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas over this course and distance May 23. Back in the money when fourth in the June 16 Listed Sandringham S. at Royal Ascot, she ran fifth in the G1 Pretty Polly S. back here last time June 26, and benefitted for the application of first-time blinkers to claim this seasonal bow under a welter burden. Settled in mid division after an alert break, she was encouraged to make her bid approaching the final quarter mile and was driven out inside the final 150 yards to assert superiority. "She didn't quite get the 10 furlongs in the Pretty Polly last season, but she did it well and travelled better today in the blinkers," trainer Tommy Stack told *irishracing.com*. "We decided to put blinkers on as it was a good prize and she tends to hit a flat spot in her races. We'll now go for the [G3] Gladness S. [back here Apr. 3] next." SNOW FAIRY OUT OF SHEEMA CLASSIC

Cristina Patino's Epsom and Irish Oaks heroine **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) will miss the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic after suffering a setback in training, trainer Ed Dunlop has revealed. The bay four-year-old, who also bagged big wins in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup and G1 Hong Kong Cup last term, was found to be lame before exercise yesterday. "It is a great shame, but the good thing is that the injury is not considered significant and is not career threatening," Dunlop said. "It is disappointing for everyone, especially the owner and coming so close to the race. We have no option but to withdraw the filly. She pulled out to exercise this morning and was found to be slightly lame on her right fore. The vets did extensive tests and found minor bone damage on the right cannonbone and while not a serious injury, it has obviously come at the wrong time for her to be able to run in Dubai. The vets have told us that it would be safe to travel, so Snow Fairy will fly home soon and she will then have two weeks box rest before we start all over again. She could well be back for the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot [in June]." *Cont. p6*

Harty Arrives at Meydan; Transcend Works...

Trainer Eoin Harty arrived in Dubai Saturday to oversee the final preparations of **Victor's Cry** (Street Cry {Ire}) for Saturday's G1 Dubai Duty Free. The West Coast-based conditioner, who saddled Well Armed (Tiznow) to win the G1 Dubai World Cup in 2009, is making his first appearance at Meydan, which hosted its first Dubai World Cup day card in 2010. "I'm trying to get my mind around the place--I have no idea where I am or where I need to be," said Harty. Owned by Equilete Stable, Victory Cry is scheduled to have his first formal work over the surface today. Harty confirmed he was pleased with how the dark bay had handled the trip from California to Dubai. However, his sole issue to date was that the Virginia-bred appeared to get a little hot on the way up to the track, because of the long walk from the quarantine barns to the track. "But everything is new to him here," explained the trainer. Jockey Victor Espinoza will be aboard the winner of last year's GI Citation H. Saturday.

Working in advance of the G1 Dubai World Cup at Meydan, **Transcend (Jpn)** (Wild Rush) negotiated 1200 meters (about six furlongs)--with a final quarter mile in a strong :23--Sunday morning at Meydan. Winner of the G1 February S. and G1 Japan Cup Dirt, the five-year-old will make his career debut over a synthetic surface in Saturday's 2000-meter feature.

Over the past five years, the size of the Barretts March catalogue has been cut nearly in half. Among other things, the expense of shipping horses from Florida, where many of the juveniles are based, to Southern California has adversely affected the Barretts team's ability to attract prospects. Lloyd said the sale company can only persevere, and is optimistic of a rebound in the near future.

"Our goal is to grow the catalogue, but you have to sell what you have," he said. "It's tough economic times, and it's expensive to come out here. People are very conservative. In the meantime, we've always sold horses well here, and I suspect we'll build it back up. Our facilities are good and it's fun; I think people really enjoy it."

It was a good weekend for Barretts graduates. May graduate The Factor (War Front) proved two turns were within his wheelhouse in the GII Rebel S. at Oaklawn Park, while Henny Hound (Henny Hughes), a \$200,000 March alum, won Saturday's G3 Falcon S. in Japan. Jerry Bailey, absent from this year's proceedings, sold both horses.

Making the Trip...

Some 2,400 miles separates Ocala from Pomona. In the past, many Florida-based consignors were eager to make the trip, with the promise of showcasing their runners to a local buying bench that included prominent owners like Bob Lewis, The Thoroughbred Corp., and B. Wayne Hughes. With Fasig-Tipton Florida (nee Calder) establishing itself as the premier boutique sale in the nation and OBS March rising in prominence, Barretts March became less of a "must-attend" event, but it still maintains its status as one of the most respected juvenile auctions in the nation, and one that many consignors are intent on supporting. Some of the

most successful consignors at Barretts March over the last decade, for one reason or another, have not made the trip this year--consignors like Murray Smith, who led all sellers a year ago, as well as Jerry Bailey, Excel Bloodstock and Scanlon Training Center. But others, like Becky Thomas's Sequel Bloodstock, Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables and Eddie Woods are once again offering select drafts at March.

"For me, this sale always presents the guy at Santa Anita who just won, and wants to go over and buy another horse," said Sequel Bloodstock's Becky Thomas. "Back east, you might get the California trainers who will come and shop the sales, but you don't necessarily get the owners. Here, it's a 20-minute car ride for them to come over and show their friends and family the horses they're interested in. I think it's something unique to this sale more than any other sale. You have buyers who just won't be at other sales. This is their venue."

Eddie Woods agrees, and said he doesn't think of the costs of coming out here in relation to a single horse's value. "It's just part of the investment; it's part of the maintenance of your whole business," said Woods. "It's part of the cost of doing business at the highest level."

Woods estimates the costs for sending a horse out to Barretts ranges from \$6,000 to \$8,000 per horse.

"It's expensive to come here, so you can only bring what you consider very good," he said. "But you only want to bring the real nice ones anyway, because that's all they really want to buy out here. It's a great marketplace for a nice horse."

Asked if there is a certain type of horse he prefers sending--a fleet sprinter, a rangy router, etc.--Woods said, "It just has to be a good horse. They'll buy both. It's California, so of course they're going to lean toward speed, but if you look in the catalogue, this sale has sold some great horses, and they've been both speed and distance horses. Whether it's two turn or a speed horse, it will have quality."

Ciaran Dunne said he began coming to Barretts in the mid-1990s. "When we first started out, we couldn't compete with the two-year-old consignors in Miami--we just didn't have the stock," he said. "So we started bringing our best horses out here and showcasing them, and through the years, I've done very well out here. I've sold some horses I don't think would have sold if we kept them on the East Coast. We'll bring eight or nine horses here every year. The [track] surface is great, the facilities are second to none, and the people couldn't be nicer. There was always a big buzz about the place, when Mr. Lewis was buying, the Thoroughbred Corp. was buying, and hopefully, they can re-generate some of that."

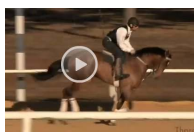
