## WOODS DROPS THE 'POM' ON BARRETT'S

In the days leading up to the Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds, consignor Eddie Woods touted

[hip 37](#), a colt by Pomeroy--Leah's Angel, as one of the best horses he's trained all year. When the straight-talking Irishman speaks, buyers usually listen, and last night, they lined up to take a shot at the strapping colt. Stonestreet Stables

rep John Moynihan, sitting in front in the sales pavilion, proved gamest, just outlasting EQB's Patti Miller to land the horse for a sales-topping \$625,000.

"Eddie has been telling me about this horse since February," said Moynihan. "We bought [MGSW] Kantharos [Lion Heart] from him last year, and we're excited about this horse. He has a great mind, and it looks like you can go right on with him. And Pomeroy's turned out to be a pretty good stallion. He's got a couple of nice runners down in Florida."

By Boundary, sophomore Pomeroy is the sire of a pair of horses who won seven-furlong graded events at Gulfstream: GII Hutcheson S. hero Flashpoint and GII Forward Gal S. heroine Pomeroy's Pistol. He is also the sire of Positive Response, runaway winner of the John Battaglia Memorial S.

A son of Leah's Angel (Caller I.D.), last night's sales topper is a half-sibling to the SP Tontine Too (Concerto), as well as Grade III winner Expect an Angel (Valid Expectations). Bred in Florida by David Robbins, the colt was hammered down to Woods's Quarter Pole Enterprises for \$75,000 at the OBS August Sale last summer. At Friday's breeze show, the bay went an eighth in [:10 1/5](#) and had an especially good gallop-out.

Moynihan was sitting alongside Scott Blasi, assistant to trainer Steve Asmussen, and Moynihan confirmed the horse would join Asmussen's string this year. Moynihan was on the phone with Jess Jackson throughout and, while the winemaker was resolute, his agent admitted to being a bit surprised by the price.

"He was expensive," Moynihan said. "I didn't really expect him to bring that much. But he was kind of a star out here."

Woods also sold [hip 16](#), a colt by Speightstown--Enjoy the Moment (Slew's Royalty), who went to Patti Miller, agent, for \$150,000. The colt had worked an eighth in [:10 flat](#) Friday. **Cont. p2**

Asked if he thought he'd brought the sales topper to Barretts March, Eddie Woods admitted, "As the days went along, no, I didn't. But when I left home, I left thinking I had one of the best, if not the best, horse I've taken to a sale this year. And yes, he sold like the best horse I brought to a sale this year. But it was quite a surprise to me. I thought whoever went north of \$300,000 would own him. But that's the beauty of the thing, when you get two people hooking up like that. It was fantastic."

Despite the big success, Woods said it's still tough out there no matter how hard you work. "Unless you have the likes of those really, really elite horses that the buyers really, really want, it's hard. I'm hoping the April Sale in Ocala is in a different vein. But with the select sale, if you don't have exactly what they want, forget it."

**From the Bayou to Barretts, Heberts Bring the Bling...**

Tens of thousands in the Gulf area were affected by the devastation caused by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita, including Hebert Bloodstock's Jeff Hebert. A lifelong horseman, Hebert had left a 22-year career as a trainer to own and operate a mini-casino with his father on the Texas/Louisiana border. With just 50 machines, the casino was a far cry from the 1,500 machines nearby Delta Downs could boast, but it was popular among truckers and locals. In 2005, however, the worst hurricane season in U.S. history took hold, and when Rita hit the Bayou State a month after Katrina, Hebert and his father found themselves with a building so severely battered that, after 17 months, it still remained shuttered. Finally, the men decided to settle with the insurance company and sell the property.

"My father retired, and I had to get a job," Hebert smiled.

Along with his wife, Kathleen, an accomplished horsewoman, Hebert decided to return to horses full-time. Instead of training at the track, however, Hebert opted to focus on yearling-to-juvenile pinhooking, and in 2007, Hebert Bloodstock brought its first draft to Barretts March.

The group included Polonius (Broken Vow), who went to B. J. Wright/ Bluegrass Industries for \$150,000. Polonius won his debut at Hollywood Park, and took the Pasadena S. at Santa Anita two starts later. He was an 11-1 chance in the 2008 GI Santa Anita Derby, finishing unplaced to Colonel John (Tiznow), but came back in his next start to win the GIII Will Rogers S. for Wright and trainer Michael Pender.

In 2008, the Heberts returned to Barretts March and sold a colt by Stormy Atlantic to Carrol Castille for \$250,000. Named Southern Region, the horse won the 2009 Grand Prairie Turf Challenge S. at Lone Star Park.

With the economy reeling in 2009, the Heberts changed the game plan. "That year, we came out to Hollywood Park with nine 2-year-olds, and just ran them," Jeff Hebert explained. "We sold some that couldn't hang with the California horses, and raced some of the others. It went well.

We sold a horse to John Sadler through the claim box named Ranger Heartly [Lost Soldier] for \$32,000. We recommended the horse to

John--he's a nice guy--because we were fixing to go back to Louisiana, and he dropped a claim in for him. We got beat the day they took him, but John ran him back for \$32,000 and won." Ranger Heartly added victories in starter allowance and allowance company, then made the big jump up to take the 2010 California Derby for Sadler and an ownership group that included Herb Alpert. "It was a nice run for them," said Hebert.

After passing on the March Sale again last year, the Heberts decided to make the trek out for 2011. Last night, they were rewarded when [hip 87](#), a fast-looking son of Too Much Bling--Surf Tide (Valid Expectations) went to Kirkwood Thoroughbreds for \$185,000.

The colt, a bargain \$15,000 TEXAUG yearling, ripped through an eighth in :10 flat and, according to Hebert, galloped out a quarter in :20 4/5--which would have earned him the bullet. The gray colt, named Surf Bling, was produced by a half-sister to SW Moon Kid (Lemon Drop Kid).

Based in Vinton, Louisiana, the Heberts operate a 145-acre farm. "We have 35 stalls, a training track...we just do it all ourselves right there," said Jeff Hebert.

The couple typically breaks and trains 30 to 35 yearlings a year, most of whom will wind up at juvenile sales. "We'll race a few, but we'd rather sell," Hebert explained. "We breed a couple a year, just because the Louisiana-bred program with the slots money is so good. But we prefer to buy short yearlings and yearlings. We buy a double handful every year. We love shopping Keeneland and OBS--we'll hit all the sales--and just look for value. We'll buy as correct a horse as our money will let us, but as far as veterinary work, as we all know, they have to be clean. We bring them home and hope they can stand up to the rigors of these sales. By the time we get to March, after doing our round-robin sprints, they develop a pecking order, and so we know which ones to bring out here and which ones to send to different sales. My wife does all the selection of the yearlings; she's the eyes of Hebert Bloodstock; I'm the mouth."

The Herberts now have another successful Barretts March in the books, but with plenty of life left in the juvenile sales season, there will be no rest for the couple. "We already have 13 yearlings on the farm who will be going to next year's sales," said Hebert.

**EQB Nabs Four-Pack...**

It's safe to say few buyers shopped Barretts March harder than EQB's Patti Miller. With her trusted pooch in tow, she was a constant presence on the backstretch in the day's leading up to the auction, and last night, EQB was just as ubiquitous. Miller, who owns EQB with founder and president Jeff Seder, signed for four horses overall, and was the direct underbidder on the night's \$625,000 Pomeroy topper. **Cont. p4**

EQB's dearest purchase was [hip 72](#), a colt by Tapit--Sawgrass Express (Roman Diplomat) from Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables, who went for \$340,000. The gun-metal gray, a half-brother to SP Daisey Lee (Grand Slam) and produced by a full-sister to MGSW Roman Envoy (Roman Diplomat), breezed an eighth in [:10 1/5](#). Miller declined to name the client EQB was representing.

"We do high-speed film analysis and heart profiles, and though he had a few little things he didn't quite do right back at the barn, he did them right on film," said Miller. "So I had a lot of confidence in him. I thought he was a special Tapit; I really liked this horse. He jumped through all the hoops, and hopefully, he continues on."

EQB also purchased a pair from Eddie Woods's consignment. They were [hip 16](#), a colt by Speightstown--Enjoy the Moment for \$150,000; and [hip 50](#), a filly by Kafwain--Myreeg for \$65,000. The team was also responsible for [hip 52](#), a filly by Harlan's Holiday--Naropa (Pleasant Tap) from the consignment of Becky Thomas's Sequel Bloodstock ([Thorostride video](#)).

Miller said the purchases were made for different clients. Asked if they were shopping for a particular type of horse at Barretts, she said, "We like a horse that will go two turns, but sprinters are nice, too."

Of being the underbidder on the Pomeroy colt, Miller added, "It's tough knocking heads with [John] Moynihan. I thought he was an exceptional horse. If he wasn't by Pomeroy, who knows that he would have brought. But, you know, the Pomeroy's have been running, and he was a fantastic individual. John knows what he's looking at."

With numbers up from 2010, Barretts officials were happy with the results of last night's auction. "There was a great energy from the beginning right through the end," said Vice President of Sales Kim Lloyd, who noted the participation of EQB's Patti Miller, as well as myriad Japanese buyers, who accounted for 11 purchases on the evening. "We're grateful every year they come in here, but to come in this year, it really means a lot," said Lloyd, who also felt the move to a night session in 2011 was the right decision. "It seems to bring a little intensity to things, for some reason," he said.

**Bold Silvano Out of World Cup...**

South African Group 1 winner **Bold Silvano (SAf)** (Silvano {Ger}), winner of the G3 Maktoum Challenge-Round 2 Feb. 11, has suffered a minor injury and will be forced to miss the Mar. 26 G1 Dubai World Cup. According to trainer Mike de Kock, "He worked well yesterday, but seems to have tweaked or pulled something. We cannot actually put our finger on it immediately, but it is enough to rule him out." De Kock added, "It is a great shame as he is a genuine [Dubai] World Cup horse. It has not been easy with him this season, but we will be back next year. At least we have back-up in the shape of **Golden Sword (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}), who will take his place." Golden Sword, runner-up in the 2009 G1 Irish Derby, has won two in a row at Meydan, a handicap Feb. 10 and a conditions race eight days later. "It is no secret that we wanted to run Golden Sword in the Dubai World Cup, as has been a revelation on the all-weather," de Kock said. "He is working very well and certainly seems to be back to something like his best. His form in Europe suggests he will handle conditions."

**Fly Down Tests Meydan Surface...**

GII Dwyer S. winner **Fly Down (Mineshaft)**, who will make his synthetic bow in Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup, galloped over the track Monday morning. "He's never run on anything but the dirt," said exercise rider Tiffany Green, who accompanied the Nick Zito trainee to Dubai. "He seems to love [Meydan]. He seems to be skipping over it, but you never know until they run on it." Green added that the overseas trip took little out of her charge. "He shipped perfectly," she said. "They said he was perfect on the plane. He ate up everything. He was the first one off the first van and he strutted off there liked he owned the place. The first day out of quarantine, I wanted to take him to the track and jog him a turn, but he was too full of himself, so I jogged a half-turn and turned around and galloped a bit." Green added, "He'll keep galloping, and then he'll gate school Thursday or Friday, and wait for race day." Second in the G1 Belmont S. and G1 Travers S. and third in the G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup and G1 Breeders' Cup Classic, 4-year-old finished fifth in the Feb. 5 G1 Donn H. in his 2011 debut.

**Gitano Hernando Sold...**

Team Valor and Gary Barber's **Gitano Hernando (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}), winner of the 2009 GI Goodwood S. at Santa Anita, has been sold to Chechen President Ramzan Kadyrov in a deal believed to be in the region of \$4 million, according to *Racing Post*. The deal was brokered by bloodstock agent Robert Harrison and the G1 Dubai World Cup hopeful will remain in the care of Newmarket-based Italian Marco Botti for the Meydan feature before transferring to conditioner Herman Brown. "I will be sad to lose Gitano Hernando because he is the stable star," Botti told the trade daily. "He has taken us all over the world, winning in America and Ireland, but he will still run for me in the Dubai World Cup. I am certainly very happy with him, and hopefully, he will run well." Harrison added, "My owner is passionate about racing and is looking to build a bigger string in England this year to go back to Dubai. A couple of them will be campaigned at the big meetings, for example [Kadyrov's] Mikhail Glinka (Ire) [Galileo {Ire}], who will be targeted at the [G1] Ascot Gold Cup."

were 24 meters out onto the course, was 1:12. Irish jockey Tadhg O'Shea was in the saddle. Harty is confident the 6-year-old will be a factor Saturday. "His style of running is conducive to the way they run here," he said. "He can sprint to the wire with the best of them." The dark bay was third in the Feb. 5 GIII Thunder Road H. last time out.

**Sweet Ducky Settling in...**

**Sweet Ducky** (Pulpit), purchased by Chechen President Ramzan Kadyrov from George and Lori Hall after finishing second in the Jan. 30 GIII Holy Bull S., is settling into his new surroundings at Meydan. While new trainer Herman Brown described the 3-year-old as "babyish and immature," he added that the dark bay is acclimating well. "He seems to have traveled well and he's eating and drinking well," Brown remarked. "He's tall and leggy, and with maturity he could be a really good horse." The colt, prepping for the G2 UAE Derby, will breeze 800 meters Tuesday. "We're just learning as we go along with him, as he just arrived here last week," Brown said. "We'll see more tomorrow. I basically just want to help the horse keep doing well and take our chances that way rather than stressing him."

Courtlandt Farm's homebred **Machen** (Distorted Humor) worked four furlongs yesterday at Fair Grounds in :48 flat and galloped out five furlongs in 1:02.20. Jockey Edgar Prado, who flew in from Florida for the work, was in the irons for trainer Neil Howard. "He's a very nice horse," Prado said. "He's a very athletic horse and he galloped out real nice for me. It's always good to get on a horse before you ride him in a race to learn any little thing you can about the horse, like if he tries to duck in or get out on you, but I had no problems with this horse." Machen, who was tabbed a ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ after a five-length allowance win Jan. 30, was fourth in the Feb. 19 GII Risen Star S. He is the 7-2 second choice on the morning line for Saturday's GII Louisiana Derby.

Neil Howard also sent out Gaillardia Racing's **Wilkinson** (Lemon Drop Kid) to work a half-mile in preparation for the Louisiana Derby. The colt, off since winning the Jan. 22 Gill LeComte S. covered the distance, in company, in :48.29 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:01.20. "I am pleased with both of them and the way they are coming up to the Louisiana Derby," Howard reported. "They both went nice and both worked about the same. We didn't want to ship them anywhere. It's nice to be able to stay in your own backyard and when they made this race a mile and an eighth last year, they did me a big favor." Also working a half-mile for the Louisiana Derby yesterday at Fair Grounds: **Majestic Harbor** (Rockport Harbor) went in :50.80; **Mavericking** (Empire Maker) went in :48.60; and **Liondrive** (Lion Tamer) went in :48.80. **Populist Politics** (Don't Get Mad), entered in both the Louisiana Derby and Friday's Crescent City Derby, worked five furlongs in 1:00.20.

**Inglorious Drills for Fair Grounds Oaks**

Donver Stable's **Inglorious** (Hennessy), the 3-1 morning-line favorite for Saturday's Gill Fair Grounds Oaks, breezed a half-mile at Fair Grounds yesterday in :49. "We got everything we wanted," trainer Josie Carroll said after the drill. "She was spot-on today." The Canadian-bred filly debuted with a win in the Fanfreluche S. at Woodbine last October and added the Ontario Lassie S. in December. She suffered her first defeat when second in the Feb. 19 Gill Rachel Alexandra S. last time out. Also working for the Fair Grounds Oaks yesterday, **Tapit Dancer** (Tapit), sixth in the Rachel Alexandra, went four furlongs in :50.60.

When I visited Airdrie Stud to see the stallions in the summer of 2008, I inspected Indian Charlie, Harlan's Holiday, Badge of Silver, Flashy Bull, Friends Lake, Include, Stevie Wonderboy and the newly arrived Brother Derek. I also looked at Gone West's sons Proud Citizen and Istan, the latter having recently completed his first season. I must admit, though, that a third son of Gone West, Canadian Frontier, received a much more cursory look--a quick glance as I walked past his stall.

The Jockey Club's figures suggest I was by no means the first (or the last) person to have ignored Canadian Frontier. Although he covered 65 mares in each of his first two seasons, his book fell to 39 mares in his third year, and he had covered no more than 45 mares in 2008. Worse was to follow. Only 11 mares headed his way in 2009, followed by 23 last year.

However, it's a safe bet that this inexpensive stallion will be setting personal-best figures this year, as the 43 named foals in his second crop include those excellent fillies No Such Word and Hilda's Passion. No Such Word made such significant progress throughout 2010 that she notched up five stakes victories, including the GI Gazelle S., and Hilda's Passion is proving similarly progressive. She was recording her third graded success when she easily outpaced the opposition in Saturday's GII Inside Information S.

So why did Canadian Frontier struggle for attention? Part of the explanation must be that he was just one of numerous sons of Gone West available in Kentucky when he started out in 2005. At an initial fee of \$10,000, he wasn't in the same price bracket as the likes of Elusive Quality, Grand Slam, Mr. Greeley and Speightstown, all of whom commanded fees between \$100,000 and \$40,000. However, he faced stiff opposition on his own doorstep from Proud Citizen, who was priced at \$17,500. Whereas Proud Citizen was a Grade II winner good enough to finish second in the Kentucky Derby and third in the Preakness, Canadian Frontier's record didn't meet some of the requirements which go to make a fashionable stallion.



**Pedigree Insights cont.**

He hadn't raced at two, and failed to reach the first three in a pair of starts at three. Although he won one of three starts at four, he didn't enjoy a full campaign until he was five, when he made up for last time with five victories. All three of his stakes successes came over six furlongs, a distance he covered in 1:08.97 in the Gill Bold Ruler H. Proud Citizen, with more precocity and two-turn appeal to his name, has inevitably proved the more popular of the two.

Canadian Frontier carried the colors of Mrs. Joyce Robsham to his stakes successes, having initially raced for Godolphin, both in the U.S. and Dubai. Of course, he isn't the first late-blossoming sprinter to have made an impact as a stallion--two others who didn't become stakes winners before they were five being Forest Wildcat and Speightstown.

There is no denying that Canadian Frontier is bred well enough to make a successful stallion. Along with fellow Grade I sires Lemon Drop Kid, Stormy Atlantic, Stormin Fever, Cape Town, Mutakddim, Offlee Wild, American Chance, Patton and Glen Jordan, Canadian Frontier is out of a daughter of the great Seattle Slew. His dam, Borodislew, was no ordinary daughter of the 1977 Triple Crown winner. A Group 3 winner over seven furlongs in France at three, Borodislew later added Grade II and Grade III victories over a mile and a sixteenth while carrying the colors of Marshall Naify. She sold for \$750,000 at Naify's dispersal in 2000.

Canadian Frontier's second dam Breath Taking established herself as one of Nureyev's fastest daughters--and earned a Timeform rating of 119--with a pair of group wins at around six furlongs in France. Breath Taking no doubt inherited much of the speed that had brought her dam, Cap d'Antibes, victories in two of Australia's premier sprints--the Lightning S. and Newmarket H.

Canadian Frontier's bloodlines seem to be standing him in good stead. No Such Word is the first black-type performer among her dam's first eight named foals and Hilda's Passion is also the first black-type performer for her dam Executricker, but from a smaller sample of four. Executricker, a winner on turf at four, is by Sadler's Wells's son El Prado. Gone West had a disappointing record with broodmares by Sadler's Wells, but El Prado mares are shaping up quite well with Gone West's sons. There is another graded winner--Lady Digby--by Grand Slam and the champion sprinter Speightstown also has a stakes winner, making three stakes winners among the first 28 foals by sons of Gone West out of daughters of El Prado.

Executricker's yearling price of \$150,000 was a reflection of a strong female line. Hilda's Passion's fourth dam Lost Virtue started a family that has done sterling work in recent years, principally for Juddmonte. Lost Virtue is also the third dam of Twice Over, one of the leading hopes for this week's Dubai World Cup, and her other descendants include the Group 1 winners Passage of Time, All At Sea and Banshee Breeze.

I've been in racing and breeding for more than 48 years. Most racehorse owners are responsible. Let's not rush to judgment about the TRF. They are people who are trying to do the right thing. We hope Joe Drape's piece will serve the purpose of galvanizing and motivating all participants in the proud sport of horse racing and move us onward and upward.

**Eastern Tent Caterpillar Hatch in Central Kentucky:**

*(Edited press release)* Experts report that eastern tent caterpillar eggs have begun hatching in Central Kentucky. While it is too early to tell what 2011 levels will be, populations have been gradually increasing over the past several years. According to Lee Townsend, University of Kentucky College of Agriculture entomologist, the newly hatched eggs, which were laid last June, are easy to identify by the small holes tiny larva chew as they exit. In about two weeks, the tents should be about the size of a baseball and easy to spot in trees. Townsend urged horse farms to check wild cherry and related trees for eastern tent caterpillar activity to determine whether management is necessary. If control measures are needed to reduce numbers, steps should be taken before the caterpillars leave their trees. "The small caterpillars will stay near the egg mass for a short time before moving to feed on expanding leaves. Eggs will continue to hatch through early April," Townsend said. Controlling eastern tent caterpillars is vital to area horse farms, as UK research has strongly linked the caterpillars with outbreaks of Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome, which can cause late-term foal losses, early-term fetal losses and weak foals. During the 2001-2002 MRLS outbreak, an estimated 30 percent of that year's Thoroughbred foal crop was lost. The state suffered an economic loss of approximately \$336 million in all breeds of horses. Studies since the 2001-2002 outbreak subsequently have revealed that horses inadvertently will eat the caterpillars and the caterpillar hairs embed into the lining of the alimentary tract. Once that protective barrier is breached, normal alimentary tract bacteria may gain access to and reproduce in sites with reduced immunity, such as the fetus and placenta. Fetal death from these alimentary tract bacteria is the hallmark of MRLS. UK entomologists recommend that unless horse farm managers have been aggressive in managing eastern tent caterpillars, or removing host trees, they should keep pregnant mares out of pastures bordered by cherry trees or other hosts for the next several weeks. Townsend offered the following recommendations for controlling moderate to large caterpillar populations if horses cannot be moved to avoid possible exposure. "Foliar sprays for caterpillar control can be made when tents are about the size of a baseball. Another option is the injection of trees with a systemic insecticide by commercial pesticide applicators or arborists. Regardless of the treatment used, it is important to revisit the sites in about five days to assess caterpillar activity," he said.

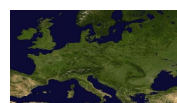

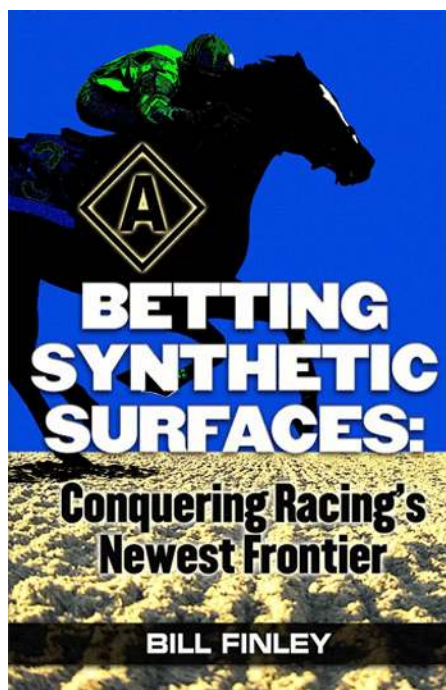
