It was good to be an Irish-bred consignor at Monday evening's Barretts March Sale of Selected

Two-Year-Olds in Pomona, California. Eddie Woods sold the top-priced horse of the sale, a \$625,000 Pomeroy colt who went to Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stable, while the next three highest prices, and five of the top nine, were members of Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables draft.

A gray colt from the first crop of GISW Corinthian (Pulpit) led the charge for Dunne, eliciting a bid of \$380,000 from Emmanuel de Seroux's Narvick International. The colt, [hip 30](#), is a son of MSW Hollow Miss (With Approval) and thus a half-sibling to GSW He's Got Grit (Songandaprayer) and SP Take the Money (Silver Charm). He was the second-highest-priced horse at Barretts.

Model (Petionville) and SW Mambo Train (Kingmambo), the dark bay colt went for \$290,000.

Meanwhile, EQB's Patti Miller purchased the Wavertree-consigned [hip 72](#), a colt by Tapit--Sawgrass Express (Roman Diplomat), for \$340,000. Buzz Chace, agent

for West Point Thoroughbreds, saw fit to go to \$210,000 for [hip 102](#), a California-bred Rock Hard Ten--Barbara Orr (Tale of the Cat) colt, while [hip 100](#), a colt by Successful Appeal--Affairs of State (Deputy Minister) sold to Yoshiji Seki for \$160,000.

Gio Ponti Settling In...

Three-time champion **Gio Ponti** (Tale of the Cat), fourth in last year's G1 Dubai World Cup, toured the Meydan paddock yesterday before having a jog and a gallop. The 6-year-old is acclimating to his surroundings, according to Christophe Lorieul, assistant to trainer Christophe Clement. "We took a couple of turns with the pony and he was very good in the paddock," said Lorieul, who rode the bay. "He was happy today--he didn't sweat as much." Lorieul added, "He has traveled better this year and has kept his condition. Last year, he lost a lot more weight [on the trip to Dubai]. Every day now he seems to be getting better and better." Lorieul added Gio Ponti may have "an easy piece of work" Wednesday. **Cont. p4**

Enjoying in the success was Dapple Bloodstock's Mike Akers, a longtime partner with Dunne who co-owned the Corinthian, Indian Charlie and Tapit colts. Akers signed for the Corinthian colt for \$130,000 at last summer's FTKJUL sale. He purchased the Tapit colt for \$60,000 at KEESEP, and the Indian Charlie colt for \$105,000. For a combined \$295,000 in yearling prices, the trio generated \$1,010,000 as juveniles. Of course, the success of these horses likely paid for a few who didn't quite hit the mark, but it was a remarkable night for the partners, nonetheless.

"We have a team that deserves a lot of credit," said Akers. "Amy Dunne, Ciaran's wife, is a big part of it. She does a lot of the pre-work. She goes out and sorts through them before Ciaran and I ever look at them. So there are a lot of people in the pipeline who deserve credit. Ciaran and I are more visible than most of them, but there are a lot of people who help put the show on. We go through a lot of preliminaries to get here; it didn't happen overnight."

Akers said he wasn't surprised by the attention the horses garnered...or their resulting price tags. "Not at all—I thought that was fair market value," he said. "Listen, the California market is not going to dry up and blow away. There are a lot of people out here that love racing, they want to race, they want nice stock, and I'm not shocked some of these horses sold very well. But they weren't cheap horses to buy [as yearlings]. We try to buy enough horse where, if we buck a shin or don't make a sale, we're not scared to run one occasionally. So when we buy a horse, we're fully prepared to put the tack on him. These horses all jumped through the hoops and ended up at this sale. They did things the right way—they breezed well, they showed well, and the top buyers loved them. Mr. Dunne and his staff are the ones to be congratulated."

While Dunne and Akers have been in the trenches together for some time now, a new partner in the group is Cory Wagner, who along with his wife Heidi operates Affirmed Investment Corp. Wagner had an interest in the Corinthian topper, as well as the Indian Charlie and Successful Appeal colts. Wagner signed for the latter for \$50,000 at KEESEP.

Wagner is in his second year of yearling-to-juvenile pinhooking. He met Dunne a few years ago at Keeneland, and in 2009 purchased three yearlings. He paid \$50,000 for Indian Winter (Indian Charlie), who sold to Jerry Hollendorfer for \$125,000 at the 2010 OBSMAR sale. Indian Winter was third to J P's Gusto (Successful Appeal) in the GI Del Mar Futurity last year and more recently won the San Pedro S. at Santa Anita Jan. 17.

maiden at Santa Anita Feb. 3 and was beaten just 3/4 lengths as the favorite in the Borderland Derby at Sunland Feb. 26. Wagner kept and raced the third prospect.

"Those horses did fairly well, so this past Keeneland September, my wife and I took the plunge and spent a significant amount of money buying horses," Wagner explained Monday evening at Barretts. "We purchased 12, I think, in all. We don't own all 12 outright. We partnered with Dapple Bloodstock and with Ciaran on some. But we owned five or six on our own."

Based in Edmonton, Canada, Wagner co-founded the internet site Investopedia.com, which in 2007 he sold to Forbes for an undisclosed amount.

"I was lucky enough to make some money and invest some of it in the horses," he said.

Asked how he got into racing, Wagner laughed. "My dad dragged me to the track when I was a kid, but my wife's family is really involved in breeding and racing in Alberta, Canada," he explained. "So when I married my wife, I kind of married into it." **Cont. p3**



Wagner is also involved in the racing game. He has 25-30 horses in training, roughly half of them with California-based trainer Mark Glatt.

“One of my first horses I actually claimed off of Bob Baffert,” said Wagner. “His name was Chief’s Magic [Chief Seattle]. We claimed him [for \$62,500] and brought him right up to Canada and he won two \$50,000 stakes races. That was hook, line and sinker for me. He’s still racing for us, actually.”

Wagner said he loves racing, but that pinhooking appeals to his business acumen. “For me, if you can buy a yearling and sell it as a two-year-old for X-percent gain, for me, that’s the model,” he said. “When you buy a horse and have the advantage of training the horse, knowing whether he can go long or short, knowing if he’s sound or not, then setting a price on him. If he sells, great, but I don’t mind keeping and racing if I have to.”

Good Night for Upstart Callaway...

Callaway Thoroughbreds set sail on its maiden voyage at Barretts March, and though it was a mixed bag for the consignment, Dan Northrup’s operation enjoyed a few nice scores. They included [hip 99](#), a colt by Bluegrass Cat--Above the Line (Easy Goer) who went to Highland Yard LLC for \$115,000. The Utah-based Northrup had purchased the colt for just \$8,000 at the Fasig-Tipton October Yearling Sale.

Northrup owns eight inspection stations near Salt Lake called Emissions Plus. He began as an owner of Quarter Horses, and dabbled in Thoroughbreds for a number of years before making a more serious investment about four years ago in the yearling-to-juvenile pinhooking game. He and varied partners typically purchased between eight and 10 yearlings a year, and offered them through consignments including BC3 Thoroughbreds, Bruno de Berdt and Rudy Delguidice’s Excel Bloodstock, and Andy Havens’s Havens Bloodstock.

This year, he decided to strike out on his own as Callaway.

“I’m a big golfer,” he explained, referring to the club manufacturer Callaway Golf. “I use Taylor Made clubs, too, but...”

Northrup’s past successes include Miss Heather Lee (Trippi), offered by Excel at Barretts March in 2009, but bought back for \$60,000. Northrup put her into training with Adam Kitchingman, and, after she broke her maiden second time out in a \$100,000 maiden claimer at Del Mar, sold her privately to a client of trainer Bob Baffert. She quickly added a first-level allowance race, then ran second to Blind Luck (Pollard’s Vision) in the GI Hollywood Starlet. **Cont. p4**

Northrup said he prefers to sell, but will race if necessary. "That's actually what happened with Miss Heather Lee," he said. "We led her up to the ring and I was selling her to break even--it wasn't like I really wanted to race. But she was just too nice a horse [to sell cheaply]. Everything's for sale. But if we have to keep one and race, that's fine."

Northrup estimates his biggest sale to date is Solar Rocket (Songandaprayer), a \$50,000 yearling he resold to Duck Riber Farm for \$170,000 at Barretts March. Solar Rocket won his second career start at Santa Anita in January of 2009, then after missing some time, finished second in allowance races at Churchill in November and Santa Anita in January.

Coming into Barretts, Callaway joined forces with Red Rock Training Stables, another Utah-based outfit that breaks and trains his yearlings.

"This was my first year, so it was better for me to piggyback on the staff that they have, and it worked out well," Northrup said. "[Red Rock] is based down in St. George, Utah, which is down in the southern part of the state near Nevada. It's very warm, they rarely get a freeze there, and they have a very nice track."

Asked about what he and his buying team typically look for in a pinhooking prospect, he said, "Most of the time we just buy the horse, and if the pedigree's there, then we just pay a little more for it," he said. "We just want them to look good, walk good, and have a good mind." Northrup's goals in the business are pretty straightforward. "I just want to sell nice horses, make a little bit of money and have fun," he said. "I do it mostly for fun. If I make money, that's a bonus. It's enjoyable, and it keeps me looking for what's around the next corner. It's exciting."

Callaway has two horses catalogued at Keeneland April, but will most likely offer its next draft at Barretts May.

If At First You Don't Succeed...

Juddmonte's **Twice Over (GB)** (Observatory) was a troubled 10th in the World Cup last year, but his connections are confident he will turn in a better effort Saturday night. Freshened up after successfully defending his title in the G1 Champion S. at Newmarket in October, the 6-year-old was a smooth winner over this course and distance in the G2 Al Maktoum Challenge - Round 3 Mar. 3. "He is grand and is in good form," said regular rider Tom Queally. "He just did a routine piece of work [Tuesday] morning, and quickened down the straight. It is a case of so far, so good, and he seems happy in himself, which is the main thing. He was a good winner last time out and he quickened up well. He seems to have tightened up since then, and we just need a bit of luck now. He will have a blow out this Friday, and that will get him to the race."

Sumii Hopeful of World Cup 'Victoire'...

Japanese trainer Katsuhiko Sumii sent out his two runners, World Cup contender **Victoire Pisa (Jpn)** (Neo Universe {Jpn}) and G1 Dubai Sheema Classic hopeful **Rulership (Jpn)** (King Kamehameha {Jpn}) for a 1200-meter drill yesterday morning. Victoire Pisa is one of three Japanese challengers for Saturday's main event, along with Buena Vista (Jpn) (Special Week {Jpn}) and Transcend (Jpn) (Wild Rush), and Sumii thinks he's learned something from his former stable star **Vodka (Jpn)** (Tanino Gimlet {Jpn}), who came up short in three Dubai appearances. Victoire Pisa, who defeated Buena Vista in the G1 Arima Kinen Dec. 26, tuned up for his big trip with a win in the G2 Nakayama Kinen Feb. 27. "Vodka had a preparation to step up for the Dubai World Cup meetings, and I thought it would be better for two of my horses to have a preparation race before the big race," Sumii said. "Victoire Pisa may go to Hong Kong after Dubai this year, and also Rulership and Buena Vista have the same owners [Sunday Racing]--because of the travelling expenses, we decided to ship to Dubai all together. Rulership and Victoire Pisa had good step-up races at home, which is good. All of the members from Japan feel that we must work together for the victory, and give all of the victims of the earthquake-triggered tsunami hope." Sumii added, "Since Victoire Pisa got to Dubai, he has had three steady gallops at Meydan, so he has become more muscular physically. Rulership always shows flexible strides and runs very lightly, and I think he took to the all-weather surface. They run in different races, so I decided to have them gallop together."

'Pegasus' Ready to Fly in Sheema Classic...

Arturo Vargas and Diamond A Racing Corporation's **Champ Pegasus** (Fusaichi Pegasus) will get another crack at his GI Breeders' Cup Turf conqueror **Dangerous Midge** (Lion Heart) in Saturday's G1 Dubai Sheema Classic. The bay will likely employ different tactics this weekend, having attempted to make all the running at Churchill. "I thought if I take him back behind this pace, they are going to be walking, and he'll never have a chance to give it a go, so we put him on the lead, and he ran great," trainer Richard Mandella explained. "[Jockey Frankie] Dettori [on Dangerous Midge] rode a great race that day. He'd pressure us a little bit, then let him alone. Then he'd pressure us, just so he wouldn't relax. Then he came the last time, and my horse said, 'That's enough.'" Champ Pegasus opened 2011 with a second to fellow Sheema challenger **Bourbon Bay** (Sligo Bay {Ire}) in the GII San Marcos S. Jan. 18, but turned the tables on that rival in the GII San Luis Obispo S. Feb. 19. "I think his race the other day shows that he really does want to be taken hold of," Mandella added. Dettori will ride Godolphin's **Rewilding (GB)** (Tiger Hill {Ire})--a half-brother to last year's Sheema Classic heroine **Dar Re Mi (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire})--in Saturday's \$5-million event, so Martin Dwyer will take over on Dangerous Midge.

Ready to Jet...

South African champion **J J the Jet Plane (SAf)** (Jet Master {SAf}) blew out down the Meydan stretch yesterday. "He'll do the same on Thursday," said trainer Michael Houdalakis. Having captured the G1 Hong Kong Sprint in December, the 7-year-old was a bit rusty when 11th in a local Tapeta handicap in February, but turned things around with a 1200-meter victory on the turf Mar. 10 "He needed his first run here, and I'd have been disappointed if he hadn't won next time," his trainer added. "He's very well, and my only concern is the distance--maybe 1000 meters is a little on the short side for him these days."

Two Looking to Give 'Moore' a Big Win...

Trainer John Moore, so successful at his Sha Tin base, is still looking for his first international Group 1 victory, and will saddle **Dim Sum (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) and **Sunny King (Ire)** (Desert Sun {GB}) in Saturday's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen in an attempt to correct that oversight. Moore previously sent Viva Pataca (GB) (Marju {Ire}) out to a runner-up finish in the 2008 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, while his One World (Aus)

(Danehill Dancer {Ire}) was third in last year's Golden Shaheen. "It's a monkey that I really need to get off my back," Moore acknowledged. "I've had several runners run very well overseas without winning, and it's something that I feel I am going to achieve sooner or later. I would love if it was in Dubai this weekend." Dim Sum, a 7-year-old, captured the Chairman's Sprint Prize in February for the second time, while Sunny King,

aged eight, has given top Hong Kong runner Beauty Flash (NZ) (Golan {Ire}) a run for his money in his last two starts. "I can't really explain how or why they have reached such a level of form at their age," Moore offered. "Dim Sum seemed out of sorts last season, and the only thing I did was to move him to a different stable in the barn. He is now beside Viva Pataca, so maybe some of the champ's old magic has rubbed off on him! As for Sunny King, he has always been very consistent, but has somehow upped his game recently. He should be well-suited to the Tapeta surface, because he won four times on the Polytrack at Lingfield, a left-handed track like Meydan, including a listed race over 1400 meters, before we bought him to race in Hong Kong." Rider Darren Beadman, who sustained an ankle injury in Hong Kong last Sunday, will be in his usual spot aboard Dim Sum. "Darren was pretty badly bruised, but he will be okay for Saturday night," Moore added. "He wants to win this race as badly as I do, and it's nice to be going there with two decent each-way chances." Dim Sum himself is unscathed as well. "Dim Sum sustained a cut to his knee on the flight over from Hong Kong so he needed to do some easier work [Tuesday]," Moore pointed out. "It's nothing serious, and has not needed suturing or anything like that, and I expect he will be out on the all-weather track [Wednesday]. They have both drawn well in low-to-middle gates, and there should be plenty of speed in the race to suit them. I had One World run third in this race last year, and I feel either of these two could match that or, with some luck, even do better."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters.

Bob Back in Dubai With Euroears...

Trainer Bob Baffert, who won a pair of Dubai World Cups with Silver Charm (Silver Buck) and Captain Steve (Fly So Free), is back in the Emirate for the first time since the latter's win a decade ago. A lot has changed since then, and the Hall of Fame conditioner was trying to get his bearings in Meydan. "I was wandering around the grandstand when I heard a security guard say, 'Excuse me, sir. Can I see some identification?'" Baffert related. "I said, 'You're looking at it. It's my hair.'"

The affable trainer was impressed with the new facility. "This place is just awesome," he reflected. "You see pictures of the grandstand, but you can't actually appreciate it until you're here. You could fit my whole hometown of Nogales, Arizona, inside that place--all the people of Nogales could live in there--it's unbelievable." Baffert went up to the grandstand's fifth floor to observe his G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen contender **Euroears** (Langfuhr) breeze 600 meters in :35.26. "I just wanted to give him a little spin out there," said the silver-haired conditioner, while pointing out his simple strategy for Saturday night. "He's one dimensional; he goes to the lead and stays there." In his first start for Baffert, the muscular Euroears ran his rivals off their feet in the GII Palos Verdes S. at Santa Anita Jan. 22. "I was debating on whether to come or not, but I decided I was going to go because this is a really nice horse," Baffert said. "And it's good to be back."



Derby Edge to the Fair Sex...

Three fillies are set to take on the boys in the \$2-million G2 UAE Derby Saturday night, including trainer Mike de Kock's Galileo (Ire) twosome of **Mahbooba (Aus)** and **Reem (Aus)**, as well as Godolphin's **Khawlah (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) from the Saeed bin Suroor shedrow. In her first start on Tapeta, Khawlah trumped Mahbooba in the G3 UAE Oaks Feb. 24. "We were not surprised, because she is tough and strong," said bin Suroor. "I am really happy with her, and she has a good chance--maybe the best chance." In addition to Reem and Mahbooba, de Kock will lead over **Zanzamar (SAf)** (Fort Wood), who was second to **Splash Point** (Street Cry {Ire}) last out in the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas Feb. 10. "I maintain the fillies are better than the colts this year, and we have two of the best," de Kock affirmed. "Mahbooba will appreciate a good gallop, but does have to reverse form with Khawlah. "Reem has been a superstar and is tough. She will run well, while Zanzamar is another who will be wanting a fast pace, as stamina is his game." Reem, like Mahbooba a homebred of Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum, trumped the boys last out in the Listed Al Bastakiya S. Mar. 3 in her fourth Carnival start.


Revenge Served Up...

I Want Revenge (Stephen Got Even), infamously scratched on the morning of 2009 GI Kentucky Derby, will be looking to get back in the headlines after Saturday's G2 Godolphin Mile. Together with stablemate--and G2 Al Quoz Sprint hopeful--**Stradivinsky** (Stravinsky), the 5-year-old is under the watchful eye of conditioner Rick Dutrow Jr.'s assistant Michelle Nevin, as well as his brother and fellow trainer Chip. In 2008, Dutrow fielded G1 Golden Shaheen hero Benny the Bull (Lucky Lionel) and G2 Godolphin Mile victor Diamond Stripes (Notebook). "My brother Rick's not coming, because I took his ticket," Chip Dutrow quipped. "When he asked me, I said 'I'm going this time.' I missed my chance to come to Dubai a few years back, so I said, 'Man, now's the time, I'm gonna go check it out.' I wanted to go last time with Benny the Bull and Diamond Stripes, but I couldn't get my passport done in time, so I missed a party there." I Want Revenge made two starts as a 4-year-old, finishing third in both the GII Suburban H. and GIII Philip Iselin H. last summer. In his lone appearance since, the dark bay was part of a three-way photo when fourth in the GI Donn H. Feb. 5. "He needed the run," said Nevin. "He's got no issues, and came out of it well."

MACHO MAN IN LOUISIANA

Mucho Macho Man (Macho Uno) heads into GII Louisiana Derby as the likely favorite, and is expected to use the nine-furlong test as springboard for the May 7 GI Kentucky Derby. The recipe for success Saturday appears to be a simple one for trainer Kathy Ritvo. "Hopefully he'll get a good break and Rajiv [Maragh] will find a good spot for him," explained Ritvo. "Hopefully, Rajiv will find himself in a good position when he comes out of the gate and he can make one run." The six-week gap between the two Derbies poses little concern for Ritvo, who confirmed the sophomore has been progressing very well since his victory in the Feb. 19 GII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds. "I'm not sure exactly what we're going to do with him, we will have to get creative [with his training]," said Ritvo. "He's a very nice, laid back horse, so he can handle it. He's ready."

Prior to his Fair Grounds score, Ritvo opted to remove the blinkers from her colt's racing apparel, which proved to be the winning move race day. "I think removing the blinkers made a big difference," she said. "I think he got to relax a lot more." Explaining the decision, Ritvo offered, "He's much more mature now, and I thought he could handle it." Mucho Macho Man graduated at third asking in a Monmouth maiden Sept. 19 before finishing second behind To Honor and Serve (Bernardini) in a pair of starts at the Big A, including the Nov. 27 GII Remsen S. Prior to his New Orleans victory, the colt was fourth behind Dialed In (Mineshaft) in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 30. "He has a huge stride and a very strong horse," Ritvo said. "Hopefully, he will reach his peak at the right time." Enjoying the ride with her current stable star, Ritvo, who received a heart transplant in 2008, "I appreciate everything he's given us and I appreciate all the time I get to spend with him."

Astrology Looking to Get on Track in Seasonal Debut...

Stonestreet Stables and George Bolton's **Astrology** (A.P. Indy) makes his highly anticipated return to the races in Sunday's GIII Sunland Derby at Sunland Park. The colt, a maiden winner at the Spa last September, was a good-looking 2 3/4-length winner in Churchill's one-mile GIII Iroquois S. later in the fall, but had to play bridesmaid in his seasonal finale in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Nov. 27. Sent West for his winter campaign, Astrology didn't quite enjoy the smoothest schedule back to the races. "When we sent him out to California, the original plan was to send him to the [GII] San Felipe S. [in February]," explained trainer Steve Asmussen. "But once he got [to California], he was under the weather, not really himself, which set us back a couple of weeks. Then, it was very rainy over there, so we are later with him than we had originally scheduled for bringing him back." Despite the setbacks, Asmussen thinks the colt has the quality to shine Sunday. "He's a graded-stakes winning colt with a tremendous pedigree," he said. "It is an ambitious place to start him back, but I feel very good about the health and condition of the horse." Asked about returning against competitive company off the layoff, Asmussen admitted, "It is a tall order, bringing him back in an \$800,000 stakes and going nine furlongs, but he ran in a pair of two-turn races last year, and handled them well. Also the timing and the distance of the Sunland Derby fits well. Sunland is a very similar racetrack to Santa Anita, and without running in the San Felipe, the only race left in Southern California was the [GI] Santa Anita Derby. I thought this was a better option for him." In his latest morning work, the colt went seven furlongs in 1:25 1/5 Mar. 15. "I liked the work that he put in the morning and he is coming into this race very well. I think a lot of our questions will be answered Sunday."

In related news, the Stonestreet/Asmussen axis is also responsible for last Saturday's **"TDN Rising Star"** **Maclean's Music** (Distorted Humor), who galloped home a seven-length winner at Santa Anita. Named for Jess Jackson and Barbara Banke's grandson, the son of GSW Forest Music (Unbridled's Song) registered the highest Beyer for a debut winner since the statistical figure's inception. While the team has high hopes for his future, Asmussen was in no hurry to decide the colt's next start. "We're just going to follow the same formula that we used to get him ready for his start--that is just run him when he's ready. I'm very pleased with how he came out of his race." As for what lies ahead in the immediate future, Asmussen added, "He will go back to the track this week, and if everything goes well, he will have his first breeze back Monday. Then the discussions will begin."

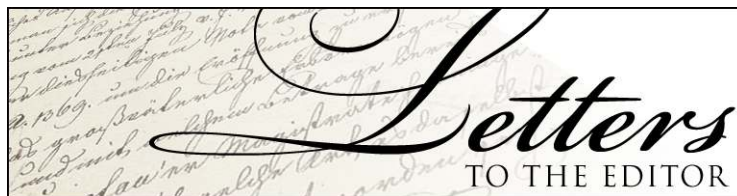

NO APRIL RACING AT NAKAYAMA,

FUKUSHIMA The Japan Racing Association has cancelled April race meetings at Nakayama and Fukushima racecourses in the wake of the Mar. 11 earthquake and tsunami. The JRA released the following changes to its stakes program yesterday:

- G2 Nikkei Sho, originally scheduled for Mar. 26 at Nakayama Racecourse will be held Apr. 2 at Hanshin Racecourse. The race distance will be changed from 2,500 to 2,400 meters.
- G3 Nakayama Himba S., originally scheduled for Mar. 13 at Nakayama Racecourse, will be held Apr. 2 at Hanshin Racecourse.
- G3 Lord Derby Challenge Trophy, originally scheduled at Nakayama Racecourse, will be held at Hanshin Racecourse.
- G2 New Zealand Trophy (NHK Mile Cup Trial), originally scheduled at Nakayama Racecourse, will be held at Hanshin Racecourse.
- G3 March S., originally scheduled for Mar. 27 at Nakayama Racecourse, will be held Apr. 10 at Hanshin Racecourse.
- G2 Yomiuri Milers Cup, originally scheduled for Apr. 16, will be held Apr. 17.
- G1 Satsuki Sho (Japanese 2000 Guineas), originally scheduled for Apr. 17 at Nakayama Racecourse, will be held Apr. 24 at Tokyo Racecourse.

Racing at Hanshin and Kokura racecourses resumed last weekend, and the JRA has established funds at both tracks to aid victims of the devastation. The JRA has donated ¥100,000,000 (US\$1,235,420) to disaster relief, while the Japanese Owners' Association has donated ¥50,000,000 and the Japan Trainers Association and Jockeys Club have each donated ¥5,000,000.

STREET CRY TOP ALL-WEATHER SIRE AGAIN

When we last took an extensive look at sires of all-weather (or synthetic) runners, in February 2010, we found that Zenyatta's sire, **Street Cry**, was the leading sire by cumulative average-earnings index on all-weather surfaces. He still is. Using figures provided by The Jockey Club Information Systems and compiled by Brianne Stanley and Gary Hadden, since the beginning of all-weather racing in North America with Turfway Park's fall meet in 2005 and including European AW racing since that date, Street Cry's runners have compiled a 3.75 all-weather cumulative average-earnings index. He has the best figure among 424 sires that have had 60 or more all-weather starters in Europe and North America since Sept. 1, 2005. Zenyatta's \$5.8 million in earnings on synthetic tracks have no doubt made a big contribution to that index.

Santa Anita may have gotten rid of their synthetic track (and the fatality rate at this meet will therefore be scrutinized carefully), but plenty of other places have not. In coming weeks, 'synthetic' tracks will be back in action at Hollywood Park, Keeneland, Woodbine, and Arlington Park. In the 5 1/2 years since synthetics came to North America, there have been more than 87,000 starters on all-weather tracks in North America and Europe (there may be a few duplications, in the cases of horses that started on AW tracks in both), representing 4,408 stallions ([click here for an alphabetical list of all sires with an AW runner since September 1, 2005](#)). Of these, 424 stallions have sired 60 or more AW runners ([click here for an alphabetical list of these 424 sires](#)). This year the total number of AW runners will go over the 100,000 mark.

Up until this year, California had even more all-weather racing than Woodbine, but the population of sires of racehorses is much more concentrated at Woodbine. Because of the rich incentive programs, a much higher proportion of runners at Woodbine are by Ontario-based sires than is the proportion of runners in California by California sires. They have more by Kentucky sires, Florida sires, etc. This is why, when we sort the 424 sires with 60+ AW runners by cumulative average-earnings index ([click](#)), nine of the top 25 sires are (or were) Ontario stallions, or (as in the case of Milwaukee Brew), have had a significant proportion of their better runners in Ontario. Actually, he now stands in Ontario, too--probably because his runners have had such good success there. *Cont. p11*

For those of you racing or breeding in Ontario, the legendary **Bold Executive** (3.20) ranks second only to Street Cry by cumulative AW AEI. **Where's The Ring** (2.59), the Pin Oak-bred by Seeking the Gold who comes from the same hot F2006 sire crop as **Candy Ride** (2.98, third by cumulative AW AEI), **Whiskey Wisdom** (2.55, now in Manitoba), and **Milwaukee Brew** (2.41) rank sixth, seventh, and eighth respectively. Also figuring among the top 25 are: **Tethra** (2.16); **Compadre** (2.12); **Trajectory** (2.01); **Kinshasa** (1.97); and **Bold n' Flashy** (1.96). Conclusion: whatever they're doing in Ontario is working; you'd hope somebody is making money with these sires.

Besides Candy Ride, the other F2006 sire with a high cumulative AW AEI is **Tapit** (2.35), though both Medaglia d'Oro (1.43) and **Speightstown** (1.27) also do fine. Speightstown, in fact, has six AW stakes winners. Also among the top 10 by cumulative AW AEI are: **D'wildcat** (2.78); **Chester House** (2.60), Juddmonte's half-brother to Empire Maker who unfortunately died before anybody had the slightest inkling how good he was going to be; and **Tiznow** (2.35), whose first foals were born in 2003 and raced in 2005, meaning he was from the first crop of sires that had synthetics available to their runners throughout their entire stud careers. It's interesting that all of the top 10 sires in this category stood in North America (more good racing on synthetics there than in Europe), and all had over 40% winners to AW runners. The average for all NA runners is 34% winners to AW runners, and it's 30% for all runners (Europe is 25%).

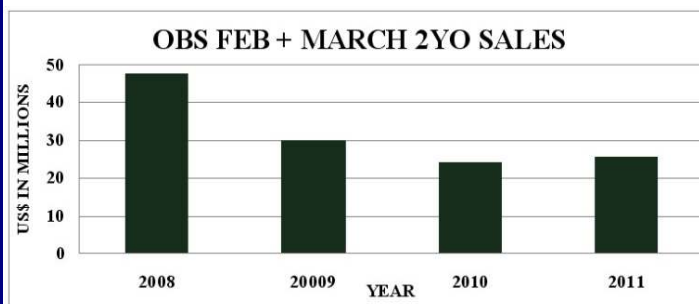
Another meaningful statistic, we are finding, is a sire's number of AW stakes winners; percentage is traditionally regarded as more important, but we are looking at statistics that are in their relative infancy ([click here](#)). There is a huge difference in the availability of black type for AW racing between North America and Europe. In North America, of course, entire major circuits are (or were) now run on synthetics, including Grade I races, whereas, in Europe, I'm pretty sure a scattering of Group 3 races is the top of the scale there. Since Sept. 1, 2005, there have been 862 AW stakes winners in North America, which is 1.78% of runners (one of every 56 runners). In Europe, there have been 156 AW stakes winners, just four-tenths of one percent of runners--one in 250 runners. **Cont. p12**

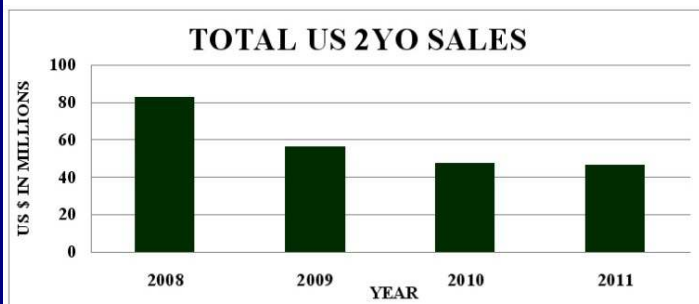

"The observation by TDN staffers in last Thursday's paper (pp. 9-10) that we should look at the OBS sale as February and March combined is spot on, and so we do in the top graph and table here: when doing so, the gross is up six percent from last year, the average up by almost \$1,000 (one percent) exactly. Of course, like everything the two-year-old market crashed between early 2008 and early 2009, then there was a further 20 percent shrinkage in numbers in 2010. The combined gross for the sales so far is down 44 percent from 2008, number catalogued down a quarter from 2009 (Barretts' not included)."

Giant's Causeway has sired 14 AW stakes winners (all in North America; of the 11 sires in this category with nine or more AW stakes winners, **Lemon Drop Kid** is the only one with an AW stakes winner in Europe), and leads all sires in this category. They called him an 'iron horse' on the racetrack, and he's pretty much that way at stud, too. But there is no doubt that his proficiency at siring AW runners has been a big help to him in achieving his two North American sire championships. Tiznow and **A.P. Indy** are tied for second, with 13 each; interestingly, the three leaders have almost exactly the same percentage of AW stakes winners to runners in North America. Giant's Causeway has 14 from 186 North American AW runners (7.53%); Tiznow is 13 from 189 (6.88%); and A.P. Indy 13 from 188 (6.91%). None had European AW stakes winners, but Giant's Causeway had 122 AW runners in Europe, whereas Tiznow and A.P. Indy have had 11 and five, respectively. So Tiznow and A.P. Indy have higher overall percentages of AW stakes winners to runners than does Giant's Causeway.

Tied with 11 AW stakes winners each are Canadian sire **Bold Executive** and **Smart Strike**; whether Curlin liked the 'plastic,' as his owner Jess Jackson called it, or not, plenty by the two-time champion sire do. Tied with 10 are the aforementioned **Street Cry**, **Lemon Drop Kid**, and deceased **Forest Wildcat**. Three sires with nine each are **Sky Mesa**, **Indian Charlie** and the California sire revelation **Unusual Heat**. I'd say that's quite a strong performance by Sky Mesa, especially. He's not a horse who gets a lot of fanfare, but he's made a really strong recovery from a slow start when he was a freshman sire in 2007, and 6.72% AW stakes winners to starters is a very good percentage.

We also compile percentage of AW winners from starters, though we find that is probably the least significant of the three class indicators ([click here](#)). Still, it's always good to know that a sire has a good record on the AW, so you wouldn't be afraid to try one on it. **Marino Marini**, for example, a son of Storm Cat who stands in California, leads the list with almost 57% AW winners to starters.

Average for North America is 34% and, since the average for Europe is just 25%, you probably won't be surprised to hear that 24 of the top 25 in this category stand in North America. The one exception is **Danetime**, who, like Chester House, is dead and just about out of runners, so the information doesn't do us much good.

Second in this category is another son of Storm Cat, **Yankee Gentleman** (56.18% AW winners to runners), who was sent from Kentucky to Louisiana (no synthetics there) last year, and third is a grandson of Storm Cat, **Cactus Ridge** (53.85%), by Storm Cat's son Hennessy. I think the message here is you needn't fear running a Storm Cat-line horse on the synthetics. Ranking 11th in this category is another California son of Storm Cat, **Tribal Rule** (48.18%), who also has a 2.04 cumulative AW AEI, and over 6% AW stakes winners to runners (seven of 110).

Canada is again prominent in this category, with **Bold Executive** (52.16%), **Milwaukee Brew** (48.91%), and **Where's The Ring** (48.35%) also among this top 10. Interestingly, fifth and sixth by percentage of AW winners to runners are the 3/4-brothers **Decarchy** (50.59%, a California stallion) and **Chester House** (50%). Their other half-brother **Empire Maker**, who is after all by **Unbridled**, was right at the average, with 34.15% AW winners. He, too, has good AW statistics: 2.17 cumulative AW AEI, and just under 4% AW stakes winners to runners (five of 123). Also among the top 10 by percentage of AW winners to runners is the current third-crop sire, **Kitten's Joy** (49.28%), a former grass champion; and just outside the top 10 is **Candy Ride** (48.04%), who figures very high in all categories, though, of course, many of his early good runners have been produced by the Craig family and have raced in California.

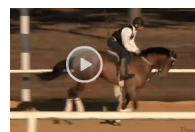

SQUARE EDDIE RETIRED AGAIN

Square Eddie (Smart Strike--Forty Gran, by El Gran Senor), who came out of retirement for three starts this winter, has been returned to Vessels Stallion Farm to resume his stud career. As a three-year-old, the chestnut was second in the GIII San Rafael S. and third in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. He was bred to 35 mares in 2010. In his return to the races, Square Eddie set a track record at Santa Anita in a Jan. 14 allowance. In subsequent starts, he was ninth in the Feb. 5 GI Donn H. and again in the Mar. 5 GI Kilroe Mile. On the board in 8 of 15 starts, Square Eddie retires with three wins and earnings of \$854,789.

Summit Committee Releases 2010 Durability and Soundness Statistics:

The Durability Committee of the Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit has published its 2010 durability and soundness statistics in the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation publication *Research Today*. While the statistics represent lifetime figures, to qualify for the lists, a stallion must have ranked within the first 200 sires by progeny earnings for calendar year 2010. Ocala Stud Farm's Concorde's Tune topped the list of 2010 sires by lifetime starts per starter, with an average of 23.33. He was followed by Airdrie's Slew City Slew (22.10 lifetime starts per starter), and Outflanker (20.99), who stands at Shamrock Stud Farms in Maryland. Leading the way of 2010 sires by lifetime percentage of foals of racing age who have started is Margaux Farm's Petionville, who has seen 83.48 percent starters from foals of racing age. Storm Boot, was second with 83.18, with Lane's End's Langfuhr coming in third with 82.77 percent. In the category of older stakes winners, Darley's Medaglia d'Oro came out on top, with 12 stakes winners who were four-year-olds.
