Way back in 1970, Sir Michael Sobell's homebred filly Boulevard showed considerable potential in winning her first three races, notably defeating Hecla and Super Honey in the Princess Margaret S. at Ascot. Hecla went on to give the peerless Mill Reef a hard time in the Imperial S., while Super Honey later found only the triple Classic winner Altesse Royale too good for her in the 1000 Guineas. Whereas her rivals flourished, Boulevard failed to build on her excellent start after being transferred to France.

Her chances of making amends as a broodmare weren't helped when this half-sister to the top-class Sun Prince produced only four foals for Ballymacoll Stud. However, each of her two daughters has exerted an influence on no less a

race than the Dubai World Cup. Boulevard's younger daughter, the Classic-placed Riverman filly Waterway, is the second dam of the impressive 2002 World Cup winner Street Cry. And now her elder daughter, the Nassau S. third Silken

Way, ranks as the second dam of Neo Universe, sire of the hugely welcome 2011 World Cup hero, Victoire Pisa. **Cont. p2**

BC SEARCH COMMITTEE HIRES HEAD HUNTER

The committee charged with finding a replacement for Breeders' Cup President and CEO Greg Avioli, comprised of BC Directors Tom Ludt, Helen Alexander, Antony Beck, Jerry Crawford and Richard Santulli, has hired the international executive search consulting firm Spencer Stuart to oversee the process. Spencer Stuart, a 55-year-old company with 51 offices in 27 countries, was instrumental in the search that led to Avioli's engagement six years ago. "The position has attracted so much initial interest from inside and outside our industry, and the selection is of such vital importance to our organization that the committee wanted to utilize the best professional resources available to assist with this process," said Ludt. The position will be based at the Breeders' Cup headquarters in Lexington. A deadline has not been set, but a replacement is expected to be named by July. In the interim, COO/CFO Matthew Lutz and Senior Vice President of Sales Carter Carnegie will handle Breeders' Cup's day-to-day operations.

Victoire Pisa has proved admirably tough and versatile. Officially ranked joint-third among the Japanese 2-year-olds of 2009, when he won his last three starts, he received the top ranking of 121 among the Japanese-raced turf 3-year-olds of 2010, just ahead of his old rival Rose Kingdom and the outstanding English filly Snow Fairy. Now, he is unbeaten in two 4-year-old starts, one on turf and one on Tapeta. His impressive record stands at eight wins from 13 starts.

In winning last year's Satsuki Sho, he provided Neo Universe with his second successive winner of this Japanese equivalent to the 2000 Guineas, following the success of Unrivaled in 2009--a year that also saw Logi Universe, another colt from Neo Universe's first crop, land the Japanese Derby. To come up with three Classic-winning sons in his first two crops represents a considerable achievement on Neo Universe's behalf, even allowing for the fact that these crops totaled more than 300 foals.

I first pointed out the stallion's potential in these pages in December 2008, writing:

"Keep an eye out too for Neo Universe, who provided Sunday Silence with his fifth victory in the Japanese Derby in 2003, when he also won the 2000 Guineas. Neo Universe's first 2-year-olds raced in 2008, and he appears to have an excellent prospect in Logi Universe, an unbeaten winner of two Japanese Group 3 events, including the Radio Nikkei Hai Nisai S. three days ago."

I went on to make an observation which has taken on more significance since the emergence of Victoire Pisa:

"An interesting aspect of Neo Universe's pedigree is that he is by a son of Halo and his dam Pointed Path is a granddaughter of Boulevard. Street Cry is another hot young stallion out of a granddaughter of Boulevard and he, too, has Halo in his pedigree, as the broodmare sire of his sire Machiavellian. It looks as though Logi Universe's breeders were intent on strengthening the links between Neo Universe and Street Cry, as the youngster's second dam is by none other than Machiavellian [creating 3x5 to Halo]."

Victoire Pisa has a high-class daughter of Machiavellian as his dam, so he is inbred 3x4 to Halo, America's champion sire of 1983 and 1989 (thanks to the Kentucky Derby triumphs of his sons Sunny's Halo and Sunday Silence).

In addition to Logi Universe and Victoire Pisa, another with two lines of Halo is the exciting young stallion Shamardal, who is out of Street Cry's sister Helsinki. Shamardal, who has Halo is his fifth and fourth generations, was represented over the weekend by Dunboyme Express, winner of the G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial. Others inbred to Halo include the high-class Australian filly More Joyous (3x3) and the major Japanese winners Asakusa Den'en (a half-brother to Victoire Pisa, inbred 3x4) and Danon Chantilly (3x3). Street Cry's Grade I-winning son Here Comes Ben is inbred 4x4. **Cont. p3**

Victoire Pisa's dam Whitewater Affair performed extremely well for her breeder John Greetham in 1996 and 1997. She was one of the first to establish Machiavellian's ability to sire performers with far more stamina than this fast son of Mr. Prospector had demonstrated. Machiavellian generally needed some help from his mates to produce a stayer, a prime example being Invermark, his winner of the 2 1/2-mile Prix du Cadran, who was out of a stoutly bred Glint of Gold mare. With the St Leger winner Bustino as her broodmare sire, Whitewater Affair stayed well enough to win the G3 John Porter S. over a mile and a half and the Prix de Pomone over 1 11/16 miles at four, when she was also second in the Yorkshire Oaks and third in the Irish St Leger.

Whitewater Affair's dam Much Too Risky enjoyed considerable success as a broodmare, becoming one of those rare mares with three group winners to her credit. Her Warning colt Little Rock also stayed much better than his sire, as he showed by winning the Princess of Wales's S. over a mile and a half, and so did Short Skirt, one of her fillies by Warning's fast son Diktat. Short Skirt won a pair of Group 3s, in addition to finishing third in the Oaks and second in the Yorkshire Oaks.

The family showed that it had truly arrived when Short Skirt was sold for 1,400,000gns as a 3-year-old in 2006. Earlier generations of the family had been by stallions who couldn't have been described as highly fashionable, but that hadn't stopped them doing very well.

Victoire Pisa's third dam, the Italian winner Short Rations, produced Group 1-winning stayers on two continents, with Arctic Owl taking the Irish St Leger and Marooned the Sydney Cup. The next dam, Short Commons, exceeded initial expectations by easily winning the Free H., prior to finishing a close fourth in the Irish 1000 Guineas. Short Commons' younger half-sister Pampalina sold for as little as 230gns as a foal, but that didn't stop her winning the 1967 Irish Oaks. Short Commons and Pampalina both produced stallion sons, the former being responsible for the smart He Loves Me and the latter for the Irish 2000 Guineas winner Pampapaul.

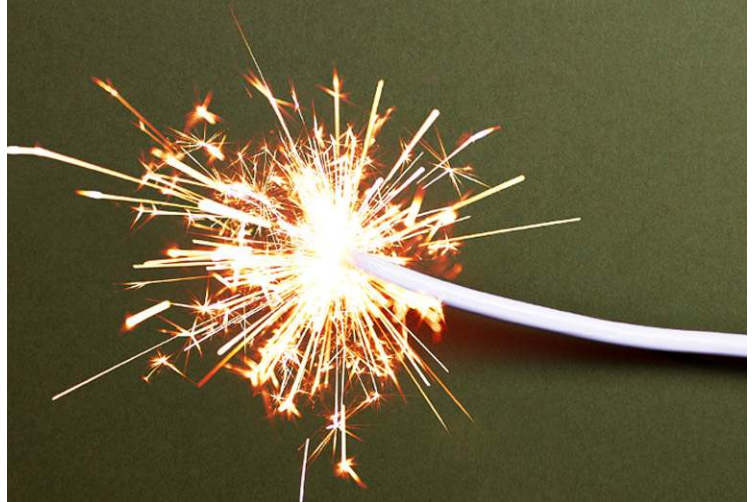
The Pampalina branch of this family also did well for the late Jean-Luc Lagardere, and it now has several representatives in the Aga Khan's stud book, so this family has earned a great deal of respect over the last 40 years or so.

RCI LEADERS CALL FOR PHASE OUT OF DRUGS (*Edited press release*) Both the outgoing and incoming chairmen of the Association of Racing Commissioners International Inc. have challenged the racing industry and member regulators to embrace a strategy to phase out drugs and medication in horse racing. Outgoing RCI Chair Dan Hartman of the

Colorado Racing Commission said that “a five-year phase-out is reasonable to bring North American racing policies in line with what is going on in other parts of the world like Europe and Hong Kong.” Hartman said that

a phased approach would give horsemen and owners sufficient time to adjust to the change. RCI’s new Chair, William Koester, the chairman of the Ohio State Racing Commission, said, “Today, over 99% of Thoroughbred racehorses and 70% of Standardbred racehorses have a needle stuck in them four hours before a race. That just does not pass the smell test with the public or anyone else except horse trainers who think it necessary to win a race. I’m sure the decision makers at the time meant well when these drugs were permitted, however this decision has forced our jurisdictions to juggle threshold levels as horseman become more desperate to win races, and has given horse racing a black eye.” These comments mark a major departure from regulatory policy that has been based on allowing traces of medication, and a move toward enacting a policy of zero tolerance. RCI President Ed Martin said the membership gathering in New Orleans last week was largely receptive to a major overhaul of medication policies. Koester noted that “change is inevitable,” and called for the association “to take the moral high ground and implement drug rules that mirror the racing in Australia, Dubai, Europe, Hong Kong, and even Russia.” He added, “If you follow horse racing, you probably heard of the names Well Armed, Curlin, Invasor, Roses in May, Pleasantly Perfect, Captain Steve, Silver Charm and Cigar. Eight of the last 16 winners of the [G1 Dubai World Cup] were from North America and ran drug free. It can be done.” In recent years, RCI has based its medication policies largely on recommendations from the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTTC). A shift toward “zero tolerance” would mark a departure from that practice and a major change for trainers.

NAPRAVNIK BECOMES FIRST WOMAN TO TOP FAIR GROUNDS RIDER STANDINGS

Jockey Rosie Napravnik, who etched her name in the Fair Grounds record book when she became the first woman rider to take the \$1 million GII Louisiana Derby Saturday, added to her accomplishments by becoming the first of her sex to take the riding title at the New Orleans oval. Napravnik, 23, booted home 110 winners, 31 more than runner-up Shaun Bridgmohan. "I have had a ton of highlights," she said. "There's such a long list of people to thank. Some of the most supportive have been Mike

Stidham and Hilary Pridham and that outfit, and my fiance, Joe Sharp, for convincing me to come down here and supporting me throughout the meet. I really want to thank everybody. I've got some great fans here and I can't wait to come back next year." Napravnik now heads to Keeneland for the spring meet, Apr. 8-29. Steve Asmussen led all trainers with 46 winners to take his 10th Fair Grounds championship, while Maggi Moss saw 19 runners carry her colors to victory to lead all owners at the meet. "The Fair Grounds is my favorite racetrack," Moss said. "It really means a lot to me. I thank everybody who is here, the management of Fair Grounds, and Steve Asmussen and Tom Amoss, because they are the ones that that did it--and, actually, the horses probably the most."
