Soldat Continues March to Louisville...

Soldat (War Front) has done nothing wrong in two starts this term, and trainer Kieran McLaughlin hopes the sophomore colt continues in the right direction in Sunday's GI Florida Derby. The dark bay colt enjoyed success on the grass last year, winning the GIII With Anticipation S. and running second in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. He transferred that success to the main track with a 10 3/4-length allowance romp at Gulfstream Jan. 21 and followed up with a two-length triumph in the Feb. 26 GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S.

"I think he still has his best races ahead of him," McLaughlin said yesterday. "He's run two nice races down here, but I don't think he was all out to

win the Fountain of Youth. If we had to ask him for more, I think that there was more there."

McLaughlin thinks his charge's versatility will prove useful Sunday.

"I think he can go anywhere," the trainer commented. "He was second in the first two starts of his life. Then he went to the turf and won, and ran second in the Breeders' Cup. He doesn't worry about fast, sloppy or if they decide to move it to the turf, we're okay. So he doesn't need his racetrack."

McLaughlin had Soldat work behind horses so he would learn to rate, and the colt handled the lesson perfectly.

"We put him about four lengths behind horses and he took a lot of dirt," McLaughlin recalled. "It was after the break, and the track was wet. He took the dirt well. He never threw his head up, he never disliked it. He just sat there and took the dirt. He actually split horses turning for home and he drew off by a length or two. He did it the right way, and worked very well. We anticipate not being on the lead in one of his next few races, and that's why we did it. But we'll just have to take each race as it comes to us." **Cont. p2**

ZENYATTA NO LONGER IN FOAL

Horse of the Year **Zenyatta** (Street Cry {Ire}--Vertigineux, by Kris S.), bred to Bernardini in February, is no longer in foal. "She came up empty on a 35-day preg check today," Lane's End Farm manager Mike Cline told *Daily Racing Form*. "It's not uncommon. It's unfortunate, but she's healthy, she's doing great, and we expect her to get back in foal." Cline also told DRF that Zenyatta would be bred back to Bernardini next week. "In life, we all have things that don't always go as hoped or planned," a diary post on Zenyatta's website read. "I am not any different than anyone else. At Lane's End, they did a recheck on me today and discovered that I am no longer in foal. Just as with humans, horses also have this type of thing happen. I am feeling terrific! I am totally looking forward to becoming a mom in the future." Owned by Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Moss, the seven-year-old mare closed out her career with a courageous second to Blame (Arch) in the 2010 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. She won 19 of 20 career starts and posted \$7,304,580 in earnings.

McLaughlin added that post position draw and the competition will dictate tactics in Sunday's race. "Last time we were down in the one hole and we wanted to go," McLaughlin explained. "This time, there is probably quite a bit of speed. We'll just play it by ear, but we will have a game plan going into the race depending on our post position. We just have to see who enters, and what post position we draw for what decision we make on whether we're going to go or sit off the pace."

McLaughlin is looking forward to a big spring with his charge.

"We're just happy that he hasn't missed a day of training in a year, and I think that is important," the Kentucky native said. "Many people use the word battle-tested, and I think he is battle-tested. He's done everything that we've thrown at him. And this will be his third 1 1/8-mile race. I think that's important, and I hope that he can still go forward from his last two races. He's just doing great. We just hope to keep him sound and happy until May 7."

LaPenta Hopes Dialed In Moves Up in Florida Derby...

Dialed In (Mineshaft) swept to the top of many Kentucky Derby lists with his last-to-first rally in the Jan. 30 GIII Holy Bull S., but some of the colt's supporters jumped ship after his runner-up effort in a Mar. 6 nine-furlong allowance last time out. Owner Bob LaPenta is hoping Dialed In's first loss in just his third lifetime start was a learning experience for the colt, and that the handsome dark bay continues to improve in Sunday's GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park.

"The race didn't unfold the way we had hoped," LaPenta said of Dialed In's allowance effort during a national teleconference yesterday. "He was on the inside, it was a slow pace, but I think he learned a lot and he ran well. I think the race was a lot better than people think. We were looking for him to gain some experience. He didn't necessarily have to win, but he was competitive and running at the end. It was his first 1 1/8-mile test. I think he learned a lot. Would I have preferred him to win? Sure, you always want to win. But if you're going to lose a race, that's the race you want to lose."

Dialed In was a debut winner at Churchill Downs last November before making his sophomore debut in the Holy Bull. Despite being short on races, LaPenta thinks Dialed In has gained plenty of experience.

"From my perspective, with what he's been through and the races he's been in, coming from off the pace, breaking slowly, going on the inside, racing on the outside, taking a tremendous amount of dirt, I'd say in his three races he's gotten six or seven races of experience," LaPenta said. "I think he's extremely talented, I think he's got a tremendous heart and I think he's learned a lot in three races."

Asked what he would be looking for from Dialed In Sunday, LaPenta added, "What you want to see is a horse that is improving, a horse that feels good, a horse that is comfortable running in a big crowded field against quality horses. I'd be very happy to see him running down the middle of the stretch, closing, picking up horses. I think that would set him up nicely for the Kentucky Derby. He's got an explosive move, and that is what I am going to be looking for on Sunday."

The Florida Derby looks to be a race with plenty of pace, particularly if unbeaten GII Hutcheson S. winner **Flashpoint** (Pomeroy) is in the field. Also likely to be on or near the lead is GIII Gotham S. winner **Stay Thirsty** (Bernardini), GII Remsen S. winner **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) and GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. winner **Soldat** (War Front). That could be good news for the late-running Dialed In.

"I wouldn't mind Flashpoint going into the race," LaPenta admitted. "I think there is going to be a lot of speed. I think they are going to put blinkers on Stay Thirsty; at least, that's what I've read. I think To Honor and Serve and Soldat will be right up there. Flashpoint, I think, would add to that whole front end. I think that would be a net positive for us, and I'd like to see it."

The Florida Derby is shaping up as a competitive contest, and LaPenta thinks it will provide a good barometer for several Kentucky Derby hopefuls. **Cont. p3**



"The Florida Derby, to me, is a mini-Kentucky Derby," he said. "There are so many good horses in there. I could see half of them, if not more, being in the Derby on the first Saturday in May. Obviously we want to see Dialed In run his race, be game and competitive and do well. This is the toughest race of all of the Derby preps, and I think it's going to tell a lot about some of the leading horses in the Derby dozen."

Mott Looks for Honor to Rebound...

Dialed In (Mineshaft) isn't the only Kentucky Derby hopeful looking to rebound from a loss in Sunday's GI Florida Derby. Live Oak Stud's **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) ended his juvenile season with easy victories in the Nov. 6 GII Nashua S. and Nov. 27 GII Remsen S., but came home third behind **Soldat** (War Front) while making his highly anticipated sophomore debut in the Feb. 26 GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. Trainer Bill Mott thinks the loss may have actually been a good thing for his charge.

"He showed us that he could run last year," Mott said of the bay colt. "I don't think those races were flukes, even though he won a couple of them fairly easily and was basically unchallenged. I think it was good for him to be challenged the other day [in the Fountain of Youth]. I think all horses need to find out that they can't just roll up to one and go by them easily every time."

Mott continued, "I think it was good [Soldat] was in there and turned him back, and gave him something to get tired about. I think they can actually improve by getting beat sometimes. He should improve and, hopefully, he's fitter and gamer the next time."

Mott said **To Honor and Serve** doesn't necessarily have to win Sunday's race to move on to the Kentucky Derby, but will need to offer a better effort than his run in the Fountain of Youth.

"I want to see an improved race," Mott confirmed. "I don't want to be making this excuse for him next week. I want to see a much better effort from him, win, lose or draw. I thought he folded up a little bit early [in the Fountain of Youth]. When he left the quarter pole, he was already flat."

To Honor and Serve was given time off after his juvenile campaign, and the holiday allowed the strapping colt time to mature.

"He's a horse with a big frame, he's got a lot of leg under him," Mott said. "He has filled out. As a two-year-old he was tall and leggy, but he has put on muscle and bulked up in the last three or four months. He's certainly gone the right way. He looks like a horse that has some class about him. When you look at him, he's not just an average horse. He looks like he could be special, and, progression-wise, it's all gone the right way. I'm hoping that he continues to go that way."

ZARDANA CALLS IT A CAREER

Arnold Zetcher's **Zardana (Brz)** (Crimson Tide {Ire}--Dear Filly {Arg}, by Southern Halo), who spoiled Horse of the Year Rachel Alexandra (Medaglia d'Oro)'s seasonal debut in last term's New Orleans Ladies S., has been retired, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Bred in Brazil by Haras Campestre, the seven-year-old began her career in her native country with three runaway wins in 2007 before registering a career high tally in the 2009 GII Bayakoa H. and a third-place finish in the 2010 GI Vanity Breeders' Cup H. Last seen placing a game second in the GII Santa Maria S. Feb. 12, the bay retires with eight wins from 24 career starts and \$512,276 in earnings. Breeding plans haven't been finalized.

Blind Luck Breezes, Next Start Uncertain...

Eclipse Award winner **Blind Luck** (Pollard's Vision) breezed a half-mile in :48.20 Tuesday morning over the training track at Santa Anita ([Facebook video](#)), her first work since her runner-up effort to old rival Havre de Grace (Saint Liam) in the GIII Azeri S. at Oaklawn Mar. 19. "She worked very well, and she's done well since the Azeri," trainer Jerry Hollendorfer commented. While the next logical spot for the champ would seem to be the GI Apple Blossom H. back in Hot Springs Apr. 15, Hollendorfer is keeping his options open. "We'll look at it," he said. "There's also a race the first week at Churchill that we'd also look at," he added, referring to the \$300,000 GII La Troienne S. The

conditioner is concerned about the weights for the Apple Blossom. "That's very important to us," he confirmed. "It's definitely going to contribute to the decision. If the weights aren't right, I'm not running." Blind Luck is currently riding a streak of five consecutive runner-up efforts. Her last victory came in the GI TVG/Betfair Alabama S. last August.

DREAM'S CLASSIC PLANS HINGE ON GROUND

Trainer David Simcock yesterday indicated that **Dream Ahead** (Diktat {GB}), last season's joint-highest rated juvenile, may skip Newmarket's Apr. 30 G1 2000 Guineas if ground conditions are not in favor. Khalifa Dasmal's dark bay, winner of the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S., rounded off last term with a fifth behind Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the G1 Dewhurst S. He may target alternative Classics in France or Ireland if going conditions at the Rowley Mile track ride quicker than good. "I really, really want to run in the 2000 Guineas, but, if the ground is on the fast side of good, he won't go," Simcock told *Racing Post*. "It's a very important race, but he's a young horse and has his whole career ahead. There's more likely to be cut in France or Ireland, so they'd be alternatives."

PRESCOTT NOTES HOORAY CAUTION

Newmarket conditioner Sir Mark Prescott has indicated concern over the progress of G1 Cheveley Park S. victress **Hooray** (GB) (Invincible Spirit {Ire}), according to *Racing Post*. Cheveley Park Stud's homebred bay also bagged victories in last term's G2 Lowther S. and G3 Sirenia S., but has failed to sparkle over the winter, and may miss the May 1 G1 1000 Guineas at her local track. "Hooray was the best 2-year-old filly in Europe last season, she was the top-rated so we start with the best animal on last year's form, but the drawback is she's not very big and hasn't grown," Prescott told the trade daily. "Her family don't often train on, and I've had quite a few of them. She hasn't particularly thrived as I started to work her now, and the big thing with a lot of trainers when they're trying to get them ready early is if they'll eat, and she's not eating as much as I'd like at the moment. She needs to do better than the last couple of weeks to run."

INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

There were three really significant things to take from Dubai World Cup day, the second contested at Meydan, Dubai's showplace racecourse, on Michael Dickinson's Tapeta surface and turf. The first is the impressive international cast, really not just for World Cup night, but for the Carnival as a whole. It remains to be seen whether G2 UAE Derby one-two Khawlah (Cape Cross) and Master of Hounds (Kingmambo) can capture the next targets mooted for them, the G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 Kentucky Derby, respectively. Whether three-year-olds can successfully use World Cup night as a prep, in other words, is one thing; but as a target for four-year-olds and up (and, in most years, Southern Hemisphere three-year-olds as well), it is really producing world-class racing.

The fact that the first six favorites on the Thoroughbred card won is pretty amazing, and maybe significant, too. Of course, they are pretty big fields, so there are bound to be traffic problems and troubled trips. But if the form horses prevail, both on turf and Tapeta, it definitely suggests the surfaces are not unduly influencing the results. Besides the broad international participation from the horsemen, the crowd, reported at over 81,000, is a big compliment to Meydan and Dubai racing. The whole entertainment package for Dubai World Cup day reads very impressively.

Japan's one-two in the G1 Dubai World Cup was a great, and not entirely unexpected, result. It's noteworthy that neither winner Victoire Pisa (well done to Tattersalls' Jimmy George there), by Sunday Silence's son, Neo Universe, nor second Transcend (Wild Rush) had ever run on synthetic tracks before, yet adapted no problem. What was disappointing was that, for the second year in a row, it was a paceless race, and tactics won the day. Victoire Pisa might well have won the race anyway, but jockey Mirco Demuro's mid-race move from last to second clearly made the difference, given the way the race was run. It highlights an odd thing about Invitational races: pacemakers never get in. Pacemaker have taken a lot of flak in the past few years, but that's misplaced political correctness. Especially if the rules required a horse to be declared as a pacemaker (or maybe coupled in the betting), you may not get a different result, but you would certainly get a more truly run race.

War Front on the Warpath...

He has some way to go to emulate Dubawi, who had 11 group/graded winners by the end of 2010 (end of the year his first three-year-olds ran), but Claiborne's **War Front** (Danzig) has established a significant early lead among second-crop sires (first three-year-olds 2011) by 2011 progeny earnings (click [here](#) for TDN's year-to-date second-crop sire list). Following The Factor's two Grade II wins (San Vicente S., Rebel S.) and Soldat's win in the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S., the filly Summer Soiree became his third graded stakes winner of 2011 in last Saturday's GIII Bourbonette S. at Turfway, taking War Front's 2011 progeny earnings to more than \$1,050,000--over \$400,000 ahead of Vinery Florida's **Pomero** (Boundary), in second place. Close behind him, by 2011 progeny earnings, are: Darley's **Bernardini** (A.P. Indy); another Florida stallion, Hartley/DeRenzo's **With Distinction** (Storm Cat); 2010 leading freshman sire **Congrats** (A.P. Indy), transferred by Vinery from Florida to Kentucky this year; and WinStar's **Bluegrass Cat** (Storm Cat/A.P. Indy cross). Each of the six second-crop sire leaders by 2011 progeny earnings has at least four black-type horses this year, with the exception of With Distinction, whose only stakes horse so far this year is Jean Lafitte S. winner and Saturday's GII Vinery Racing Spiral S. second Decisive Moment.

War Front's sensational 2011 start has taken him to just \$2,000 behind Congrats in cumulative progeny earnings for second-crop (first foals 2008) sires (click [here](#)). As of yesterday, Congrats had sired 39 winners and the earners of \$2,218,588, including a hugely impressive total of 15 black-type horses already in his first crop. War Front had sired 29 winners of \$2,216,577, and leads his 'sire crop' now with six black-type winners (of which three are graded stakes winners). Third-placed Bernardini is the leader by number of graded/group stakes winners (five) and second to War Front by number of black-type winners (same five). Bluegrass Cat is fourth by cumulative progeny earnings, and tied for second (with **Sharp Humor**, by Distorted Humor) by number of cumulative black-type horses (nine each). Leading 2010 European freshman sire. Darley's **Iffraaj** (Zafonic) still ranks fifth by cumulative progeny earnings, though the European season is just getting underway. He still leads this sire crop by number of winners (41).

There are a number of promising mid-range stud fee sires among this crop; each of the top 15 by cumulative progeny earnings, except for With Distinction, has two or more black-type winners to date, and cumulative progeny earnings over \$800,000. After Iffraaj, the next 10 by cumulative progeny earnings are: WinStar's **Sharp Humor**; With Distinction; Darley's **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song); Pomero; another Vinery sire, **Silver Train**, by A.P. Indy's son Old Trieste; Canada's **Old Forester** (Forestry); Three Chimneys' **Flower Alley** (Distorted Humor); Paul's Mill's **Bellamy Road** (by Concerto, a son of Chief's Crown); Claiborne's **First Samurai** (Giant's Causeway); and Airdrie's **Badge of Silver** (Silver Deputy). **Oppenheim cont.**

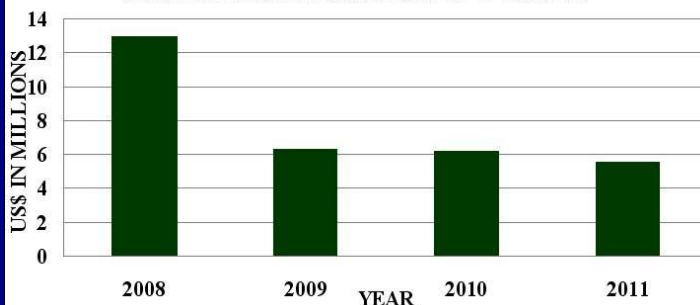

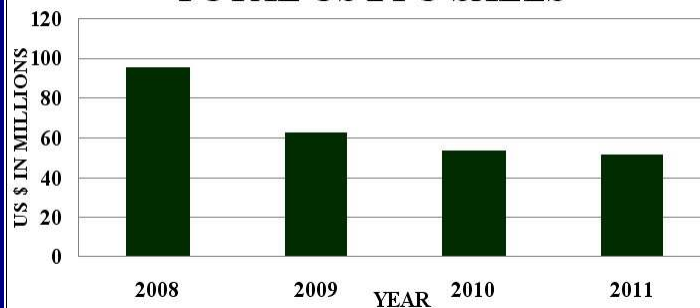

TOTAL US 2YO SALES AS OF MARCH 29, 2011

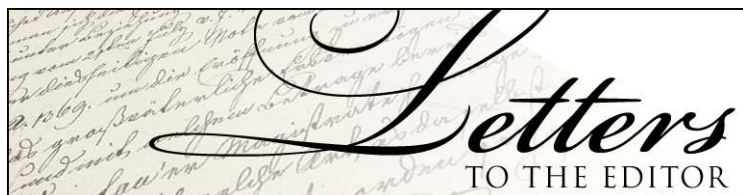

As we've noted, 14 of the top 15 by cumulative progeny earnings at this stage stand in Kentucky, but that could change as the European season gets going, which it's about to do.

One horse who doesn't make the lists is perennial Australian top-three sire **Encosta de Lago** (Fairy King), who was brought up for one season by Coolmore, and has a resulting crop of 44 named 2011 Northern Hemisphere-bred two-year-olds. That crop has just seven winners so far, but one of them, Empowering, led all they way to upset the G3 1000 Guineas Trial at Leopardstown on Sunday. She is bred, owned, and trained by Aidan and Anne-Marie O'Brien, and was ridden by son Joseph. 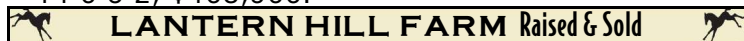

Six lots later, breeze-up regular Bobby O'Ryan paid £70,000 for a colt from the first crop of Cheveley Park Stud's Dutch Art (GB). From Harefield Lodge Stud, the March-foaled chestnut is a half-brother to the useful Gold Post (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}), who was runner-up to the subsequent Group 1 winner Zoffany (Ire) (Dansili {GB}) on debut, and is a descendant of the renowned Ack's Secret. Another to represent a pinhooking triumph, he had cost only 15,500 guineas at Tattersalls as a foal before failing to meet his reserve at 19,000 guineas back there the following October.

Late in the session, T.G. and B.B. Mills of Lorretta Lodge Stables paid £65,000 for hip 84, a son of Marju (Ire) whose dam is a half to the top-class distaffer Summitville (GB) (Grand Lodge) from the draft of Suirview Stables. Ross Doyle, another frequent customer in these circles, was responsible for the purchase of a pair of in-demand juveniles in hip 40, another offering by a sire whose first runners are in operation in 2011 in Amadeus Wolf (GB); and a daughter of Invincible Spirit (Ire) consigned as hip 51. From Con Marnane's Bansa House Stables, the Amadeus Wolf is out of a half to the 2009 G3 Prix Chloe winner Wilsid (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}) and fetched £50,000, while Hillwood Stud's Invincible Spirit offering is a granddaughter of the champion Ode (Lord Avie)

whose tag of £46,000 made her the top-priced filly of the day. Also from the Mocklershill draft was hip 41, a son of Exceed and Excel (Aus) from the extended family of this year's Derby hopeful Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}) knocked down to Mike Murphy for £50,000. Stephen Hillen later paid £46,000 for Brown Island Stables' hip 72, a Speightstown 3/4-brother to a Jamaican champion in Good Citizen (Proud Citizen).

Last year's first-season sensation Iffraaj (GB) remains popular, and Russell McNabb paid £45,000 on behalf of trainer Gary Moore for hip 27, his Ballyhane-consigned filly from the extended family of sire Redback (GB).

The Bloodstock Connection sold a pair of notable colts for £42,000 apiece in hip 54, a son of Invincible Spirit (Ire) whose dam is a full-sibling of Docksider bought by Kilstone Ltd; and hip 63, an El Prado (Ire) out of a half to Ticker Tape (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) secured by Gordian Troeller Bloodstock. Bansha House's successful spree was capped with the sale of hip 78, a Majestic Missile (Ire) full-brother to last year's Listed Roses S. winner and G2 Flying Childers S. third New Planet (Ire) to that colt's trainer John Quinn for £40,000.

At the close of the session, the average of £25,008 was up by 54 percent and the median of £20,000 up 60 percent on last year. Full results are on goffs.com.

PRINCE SABO EUTHANIZED *Edited press release*

Cheveley Park Stud yesterday announced that **Prince Sabo (GB)** (Young Generation {Ire}--Jubilee Song {GB}, by Song {GB}) has been euthanized due to infirmities of old age. Foaled in 1982 and bred by Launceston Stud, the bay cost 22,000gns as a yearling and was initially trained by Brian Swift. He also came under the care of former jockey Geoff Lewis and, finally, Sir Michael Stoute. His big-race wins came in the G2 Flying Childers S. as a juvenile and the G3 Palace House S., both over five furlongs. He also hit the board in the G3 King George S. and the G1 Prix Robert Papin. Retired to the breeding shed in 1987, Prince Sabo initially stood at Brickfield Stud on the outskirts of Newmarket, but primarily stood at Cheveley Park Stud, apart from one season spent at Sledmere Stud in Yorkshire. He quickly established himself as a source of tough and consistent sprinters, indeed overall he sired the winners of over 680 races and £4.75 million in prize money. His best progeny included the G2 Mill Reef S. winner Princely Hush (Ire), G3 King George S. winner Fire Up The Band (GB), and G3 Norfolk S. winner Tippitt Boy (GB). He also proved to be a successful broodmare sire, with his G3 Princess Margaret S. runner-up Maid For Walking (GB) being the dam of G1 Woodford Reserve Turf Classic hero Stroll (Pulpit); and G2 Prix du Gros-Chene second Easy Option (Ire) being the dam of G1 Sussex S. victor Court Masterpiece (GB) (Polish Precedent). Prince Sabo was retired from stud duties in 2006 and enjoyed happy retirement at Cheveley Park Stud, where he will be sorely missed.
