Triple Threats

Thirteen Sophs Added to Triple Crown...

A total of 13 sophomore colts and geldings were supplemented to the Triple Crown series at a cost of \$6,000 when late nominations to the Kentucky Derby, Preakness and Belmont S. were announced yesterday.

The list is headed by **Watch Me Go** (West Acre), who earned his way into Classics consideration with his 43-1 upset over Brethren (Distorted Humor) in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 12. **Swift Warrior** (First Samurai) is also among the late

nominees off his wire-to-wire success in last Saturday's Rushaway S., while **Norman Asbjornson** (Real Quiet), runner-up to Stay Thirsty (Bernardini) in the GIII Gotham S., will get a shot to punch his ticket to the Run for the Roses in next weekend's GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct. The others entered are: Turf Paradise Derby winner **Beer Meister** (Pleasant Tap); **Bowman's Causeway** (Giant's Causeway); **Joel Blazing Aaron** (Graeme Hall); **Lagoon of Diamonds** (Perfect Soul {Ire}); **Nacho Saint** (Yes It's True); GIII Sunland Derby third **Ruler on Ice** (Roman Ruler); **Saratoga Ice** (Eddington); the undefeated **Smoke It Right** (Smoke Glacken); and **Truman's Commander** (Friends Lake). Gomez Racking Up Frequent Flyer Miles...

For a top-shelf jockey, the search for "the" three-year-old horse can take him far and wide. Just ask Garrett Gomez. Two weeks ago, the two-time Eclipse Award-winning jockey was in Hot Springs, Arkansas, to ride Sway Away (Afleet Alex) in the GII Rebel S. and last weekend he returned to the Midwest to ride in the GII Louisiana Derby and supporting undercard events.

A week from Saturday, he'll be back in Southern California for the GI Santa Anita Derby, but this weekend he jets to Miami to guide Live Oak's **To Honor and Serve** (Bernardini) in the GI Florida Derby. Jockey agent Ron Anderson, who no longer represents Gomez, secured the mount.

"I've been dealing with Bill Mott going back to my days with Jerry Bailey," Anderson

said. "In five years, Garrett has won 12 Breeders' Cup races--I've never been around anyone who has ever done that. I think [Mott] and Mrs. [Charlotte] Weber [of Live Oak Plantation] just realized that Garrett is the best man for the job." It is not the first time Gomez will attempt to win the Florida Derby. In 2009, he twice made the cross-country trip to pilot Dunkirk (Unbridled's Song), first in an allowance win and then to a runner-up effort behind Quality Road (Elusive Quality) in the Derby.

Archarch Works Towards Arkansas Derby...

Robert Yagos's **Archarch** (Arch), upset winner two back of the GIII Southwest S., posted his first workout since posting a third-place effort to The Factor (War Front) in the Mar. 19 GII Rebel S., going five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 Tuesday morning. "We are very satisfied with where he's at right now," said trainer Jinks Fires. "We are dealing with the weather and wanted to get it in maybe a little earlier than we planned. We thought about waiting a day, but I didn't want to end up having to breeze on a wet track." The dark bay, who broke his maiden in the Sugar Bowl S. at the Fair Grounds in December, was drawn alongside Alternation (Distorted Humor) in the Rebel, and was repeatedly kicked in the legs when the Pin Oak runner flipped in the gate. "The veterinarian said when they got him out of the gate he was trembling," Fires said. "It really stirred him up. He relaxed so well in the race before, which is key for him. I was very happy he was still able to run as well as he did. He was a little sore for a few days, but we've been hosing him and he seems to be doing good now." The trainer's son-in-law Jon Court has been aboard the colt in each of his five trips to the post and has a return call in the GI Arkansas Derby Apr. 16.

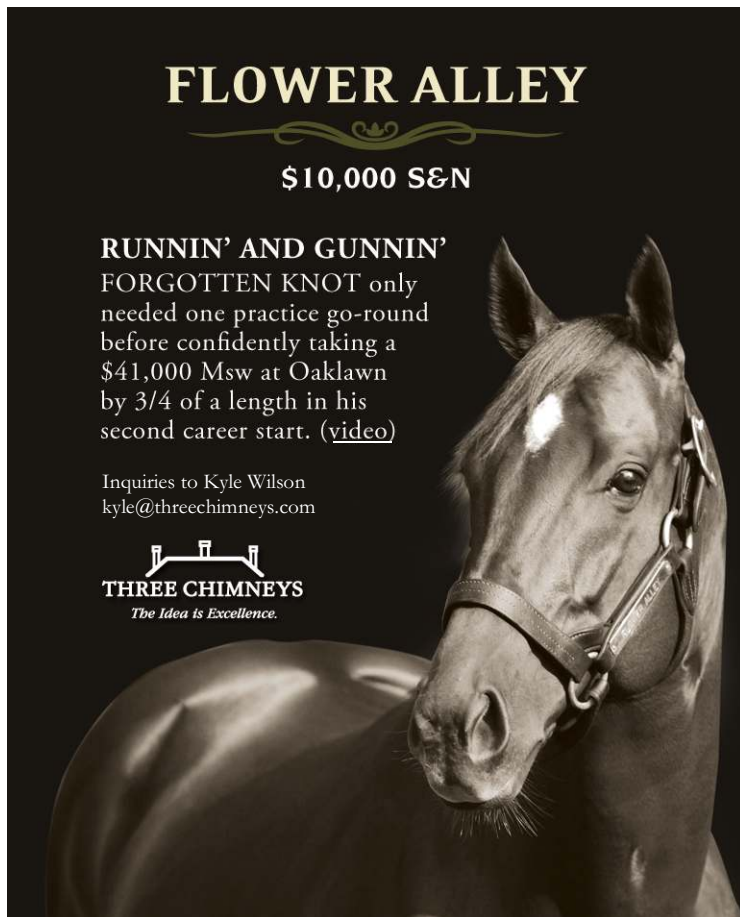

JAPANESE RACING CONTRIBUTES TO DISASTER RELIEF Racetracks across Japan collected donations from racegoers between Mar. 19 and 27 totalling ¥44,735,867 (\$539,627) which will go to the "Aid for Tohoku-Kanto Earthquake." The Japan Racing Association has also contributed an additional ¥1 billion (\$12,063,409) from the turnover during that period to their immediate donation of ¥100,000,000 (\$1,206,436). Owners, trainers and jockeys also chipped in to the tune of ¥38.2 million (\$460,854). All donations will be passed along to the Japan Red Cross Society. The JRA has also announced that 5% of the betting turnover on the G3 March S. at Hanshin Apr. 10 will be donated to victims of the earthquake.

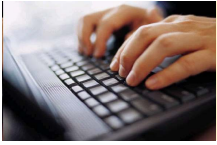

WRITERS UP

WORKING WITH OUR NEIGHBORS TO THE SOUTH by Tom Thornbury, Keeneland's Associate Director of Sales

Ten years ago, the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association/Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders and Keeneland joined forces with the Kentucky Department of Agriculture to establish trade relationships in Latin and South America. What started as an effort to test the waters in untapped markets has developed into Keeneland's progressive "emerging markets" program.

The first mission for the program was to Mexico City, where racing had been suspended six years previously, and was making a comeback at the Hipodromo de las Americas. From there, we ventured to Chile, Argentina, Brazil, Uruguay, Panama, Puerto Rico, Venezuela and Peru. The foundation was laid; technical assistance went south, along with a flood of racing and breeding stock, in addition to a prosperous stallion "shuttle" trade. From South America came a wellspring of sensational racing machines that made a lasting impression wherever they landed throughout the world.

The principal agent in this recent exchange and enhancement to trade relationships is Keeneland Marketing Associate Chauncey Morris, who came to us from the Governor's Office in Frankfort, where he was a special consultant in Agricultural Trade and Economic Development. His mother hails from Ecuador, and Chauncey, while raised in Ashland, Kentucky, became fluent in Spanish, which made him perfectly suited to initiating this "emerging markets" program.

Since arriving at Keeneland, Chauncey has expanded the reach of this program to include nearly every country in the world that races Thoroughbred horses. The benefit to both breeders who sell at Keeneland and those from other countries who buy at Keeneland is immeasurable. The simple fact is that, as the world of racing contracts, we must all find ways to work together, world-wide, in order to ensure that racing remains viable. Keeneland's program is one that positively impacts that necessity.

My efforts have been to establish business relationships and to enhance the sales experience for our clients from these South American countries. At the same time, in an effort to improve the lot of breeders there, I have been recently involved in the introduction of a “selected sale” format for yearling sales, which is foreign to their traditional sale format. Prior to the introduction of this “selected” format, the sales season was endless; one farm sold their crop of yearlings this week, another the following week, skip a week and another farm sold. For the local buying audience, this method was tried and true. But for an international buyer, participation was virtually impossible due to the huge investment of time necessary.

With the introduction of the “selected” format, many breeders, large or small, now have the opportunity to send some of their best yearlings to one single sale, where the buyers can find a wealth of excellent stock, at one time and at one place.

The breeders in Sao Paulo and Parana, Brazil, were the first to adopt this new sales format in 2008. At that first “selected” sale, 24 different breeders presented 66 sensational individuals in Sao Paulo for the opening session of a three-day yearling sale. From this initial “select” group came Tenarin (Brz) (Romarin {Brz}), winner of the G1 Sao Paulo Derby; Timeo (Brz) (First American), 2nd in the Derby and winner of the G1 Grande Premio J. Ademar de Almeida Prado (equivalent to the Breeders’ Cup in Brazil); and Inchatillon (Brz) (Inexplicable), winner of the G1 Grande Premio Diana (equivalent to the Oaks).

The following year, from an equally small, but significant group, came Uareoutlaw (Brz) (Christine’s Outlaw), later named champion 2-year-old colt. A 20% strike-rate for stakes-level horses has been produced from these “selected” sales in Brazil. This speaks to the quality on-offer from breeders in Brazil. My job was simply to select the very best from each breeder’s entries. The average price for yearlings from this sale has risen each year since its inception, accomplishing the primary mission.


The 2010 sale-topper in Brazil, Tiger Woods (Brz), from young sire Tiger Heart’s first crop, recently won the G3 Grande Premio Presidente Queiroz in Sao Paulo by 12 lengths. This colt was the sole yearling produced by Fernando Perche, a small breeder, which emphasizes the importance of the “selected” sale format. Also from the 2010 sale came the undefeated Tiger Heart filly Licca-Chan (Brz), now a Group 2 winner in Rio de Janeiro and Sao Paulo. She comes from Sylvio Bertoli’s Haras Santarem, the breeder of 2010 G1 Dubai World Cup winner Gloria De Campeao (Brz) (Impression {Arg}), and also the farm at which Tiger Heart stands stud duty. Licca-Chan races for Sergio Menezes of Haras Sao Jose da Serra, where Macho Uno stood his first Southern Hemisphere season in 2010.

Additionally, the 2-year-old filly Alta Vista (Brz) (Amigoni {Ire}), bred and sold by Alexandre Frare's Haras Cifra, has won a Group 2 and remains undefeated in Sao Paulo.

In 2010, Antonio Bullrich decided to try this new "selected" format in Argentina. Breeders were wary, but interested to see if this format would attract new, international buyers. From a group of roughly 350 yearlings inspected, 20 different breeders presented 78 exceptionally well-conformed, "selected" yearlings. The sale was set for May 9. Immediately before the sale was to take place, an outbreak of Equine Viral Arteritis occurred outside Buenos Aires. The sale was postponed until June.

Ordinarily, this sort of hiccup would spell disaster for a yearling sale, but the Copa Bullrich "selected" sale saw record prices and record averages for the breeders who participated.

As a result, the interest in the "selection" for 2011 has been dramatically up from last year. We inspected over 500 yearlings, with many new farms from all over Argentina joining in, and a resultant group of nearly 150 "select" yearlings will be sold in two days this year.

Performance results from the 2010 sale have been positive as well. From the 78 presented have come standouts such as recent Group 1 and Group 2 stakes-winner Angiolo (Arg) (Grand Reward), bred and sold by Haras La Quebrada. The colt has won in such handy fashion as to be considered early favorite for champion 2-year-old honors early in the season. Graduates also include recent maiden winner Buen Verso (Arg) (Distorted Humor), owned by a group of American buyers, and there is rumor that the best is yet to come from this initial group of "selected" yearlings.

The Leilao International Sale will be held in Curitiba, Parana, Brazil, Apr. 13. The best approach is to fly to Sao Paulo and take a short flight to Curitiba from there. Curitiba is a medium-sized city, similar to Lexington, Kentucky, and is a very safe and pleasant city. The sale facility is located within the Jockey Club (Hipodromo do Taruma, Curitiba), and there are several nice hotels in the area. Parana is a very concentrated center of Thoroughbred breeding, where many of the finest breeding farms are located, all within minutes of each other.

A half-brother to 2010 G1 Dubai World Cup winner Gloria De Campeao (Brz) (Impression {Arg}), by the highly successful Wild Event, is offered by Haras Santarem and will be the centerpiece of the event this year. He is an absolutely magnificent colt.

The Copa Bullrich Sale is scheduled for May 8-10. (For the catalogue, click [here](#)). The premier "selected" sessions are the 8th and 9th. The sale is to be held at the sale facility at the Jockey Club of San Isidro, just outside the city center of Buenos Aires. You can find many fine hotels and restaurants in Buenos Aires, regarded as one of the loveliest, big cities in the world.

An interesting feature to the Argentine sale this year will be the first crops of shuttle stallions such as Giant's Causeway, Johannesburg and El Corredor, and new to Argentina, The Leopard, Key Deputy and Van Nistelrooy. Also represented by Southern Hemisphere yearlings are El Prado (Ire), Tiznow, Malibu Moon and Awesome Again. For the buyer from outside Argentina, there are yearlings by familiar sires, but once there, your head may be turned by those less familiar. Regardless your inclination, you will find a stellar bunch of yearlings from which to choose.

If we have gathered the excellent individuals for these sales that I believe we have, and if this “selected” format helps to attract a larger international buying audience, and if the breeders in these countries realize greater profit for their product, then we will have done what we set out to do. I am proud of this mission sponsored by Keeneland. It directly represents exactly what Keeneland is all about--a tangible means of elevating the status of racing and breeding throughout the world, and working together with our foreign partners to ensure that racing continues to be a viable and exciting sport. International racing events have proven the quality of the South American horse, and their achievements speak for themselves. The worldwide racing community can no longer afford to think parochially. We must think globally with a greater emphasis on community. This small contribution was made as a step in that direction. Hopefully, a rising tide will lift all boats.

2011 HALL OF FAME FINALISTS ANNOUNCED

Jockeys John Velazquez, Calvin Borel and Garrett Gomez along with trainer Jerry Hollendorfer are among the first-time finalists for election into the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame, it was announced yesterday. They are joined on the ballot by previous finalists jockey Alex Solis, trainers Gary Jones and Robert Wheeler in the human categories and Open Mind, Safely Kept and Sky Beauty in the equine category. The finalists were selected by the Hall of Fame's 16-member Nominating Committee from a total of 80 candidates suggested throughout the year by turf journalists, Thoroughbred industry participants and racing fans. To be eligible, trainers must have been active for 25 years and jockeys must have been active for 20 years. Thoroughbreds must have been retired for five years. All candidates must have been active within the past 25 years. A separate Historic Review Committee is assigned to consider candidates whose careers were completed more than 25 years ago. Hall of Fame voters may select as many candidates they deem worthy of induction into the Hall. The four candidates with the highest vote totals will be inducted at public ceremonies to be held Aug. 12 at 10:30 a.m. in the Humphrey Finney Sales Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, New York.

Purse Tax Dropped:

A proposed 2 3/4% tax on purse winnings proposed by New York Governor Andrew Cuomo was removed from the state budget, which is currently pending approval in Albany, *Daily Racing Form* reports. Cuomo had suggested that the tax would help raise about \$8 million annually for the New York State Racing and Wagering Board. Trainer Rick Violette Jr., president of the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, told *DRF* that evidence was presented to state officials showing that the New York racing industry had paid \$68 million in taxes to the state in the last fiscal year. Cuomo argued that the state's taxpayers were responsible for subsidizing the NYSRWB. "It was a stretch saying that the general population was footing the tax bill for the racing industry," Violette told the *Form*. "That isn't so. Fortunately, cooler heads prevailed."
