TEAM VALORS BUYS SUMMER SOIREE

Summer Soiree (War Front), a 10 3/4-length winner of last Saturday's GIII Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway, has been purchased for an undisclosed sum by Team Valor International. The 3-year-old filly will be pointed to the May 6 GI Kentucky Oaks. Graham Motion, who trains all of Team

Valor's North American stock, will receive the War Front filly Monday afternoon, after she is flown from Hot Springs, Arkansas, to Lexington, Kentucky. Motion plans to breeze the filly three times prior to the filly Classic in Louisville. Previously campaigned by Brereton C. Jones, his son Bret Jones and the Wahoo Partners LL, the filly was stakes placed at two, but is undefeated in two starts at three, including a 9 3/4-length allowance victory at Oaklawn Jan. 30. "We saw her race in person [last] Saturday and we were ultra impressed with her," said Barry Irwin, CEO of Team Valor International. "She appeared to be just galloping. [Trainer] Larry Jones has done a remarkable job with her."

RACETRACK Round-Up

Fairy Sound Again...

Cristina Patino's **Snow Fairy (Ire)** (Intikhab) has recovered from the injury which ruled her out of last Saturday's G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, trainer Ed Dunlop announced yesterday. Royal Ascot has been penciled in for the seasonal bow of the four-time Group 1 winner, with the June 15 G1 Prince of Wales's S. her most likely target. "Snow Fairy returned earlier in the week and she seems fine, we jogged her up and she's very good," her conditioner told *PA Sport*. "We are just going to run a few more tests on her and then we'll get a picture of what we need to do and where we are. Any injury is annoying, but she danced every dance last year, so we will be looking towards the middle part of the season and onwards." Dunlop also had news of last year's G3 Solario S. winner **Native Khan (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}), who is Guineas-bound. "He's wintered very well, we've been pleased with his work so far and we're happy with him," he said. "He'll run in either race [the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket Apr. 30 or G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 15] and hopefully all goes well. He won't go for a trial, he'll run in either Guineas first time out."

Black Caviar Rated World's Best...

Off her dominating win under 128 pounds in the Mar. 12 G1 Newmarket H., **Black Caviar (Aus)** (Bel Esprit {Aus}) has been given an international rating of 130, tops in the world for the six-month period between Oct. 1, 2010 and Mar. 27, 2011. Her rating puts her just ahead of G1 Breeders' Cup Classic hero Blame (Arch, 129) and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Workforce (GB) (King's Best, 128), and easily surpasses the previous high awarded a sprinter (Oasis Dream {GB}, 125). "This is a historic day for Australian racing and breeding," *Aushorse* Chairman Antony Thompson said. "Not only does it show our breeders can breed the very best horses in the world, but it also shows the respect in which Australian racing is now held." Bred by Rick Jamieson, four-year-old Black Caviar was an A\$210,000 purchase from the draft of Swettenham Stud at the Inglis Melbourne Premier Yearling Sale and is perfect in her 11 career starts for earnings of A\$2.5 million.

Berry to Ride J P's Gusto in Arkansas Derby...

Gem Stables' **J P's Gusto** (Successful Appeal), winner of last season's GI Del Mar Futurity, will be ridden by Oaklawn's leading rider Cliff Berry in the Apr. 16 GI Arkansas Derby. The pair teamed up for a 'bullet'

five-furlong breeze in :58 3/5 over the fast track Thursday morning. Trained by Joe Petalino, J P's Gusto galloped out in 1:12 2/5, the fastest six-furlong time of the morning. Berry also worked the colt prior to a seventh-place finish in the Mar. 19 GII Rebel S., in which Ramon Dominguez had the mount. "That's


what I was looking for," said Petalino. "I was hoping the horse would be closer to the front in his last race.

Hopefully, this time we can get that trip." In the Rebel, the bay was rated off a crisp early pace set by **The Factor** (War Front), trained by Bob Baffert.

"[Bob Baffert] came in here and scared everybody saying 'don't go with me,'" said Petalino. "I was actually hoping to run with him. As fast as the track was playing that day, I was looking forward to it." The Factor also remains a likely candidate for the Arkansas Derby, although Baffert has yet to commit the winner of the GII San Vicente S. to the nine-furlong contest.

Sway Away Drills for Arkansas Derby...

The California colt **Sway Away** (Afleet Alex) returned to the worktab yesterday morning with a five-furlong move in :59 3/5 at Oaklawn in preparation for the GI Arkansas Derby. Under jockey Luis Quinonez, the sophomore broke off for his workout moments before fellow Arkansas Derby hopeful J P's Gusto set out on a similar five-furlong move. While the colt galloped out six panels, an official time was not recorded. "It was just a maintenance work, but Luis said he didn't have to put any pressure on the horse," said trainer Jeff Bonde by phone from Santa Anita Park in California. "Luis said he just sort of let the horse do it on his own and my guy said the gallop out was like 12 and 2." Sway Away, who was runner-up in the Feb. 20 GII San Vicente S., will be ridden by Garrett Gomez in the Arkansas Derby.

For Peachtree Stable's John Fort, success in the horse business has always been about finding value. The South Carolinian, whose interest in horses began as a teen when he observed Hall of Fame conditioners Max Hirsch and Woody Stephens training near his home at the old Fair Grounds Training Center in Camden, has built a powerful and successful stable by developing a keen eye for talent and potential in individuals that others gloss over. Fort was a successful polo player and



worked briefly as a school teacher after graduating from the University of South Carolina, but having a career in the horse industry was what he always wanted, so he found a way to make it happen.

Fort founded Seaside Stable--which would eventually become Peachtree--in 1976, purchasing polo ponies and horses off the track, training them, and reselling them for a profit.

"At that time, there weren't really any retirement facilities for horses," Fort recalled. "The horse slaughter business was big back then, and there was a sad end to a lot of racehorses' careers at that time. There were

some dealers, however, that were aware that there were people like me who would take them and try to recycle them into useful purpose."

"Some of the horses were mares, so I figured out how to get pedigrees and I bred those mares to local Thoroughbred stallions," he continued. "I even bought a share in a stallion in Ocala named Princely Pleasure. I found that the same mares I was buying for \$400-500 off the racetrack were selling for \$5,000 in foal. I got intrigued by the business. I had my polo trailer and I'd take mares down to the OBS sales in the early days--back in 1978, '79, '80--and sell them. It doesn't seem like a lot to me today, but at that time I was kind of squeezing out a living in the horse business, which is what I wanted to do."

After a brief stint working for famed Calumet Farm trainer John Veitch, Fort relocated his operation to Atlanta and renamed it Peachtree. He continued to grow his business, and had a breakthrough in 2001 with \$105,000 KEESEP yearling Invisible Ink, who finished third in that year's GI Florida Derby and second in the GI Kentucky Derby behind Monarchos, en route to \$465,088 in career earnings.

"We had won a lot of races, and I think I was pretty well-known in the business, but Invisible Ink was the first horse to put us on the national stage," said Fort. "He got a lot of publicity from ABC and all the other news outlets and he was a very important horse to me. I'm in the horse business, and he just was a horse that seemed to really make a lot of stuff happen after that."

Fort enjoyed continued sporting and financial success in the following years both individually and in partnership, selling future GI Cigar Mile H. winner Lion Tamer, whom he bought for \$180,000 at Keeneland in 2001, privately to Michael Tabor off a seven-length maiden win at Belmont in September of 2002. He also turned a hefty profit with GSW Chimichurri, a \$250,000 FTFEB juvenile in 2002 who Fort sold as a horse of racing age for \$675,000 the following year at KEENOV. Fort also purchased future MGSW India for \$400,000 in 2003 at FTSAUG, and sold the filly back to her breeders, Frank and Jane Lyon, for a reported \$2.05 million after a 12-length maiden romp at Saratoga in 2005.

One of the accomplishments that Fort is most proud of is multiple Grade I-winning millionaire Red Giant's world record-setting performance for 1 1/4 miles in the 2001 GI Clement L. Hirsch S. on the turf at Oak Tree at Santa Anita.

"I think it's pretty remarkable that he set a world record for a mile and a quarter, the classic American distance--1:57 flat for a mile and a quarter is running pretty fast. I'm really proud of that," beamed Fort.

Fort, who has about 10-12 horses currently in training with Bob Baffert, Steve Margolis, Rick Dutrow Jr. and Cathal Lynch, as well as about 25 mares boarded at Pine Grove Plantation near Camden, has a trio of sophomores who look poised to add to the Peachtree legacy.

Last Sunday, the Baffert-trained **Plum Pretty** (Medaglia d'Oro), third in her previous start in the GI Las Virgenes at Santa Anita Mar. 27, took the Sunland Park Oaks by 25 lengths. That's right--25 lengths.

"I asked Bob if he had ever won a race by 25 lengths," Fort relayed. "He said, 'No way!' The most he could remember was Point Given winning the Belmont by 12 1/4 lengths which is, of course, more important than winning the Sunland Park Oaks by 25 lengths, but still."

"She was a nice filly, she had been training well," Fort said "She'd been in those one-turn races out in California against a whole different level of horses. The switch to two turns was a big part of it, as was the fact that [MGISW] Turbulent Descent and those horses weren't in the race. What can happen in a race like that is that those fillies simply weren't as good as Plum Pretty, and when they tried to run with her early, they just couldn't keep up. She pushed them out of their comfort zone, and the race was pretty much just left to her."

Plum Pretty, who RNA'd for \$75,000 as a yearling at FTMOCT, is one of those value buys that Fort has built his business on. He scooped her up for just \$130,000 as a juvenile at OBS March.

"There wasn't anything *not* to like about her," Fort recalled when asked how he picked Plum Pretty out of the sale. "Obviously, the pedigree was there. If pedigrees are already made, then typically you can't afford horses or you're paying a premium. I have to create value. The pedigree was extremely make-able. The mare had had three or four foals and hadn't had any winners, but those are the kind of pedigrees you can step into with the right individual and 'boom,' whereas other people are thinking 'That mare's never going to produce anything.'" **Cont. pxxx**

Fort continued, "I would describe Plum Pretty physically, as a two-year-old in training, as having the right frame, but she was very unfinished. But, I grew up used to looking at unfinished horses and that might have given me an edge."

Fort used an interesting analogy to describe buying at a two-year-old sale.

"It's like playing poker," he explained. "You pay a little more for every card you look at. Sometimes I can't really afford to pay the premium for a horse who works in :10 flat or :09 4/5 or whatever it is, but every once in a while at the two-year-old sales there are horses like Plum Pretty. I think good horses can be anywhere, and every time I buy a horse I'm looking for an edge. You always have to look for an edge, because there are still buyers out there with plenty of money who are going to outbid you on the obvious horses. You can wait until they get to the racetrack and break their maiden by 10 lengths down at Calder, and then you've seen another card and there's another whole group of people waiting to see that card. And they pay a lot."

Fort was willing to dig a little deeper, however, for a colt fittingly named **Red Ace**, who he scooped up for \$300,000 at FTFEB, which was \$165,000 more than the next most expensive two-year-old by Northern Afleet purchased in 2010. The \$77,000 KEESEP yearling broke his maiden in ultra-impressive fashion second out by 6 1/2 lengths at Fair Grounds Mar. 13 for Steve Margolis after running fourth on debut behind "TDN Rising Star" Bind (Pulpit).

"He was an expensive purchase for me," Fort admitted. "He is a truly beautiful horse, and he was truly beautiful at the two-year-old sale. [Taylor Made V.P. of Boarding Operations] Frank Taylor came up to me 15 or 20 minutes after I bought Red Ace and said, 'John, that is the most beautiful Northern Afleet that has ever been born.' Then he amplified that and said, 'I take that back--that's the most beautiful Northern Afleet that will ever be born.'"


Despite the somewhat lofty price tag, Fort still believes Red Ace was a bargain.

"Northern Afleet is not a real commercial stallion," Fort said of the sire of five 2011 stakes winners, headed by GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. upsetter Teaks North. "He's just one of those stallions that has a lot of stakes winners, but everyone walks right on by him. Red Ace hadn't sold for much as a yearling--I did not see him as a yearling--he sold deep into the sale. And he didn't work real fast, but I liked the way he worked. He worked like a horse who was classy, a good mover, but didn't have that quick turn of foot that was going to get a whole class of buyers attention. Actually, a lot of the people that bid against me on him were trainers as opposed to agents. I was thrilled to get him."

Red Ace will resurface in a 1 1/16-mile allowance event on the Polytrack at Keeneland Apr. 16, and the Ontario-bred's long-term goal is the Jun. 26 Queen's Plate, the first leg of the Canadian Triple Crown.

Fort's **Flashpoint**, who took the GI Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream by 7 1/4 lengths Feb. 26, will contest Sunday's GI Florida Derby in his first two-turn try for Richard Dutrow Jr.

"I'm running in the Florida Derby because I can visualize a favorable pace scenario," Fort, whose charge has been categorized by many as merely a sprinter, explained. "No race is easy to win--Grade I races are impossible to win, but I think we have a shot."

Surprisingly, and refreshingly considering the prevalence of "Derby Fever" that tends to plague many owners, Fort said that Flashpoint could run well in the Florida Derby, but not ship to Kentucky for the First Saturday in May. "It's really important to realize that these regional derbies like the Florida Derby are really old, prestigious races...I'd love to win the Florida Derby, and then I'll think about the next race that I have to win, but it's not mandatory that the Florida Derby winner go to the Kentucky Derby. Although, I'm not ruling that out, and I haven't won the Florida Derby yet."

"I've been in the Derby three times," Fort said. "I haven't won it yet. I'd really like to win it, because it's such an important achievement and a legacy achievement and it would be great financially as well, but being in the Derby is not that big of a deal to me at this point. I also think I've got a real strong hand with Plum Pretty in the [GI Kentucky] Oaks, and if we had a real contender for the Oaks that would be great for that weekend. We don't have to get too greedy."

But, with all the success Fort has enjoyed, could you blame him?

WRITERS UP

FARM HOPPING IN SOUTH AMERICA by Tom Thornbury, Keeneland's Associate Director of Sales

The excellent quality of the yearlings selected for the sales in Brazil and Argentina is typical of that found in South America. First of all, the climate is pleasant, never harsh, which encourages growth and early maturity.

Secondly, in both Brazil and Argentina, you will find an agrarian-based economy. Both countries raise oceans of soy beans, corn, sugar cane and huge herds of cattle.

Argentina is blessed with dark, rich soil and thousand of square

miles of endless, flat topography. Brazil is equally blessed with productive soil, but also with a more temperate climate and more rainfall. Both are huge countries, but Brazil's size is fantastic. Everything grows there in abundance, and Brazil dominates the world's orange juice, coffee, rubber, soy bean and sugar markets. In fact, Brazil runs its cars on ethanol produced from sugar. Ethanol is produced far more efficiently from sugar than from corn, and its use in ethanol production does not reduce availability of a precious food source, as does using corn. There is no argument as to where the best beef in the world is produced--South America. The grass is knee-deep, and there is little need to fatten the cattle with grain.

This year, the Keeneland inspection team spent two weeks inspecting yearlings from many farms, large and small, all over Argentina.

The majority of the older, more established farms are located within an hour or two from Buenos Aires in San Antonio de Areco and Capitan Sarmiento. Farms like El Paraiso raise hundreds of horses on immense pasture that has been in the family for several generations. They stand notable sire Incurable Optimist, sire of multiple champion and Horse of the Year Life of Victory (Arg). Nearby, Arroyo de Luna breeds to race and sell and stand respected sire Not for Sale, sire of Asiatic Boy (Arg) and Forty Licks (Arg), to name just a couple.

Other successful farms in this area include Alessandro Miserochi's Santa Ines, from which came "Horse of the World" Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes); and Haras La Pasion, the farm of prominent racing stable Rubio B.'s owner Ricardo Benedicto and his son Nicolas, who are on track to be a major force in breeding as well as racing. Stallion station La Mission handles a long list of shuttle stallions, which has included Giant's Causeway, Johannesburg and Pollard's Vision. Another new upstart in the stallion business is American-styled La Leyenda, owned by Alberto and Renata Stein, where they have shuttle stallions Exchange Rate and Offlee Wild.

We made inspection stops at nearly every Thoroughbred breeding farm in the region. We visited Haras Carampangue, operated by the younger Ignacio Pavlovsky, where sire-sensation Orpen stands and Chenault, a new venture with some really well-bred, top-quality yearlings. **Cont. p9**

We also visited De La Pomme, owned by the Liberman family, who have extensive investments in South American racing through LARC (Latin America Racing Channel) and Hipodromo Maronas in Montevideo, Uruguay; Don Arcangel, owned by Pablo Maggio, who stands Manipulator (Ire); El Catorce, owned by

professional soccer player Claudio Pizarro, who also has a great group of yearlings for the sale; El Mallin, owned by Antonio Bullrich, who is the president of both the Bullrich Sale Company and the Hipodromo Argentino de Palermo; Haras Esperanza, owned by Raul Lottero, a very

passionate breeder; Haras Melincue, a farm with beautifully designed and built facilities and some very fine horses as well; and Haras Vacacion, owned by Pablo Zavaleta, where there is a deep, rich history of successful breeding and racing.

A little farther out, La Quebrada is run by young master horseman Hernan Ceriani, following decades of success by his father, and has a strong line-up of stallions, like Easing Along, sire of multiple champion and recent Horse of the Year Interaction (Arg), and Southern Halo, whose success needs no validation. The young horses are raised far away at a second farm, where they have huge pastures, surrounded by thousands of acres of grain crops.

Juan Carlos Bago's Firmamento, in both nearby La Plata and distant Mar del Plata, is annually considered for Breeder of the Year. Much farther out are farms such as Alfredo Camogli's Alfalfar, from which have come legions of successful racehorses, like recent 2-year-old filly star La Toscana Cat (Arg) (Easing Along).

La Biznaga, owned by Carlos Blaquier, is a two-hour trip away by twin-engine plane. It is a magnificent farm with extraordinary success, having stood Bernstein, who has had even greater success in Argentina than in the United States as a graded-stakes producer.

The farm of Julio Bozano, Santa Maria de Araras, transcends the scope of nearly any farm in the world. There are branches of this farm in Mar del Plata and Capitan Sarmiento in Argentina, one in Curitiba, Parana and Bage in Brazil, and one in Ocala, Florida, and their colors are on winners world-wide in the highest levels of competition. Dr. Ignacio Pavlovsky, one of Argentina's most highly respected horsemen, is the general manager there.

Our trip also took us into the distant provinces of La Pampa, Cordoba and Rosario, the "bread-basket" of Argentina. In these provinces, you will find endless expanses of pastureland, huge herds of cattle, and thousands of acres of soy beans, wheat, corn and sugar cane. In La Pampa, we visited the farm of Javier "Vasco" Zubizaretta, Haras Ustasti. He has the distinction, as a breeder, of having bred two Argentine Derby winners in the past few years.

In Cordoba we stopped at La Forteleza, owned by Horacio and Marcella Andrenacci. Horacio is involved in cattle and grain production on a huge scale and Marcella is actually the force behind the Thoroughbred breeding side of things. At Haras Don Florentino, owned by Luis Grimaldi, they are principally grain producers. However, they stand the very popular sire Alpha Plus, and they breed to race and sell. Their primary sales are held at the farm, although they will be sending some special individuals to the Copa Bullrich Sale this year. From there, we traveled to Rosario to the farm of Walter Tombolini, Haras Viejo Tombo.

Adjacent to town, this farm is more comparable to an American farm in size. There is more than ample space and excellent pasture, and Tombolini is constantly upgrading his breeding stock with mares from the United States.

There are four major areas of breeding in Brazil. One area is within the state of Sao Paulo, a huge expanse of farmland outside the highly commercial city of Sao

Paulo, in the center of Brazil, south of Rio de Janeiro. Some of the farms there are thousands of acres in scope, where primarily coffee, oranges, cattle, rubber trees, forests of eucalyptus trees for pulp-wood, sugar cane, soy beans and corn are raised. The

operation on many of these farms is just a component of the overall farm production. Farms are located at long distances from one another in this region. Some of the major breeding farms in Sao Paulo are Calunga, Interlagos, Sao Jose & Expeditus, Louveira, Vale Verde, Sao Quirino, San Francesco, Fazenda Boa Vista, and Caporanga.

In Parana, a state to the south of Sao Paulo, located in the mountains and close to the Atlantic coast, the farms are smaller, more centrally located, and horse production is primary, although with the rising prices for commodities, lots of acres are now covered with soy beans, sugar cane and corn. The climate there is unusual for Brazil; because it is located in the mountains and close to the sea, it remains cool, with constant rain year-round. It is similar in climate to Ireland, and the soil is dark and rich, unlike the predominant red clay soils throughout the rest of Brazil. Some of the country's most successful breeders are located here; Santarem, Anderson, Springfield, Curitibaano, Chesapeake, Palmerini, Santa Rita da Serra, San Jose da Serra, Santa Maria de Araras, J.B. Barros, and Haras Valente. There are a

number of other breeders located in Parana that, along with these larger farms, contribute horses for racing in Curitiba, Sao Paulo, and Rio de Janeiro.



Springfield

Farther to the south is the region of Bage, where some of the most prolific and successful breeders reside, such as TNT, Old Friends, Anderson, Santa Maria de Araras, Doce Vale, and Fazenda Monthesir. In Bage, the farm land is primarily dedicated to soy beans, sugar cane, cattle and rice production. The Thoroughbred operations are very large and the climate can be very hot, dry, and more harsh, but great for hay production.

This area is physically closer to Uruguay and Argentina, and most of these big outfits have farms elsewhere in Brazil, as well as in Argentina.

Additionally, there is a huge breeding operation in Ponta Pora, which lays half in Brazil and half in Paraguay, Haras Ponta Pora. The region is one of the largest expanses of farmland in Brazil, dedicated to soy beans, corn and sugar cane. One of the world's largest ethanol production plants is there, along with an assembly plant for John Deere tractors and combines that has become the company's number one production plant. Ponta Pora, owned by Camil Georges, is always among the leading breeders throughout Brazil, as they have more than 300 mares and the popular stallion Durban Thunder (Brz).

The horsemanship throughout South America, and particularly in Argentina, is arguably the best in the world. Everyone either plays polo or rides to tend cattle herds (or horses), and the farm workers are "gauchos," or they have been steeped in the gaucho-way. The passion for breeding and racing horses goes back centuries to the introduction of the horse by Spanish con-

querors. The art has been refined through importation of deep European bloodlines, and more recently enhanced by the American speed-breed.

Argentine polo is in a league of its own. Exceptionally talented players, such as Adolfo Cambiaso, make millions as professional players, as well as through selling polo ponies. In fact, Bullrich had a sale this year of 25 polo ponies from Cambiaso's stable, La Dolfina, which brought total receipts of \$3,119,000. One individual, a "clone" of Cambiaso's best-ever polo mare went for an astounding \$800,000.

South American countries cling to a traditional agrarian life, and it's not unusual to find that several generations of families have grown up working on farms, where they tend crops, work cattle and raise horses. The horses raised are durable, strong, solid of bone and hoof, and are generally of exceptional physical conformation. Those selected for these particular sales are the leggy type, with depth of girth, lovely top-lines, and are long striding, Classic-distance type horses. They match up with the best found anywhere in the world, and the South American horse is undeniably competitive wherever in the world they race.

LIFETIME BAN FOR PARAGALLO Ernie Paragallo has been handed a lifetime ban from the New York State Racing and Wagering Board and has been barred from all racetrack properties in the state. Paragallo also appears to be headed to jail after a New York appellate judge rejected Paragallo's appeal of the 2010 conviction on 33 counts of animal-cruelty charges. The 52-year-old resident of Long Island was sentenced to two years in prison last year for the mistreatment of his horses at his Center Brook Farm in Greene County, New York. "The actions today by my Board send a strong signal that there is no place for anyone in the racing industry who mistreats horses and obfuscates his connection to horses that run on our tracks," John D. Sabatini, chairman of the State Racing and Wagering Board told *The New York Times*. After voting for the ban, board member Charles Diamond also recommended that the New York legislature change its law to make cruelty to animals a felony.

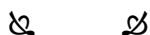

PUERTO RICO CHAMPIONS ANNOUNCED

Puerto Rican Stud Book officials have named **Soy Conquistador** (Sweetnorthernstain--Beth's Appeal, by Valid Appeal) as the island's Horse of the Year and champion older horse for the second straight year. The 2010 Camarero awards honor native-bred and imported divisional championships in Puerto Rican racing. Soy Conquistador won all nine of his starts last year, including the Dia del Verano and Antornio R. Barcelo, both recognized as Group 1 events in Puerto Rico. He became the fifth older horse to win more than five stakes in one season and the first horse to win Horse of the Year in consecutive years since **Defensora** (My Favorite Place) in 2007-08. Campaigned by Establo Edelsam, Soy Conquistador also was proclaimed champion sprinter. Conditioned by Maximo Gomez, the Puerto Rican-bred earned \$222,615 during his championship season. He has won 26 of 43 starts in six racing seasons and has banked \$847,933 in earnings. Bred in Puerto Rico by Juan Luna's Potrero Luna Inc, the seven-year-old was produced by the Valid Appeal mare Beth's Appeal. One other re-elected champion was **Defensora**, older mare. Other Puerto Rican champions include **Okairy M** (Billions), two-year-old filly; **El Negro Torres** (Don Guido), two-year-old male; **El Inspirado** (Peaks And Valleys), three-year-old male; and **La Sabanera** (Virtua Cop), three-year-old female. Imported horses, all bred in the U.S., honored were **La Glamorosa** (Fire Slam), two-year-old filly; **Vuelve Ruben M** (Concerto), two-year-old colt; **Cuqui's Love** (Afleet Alex), three-year-old filly; **Munra** (Ecton Park), three-year-old male; **Dreaming Of Victory** (Victory Gallop), older horse; and **Gale In The Vale** (Cat Thief), older mare.
