PREMIER PEGASUS OUT OF SANTA ANITA DERBY

Myung Kwon Cho's **Premier Pegasus** (Fusaichi Pegasus), who was originally installed as the 8-5 morning line favorite for Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby, was scratched from the \$1-million event yesterday after he

was diagnosed with a fracture in the cannon bone of his left foreleg following a gallop over Santa Anita's training track. "Rafael Martinez, who is Mr. Cho's assistant, called me in the racing office at about 1:25 p.m.," explained Zachary Soto, Santa Anita's stakes coordinator. "Rafael said, 'The horse is hurt and he can't run. Please put in a scratch.'" Maria Ayala, also an assistant to Cho, who bred, owns and trains Premier Pegasus, told *Daily Racing Form*, "The doctor said he had a hairline fracture of the cannon bone."

Ayala added, "Not good. The horse is okay. He ate good. Mr. Cho, said, 'Maria, relax. It's not your fault.'" Cho's charge was coming off a 7 3/4-length romp in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 12. Zayat Stables's San Felipe runner-up and 2010 GI Norfolk S. winner **Jaycito** (Victory Gallop) will inherit morning line favoritism at updated odds of 2-1.

INGLIS EASTER WRAPS UP WITH GAINS


The Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale concluded its strong three-day run Thursday, with a son of Redoute's Choice (Aus) out of the stakes-placed Singspiel (Ire) mare Park Esteem (Ire) bringing A\$850,000 (US\$888,781) from Peter Moody during the Session I finale. The top-per, consigned by Cressfield Stud as **lot 393**, is out of a 3/4-sister to G1 Dubai World Cup hero Moon Ballad (Ire) (Singspiel {Ire}). Led by a strong international buying bench, Session I realized cumulative gains in both average and median. Cont. p2

“One of the most pleasing aspects of the sale was the depth of the buying bench,” Inglis Managing Director Mark Webster revealed. “We are not relying on one or two major buyers to boost the figures and it was pleasing to see so many different names among the top buyers this year. In particular, we have had very good overseas representation over the past three days.” He continued, “Similarly, the broad strength of the stallions also has to be viewed as a positive sign for the industry. While Redoute’s Choice and Encosta de Lago (Aus) are still the benchmarks, others like Fastnet Rock (Aus) and More Than Ready have also emerged, along with exciting new stallions like Street Sense and Bernardini, providing top end buyers with more options.” James Harron secured the day’s second-highest priced lot, a More Than Ready--November Flight (Aus) (Flying Spur {Aus}) colt from the Kitchwin Hills draft for A\$810,000. “I looked at Elite Falls [More Than Ready’s Group 2-winning Golden Slipper placegetter] eight or nine times last year and didn’t buy her, so we were keen to make sure we got this fellow,” Harron said of [lot 378](#). The James Bester/Demi O’Byrne tandem, which led all buyers with six yearlings purchased for A\$3.51 million, continued their shopping spree with [lot 405](#), a son of Encosta de Lago (Aus) out of Pinezero (Aus) (Danzero {Aus}). KEENELAND APRIL TWO-YEAR-OLDS in TRAINING SALE

Monday, April 11 • 4 p.m.

FOUR AT :9 4/5 DURING PREVIEW

The lone under-tack preview for the Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale was held yesterday in Lexington. The sale will be held this Monday, Apr. 11, beginning at 4 p.m. Four horses breezed an eighth in :9 4/5 to share the bullet for the distance. The first to do so was [hip 107](#), a colt by City Place--Bourbon Night (Arch) who went out during the first set. The Florida-bred dark bay, named Midnight Bourbon, is offered as the property of Jon Jazdzewski.

Not long after the first renovation break, [hip 150](#), a filly from the first crop of Street Sense--Gwinnett (Vindication) from Murray Smith's consignment also worked in :9 4/5. The dark bay is a granddaughter of MSW & MGSP Wilzada (Meadowlake). Two more horses hit the

mark during the second set. [Hip 138](#), a colt by Broken Vow--Fashion Girl (Tactical Cat), flew the flag for Eddie Woods's consignment. The Florida-bred colt's dam was a stakes-winning juvenile at Monmouth. He was followed by [hip 147](#), a colt by Street Sense--Good Student (Arg) (Louis Quatorze) from Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree consignment. Hip 147's dam, Good Student, was a Group 3 winner in South America before being Grade I-placed in California.

Two horses shared the bullet for a quarter mile after working in :20 4/5. [Hip 122](#), a colt by Empire Maker--Cosmic Wish (Dixieland Band), was the lone horse to achieve the feat during the first set. The gray colt was produced by a half-sister to the hard-knocking MGSW Cosmonaut (Lemon Drop Kid) and is consigned by Niall Brennan Stables. Brennan also consigns [Hip 119](#), a colt by Hat Trick (Jpn)--Chiming Dixie (Dixieland Band), who matched the time. From his sire's first crop, the colt was produced by a full-sister to GSW Chimes Band and SW Lady Dixie. He breezed during the second set. There were no bullet workers during the third and final set, though two horses did work in :10 flat during the third set.

"It was very consistent from start to finish, and the times were very good," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. Asked about the grouping of three of the four :9 4/5 workouts in the second set, he added, "I would suspect the placement of the horses by the consignors was a matter of handicapping," he said, and not indicative of a quicker surface. "

Weather was ideal, with temps in the low 60s and a lively breeze in the morning. By 1:30 p.m., it got up to 68 degrees, and with the breeze subsiding some, the track seemed a tick faster, though that might be attributed to the track work during the initial renovation break. Attendance reflected the conditions. On hand were Darley's Jimmy Bell and Charlie Boden; Fox Hill Farm rep Tom McGreevy; bloodstock agent Tim McMurry; Stonestreet Stable advisor John Moynihan; Hidden Brook team members Dan Hall and Jack Brothers, who sat alongside trainer Chad Brown; New York trainer John Kimmel, in a box adjacent to EQB's Patti Miller; trainer Michelle Nihei; Indian Creek Farm's Shack Parrish; as well as Spendthrift farm owner B. Wayne Hughes and the farm's general manager Ned Toffey.

Team Valor International's GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero **Pluck** looks to bounce back from a dull fourth-place finish in an allowance at Tampa Mar. 12 in his sophomore debut. It will be the homebred's second start for Graham Motion, as Pluck was in the Todd Pletcher barn last year when he took the Sep. 18 GIII Summer S. at Woodbine, two slots ahead of ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Stormy Rush** and another two spots in front of **Ronin Dax**. Pluck's trouble-overcoming one-length Breeders' Cup score has since been flattered by runner-up Soldat (War Front), who annexed the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. before disappointing as the chalk in last Sunday's GI Florida Derby. "When he won the Breeders' Cup and in his win at Woodbine, he just laid his body down," Team Valor founder/CEO Barry Irwin told *Daily Racing Form*. "He was incredible. Those were over softer courses, though, and unlike what he had at Tampa. He does like some give to the ground, and I'm going to guess he could like this course at Keeneland." Millenium Farms' **Great Mills** comes in on a three-race win streak, but must answer distance concerns. The son of red-hot War Front showed speed before fading to 10th when debuted at a mile over the Fair Grounds lawn Nov. 28. He has since reeled off two scores at 5 1/2 furlongs and took the Grindstone S. over 7 1/2 furlongs of yielding sod in New Orleans Mar. 12. **Air Support**, who defeated Soldat in the GIII Pilgrim S. at Belmont in October, makes his first start since recording a troubled-trip ninth in the Juvenile Turf.

The world's highest rated racehorse, **Black Caviar**, last seen annexing the G1 William Reid S. at Moonee Valley Mar. 25, looks to increase her unbeaten record to 12. This will be her first start outside of Melbourne, her first race run going clockwise, and possibly her first try over wet ground. This also considered by many to be the best field Black Caviar has faced, but conditioner Peter Moody doesn't seem concerned. "I'm always respectful of the opposition and I'm also aware things can go wrong, but I think she has them covered," Moody told *AAP Racing*. **Hay List**, who was second to Black Caviar in the G1 Lightning S., William Reid runner-up **Crystal Lily** and last year's G1 AJC Derby winner **Shoot Out** appear to be the star's stiffest competition.



Congrats to Shuttle to Australia...

Congrats (A.P. Indy--Praise, by Mr. Prospector), America's leading first crop sire in 2010 led by Grade I heroines Turbulent Descent and Wickedly Perfect, will shuttle to Vinery Australia for the 2011 Southern Hemisphere breeding season. The Grade II winner and multiple Grade I-placed 11-year-old will be just the second stakes winner by A.P. Indy to stand in Australia. "Congrats was a Grade 2 winner who started his stud career off in Florida so, on a comparative basis, he wasn't serving a particularly high standard of mares," said Vinery Stud General Manager Peter Orton. "Yet the quality and class that he put into his stock has obviously come through and now he is getting phenomenal results." Orton added, "A.P. Indy has been one of the great sires in America for a good while and we have been keen to get one of his sons." Congrats, bred on the same cross as Pulpit and Malibu Moon, is a full-brother to graded stakes-placed sire Flatter. "Proven stallions like Congrats reduce the amount of uncertainty that you get with unproven horses, and he is a particularly good-looking horse and has obviously stamped that in his stock as a sire and upgraded his mares significantly," Orton concluded.

as a possible springboard to the May 6 GI Kentucky Oaks for his blue-blooded runner, which would offer a longer recovery time between Arienza's last start and her stakes debut, but less prep time before the Oaks. The \$800,000 KEESEP yearling's main competition will come from Fox Hill Farms' **Joyful Victory** (Tapit), who took the GIII Honeybee S. over track and trip by 8 3/4 lengths in her first start for Larry Jones. Post positions for the 1 1/16-mile \$300,000 event will be drawn today.

Sway Away Drills for Arkansas Derby...

Batman Stable, Leberz, Olsen, et al's **Sway Away** (Afleet Alex) drilled six furlongs in 1:12.60 at Oaklawn Thursday in preparation for next Saturday's \$1-million GI Arkansas Derby. The Jeff Bonde trainee, who was second in the GII Best Pal S. at Del Mar last August and runner-up in the GII San Vicente S. Feb. 20 at Santa Anita, was sixth last out in the GII Rebel S. here Mar. 19. He was the 9-5 second choice behind San Vicente and Rebel winner **The Factor** (War Front), who will also return in the Arkansas Derby. "It was a very nice work," said Luis Quinonez, who aboard for the work. "He started off a little slow like we wanted and picked it up nicely. He finished good and galloped out really good. I worked him last time also and he went in :59.00, so he's a nice horse." Garret Gomez, who rode Sway Away last time, is expected to retain the mount.

Dozen Added to Epsom Derby...

The second entry stage for the June 4 G1 Epsom Derby saw 12 colts added to the field, at a cost of £8,000 each, taking the number now engaged in the £1.25-million Classic to 134, it was announced yesterday. Heading the dozen bidding to emulate last term's winner Workforce (GB) (King's Best), himself a second-stage entry, is Godolphin's **Casamento (Ire)** (Shamardal), who won last season's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster when in the care of former trainer Michael Halford. Another added to the field is recent G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas trial winner **Dunboyne Express (Ire)** (Shamardal), who finished fifth behind Casamento at Doncaster. Further notable additions include Godolphin's **Dubai Prince (Ire)** (Shamardal), unbeaten winner of October's G3 Killavullan S.; and G3 Solario S. victor and G1 Racing Post Trophy fourth **Native Khan (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}). The last chance to enter this year's Blue Riband is the £75,000 final entry stage May 30.

When Midnight Visit crossed the finish line first in Sunday's Love Is Eternal S. at Aqueduct, she became the first black-type winner for the fledgling Thoroughbred Futures Racing, a racing partnership started two years ago by Adam Corndorf and Andrew Cary. Thoroughbred Futures currently has two groups of horses in training--four 4-year-olds and four 3-year-olds--and over 30 partners. All of the stable's runners were bought as two-year-olds.

"We like the idea that you are getting a little more information and the horses are further along in their training," Cary explained of the emphasis on buying juveniles.

"And you are that much closer to seeing them on the racetrack. For our model, it worked well. From the eight that we bought, all eight have started and seven have won maiden special weights and the other one was second."

All the horses in the Thoroughbred Futures syndicates are fillies, and that was part of the plan, according to Cary.

"We wanted to buy fillies with potential and try to make them worth more and sell them as broodmares," the native Zimbabwean explained. "The residual value of a filly is a lot more, on average, than it is with colts. Colts are kind of an all-or-nothing phenomenon. At least with fillies you have something there at the end of the day. So hopefully, some of those will go on now and get some black-type and they will sell well when we conclude the syndicate in a couple of years."

While all of the fillies are destined for return visits to the sales ring, the syndicate does not have a pre-determined expiration date.

"It's not hard and fast, but they are all fillies and they will all be sold before they get retired," Cary said. "They'll all get sold as broodmare prospects, whether that is at three or four or five, we kind of have that flexibility to try and time it the best we can."

Midnight Visit was a no-brainer as a two-year-old purchase, according to Cary, who also serves as general manager and partner of Select Sales Agency.

"For me, she was one of those that, at first sight, you know you want to go after," Cary said of the New York-bred filly. "For a late foal--I think she was almost a May foal--she was very mature and advanced looking. She had a beautiful frame to grow into. She had a beautiful long neck, a big shoulder and a lovely hip, and a nice way of going and a good attitude."

During the under-tack preview for last year's Fasig-Tipton February sale, Midnight Visit worked a furlong in :10 3/5. The time may not have been blazing, but the work impressed Cary.

"Her workout was good," Cary recalled. "She just did everything well without being overly asked to do it."

Midnight Visit has done little wrong in her young racing career. The filly, trained by Todd Pletcher, debuted with a win over six furlongs at Aqueduct Nov. 28 and came back to take an allowance Jan. 23. Stretched out to a mile and 70 yards, she suffered her first loss when third in the Mar. 11 Proud Puppy S. Turned back to six furlongs Sunday, Midnight Visit forged to the lead late for a half-length triumph over Those Lion Eyes (Lion Heart).

"She had a bit of a wide trip, but ran down a very nice horse," Cary said of the stakes victory. "And she won with something left."

As for what is next for Thoroughbred Futures' first stakes winner, Cary did not rule out trying the filly over a route of ground in the future or tackling tougher competition.

"She is a New York-bred, so that is the first thing we look at, but I think we're getting to the stage where we wouldn't mind taking a peek at some open stakes, as well," he explained. "And who knows? Maybe some graded stakes, too, down the road for broodmare value."

The step up to graded stakes company would be a benefit to Thoroughbred Futures partners on more than one level. The majority of the owners are based in the midwest and don't always get to see their horses run.

"It's tough with maiden races, allowance races or overnight stakes," Cary admitted. "You don't know if they are going to fill until a few days out. But hopefully she'll be in graded stakes in the future and she'll be easier to find."
