Uncle Mo (Indian Charlie) looked like the proverbial mortal lock in the GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct,

and most conversations among racing fans centered on what the champion's winning margin would be. He was 1-9 and set a moderate pace, but **Toby's Corner**--a son of runaway 2005 Wood hero Bellamy Road--had other ideas. Equipped with blinkers for the first time, Dianne Cotter's

homebred snaked his way through traffic, and surged past **Arthur's Tale** (Bernardini) to emulate his sire with a Wood win. Uncle Mo had no response in midstretch, and wound up a one-paced third. "He grabbed a quarter [left front] leaving the gate," said Uncle Mo's trainer Todd Pletcher. "It didn't help, but I'm not using that as an excuse. I was a little concerned turning for home at the three-sixteenths pole when he didn't really kick clear. I thought then that we were going to be in for a fight. You could see the last 50-60 yards he was tired." It was first-time blinkers for Toby's Corner, and trainer Graham Motion felt they were key. "I think they were big--it's the first time he's really run straight like that," Motion said. "I should have done it a long time ago. We've put the blinkers on him the last couple of weeks and I was worried it was going to make him keen, and he was actually more relaxed with them on. I've never had a horse respond like that to them." **Cont. p2**

LILACS BLOOM EARLY IN ASHLAND

There are a few weeks to go before lilacs are in full bloom, but **Lilacs and Lace** (Flower Alley) sprung a 48-1

front-running surprise in the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland. With her speed rationed out by jockey Javier Castellano, the chestnut kept on going to light up the board. "We talked about it before the race that if she broke well, take it from there," Castellano confirmed. "She enjoyed going to the lead." Favored **Kathmanblu**

(Bluegrass Cat) was third, while **Dancinginherdreams** (Tapit) was well back early before winding up last. According to Trakus, Kathmanblu traveled 67 feet further than the winner, which works out to approximately 7 3/4 lengths lost. **Cont. p4**

MIDNIGHT AT THE OASIS

The GI Santa Anita Derby lost much of its luster with the withdrawals of top choices Premier Pegasus (Fusaichi Pegasus) and Jaycito (Victory Gallop). Arnold Zetcher's **Midnight Interlude** (War Chant), coming off his graduation three weeks ago, gave a late surge to

edge the valiant **Comma to the Top** (Bwana Charlie). "I never won a Santa Anita Derby with a horse off a maiden race like this, but he was training well and his last race was a great race," said winning conditioner Bob Baffert, who was saddling a record sixth winner of this contest. "Comma to the Top

ran a great race. I thought we weren't going to run him down; he was still a little green." Baffert added, "He's just figuring things out right now. He grew up in a hurry. You want your last [Kentucky Derby] prep to be like this." Victor Espinoza rode the winner. "Bob and I have been lucky together," said Espinoza, who piloted Baffert's 2002 Kentucky Derby victor War Emblem (Our Emblem). "I think I am his lucky charm. I think the distance is not a problem for this horse--I think it's even better for him. He's still learning, and still hasn't given 100 percent of what he has. He ran an unbelievable race today." **Cont. p3**

Dianne Cotter bred Bellamy Road, but sold him as a 2-year-old to Kinsman Farm, and was on the sidelines when that dark bay posted a towering performance in the 2005 Wood Memorial. She sent the mare Brandon's Ride to his court in his first year at stud and wound up with Toby's Corner. The liver chestnut aired by 10 3/4 lengths going a one-turn mile at Laurel in his second start Nov. 25, and added an allowance score over that track and trip Jan. 12. His streak continued with a rallying success in the Whirlaway S. over the Big A inner track Feb. 5--when he defeated GIII Bay Shore S. hero J J's Lucky Train (Silver Train)--but came to an end when he finished a troubled third behind Repole Stable's Stay Thirsty (Bernardini) in the GIII Gotham S. on the inner Mar. 5.

However, Toby got his revenge on those connections here. Void of early speed as Uncle Mo set a measured pace of :23.49 and :47.98, Toby's Corner saved ground while racing just behind Arthur's Tale, and those two advanced in that order through the far turn. The champ entered the lane after three-quarters in 1:12.28, but didn't open daylight, and viewers sensed an impending upset.

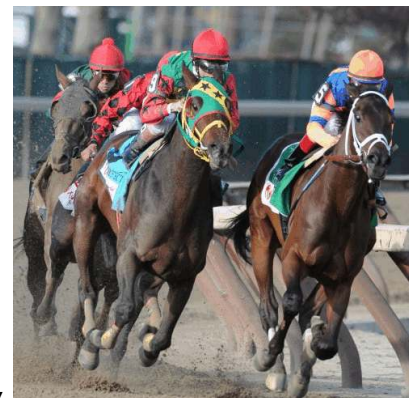
Arthur's Tale struck first up the center of the track, but Toby's Corner, piloted by the crafty Eddie Castro, came off the fence, then split horses and dashed through the opening between his main rivals in the waning strides.

"Oh, I was very surprised, but there's always hope," said the 73-year-old Cotter. "His daddy won much more impressively. We weren't at the race when Bellamy Road ran, but we certainly watched it at home. It was such a wonderful day. To think this could happen--I can't stop laughing. It's just such a wonderful feeling. Graham did such a wonderful job, and Eddie rode him just perfectly today. It's just been heaven."

It's on to Louisville for the Wood winner. "We had never talked about [the Derby]," Motion added. "The Cotters never mentioned it to me, and I don't think [Mrs. Cotter] even knew I'd nominated him early on. It's pretty neat. We're going, as long as he's doing fine. It looks like the mile and a quarter won't be a problem. It's obviously a very wide open group, and I kind of think he ranks right up there with the top ones."

Toby's Corner is the last reported foal from Brandon's Ride, who was campaigned by the Cotters.

Midnight Interlude was a non-threatening third in his Jan. 29 unveiling at Santa Anita, finishing 11 lengths behind **TDN Rising Star** Runflatout (Flatter). Stretched out to a mile Feb. 26, he was second by a half-length, and the third time proved the charm when he romped by 8 1/2 lengths going the same distance over a wet-fast track Mar. 20. Stablemate Jaycito had been battling a sore foot prior to being scratched, and Midnight Interlude came off the bench to hit the buzzer. Never too far back, the dark bay was parked four wide as Comma to the Top set up shop up front. The GI Hollywood Futurity hero still had the advantage after six furlongs in 1:11.53, but jockey Victor Espinoza got to work on Midnight Interlude turning for home. Comma to the Top was leg-weary in midstretch and began to drift out a bit, forcing Midnight Interlude to shift course slightly, but he still battled on bravely, and succumbed in the shadow of the wire.

Midnight Interlude could be part of a Baffert triumvirate for the GI Kentucky Derby May 7. "We still have Jaycito [who is being considered for the GIII Coolmore Lexington at Keeneland Apr. 23," the Hall of Famer noted. "The Factor runs at Oaklawn next week, so we'll see what he does there, if he can handle a mile and an eighth. We still have a ways to go, so you never think that far ahead. Things can happen to these horses, so you don't try and get too excited about it. But the Zetchers tonight, they can get excited about it."

The winner's dam Midnight Kiss, third in the G1 New Zealand Oaks, was privately acquired by Zetcher. He attempted to sell her twice at auction, but the Kiwi-bred RNA'd twice, for \$200,000 at KEENOV in 2005 when in foal to Empire Maker, and for \$70,000 with this colt in utero at KEEJAN in 2008. The mare has a 2-year-old full-brother to the Santa Anita Derby winner, and produced a Bernstein filly Mar. 24.

Lilacs and Lace took four starts to break her maiden, earning her diploma on the Golden Gate Tapeta in October. Second in the Corte Madera S. Dec. 4 for breeders Kathryn Nikkel and Judy Hicks, she came back to capture the California Oaks Jan. 1. James Covello purchased a majority share in the filly after that victory, and transferred her from Duane Offield to his

trainer, John Terranova II. The chestnut was a distant fourth in the Gill Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway in her first try under new management, but turned it around to shock the Keeneland crowd. Jockey Javier Castellano sent the longshot right to the front and cut out reasonable fractions. She had company as they came out of the bend, but found another gear, building enough of an advantage at midstretch to hold 'em safe to the wire. Nikkel, based in California, signed the ticket on the dam, in foal to Yankee Gentleman, for \$50,000 at KEENOV 2005. The mare has a yearling filly by Henny Hughes and was bred to Flower Alley for 2011. Morning Line proved ultra-game to win the GII Pennsylvania Derby by a neck Sept. 25, but couldn't quite hold on in the GI Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile at Churchill Nov. 6, and wound up second by a head to Dakota Phone (Zavata). He ran third as the even-money choice in the GIII Hal's Hope H. at Gulfstream Jan. 8, after which a share in him was sold to Zabeel Racing Corp. Second for Zabeel and Thoroughbred Legends in the GI Donn H. at the Hallandale oval Feb. 5, the dark bay was listed solely under the latter syndicate for this third top-level attempt. Sunrise Smarty (Smarty Jones) whistled through fractions of :22.52 and :44.42 up front, with Morning Line amidst the firing line just behind. The second choice angled out three wide entering the stretch, and continued on in workmanlike style to edge favored Apriority. "I'm very happy for the horse," said winning trainer Nick Zito. "He's lost some tough ones--the Breeders' Cup Mile was a heartbreaker; the Donn was a heartbreaker. He's such a well-deserving Grade I horse. He beat a top horse in [Apriority]. He did what a professional horse is supposed to do." Repole Stable's Calibrachoa (Southern Image) was scratched from the Carter with a foot issue. "He's not lame, but it's probably something that would prevent him from bringing his 'A' game," explained Jonathan Thomas, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher. "It might be something where if we had an additional week, that it would have been fine." While the rest of the Arcadia field was circling at the stalls, Liberian Freighter was in a world of his own up at the quarter pole, stubbornly delaying the start. But he was all business once he put his mind to it and made all the running to cause the upset. The dark bay was equally lightly regarded when he took the GII Oak Tree Mile Oct. 9, but could do no better than third in the Cal Cup Mile three weeks later. Last of 10 in the GII Citation H. at Hollywood Nov. 27, he attended the pace before drifting back to finish eighth in the GI F. E. Kilroe Mile Mar. 5. A comfortable leader through a half-mile in :47.41, Liberian Freighter began to inch away on the final turn, cut the corner into the stretch and held sway late. Favored Caracortado (Cat Dreams) found himself with too much to do entering the stretch and rallied only mildly into fifth. 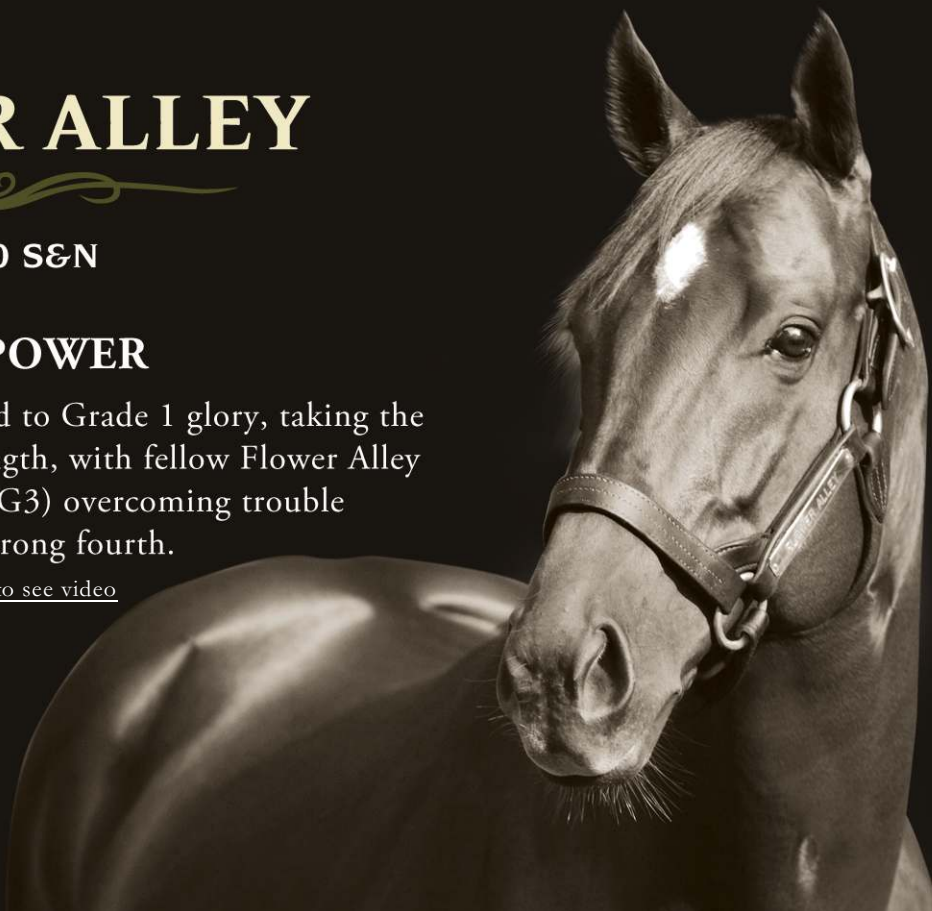

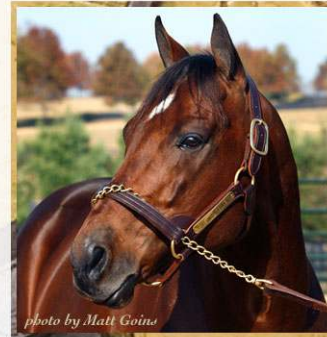

The major disappointment of the race was Jimmy Choux, who raced in a close fifth, got clear running in the stretch, but emptied out late and finished sixth.

He is expected to breeze once more in Florida before shipping to the Bluegrass State. "We'll see how he comes back from the work," Ritvo offered. "He surprised me a little today. We'll adjust his work next week, and then we should be off to Kentucky."

Quartet Tune Up for Arkansas Derby...

Grade I winner **J P's Gusto** (Successful Appeal), equipped with blinkers, stopped the clock in :58 2/5 after his five-panel breeze yesterday. The Gem Stables colorbearer was a disappointing seventh behind The Factor (War Front) last out in the GII Rebel S. Mar. 19, but trainer Joe Petalino thinks his charge can turn the tables next Saturday in the GI Arkansas Derby. He is replacing rider Ramon Dominguez with Cliff Berry in addition to the equipment change. "I'm confident, because he's been training well the whole time," said Petalino. "The blinkers sure helped quite a bit. Then again, I was pretty confident in his last race, but the jockey told me I had a sprinter. I think he's been listening to the TV handicappers too long."

♣ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♣ **Alternation** (Distorted Humor), scratched after flipping in the gate prior to the Rebel, will likely get another crack at his peers in the Arkansas Derby. The Pin Oak homebred has been schooling in the gate regularly since that Mar. 19 test, and he covered six furlongs in 1:14 3/5 in Hot Springs yesterday. "It went well," said trainer Donnie K. Von Hemel. "He was very relaxed the first part, but had a really nice acceleration down the lane. I'm happy with him. Additional Arkansas Derby contenders breezed in Florida yesterday. **Truman's Commander** (Friends Lake), in whom a majority interest was sold to Robert LaPenta by Harry Rosenblum, zipped a half in :47 3/5 at Palm Meadows. "I think his work was great," said the colt's new trainer Nick Zito. "I worked him in company with another horse, and he showed he's pretty quick for a horse who comes from behind. He has a nice turn of foot." Zito added, "The Arkansas Derby is a big step up, but that's what we're looking for. We've done upsets before. That's why they run the race." Previously trained by Allen Milligan, Truman's Commander graduated in his fourth start, scoring by six lengths at Oaklawn Mar. 6 ([video](#)). Todd Pletcher, who ran second in last year's Arkansas Derby with Super Saver (Maria's Mon) before going on to take the Run for the Roses, looks to have a pair of colts for the 2011 renewal of Oaklawn's marquee event. **Brethren** (Distorted Humor), who lost his perfect record when third last out in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby, worked five-eighths in :59 at Palm Meadows, as did recent allowance winner **Dance City** (City Zip). Both colts are expected to fly to Arkansas Monday.

Willcox Inn Preps for Blue Grass...

GI Toyota Blue Grass S. hopeful **Willcox Inn** (Harlan's Holiday) breezed six furlongs in 1:12.40 on the Keeneland Polytrack yesterday morning ([video](#)). The bay colt put away stablemate Lumberyard Jack (Bellamy Road) during the move. "It could not have gone any better," said trainer Mike Stidham. "He broke off fairly easy, finished strong and galloped out very well. Willcox Inn, who capped 2010 with a third in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf, opened his sophomore campaign with a second in the Grindstone S. at Fair Grounds Mar. 19.

Jazdzewski Consignment: *Small but Fast*

Jon Jazdzewski brings a lifetime of experience in the horse industry, and two juveniles, into Monday's Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale.

Jazdzewski's parents trained racehorses as a hobby. Following in the family tradition, he rode races in the bushes in Wisconsin before embarking on a training career himself. Nowadays, he works as an equine dentist, while also pinhooking a small number of horses.

Jazdzewski first tried his hand at pinhooking back in 1996 and had instant success. He purchased a yearling filly by Trempolino for \$5,000 out of the 1995 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October sale. Returned to the sales ring the following spring, the filly sold for \$37,000 at the Keeneland April sale.

A few years ago, Jazdzewski decided to sell under his own name. He purchased a filly by Cat Dreams for \$10,000 at the 2007 Keeneland September sale and brought her to sell at the 2008 April sale.

"I had a good one and I knew it," Jazdzewski said of the decision to sell the filly himself. "And I'd done it so many times and knew all the stuff that goes on behind the scenes. Keeneland even asked, 'Are you sure you don't want to go with a recognized consignor?' I said, 'No.' It doesn't matter. They'll find a good horse no matter who has him."

He proved he knew what he was doing. The Cat Dreams filly zipped a furlong in :09 4/5 at the sales preview before being purchased for \$230,000 by Hal Earnhardt and trainer Bob Baffert.

Despite his success, Jazdzewski is committed to limiting his pinhooking ventures.

"My main income is dental work on horses," he said. "We just do this on the side. Last year was the most we ever bought. I bought four, most of them for racing. Up until this year, we were buying just one a year. Basically, I don't want to get too big. And I think if I get forced into buying, I won't buy what is right. What has allowed us success every year is not forcing the issue. If there is a nice one and it is reasonable, I buy it; if not, I don't."

Jazdzewski has consigned two horses to this year's April sale. The first offering, [hip 107](#), is a son of City Place out of Bourbon Night (Arch). In a case of what he hopes will be *deja vu*, the chestnut worked in a flashy [:9 4/5](#) during Thursday's under-tack preview.

The colt, a \$4,000 purchase at last year's OBS August sale, was a standout from the start, according to Jazdzewski.

"He was a total athlete," the 40-year-old said. "I was hoping that no one else saw what I saw. I loved everything about him. I was just hoping I wouldn't get outbid. There is not a whole lot of page there, but if you look at the individual, he's really nice."

The consignment's second offering ([hip 161](#)) is a colt from the first crop of graded stakes winner Will He Shine (Silver Deputy) out of In Kim's Honor (Honor Grades). The juvenile was bought in utero for \$3,000 out of the 2008 Keeneland November sale.

"She's a nice, big mare," Jazdzewski reported. "She almost looks like a stallion. And her colt looks like a Quarter Horse. He's pretty nice."

Jazdzewski said he uses his instincts to pick out his pinhooking prospects.

"I've bought pedigree, but then you get so many issues if we can afford it," he explained. "So I just buy an athlete. It has to hit me right away. The more I look at them, the worse it gets for me. Every one that I've ever made a lot of money off of was out of the back of the ring and was a no-brainer."

Jazdzewski thinks the key to his success is to keep everything in perspective--a task made easier with the help of his wife, Patience.

"She's an attorney," Jazdzewski said. "Other than dealing with me, she doesn't have anything to do with racing, but she helps keep me grounded. She's come to grips with me doing the things I'm doing, because I'm not always by the book."

Still, it sounds like Jazdzewski has a definite plan.

"I know not to do it full time," he explained. "So I don't get pressured into buying stuff I shouldn't and I never spend too much and tie too much into it. As soon as the sale is over I will go back [to dentistry] and I'll be doing 25 a day, every day." -*Jessica Martini*

BALLBRIGGS WINS NATIONAL FOR MCCAIN JUNIOR

Former trainer Ginger McCain's name will forever be associated with the Grand National Steeplechase, thanks to the race's only triple winner Red Rum (GB) (Quorum {GB}), but it was his son Donald who stole the limelight when he saddled **Ballbriggs (Ire)** (Presenting {GB}) to win the 4 1/2-mile marathon at Aintree in Liverpool yesterday. The 10-year-old won at the Cheltenham festival last year, and preserved his handicap rating with hurdles wins at Wincanton and Ayr. He ran second when returning over fences at Kelso Mar. 5, and the decision to bypass this term's Cheltenham meet was justified with a gutsy staying performance to claim the £950,000 contest. Racing in the vanguard from the outset, the 14-1 chance seized the lead with a prodigious leap at "The Chair." He lost his advantage briefly--following a mistake at the sixth-last fence--and, with rivals looming large over the last two obstacles, he was driven out by jockey Jason Maguire up the long run-in to defeat **Oscar Time (Ire)** (Oscar {Ire}) by 2 1/4 lengths, with defending champion **Don't Push It (Ire)** (Old Vic {GB}) a further 12 lengths adrift in third. "It's just fantastic, and to win this race means as much to [owner] Trevor Hemmings as it does to us," said McCain. "We've always thought he might be an Aintree horse and you only need to see the way he's taken to this place today. Good horses are easy to train and everything has gone smoothly all year. He had a nice prep at Kelso last time, and he's just an absolute pleasure to deal with."
