## DUTROW DENIED KENTUCKY LICENSE

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Wednesday denied Rick Dutrow Jr.'s application for a license. The decision means that the two horses Dutrow entered at Keeneland, **Court Vision** (Gulch) and **Amen Hallelujah** (Montbrook), could be forced to scratch. Amen Hallelujah is the 2-1 morning-line favorite for today's GI Vinery Madison S., while Court Vision is the 8-5 choice for Friday's GI Maker's Mark Mile. "The hearing with Mr. Dutrow lasted about an hour, and then the committee deliberated for about an hour before coming back to let him know that they were not going to issue him a license," said the KHRC's Dick Brown.

It was a unanimous decision. Dutrow was present at the hearing, but was not accompanied by legal representation. Brown said Dutrow can appeal the decision, but an appeal would not result in a stay that would allow him to race horses over the next few days. "If he had already had a license and it was being revoked, then he would have the ability to seek a stay of that order to keep his license while it was being appealed, but since there is no license, his remedy would likely be in circuit court to seek some sort of injunction," Brown explained. "Or he can appeal to the full commission, and then the commission would appeal to the hearing officer." Dutrow questioned why the commission's director of licensing, Chris Clark, had informed him that he would be able to enter the horses Tuesday, if it was a possibility they would have to be scratched because of the committee's decision. "You guys could have said, 'Rick, there's a very good chance of you not being licensed;' then I could have entered them in another trainer's name," Dutrow told *Daily Racing Form*. "Now they have to be scratched. What did the owners do wrong?" He added, "It's okay what [they] did to me, but not what [they] did to the owners. They came here in good faith."

## OGDEN OPTS FOR AZAMOUR COLT

Owner Sir Robert Ogden led the way at Tattersalls' Craven Breeze-Up opener in Newmarket last night when fighting off agent Dwayne Woods for a 315,000gns (US\$537,892) Azamour (Ire) colt sold from Willie Browne's Mocklershill Stables. Trainer Jeremy Noseda tried early on for [lot 66](#), but it was Woods--accompanied by his Hong Kong trainer brother Sean--who was underbidder to Ogden, standing with racing manager Barry Simpson and one of his Irish-based trainers, David Wachman. **Cont. p9**

## FULL FIELDS FOR DERBY PREPS

The last two Grade I preps for the May 7 GI Kentucky Derby will be held Saturday, and the gates will be loaded for both. The \$1-million GI Arkansas Derby at Oaklawn Park drew a field of 14, including 7-5 morning-line chalk **The Factor** (War Front). George Bolton and Fog City Stable's grey made it three in a row with a runaway win in his two-turn debut, the GI Rebel S. over this track Mar. 19. A dozen will go postward in the \$750,000 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland, headed by Tom Walters's **Santiva** (Giant's Causeway). Runner-up in the GI Dixiana Breeders' Futurity over the Keeneland strip last year, the bay won the GI Kentucky Jockey Club S. in November, and opened 2011 with a runner-up finish in the GI Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 19. The 3-1 choice on the morning line, he makes his second start of the campaign here. Both of the favorites will break from post 3 in their respective races. Trainer Eddie Keneally will saddle Santiva, and is confident he can get the nine furlongs. "I shouldn't think it will be a problem," Keneally said. "He's a very relaxed horse. He's easy to manage. Barefoot Lady, off the mark by six lengths over five furlongs at Beverley in August, followed up at Doncaster when upped a panel early the next month. She filled the third spot in the G3 Firth of Clyde S. at Ayr 10 days later. Runner-up in the Listed Rockingham S. in a third run over six furlongs at York in October, the bay stepped up again to upset some bigger reputations in this Guineas prep. Restrained early, she was forced to race widest of all towards the rear keeping tabs with the favorite Sing Softly. She was left behind momentarily as that rival took command inside the final furlong, but picked up for rider Paul Hanagan to get in front in the shade of the post. "She is very tough and did it the hard way, as she had no cover," Hanagan commented. "Her head was virtually on the floor, she was trying that hard, and Ryan [Moore on Sing Softly] took me all the way, which helped a lot. We thought we had nothing to lose by running here, and she will get a mile okay." Connections are considering supplementing for the May 1 G1 1000 Guineas back at this track, which is also likely to be the target for the third-place finisher Maqaasid. Beaten a nose by Blind Luck (Pollard's Vision) when second in the GI Kentucky Oaks, she came back to take the GII Honeymoon H. at Hollywood, and the GII San Clemente H. and GI Del Mar Oaks where the surf meets the turf, all on the grass. The

bay was third in the GI QE II Challenge Cup on the Keeneland sod and the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint on the Churchill main track to cap off the campaign. Connections considered retirement after the 4-year-old ran fifth in the Jan. 2 GIII Monrovia H., but opted to keep her in training, and she enters this off a win in the Jan. 29 Sunshine Millions Distaff S. and a second in the Feb. 26 Valentine Dancer H. "At first, I thought she might have lost a little bit from last year when she didn't do so well coming down the hill [in the Monrovia], but then she picked it up against Cal-breds," trainer Jim Cassidy said. "In her last start, she got trapped in a four-horse field and had no chance to show what she could do."

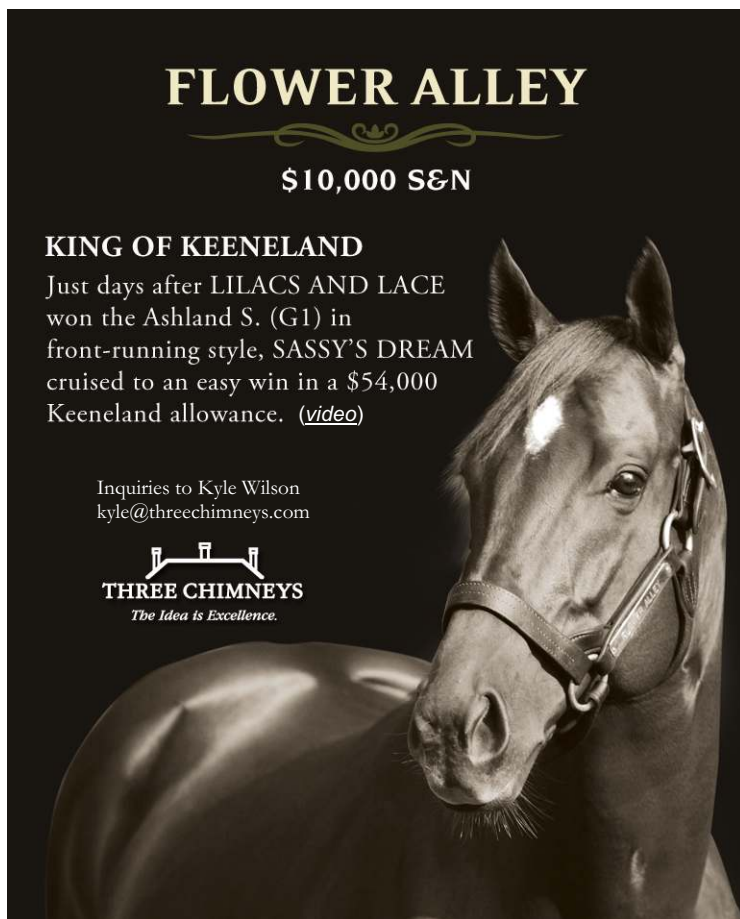

The grey filly was second in the GIII Victory Ride S. at Saratoga and captured the GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont last year, but trailed the field home in the Nov. 5 BC F/M Sprint. Off at 3-1 in the Feb. 13 GIII Hurricane Bertie S. at Gulfstream Park, she played caboose the entire race and was beaten 25 3/4 lengths. The 4-year-old has been working brilliantly since, however, going five-eighths in a bullet :59 at Palm Meadows Apr. 2 and getting the trip in :58 flat over the Keeneland strip a week later. Morning-line chalk **Amen Hallelujah** could be scratched after trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. was denied a license in Kentucky.

**Native Khan** will be a warm order to win this Guineas prep, which admittedly has a below-par look to it this year. Successful at the July Meeting here and in Sandown's G3 Solario S. in September, the grey finished up with a staying-on fourth in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster the following month. "We could do with a drop of rain for a lot of the horses, but Native Khan is one who will relish the fast ground," trainer Ed Dunlop said. "He is such a good mover, and he could not operate on the soft ground in the Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster last year, but he has done really well through the winter, and we are very happy with him." Richard Hannon, who has saddled four winners of this trial, calls on **Casual Glimpse** and the penalised G2 July S. and G2 Richmond S. winner **Libranno**. Both colts come here on the back of two unplaced efforts in group company. "While Libranno has a three-pound penalty, he did work exceptionally well when we took him for a day out at Kempton last week," Hannon explained. "The worry with him is whether he gets the mile, but, until we try, we won't find out. It will be tough for both of ours, but they are in good nick." **Yaseer** trailed leading Derby contender Carlton House (Street Cry {Ire}) on debut at Newbury in October before recording an easy win on Kempton's Polytrack in December. "Hopefully, he's a progressive type, and we'd hope he'll run extremely well," trainer Marcus Tregoning told *PA Sport*. "He was quite a late foal [May 26], and we didn't get him until May last year, which always make it a bit more difficult with these backward horses. The hope is that he'll go on and keep improving through the year, and he is in the 2000 Guineas. I think a mile is far enough for him at the moment."

## Swift Warrior Out with Condylar Fracture...

Rushaway S. winner **Swift Warrior** (First Samurai), who was prepping for Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S., was diagnosed with a non-displaced condylar fracture of the right front cannon bone after breezing three furlongs in an easy :39.20 at Keeneland Wednesday. "He looked smooth on the track, but when we got back to the barn and unsaddled him, he took a couple of funny steps," trainer John Terranova said. "Then we noticed a little filling around the ankle and took X-rays. He is already on his way to Rood and Riddle. We should have a prognosis tonight." Campaigned by James Dolan and James Covello, Swift Warrior was also second in the Foolish Pleasure S. at two and third in the Tropical Park Derby on the turf in his sophomore bow. To date, he has a record of 12-3-2-5 and earnings of \$136,810.

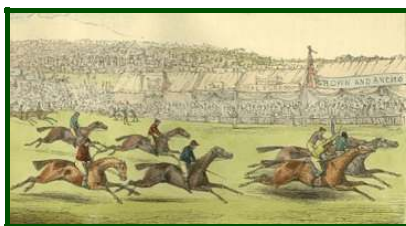

## Orientation Day at Oaklawn...By Christina Bossinakis

The draw for Saturday's GI Arkansas Derby was held Wednesday morning in the Oaklawn grandstand. Among those in attendance was Robert Yagos, owner of **Archarcharch** (Arch), and Harry Rosenblum, who co-owns **Truman's Commander** (Friends Lake) with Bob LaPenta. The whole thing, which lasted all of about 20 minutes, while not as flashy as draws can often be, was certainly an exercise in efficiency.

Later in the day, I had an opportunity to wander out and familiarize myself with the layout of the track, and I was struck by a few things. While it's immediately obvious that the plant has weathered many winters, it really is among the cleanest you'll ever find. You can almost eat off the floor--it's that clean. I suppose that the patrons are a little more respectful of the facility than one might find at New York tracks (after all, it's the South), but regardless, it is noticeable how well maintained the track is. **Cont. p7**

Also, the grandstand is completely enclosed by windows (a la Meadowlands), which makes it a unique structure in the United States.

The infield is beautifully maintained and manicured, and is reminiscent of a local park more than a racetrack. I was also struck by the maze-like qualities of the track. If you're not careful, you could find yourself quite lost within minutes!

While there seems to be no rhyme or reason to the layout, it's often easy to distinguish which room you've stumbled into because of the signage on the walls. Personally, I appreciated the New York room, which pays homage to the metropolis with plenty of insignia and graffiti.

There also seemed to be a pretty nice crowd for a Wednesday (I don't think this many people turned out for the Wood Memorial), especially considering that yesterday's card was created to try and make up for the eight days lost

because of bad weather.

However, the most interesting thing I stumbled onto during my reconnaissance mission was a room that sold the *Daily Racing Form*, which looked like something off the set of *Designing Women* (yeah, that's going a few years back). The attention to detail that went into decorating the office was pretty interesting, especially since it appeared to be located randomly in the grandstand area. Adorned with candles and flowers, it seemed like a nice spot to drop in for a leisurely visit, while taking in the enticing aromas wafting through the air (not sure if they were scented candles or incense?), not to mention grabbing a copy of the *Form*. Pretty fantastic, if you ask me.

Jockey John Egan is a regular buyer at the breeze-ups and, acting on behalf of Hong Kong trainer Peter Ho, he saw off Ogden to get a Danehill Dancer (Ire)--Showbiz (Ire) colt for 260,000gns. A great-grandson of G1 Matron S. winner Talking Picture, lot 81 was also purchased by Mags O'Toole as a yearling, going for €65,000 at Arqana's August auction. The bay breezed under Norman Williamson, from whose County Meath-based Oak Tree Farm he was offered. "We had to push the boat out to get him, but he was our pick of the sale, so we decided we'd do that," said Egan. Egan also bought a 155,000gns Cape Cross (Ire) colt and a 110,000gns Gone West colt offered from Mocklershill Stables.

Local agent Johnny McKeever was another shopping for Hong Kong. Seated with colleague Philip Johnston, he saw off Yorkshire handler Ben Haslam to pay 180,000gns for a Speightstown colt. He sold from Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud as lot 46. The chestnut made \$110,000 as a foal at Keeneland and \$70,000 as a yearling at the same venue in September. "He's been bought for Hung Yat Fai, a long-standing owner in Hong Kong," said McKeever. "He has a share in seven 2-year-olds in Britain that I run as the Right Tack Partnership; I was over here visiting them and said, 'Let's buy one at the breeze-ups.' I'm not sure who will train this colt, but he was very athletic, with a nice outlook." The agent added, "I've been lucky buying from Yeomanstown, and purchased my first Group 1 winner, Bad As I Wannabe (Ire) (Common Grounds), from them."

Many vendors were happy to see Sheikh Mohammed at the sale. Dick O'Gorman, one of his buying team, paid 200,000gns for lot 70, a Dubawi (Ire) half-brother to last season's G3 Killavullan S. winner Dubai Prince (Ire) (Shamardal), who was a recent second entry for this season's G1 Investec Derby. "He's bought for an existing client who is a fan of the sire, but I can't say any more than that," said O'Gorman.

Angie Loder, who has also bought for the Sheikh in past years, was another to hit 200,000gns when buying lot 64, a Iffraaj (GB) filly consigned from Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud. The bay had been bought for just £34,000 at Doncaster's Premier Yearling Sale in August before her dam's half-sister Gilt Edge Girl (GB) (Monsieur Bond {Ire}) won the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye in October. "She breezed well and, although she'll be staying in Britain, I can't say who she has been

The Alliance promotes the safety of racing's human and equine athletes and protects the integrity of the sport for participants and the wagering public through a rigorous [Code of Standards](#) and an accreditation process. One of the six broad areas covered by the Code is aftercare and transition of retired racehorses.

The [Finger Lakes Thoroughbred Adoption Program](#) was identified by the Alliance as one of several "Best Practice" ratings for the track. Founded in 2006, the program has now adopted out over 400 Thoroughbreds. To aid the adoption process, employees join volunteers in retraining the horses to best determine a suitable post-racing career. Horses typically stay in the program for 30-60 days before moving on to new homes.

**HATS OFF TO HORSES IN JAPAN**

Horses in the Fukushima Prefecture of Japan, whose lives have been threatened by the radiation leak from the crippled nuclear power plant and subsequent evacuation of the area, may soon get some help courtesy of a charitable project started by Winchester Farm in Lexington, Kentucky.

Winchester's owner, Dr. Naoya Yoshida, is in the process of organizing a 'Hats Off' program, modeled after the successful annual fundraiser at The Kentucky Horse Park, and is asking the industry for help.

"I received messages by phone, e-mail and Twitter

from horse people in Japan early this week," said Yoshida.

"There are many horses facing a serious situation due to the earthquake

and the radioactive contamination from the nuclear power plants in the Fukushima

Prefecture."

Yoshida explained that Fukushima is an area famous for its horses. Home to Fukushima Racecourse, it is also host each July to a 1000-year-old equestrian festival called Soma Nomaai--the star of which is a breed of Japanese domestic pony called the Soma.

"There are 370 Soma ponies around the region, and they are raised by small farmers around Minami Soma City," said Yoshida.

"The city supported those breeders financially to protect the breed and the culture, but the city has fallen into financial trouble since the big earthquake and unfortunately they had to stop their support."

Yoshida said that most of residents fled the city after the evacuation order was given. "The area became like a ghost town," he said. "There are a few horse people refusing the order to evacuate so they can stay and take care of the horses, but other farmers unfortunately had to leave their horses at the farms. Generally, farms in Fukushima are quite small and so do not have adequate pastureland. The horses don't have any food."

The ponies are famous worldwide, he said. "Everybody knows 'Soma Nomaioi' in Japan and the equestrian festival has attracted many people to participate in the multiple equestrian events--not only horse racing, but also show jumping, endurance tests, leisure riding and more. The big team from Fukushima came to the U.S. twice before to perform in Hawaii and at Santa Anita."

Yoshida explained that the people who contacted him wondered if it were possible to raise money not only to help protect the horses, but to also help local teenage riders who have lost their parents or whose sudden financial problems made it difficult for them to go to school.

"I mentioned our 'Hats Off Event' at the Kentucky Horse Park to them," he said. "Each year,

Kentucky horse farms donate their logo caps and the Horse Park gives them away to the visitors who come to see the park and learn about the Kentucky horse industry on that day. It is a huge hit at the Horse Park, so we thought something similar would be a good way to both raise money for the horses in Fukushima and at the same time, promote the horse industry globally."

Yoshida's plan is to ask breeders, trainers, owners, jockeys, sales companies, racetracks, veterinarians, blacksmiths and others to send as many of their logo caps by the end of the month. He will, in turn, send them on to Japan where they will be sold horse lovers all over the country to raise money. Winchester Farm will pay the shipping fees, and Yoshida has organized a team in Japan to sell and distribute them there.

"There are many people in Japan who would want to wear caps made in foreign racing countries. They would also be pleased to pay for them in order to donate their cash," he said.

Funds will directed to Minami Soma City, and to the Japan Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, a non-profit organization, which has been charged with the charitable support for the Fukushima equestrian industry.

The funds will be used for three purposes:

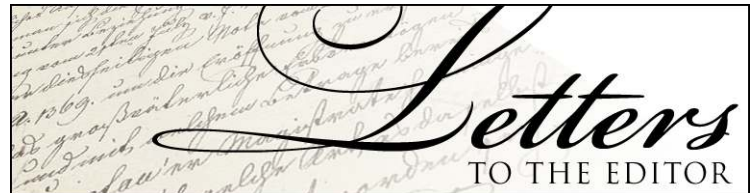
- To provide support for the young riders who lost parents due to the earthquake and tsunami.
- To provide treatment for the injured horses and vanning to evacuate the horses from Fukushima.
- To help support the Fukushima breeders to protect the Soma breed and culture.

Approximately 100 ponies have died, Yoshida said.

"To have many horse lovers in Japan wearing the caps would help us to promote the global horse industry as well as the Japanese domestic industry," Yoshida said. "A cap may be a tiny item to donate and sell, but it would be a nice item for Japanese horse lovers to show that they share our concerns for the horses and the people of the region. Hopefully, this kind of project could help us to establish stronger relationships with Japan and the Japanese horse industry for the future."

Yoshida said he hoped that the cap program can spur a new sense of worldwide community in the thoroughbred world. "Japan has been our good friend and partner in the horse industry for years. It is our time to support their horse community. I would be very grateful if I can work as a kind of bridge between Japan and other countries."

BREEDERS' CUP REVISES GOVERNANCE RULES

(Edited press release) The Breeders' Cup Members and Trustees convened Wednesday for a special meeting to consider changes to the corporation's by-laws. The following actions were approved:

- The term "Trustee" was deleted from the official name of the larger body, whose participants will now be referred to as Members. The term "Board" was deleted from the Members body to avoid confusion with the identity of the Board of Directors.
• Members shall serve four-year terms and Member elections will take place every other year. The election of Members will be staggered with 19 Members elected in 2012 and 20 Members elected in 2014. Under the former system, Members served three-year terms.
• Directors shall serve four-year terms on the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors instead of the current two-year terms. The election of the Directors, as conducted annually by the Members, shall be staggered with the election of three directors in July, followed by three in 2012, three in 2013 and four in 2014.
• To enact the new by-laws regarding staggered elections, a blind draw was conducted to determine the status of the six Directors with terms expiring this year. The three Directors whose terms will expire this year are Robert Manfuso, Richard Santulli and Duncan Taylor. The three Directors whose terms have been extended until 2012 are Tom Ludt, Clem Murphy and Oliver Tait. It is expected that the three Directors with expiring terms, along other Members, will self-nominate for the July election of Directors.
• The term for the Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall each be two years with a limit of two consecutive two-year terms. Under the former system, the elections of Chairman and Vice Chairman were held every year.
• Directors failing to attend in-person three consecutive meetings cease being a Director unless excused for good cause.

These changes follow a review of Breeders' Cup's corporate governance by a committee formed by the Board last September. Committee Chairman and Director Tom Ludt commented: "These changes in lengthening the terms of service for Members and Directors will allow those individuals to provide greater continuity, experience and efficiency in serving Breeders' Cup over a sustained period of time." The Breeders' Cup Board of Directors will convene for a regularly scheduled meeting on Thursday.

**CHRB Unveils Racetrack Safety Proposals:**

The California Horse Racing Board has put together a plan that will focus on the improvement of the health and safety of horses and riders at tracks in the state. Unveiled at a public meeting Apr. 8, the proposals include a \$1-million plus program to study the causes of injuries, catastrophic and otherwise, and to provide the results to members of the industry. The program would be headed by Dr. Susan Stover of UC Davis, and funding would be provided by the California tracks and horsemen. Commissioner John Harris remarked, "As field sizes have decreased and the costs of keeping a horse in training have increased, it is critical that we look at ways to do better jobs in keeping horses sound. I think this overall plan can have some major payback for all segments." The plan would also implement a rule to void th claim of any horse that suffers a fatal injury or is placed on the vet's list immediately following the race, and would make the last six months of veterinary records of any horse claimed available to the new owner. Those vet records would also be provided in the event of any postmortem examination. "It came as a shock to me to hear that often times the Board has had difficulty security the appropriate health records," Harris said. "These can be provided by going through legal channels but it seems ridiculous that anyone losing a horse would not want the investigation maximized. This is not meant to point fingers at anyone for fault but rather to help us better understand the causation and possible mitigation of injuries."
