"Although it is not my standard practice to share a horse's examination results with anyone other than the owner, I feel that Uncle Mo's disappointing performance in the Wood Memorial warrants an explanation," Pletcher said. "Late yesterday, both Mike and I spoke with the vets, who concluded that Uncle Mo has a GI tract infection, and we began treatment immediately. The vets also concluded that Uncle Mo is perfectly capable of returning to full training while the treatment continues. He will ship to Churchill Downs Apr. 18 and will have two works before May 7. If I do not feel that Uncle Mo is 100% for the Kentucky Derby, both Mike and I agree that he will not run. My main focus is to return Uncle Mo to optimum health in the next 23 days, and I am optimistic that we can accomplish this goal." ## GONE NATIVE

Sent off the 8-11 favorite for yesterday's G3 Breeze Up Vendors Craven S. at Newmarket, Vefa Araci's **Native Khan (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}) duly delivered to stake his 2000 Guineas claims for Ed Dunlop and Kieren Fallon. Successful in the G3 Solario S. at Sandown last August and fourth in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in October, the grey was coaxed by the long-time leader **Libranno (GB)** (Librettist) with a quarter mile remaining and needed only a couple of taps to secure a comfortable two-length success. "Kieren said he will improve a lot, and the fast ground was the key," Dunlop commented. "We're thrilled to win this race and he did it well." **Cont. p5**

## LUDT ELECTED CHAIRMAN OF BC BOARD

The Breeders' Cup Board of Directors voted Tom Ludt as Board Chairman and moved toward the elimination of race-day medications in the Breeders' Cup World Championships at its meeting today in Lexington. Ludt currently serves as president of Vinery Ltd. He succeeds William S. Farish Jr., who stepped down yesterday after serving a five-year term. Ludt, who has been a director since 2009, will serve a two-year term. Farish will remain on the board as a director. "Being elected Chairman of the Breeders' Cup is both a great honor and significant responsibility," said Ludt. "I believe the innovations of the last few years, including our expansion to two days and 14 races, and our continued focus on the international aspects of our competition, will serve the Breeders' Cup well as we strive to find new ways to strengthen the organization and our game as a whole." The Board also endorsed in principle the recently announced recommendation of the Association of Racing Commissioners International (RCI) to eliminate the use of race-day medications in North America and decided to appoint a sub-committee with the objective of developing a plan and a timetable for the elimination of race-day medication in the Breeders' Cup World Championships.

The 2009 GI Shadwell Turf Mile hero has been training smartly for his return to action. **Get Stormy**, winner of last term's GII Fourstardave H. and GII Bernard Baruch H. at Saratoga, got back on track with a third-place finish in the GI Gulfstream Park Turf H. Feb. 5 following a pair of disappointing efforts in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile and GIII Ft. Lauderdale S. Jan. 9.

**DUTROW HORSES ALLOWED TO RUN IN KY**

Franklin Circuit Judge Phillip Shepherd issued a temporary restraining order against the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission in the issue of the KHRC's denying a trainer's license to Richard Dutrow Jr., which paved the way for **Amen Hallelujah** (Montbrook) to contest Thursday's GI Vinery Madison S. at Keeneland (*see race recap p3*). The Order came in a case filed by Amen Hallelujah's half-owner Whizway Farms LLC. Later in the afternoon, it was announced that the Commission had reached an agreement which allowed Amen Hallelujah, as well as GI Maker's Mark Mile S. entrant **Court Vision** (Gulch)-- both entered by Dutrow--to race under trainer Justin Sallusto's name. "This action was necessary in order to prevent immediate and irreparable injury to our client, which spent a considerable amount of money to fly this horse to Kentucky for this race without any advance notice that the Commission might consider drastic action against Mr. Dutrow during the meet," Joe F. Childers of the Lexington firm Getty & Childers, which represents Whizway Farm, said of the TRO. Dutrow has appealed the denial of his Kentucky license, which will be heard by the Commission at a later date.

Smiling Tiger, hero of last term's GI Bing Crosby S. and GI Ancient Title S., reported home a solid third in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs Nov. 6. Second, beaten a nose in the prestigious GI Malibu S. Dec. 26, the chestnut disappointed with a third-place finish as the 2-5 chalk in the GII Palos Verdes S. Jan. 22 before getting back on track with a narrow win in the GII San Carlos H. Feb. 19. Making a rare appearance outside of California here, Smiling Tiger was settled toward the back early. With Joel Rosario in for the ride, Smiling Tiger still had plenty left to do while fourth at the top of the stretch, but came with an explosive rally to win going away. "This is one of the most special horses to us," trainer Jeff Bonde said. "He really turned it around for us. He's led us to a lot of thrills, and hopefully a lot more thrills to come. We will look at the seven-eighths race at Churchill, but I think the Met Mile might fit better just because of the spacing being six weeks, and that's what we are trying to do with him to get back to the Breeders' Cup this fall." Rosario added, "He came out from the gate a little slow, but I let him regroup. He settled nicely and when I asked him he gave me a great kick turning for home. He showed me in his last race that he can run, but today he showed me he can really run. He's a big horse with a great stride and that really helps him out when he runs." Native Khan looked a colt with a future when recording a 3 1/4-length win on debut in a seven-furlong maiden on the July Course here and was value for more than his half-length winning margin over Measuring Time (GB) (Dubai Destination) in Sandown's G3 Solario S. in September. Held up at the tail of the field in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster the following month, he made eye-catching late progress to close into fourth behind the more positively ridden winner Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal). Initially set to go straight to either the Apr. 30 G1 2000 Guineas here or the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp 15 days later, connections changed direction when this race looked like it was shaping into a weaker-than-usual affair. Settled in third early by Kieren Fallon after showing keenness out of the gates, the grey always had dead aim on the front-running Libranno--whose two-year-old form had been at six furlongs--and the unexposed maiden winner Yaseer. His rider was at his smoothest as he asked Native Khan to settle the issue inside the final quarter, and there was a feeling that he was idling when clear on the uphill rise to the line. "We learnt in the Racing Post Trophy that he doesn't like soft ground as he's such a beautiful-moving horse," trainer Ed Dunlop commented. "It was an afterthought to come here, but he was training so well and the ground had been so dry, which suited him well. Kieren said he took it up a little early and he pricked his ears in front, but he stayed on well and I know he'll improve. He'll run in either the English or French Guineas, and we'll see what Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) does on Saturday, but you can't run away from one horse and the ground is the important thing--he won't run on soft. He is a French-bred, so the premiums on offer in France are attractive, but he handled the dip well and it looks like it'll be dry here for a while." **Click for the [Racing Post chart](#) or the [brisnet.com PPs](#). 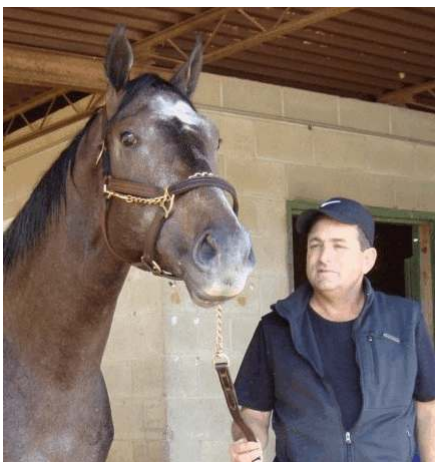

**WOW FACTOR**

All I could utter was 'Wow.' Then I spit a couple of times (or at least I simulated the action; it's a Greek thing). That was my reaction when this year's GII San Vicente S. and GII Rebel S. winner **The Factor** (War Front), led by Bob Baffert's main man Jim Barnes, walked past today. If Saturday's GI Arkansas Derby was going to be decided on appearances, this boy would certainly be a lock. The Factor is not very big, maybe 15.3 hands at best, but he definitely has star

quality. In fact, I liken him to Prince (yes, the artist). He's not physically very big, but his charisma makes you think he's a giant! Barnes had a firm grip on the spirited grey as he walked him around the shedrow, and every now and again, stopping at the entryway so the colt could soak up the sights and sounds drifting in from the early activities on the backside. Often in the mornings, The Factor is granted permission to stand quietly off to the side so he can satisfy his penchant for voyeurism. During my visit with TF yesterday, the colt was on his toes and constantly danced around, obviously very pleased with himself. When asked if he had remarked any changes in the colt since his Rebel score, Barnes offered, "The biggest change I've seen is that he's been so full of himself. He's feeling really good right now." The colt already has a win over the track, but according to Barnes, it doesn't matter where he runs, he can win. "He can run over anything," Barnes said. "He's such an efficient mover and just skims over the ground." Even though distance could be a question mark the further this horse goes, one thing is without doubt, The Factor certainly has the makings of a champion. "He's a seriously fast horse," said Barnes. "He's a freak."

On the backside yesterday morning, I also had the opportunity to stop by the Susan's Girl Barn, where Neil Drysdale's sole entry **Miss Match (Arg)** (Indygo Shiner) is bedded down. The winner of the GI Santa Margarita S. was walking th shedrow when I arrived, and she certainly made a good impression from the moment I laid eyes on her. She looked sharp and alert, with her ears pricked and her coat glistening. With Drysdale not making the trip because he will be attending a Saturday morning memorial service for Ned Evans, and assistant John O'Donaghue expected to arrive today, the filly is being overseen by her regular rider Marcelino Olguin. Olguin has been riding the 6-year-old since Australian-based Mathew Cloros secured the mare for \$500,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. Olguin confirmed yesterday that the mare has been doing very well since her arrival on Tuesday and has handled the Oaklawn surface with aplomb. While admittedly a little surprised she won the Santa Margarita, Olguin said he wouldn't be surprised if the hard-trying mare won this afternoon. Given plenty of time to settle in after joining the Drysdale string, Olguin indicated that she had put on some weight over the last few months and has been getting better and better with time. She's up against some nice ones today, however, the mare's supporters have reason to be encouraged.

Brethren adds blinkers for the first time in the \$1-million centerpiece. "I think many people will grab on to the connection to Super Saver and bring his price down on the day," assistant trainer Mike Dillger said. "The blinkers will be more about keeping him focused rather than about getting him to show speed. We know there will be plenty of speed. We need him to relax a bit more and make his run." **Dance City** (City Zip), owned and bred by the late Edward P. Evans, gets tested for class. The Virginia-bred graduated at Gulfstream Jan. 21, then added an allowance by a nose Mar. 19. "He's going to offer a lot of value," Dillger said of Dance City. "He's coming up to this race very well. He's just been completely thrown off the schedule the boss had planned for him. He was sick earlier this winter and then he had to race against another one of our horses trying to get going again. He's getting a real test, but we've liked him very much all along and he should run better than his odds."

Sheikh Fahad's advisor David Redvers was in Australia, and it was left to his assistant Hannah Wall to strike the successful bid. Charlie Gordon-Watson and Crispin de Moubray also tried for the colt, who had been bought as a foal for €160,000 by Twomey, but it was BBA Ireland agent Eamonn Reilly who was underbidder to Wall. "David was at the practice breeze on Monday and liked him then," Wall commented. "He did a good time and is a big horse and won't be rushed. He'll have a break at Tweenhills Stud before a trainer is decided." Seamus Burns of Lodge Park Stud in County Kilkenny saw off Gordon-Watson at 180,000gns for a Dynaformer colt out of stakes-placed Juke (Mr. Prospector) prepared at Norman Williamson's County Meath-based Oak Tree Farm. "My son bred a horse called Buxted by Dynaformer, and I know he breeds good, strong horses that can go on turf. I just liked this colt," said Burns, who has yet to decide on a trainer for his purchase, a \$100,000 Keeneland September yearling. Newmarket trainer John Gosden paid 150,000gns for a Medaglia d'Oro colt sold from Gay O'Callaghan's Yeomanstown Stud. "This was a proper horse by a proper stallion and it will be even better if I get him sold to an owner," said Gosden.

With a slightly larger catalogue than last year, the Craven sale finished with turnover up marginally to 7,987,000gns although there was a decline in the remaining indicators. The clearance rate dropped 1% to 68%, while the 60,000gns median was down 14% and the 71,313gns average dipped by 11%. "There have been a number of positives to take from the trade at this year's Tattersalls Craven Breeze Up Sale," Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony commented. "Having taken the decision not to stage the Guineas Breeze-Up Sale this year, we compiled a larger and more diverse Craven catalogue and this has attracted buyers at all levels of the market from throughout the world. We have seen an increase in turnover, and the extra numbers have not had an adverse impact on the all-important clearance rate which has held up well. Germiston. A total of 600 youngster have been catalogued for the three-day sale. With South African-breds doing well internationally, the sale annually attracts its fair share of leading overseas buyers. The likes of Team Valor, Shadwell Stud and Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa Al

Maktoum have all patronised the sale heavily in recent years. Last year's auction was topped by a record R4-million son of Jet Master (SAf)--Divine Nymph (SAf) (Al Mufti), who was purchased by trainer Geoff Woodruff. He was one of 497 head sold; the aggregate was R161,305,000, and the average was R324,557.

Sweet Sanette (SAf) (Jallad), who downed top sprinter Sacred Kingdom (Aus) to win the Bauhinia Sprint Trophy at Sha Tin, last weekend, was a R400,000 at this sale in 2007. Another top graduate of this auction is J J the Jet Plane (SAf) (Jet Master), a R300,000 purchase in 2008 who recently captured the G2 Al Quoz Sprint at Meydan.

All of South Africa's leading stallions are well represented at the sale. Currently leading the general sires list is Jet Master, who has topped the premiership the last four years running. He has 44 yearlings on offer, including lot 268, a full brother to J J The Jet Plane. Other leading sires represented on the sale include Silvano (Ger) (36), Jallad (20), Captain Al (SAf) (33), Fort Wood (24), Dynasty (SAf) (11) and Western Winner (21).

There are also some outstanding international sires with offspring on sale. Dubawi (Ire), whose first crop have stamped him as a superb sire, has a filly catalogued, whilst other top overseas-based stallions represented include Elusive Quality, Giant's Causeway and Rock of Gibraltar (Ire).

The sale will also offer some of the first local yearlings sired by Trippi, who is currently the second leading sire in the U.S. The son of End Sweep, who stands at Drakenstein Stud, has 20 yearlings slated to go under the hammer. A.P. Indy's half-brother, Tiger Ridge, has gotten off to a tremendous start since moving to South Africa. He has 22 yearlings set to sell.

The 2011 sale also offers the progeny of 13 individual Group 1-winning mares. There are also siblings to top-level winners Past Master (SAf), Gypsy's Warning (SAf), Big City Life (SAf), Rebel King (SAf) and Kings Gambit (SAf), among others.

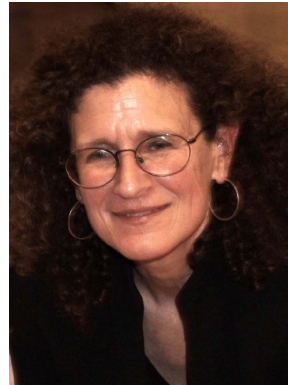

# WRITERS UP

**GORDON'S 'MISRULE' WINS BOOK PRIZE**

Castleton Lyons teamed with the *Thoroughbred Times* to present the fifth-annual Dr. Tony Ryan Book Award at the Lexington-area farm Wednesday night.

The grand prize, a handsome crystal trophy and \$10,000 purse, went to Jaimy Gordon's novel *Lord of Misrule*, the lone work of fiction among the finalists. Based at Gordon's invented Indian Mound Downs in West Virginia, the 296-page *Lord of Misrule* (McPherson and Co.) follows a small-time young trainer named Tommy Hansel, who looks to swoop in on the rough-and-tumble track with a small group of superior horses, cash out betting on his runners, then leave before anyone's the

wiser. There is also Hansel's innocent girlfriend Maggie Koderer, an old black groom named Medicine Ed, and the track itself--at the margins of the sport and home to those at the margins of society.

Gordon was on hand to accept the award, and, despite the subject matter, said she wasn't expecting the novel to generate so much enthusiasm in the racing world. "I've been so moved by the interest of racetrack people in this book," Gordon said during her acceptance speech. "It took me completely by surprise. I knew that I had written a literary novel, but I wasn't sure everybody would like it. I had a conversation with Andy Beyer about the book, and he said, 'By the way, Jaimy, who did you write this book for?' And I said that I wrote it for somebody who loves language more than anything in the world, and is willing to work hard to fully experience it. And for someone who loves horse racing more than anything in the world. And I then I thought about what I was saying and said, 'I wrote it for...me! I wrote it for one person! And you!' I could only think of two people who I was describing--Andy Beyer and myself. And at that moment, I kind of despaired. That's it?"



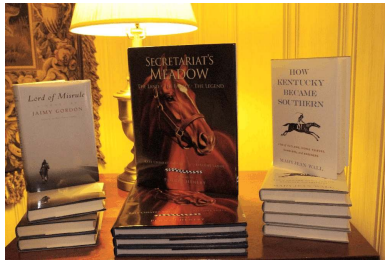

If she despaired then, she didn't for long. In November of 2010, the novel earned the prestigious National Book Award--which also carries at \$10,000 prize--and glowing reviews from publications like the *New York Times* and *Los Angeles Times*. Cont. p14

*Lord of Misrule* was one of three books named finalists, all of whom were written by women. Shane Ryan, son of the award's founder and head of Castleton Lyons, quipped during the proceedings that this was an Oaks race--"there are no colts here," he said. In addition to Gordon's work, there was Maryjean Wall's *How Kentucky Became Southern*, a history of the Bluegrass and horse racing published by University Press of Kentucky; and Kate Chenery Tweedy and Leanne Ladin's *Secretariat's Meadow*, about the land and family that produced the great 1973 Triple Crown winner and published by Dementi Milestone. Each finalist received \$1,000 and a crystal trophy.



A large crowd, gathered on the second floor of Castleton Lyons' stallion complex, were treated to speeches by each of the finalists, who detailed what their books were about and how they came to be. Chenery Tweedy, the daughter of Secretariat's owner and racing's first lady Penny Chenery Tweedy, explained how her mother was one of the hardest critics to win over, but said she gained a huge respect for her family's perseverance in the sport.

"I learned that even though great fortune--i.e. having a horse like Secretariat--seems like it comes out of the blue, that in granddaddy's and mom's case, it took a combination of passion, vision, determination, risk taking and hard work to open that door and let luck walk in," she explained.

As guests mingled about after the ceremony, Gordon spent her time not hobnobbing, but instead sitting and reading with Shane Ryan's young daughter and son. Among those present were the farm's president Stuart Fitzgibbon, Paramount Sales' Gabriel Duignan and Pat Costello, and Runnymede Farm's Martin O'Dowd.

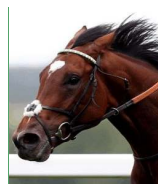
