## EVENTFUL TRIP TO KY FOR UNCLE MO

Champion **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie) arrived safely at Churchill Downs at noon Monday, but not without incident. The Tex Sutton plane that was carrying Uncle Mo, as well as **R Heat Lightning** (Trippi), likely favorite for the May 6 GI Kentucky Oaks, was diverted to Dulles Airport in Washington D.C. after a warning light flashed on shortly after take-off from New York. The problem proved minor, and the

flight was back on its way, landing in Louisville two hours late. "Representatives from Tex Sutton had called and said there was a slight hiccup--something mechanical or some sort of a warning light," Michael McCarthy, assistant to trainer Todd Pletcher, said. "The horses are here, everybody's bedded down and everybody's fine. We'll take it with a grain of salt." The Pletcher trainees are scheduled to gallop at Churchill this morning. Also shipping into Churchill Monday was **Mucho Macho Man** (Macho Uno), who vanned north from Gulfstream Park. He arrived at about 2:30 in the morning. "He's doing super," trainer Kathy Ritvo said. "He's very consistent. He gives it his all every day. He has a great attitude--just great energy."

## DUBAI PRINCE TO MISS THE CLASSICS

Godolphin's early Classic pretensions have been dealt a major blow with the news that the unbeaten **Dubai Prince (Ire)** (Shamardal) is injured. Having been pointed at next Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas, the former Dermot Weld-trained G3 Killavullan S. winner has suffered a hairline fracture of his right ilial wing in training and faces weeks on the shelf. "It is a big shame, as he had been shaping up nicely this spring," Racing Manager Simon Crisford commented. "He will now need a few weeks off, but he should be fine for later in the season."

## PRIMAL FORCE DIES

**Primal Force** (Blushing Groom {Fr}--Prime Prospect, by Mr. Prospector), the 2000 Broodmare of the Year, died Sunday at Adena Springs in Paris, Kentucky, due to complications while foaling. She was 24. Her foal, a full-sister to champion Macho Uno (Holy Bull), was saved. Bred and raced by Mrs. Bert Firestone, Primal Force had four wins and two thirds from her eight career starts. Frank Stronach purchased the bay for \$95,000 as a broodmare prospect at KEEJAN 1992. One of just three mares to boast multiple Breeders' Cup champions, she produced Awesome Again (Deputy Minister), winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, GI Whitney H., GII Stephen Foster H., GII Saratoga BC H., GII Jim Dandy S., GIII Hawthorne Gold Cup and the Queen's Plate, and earner of \$4,374,590; and Macho Uno, who captured the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, GI Grey BC S., GII Massachusetts H. and GIII Pennsylvania Derby and bankrolled \$1,851,803. Both stallions stand at Adena in Kentucky. "Primal Force was the foundation mare for Adena Springs," Stronach said. "She was part of our family and is responsible for much of the success we have had as breeders. She will be greatly missed by all of us."

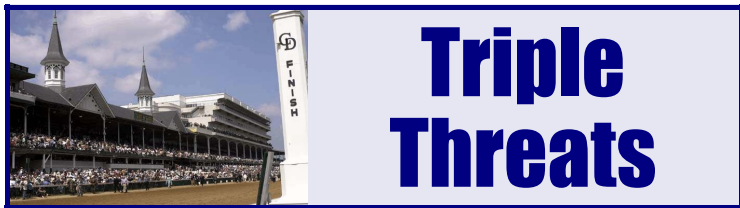

## Astrology Headed to Jerome...

Stonestreet Stables and George Bolton's **Astrology** (A.P. Indy), runner-up in the Mar. 27 GIII Sunland Park Derby, will now be pointed for the GII Jerome S. at Aqueduct Apr. 23. "We think the Jerome is a nice spot for him coming off the Sunland Derby, a race in which he ran hard," trainer Steve Asmussen said in a press release, adding, "We feel that running him in the [May 7 GI] Kentucky Derby off one prep race is too much to ask of him at this point." On the board in all six career starts, Astrology captured the GIII Iroquois S. at Churchill last October, and ended the season with a second in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. the following month. The Sunland Derby was his sophomore bow.

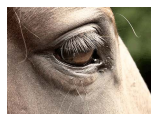

Barbaro's majestic victory in the Kentucky Derby still burns brightly in the memory nearly five years on. It was inevitable, then, that many of the breeders using Dynaformer the following year would try to replicate Barbaro's excellence by sending him more mares from the Mr. Prospector line--especially since Barbaro was far from an isolated example.

In addition to siring Barbaro from a Carson City mare, Dynaformer had also shown considerable potential with daughters of Seeking the Gold, Kingmambo and of Mr. Prospector himself. From only four runners out of Seeking the Gold mares, Dynaformer has been represented by the Grade I winner Riskaverse; his first foal out of a Kingmambo mare was Ocean Silk, the highest-rated English-trained 3-year-old staying filly of 2003; and his eight runners out of Mr. Prospector mares were headed by the Grade I winner Film Maker.

The intervening years have seen the merits of the Dynaformer/Mr. Prospector cross further advertised by the Grade I winners Gozzip Girl and Wiener Walzer (both out of Kingmambo mares), the Grade II winner Masseur (Mr. Prospector) and the Grade III winners Vacation (Seeking The Gold), Haka (Mr. Prospector) and Bearpath (Unbridled's Song).

When I wrote about Gozzip Girl and Wiener Walzer in July 2009, I commented that we could expect Dynaformer to come up with an avalanche of good winners from granddaughters of Mr. Prospector over the next few years.

This none-too-difficult prophecy is already coming to fruition thanks to Dynaformer's 70-strong 2008 crop, which includes 19 youngsters out of granddaughters of Mr. Prospector.

Godolphin's filly White Moonstone became the crop's first Group 1 winner when she retained her unbeaten record in the Fillies' Mile last September. She is one of Dynaformer's first 28 foals out of Seeking the Gold mares--a collection which has so far produced three graded winners, one stakes winner and four graded-placed performers.

Now the last-ditch victory by Brilliant Speed in the Blue Grass S. has raised the possibility that Dynaformer has another viable Kentucky Derby contender, following Blumin Affair, third to Go For Gin in 1994, Perfect Drift, who chased home War Emblem and Proud Citizen in 2002, and Barbaro in 2006.

Brilliant Speed is the first good winner to emerge from Dynaformer's first 14 foals out of Gone West mares, four of them 3-year-olds of 2011. However, Derby success would be nothing new for Gone West in the role of broodmare sire, as one of his daughters produced Motivator, winner of the 2005 Epsom Derby. Awesome Feather, last year's champion juvenile filly, is another out of a Gone West mare.

Gone West never managed to sire a Kentucky Derby winner, with Proud Citizen representing his best effort when second in 2002, but he did sire a Belmont S. winner in Commendable, and his son Elusive Quality made an indelible mark on the Triple Crown with Smarty Jones.

There is also a link to a winner of a Triple Crown event in Brilliant Speed's female line, as his second dam, the good Canadian filly Daijin, is a sister to Touch Gold, hero of the 1997 Belmont S. Daijin is also a half-sister to the Canadian Triple Crown winner With Approval, who later ran second in the Arlington Million and Breeders' Cup Turf, so there is no shortage of stamina in this family.

Brilliant Speed's third dam Passing Mood was a leading Canadian 2-year-old. However, her pedigree was more that of a top performer at around a mile and a quarter, as she was by Buckpasser and her first two dams were by Northern Dancer and Mahmoud. The Northern Dancer mare was Cool Mood, a winner of the Canadian Oaks, and the Mahmoud mare was Happy Mood, winner of the Acorn S., so this is a family of consistent quality. Other Grade I winners descending from Happy Mood include Discreet Cat, Discreetly Mine, Pretty Discreet, Buryyourbelief (Kentucky Oaks), Healthy Addiction and Haynesfield.

Daijin has also contributed to the family fortunes by producing the accomplished Canadian fillies Handpainted and Serenading to A.P. Indy. She also scored a hit in the sales ring when her Gone West filly Speed Succeeds sold for \$1,450,000 to Live Oak Plantation at Keeneland's 2002 September Sale. Only three fillies sold for more at that year's American yearling sales.

Unfortunately, Speed Succeeds never managed to race, but she has made amends by producing Brilliant Speed as her third foal, her fourth being a 2-year-old colt by Indian Charlie.

As Brilliant Speed started at 19-1 in the Blue Grass, having won only one of his seven previous races, it isn't easy to assess his prospects in the Kentucky Derby. The picture is also clouded by the fact that he was soundly beaten each time he tackled a dirt track. Remember, though, that those two dirt starts came on his first two starts last summer, one of them over five furlongs. He was slowly away on his debut, and showed distinct signs of inexperience when rank on his second appearance. His all-weather debut in the Blue Grass was preceded by five starts on turf, a surface that also featured in Barbaro's route to Churchill Downs.

It's in his favour that he will be suited by the step up to a mile and a quarter and his pedigree suggests that he deserves a chance to shine back on the main track, as it combines two forces--Hail to Reason and Mr. Prospector--which have regularly made their presence felt on Derby Day.

God bless you. That was beautifully spot on and dreadfully spot on, both, I am sad to say. (*A Managed Response, TDN Op/Ed, 4/18/11.*)

You so exactly captured the really agonizing thing for those of us who know these animals, certainly myself, I am afraid, better than I know humans...that look; damn that look and how can this be violated, the trust this look portrays?

One way is to never see these sales first hand, to stay away from anything where you have to look too close at the "by-products" of our sport. It's not hard to do and mostly, but for the media or someone inside like you making us look, we can avoid hard thoughts on this.

I have always taken the utmost care to be responsible for all the animals in my program, but there's no telling what happens to them when I am no longer in control of their destiny. Almost certainly, as I have been doing this thing for now 34 years, animals from my breeding, racing, sales or clients have, unbeknownst to any of us...ended up ending this way.

I bought a yearling for a man who cares absolutely always for his horses first. This was his first venture into sole proprietorship and this wonderful gelding ended up winning a stakes in his third start at three. That was years ago and he was eventually taken from his trainer through the claim box. Always watching after him and his well-being, through several years of changing hands and earning a decent living for his connections, this gentleman had this gelding's trainer/owner contacted and told them absolutely if ever they were finished with him to call him and he would buy/take, whatever it would require, this horse and ensure him a permanent home.

Outside of this kind of valorous and responsible behavior, I don't know the answer. There are flat out too many horses and they have no residual value. Drive around in Ocala if you want your heart broken by the empty farms, overgrown and endlessly, seemingly hopelessly listed for sale, one after the other. Listen to the stories of people with no money and unable to pay rent, unable to feed themselves, and we have seen this, still trying so hard to feed the animals they cannot even entertain breeding or breaking or even registering now. It's terrible, it's pervasive and I don't know that there is a remedy, but rescue...

**WAR FRONT FILLY TOPS OBS APRIL EARLY RETURNS** Few sires have been as hot as War Front (Danzig) at the juvenile sales this year, and the lone prospect by Claiborne's up-and-comer at the opening session of the OBS Spring Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale Monday kept the ball rolling for the second-crop stallion. [Hip 261](#), a filly by War Front out of SW Tappin For Gold (Pleasant Tap), was purchased by Buzz Chace, agent for Jayeff B Stable, for \$275,000. Consigning duties were handled by Alexandra de Meric and Brandon Rice, who had acquired the filly under the banner New Mission Bloodstock for \$80,000 at Keeneland September. She was the fifth-highest War Front yearling to sell last season. At that point, War Front could boast a single black-type winner, the grassy GIII With Anticipation S. hero Soldat, but in the next few months, he'd add five more, including **"TDN Rising Star"**  The Factor, home first in the GII San Vicente and GII Rebel S. War Front's daughter Summer Soiree, meanwhile, became his third graded winner in the GIII Bourbonette Oaks, and Soldat established himself as a legitimate GI Kentucky Derby hopeful with a victory in the GII Fountain of Youth S.

War Front's success has led to something of a run on his 2-year-olds this year. Bloodstock agent Steve Young went to \$375,000 for a colt out of True Gritz (Yes It's True), then came back at Keeneland April to buy a half-brother to Laragh (Tapit) for \$475,000. At the same Keeneland April Sale, Stonestreet Stables purchased a colt out of La Prada for \$485,000--the second-highest price at the auction. Hip 261 rode this momentum into OBS April, then separated herself from the pack with a sharp [:10 1/5](#) breeze going an eighth Apr. 12. She becomes the second straight big seller at the OBS Spring sale for de Meric and Rice. A year ago, the couple sold Humble and Hungry (Limehouse--Cukee, by Langfuhr), a \$7,000 FTKOCT yearling buy, to Bob Feld, agent for Sagamore Farm, for \$200,000. The colt was a grassy maiden winner at Belmont last fall and was beaten just 3 1/2 lengths when unplaced in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf in November.

**'Descent' Bro Brings \$150,000...**

A day after Turbulent Descent (Congrats) stretched clear to an easy win in the GII Beaumont S. at Keeneland, a year-younger half-brother to the MGISW went under the hammer at OBS April. By the red-hot expatriated sire Trippi, the colt sold to Hidden Brook for \$150,000. Selling from the draft of breeder Ocala Stud as [hip 59](#), the colt was produced by the 10-year-old Roger's Sue (Forestry), an unraced half-sister to MGSP Bonay (Wild Again) whose second dam is the MGISW millionairess Gorgeous (Slew o'Gold). Ocala Stud sent out hip 59 to a quarter-mile breeze in [:21 1/5](#): at the first breeze show Apr. 12.

"He is a nice colt," said Hidden Brook's Dan Hall, bidding for an unnamed client. "We liked the way he breezed, and he looked the part at the end of the shank, too. And obviously the pedigree's there. Trippi's having a great year. We were happy to get him."

Trippi is the sire of five 2011 black-type winners, including not one but three E. Paul Robsham Stable homebreds. They include the outstanding R Heat Lightning, runner-up to Awesome Feather (Awesome of Course) in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies last fall and a dominating winner of the GII Davona Dale S. and GII Gulfstream Park Oaks in her last two. She's currently one of the favorites for the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill May 6. The Trippi/Robsham train also includes the sophomore colt Travelin Man, hero of the GII Swale S. at Gulfstream Apr. 3, and R Holiday Mood, another 3-year-old filly who won the Out Rules S. at Aqueduct Mar. 13.

**Soldat Team Lands Two...**

Two years ago, bloodstock agent Steve Shahinian and owner Harvey Clarke came up with GII Fountain of Youth S. winner Soldat (War Front) after combing the backstretch at Keeneland September, and yesterday, the pair were busy at OBS. They came away with two horses, led by [hip 92](#), a New York-bred filly by Hook and Ladder--Savasana (Scatmandu) from Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables consignment who went for \$120,000. Juvenile pinhooker Eddie Woods has been on a tear this year, selling four horses for \$300,000 or more at Fasig-Tipton Florida, a trio for over \$300,000 at OBS March, and the sales-topping \$625,000 Pomeroy--Leah's Angel colt at Barretts March. At last week's Keeneland April Sale, he added two more horses that sold north of \$300,000, putting the total at no fewer than 10 in 2011 to reach or eclipse that figure.

While Woods didn't reach those heights yesterday at OBS April, he did come away with a home run, selling [hip 102](#), a filly by Kafwain--Seattle Splash (Chief Seattle) for \$200,000. Woods purchased the Kafwain filly for \$31,000 as an OBSAUG yearling.

Grace Stables LLC signed the winning slip. Grace Stables is the nom de course of Barbara Banke, the wife of Stonestreet Stable's Jess Jackson. They typically race and buy colts under the banner Stonestreet, and fillies through Grace Stables.

Woods also sold [hip 197](#), a filly by first-crop sire Sunriver (Saint Ballado) out of Starinthemeadow (Meadowlake), for \$175,000. Quarter Pole Enterprises acquired the filly for \$40,000 at OBS August.

**NATIONAL HBPA OPPOSED TO RCI FIVE-YEAR PLAN AS CURRENTLY PROPOSED**

The National HBPA Board of Directors issued a press release Monday, stating their unanimous opposition to the plan proposed by the Association of Racing Commissioners International that all medication in racing be phased out in the next five years. In the release, the National HBPA stated, "As the national representative of the largest number of horsemen who would be directly impacted by what the RCI proposes, the National HBPA takes issue with RCI's strategy of pushing a proposal with such far-reaching implications without initially conferring with any of the major representative horsemen's groups, including the National HBPA. The National HBPA agrees that, within the five-year goal established by the RCI, a national plan that addresses the concerns it has raised could be attainable. However, the vagueness of the RCI's proposal and its pre-determined outcome are cause for great concern." To address the issue, the National HBPA has announced that its annual Summer Convention, to be held July 21-24 in Seattle, will focus entirely on the RCI proposal. Speaker forums will be assembled with the goal of answering questions including what the consequences of the RCI plan might be; what alternative therapies would be available to treat horses that bleed if the use of Furosemide is banned; how trainers in other countries handle the problem; what the economic impact on racing might be; and what factors might make U.S. horses more susceptible to bleeding. "The National HBPA is dedicated to gathering divergent and reasonable viewpoints on this issue, and will continue to rely upon the reasoned, professional and scientific approach to the medication policy that statistics show serves our industry well," the statement said. **Purses Hiked for Hollywood Meet:**

*(Edited press release)* The spring/summer meet at Hollywood Park, which begins with an eight-race program Thursday, will see an increase in overnight purses from the 2010 season. Overnight purses for the 54-day meet will be range from \$290,000-\$300,000 per day, a boost of between 16-20% over last year, according to Martin Panza, Hollywood Park's racing secretary and vice president of racing. "The increases in purses for claiming horses can help keep an owner in business," said Panza. "Someone can claim a horse for, say \$12,500, win a race and be out on the claim. This could lead to an increase in horse inventory and stimulate more business."

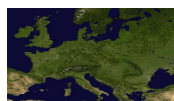
