Triple Threats

Uncle Mo Gallops at Churchill

Trainer Todd Pletcher was on hand to watch as **Uncle Mo** (Indian Charlie) galloped over the Churchill Downs strip yesterday after shipping into Louisville Monday. Last year's champion juvenile colt continues to be treated for a gastrointestinal tract infection that was diagnosed a few days after his third-place effort in the

Apr. 9 GI Wood Memorial. "I think he's in the same position that every horse in this race is in, that they need to have a really good 19 days," Pletcher said. "Obviously, when you have a gastrointestinal tract infection, you know your appetite is not going to be as good as you'd like for it to be. So we feel like he's making progress and that he's

doing well, but, like I said, he's got to have a really good 19 days. Last year, [Kentucky Derby winner] Super Saver was awesome for 21 days here. That's what you need, and that's why everything has to fall into place." Uncle Mo is expected to work twice at Churchill before the May 7 GI Kentucky Derby, but the timing of the drills is still up in the air. "If I decide he needs a few extra days, then obviously that's going to push the other one back a few days at the other end," Pletcher explained. Pletcher added that **Brethren** (Distorted Humor) would head to WinStar Farm for a few weeks following his 11th-place effort in Saturday's GI Arkansas Derby. "Physically there is nothing," Pletcher said. "It was just a disappointing effort. WinStar's right there, so they're going to take him home and give him a freshening."

Jaycito Doubtful for Lexington

Zayat Stable's **Jaycito** (Victory Gallop) remains questionable for Saturday's GIII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Winner of last year's GI Norfolk Breeders' Cup S., the colt was second in the Mar. 12 GII San Felipe S. in his only 2011 start to date. He missed the Apr. 9 GI Santa Anita Derby with a bruised right front foot, and has not worked since Apr. 2. Jaycito was originally expected to ship to Kentucky Tuesday, but has been delayed until at least Thursday. Trainer Bob Baffert said he would make a decision on the Lexington today.

Classic Corner

Bassett out of Guineas Picture

Wootton Bassett (GB) (Iffraaj {GB}) was the latest high-profile name to drop out of the reckoning for the G1 2000 Guineas yesterday after trainer Richard Fahey admitted defeat in his race to get the unbeaten colt to Newmarket on time. Last year's G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere winner had suffered a setback earlier this year, and that has proved costly in the run-up to next Saturday's Classic. "It's disappointing, but we didn't want to go to the

Guineas if he wasn't 100 percent," Fahey told *sportinglife.com*. "We'll look at other options now. We could go to the Curragh for the [May 21] G1 Irish 2000 Guineas or Longchamp for the French version [G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp May 15]. We missed 3 1/2 weeks with him just at the wrong time. He was back cantering at the end of February, and Newmarket will just come too soon for him."

'Ex' on Cologne Trail...

Trainer Marco Botti is aiming Saturday's G3 Greenham S. runner-up **Excelebration (Ire)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}) at the G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen (German 2000 Guineas) at Cologne May 22. Second to Frankel (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in Newbury's seven-furlong contest, Giuliano Manfredini's colt will step up to a mile for the Classic if the ground is on the quick side. "We were obviously very pleased with the run," Botti told *PA Sport*. "He ran a good race, and proved he's a nice horse. I'm convinced his ideal trip would be seven furlongs, but talking to Adam Kirby, who rode him, he's pretty sure the horse will stay a mile. He wasn't running out of petrol at the end. He kept going and he didn't give up, so the extra furlong won't be a problem. I think we might go for the German Guineas, but we want good ground not soft. We still have the [June 15] G3 Jersey S. back over seven furlongs at Royal Ascot, and we might give him an entry in the [June 14] G1 St James's Palace there as well to have a couple of options. He has proved he's up to that level, so we want to aim him at some of the big races."

THE REALLY NEW WORLD ORDER

The King is Retired; long live the King. Yes, the retirement of A.P. Indy truly marks the end of an era-- the era before all sires had the opportunity, through veterinary advances, to cover probably double the mares they had before. We mark that as having happened in 1995, so our view is that virtually all sires whose first foals were born in 1996 and later have stood their entire careers in the 'big-book era.' There are a few exceptions among active sires, notably Monsun in Germany (first foals 1997) and Unusual Heat (first foals 1999) in California. But, really, with the retirement of A.P. Indy, all the other leading active sires are 'big-book era' sires.

Since we are 15 years into the Big-Book Era, we have a lot of evidence of what we should expect from today's top active sires: the most easily recognizable statistic is percentage of black-type winners (or stakes winners, though 'black-type winners' is better, as there are stakes that are not black type, and 'black type' is the essential ingredient in all Thoroughbred values) from foals of racing age. In the old days, the gold standard was 10%. Now, and for at least the last five years, we've established definitively it is between 5.5 and 6% black-type winners to foals.

In APEX terms, we've noted how the A Runner Index for the top sires has fallen from index figures between 4.50-5.00 (nine to 10% A Runners from year-starters), which were achieved by the likes of Danzig, Storm Cat, Nureyev, Sadler's Wells, Danehill--and seven-time Leading Sire by APEX A Runner Index, A.P. Indy. Now the leading active sire by A Runner Index (excepting Unusual Heat and Monsun, and F2006 sire Speightstown) is **Galileo**, with a 3.72 A Runner Index 2004-2010 (his entire career, since his first foals raced in 2005). This is just under 7.5% A Runners from year-starters, some 20% lower than the top figures for the stars of yesteryear. That's the story in the Big-Book Era ([click here](#) to see the top active sires by A Runner Index, excepting Unusual Heat and Monsun).

But establishing the top sires cannot be completely encapsulated by the A Runner Index. These are earners of \$105,000+ in a season in North America, and corresponding figures in other countries. There are about the same number of A Runners as there are listed and group/graded black-type winners combined. To try and really rate the new top 30 active sires in North America and Europe, we mined our database and did a little added research, and came up with two other numbers we'd suggest need to be taken into consideration. The first is the sire's career percentage of 'unique' A Runners (counted only once, no matter how many years they qualified as an A Runner) to named foals of racing age. **Cont. p4**

This could be particularly important in the case of sires whose first foals raced before 2004, the first year for which sires' current A Runner indexes are calculated. Distorted Humor's first crop of 3-year-olds, for example, included 2003 GI Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide, who may have gone on to be an A Runner in subsequent seasons; but the 2003 season, when Funny Cide, won the Derby, was not included in Distorted Humor's current A Runner Index. The career percentage fixes that ([click here to see the top sires by percentage of 'unique' A Runners to named foals of racing age](#)).

Second, we did some research on the number and percentage of Group 1/Grade I winners among the 678 sires used to calculate leading APEX sires (those with 200+ year-starters 2004-2010), and came up with an estimate of 0.61% Group 1/Grade I winners from foals (roughly one in 164 foals). We then indexed that for what we identified as the current active top 30 sires (including two F2008 sires, Bernardini and War Front, which do not yet have APEX ratings). [Click here to see the 28 sires ranked by this index](#)--Galileo is number one in this category, too, by the way, with a 3.62 'G1/GI Index', followed by **Street Cry** (3.35), **Montjeu** (2.97), **Giant's Causeway** (2.79), and **Pivotal** (2.78). Incidentally, you'll see in the three click-through tables that we have separated the F2006 sires (**Tapit**, **Medaglia d'Oro**, **Speightstown**, **Candy Ride**) and the two F2007 sires (**Dubawi**, **Shamardal**) from the 22 'older' sires (first foals 1998-2005) in those lists.

We then created a points system, weighting each of the three figures equally, to come up with at least a tentative ranking of the new Top 30 Active North American and European sires, in the table below. We called an audible and calculated the positions based on 21 of the 'older' sires, so you'll notice in the three 'rank' columns on the right of the table, that, for example, both Tapit and Oasis Dream have a number four ranking by 2004-2010 A Runner Index. It's because the calculation was based on 21 sires, but postulated a 'what if' based on where the four F2006 sires would have rated had they been included with the older group. Basically, don't worry about it. I make some subjective assumptions.

As you'll see in the accompanying table, Galileo does indeed rate as the world (sorry, North American and European) number one, using this little formula. Current leading 2011 North American sire Tapit ranks second, ahead of Street Cry, Giant's Causeway, another F2006 sire in Speightstown, **Oasis Dream**, and **Distorted Humor**. A third North American F2006 sire, Candy Ride, ranks eighth, followed by **Awesome Again**, **Smart Strike**, **Unbridled's Song**, and a fourth North American F2006 sire, **Medaglia d'Oro**. So four North American F2006 sires rank among the top 12. Kentucky sires actually occupy 10 of the first 12 spots, along with Galileo and Oasis Dream from Europe. For the top 30, 18 stand in Kentucky, 12 stand in Europe. **Cont. p5**

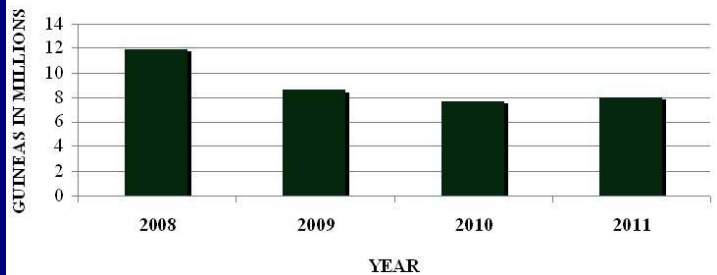
Weekly Sales Ticker

"With the demise of the Guineas two-year-old sale, the number catalogued and sold at Tattersalls' Craven meeting Two-Year-Old sale were much more comparable to 2008 (pre-crash) and 2009 (post-crash) figures than they were to last year's sale. The most relevant comparison seems to be with post-crash 2009, from which the gross was down seven percent, and the average down two percent. With exactly the same number of two-year-olds catalogued so far (1,313) this year as last year, the number sold is up five percent, the gross is almost even, and the average is down five percent."

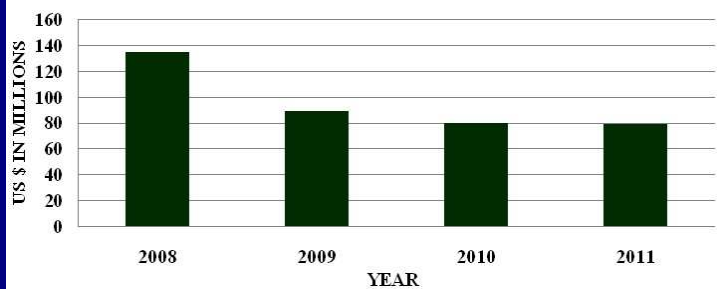
TATTERSALLS CRAVEN BREEZE UP SALE

It's really too complicated to try and create a World Top 30 just yet, since we don't have comprehensive enough comparable figures for Southern Hemisphere sires, and it's also very difficult to compare figures from Japan as well. So we'll stick to North America and Europe for these purposes, but we would certainly note the four top sires at Inglis's Sydney Easter sale earlier this month, because their averages reflected their stature among Australasian sires: **Redoute's Choice**, **Encosta de Lago**, **Fastnet Rock**, and **More Than Ready** (Southern Hemisphere version).

op/ed feedback

Thank you, Sue, for a wonderful perspective, and thank you for your service on behalf of so many retired racehorses ([TDN Op/Ed, April 18, 2011](#)). Like the writer whose letter you printed yesterday, I too feel that the trust the mare you displayed (and then saved) cannot in honor be denied. But wringing hands and wishing that people were different will change nothing. As your writer implicitly said, too many people take on responsibility for horses that they either cannot or will not discharge. That is "pay to play," i.e. impose a charge on entries, on purchases, or wherever, that will force those owners to pay toward retiring the horses they race, rather than abandoning them.

My colleagues in Mosaic Racing pay regularly into a retirement account for our horses. When our retired, now-deceased race mare was two, she already had CDs in a 401 H. Similarly, when I was in a claiming partnership in MD, we found our horses new homes, including those we no longer owned, when they could no longer race.

As you know, this acceptance of responsibility is not widespread, and those who wish to avoid it will fight hard against any attempt to make them pay to play. Perhaps that's why no one is undertaking that fight, but instead, wringing their hands and wishing. Meanwhile, blaming the retirement groups for their management failings is simply a distraction from the real problem: people who abandon their responsibilities, like their horses, to others.

MIZZEN MAST OFFSPRING LEAD WAY AT OBS TUESDAY

A pair of juveniles by Mizzen Mast headlined Tuesday's second session of the four-day Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's April Sale. A colt by the Juddmonte stallion jumped to the top of the leader board late in the day with a final bid of \$240,000 from EQB's Patrice Miller. [Hip 679](#), consigned by Paul Sharp, agent, is out of Copper Rose (Unbridled), a half-sister to graded stakes winner Namaqualand (Mr. Prospector). He worked a quarter-mile in :21 flat at last week's under tack show. The bay colt was purchased by Machmer Hall and partners for \$60,000 as a Keeneland November weanling in 2009, and RNA'd for \$75,000 at Keeneland last September. "I loved this colt from the day I laid eyes on him as a weanling," reported Machmer Hall's Carrie Brogden. "He was a very uncomplicated, sound horse that worked well and vetted cleanly. There were two other partners on him that bought into him sight unseen, and I appreciate that so much. Paul and Sarah [Sharp] have been amazing friends and partners over the years. They do a great job, and people that buy off them know the horses' best days are ahead of them and not behind them. I am absolutely delighted and thrilled." Brogden was following a proven formula with yesterday's colt. "We love Mizzen Mast as a sire," she said. "I have sold three with Paul Sharp. Two have become graded stakes horses, including the graded stakes winner Strike the Bell, who we pinhooked with Dave Ingordo." Earlier during Tuesday's session, a filly by Mizzen Mast sold for \$210,000 to Narvick International. The gray filly ([hip 516](#)), out of Baby Lets Cruise, is a half-sister to stakes placed Quick Ride (Afleet Alex), and was consigned by Costanzo Sales. Anthony Costanzo purchased the youngster for \$42,000 as a Keeneland September yearling. She worked a furlong in :10 flat at last week's breeze show. Through two days of the four-day auction, 403 juveniles have grossed \$12,679,500. The average of \$31,463 is up 15.6% from the 2010 figure of \$27,210. The sale continues today at 10:30 a.m.

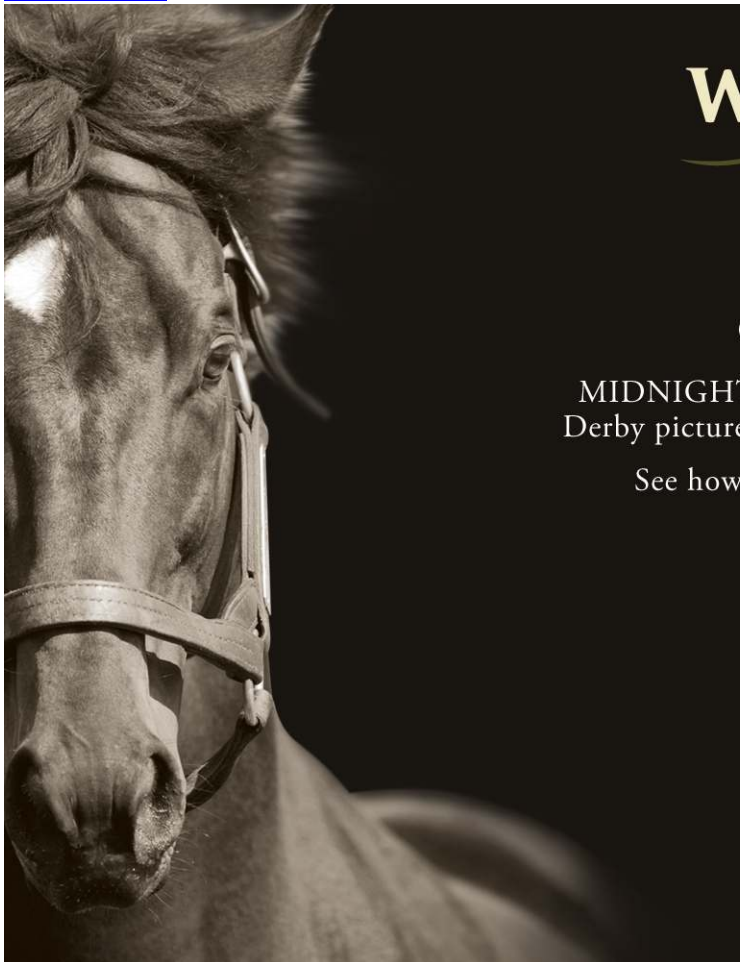
