## BC CHALLENGE PROGRAM EXPANDS

The Breeders' Cup Challenge for 2011 has been expanded to 68 races, with 10 additional international Group 1 events offering springboards to the Breeders' Cup Championships, which will be held at Churchill Nov. 4-5. Officials also revealed that the winners of the challenge races would have their entry fees paid, and travel allowances would be provided for their connections.

"We have strengthened the Breeders' Cup Challenge by upgrading the quality of the races and creating greater incentives for horsemen to participate in the series by paying the winners' entry fees and travel expenses into the championships," said Clem Murphy, chairman of the Breeders' Cup Racing and Nominations Committee. "All of these factors will help to generate increased awareness for our championships throughout the summer and fall, while promoting the best of Thoroughbred racing from around the world." The Breeders' Cup will provide \$20,000 in travel allowances to Challenge winners from outside of North America, and \$10,000 for winners of Challenge races on this continent. Among the 10 new international races added are the G1 Takarazuka Kinen at Hanshin June 26, whose winner will receive an automatic berth in the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf; and the G2 Clasico Belgrano at Palermo in Buenos Aires June 18, which could be a springboard to the GIII Breeders' Cup Marathon. To ensure that the world's best horses can compete in the challenge series and the Breeders' Cup World Championships, Breeders' Cup is offering a special one-time "Open Enrollment" program this year. The Open Enrollment program, which ends June 30, is available to any non-nominated horse anywhere in the world as long as the sire is Breeders' Cup nominated in 2011. Non-nominated horses can be made fully eligible according to the following Open Enrollment fee schedule: yearlings for \$3,000, 2-year-olds for \$6,000 and 3-year-olds and up for \$25,000.

## APRIL RETURN FOR WINTER MEMORIES

**Winter Memories** (El Prado {Ire}) will be part of a full starting gate for the GIII Appalachian S. today at Keeneland, her first start since coming up short as the even-money favorite in the GII Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Turf at Churchill Nov. 5. Previously a scintillating winner of the GIII Miss Grillo S., the daughter of millionaire Memories of Silver (Silver Hawk) has been working like clockwork at Palm Meadows since February. She'll need to be ready, as there are some talented fillies in the line-up. ♣ **"TDN Rising Star"** ♣ **Ruthenia** (Pulpit) also kicks off her 3-year-old season. The dark bay paired up wins in the space of 20 days at Belmont last fall, including the Good Mood S. on Halloween. She is trained by Christophe Clement, who also conditioned her full-sister, GISW Rutherienne. "She's just high energy--same with Rutherienne," said Clement's assistant Ben Colebrook. "A lot of the good fillies, they seem to have a high energy level. You run them and the day after the race, they're bucking and kicking. They handle everything better than a normal horse." Another Appalachian entrant perfect in two starts is **Smart Sting** (Smart Strike), a daughter of champion Perfect Sting (Red Ransom) who is coming off a sharp allowance score at Gulfstream Mar. 16.

**Sadler Looking Forward to Oaks Start with Zazu**

Trainer John Sadler reported yesterday that all systems are on go with his GI Kentucky Oaks hopeful **Zazu** (Tapit). The gray filly, who beat the speedy Turbulent Descent (Congrats) in the Feb. 5 GI Las Virgenes S. ([video](#)), has not started since finishing a late-closing second to that rival in the Mar. 5 GI Santa Anita Oaks ([video](#)).

"I wanted to give her a little breather," explained Sadler of the eight weeks between the Santa Anita Oaks and May 6 Kentucky Oaks. "She had a lot of races there in a short period. And we thought, after she ran so well in the Santa Anita Oaks, we'd just train her up to the Kentucky Oaks. We think [the layoff] is a positive for her." Zazu worked six furlongs at Hollywood Park Sunday in 1:13.1. "She's been working steadily right along," Sadler said. "The week before that she worked [six furlongs :14 [1:14.3]. She's been training right along and doing well." **Cont.p4**

Sadler added that the Jerry and Ann Moss colorbearer will have two more works before the Oaks, but travel plans remain open. "I've a couple of options," the trainer said. "I could work her twice more at Hollywood or maybe the last work in Kentucky. I won't make up my mind on that until after she works this Sunday." Whenever she arrives in Kentucky, Sadler is sure Zazu will relish the nine furlongs of the Oaks. "We think she'll love the Oaks distance. And the other thing that we think is that, if it comes up muddy, we think she'll handle that, too." On the board in six of seven starts, including four stakes races, Zazu has won twice and earned \$290,985 to date. Sadler is optimistic of a big effort from his charge at Churchill on the first Friday in May. "We know it's always a tough race, but I think she is a good fit and I'm looking forward to it." Zazu's dam Rhumb Line (Mr. Greeley) produced a chestnut filly by GI Belmont S. winner Birdstone Apr. 11.

**RMTC JOINS NTRA AND AAEP IN ORGANIZING UPCOMING INTERNATIONAL SUMMIT TO ADDRESS RACE-DAY MEDICATION**

The Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTC) board of directors announced Wednesday that it will join the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) and American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) in organizing an international summit this summer to address race-day medication. The exact date and location of the summit will be announced in the very near future. The announcement came following a day-long meeting of the RMTC Apr. 19 in Dallas, Texas. "With our scientific research and our Drug Testing Initiative, we have the infrastructure to help the industry administer, in a uniform and effective manner, any medication program it chooses to pursue," said Dr. Rick Arthur, RMTC officer and equine medical director for the California Horse Racing Board. Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the NTRA, added, "The NTRA welcomes the opportunity to bring together a broad range of international industry views on race-day medication. Our goal is to ensure that all stakeholders are included in the dialogue so that the ultimate conclusions are based on an objective evaluation of the facts." AAEP Executive Director David Foley also responded to RMTC's call for action, saying, "The AAEP is pleased to co-sponsor this meeting, and stands ready to assist the industry in any way that we can. Our chief concern is for the health and welfare of the horse, and ensuring the integrity and vitality of the sport." ## RECORD U.S. ENTRY FOR ROYAL ASCOT

*Edited press release*

Entries for Royal Ascot's seven Group 1 races will see a record 10 U.S. candidates--and up to 11 nations represented--at this year's June meet, it was revealed yesterday. Furthermore, in addition to the European contingent, there are four possibles from Australia, three from Hong Kong, two from Singapore, and three from Japan. Among the U.S. entries for the June 18 G1 Golden Jubilee S. is last term's GI Santa Anita Derby winner **Sidney's Candy** (Candy Ride {Arg}). Owner Bobby Flay may be represented in the June 17 G1 Coronation S. by last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Filly Turf victress **More Than Real** (More Than Ready). Trainer Ken McPeck has also earmarked that one-mile contest for the GI Ashland S. third-place finisher **Kathmanblu** (Bluegrass Cat). Singapore's sprint sensation and recent G1 Golden Shaheen hero **Rocket Man (Aus)** (Viscount {Aus}) is another candidate for the Golden Jubilee, and may be joined by compatriot **Better Be The One (Aus)** (More Than Ready). Japan's trio includes last year's champion 2-year-old **Grand Prix Boss (Jpn)** (Sakura Bakushin O {Jpn}) and recent G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) heroine **Marcellina (Jpn)** (Deep Impact {Jpn}). "We're obviously delighted to have received such strong entries, from all around the world, in quality and quantity terms for the Royal Ascot Group 1 races," commented Ascot's Nick Smith. "Twenty-two individual horses from outside Europe, many doubly engaged, is a record at the initial stage, and there are also two in the [G2] Ribblesdale [S.]. We're hoping to see some 2-year-olds from the U.S. as well. The Americans steal the limelight somewhat, but it is also particularly pleasing to see three entries from Japan, as we haven't had a runner from there since 2006, and of course to see the name of Singapore's star, Rocket Man, amongst the entries. Whilst the sprints, bolstered by the Global Sprint Challenge, have obviously attracted the lion's share of the international entries, the interest in the 3-year-old mile showdowns is encouraging. The British, French, Irish and wider European interest in the Royal Meeting remains just as important as attracting runners from outside Europe, of course, and it is worth noting that Godolphin have made 44 entries and Aidan O'Brien has made 35."

### Frankel Heads 2000 Guineas 19...

Khalid Abdullah's **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) heads 19 possibles for the Apr. 30 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket following Tuesday's scratchings deadline. The recent G3 Greenham S. winner remains on course for the one-mile Classic, and trainer Henry Cecil expects the step up from seven furlongs to be in his favor. "Frankel did everything I expected him to do on Saturday and I now hope he can come good on 2000 Guineas day," Cecil said. "The race should bring him on, and I also feel that another furlong should be to his advantage. One can never be over confident, but I am very hopeful for him. Win or lose, I am sure he will improve as the year goes on." Chief among his rivals is last year's unbeaten G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. winner **Pathfork** (Distorted Humor), who also remains engaged. "As of this moment, Pathfork is running and I'm happy with his progress," commented trainer Jessica Harrington. "So far, touching all wood, it's so good. He had very good form last year, he did everything that was asked of him and so I couldn't ask for any more." Godolphin's G1 Racing Post Trophy victor **Casamento (Ire)** (Shamardal) and Ballydoyle's G1 Criterium International winner **Roderic O'Connor (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) are other notables to stand their ground. **Zoffany (Ire)** (Dansili {GB}), **Strong Suit** (Rahy) and **Glor Na Mara (Ire)** (Leroidesanimaux {Brz}) were among the 33 sophomores scratched.

## Kinsale King Nearing Return...

**Kinsale King** (Yankee Victor), scratched on the morning of his title defense in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen at Meydan last month, is expected to return to action at Hollywood before adding to his frequent flyer miles. "He caught a bug and had bad blood in Dubai, but we regrouped," said trainer Carl O'Callaghan. "He will work here this week, run in the Cool Frenchy S. May 7, and go back to Royal Ascot in England for the G1 King's Stand S. at five furlongs June 19." The Cool Frenchy is a five-furlong test on Hollywood's Cushion Track. Last year at Royal Ascot, the 6-year-old ran third in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. O'Callaghan also indicated that his charge **Leaving New York** (Tribal Rule) has been nominated to this year's Golden Jubilee S. The 4-year-old runs Saturday in the Tiznow S. at Hollywood.

**CORINTHIAN FILLY TOPS OBS DAY 3**

Trainer Mark Casse made his presence felt as the leading buyer at OBS March, purchasing six head for \$1.755 million. After going the first two sessions of the OBS Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training without a purchase, the Canadian-based horseman was back in the spotlight, landing at least two horses, including the session-topping Corinthian--Glacken's Mark filly for \$320,000. Casse also purchased [hip 715](#), a filly by Smart Strike--Daily Special (Dayjur), for \$50,000. With today's fourth and final session still remaining, the Corinthian filly, selling as [hip 916](#) from the draft of Niall Brennan Stables, is the sale's highest-priced juvenile.

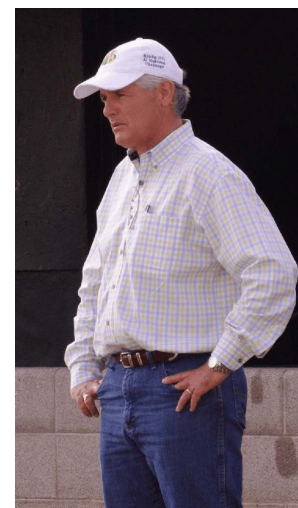
"She's done very well," said Brennan. "She was a bit raw as a yearling, but developed beautifully as she got fit. She's a tall, elegant filly with great scope to her. She's got a great stride on her, and when you come look at her at the barn, she looks like the kind who's going to get two turns."

The Jan. 21-foaled miss is the first foal from the stakes-winning Glacken's Mark (Smoke Glacken), and represented a nice score for her breeders, John McLane and Irv Wiemer. The partners originally offered the filly at last year's Keeneland September sale, but opted to buy her back for \$47,000 and instead send her to Brennan.

"They're both clients of mine from Florida," said Brennan. "They race a few every year, and they kept this filly's dam to breed. They're great guys and have been in the business a good bit."

Wiemer and McLane have owned, among others, Something Ventured (Cobra King), winner of the 2004 GIII My Charmer H. at Calder. They have also bred the black-type winner Passive Income (High Yield), and pinhooked subsequent Grade I winner Burning Roma (Rubiano). They bought Burning Roma for \$50,000 as a KEENOV weanling in 1998 before reselling him for \$90,000 as an OBSAUG yearling. Robert Scanlon ultimately sold Burning Roma to Hal Queen for \$40,000 at FTFFEB in 2000. Later in the year, the bay crossed the line second to City Zip (Carson City) in the GI Futurity S. at Belmont, but was put up to first via disqualification. Burning Roma retired with earnings of over \$1.5 million.

A month before they had acquired Burning Roma as a weanling, Wiemer and McLane purchased another weanling, a filly by Marquetry for \$40,000 at OBS October. They also pinhooked that horse, named Marquetup, sending her to Keeneland September. They failed to find the right price, however, and took her back when bidding stalled at \$47,000.

Put into training with Gary Capuano, Marquetup proved a modest runner, taking a Laurel maiden special weight in November 2001 in her lone career victory. Marquetup would prove a better broodmare for Wiemer and McLane. Her first live foal was Glacken's Mark--dam of yesterday's top-priced Corinthian filly.

Another buyback--she RNA'd for \$65,000 as a FTKJUL yearling--Glacken's Mark won four straight for the Todd Pletcher barn during her 2-year-old year in 2006, including a pair of minor stakes at Delaware Park, and like her dam would be kept as a broodmare prospect by McLane and Wiemer. She slipped in her first year, but produced this filly, from GI Met Mile winner Corinthian's first crop, in her second. Glacken's Mark had a Pure Prize colt in 2010 and produced an Afleet Alex colt in 2011.

At the third breeze show, the Corinthian filly showed some of her mother's precocity when she zipped a quarter in :21 1/5, giving her connections added confidence after a particularly strong run-up to the sale at Brennan's Ocala-based farm.

"We figured she'd sell very well--she's was just in the right place at the right time," said Niall Brennan. "She just developed so nicely in the past six weeks or so. She just came to hand beautifully, and then came over here and excelled. She breezed beautifully, and came out of it well. One the short lists, she just kept coming up, and people kept coming back for her, saying she was one of the better horses they've seen in the whole sale. She showed herself very well, with a lot of class. Mark Casse bought her. He works the sale very hard, and Gary Young does, as well, and he was the underbidder. I think those guys wanted her bad, but I think Gary was frustrated to wait around and not get her. But those are two guys who work the sale very hard, and they both landed on her."

**De Meric & Rice Spring the Double...**

Alexandra de Meric and Brandon Rice made their maiden voyage as a consigning team last year at OBS Spring, and enjoyed immediate success. From a draft comprised of just two prospects, they sold Humble and Hungry (Limehouse) for \$200,000. That, after spending just \$7,000 on him as a FTKOCT yearling. Humble and Hungry went on to break his maiden in a grassy maiden special weight at Belmont before finishing a solid eighth (beaten just over three lengths) in last November's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf at Churchill.



**De Meric & Rice**

Spreading the scope of their operation a bit in 2011, de Meric and Rice entered the season with a slightly bigger group of five of their own horses, and took on a few outside clients, as well. One of their clients was New Mission Bloodstock--made up of Jim McCartan, Willie Browne and partners--who asked the couple to ready a filly by War Front for the juvenile sales. On Monday, that filly topped the opening session of OBS April on Buzz Chace's \$275,000 bid. Chace was buying on behalf of Richard Santulli's Jayeff B Stable.

"War Front happened to be a hot sire this spring, and we knew anything could happen in the ring," Rice said of the sire of graded winners The Factor, Soldat and Summer Soiree.

Catalogued as [hip 261](#), the filly is a daughter of the stakes-winning Tappin for Gold (Pleasant Tap) and was purchased by New Mission for \$80,000 as a Keeneland September yearling.

"We got her shortly after the September sale, and she's been an easy keeper all along," added Rice. "She's a very clean-legged, very strong filly. When it came time to sell her, she was perfectly in bloom. She was all dappled out and had reached the time in her maturity where she was really ready to perform."

At the initial under-tack show, the filly breezed an eighth in [:10 1/5](#).

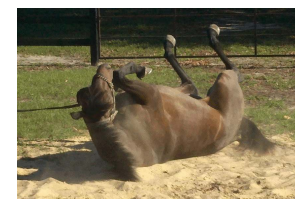
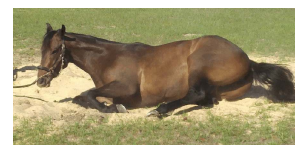
"We thought for sure she'd get a time like that, if not faster," said Rice. "She goes out 100% everyday and gives it her best effort. She breezed during the first day, which was actually a little bit of a difficult day with the weather. She breezed immediately after a thunderstorm, on the wet SafeTrack, and it was pretty humid. I think the buyers were pretty well aware that horses who performed well during the first breeze show definitely needed to be looked at, because they had to fight the conditions a little bit."

De Meric said that while Humble and Hungry established a high bar--\$200,000 high--she and Rice didn't come into 2011 trying to outdo themselves...at least as far as the sales board goes.

"By no means did we set a goal to surpass our financial success last year," she explained. "But it's exciting to get here and realize that the horses are stacking up against the competition nicely, and that they're turning into the horses you hoped they would. But we're just trying to sell a good product and have our clients excited and enjoy the process."

New Mission was the only client for whom de Meric and Rice were preparing sales horses; the rest are end users whose juveniles will be heading straight to the track.

"We're open to work with all kinds of clients, whether they want to go to the sales, or whether they'd rather race," said Rice.

Both de Meric and Rice grew up in the business; de Meric is the daughter of successful juvenile consignors Nick and Jacqui de Meric, while Rice's parents are Bryan and Holley Rice, who operate a similarly successful operation in Woodside Ranch. A lifetime of learning, both at home and during trips abroad, have left the 20-somethings with a particular philosophy on how to go about their business. Attention to the horses' mental health is at or near the top of the list.

"We pride ourselves in our horse-management plan of having our horses turned out eating, grazing, playing, and sun bathing when we aren't riding and training them," said Rice. "We've grown up in two different horse families, and we've studied around the world on how to grow these babies into good, solid racehorses, and into good products for our customers to buy."

Rice went on to explain, "We lease our current facilities, and one thing we looked for was a good, open, turn-out space. As the year progresses, we bring them in more, because it's important that they learn to adapt to being in a stall for both the sales and their racing careers, but when they're with us in the fall and early stages of the spring, we love to have them outside as much as possible, where they're not developing ulcers and all kinds of bad habits."

"They're out grazing, building good bone, tendon and ligaments, and keeping a good stomach on them, all of which will soon be valuable as they start their racing careers," Rice continued. "Most of our horses also remain barefoot during the fall, winter and spring in an effort to grow a healthy, balanced foot."

The success of Humble and Hungry has been a nice boost for de Meric and Rice, but it's clear that, more than anything, they are intent on living up to his name. Asked, for example, if they made the trip up to Churchill to watch the colt in the Breeders' Cup, Rice shook his head.

"As much fun as it would have been to go up there and socialize and see him run--we were really proud of him--we were keeping our noses to the grindstone and working on training these horses," he said. -LM

The colt, bred by Bobby Flay Thoroughbreds, was a \$140,000 weanling buyback at the 2009 Keeneland November Sale.

EQB's Patti Miller, who has been busy all spring, continued to be active at OBS. She secured two of the top five lots yesterday: [hip 710](#), a colt by Rock Hard Ten--Cute Cakes (Lemon Drop Kid) that consignor Eddie Woods was offering on behalf of Ken Ramsey, for \$170,000. Ramsey had purchased the dark bay, from the extended family of Hennessy, for \$85,000 at Keeneland September. Miller also purchased [hip 850](#), a New York-bred daughter of Freud--Fast Read (Touch Gold), for \$135,000. Hoppel's Horse and Cattle Co. consigned the filly, who had been acquired by Lee Einsidler for \$16,000 at FTNAUG last summer.

**HARD SPUN COLT TOPS BREEZE-UP** Doncaster Bloodstock Sales staged its annual Breeze-Up yesterday and it was a son of Hard Spun (Danzig) who provided some late fireworks when selling for £140,000. Willie Browne's Mocklershill Stables consigned the sole offering by Darley's freshman as hip [152](#). He was purchased by Cara Bloodstock for only \$15,000 as a yearling at Keeneland last September. From a proven dynasty, the March-foaled chestnut half-brother to the listed performer The West's Awake (Theatrical {Ire}) shares his second dam, the 1987 G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix Vermeille heroine Bint Pasha (Affirmed), with the 2004 GI Wood Memorial runner-up Master David (Grand Slam). After a battle with Robin O'Ryan, it was trainer John Quinn's son Sean who signed the docket on behalf of his father. "He had everything--the looks, the pedigree and he galloped," Sean Quinn said. "He's been bought for Peter Clay, who races Maxilead Ltd. I think he'll be a six-furlong or seven-furlong type of 2-year-old."

Earlier, O'Ryan secured hip [112](#), a son of Teofilo (Ire) out of the 2003 G3 Premio Dormello winner Mamela (Ger) (Protektor {Ger}) for £110,000. Consigned by Harefield Lodge Stables, the March-foaled bay will go into training with Richard Fahey. That eclipsed the £105,000 earlier paid by David Redvers for Meadowview Stables' hip [72](#), a Shamardal half-brother to the listed winner Brindisi (GB) (Dr Fong), whose third dam is the 1980 Epsom Oaks heroine Bireme (GB) (Grundy {Ire}). Led out unsold at 29,000gns at Tattersalls last October, he was bought on behalf of Sheikh Fahad al Thani. Redvers commented, "He'll have six weeks in a field and physically, he did one of the most impressive breezes which was matched by his time. Apart from Dubawi, there's no other stallion on fire like Shamardal and this colt had a stallion's pedigree. We haven't decided yet who will train him."

This colt was out of a Sadler's Wells mare from a good family. Hopefully he's going to be a nice horse that will make a three-year-old as well." Hip [68](#), a son of Yankee Gentleman, who shares his second dam with the top sprinter Morluc (Housebuster), was bought by Highflyer Bloodstock, while David Marnane Racing also paid that amount for Bansha House's hip [178](#), a son of Moss Vale (Ire) whose page includes a host of top Aga Khan-breds, including the dual GII American H. hero Takarian (Ire) (Doyoun {Ire}).

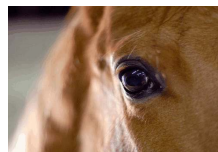

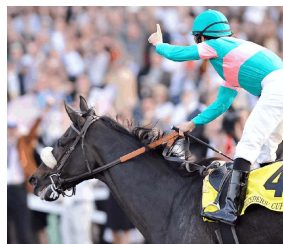
