## SENATORS RAISE QUESTIONS ON RACING

Senators Tom Udall (D-NM) and Rep. Ed Whitfield (R-KY) revealed Thursday that they intend to unveil

legislation next week that would prohibit race-day medication, and permanently suspend the license of anyone convicted of three violations of the ban. A horse that tests positive for performance-enhancing

drugs three times would be banned for at least two years. Weighing in from the owner's perspective, Team Valor International Founder Barry Irwin said, "I think federal intervention on the medication issue is essential in bringing control to a situation that racing itself has been unable to satisfactorily resolve. Look at what's going on now, with the HBPA stonewalling and refusing to get on board with the rest of the racing community to ban race day medication. By putting some teeth into the game, the Feds can send a strong message to cheaters that should go a long way in curbing aberrant behavior, as well as ridding the sport of undesirable elements. I applaud this move as a positive and necessary step in the right direction. The tail has been wagging the dog for too long now, and we need to get rid of the fleas." The legislators had issued a press release a year ago, announcing they had contacted the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, The Jockey Club and Racing Commissioners International, seeking information as to progress made on animal welfare, jockey safety and sporting integrity since hearings on horse racing were held in Congress in 2008. Citing the lack of a national governing body, the Senators wrote, "Horse racing, like boxing, is instead regulated at the state level by state racing commissions, which results in tracks around the country operating under different policies and rules. This lack of central governance thus complicates efforts to root out cheating, deter illegal drug use, and ensure safe racing conditions." The three racing organizations were asked to respond to a list of questions that addressed issues including the adoption of the RCI model rules and the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium recommendations; whether current penalties and enforcement of the rules is sufficient; and the availability of data on injuries to horses and riders. Almost a year later, they announced their intention to introduce the bill that would legislate the sport on a federal level. **Cont. p2**

## THE FRANKEL FACTOR

When it comes to **Frankel (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), there is little in the way of humility. And if you believe the betting markets, Khalid Abdullah's unbeaten idol enters today's G1 Qipco 2000 Guineas with a case more concrete than any supplied since Nijinsky II more than four decades ago. His precocity saw him named in honor of the late Hall of Fame trainer and he has been flaunting his extraordinary ability in public since breaking for his debut on the July Course here on a rain-drenched evening in August. Henry Cecil, who saddled two quickfire Guineas winners at the start of his career in Bolkonski (Ire) and Wollow (Ire) in 1975 and 1976, respectively, has endured the long wait to welcome back another leading light at the Newmarket to which he has long been betrothed. Frankel's dynamic display in Ascot's G2 Royal Lodge S. in September has been backed up by ample demonstrations of superiority in both this venue's G1 Dewhurst S. on Champions' Day and Newbury's G3 Greenham S. on his seasonal introduction a fortnight ago, so the portents could hardly be stronger. "On pedigree, he could be a better 3-year-old than 2-year-old, and he looks a better horse this year," Cecil warned this week. The NTRA and TJC declined to comment on the proposed legislation until it has been released, but TJC President and COO James Gagliano offered, "The Jockey Club does share the belief that performance-enhancing medication has no place in Thoroughbred racing. As we said in our Apr. 28 statement, The Jockey Club stands convinced that the elimination of race-day medication is essential to achieving optimal stewardship of the horse, the sport, the public perception and confidence, and the business of Thoroughbred racing. Gambling in the U.S. has long been regulated under the province of the states and, in point of fact, racing is the most regulated of sports. Through this structure, we have made great progress in many areas over the last few years in reforming our medication policies. There is more to be done in this regard, in particular revisiting race-day medication policies, and we are encouraged by recent calls in support of this position--including from the association of state regulators themselves. We believe this industry has the wherewithal to begin a phase-in of these policies within a year. We further acknowledge, however, it is the federal government that regulates interstate activities in our country. And, as a \$40-billion business employing about 400,000 individuals across many states, it is undeniable that we are an interstate activity. We look forward to speaking to anyone interested in promoting medication reform." Breeders' Cup Chairman Tom Ludt said, "We are forming a committee to address the issue. We will issue a statement early next week, and expect them to have a response very soon."

Godolphin has suffered a blank spell since their second winner Island Sands (Ire) (Turtle Island {Ire}) in 1999, but, in last year's G1 Racing Post Trophy winner Casamento (Ire) (Shamardal) and G2 Champagne S. scorer Saamidd (GB) (Street Cry {Ire}), they have two above-average contenders. Trained by Mick Halford last term, Casamento was one of a clutch of Irish-trained runners to grace the traditional maroon and white silks of Sheikh Mohammed. Now with Mahmood Al Zarooni, he captured the G2 Beresford S.

at The Curragh in late September, having run Pathfork (Distorted Humor) to a head when runner-up in the G1 Vincent O'Brien National S. there 15 days earlier. Saamidd, who earned

status with a seven-length maiden win at Newbury in August, was near-favorite for this after his easy Champagne win the following month, but is available at inflated odds after his recalcitrant display both before and during the Dewhurst, in which he finished a distant last of six to Frankel. Racing Manager Simon Crisford said, "The Guineas is a good route to the Derby, but [Casamento] has got enough pace for a mile, he has got plenty of speed and he is doing very well. Mahmood's stable is in cracking good form, and sometimes you have to go when everything is in good order."

Saeed bin Suroor, who saddled both of Godolphin's previous Guineas winners, said, "Saamid works nicely at home and he is ready to go. He ran well last year and he has matured through the winter into a stronger, heavier, more relaxed horse, so we are looking for a good run from him." Added Crisford, "Nothing ever came to light to explain Saamid's poor run in the Dewhurst. But the colt had a difficult disposition on the day--his attitude seemed to change and he didn't like the ground very much. Even saying that, he was disappointing, but he has been working nicely this year. Obviously, he has a lot to find with the principals on Saturday, but we have been very pleased with his progress over the last few weeks."

**An Envious Tally...**

Ballydoyle will rely solely on **Roderic O'Connor (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) in a bid for a sixth renewal. Although he appeared to have come from left field when chasing home Frankel by 2 1/4 lengths in the Dewhurst, he had previously shown marked ability when putting his better-fancied stable companion and GI Kentucky Derby bound Master of Hounds (Kingmambo) in the shade in a seven-furlong maiden at The Curragh in June. Authoritative--despite showing an errant tendency--when subsequently cementing that form in winning the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud in November, he warrants respect here. That also applies to Vefa Araci's **Native Khan (Fr)** (Azamour {Ire}), who bids to become the first since the 2004 hero Haafhd (GB) (Alhaarth {Ire}) to complete the Craven-Guineas double. Despite the relative weakness of that traditional course-and-distance trial Apr. 14, the grey was a facile winner, and his realist trainer Ed Dunlop is expecting significant progression. "Native Khan is rated 111, as against the 126 of Frankel, so if the favourite is on his game, we need to produce a career-best performance to get anywhere near him," he commented. "However, Native Khan has improved since he won the Craven, and he seems more laid-back in his work. There is precious little rain around and they are talking of temperatures around 19 degrees for the big race, so it looks like we will get our fast ground, and there also seems to be plenty of pace in the race," he added. James Toller puts forward a live outsider in **Loving Spirit (GB)** (Azamour {Ire}), who was an impressive five-length debut winner over seven furlongs on the Middle Park undercard here before coming unstuck when second in the Houghton Conditions S. over a mile on his next visit a fortnight later. "He is maybe a bit inexperienced for a race like this, but I've not had the time to get a prep run into him," his trainer told *PA Sport*. "He won first time out, though, and seems to go well fresh. We were slightly disappointed with his second run, but that might have come too quick and he's strengthened up since then. It's obviously a very tough race, but he's pleased us at home and this will tell us how good he is."

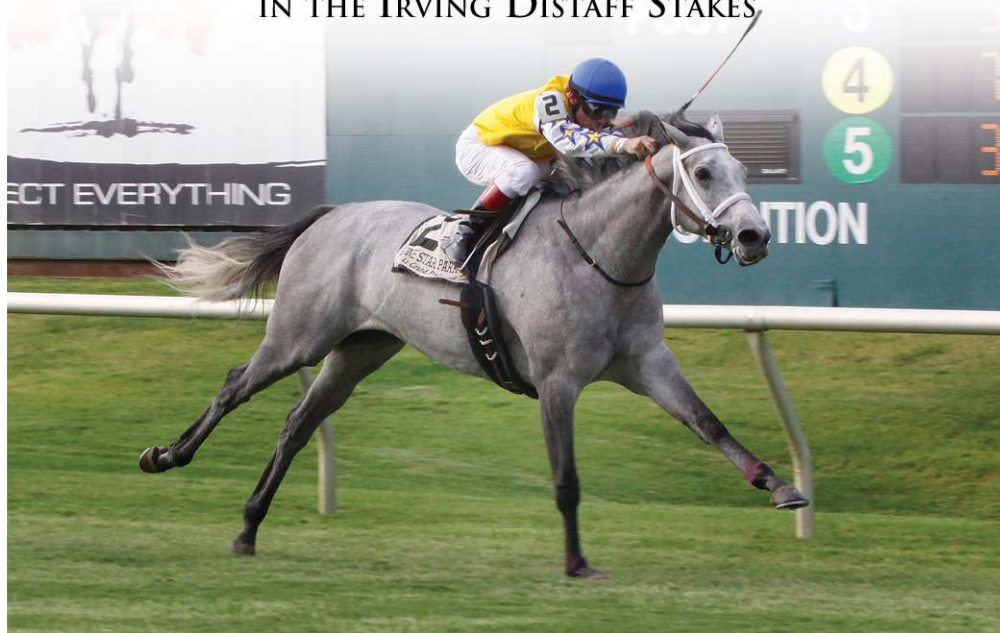

**CLOUD HEADS OPEN 1000**

George Strawbridge's ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ **Moonlight Cloud (GB)** (Invincible Spirit {Ire}) appears set to start favorite in tomorrow's G1 Qipco 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, which has the opposite look to the colt's equivalent. With 19 declared, there is the possibility that the runners will split as they charge the Rowley Mile, which led to the stand's-side group dominating 12 months ago on contrasting good-to-soft ground conditions. Moonlight Cloud, who went some

way toward justifying the elevated opinion of her long held by trainer Freddy Head when besting Helleborine (GB) (Observatory) in the G3 Prix Imprudence at Maisons-Laffitte last time Apr. 7, exits from the nine hole as she bids to become the fifth 1000 Guineas winner prepared by the famed Head dynasty.

Criquette Head-Maarek used the Imprudence as a warm-up for all four of her Newmarket heroines, and her brother Freddy is taking up the baton as he seeks an inevitable initial Classic victory. "The only question is whether she will get the distance," he told *Racing Post* earlier in the week. "I think she will, especially if the ground stays on the fast side. She was a brilliant 2-year-old, and I think she has come on a lot since winning the Prix Imprudence. She's looking very well and I don't think she has ever been better." Another from France is Ahmed Mouknass and Pandora Stud's **Nova Hawk (GB)** (Hawk Wing), who set up this cross-channel raid with a win in the Mar. 31 Listed Prix la Camargo at Saint-Cloud. "She is a good filly with experience and the 1000 Guineas looks a very open race with 19 runners," trainer Rodolphe Collet said yesterday. "Nova Hawk was very impressive at Saint-Cloud, but all her form has been on soft or heavy ground, and we would like some rain at Newmarket because she has not tried good-to-firm going. She has enough quality to run in the Guineas and travels well in her races, but there are not a lot of lines of form to link to other runners and I don't have horses at home to test her."

Aidan O'Brien has booked Pat Smullen for Michael Tabor, Susan Magnier and Derrick Smith's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac heroine **Misty For Me (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), who is drawn away from the stand's side in two, with Colm O'Donoghue on the G1 Fillies Mile runner-up **Together (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) and the trainer's son Joseph having his first English Classic ride on mother Anne Marie's Mar. 27 G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S. scorer **Empowering (Ire)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}). Bolstering the Irish contingent is the Betty Maxwell-Moran-owned and Jessica Harrington-trained **Laughing Lashes** (Mr. Greeley), whose form is closely linked with that Ballydoyle trio. After finding Together a length too strong in Leopardstown's G3 Silver Flash S. over seven furlongs in July, she avenged that defeat by besting her and stable companion Misty For Me in the G2 Debutante S. at The Curragh the following month before succumbing to the latter when the bridesmaid in that track's G1 Moyglare Stud S. three weeks later. "She's in great form and it still amazes me, looking at her now, how well she did last year considering she is so big," Harrington said. "It is much more open than the 2000, but there are an awful lot of good fillies there, and at the end of the day it will be the ones who have trained on properly who will be thereabouts." Of the four withdrawals yesterday, the most notable was Godolphin's Listed Radley S. winner Zoowraa (GB) (Azamour {Ire}), leaving the stable with a sole challenger in the Mahmood Al Zarooni-trained Listed Montrose Fillies' S. scorer **Blue Bunting** (Dynaformer). "It is a big jump in class for Blue Bunting, going from a Listed win to the 1000 Guineas," her conditioner said. "She is by Dynaformer and she might be better over further--this could be her trial for the Oaks."

GI Arkansas Derby hero **Archarcharch** (Arch) worked a bullet five furlongs in a co-bullet :59.40 during the Derby/Oaks training session at Churchill Friday. Jockey Jon Court was in the irons as he

clipped off fractions of :11.60, :23, :35 and :47.60, and galloped out six anels in 1:12.80. "I thought the work went very well," trainer Jinks Fires said. "Jon asked him to go and he went. He's just a

fast horse, an awesome kind of horse, and a horse like that makes you excited to get up in the morning." The conditioner added that the colt has thrived since his Grade I tally. "I feel that he has gotten better since the Arkansas Derby, and Jon feels that way, too," Fires said. "I've felt good about him all along since the first time we worked him. We are just hoping for a good trip for him and hope that happens."

Also breezing Friday, GIII Vinery Spiral S. runner-up **Decisive Moment** (With Distinction) went five-eighths in 1:01.40 under jockey Jesus Castanon. "He did excellent," trainer Juan Arias remarked. "That's what I wanted him to do. I told Jesus, 'Last time we worked, we worked a bullet, so you don't need to go that fast this time.'" The winner of the Jean Laffitte S. last year, he was timed in splits of :12.60, :25.20, :37 and :49.20 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:15. The dark bay was one of the first to arrive at Churchill Downs. "He loves this atmosphere," Arias said. "He got here early enough that he got acclimated to the weather. By being here early, I think it helps a lot. He just loves Churchill Downs. He feels ready to party; he's ready to dance to any kind of music. He can dance." The Panamanian-born conditioner will be saddling his first Derby runner. "This is what you get up for every day," he said. "You get up; do your job; you do the best you can with the stock that you have and rotate horses until you get the chance to run into a horse like Decisive Moment. This is very exciting. This is a world-class race."

**Soldat Works in Florida...**

Clarke, Robertson, Braverman and Namcook's **Soldat** (War Front), hero of the GII Fasig-Tipton Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 26, worked five furlongs in 1:01.40 at Palm Meadows Friday, his final tune-up for the GI Kentucky Derby. The dark bay has thrived in his training in the Sunshine State since disappointing with a well-beaten fifth as the 3-2 favorite in the GI Florida Derby Apr. 3. He also covered five furlongs in :59 flat Apr. 21. "He worked faster than I'd have liked last week, but did it properly," trainer Kiaran McLaughlin told *Daily Racing Form*. "Today was perfect." He continued, "I'm also glad we were able to keep him down here this late. The track has a great surface, and it certainly proved to be the right call considering the way the weather has been in Louisville. He couldn't be doing better and right now it's more about the post position than anything else." Soldat is scheduled to fly to Louisville today.

**Gomez to Ride Master of Hounds...**

It was confirmed yesterday that jockey Garrett Gomez, who has yet to win the "Run for the Roses," will pilot **Master of Hounds** (Kingmambo) in the May 7 GI Kentucky Derby. Third in the G1 Racing Post Trophy on the Doncaster turf last year and second by a nose in the G2 UAE Derby on the Meydan all-weather last out Mar. 26, he will be making his conventional dirt debut.

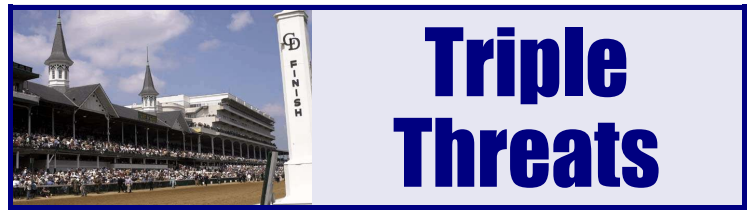

**Oaks Fillies Tune Up...**

A pair of May 6 GI Kentucky Oaks hopefuls worked at Churchill Downs Friday morning. Right Time Racing's **Bouquet Booth** (Flower Alley), fourth in the GIII Rachel Alexandra S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 19 and in the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland Apr. 9, went five-eighths in 1:02.20 over a fast Churchill strip. Robby Albarado was in the saddle. "Robby let her roll from the sixteenth pole home, and we did not want to overdo it six or seven days out," trainer Steve Margolis said. "She had her major work last week [five furlongs in 1:00.40 Apr. 21]." The dark bay captured the GIII Delta Princess S. last year, and kicked off 2011 with a win in the Silverbulletday S. in New Orleans. "I am a realist and I know it is a tough spot," Margolis admitted. "I know she might be the sixth or seventh choice, but she has proved herself with these type horses and deserves a shot. She is training well and if she wasn't, she wouldn't run."

Also going five panels, John Oxley's **Delightful Mary** (Limehouse) got the distance in company in 1:01.60 under jockey Shaun Bridgmohan. "It was fine," trainer Mark Casse said. "We had two clocks on her and we got her a second faster, but that really doesn't matter. I was watching some of the other workers, and it seemed like some of them struggled with the track, but she didn't."

★ "TDN Rising Star" ★ **Arienza** (Giant's Causeway), second in the GII Fantasy S. Apr. 10, went five-eighths in a co-fastest :59.40 and dashing off fractions of :11.80, :23.20 and :34.40 with retired rider Larry Melancon in the irons. "It was a good work," trainer Dan Peitz said. "I got her last three-eighths in :35 2/5, and maybe a tick faster on the final time than what the clockers got her in." But, he added, he was likely to skip the Oaks with his charge. "I am probably leaning toward the [May 6 GIII] Eight Belles [S.] I'll see how she comes out of the work and how everybody else is doing, but if Larry [Jones with Joyful Victory (Tapit)] and Todd [Pletcher with R Heat Lightning (Trippi)] are sitting on go, we may wait."

Getting her final prep at High Pointe Training Center in La Grange, Kentucky, just northeast of Louisville, Fleur De Lis Racing's **Suave Voir Faire** (Suave) breezed five furlongs in :59.80. "It was a good move--I got her last quarter in :23 4/5 and galloping out six furlongs in 1:13," trainer Speedy Smithwick said. "I thought the track was a little heavy this morning. I thought it might be more 'wet-fast.'" The filly, a distant third in the GIII Bourbonette Oaks at Turfway Mar. 26 in her latest, is scheduled to ship to Churchill Monday.

### 'FRESH' LOOK AT INSTA-TISTICS

In previous editions of "The Hot List," we've looked at TDN Sires Lists and the stallions that populate them. We're going to change things up a bit this week and instead focus in on another valuable tool on the *TDN* site, Insta-Tistics, which as you know, is a ranking of stallions by the prices their offspring bring at auction. Four categories are covered--weanlings, yearlings, 2-year-olds in training and covering sires--and the lists are sortable by average price, median price and number sold. We'll look at how this year's North American freshman crop--a group with huge potential--has fared at the juvenile sales, keeping in mind that three major sales--Fasig-Tipton May, Barretts May and OBS June, are still to come.

Bookmakers might well peg Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud as the odds-on pick to be standing the leading freshman sire by year's end, based on the fact that it boasts four well-regarded freshmen on its Kentucky roster: **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}), **Hard Spun** (Danzig), **Any Given Saturday** (Distorted Humor), and **Discreet Cat** (Forestry). Part of Sheikh Mohammed's massive spending spree in 2007, the first three spent much of that season knocking heads. Street Sense took the Kentucky Derby, of course, over a hard-trying Hard Spun, while Any Given Saturday had that foe back in second again in the GI Haskell Invitational (with Curlin third). Hard Spun bounced back from that loss to win the GI King's Bishop S., and would round out the year with a second to Curlin (Smart Strike) in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. A year older, Discreet Cat won the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile at three in a spectacular 1:32 2/5. All four were priced to their achievements when they went to stud: Street Sense opened up with a \$75,000 fee, with Hard Spun at \$50,000, Any Given Saturday at \$40,000, and Discreet Cat at \$30,000. This was spring '08, the last year of pre-crash fees.

By a flared nostril, Street Sense has edged out his stablemate Hard Spun by average price on Insta-Tistics. Eleven of his 14 juveniles on offer this spring sold for \$193,681, or just about \$2,100 more than Hard Spun (20 offered, 15 sold). What's been most impressive about Street Sense is the consistency of his stock. With a top juvenile price of \$400,000 (colt out of Richbabe (Successful Appeal) who went to Eric Fein at FTFEB), his average wasn't unduly inflated by a big seven-figure transaction. In fact, just the opposite happened. He had a daughter sell for \$1,000 at KEEAPR (hey, it happens), which will put a serious dent in your numbers.

It meant, in fact, that Street Sense's median of \$200,000 would be higher than his average, a rare occurrence. Regardless, Street Sense is on top in that category, too. It should also be noted that these figures don't include a highly regarded daughter at Keeneland--some thought she had sale-topping potential--who RNA'd for \$425,000.

Hard Spun's median, meanwhile, was a perfectly respectable \$130,000, and his very best offspring really captured the imagination of buyers. In fact, he can claim the title of siring the two highest-priced juveniles of 2011 by a freshman sire. A colt from the mare Light From Above brought \$675,000 at last week's OBSAPR sale when purchased by Frank Fletcher (*see toppers list for more info*), while another colt, produced by Princess Patricia, sold to Brushwood for \$575,000 at FTFEB.

Scat Daddy was also part of that sensational crop that included Curlin, Street Sense, et al., and, if you remember, was the 7-1 third choice in that year's Derby off consecutive wins in the GI Fountain of Youth S. and GI Florida Derby. He stood his first year at a fee of \$30,000, and his yearlings averaged \$53,630. Buyers really gravitated to his juveniles, though, which have averaged \$113,128 (17 offered, 14 sold). Scat Daddy's 2-year-olds included a session-topping son of Madagascats who went for \$400,000 at OBSMAR; a colt out of Bourbon Ball who sold to EQB's Patti Miller for \$250,000 at KEEAPR; and a filly out of Evangelizer who sold to John Kimmel for \$220,000 at FTFEB.

The late **Lawyer Ron** (Langfuhr) had a big turnaround from the yearling to 2-year-old sales. A seriously talented horse who smashed the track record at Saratoga winning the GI Whitney H., Lawyer Ron saw 38 of his yearlings sell for an average of \$37,552. That off an initial stud fee of \$30,000. But buyers came around at the juvenile sales. Nine of his 12 juveniles offered sold for an average of \$117,277, which puts him third on our rankings.

A sire with similar 2-year-old numbers is **Corinthian** (Pulpit), who sits just behind Lawyer Ron in fourth with a \$114,785 average (18 offered, 14 sold). The nicely bred Gainesway stallion was especially strong at the top of the market. He had a colt out of Hollow Miss (With Approval) bring \$380,000 at BARMAR; a filly out of Glacken's Mark (Smoke Glacken) bring \$320,000 at OBSAPR; and a colt out of Berry Blessed (St. Jovite) bring \$250,000 at KEEAPR. Corinthian's median was \$50,000.

One sire who quietly is having very nice spring at the juvenile sales is **Half Ours** (Unbridled's Song), who began his career at Taylor Made in Kentucky before being moved to Clear Creek Stud in Louisiana, where he stands now for just \$4,500. He's had 17 of 19 sell for an average of \$66,735, including four who made six figures. They were led by a colt produced by Skyladysky (Sky Classic) who went to Will Wright for \$275,000 at OBSMAR.

Even more eye-catching is his \$60,000 median--good for sixth on our rankings and in front of some very nice stallions.

**Flashy Bull** (Holy Bull) enjoyed some positive buzz over the spring. He was responsible for the \$170,000 filly that topped the Fasig-Tipton Texas Two-Year-Olds Sale. Martin Racing and Carl Moore, agent, purchased the daughter of Destiny's Yield (High Yield). That wasn't Flashy Bull's highest-priced juvenile, though. A filly out of Dakota Rae (Stephen Got Even) sold to Long Lake Stables for \$185,000 at OBSMAR. His 2-year-olds have averaged \$49,452.

**High Cotton** (Dixie Union), whose biggest win came in the Gill Northern Dancer S. at three, began his stud career at Ocala Stud for a fee of \$5,000, and now is at \$2,500. His 2-year-old average is \$32,536, and he's had individuals sell for \$150,000 (filly out of Valid Concorde, by Concorde's Tune, at OBSAPR), \$90,000 and \$70,000.

Of course, success in the auction ring doesn't always equate to success on the track, but buyers have generally gotten it right over the past decade--at least when it comes to a crop's leading sire. Pulpit, Stormy Atlantic, Tiznow, Mineshaft and Bernardini were all leading juvenile sires.

The TDN asked some of the best eyes in the industry what they thought of this year's crop, and they kindly shared their opinions.

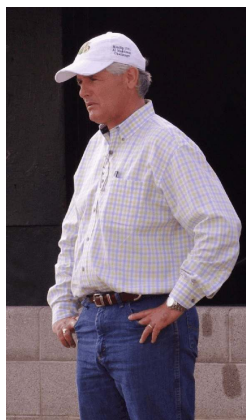

**Consignor Niall Brennan:**

I suppose everybody seems to be of the same opinion that the **Hard Spuns**, the **Street Senses**, and the **Any Given Saturdays** are the ones who are sticking out. The Hard Spuns I like; they're hearty, and they look like they'll do anything. They act like summer-type horses, but look like they'll go on. Whereas the Street Senses--the ones I've had--are big scopey horses who look like they'll appreciate more time and more ground. But I do like them a lot. And I like Any Given Saturday, but again, I think they're going to appreciate more ground. So I like all three, but of course they are the three the most is going to be expected from.

Of course, one who has gotten some attention now through the two-year-old sales is **Scat Daddy**.

We've had several, and they sold

well. We had some nice horses by him, and they trained well. I wouldn't be surprised to see him with some early winners.

I [had] a **Hat Trick (Jpn)** colt [at KEEAPR] who breezed well and he's a nice colt. But he didn't have many horses, so it's a little harder to establish an opinion of him, because you haven't seen many of them yet. But this is a really nice colt, and the sire was a heckuva nice race horse in Japan [and Hong Kong], where he was a Group 1 miler. And he's a son of Sunday Silence, so he's got a license to be a sire.

You know, I've seen some interesting horses by **Bob and John** (Seeking the Gold), thought they may take a bit of time. Obviously, they're not bred to be early--or he wasn't, at least--but I've seen some nice ones by him, and I think he's a little bit of a sleeper.

**DataTrack (BreezeFigs) Picks, by Robert D. Fierro, Jay Kilgore and Frank Mitchell:**

"This year we entered the 2-year-old season with the single most competitive crop of sires we have seen in a decade. Based on their biomechanical projections, we thought highly of the obvious ones, especially those whose prospects would be helped by books of superior mares, e.g., **Street Sense**. We also saw that it was going to be tough to separate the likes of **Political Force**, **Any Given Saturday**, **Corinthian**, **Hard Spun**, **Scat Daddy**, **Discreet Cat** and **Bob and John**. We also liked stallions that are now deceased like **Lawyer Ron** and **Master Command**. And **Invasor (Arg)** was lurking around. But the big surprise was the horse that kept coming out at or near the top: **Flashy Bull**.

When the 2-year-olds began to breeze, there were some others who did, indeed, pop up—but our projections held with one big exception: **Invasor** simply does not have enough at the sales to make a judgment. But through all breeze shows thus far, including the four days at OBS April, of the freshmen with more than 10 2-year-olds that have breezed, the big surprise to many among commercial stallions in Kentucky is going to be **Flashy Bull**. All the others mentioned above are likely to be competing with him for headlines through the year. To that crowd you can also add Florida-based **Simon Pure**, whose runners have been very consistent and who has long-term prospects. **Half Ours** and Florida-based **Exclusive Quality**, who will have a lot of runners early, may be more limited in scope. Among those with fewer than 10 breezers, watch out for **Silver Wagon**—they raised a few eyebrows here and there."

**Bloodstock Agent David Ingordo:**

"My sleeper pick is **Purim (Dynaformer)**. He had a second with his first starter at Keeneland and there [was] a really nice one at [OBS April]. I tried to buy several as yearlings and they sold well and looked the part. **Purim** had a lot of ability, so it will not surprise me if he makes a sire.

I love the **Hard Spuns** I've seen. The colt that **Wavertree** sold in Miami (o/o Princess Patricia, [hip 67](#), [video](#)) was a special type of horse and **Eddie Woods** sold a superstar colt in Keeneland April (o/o **Glimmering {Ire}**, [hip 145](#), [video](#)).

The **Street Senses** look good and I like how they train. I think they will be more Classic types and be better in the fall and as 3-year-olds.

**After Market** is the other sleeper in the group. He was a tremendous racehorse, has a great pedigree, is a very handsome stallion and his offspring look very good in their training at this point. We have about eight of them in training at Mayberry Farm in Ocala, and several of them show the ability to be any kind. One I'm particularly fond of is a colt going to John Shirreffs out of Ing. He reminds me a lot of his sire. I think they will be able to run on dirt, too.

I've been impressed with the **Political Force** offspring as well. We have a colt going to California that we purchased, and he's quite nice. Political Force strikes me as a young sire with some potential."

**Steve Venosa, SGV Thoroughbreds:**

"We had a Flashy Bull who trained very consistently on the farm all year, and he went to Ocala and did very well at the March Sale. It seems like those, as a group, are very nice horses."

**EQB's Patrice Miller:**

Since most of EQB's exposure is through sales yearlings and 2yos, we have a bit more confidence in horses that had larger crops, so we have seen enough to get an impression, in hopes of identifying a trend. Obviously, EQB's criteria includes cardiovascular measuring, and high-speed (slow motion) film analysis done at the 2-year-old in training sales. That information, combined with a physical assessment, and a clean bill of health, wind, and soundness via a veterinary exam, are the shortlists that we bid on for clients.

Four sires came to mind right away, as the offspring of those four sires were often on our short lists. Those four, in order of my preference, were **Street Sense**, **Hard Spun**, **Corinthian**, and **Any Given Saturday**. We didn't see that many **Scat Daddys**, but those that I saw impressed us...and our tests.

Four sires that were not represented with as many numbers, but seemed to be consistent (again, in order of preference), were **Flashy Bull**, **Half Ours**, **English Channel** (Smart Strike), and **Hat Trick**(Jpn).

I did not include **Lawyer Ron** and **Master Command** (A.P. Indy), who were represented by several very good individuals who passed all the EQB tests, and looked like kick-ass horses. Unfortunately those sires died, so I didn't feel we'd have a big enough sample to make a credible prediction.

But overall, the first four--Street Sense, Hard Spun, Corinthian, and Any Given Saturday--looked very promising to us. Consistently, their progeny seemed to be able to score well for our technology, and when you did a reality check, you'd see a darned nice horse that looked fast and who looked like it could thrive training.

Also, one of the biggest variables that a breeder and stallion owner have to overcome, I think, is that the offspring get placed in capable trainers' hands. That, and some luck, are grossly underrated, and crucial for a freshman sire's future. The good news is that these four sires seemed to consistently pass on enough raw material to meet the task, and were often placed in very capable hands.

The past and current chairmen of the RCI got the industry's attention recently on their recommendation to ban race day medication. I fail to see the wisdom in the opposition's side to maintain the current medication platform while the industry holds meetings and contemplates more scientific studies. Have I missed something over the past few years while reading the Equibase reports or clear messages contained in the letters from Congress to our industry? When was the last time we received a quarterly or annual report indicating an increase in attendance, wagering or purses (not generated by alternative gaming)? Wagering had a +0.90 in the Third Quarter of 2007. To me this medication issue is not about science. It is about a philosophy and a perception. The philosophy is that the industry thinks it knows what's best for our sport. The perception from our customers, both current and potential, is that we are a drug infested sport. True or false, there is no amount of money that can be raised to promote a public relations effort to convenience our customers otherwise. They read about the trainers that have abused our current medication rules, it may be a minority, but the perception is that everyone is abusing. Yes one bad apple does spoil the barrel. Why do we allow the inmates to run the asylum? It is insane to continue to do the same thing over and over again expecting a different outcome. Break tradition, try something new. It might change that perception and bring some customers back. "The first thing you have to do to get out of a hole is to quit digging" The Cowboy philosophy.

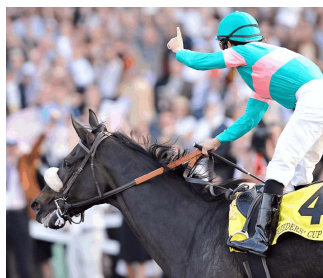

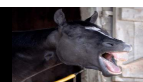
